The Cummington Harlows



An Introduction

This genealogical record has been prepared to include the descendants of Charles Harlow and Joseph T. Harlow, brothers, who were born in Cummington in 1813 and 1817 and resided in their native town most of their lives.

In 1919 at a meeting of these descendants in West Cummington the Harlow Association was formed which has held reunions annually since in Cummington, Plainfield, Northampton and Ware.

In 1923 it was voted by those present, to have a genealogy prepared and Mrs. Elizabeth Harlow Goetz of Philadelphia, Pa., accepted the appointment of compiler. To her is to be credited much of the labor in gathering the family records of these two men and their descendants. In 1926 the writer was designated to complete the genealogy and to endeavor to ascertain the connection with the immigrant ancestor, Sergeant William Harlow of Plymouth.

Through the invaluable aid of Theodore P. Adams of Plymouth, himself a descendant, this connection has been traced and with his unstinted assistance it has been possible to include the direct line of ancestors on the Harlow side in full and thus enable the descendants of these Cummington men to have the complete line from the days of the Pilgrims.

This record has also been prepared with an opportunity by use of blank pages for members to add the names of future descendants.

The Harlow Ancestry

Sergeant William Harlow was born in England probably about 1624 and is first mentioned in the town records of Plymouth, Mass., on Dec. 10, 146 when listed as one of the voters.

His marriage to Rebecca Bartlett on Dec. 20, 1649 is recorded. She was the daughter of Robert Bartlett of Plymouth and of Mary Warren whose father, Richard Warren, came in the Maytlower in 1620.

By his first wife he had four children, the youngest being William.

After her death he married a second and a third wife and had in all 14 children.

He was admitted a freeman in 1654 and, beginning in 1665 and for many years after, served as one of the "raters" or in more recent years known as assessors. He served as one of the three selectmen of Plymouth for 16 years in the period of 26 years from 1665 to his death in 1691.

In 1673 to 1675 he was a deputy to the General Court. His title was obtained as the leader of the military company and he had charge of the old fort and saw much military service.

In his home town Sergeant Harlow was one of the outstanding citizens beyond question and the records dealing with the history of the church as well as of the town indicate the important part which he played in those struggling years in the second half of the 17th, century.

Of special interest in connection with this immigrant ancestor is the quaint old Harlow house recently restored and which he built in 1677 of timbers taken from the old fort on Burial Hill constructed by the Pilgrims in 1621 and in which their religious services were held. At the end of King Philip's war this was torn down and the manner in which these timbers were fitted to the use of this first Harlow may be seen to-day. After remaining in the Harlow family until 1921 or for 244 years it was purchased by the Antiquarian Society and has been restored to its original condition so far as was possible and refurnished with furniture of the period.

Second Generation

William Harlow, son of Sergeant William Harlow, was born in Plymouth June 2, 1657 and died Jan. 28, 1711. He resided in Manomet Ponds, a part of Plymouth. His wife was Lydia Cushman, daughter of Thomas Cushman, the famous Elder of the Pilgrim church. Her mother was Mary Allerton, whose father Isaac Allerton a prominent leader among the Pilgrims had come over with his wife on the Mayflower.

There were eight children by this marriage including four sons. One of these was Robert.

Third Generation

Deacon Robert Harlow as he was called was born about 1695 in the part of Flymouth where he lived before his marriage, at Manomet Ponds.

His first wife was Susanna Cole of Plympton. Her mother, Susanna Gray was a daughter of Edward Gray who died in 1681 and whose gravestone is the oldest on Burial Hill in Plymouth.

This grandson of Sergeant William Harlow settled in Plymton and was deacon of the Second church. He has many descendants principally in Maine and mostly by his first wife. One of the sons was Benjamin.

Fourth Generation

Benjamin Harlow was born on Sept. 12, 1723 and died in Sharon on Aug. 12, 1792. He is recorded as born in Plymouth. He married twice and the first time Abigail Hobbs of Stoughton on July 11, 1744 who died in 1752. By his first marriage he had two daughters and one son, Matthew Hobbs Harlow.

Fifth Generation

Matthew Hobbs Harlow was born in Sharon or Stoughton on Apr. 22, 1750 according to Sharon records and on Apr. 3, 1752 the date of his mother's death by Stoughton records. He died on Oct. 22, 1809 and is buried in Sharon. His wife, Lydia lived to be 79 and died on Apr. 7, 1829.

Sixth Generation

Matthew Harlow, born Sept. 20, 1775, was the oldest son and second of the nine children born to Matthew Hobbs Harlow and his wife Lydia.

It is not possible to discover how it came about that this Harlow removed to Cummington but some effort to place the date fixes it as on Nov. 19, 1805 or when he was 30.

It is also stated that he moved from Natick. He married as his first wife Mahitable Bird in 1801 and she died in 1807. He married his second wife, Persis Parker, a widow, on Jan. 18, 1808 and from this union there were six children including the two sons, Charles and Joseph Tolman, named in the introduction.

The Charles Harlow Line

1. Charles Harlow born in Cummington Feb. 18, 1813, died Mar. 3, 1886. As a young man he was employed in tanneries and at one time worked in Maine. Later he manufactured hay rakes at the location near West Cummington which was later known as the paper mill village.

Like his brother he was skilled in the use of tools and a useful citizen in a period when ability to lend a hand counted a lot.

He married Orissa Mason in Worthington on May 7, 1834 and she died Apr. 29, 1881.



The Joseph Harlow Line

- 1. Joseph Tolman Harlow was nearly five years younger than his brother Charles but died some six years earlier. His life was a useful one in many ways and spent in the west part of Cummington, at times on a farm near East Windsor. He was a millwright by trade and also a cabinet maker for he was skilled in the use of tools and could turn his hand in many ways. He installed the first turbine waterwheel to be set up in that section, at Allenville in the town of Windsor and for one Capt. Allen. For a period of 12 years he was proprietor of the hotel in West Cummington called the Deer Hill House and was so engaged at the time of the Civil War. His first wife was Elizabeth Stetson, who died Nov. 8, 1863. His second wife was Electa Haskins. By his first wife he had five children:
