A great deal of study will be necessary to properly place these James Hartwells.

On the following pages is recorded all the information that has been received in regard to three families of unknown or uncertain origin. This brings the total of such families to 24, and it is possible that others may be discovered. If records were available, probably most of these families could be traced to "lost" members of the very large Concord Group, but some are likely to be descendants of later immigrants. However, adequate and reliable records do not exist, so these families, these "cousins", will always remain of unknown origin. Several very early immigrants to Virginia may account for Hartwells apparently originating in that state, but no records have yet been found to support such a possibility.

THOMAS HARTWELL

The record of THOMAS HARTWELL and his descendants as given in the Hartwell Genealogy of 1956 (ELDER MALE LINE page 56), is hereby entirely re-written. In Densmore's Handbook of Hartwell Genealogy, page 174, bottom line, occurs the following: "THOMAS b May 28, 1780, d; carp; served in gunboat fleet on Lake Erie, War of 1812". This man is probably the hitherto unknown THOMAS HARTWELL, of whom scraps of data have been discovered. He was undoubtedly born in Massachusetts, and went to Canada during a year not yet known, but started clearing his land in 1806, and in 1807 in Hope Township, Ontario, as having 20 acres of cultivated land, and 180 acres of uncultivated land. In 1808 he finished a round log house on his clearing in Hope Township. He was probably married in 1806, but his wife's name, birth place and birth data are still unknown. His children were all born in the log house. He was on the roll call of the militia, War of 1812, 1st Regiment Durham Militia attached to the 1st and 3d York Militia in Toronto, but probably did not serve. In 1818 he was an Innkeeper and in 1822 he was a pound keeper along with David Stevens. In 1829, 1830, and 1831 he was on the census rolls of Darlington Township, and he moved to Peterborough in 1832 where he was apparently an Innkeeper as he advertised it for sale on August 31, 1836. In 1835 and 1836 he was foreman in charge of building a saw and grist mill in Warsaw, Dummer Township, but died before it was finished in the fall of 1836. He was the father of eight children, six daughters born between 1808 and 1817, and two sons born in 1818 and 1828. Nothing whatever is known of these children, with the exception of Edwin.

ALFRED STEDMAN HARTWELL

ALFRED STEDMAN HARTWELL, a descendant in the seventh generation of the emigrant, William Hartwell, of Concord, Mass., son of Stedman and his second wife, Rebecca D. (Berry) Hartwell, was born in West Dedham, Mass., June 11, 1836.

He attended Harvard College at the same time with such men as Oliver Wendell Holmes, Jr., later Chief Justice of the United States Supreme Court, William and Henry James. He was awarded membership in Phi Beta Kappa for his scholarship and was graduated in 1858 with the degree of A. B., and in that year was appointed tutor in Washington University at St. Louis, Mo. In the spring of 1861 he enlisted in the 3rd Regiment Home Guards as corporal, taking part in the capture, under the direction of Capt., afterwards Gen. Lyon, of Camp Jackson, a camp of state militia assembled under the Confederate flag, under the eye of Gen. C. F. Jackson, designed to bring about the secession of the state, which a legally elected convention held in the winter had refused to sanction.

He returned east in midsummer, entered Harvard Law School, enlisted in August, 1862 as a private in F, 44th Mass. Vols; was 1st Lieut. in September under Foster in North Carolina; Captain of D., 54th Mass. Vols., March 16, 1863; Lieut. Col. of the 55th on May 30th, Colonel in Nov. 1863; brev. Brig. Gen. U. S. Vols., Dec. 1864 when 28 years old, on duty in South Carolina and Florida. He was in action at Honey Hill, S. C., commanding a brigade of colored troops, receiving four wounds, his horse was killed, and he was carried off the field by private Ellsworth of a New Hampshire regiment, who was promoted to captain on that occasion. After the surrender of Lee, he was stationed in the interior of South Carolina, commanding the district, and in the winter of 1865-66 in Charleston investigating enlistment frauds. He was mustered out in August, 1866.

In 1866 he returned to Harvard and received his degree of Bachelor of Law the following year. He was admitted to the bar in the fall of 1866, and was chosen representative in the Legislature from Natick with only three opposing votes, in 1868. In this year he gave up an assured career in Boston to try his fortunes in far Hawaii as Assistant Justice of the Supreme Court. He reached Hawaii on Sept. 29th and presided during the absence of Chief Justice Allen who was in Washington on commercial business, until 1874, after which he practiced law with the exception of three terms as attorney-general, until Sept. 1885, when he returned with his family to Boston.

In 1880 he conducted the Hawaiian Gazette, to which he was a constant contributor until his removal from the islands, acting in opposition to the court party. In 1904 he was appointed Associate Justice of the Supreme Court of the Territory of Hawaii, and three years later became Chief Justice.

In March, 1911, when he was almost seventy-five years old, he resigned and the following June set out for a long vacation in Europe. But in London he was taken ill, and so returned sooner than he had expected. Clients again thronged to his office, but he was able to continue practice for only a short time. After an illness of less than a week, he died at his home, Aug. 30, 1912.

Judge Hartwell's death was mourned by the entire community. At his funeral the governor and other men of high official position acted as pall-bearers. He was universally respected for his keenness of intellect, independence of thought, and moral and physical courage. As a lawyer, honesty and justice were his first requirements. His knowledge of law was comprehensive and precise, his briefs were held up as models of brevity and clarity. His quick, clever wit, pleasant personality and maturity of judgement made his friendship sought and prized.

On January 10, 1872, Judge Hartwell married Miss Charlotte Elizabeth, daughter of James William and Mellicent (Knapp) Smith, born at Lolos, Kaia, Apr. 28, 1845, died in Honolulu, June 3, 1896. James W. Smith was a missionary physician at Honolulu. He and his wife were from Greenwich, Conn.

The Judge belonged to the Grand Army of the Republic, The Military Order of Loyal Legion, Phi Beta Kappa, The University Club of Honolulu, The Metropolitan Club of Washington and The Union Club of Boston.

COL. CHARLES LEONARD HEARTWELL

COL. CHARLES LEONARD HEARTWELL, a descendant in the ninth generation of William Hartwell of Concord, Mass., member of the only branch of the family, so far as known in which the spelling Heartwell is used, son of James Benjamin and Sarah Jane (Dibble) Hartwell, was born in Geneva, N. Y., July 1, 1869. His mother was a daughter of Capt. Ransom Dibble of an old Virginia family, captain of a sailing vessel which came around Cape Horn in 1849 to Calif. His father was a prominent financier and business man in Geneva and Hastings, Neb., and was state senator from Nebraska in 1886.

On December 14, 1898, Charles was married to La Verne Elizabeth, daughter of William Wallace and Belle (McKee) Lowe, who was born on Dec. 4, 1878 and died March 7, 1935. He studied at the university of Switzerland and the Polytechnic School at Zurich from 1887 to 1889, and completed his education at Hastings College in Nebraska, his father being one of the founders of this Presbyterian College. During vacations he made bicycle tours through Europe, meeting with many interesting and exciting adventures.

He went to Long Beach, Calif. in 1890 and was employed as assistant cashier at the Bank of Long Beach until 1900 when he aided in the organization of the First National Bank of Long Beach and became its cashier. Later he helped organize the First Savings Bank in Long Beach, also the first Building and Loan Association. He was one of the leading figures in the construction of the Heartwell Building and the Lowe Building, erected by his father-in-law on the site where Mr. Lowe built the first Long Beach store and had charge of the first Long Beach Post Office.

Col. Heartwell served as City Treasurer from 1899 to 1908, and in 1907 was commissioned Lieut. Colonel of the National Guard of Calif. In 1898 the war with Spain put him in charge of a Long Beach Company as 2d Lieut. In 1916 he qualified for Lieut. Colonel, Quartermaster Corps, U. S. Vols. He was a member of the Calif. Council of Defense during the War, and of the American Protective League. He was also in the Food Administration under Herbert Hoover as Sugar Director of the Los Angeles Unit, and was active in Liberty Loan and American Red Cross drives.

Governor Richardson appointed him Director of the Sixth District Agricultural Association of Calif. in 1924, and he was reappointed for the term from 1920-1930, serving as president in 1926 and vice president in 1927 until 1934, having been reappointed by Gov. Young. Governor Richardson also made him Chief of Claims and Disbursements in the Department of Finance, and he served in this capacity during Governor Richardson's term of office.

In 1941 he was president of the Heartwell-Lowe Company, and Chairman of the Long Beach Water Commission. He was a member of the First Congregational Church. His hobby was collecting clocks, and his collection included more than 500 time pieces. He died Dec. 11, 1942, and left no issue.

EDWARD MUSSEY HARTWELL

EDWARD MUSSEY HARTWELL was born in Exeter, N. H., May 29, 1850, the eldest child of Josiah Shattuck and Catherine Stone (Mussey) Hartwell. Catherine's father, Dr. Reuben D. Mussey, was one of the original professors of surgery at Dartmouth Medical School, and was largely instrumental in establishing the medical school in Cincinnati which has since become affiliated with the University of Cincinnati. Josiah Shattuck Hartwell was graduated from Harvard University in 1844; Harvard Law School in 1846; A. M. in 1847.

EDWARD was of the eighth generation from the emigrant, William Hartwell of Concord, Mass. He was married in London, England, July 25, 1889 to MARY LETITIA, daughter of Judge George William and Clara Maria (Brune) Brown of Baltimore, Md., born May 11, 1857, died Sept. 7, 1940.

He was graduated from Amherst College in 1873 and became Vice Principal of the Orange, N. J. high school in that year, and in 1877 was a teacher in the Boston Latin School. In 1876 he received his A. M. degree from Amherst College; PhD in 1881 from Johns Hopkins University in Baltimore; M. D. from Miami Medical College in Cincinnati, Ohio in 1882; and LL.D. from Amherst in 1898. In 1877-78 he was a student of medicine in Cincinnati, and in 1879-80 a fellow of Johns Hopkins University.

Many activities engaged his attention. In 1883-91 he was Associate Physical training and director of gymnasium at Johns Hopkins University, and he established the first department of physical education in the U. S. while there. He was Director of Physical Training in the Boston Public schools from 1891 to 1897; Secretary of the Statistical Dept., City of Boston since its establishment in 1897; Chairman of the Massachusetts State Commission for the Blind in Boston 1906-8; Special expert agent U. S. Dept. of Labor in Europe 1888-89; had studied in Berlin, Vienna and Stockholm and made special investigations in Hygiene, education and statistics in Great Britain, Germany, Russia and Scandinavia.

A translation from the Swedish "Klein's Handbook on Massage" was made by him, and he wrote numerous pamphlets, articles and reports upon physical training, school hygiene and the condition of the Blind, as well as articles in publications of the U. S. Dept. of Labor, U. S. Bureau of Education, National Municipal League and American Statistical Association. He was a member of the medical and Chirurgical Faculty of Maryland, Boston Society of Medical Improvement, and the American Statistical Association.

