THE ABRAHAM HOLMAN FAMILY OF ROSS COUNTY, OHIO

(Additions and Corrections since 1959)

Research at libraries in Washington, D.C., in the period 1960-1969, brought to light facts that I had missed earlier. Correspondence with relatives and others of the Holman name has brought forth additional facts. And the births, marriages, and deaths that have occurred from 1959 through 1978 are here included to bring the Holman history up to date by means of this Supplement. Page numbers starting each paragraph below refer to the appropriate pages in the 1959 book.

- Page 3 The Abraham Holman farm was in Section 13, Township 9 North, in Green Township, Ross County, and about 2½ miles west of Hallsville, a village in Colerain Twp. Several of the Holman relatives resided in **Colerain Twp..**
- Page 5 Eighth line from bottom: "foreigners" should be "foreigners".
- Page 5 Sixth line from bottom: "(5) p. 44" should be "(5) p. xv."
- Page 5 Second line from bottom: "(5) p. 44" should be "(5) p. xxvi."
- Page 6 Middle paragraph: No person with the surname of "Holman" is found in the Index of Strassburger and Hinke's "Pennsylvania German Pioneers" of 1934 (14) 1. Therefore the compiler believes that our original immigrant Holman did not come from Germany.
- Page 6 Under "Ancestry": MARTIN HOLMAN died in Brown County, Ohio, "at a ripe old age". See page 227 of (8). However, we have not succeeded in finding a record of where he was buried.
- Page 6 Last line on page: MARTIN's wife's name was CATHERINE. In the White Churches Cemetery, Green Twp., Ross Co., there is a gravestone with the inscription: "Catherine, wife of Martin Holman, died Sept. 12, 1828, aged 71 years, 8 mo., 28 days." Therefore, she was born about Dec. 14, 1756. We presume that she was the mother of John Holman, but she could also have been a second wife of Martin. We lack proof of either.
- Page 10 JOHN HOLMAN His mother's name may have been Catherine. See immediately above.

Page 11 JOHN HOLMAN married (2nd) CATHERINE HOUGH CHAMBERS on Sept. 9, 1845, in Ross Co., Ohio. See p. 217 of Ross Co. Marriages (12). She was born about 1800, because the U.S. Censuses of 1850, 1860, and 1870 give her ages then as 50, 61, and 70 respectively. (The age 61 in 1860 is of course 1 year off.) Both the Census record and the Marriage record spell her first name with a "C" rather than a "K". She died on Dec. 17, 1877, aged 77 yrs., 7 mo., 5 da. (2).

Page 11 Middle of page: "White Cemetery" should be "White Churches Cemetery".

Pages 11-12 The children of John and Christina Eyestone Holman are listed in the order in which they appeared on page 240 of the Ross Co. History (16). From the U.S. Census records and the Ross County marriage records, it appears that this order is not entirely correct. See details under each person below.

Page 11 REBECCA HOLMAN was undoubtedly born in 1817, because her par-
H-181 ents were married in 1816 and her next younger brother was born in 1818. She married David Kutz on Nov. 6, 1834. See p. 400 of (12). If ~~their~~ son was named David, he was also David Kutz.

Page 11 ABRAHAM HOLMAN: Ross Co. marriage records show the date of
H-182 his marriage as Dec. 29, but his family Bible shows Dec. 30.

Pages 11-12 MARTIN HOLMAN: born Ross Co., Ohio in 1820 or 1821.
The U.S. Censuses of 1850 and 1860 show him as 29 and 40 years of age, respectively. It is recorded that he married Ferby May on March 16, 1843 (p. 93 of (12)). Another source, p. 648 of (3), gives her name as Mary Ferba. She was born about 1824, as the U.S. Censuses of 1850 and 1860 give her age as 26 and 36 respectively. Here her name is spelled PHERABY.

Martin and Pheraby Holman had 10 children, all born in Ross Co., Ohio. Four who died ~~and~~ were buried in the Mt. Pleasant Cem., 1 mile south of Kingston, Ohio, were: DAVID, JACOB W., CLAYTON L., AND SUSAN C. The six children who survived were: WILLIAM A., b. 1845; SABRINA A., b. 1846; JOHN ALBERT, b. 1848; DAVID T. (a 2nd David), b. 1855; EVA, or Effie, b. 1859; and CAREY L., b. 1861.

The family moved from Ross Co., Ohio, to Macon Co., Ill., during the Civil War and located on a farm on the Bloomington Road near Decatur. More about them, especially Carey L., the youngest, can be found on page 648 of (3). Martin and Pheraby died in Illinois, dates not available to us.

Page 12 SARAH HOLMAN married ANDREW HESS on Oct. 27, 1842, in Ross Co.
H-184 See p. 77 of Ross Co. marriages (12); also Note, next page.

