As I have uncovered it, this is THE JOHNSON FAMILY STORY:

JOHN JOHNSON, who married MARGERY \_\_\_\_\_ in England, probably London, came to America in 1630 with John Winthrop. He was a surveyor, and laid out most of the towns around Boston. Together with Thomas Dudley and Winthrop they founded the first church in Boston. He was active in defence against the Pequot Indians. His son ISAAC JOHNSON was Captain of the Artillery and was killed in the famous Fort Fight on December 19, 1675.

ISAAC JOHNSON married ELIZABETH PORTER at Roxbury, Mass., where their children were born. Our ancestor, NATHANIEL JOHNSON, was born May 1, 1647 in Roxbury. He was one of the first settlers who went from Massachusetts to settle in Connecticut. He married MARY SMITH, daughter of LAWRENCE and MARY SMITH of Dorchester, Mass. Mary was born February 28, 1642, and died March 6, 1731/2. All of their children, including our ancestor SMITH JOHNSON, were born in Roxbury, Mass., and in 1686 the family moved to Woodstock, Connecticut.

In Connecticut SMITH JOHNSON married SARAH MILLER, who was born January 7, 1679 in Middletown, Conn., daughter of THOMAS and SARAH (Nettleton) MILLER. Thirteen children were born to them, and when he died his estate was appraised at 1650 pounds. Our ancestor was SMITH JOHNSON II born December 12, 1703, in Woodstock, Conn.

SMITH JOHNSON II stayed in Woodstock, Conn., married November 16, 1726 EXPERIENCE PARKER, had six children, including our ancestor, SMITH JOHNSON III, born December 2, 1736, after the death of his father April 28, 1736.

SMITH JOHNSON III lived and died in 1812 in Woodstock, Conn. He married SARAH GOULD, daughter of THOMAS and REBECCA (Lyon) GOULD, on October 10, 1759. After the birth of six children to Sarah, in 1776 Smith married the second of his three wives. Our ancestor, HEZEKIAH JOHNSON was the fourth child in the family, the second son named Hezekiah, since their first-born died.

The Vital Records of Woodstock, Conn., the Congregational Church Records at Woodstock Hill, Family Bible Records at the Conn. State Library were searched by the librarian. Our own family Bible states Hezekiah Johnson was born January 21, 1768. "Johnson, Hezekiah, son of Smith and Sarah, bapt. July 24, 1768 Woodstock (Woodstock Hill) 1st Cong. Ch. H.C.B.:221."

When grandfather Hezekiah answered the Census of 1855 in Allegany Co., N.Y. he gave Connecticut as his place of birth. I wrote to the state librarian and received the above information as well as information concerning the second Smith Johnson. The Woodstock Vital Records led me to the rest. The census also said he was a farmer, and one of the biographies I found said he bought land from the Holland Lumbering Co. This biography indicated he went from there to Illinois by way of Iowa, after the death of his wife in New York State.

HEZEKIAH JOHNSON, born in Woodstock, Conn., married HANNAH EMERSON of Hampstead, New Hampshire, January 18, 1796. From her birth date, August 22, 1768, the N.H. State Librarian provided the information that her parents were CALEB and ABIGAIL (French) EMERSON. From that I was able to trace her back to her 1630 immigrant ancestor: ROBERT EMERSON. Our great-grandfather, WINTHROP T. JOHNSON, their son, must have been about seven when they made their famous walk to Allegany Co., N.Y. They may have started walking from Vermont, perhaps they had been living there, but he and his brothers and sisters were born in New Hampshire.

## JOHNSON FAMILY

JOHN JOHNSON, the progenitor of our line, came to America probably with Winthrop's fleet in 1630. He was chosen by the General Court of Roxbury, Massachusetts, as Constable, in that year. He came from England.

The English home of John is not known. However, it is known that he had correspondence with relatives who resided within twelve miles of London on the River Lee, so it is safe to say he came from that vicinity.

He married Margery in England. Her maiden name is not certain, but from certain legal documents extant it is assumed to have been Margery Heath. According to Savage he came with two sons, Isaac and Humphrey, and probably three daughters, since five children are listed.

He was a Freeman in 5/18-1631, was known as a man of distinction and good reputation. He landed at Salem when he came with Winthrop, June 26, 1630. He settled at Roxbury. At least one of his daughters was married as his son-in-law, Richard Mowry, became a Freeman with him. He was active as a Jurymen, served on numerous committees of the government, surveyed and laid out the bounds of towns around Boston.