Club affiliations: St. Botolph; Twentieth Century and Podingstone of Boston. During the latter part of his life he was a biometrician in the Dept. of Vital Statistics in Boston. He died in Jamaica Plain, Mass., Feb. 19, 1922, and was buried in the family lot in Littleton, Mass.

EDWARD MUSSEY HARTWELL-2

The following is from the Colonial Society of Massachusetts, November 22, 1922:

Edward Mussey Hartwell, --Secretary of the Statistical Department of the City of Boston. The mention of his office gives no indication whatever of the value of his services to city and nation. He was teacher, physician, statistician, investigator and writer. It was his aim in life to better the condition of those who needed help: children and the Blind. His kindness was genuine; he was modest without affectation; manly and therefore lovable; he endeared himself greatly to those who know him for his friendship was life-long and was a constant source of helpfulness and cheer.

EMILY SUSAN HARTWELL

EMILY SUSAN HARTWELL, daughter of Charles and Lucy E. (Stesrns) Hartwell, and of the 8th generation from William of Concord, was born in Foochow, China April 16, 1859, and died October 2, 1951. She was graduated from Wheaton Seminary at Norton, Mass. in 1883, returning in September of that year as a teacher, but on hearing of her mother's death she resigned to return to Foochow under the American Board Commissioners for Foreign Missions. There she taught in Foochow College and had charge of the Bible women. She was acting head of the College during the furlough of the President 1896-1897. When she was on furlough in the United States in 1893-94, she was chosen first Field Secretary of the Congregational Women of Minnesota. During this time she raised money for work in China--the Union Kindergarten Training School and the Kate C. Woodhull Hospital. Youth and orphans always had great appeal and she early supported orphans on faith. Independent of organized missions, she and Chinese Christian leaders in 1910 started what became the Christian Herald Fukien Homes, a home for industrial training of 200 orphans. This was later carried on by the Fukien government and Chinese philanthropy.

On the overthrow of the Manchu government in 1911 she helped feed the starving Manchus in the Manchu quarters. At one time there were 1000 in the bread line. In 1919 she was decorated by the President of China for her outstanding philanthropic work. In 1921, when home on furlough with her plea for industrial education, the Christian Herald organized in 1922 the Christian Herald Industrial Missions in China at Foochow for carrying further the industrial education. On reaching retirement age, at the request of the Chinese, she continued living in Foochow but returned to this country in 1938 to raise funds for the Chinese Causes.

Due to the 2d World War she was never able to return to China. During her 54 years of service in Foochow she was active in almost every branch of missionary service, including pioneer work in the Sunday School and the Christian Endeavor Society, anti-opium, anti-foot binding, orphanage, industrial as well as evangelical and educational work of the mission. She received the honorary degree of Master of Arts from her alma mater, Wheaton College, and was a life member of the Colonial Chapter of the Daughters of the American Revolution of Minneapolis. At her death the American Board telegraphed her family "We thank God for the life and work of Emily Hartwell."

FRANK EUGENE HARTWELL

Frank Eugene Hartwell, one of the most versatile Hartwells of whom we have any knowledge--printer, meteorologist, artist, artisan, author, legislator, photographer--was born in Cardington, Ohio, August 13, 1873, the youngest of three sons of Oliver Cromwell and Harriet Hallway (Smith) Hartwell. He is a descendant in the ninth generation of William of Concord and his elder son, John and his first wife, Priscilla Wright.

Gene, as he is familiarly called, was a somewhat precarious child. By the time he was three years old he had learned to read "primer" style. His education was carried through the next six years by his mother, an ex-school teacher, after which he attended public school in a small village in western Ohio until he was graduated at the age of sixteen from their newly organized high school, as one of their first class of four boys. During vacations he learned printing on a four page country newspaper, contributing to a certain extent to the news columns. After high school he followed this trade through a number of towns and cities, finally landing in the Government Printing Office in 1897.

On December 25th, 1893, he married Berta, daughter of Edgar M. and Emma (Gardner) Chase, b May 31, 1871. By this marriage he has two surviving children, Erva H. Boylon, widow, who operates a small elite resort on St. John of the Virgin Islands, and Ralf, who is a successful industrialist in New Jersey. He was divorced from this wife and on July 18, 1932 he married Florence Grace, daughter of Jasper C.

and Nellie (Goff) Baker, born August 9, 1882, who has been a tower of strength to him since that time.

After three years in the Government Printing Office in Washington, D. C., he entered the Weather Bureau printing plant at Lincoln, Nebraska, and in his own words "it took me just three years to work my way out of the printing end of it into a swivel chair". For four and a half months in the season of 1904 he was in charge of a hurricane station in Cienfuegos, Cuba, then to Key West, Florida until 1908, when for personal reasons he requested transfer and was assigned to Richmond, Virginia as first assistant. Learning that there was to be a vacancy at San Juan, P. R., he applied for that post and held it for ten years, seven of which he was in charge. He was transferred to Burlington, Vermont in 1919 for administrative reasons, where he operated the first pilot balloon station in northern New England for eleven years, then back to San Juan in 1930 where he had complete charge of the Caribbean area until 1935. "Retirement laws caught up with me then and I returned to Vermont".