- Page 12 SARAH HOLMAN (Note:- On a list of the children of John
H-185 Holman, which I received from Miss Jessie T. Wood of
Kingston, Ohio, in the early 1930's, she showed that
Sally (Sarah) Holman married a Hess and that Rebecca
married a Kutz. However, because the Eyestone Genealogy
(5), which shows that Rebecca m. Hess and Sarah m.
Coots (Kutz), was mimeographed and of later date, I
assumed it to be accurate and published it this way in
1959. Now the Ross Co, marriage records that I have re-
ceived confirm Miss Wood's list.)
- Page 12 GEORGE HOLMAN was born on Dec. 21, 1821 and died May 27,
H-185 1910. In 1849 he married NANCY KARSHNER,
daughter of pioneer Daniel Karshner. Nancy was born on
Feb. 8, 1830 and died Dec. 20, 1898. (Dates from letter
of Mrs. C.D. Woslever to R.H. May, Oct. 26, 1977.) Geo.
and Nancy Holman had no children of their own, but they
adopted Austin W. Holman (see p. 167 of (8)).
- Page 12 SUSANNA HOLMAN was born about 1832, because her age is
H-187 given as 18 in the U.S. Census of 1850.
- Page 12 ROSANNA HOLMAN married WILLIAM PONTIUS on March 26, 1848.
H-188 See p. 341 of (12). She may, therefore, have been older
than Susanna (H-187) who would have been age 16 in 1848.
Although Rosanna Holman Pontius had no children, she
raised her niece Bell May, after her sister Leah (H-189)
died.
- Page 12 LEAH HOLMAN was born about 1835, because her age is 15 in
H-189 the U.S. Census of 1850. Her husband HARVEY MAY was pro-
bably born about 1836 (although the Census of 1850 gives
his age as 4, he was probably then 14); he was the son of
Strouse May. Leah Holman May apparently died before 1866,
as she is not mentioned in her father John Holman's will.
- Page 12 DAVID HOLMAN was born about 1826, because the U.S. Census
H-18X of 1850 gives his age as 24. His name does not appear in
his father's household in the Census of 1860. He is not
mentioned in his father's will (John died in 1866). So
David may have died before then, although one source (?)
gives his death as in 1874.
- Page 12 CATHERINE HOLMAN married RUBEN PONTIUS on Nov. 4, 1849,
H-18Y in Ross County. See p. 427 of (12). From this date we
judge that she was not one of the younger daughters of
John and Christina Holman.
- Page 12 MARY ANN HOLMAN was born about 1838, because the Census
H-18Z of 1850 gives her age as 12. Her son was LAWRANCE
CRITTENDON THROCKMORTON, who is named in his grandfather
John Holman's will.

Page 14 AUSTIN HOLMAN died on July 9, 1865, according to the family
H-1821 Bible.

Page 14 JOHN MARTIN HOLMAN's first wife LAURA ROCKWELL was the daugh-
H-1822 ter of Russell and Pheraby Entrekin Rockwell. Russell
Rockwell was born in the East and came to Kingston as a young
man. He died at the age of 37, and his wife Pheraby remarried
-- to ABRAHAM JONES. Their daughter ANNA (half-sister of Laura)
married Bishop THOBURN. See p. 75 of (8).

John's 2nd wife, MARTHA CROUSE HOLMAN, died on Aug. 5, 1966,
at Berger Hospital, Circleville, Ohio. She was buried in Mt.
Pleasant Cem., 1 mile south of Kingston, Ohio. She was the
daughter of David and Elizabeth Leist Crouse.

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The Family Bible:

The family Bible of Abraham and Leah Dresbach Holman, now in the possession of John Austin Howard, contains the dates of their marriage, births, and deaths, also the dates of their children's births, and the dates of death of the four children who preceded Abraham Holman in death. Since these dates are given in the family history published in 1959, it seems unnecessary to repeat that record here. Their Bible was published in 1863, after all but their last child was born, so most of the dates must have been copied from some previous record.

The Dreisbach Genealogy

The information which I collected on the Dreisbach (or Dresbach) family and published in 1959 on pages 32-37 of "The Abraham Holman Family of Ross County, Ohio" (10), came principally from three sources:

1. The family Bible record of Martin Dreisbach (b. 1777, d. 1850), his two wives, and their children. This record was copied by a granddaughter, Susan Dresbach Wright, of Ross Co., Ohio, and sent to me early in 1928.
2. Correspondence with Dr. Melvin Dresbach, of Albany, N.Y., a grandson of the same Martin Dreisbach, in May 1928.
3. The "Annals of Martin Dreisbach Sr. and His Descendants, 1717-1927", compiled by Cora Hyde Dreisbach from the work of several descendants and copied, duplicated, and distributed by Emma Dreisbach Woodside (4). It bears no date of publication, but I believe it was done between 1927 and 1929.

