HENRY KENE.

In 1651 there was in Salem village, (now Danvers,) Essex County, Mass., one HENRY KENE. The name is found in several forms in the church records in Danvers, in the records of Salem, and in documents in the State House in Boston. Some of the forms are given below.

This Henry was born in 1624, for, in 1684 deposing as witness to a will, he says he is sixty years old. He was born probably in Holland, of Puritan parentage. The name Kinne is a name found in north and middle England, the native land of the Pilgrim Fathers.

In 1712, HENRY KENNEY, in a quit-claim deed to his brother John, speaks of their father Henry "now deceased."

HENRY KENE, doubtless, and others of his name lie buried in an old ground in Danvers, not far from the house in which Gen. Israel Putnam was born in 1718. This ground is in part at least made up of land once owned by this Henry.

There are no monuments in Danvers bearing the name.

Savage, in his Genealogical Dictionary, under the name Kenny or Kenney, gives together with Henry of Salem, Thomas of Gloucester, 1664, Richard of New Hampshire, 1670, and Andrew of Malden, whose son Samuel was born in 1690.

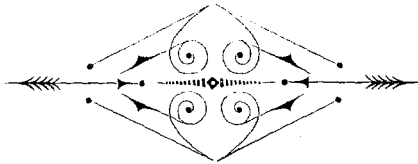

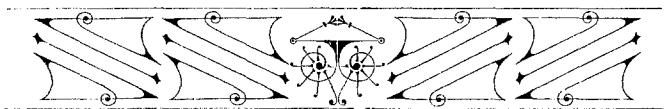

The will of Thomas Kenny is dated 30th May, 1687. Estate inventoried 14th June, 1687.

On Feb. 6, 1695, guardians are appointed by the Court of Probate for the children of Thomas and Elizabeth Kene, both deceased.





THOMAS AND JOSEPH,
OF PRESTON.

In 1706, Joseph Kenney and Kozlah, his wife, grand-daughter of Francis Peabody, of Topsfield, sell their lands and remove to Preston, now Griswold, Conn. Both sign the deed by their marks, as does the first Henry, but his mark is a well formed H.

In December, 1715, Thomas Kinne and Martha, his wife, sell their lands in Salem, and buy 150 acres in Preston, Conn., adjoining land of his brother Joseph, on the south side of the River Pachaug, including the site of the present Glasgo Post Office.

These two men (Thomas and Joseph) are grand-sons, through Thomas, of Henry of Salem. They brought with them the tradition that their grandfather Henry came from Holland.

Thomas, of Preston, one of the founders and first Deacon of the "Second Church of Christ in Preston," (now the First Congregational Church of Griswold, and known as the Pachaug Church,) died 1st October, 1756. Captain Joseph, of Preston, died 12th July, 1745. They lie buried, probably each on his own land, with many of their descendants, in the old Kinne burying ground on the banks of the Pachaug, in the south-eastern part of Griswold, Conn.

Sept. 2, 1752, and all dates before are Old Style dates: all dates after, New Style. Twelve days must now be added to an Old Style date, in order to bring it into New Style. After 1900, thirteen days.

The foregoing summary of family names and dates is given, not as an end in itself, but as a possible means of assistance in the study of family history.

Few of the descendants of Henry Kinne, of Salem, through the brothers Thomas and Joseph, of Preston, have now an excuse for inability to trace their ancestry.

Certain facts, however, are not yet determined. The missing links should be supplied.

Cannot the marriage, or the death before marriage, of every child of Thomas and Joseph be established?