His contacts were many and varied, and from all walks of life. He knew personally three different governors of Puerto Rico, among them Theodore Roosevelt, Jr., Chief of Police Shanton, and was "consulting meteorologist" for the School of Tropical Medicine. In his work with the Weather Bureau he had many harrowing experiences and successfully overcame many difficulties including the full direction of the work while lying in bed with a broken back; the erection of buildings wholly or partially destroyed by hurricanes, long exhausting walks to remote stations when other ways of transportation were absent, etc. He was the recipient of many letters of appreciation and commendation, one of which read:

"Mr. F. E. Hartwell, Burlington, Vermont, Director of the Burlington U. S. Weather Bureau, should be especially commended for his whole-hearted co-operation and assistance in furnishing daily weather data which was invaluable in connection with the planning of all air operations". B. D. Foulis, Lt. Col., Air Corps, Commending. And from El Paia, September 27, 1932: "...the magnificent work of the Weather Bureau in regard to the disaster which Puerto Rico has suffered. That office announced the phenomenon of time...the reports of the Weather Bureau were precise, mathematical; El Paia Congratulates..."

Since leaving the service of 1935 his home has been "up in the woods" of Vermont where he reads the Bulletins of the American Meteorological Society, pushes a lawn mower, shovels snow, juggles storm windows and screens, fights gnats, mosquitos, wood chucks and porcupines, builds closets and conveniences, does painting, plumbing, carpentering, roofing, chair caning; "dabbles a bit" with literary organizations and with paints and camera, and does beautiful needlepoint. He writes "nobody taught me to do needlepoint, I taught myself. You know, you have seven senses instead of five. The other two are horse and common". An example of his needlepoint hangs in President Eisenhower's home in Gettysburg. In the second semester of the school year of 1938-39 he was teaching meteorology to a group of embryonic air pilots for the University of Vermont. He qualified for the "251 Club" by visiting all the townships in Vermont, represented his "balliwick" in the Vermont Legislature in 1956, and was one of three delegates to represent Vermont at the Federal-State conference on Aging in Washington in June 1956. From 1942 to 1947 inclusive Mr. and Mrs. Hartwell did yeoman service with the Masonic Service Association in welfare work among the armed services. This work took them to Jacksonville, Florida; Columbia, S. C.; Newport, R. I.; and finally to Asheville, N. C. The work consisted in operating recreation centers during the war and in hospital visitation work during and following the war. He is still rated as "Field Agent Emeritus" by the Masonic Service Association.

In addition to his other pursuits after retirement, he went back to his old trade--printing--with a little shop in the parlor, later relegated to the garage when other interests intervened, and finally moved to the "cellar" where he printed a number of things including a little forty-page magazine. And in 1957-58, in his 85th year, he wrote, hand set the type and printed one page at a time on a 7 x 11 foot-power C & P press of the vintage of 1868 a 168 page book of his experiences called "Forty Years of the Weather Bureau", the limited edition of which was exhausted in ninety days, and from which, with the permission of the author, some of the statements in this paper have been drawn. In this book he writes "I was never one to sit down much and do the Macawber act, so now I am not inclined to sit and wait for the Reaper. I am inclined to think that the Reaper catches up with those who sit and wait much quicker than those who stay a jump ahead by forgetting him and keeping on the go". May Frank Eugene Hartwell keep ahead of the Reaper for years to come!

HARRY HARTWELL

HARRY HARTWELL, ninth generation from William of Concord, was a son of Charles E. and Lucy Ann (Rice) Hartwell, was born in Providence, R. I., June 6, 1869 and died in Middletown, Ohio, Oct. 8, 1952. He married Nov. 20, 1902, Emily H., daughter of Charles W. and Georgiana M. (Taylor) Geoghegan of Chicago, born in Argentina, May 12, 1873, died July 26, 1940; married 2d wife May 22, 1941, Mary Rice Danford. There were no children.

He was an internationally known civil engineer who began business in New York in 1890 as a draftsman and assistant engineer engaged in the Third Avenue Cable Road construction, and in 1894 for construction of Broadway, Columbus Avenue and Lexington Avenue Lines. In 1896-98 he was assistant engineer reconstructing cable roads for electric roads for the Metropolitan Street Railway Co., in New York, and also undertook private engineering in Kingston, Jamaica, and Havana, Cuba in connection with promotion of electric lines and securing of concessions in both cities.

In 1899-1902 he was in San Paula, Brazil, as Chief Construction Engineer for San Paula Tramway Light and Power Co. From 1902 to 1904 in London, England with J. G. White Co. In 1904 in charge of Nashville office for Ford, Bacon and Davis, consulting engineers, and in 1905-07 chief engineer United Railroads of San Francisco, and after the fire, did work involving rehabilitation of track, railway and buildings.

In 1907-1912 he was associated with Sanderson and Porter, N. Y., report work in Sonora, Mexico in charge of constructing high tension transmission line, then in Victoria, B. C., in charge of location and construction of a new water supply. In 1912, again with Pearson Engineering Corp. duties generally executive, in charge of special engineering projects. In 1914, in Winnipeg, Canada as consulting engineer hydro-electric development of Winnipeg River. Office closed in Aug. 1916 because of the war. In 1917, until his retirement, he was back in New York with Chandler and Co., investment bankers.

He spoke some Spanish, and spoke Portuguese fluently. He was a member of the American Society of Civil Engineers; American Society of Mechanical Engineers; New York Railroad Club; Engineers Club of New York; American Railway Assn., and various Masonic bodies.

