Landmarks–Familiar Names Disappearing.

Written for the Hampshire Gazette, by Rev. Solomon Clark.

One by one their number is steadily declining. To the list of the departed may be added the name of Deacon Freeman Hamlen. His father, John Hamlen, originated in Bridgewater, married at 28, and became one of the earliest inhabitants of Plainfield, where he reared a family of ten children. For 19 years he was one of the Selectmen and for five years represented the town at the General Court or Legislature. He deceased in his 90th year, in 1852, being the last Bevolutionary pensioner in I isinfield.

Freeman Hamlen was his seventh child, born May 8, 1805, and would bave been 84 next May. (This was written soon after his death, which sourred Jan. 16, 1889.) Nearly all his days he lived in his native town. Is June, 1829, he was married by Rev. Moses Hallock, to Miss Clarissa Whiting, daughter of Major Whiting of Plainfield. She was the mother Gapt. Edward F. Hamlen, extensively known in Northampton, where he resided many years. He is now Executive clerk at the State House in Boston.

For his second wife, Des. Hamlen was mapried in Hawley, Nov. 30, 1488, to Miss Martha Taylor; four of her brothers entered the ministry. She survives her husband.

Like his father, Dea. Hamlen was quiet, modest, retiring. Through his long life, two characteristics stood out very marked in him, namely, thorough honesty and sound judgment. The prevalent feeling was that entire confidence could be reposed in his word. It is not strange, therefore, that a high value was placed on his services, and that from year to year the town honored him with responsible positions.

He was in the legislature, a member of the House of Representatives two years. As town clerk and treasurer his faithful services were called into requisition annually for nearly a quarter of a century. His penmanship, for accuracy and planness was worthy of imitation. (Continued from the first page of this leaflet.)

In respect to his connection with the church, which began over fifty years ago, the record bespeaks him an Israelite indeed. Humility, meekness, sincerity, spirituality, were marked features of his Ohristian character. In 1844 he was elected to the office of Deacon, the active duties of which, in connection also with that of clerk of the church, he discharged into the evening of his days.

The church manual, which he undertook and completed in 1884, then nearly 80, a valuable document of the kind, in respect to fullness and accuracy, gives evidence of unusual painstaking. In the preparation of that manual, it may be said, "He being dead yet speaketh."

A word respecting his devotional spirit and habits. Like Enoch of old, "He walked with God." Rev. Mr. Seymour of Hawley remarked at the funeral, that as was said of another, "in all probability Dea. Hamlen had prayed over every rod of his farm."

It is proper to say in conclusion that the Hamlens were among the musical families of the town. Some of them have obtained celebrity in localities at the West. The Plainfield choir, led 40 years ago by Captain Rauben Hamlen, assisted on a musical instrument by Deacon Freeman, also represented by the Gurneys, Shaws, Whites, Whitings, Robinsons, Macks, Joys, Roods and others, was one of the celebrated choirs in the western part of Hampshire County. For a time they were under the training of Dr. Lucas and Col. Barr, both remembered in Northampton.

Edward F. Hamlen, a native of Plainfield, and son of Freeman, whose record appears on page 8 of this book, is a veteran of the Oivil war, and has been for over 20 years, (1898), the confidential clerk of each of the State Governors of that period. It may be considered a good endorsement of his ability that he has retained that position under Governors of different political viewa. A few feet from his desk is the House of Representatives, whither came both his father and grandfather, as representatives from Plainfield. His grandfather came down horseback, and turned his horse out to pasture, where now East Boston is all built up. In those days the legislature held two sessions a year.

AN OBITUARY

OF

John Hamlen, Esg. of Plainfield,

Who died April 15, 1852, in the 90th year of his age.

Mr. Hamlen was born in Bridgewater, Mass., Oct. 22, 1762. In the year 1776, at the age of thirteen, he removed with his parents to Cummington, three years before it took the municipal rank of a town. It was among the most distinct of his recollections that while at Northampton, on his way to Oummington, the news of our country's declaration of Independence reached that town, surprising, yet rejoicing the inhabitants. At the age of 16, he entered the service of his country, for the maintenance of this declaration, in which service he continued about 6 months. For this, he was subsequently moderately pensioned by the government, and was, at the time of his death, the last of the Revolutionary pensioners in Plainfield. At the age of 28, he married and removed to Plain field, then a district, belonging to Cummington, thus becoming one of its earliest inhabitants, though it was not incorporated as a town until about seventeen years later.

As a citizen, Mr. Haulen was respected and honored, having received many offices of trust, by the suffrages of his fellow citizens. For nineteen years, he was one of the Selectmen of the town, and was five years, including 10 sessions, a member of the General Court, as a Representative of his town. He was also early appointed a Justice of the Pence, but steadfastly declining the legal qualifications, he never exercised the functions of that office. In his domestic relations, he was happy, though not without afflictions. He was first married at the age of 28, to Miss Sally Towne, by whom he had ten children, and with whom he lived 28 years. Remaining unmarried one year after her decease, he was again married to Mrs. Dorothy Gove of Worthington, with whom he also lived 28 years, she having died in 1847. Himself for many years a man of feeble health, he yet survived both of his companions, attaining a great age.

In his general character, Mr. H. was quiet, modest and retiring. There was little of the emotive, or the impulsive in his nature; he was not easily excited, but was cool and practical in his views. If not so ardent in his attachments as many others, he was not less constant in his From the first, he manifested a commendable interest in friendships. the social and moral character of the town, and was one of the committee for erecting the first Meeting House in the town (an event of no small account in those times), and was ever a firm supporter of the Congregational Society of the town. It was not, however, till a late period of life that he became personally interested in religion as a saving reality, tho' for some years previous, he entertained hope. It was not till he had reached 75 years of age, that he joined himself in covenant with the Church of Christ. From that time, however, he well adorned his profession, leaving no doubt of his hearty attachments to, and his love for, the doctrines of grace, as held by the Calvinistic churches in New England, Thus believing, he quietly and peacefully sank away into the arms of death.