In the decade 1960-69 with an opportunity to do further research on the Dreisbachs in Washington, D.C., I found additional information and also that some of the "facts" I had published were wrong. This section provides additions and corrections and the page numbers underlined below refer to the appropriate pages in the Holman family history of 1959 (10).

Page 32 The year when MARTIN DREISBACH SR. emigrated to America is given in two places as 1746. This date came from source 3., above, and is from a statement of the Rev. John Dreisbach (1789-1871), a grandson of Martin Sr. This worthy Reverend evidently erred, because the official records show Martin Dreisbachs emigrating to Philadelphia in 1750 and 1751. (See Rupp (7) and Strassburger (14) listed in the References on page 22) Whether there were two Martins or whether our ancestor came over in 1750, then went back to get his wife and returned in 1751, I have not determined. Laura Helman (6) states that MARTIN DREISBACH, whose wife was ANNA EVE HOFFMAN, arrived at Philadelphia on Oct. 4, 1751, on the ship "Queen of Denmark". This coincides with the "Martinus Dreysbach" of Strassburger (page 473 of (14)). The "Mardin" Dreisbach who came in 1750 arrived at Philadelphia on August 24, the the ship "Brothers".

So many Germans emigrated to the American colonies (especially Pennsylvania) in the 18th Century, that they were required to swear allegiance to the Crown of England. Fortunately these records have been preserved.

The first Dreisbach to emigrate was Simon, a cousin of Martin, who arrived in Philadelphia on Sept. 19, 1743, on the ship "Lydia". He was then 45 years of age and with him were Johan Jost Dreisbach, age 20, and Johan Adam Dreisbach, age 19 (Strassburger (14) pages 340, 341, 343). Whether these younger men were his sons or other relatives, I have not determined. Another Dreisbach (Heinrich, or Henry) arrived Nov. 7, 1754, on the ship "John and Elizabeth" (Penna. Archives, 2nd Series, Vol. XVII, pp. 448-9, Ships Lists, Foreigners Imported).

Page 32 D-1 ANNA EVE HOFFMAN's date of birth is given as 1724, again based on source 3., above. This also appears to be in error, because her gravestone says she was born in 1722 and died in 1789 at the age of 67. The latter is supported by Helman (6) and Linn (9). In June 1966 I visited the Dreisbach Cemetery and found the graves of Martin and his wife in its northeast corner. From Lewisburg, Penna., one goes $4\frac{1}{2}$ miles west on State Route 45, then 1 mile south on a county road to the church and cemetery. The gravestone of Anna Hoffman Dreisbach is of dark gray slate, carefully inscribed in old German script as follows:

"Hier liegt Anna Eva gewesene Ehe Gattin des Martin Dresbach's geboren im April 1722 rerheyraet im April 1742. Gestorben den 10 Feber A D 1789 Ihr alter war beinahe 67 Jahre. Ich liege u. schlafe ganz mit Freiden denn der Herr erhalt mich." Translation: Anna Eva, the late wife of Martin Dresbach, born April 1722, married in April 1742, died on Feb. 10, A.D. 1789. Her age was nearly 67 years. I rest and sleep fully with peace because the Lord supports me.

Her gravestone thus gives Anna Eve Hoffman's date of marriage, 1742, when she was 20 and Martin was 25. They had been married about 9 years when they emigrated to America in 1751, so their older children may have been born in Germany and have come with them. The ships lists often showed only the heads of families.

Page 34 D-1 MARTIN DREISBACH's date of death is shown as "February or March" of 1799", again from source 3., above. The date was actually Feb. 18, 1799. See Helman (6) or Linn (9).

Pages 34-35 D-11 - 16 incl. Six children of MARTIN and ANNA HOFFMAN DREISBACH are listed, presumably in the order of their birth. However, this apparently may not be so, for if Margaret Dreisbach married John Aurand in 1772, she must have been older than Martin Dreisbach Jr., who was born in 1764.

The Rev. John Dreisbach states, page 27 of (4), that Martin Dreisbach Sr., having lost his eldest son by sudden death, sold his farm and saw and grist mills in Lancaster County, Penna., and bought a farm in Berks County and moved there in 1763. We lack this son's name. Ten years later he sold this farm and bought a tract of land in Buffalo Valley (then Northumberland Co., now Union Co.) and moved there in 1773. Here they had to flee their home for a time because of trouble with the Indians. So some of their family records may have been lost, for we do not know the dates of birth of their children, except for Martin Jr. There may have been other children who died young.

Page 34 D-11 JACOB DREISBACH served in the American Revolution as a private in the Rangers on the Frontiers. See Penna Archives, 3rd Series, Vol. XXIII, pages 245, 248, and 351, where his name is spelled Trishbough, Thrishbaugh, and Teasbough. These indicate a difficulty in understanding the name and transcribing it.