HENRY WALKER HARTWELL, eldest son of Alonzo and Sarah Lunt (Walker) Hartwell, was born in Boston, Mass., September 4th 1833. He

came of a distinguished family, and was of the eighth generation from the immigrant, William, of Concord. His great-grandfather was a soldier in the Revolution; his grandfather a much respected farmer in Littleton, Mass., and his father a well known wood engraver and portrait Painter.

Soon after the birth of Henry, the family moved back to the Hartwell home in Littleton, and the boy grew up there and attended local schools and Lawrence Academy in Groton. He then went to Boston and studied architecture in the office of Joseph Billings. About 1850 the family moved from Littleton to Waltham, and there, on June 9th, 1857, Henry married Sarah Elizabeth Miller, and they lived in Waltham for the rest of their lives except for three years in the early 1870s when they were in Boston.

In 1863 Henry and his brother, Albert enlisted in the 44th Mass. regiment, a nine month's service. Henry was soon promoted to corporal. They were stationed in North Carolina, saw some fighting, and were besieged in the town of Washington, N. C. Henry's diary and letters to his wife give a vivid picture of their experiences. After the war he considered giving up his profession and going West on to a small farm. He took a trip as far as Wisconsin but found nothing that seemed favorable and on his return opened an office in Boston.

In 1868 he formed a partnership with Albert E. Swasey, Jr., of Taunton. Together they did a good deal of public work--churches, a town hall, etc., in Taunton, Fall River, Pawtucket and Central Falls, R. I., besides private houses in that neighborhood as well as in places nearer Boston. This partnership was dissolved after a few years.

In 1881 the partnership with William Cummings Richardson was formed, and in 1895 James Driver was taken into the firm. In 1905 Mr. Hartwell retired from active work although his name remained in the firm. During these years many private houses, several churches, some libraries, and many school houses were built. Among these were high schools in Springfield, Dorchester, Somerville, buildings for normal schools in Hyannis, Framingham, Westfield, Bridgewater, Normal Art School in Boston, the Unitarian and Congregational churches in Somerville, Town Hall and Savings Bank in Leominster, the Pilgrim Church in Plymouth, R. R. stations in Greenfield and Waltham on the Fitchburg R. R., schools, banks and business blocks in Waltham besides many other buildings in various places.

For many years Henry personally superintended the erection of all the houses and buildings planned in his office. He was very particular that all specifications should be carried out exactly as stated and no inferior materials should be used. The superintendence involved much travel. It was in the days before telephones were common and he would often telegraph home if he was to be delayed, so that the family would not be worried. As he grew older it seemed best to conserve his strength and a paid superintendent was employed.

In 1878 Mr. Hartwell was called to Washington as an expert to consult with others on the selection of plans for the restoration of the Patent Office building. His engineering skill was well known.

Like most of the Hartwells, Henry was fond of music. Although he never studied it, he played the organ in a church in Watertown, Mass. in 1857, and in 1861 was doing the same thing in the Unitarian church in Waltham. In those days professional skill was not demanded in a country church. He sang tenor and at that time there were many meetings of the members of the choir in the Hartwell home. As the son and daughter grew up the family made a pleasant quartet that sang together Sunday evenings, the mother and father singing soprano and tenor, and the children filling the other parts. He always enjoyed the piano duet playing of the son and daughter.

In September, 1889, after a happy summer at the shore, his only son, Ernest, was drowned by the overturning of a small sail boat in Boston Harbor. This was a terrible blow to the family and Henry never wholly recovered from it. Ernest was following in the footsteps of his father and was to have taken into the firm in a few months. For a long time Henry could not bear to hear the piano played, but this passed after a time and music again became a pleasure.

It was at this time also that he withdrew from all active work in Masonry. He had devoted much time to this for many years, had been High Priest of Royal Arch Chapter, and Master of Monitor Lodge in Waltham, as well as head of St. Bernard Commandery of Knights Templars in Boston. At this time of his death he was the oldest living past head of all these organizations and was held in high esteem by the members. A delegation from the Commandry visited him one afternoon in February, 1918, at his home in Waltham to mark the fiftieth anniversary of his joining the organizations.

The family was Unitarian in its religious affiliations and Henry was active in the First Parish in Waltham. For several years he was chairman of the Parish Committee. He read a great deal, biography and essays, was fond of Dickens and in his later years, of Shakespeare. He liked quiet evenings at home with his evening papers, a book and a cigar. He was devoted to his family and did all in his power for their happiness and comfort.

Although he never kept a horse he liked to drive, and on pleasant Sunday afternoons in summer a horse and surrey was procured from the livery stable and the family went for a drive. He liked to sail and fish. When the Leighton brothers owned and operated Appledore Hotel at the Isles of Shoals off Portsmouth, N. H., he often went there for a week or more for sailing and fishing. In politics he was a Republican, but not so "dyed in the wool" that he did not use his own judgement about candidates, and he voted for Cleveland for President in 1884.

After Mrs. Hartwell's death in 1907, Henry and his daughter continued to live in the house he had built in Waltham in 1870, going to the seashore or the mountains for a few weeks each summer. He died in Waltham, Dec. 30, 1919. The many letters received by his daughter at this time showed the respect and affection with which he was regarded.

The following is quoted from the American Encyclopedia of Biography: "Mr. Hartwell was a man respected and honored in the daily walks of life, and was beloved because he was genuine, whole-hearted, honest, direct, just and prompt in his dealings, considerate and thoughtful to all, regardless of time, place or circumstances or people. He was always the same sterling friend to humanity and very thoughtful of those who were in his service. The deeds performed by him in their interest and for their comfort were innumerable, thus in their hour of need, many had cause to be thankful to him and bless him for his kindness. In Mr. Hartwell's life and character there developed, along with the hereditary traits of the Puritans, which were his birthright, the stern elements which from his early youth had influenced his education."

