Stewart, who was born in Black River Falls, Jackson Co., Wis., in 1857. They have three children-Rena M., Mertie C. and Milton M. His father, Peter, was born in 1801, in Canada; emigrated to the United States in 1845, settled at Fort Clinton, Ohio, and in 1854 came to Richland county and located in the town of Marshall, early in the settlement of that territory. John J. Jewell, one of the most prominent business men and farmers of the town of Blocm, was born in Carroll Co.; Ohio, in 1828, where

his youth was spent, and he received such education as he was able to obtain in the district schools of his native county. In 1855 he moved to Vernon Co., Wis., settled in the town of Union, remained six months, then moved to the town of Bloom, Richland county, where he purchased 800 acres of land, which he has since reduced to 500, located on section 1, where he now resides, and is engaged in farming, merchandising, loaning money and buying and selling stock to a large extent in Richland and Vernon counties. He was married in 1854 to Catharine Borland, who was born in the State of Pennsylvania, in 1830. They have seven children—David W., R. R., Enoch, William K., Ezra, John J. and Mary E. William K. is now married to Sarah E. McBain and Mary E. to Lemon T. Smith. When Mr. Jewell came to this country, it was a wilderness; and pluck and energy were necessary elements for success. Remote from mill and market, without roads or easy methods of transportation, with little food and poor shelter, settlement in those days meant for a while almost hermitage, and all bonor is due such men and women as Mr. and Mrs. Jewell, who by sacrifice and effort assisted in putting in motion a series of events, which have made possible the development of so goodly a land. Sometimes it would seem a place has thus been purchased at a cost beyond estimation, but they have lived to enjoy a home honestly gained, a competence fairly won, and are among the best class of Richland county citizens. Mr. Jewell has business qualifications beyond most men, which, combined with economy, energy and good judgment, have enabled him to outstrip others in the accumulation of wealth, until now he is in possession of a sufficiency for every enjoyment during his declining years.

JEWELL FAMILY COAT OF ARMS


Jewell or Jule of Bowden, county Devonshire, England, of this family was John Jewell, Bishop of Salisbury, 1560-71. You will find this in the photostat made from Burke's General Armory, 1884 edition, which gives four recordings, all using the gillyflowers. It is also recorded for that family of Salisbury, cou. Wiltshire as well as in Scotland. See record of guartered arms used by Thomas Lovett, Esq. etc. Bishop John Jewell's arms has a shield with a blue chevron on which is a maidens head of gold, the chevron being between three gillyflowers of red, stalked and leaves are green. On a chief (top part of the shield which is black is a hawk's lure, stringed between two falcons' of silver with beaks and legged of gold. The crest is a cubit arm vested blue and cuffed silver, holding in the hand in natural colors a gillyflower as in the arms, that would be red with stem and leaves of green. The mantling would be gold and blue and the helmet in natural colors. Rather complicated arms but would look very beautiful.

2. Samuel Keener, son of Ulrich and (Ehrehard) Keener. is mentioned in the will of his father as having already re ceived a place. His name is found in the list of taxables in Greene Township, Washington County, Pennsylvania, in 1784 Only later records of him are found in Monongalia County. West Virginia.

Sebastian (Boston) Keener, son of Ulrich and (Ehrehard) Keener, received a Bill of Sale for his father's home place and served as one of the executors with his brother. Samuel Keener, in the estate of Ulrich Keener. The muster roll of Lieutenant William Cress' Company under Colone! Zackwell Morgan is found among the General Edward Hand papers in the Draper Mss. (3NN6) and proves that Sebastian Keener enlisted in the Militia of Monongalia County on September 2, 1777, and was in the service at Fort Pitt on October 1, 1777. The name of Sebastian Keener is on the Greene Township, Washington County, Pennsylvania, Tax lists for 1784. with the notation "lives out of the Township," which is explainable as he had just received the home farm in Fayette County. Pennsylvania. He was taxed in German Township, Fayette County, in 1785. Sebastian Keener was born September 12. 1755. He was probably pioneering on the west side of the Monongahela River when his brother was killed by the Indians. He secured a warrant for his tract of land on Whiteley Creck, next to John Lantz's land, on February 19, 1793, and the same year added to his holding by a purchase from William Minor.

His wife was Margaret Gilleland, daughter of John Gilleland of Fayette County, Pennsylvania, and she is mentioned in his will of March 21, 1820. Margaret (Gilleland) Keener is also mentioned in the will of her sister, Elizabeth Gilleland, and

Margaret's children are named in the will of her sister, Letty Gilleland, who died in Fayette County about 1838. Margaret Gilleland was born January 4, 1758, and died in Greene County on January 26, 1831. She is buried with her husband, who died April 28, 1826. on the original tract of land granted to Sebastian Keener.