Jacob Dreisbach died in 1804 on the farm of John Dunkle -- Linn (9). So his death was not in 1805 as stated in source 3., above. In Jacob's will, dated Oct. 15, 1803, and probated Aug. 21, 1804, he gives his property to his beloved wife Magdalene. Executors were the widow and sons Martin and John. (Northumberland Co., Penna., Will Book no. 1, page 328.)

MAGDALENA BUCKS DREISBACH died Feb. 15, 1836, in Pickaway County, Ohio.

Page 34 D-12 The six children of HENRY and MARGARET RIMMEL DREISBACH were: John, Daniel, Jacob, and three daughters. (See Dreisbach (4) and Helman (6).)

Page 34 D-13 The eight children of JOHN and CATHERINE YOUNGMAN DREISBACH were: Samuel, John Jr., Thomas, Joseph, Ellis, George, and two daughters. See (4) and (6).

Page 35 D-14 The six children of MARTIN JR and SABINA BUCKS DREISBACH were:

Page 35 D-111 MARTIN DREISBACH (b. 1777, d. 1850) Came to Ohio in 1809 (1) or 1811 (16). In either case, he returned to Pennsylvania for his second marriage, to ANNA EYER in 1812, and brought her back to Ross Co., Ohio. His family Bible gives her name as Anna Ayer or Eyer, a daughter of Abraham Ayer (Eyer), and her date of birth as Feb. 10, 1783. Bennett (1) says that "Martin married Mary Eyer, born Feb. 11, 1783, and daughter of Abram Eyer." The dates and father's names are so close in these two sources that it led me to conjecture that Martin's second wife was named Mary Anna or Anna Mary. However, Bennett could have been wrong about the name Mary since it is not given in the family Bible.

Martin's first cousin, the Rev. John Dreisbach, married (1) Catherine Eyer and (2) Fanny Eyer, sisters, whose father was Abraham Eyer and whose mother was named Catherine (she b. Oct. 15, 1752, m. May 1776, d. Sept. 22, 1805; Linn (9). Martin's wife Anna Eyer was probably a sister of his cousin's wives, unless there were two Abraham Eyers at that time.

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The Eyestone Genealogy

Corrections and additions to the Eyestone, or Augenstein, family information on pages 38-43 of "The Abraham Holman Family of Ross County, Ohio" (10) are as follows:

- Page 38 JOHN HIERONYMUS AUGENSTEIN (Johann Hieronymus Augustin, as it is recorded) arrived at Philadelphia on Oct. 5, 1768, on the ship Sally. This date was not of the ship's departure from Rotterdam. Strassburger(14), Vol. I, page 714, List 264C.
- Page 38 JOHANN AUGUSTIN (Augenstein), age 36, arrived in Philadelphia, Pa., on Sept. 5, 1805, on the ship Verny from Amsterdam. He was born in Gemhoffen, Germany. See Strassburger(14), Vol. III, page 169, List 486. (I don't know his relationship to the other Augensteins -- possibly a son of Jacob (E-128).-- RHM)
- Page 39 E-121 CASPER AUGENSTEIN was buried in the Churchyard of the German Reformed Church near Kingston, Ross Co., Ohio. See Eyestone (5), p. 7. (I believe this is the same as the White Churches Cem. -- RHM.)
- Page 40 first line: 2/ should be 12/.
- Page 40 E-123 JOHANNAS AUGENSTEIN migrated to Philadelphia in 1751. He had 400 acres of land in Bedford Co., Penna., in 1794. Date and place of death unknown. Eyestone, (5), p. 7.
- Page 40 E-125 BALTHAZER AUGENSTEIN owned 100 acres of land in Bedford Co., Penna., and was taxed there in 1793. His name appears in the U.S. Census of 1790 as "Balzer Anglestine" and in that of 1800 as "Baltzer Agustine". No further information. Eyestone (5), page 7.
- Page 40 E-126 JEROME AUGENSTEIN was listed among the Rangers on the Frontiers, 1778-1783, in Northumberland Co., Penna., and was a private in Snyder's Company. No further data. See Eyestone (5), page 7.
- Page 40 E-127 JOHN HIERONYMUS AUGENSTEIN served in the Revolutionary War. Details and other information in Eyestone (5). His son was also named John Hieronymus Augenstein, but we have no details concerning him. (5)
- Page 40 E-128 JACOB AUGENSTEIN had two sons (twins) of record: George Frederick Augenstein and George Martin Augenstein. The latter's family came to America in 1832, but George died enroute. Eyestone (5) pp. 11-12 for details.
- Page 41 (Under H-1221, which should be E-1221) FREDERICK PFERCHING (Friedrich Pförching, as recorded) emigrated to America in 1749, arriving at Philadelphia on Oct. 2, on the ship Jacob from Amsterdam, via Shields, England. This ship contained emigrants from Swabia, Wirtemberg, and Darmstadt. See Strassburger (14), Vol. I, p. 417, List 140C.