From an editorial in the Waltham Daily Free Press:

"The passing of Henry Walker Hartwell removes from among our people one more of those old times courtly men who are becoming sadly few now-a-days. The old time courtesy that marked respect for the sobering factors of life, that chivalry towards women, is becoming so noticeably a thing of the past that one misses the men who were their exponents when they pass on. Mr. Hartwell was a long time resident of Waltham and of the highest type of citizenship. Born of more than usually talented parents he well upheld the family name."

Dr. JOHN AUGUSTUS HARTWELL

Dr. JOHN AUGUSTUS HARTWELL was a great surgeon, a senior statesman of his profession, and a vigorous, attractive personality; few men have the ability or the good fortune to serve their times and their calling as fully as he did.

He was born in Sussex, N. J., Sept. 27, 1867, the son of Samuel Slawson and Mary Clarinda (Stiles) Hartwell and of the ninth generation from the emigrant, William, of Concord, Mass., and he early showed the interest in science and the physical and intellectual excellence which marked his later career. After preparing for college at the Sedgewich School, Grear Barrington, Mass., he entered the Sheffield Scientific School of Yale, graduating in 1889 at the early age of nineteen. He had financed his college course by coaching rowing crews in summer vacations, and was himself a notable oarsman and football player. It was at the training table that he won the nickname of "Josh", by which many friends knew him.

Distinguished as a student as well as an athlete, he proceeded to graduate study at Sheffield serving also as an assistant in physiological chemistry, and in 1892, received his medical degree cum lauda from the Yale School of Medicine. There followed another year of graduate work at the College of Physicians and Surgeons in New York City, and three years of internship at the Presbyterian Hospital in New York until in 1897, Dr. Hartwell was ready to begin his long career as physician and surgeon.

Though his private practice was extensive, it was impossible for a man of his gifts, temperament and zeal for his chosen work ever to be solely a private practitioner. It was inevitable that he should continue his intellectual interests, and wholly characteristic that he should do battle in the public interest for those things which he felt to be just. This was the quality which caused one of his colleagues to call him "the elder Cato," in recognition of his stern insistence of fighting for those causes which appealed to his strong social consciousness. His many appointments and complex activities become understandable when it is realized that they were motivated by his passionate desire not only to serve humanity through surgery, but to further the advance of his profession in every way open of him.

In the year following his internship, Dr. Hartwell began his long course of teaching at the Cornell Medical School from 1898 to 1938, starting as an instructor in Physiology and holding variously the posts of Demonstrator in Anatomy, Assistant, then Associate Professor of Surgery, and Professor of Clinical Surgery. At Cornell he organized a "pay clinic" for people of moderate income, a successful undertaking which demonstrated Dr. Hartwell's awareness that medical practice must not be divorced from social or economic realities. As consulting surgeon he served at many hospitals, including the New York, Bellevue, Lincoln, Reconstruction, Memorial, New York Infirmary for Women and Children, the Laurence Hospital of Bronxville and the United Hospital of Post Chester. His appointment as Attending Surgeon at the Presbyterian Hospital where he had interned was a source of great satisfaction to him.

When the United States entered World War I, he offered himself for active service with the Medical Corps., but was rejected on account of a peripheral vascular disease, the result of an attack of typhoid fever. His war services were nevertheless characteristically distinctive. In July 1917 he was appointed National Advisor on Surgical Dressings for the American Red Cross, and in November of that year began the direction of a special course in war surgery at Bellevue in co-operation with the Cornell Medical School. Some two hundred medical officers assigned by the Surgeon General attended this course. In January 1918, Dr. Hartwell was commissioned Major in the Medical Corps and in July went to France, continuing his supervision of Red Cross Supplies, and studying surgery in the evacuation and field hospitals during the Meuse-Argonne battle. After the armistice he returned to this country as consulting surgeon for the Debarkation Hospitals in New York, serving until he was discharged from the army in July, 1919.

He had long been active in civic and professional societies, but following the war this part of his work became increasingly important. He was president of the New York Surgical Society from 1921 to 1923, president of the Society of Clinical Surgery in 1928 and 1933, and in 1918 began his long and productive work in directing the affairs of the New York Academy of Medicine, of which he had been a fellow since 1901. He served the Academy as vice-president from 1918 to 1920, as president from 1929 to 1933, as director from 1934 to 1939 and as trustee in 1928, 1933-34, and 1939-49. In his connection with the Academy he often appeared as spokesman before civic and legislative bodies; he was a foe of feesplitting and threw influence against over-specialization in medical training. He became deeply interested in cancer control, and in his post as Associate Director of the American Society for the Control of Cancer, greatly improved the administration of the groups concerned in this work. During the last years of his life, when he was partially crippled by the same vascular disease which had troubled him so long, he remained optimistic and impelled by the same energy, vision and enthusiasm which has always distinguished him. In the face of declining revenues he insisted that the Academy should not curtail its efforts in the interest of public health and of extending medical information and education.

He married on April 16, 1910, MARY BUTLER (GREEN) FULTON, born Feb. 3, 1872, died Dec. 23, 1947, an aunt of Mrs. Theodore Roosevelt, Jr., and it is not surprising to find that Dr. Hartwell assumed for many years an active part in the trusteeship of the Town Hall which was founded by his wife's aunt, Eleanor Butler Sanders.