On March 4, 1634, John Johnson and Richard Duner were ordered to build a bridge across Muddy River, five towns being assessed to pay the cost. He served as a member of the committee to determine the valuation of the towns in 1635, 6, 7; was a Deputy in 1637 to levy on towns to raise 50 men to fight against the Pequots. He was Surveyor General, which included responsibility for arms and ammunition for the Colony. There is a story of the burning of his house and the arms stored there, told in Gov. Winthrop's "History." This is also told in Drake's "History of Roxbury, Mass." He was elected to the House of Deputies for 21 years, mostly continuous.

"Capt. John Johnson was 1st Clerk of the Ancient and Honorable Artillery. His son, Isaac, was its Captain and leader at one time. It is the oldest military organization in the Country, founded 3/13-1638, and which still proudly maintains its existence. Upon the rolls of its members are to be found the names of men who in their day, through the entire history of Massachusetts were foremost in peace and war, and who occupied the highest place in Science, Art, Literature and in social, political and military life. At no time could any but a distinguished citizen have become a member of its society."

Isaac was the eldest son of John and came to this country with him. He was Freeman 3/4-1635, member of Ancient and Honorable Artillery in 1645, became Capt. in 1667. He was Capt. of Roxbury Co. of Narraganset Expedition and was killed at the head of his company in famous Fort Fight on December 19, 1675. (Near Four Corners, Sakonnet River, Rhode Island.) He was an original donor of the Free School.

HEZEKIAH and HANNAH were the oldest known members of the family until 1966.  
 Family tradition said they came from Vermont, walking to Allegany Co., N.Y.  
 in 1817, according to obituary of Winthrop T. Johnson.

The Census of 1855 showed them both residents of Centerville town, gave  
 their ages, listed their states of origin. State librarians supplied  
 information of their parents and birthplaces.

The Census also listed his occupation as a farmer. Later family histories  
 state he had bought his land from the Holland Lumbering Company, cleared his  
 farm, and raised his family in New York. After the death of Hannah,  
 Hezekiah moved to Melugin's Grove (later Compton), Illinois, to live with  
 his son Caleb, perhaps reaching there by way of Belleview, Iowa, where  
 another son, Winthrop was then living.

Obituary received from Arthur Sloate, grandson of Emiline Johnson:  
 "Winthrop Johnson was born in Vermont March 23, 1810, walking to the state of New York when seven years of age, in 1817, on foot with his father. He remained there until 1855, then emigrated to Jackson Co., Iowa, going across the country with teams. He remained there 18 months, then removed to the state of Illinois, and located near Freeport. He remained there one year, then came to Lee County and located in Viola Twp. and has lived there ever since. He was married to Catherine Farrington Feb. 29, 1829, and they lived together until her death, which occurred Feb. 18, 1882, making a married life of a little over 53 years. He was the father of 15 children, but six of whom are still living, three sons and three daughters. One son and two daughters are in Clay Co., Iowa, one daughter in Nicholson, Dodge Co., Neb., two sons here and one in Steward and the other he was living with at the time of his death, which occurred April 25, 1884, at 10 A.M., age 74 years, one month, two days. He was amember of the Free Will Baptist Church while living in the state of New York. Three of the sons were in the late war, two of which died in the service." This was the original newspaper clipping, received 2/22-1966. It was also copied in the notes of Jessie Parker Warner, daughter of Emiline Johnson, who had done much work on the family genealogy. This reflects the family error of stating he had been born in Vermont. An ornate Family Register in my possession lists only 13 children.

Smith Johnson came west and raised a large family. They settled around Compton, Ill. and children married and raised families. Mostly farmers. Many descendants settled, scattered in 1961 when Jessie Parker made book.

In Smith's biography it states he had a superior education, built the first schoolhouse on his own land. Lived in Allegany Co., until 1836 when he came west by lake and team. This gives him only 4 children. His son Truman b. 4/3-1832 served in Civil War Co I 15th Ill., in N.C. Later he was a school trustee. m. 1/29-1860 Mary E. Melugin of Melugin's Grove. 10 children: Harvey, Addie, Rosa, George, Walter, Franklin, May, Dollie, Maud, Wilber. I have not looked for these people. 1967.