Page 41 H-1222 (should be E-1222) MELCHIOR A. MEYERS' middle name was Abraham. Meyers is also spelled without the "s", and sometimes as Myers. His child by his wife Catherine was named William. More details are in Eyestone (5), page 9.

Page 41 H-1223 should be E-1223

Page 42 E-1224 The 9 children of Jacob and Louisa Eyestone Hough were: Jacob Jr., b. 1793; Katherine, b. 1798, 'm.(1) Chambers, m.(2) John Holman (H-18); George, b. 1799; John, b. 1801; Abraham, b. 1809; Isaac, b. 1811; Casper, b. 1813; Elizabeth, b. 1815; and Joseph, b. 1818. More details of this family are in Eyestone (5), pp. 10-11.

Page 42 E-12211 The 10 children of John and Sarah Bunn Eyestone were: Abraham, b. 1815; Ezekiel Aaron, b. 1817; George, b. 1819; Harmon, b. 1822; Griffith, b. 1825; Rosanna, b. 1827; Elizabeth ~~Harity~~, b. 1829; Eliza Jane, b. 1835; John Wesley, b. 1838; and William Harrison, b. 1840. The first three were born in Ross County; the last seven in Wyandot Co., Ohio. See Eyestone (5), p.13.

Page 42 E-12213 The 5 children of Jacob and Betsey Eyestone Mill-saver were: Abraham; Hannah; Catherine, b. 1830; Jacob Jr.; and Mary Ann, died young. Eyestone (5), p.13.

Page 42 E-12214 The 8 children of George and Elizabeth Kirk Eyestone were: Susanna, b. 1817; Irvin, b. 1818; John, b. 1819; Rosanna, b. 1821; Enoch, b. ____; Nelson, b. 1828; George, b. 1831; and Jeremiah, b. 1833. These dates are given by Orrin W. Sidener in his compendious Sidener Genealogy (13) and may not all be correct, because Eyestone (5), p. 14, says the dates are uncertain, due to conflicting evidence. Some of Eyestone's dates are different; for example, he gives Enoch's as 1822 or 1829. I give them here because they give the period over which these children were born.

Page 43 E-12216 Anna Susanna Eyestone's son was WILLIAM H. DRESBACH, born April 29, 1818, in Green Twp., Ross Co., Ohio. His father was Jonathan Dresbach, presumably D-117**see page 35 of May (10). See also Eyestone (5), pp 14-15.

Page 43 E-12217 The 5 children of Michael and Hannah Eyestone Van Gundy were: William, Elizabeth, Abraham, George, and Susan. (Source: not recorded by compiler.)

LAST WILL AND TESTAMENT OF ABRAHAM HOLMAN

IN THE NAME OF THE BENEVOLENT FATHER OF ALL:

I, Abraham Holman of Green township, Ross County and State of Ohio, considering the certainty of death and the uncertainty of the time thereof and being desirous to settle my worldly affairs and thereby be the better prepared to leave this world when it shall please God to call me hence, do therefore make and publish this my last will and testament as follows to wit:

Item 1st- I direct all my debts and funeral charges to be paid by my executors hereinafter named.

Item 2nd- I give and devise to my grandson Arthur Bookwalter the sum of Three Thousand Dollars (\$3000.00) the same to be paid out of my estate when he arrives at the age of Twenty-one years. In case he should not live to become of age, in that event the above sum shall be equally divided among my six children, John, Flora, Ella, Ettie, Jennie, and Ollie.

Item 3rd- I direct that my son John M. Holman have the farm on which he now lives known as the Abraham Jones farm containing One Hundred and Ninety-two acres more or less, that is to say if my son John elects to take the said farm at the sum of Eighteen Thousand Six Hundred Dollars (\$18600.00): He to pay not less than Five Thousand Dollars cash within one year after my decease and the balance in equal annual payments with legal rate of interest secured by first mortgage on the premises, the deferred payments to be made as to time as he and my executors may arrange. In case my son John declines to take the said farm on the above conditions then I direct that the said farm be sold by my Executors and the proceeds divided equally between my six children John, Flora, Ella, Ettie, Jennie, and Ollie.

Item 4th- I give and devise all the balance of my estate equally among my six children heretofore named taken into consideration what each have already got or may hereafter get before my death.

Item 5th- I do hereby nominate and appoint my son John M. Holman and my son-in-law J. Myron May my Executors of this my last will and testament hereby authorizing and empowering them to compromise, adjust, release and discharge in such manner as they may deem proper.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 26th day of April, 1893.

Codicil to the Will of Abraham Holman

Whereas I, Abraham Holman of Green Township, Ross County, Ohio, did on the 26th day of April, 1893, make my last will and testament do hereby declare this to be a codicil to the same and hereby attach it to said last will and testament, I hereby ratify all of said will save as far as any part of it is inconsistent with and may be modified by this codicil.