Any profession is fortunate in members who give all of their best years and highest energies to the development of its practices and ideals, and even the most superficial glance at the life of John A. Hartwell shows how thoroughly he was devoted to the best of medical thought and methods. He believed in the practice of medicine for the benefit of the whole community and his death was the loss of the community as well as of his colleagues and friends. "The soil out of which such men as he are made is good to be born in, good to live on, good to die for and good to be buried in." He died November 30, 1940

SHATTUCK OSGOOD HARTWELL

Shattuck Osgood Hartwell, of the eighth generation from the immigrant William of Concord, was born in Littleton, Massachusetts, March 20, 1865 and died November 4, 1946. He was the seventh of eight children born of Josiah Shattuck and his wife Catherine Stone (Mussey) Hartwell of Littleton, where he lived on a small farm until his graduation from Amherst College in 1888. His father was a lawyer who daily commuted by train to his desk in the U. S. Custom House in Boston. His mother was the accomplished daughter of Dr. Ruben D. Mussey, one of New England's famous surgeons who was one time professor of Physics and Surgery at Dartmouth College and later founded a medical school in Cincinnati, Ohio, which became the Medical School of the University of Cincinnati. The Hartwell home at Littleton was one of which obstreperous Harvard students were sometimes "rusticated" as a combined corrective measure for errors in deportment and a continuation of their education, for while there, between farm chores, they were tutored in Latin and Greek.

He was married on July 5, 1894 to Kate Aurelia Wellman, daughter of Dr. Homer O. and Fidelity (Wellman) Hitchcock of Kalamazoo, Michigan, born Dec. 16, 1863, died . . . Three children were born to them.

Previous to receiving his B. A. degree from Amherst, Mr. Hartwell had graduated from the Boston Latin School. At Amherst he was a member of Psi Upsilon fraternity and he was the class poet for the class of 1888. To help defray the expenses of college he taught for one or two years before going to Amherst. After college he taught for two or three years at the Brooklyn Polytechnic School and in 1892 he accepted an appointment as principal of the high school in Kalamazoo, Michigan, where he also taught Latin and Greek. While in Kalamazoo he served as Chairman of the high school Athletic Committee of the Michigan Education Association, in which capacity he played an important part in bringing order out of chaos in the matter of interscholastic athletic competition between secondary schools, a service for which he has been given published credit in Mr. Louis L. Forsythe's book, "Athletics in Michigan High Schools - The First Hundred Years". While at Kalamazoo he also served as President of the Michigan Education Association and was on the summer faculty of the University of Chicago for a number of years, where he taught courses in School Management.

When the Cleveland, Ohio, Public School System found itself in serious difficulties, Mr. Hartwell was selected to be one of a team of

prominent educators from various parts of the nation to survey the Cleveland situation and to recommend suitable changes. Their report was duly published and adopted, and became a text for students of education. The group who made the survey and report became known as the "Cleveland Conference" and met annually for a number of years. Later, they did a similar survey and made recommendations for improvement of the Public Schools of St. Louis, Missouri. Mr. Hartwell's best known contribution to school management was termed "The Platoon System" and was quite generally adopted in the primary schools of the country.

In 1915 Mr. Hartwell accepted a call to be superintendant of schools at Muskegon, Michigan, and in 1918 he was called to act in the same capacity at St. Paul, Minnesota, where he served until his retirement in 1936. While at St. Paul he was also a member of the summer faculty in the College of Education of the University of Minnesota for several summers, and he served in a similar lectureship one summer at the University of Oregon.

Mr. Hartwell was a quiet, unassuming executive who gained the respect and admiration, and often the affection of those with whom he labored not so much by his warm personality as by his capability and his adherence to the principles of fair play and impartiality. He was a staunch member of the Congregational Church but not an ardent denominationalist. At home or at work he was always a cultured but unassuming gentleman.

While at Kalamazoo he was honored by the Ypsilanti State Normal School with the Honorary Degree of Master of Pedagogy, and both the University of Michigan and Kalamazoo Baptist College wished to confer upon the Honorary Degree of Doctor of Laws and Literature. As was characteristic of him, since the invitation to receive the Honorary Degree had first come from the smaller college and had been accepted, he chose to receive his Honorary Doctor's Degree from Kalamazoo College, since both commencements were being held simultaneously. Incidentally, his son, who has written this brief review of his career does not recall ever having seen either honorary parchment since the day it was received. Certainly it was never framed nor displayed prominently, and he was never known as "Doctor" Hartwell, but simply as Mister Hartwell. In St. Paul he enjoyed membership in "The Schoolmaster's C Club", composed largely of College Professors, and he was a Rotarian, both in Muskegon and in St. Paul.

In 1927 the writer made the chance acquaintance of the then President of the University of Indiana. The similarity of names prompted the University President to inquire if Mr. S. O. Hartwell, Superintendent of Schools at St. Paul, were the writer's father. On being told he was, he said, "Your father is one of the ten best educators in the country". It was news to the writer.

SWAN HARTWELL

SWAN HARTWELL, a descendant in the ninth generation from the immigrant William of Concord, Mass., and in the fifth generation from Peter Hartwell and his second wife, Jean Langdon, son of Hugh Nesbit and Mary E. (Davenport) Hartwell, was born in Somerville, N. J., April 29, 1876. He married Nov. 3, 1906, Helen (Burnap) Taylor of Boston, born July 30, 1878, died July, 1926; married second wife Feb. 6, 1929, Edna Marsden (Pratt) Wilson of New York City. There are two children.

The following is from a sketch written by Swan Hartwell:

Both my parents died before they reached the age of sixty. I was compelled to start working at an early age and went to work in the coal mines where I did everything about a colliery including the picking of slate, etc. Later I became a breaker boss and then was promoted to coal inspector. In this capacity I inspected the coal in the cars to see if it was merchantable. After this I went to New York where I was offered a job in the office of Cox Bros. & Co. I ran errands, carried packages and in general filled in where needed. After leaving Cox Bros. & Co., I went to work for Whitney Kemmerer, Inc., as a salesman in the New York area.

In 1893, my father, who was also a coal salesman, and I opened our own business under a partnership known as H. N. Hartwell & Son to continue in our own name the sale of anthracite and bituminous coal. Our first office was three steps down on Kilby Street in Boston, Mass., and consisted of only one room. At the time this partnership was formed, our capital consisted of our nerve and a belief in the future.

About 1910, my father wished to retire and I bought out his interest. It was at this time that the firm was incorporated and I became president. The business began to expand and in the years that followed, as subsidiaries of H. N. Hartwell & Co., Inc., there was the Leggits Creek Coal Co. of Buffalo; Hartwell Coal Co. of New York; Hartwell Barge Co.; Wellhart Steamship Co.; Hartwellson Steamship Co.; Hartwell Coal Co. of Maine; Maine State Coal Depot; Old Colony Wharf Co.; Eastern Fuel Co.; and the White Fuel Corp. Many of these companies have retired from business due to changing conditions and others have been absorbed by the parent concern. A few years ago, H. N. Hartwell & Son, Inc., sold its controlling interest in the White Fuel Corp. for a sum in excess of \$4,000,000.

During the period when we were active in the shipping business, as well as coal and fuel oil business, we maintained docks at New Haven, Conn.; Allyn's Point, Conn.; Providence, R. I.; Boston, Lynn and Newburyport, Mass.; Portland and Bucksport, Maine. The Bucksport operation later transferring to a location at Sandy Point, Maine.

In 1951, in the interest of diversification of operations, this company entered the industrial plastics field handling a product manufactured by the great Saint Gobain Co. of France. About a year and a half later, we entered into an agreement whereby our plastic products were manufactured in this country. The imported plastic pipe varied greatly in its dimensions, and we began to merchandise plastic pipe as true in dimensions as metal pipe. We developed a complete line of fittings to go with this pipe which are comparable to the best fittings produced in this country. We have fabricators located throughout the United States, and our BOLTARON 6200 and 7200 are well known through this country and Canada. Many installations have been made for some of the biggest concerns in all fields of chemistry and heavy industry.

The small concern that I founded with my father in 1893 has grown over the years and made constant progress. It is with pride that I say "we are still doing it."

This was written in 1958. To this may be added the fact that he lives in West Newton, Mass., and although eighty-two years of age, is as active, apparently, as ever, with the same drive and force that has made him an outstandingly successful business man. He was the third president of the Hartwells of America.

WILLIAM WHEELOCK PEET

WILLIAM WHEELCOK PEET, son of Louisa Carolina Rich and Josiah Wheelock Peet, grandson of Elizabeth Hartwell and Thomas W. Rich, in the eighth generation from William of Concord, was born in Fall River, Mass., Feb. 14, 1851, d in Ames, Iowa, Sept. 8, 1942, m Aug. 11, 1881, Martha H., dau of Edward Jones and Martha O. (Crane) Cartildge, b Hunter's Point, L. I., N. Y., Aug. 18, 1856, d Oct. 20, 1920.

He studied at Williston Seminary in Easthampton, Mass.; took optional courses in Iowa (not Grinnell) College in 1874; taught school in Iowa; with Burlington & Missouri R. R. (C. R. & Q.) system as tax agent, assistant land commissioner, assistant to legal dept., chief clerk in charge of general manager's office at Omaha.

In 1881 he accepted a call from A,B,C,F,M. to be business manager of its missions in Turkey, and diplomatic agent of some missions; was in charge of property and adjuster of titles of those properties; treasurer and manager of American Red Cross in Turkey; was awarded the Red Cross Medal of Merit by President Wilson; was in charge of relief work for the American missions in Turkey, and distributed many millions of dollars through that agency.

He was chairman of the committee co-operating with the American Embassy in Constantinople in the winter of 1901 and 1902 for the rescue of the missionary, Ellen M. Stone from brigands; he represented the American mission in Turkey on various commissions; was appointed chairman of the Overseas Administration Committee of the Near East Relief in 1919-1925; was decorated by King George II of Greece "for humanitarian work in the Near East Countries; "and received the Near East Medal of Merit for work "involving courage and ability".

In 1898 he received his M. A. degree from Grinnell College; Doctor of Laws from University of Vermont in 1917, and from Grinnell College the same year; retired from active mission work in 1925.

After his retirement he was appointed by the Federal Council of Churches of Christ in America to be their representative to the Ancient Apostolic Churches in the Near East.

His citation from the Dean of the University of Vermont in 1917 was as follows: For Doctor of Laws, William Wheelock Peet, treasurer and business manager of missions in Turkey. His life a brave ballad of the East and West, dedicating to the troubled lands about the Golden Horn the wisdom, loyalty, love and zeal of the American idealist. Spiritual thinker and practical worker, serving his country by service to the world."

In 1940 he was living with his sister in Chattanooga, Tenn. He left one child, a son, William Hartwell Peet.

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