I hereby change Item 2nd of my Last Will and Testament so as to give to my grandson Arthur Bookwalter a full share with my children, that is to say he shall share and share alike with my son John, my daughters Flora, Ella, Ettie, Jennie, and Ollie instead of receiving Three Thousand Dollars as embodied in my last will and testament hereby attached.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 27th day of August 1901.

Note: Arthur Bookwalter (Buchwalter), the only surviving son of Abraham's daughter Lucretia, was married in Feb. 1900, at the age of 23, which is perhaps the reason for this codicil.

Elias Moore, one of the witnesses of the original will, had been the husband of Abraham's daughter Martha. Mary Moore was Elias' second wife.

Abraham's son Austin and his daughters Lucretia and Martha had died before Abraham Holman made his will in 1893.

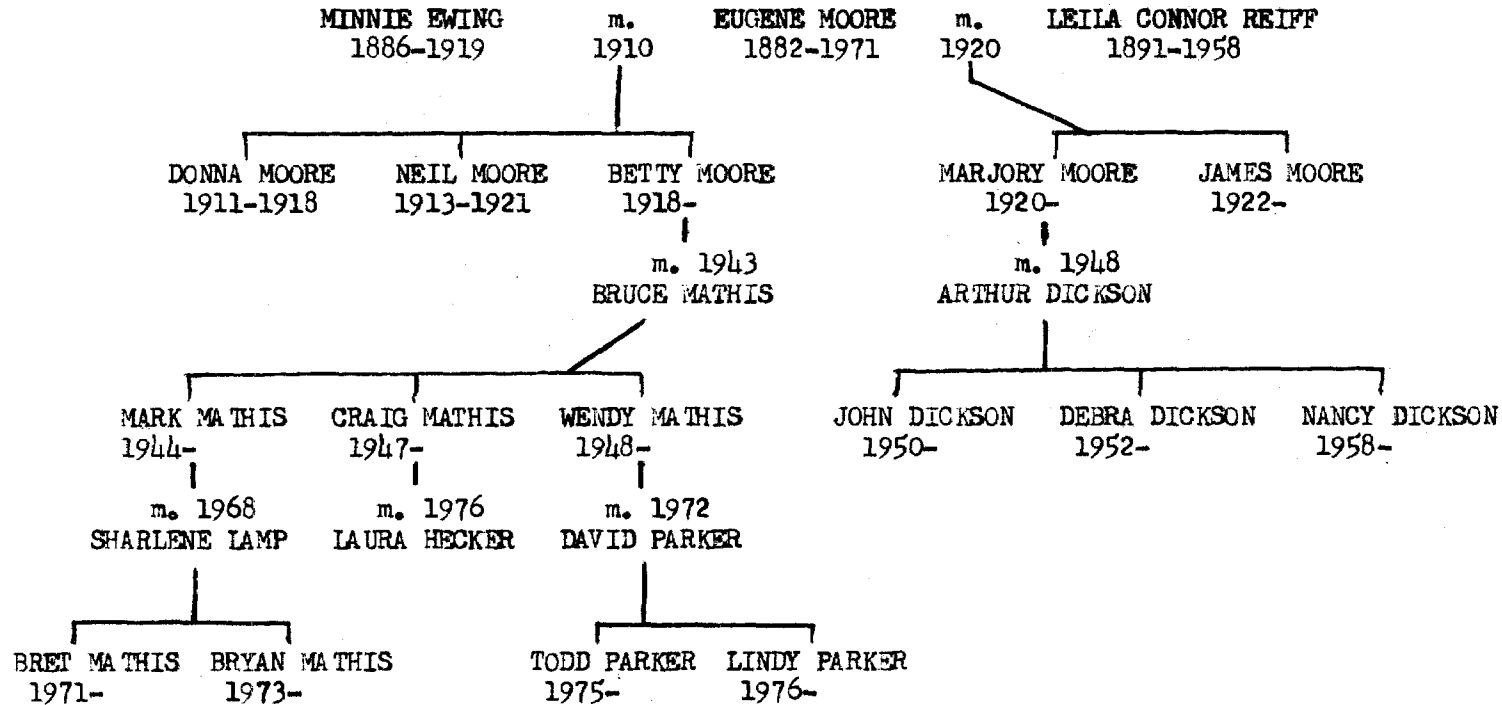

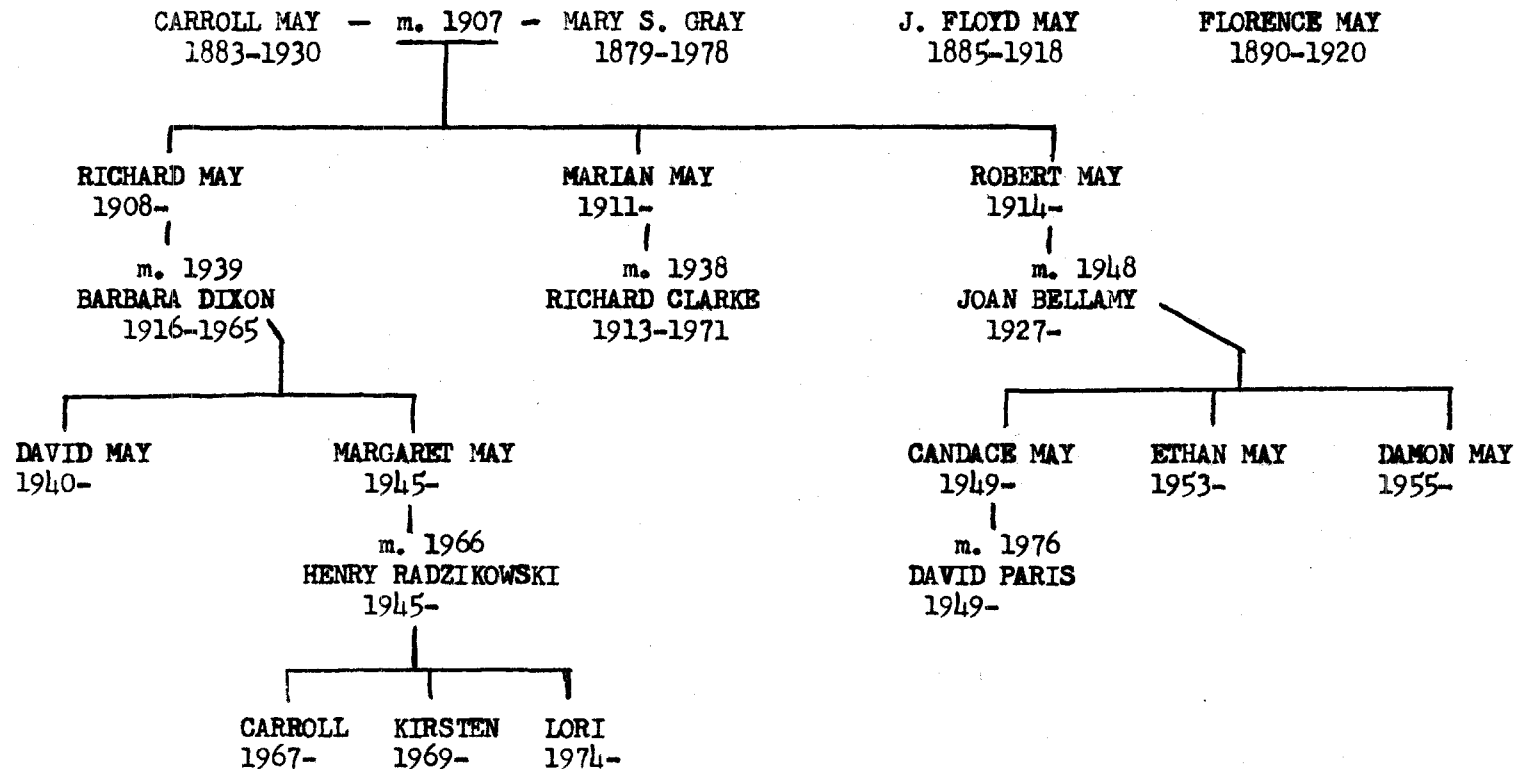

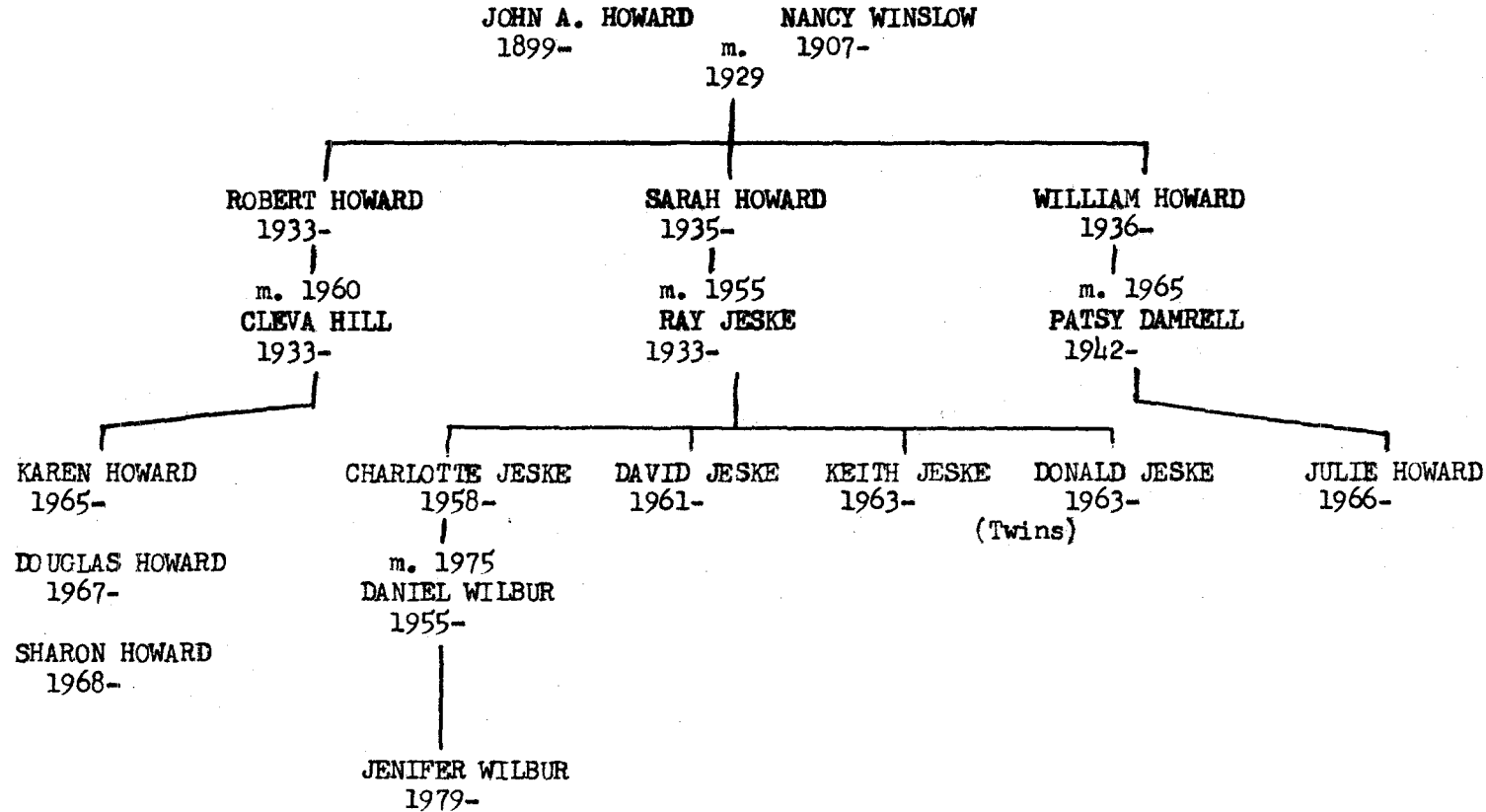

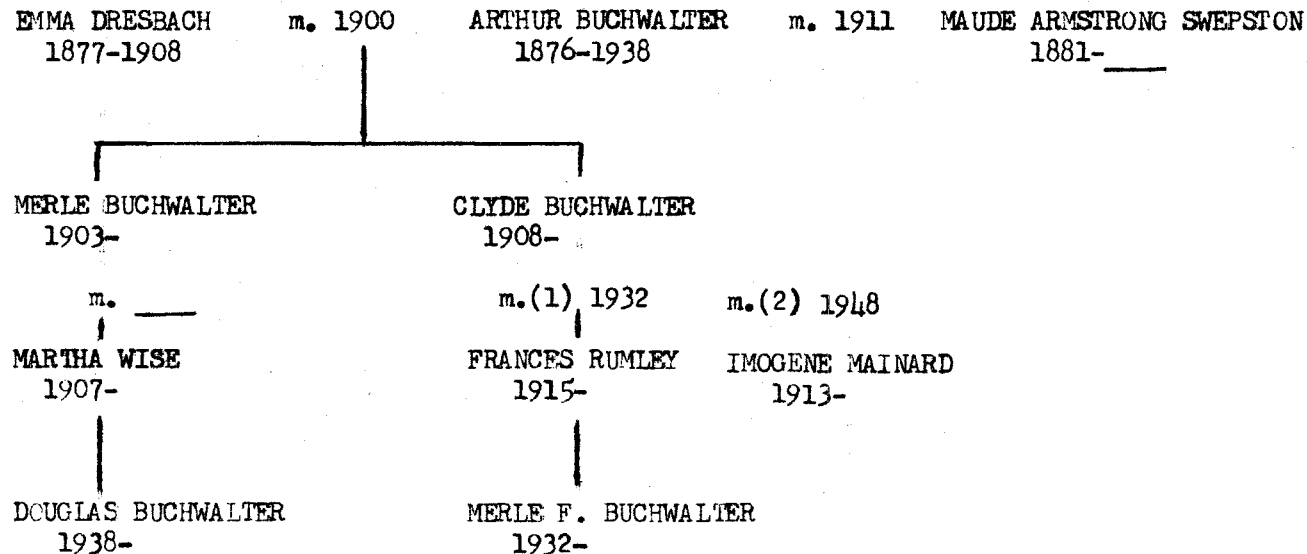
