Woburn, Mass. was originally called Charlestown Village.

December 18, 1640 he (Francis Kendall) with thirty-one others

subscribed the "Town Orders" of Woburn.

Marriage Record

Ffrancis Kendall, alias Miles and Mart Tedd (Tidd) maryed 24" of 10 mo. (Dec. 34) 1644.

Francis Kendall built the first mill in Woburn. He was a town officer and a man of great respectability and influence. His wife Mary Tidd was the daughter of John Tidd and Margaret of Woburn from Charlestown.

John Kendall, progenitor of the American family lived in the County of Cambridge, England in 1646 and died there in 1660. Two of his sons came to America. Francis of Woburn and Deacon Thomas Kendall a proprietor of Reading, Mass. in 1644. Thomas had ten daughters but no sons who d, assoi don d, per Francis served eighteen years as selectman of Woburn at different times and on important committees.

Francis Kendall lived about a mile west on the road to Lexington. In his will dated May 9, 1706 he called himself a miller. He left & the mill to John, & to Thomas and & to Samuel.

Alice Hassell Temple was the daughter of Richard Hassell, born 1622 and his wife Joan. Christopher Temple was born 1660 and married Alice Hassell Dec. 3, 1685. He was killed by the Indians September 28, 1691.

April 25, 1896 Jacob bought eight tracts of land (about 120 A) from Benjamin Pierce for the consideration of seventy ponds sterling and an agreement on the part of Jacob Kendall to care for and maintain Benj. Pierce's aged father and mother, Robert Peirce and Mary Knight, for life. Mary Knight died March 18, 1701 and Robert Peirce died September 10, 1706. About 1716 Jacob moved to Billerica. In 1736 he removed to Bedford to live with his oldest son Jacob.

Lieut. John Kendall moved to Dunstable in 1726. Buritd at "Meeting House Hill" near Nashua, New Hampshire. Susannah-----was his second wife.

In 1743 he was selectman of Dunstable and one of the assistants of the town clerk in recording the votes of the time.

The choice of spots on the church floor for building pews was made to members in accordance with the amount of their taxes

and Lieut. John Kendall having the eighth choice selected spot numbered one. This was October 21, 1757 and John and his wife Susannah appear this year among the signers of the Church Covenant.

Temple Kendall was Town Clerk of Dunstable, Mass.

Temple Kendall was a Lieutenant under Capt. John Ford at the Battle of Bunker Hill.

On the alarm of Lexington, Temple Kendall went out as a private in Capt. Ruben Butterfield's company of Militia, Col.

David Green's regiment, which marched on the morning of April 19, 1775 to Cambridge and disbanded April 22, 1775. Service

three days. May 31, 1776 he was commissioned First Lieut. in Capt.Oliver Cumming's company, the 9th (West Co.in Dunstable). Lieutenant Col.Simeon Spaulding's (7th Middlesex Co.) regiment of Massachusetts Militia. He was also a Lieutenant in Capt.John Ford's Company of Molunteers, Col. Johathan Reid's regiment, raised in Dracut, Chelmsford and Dunstable with roll dated at Chelmsford, engaged Sept.27,1777 and marched Sept.30,1777 to reinforce the Morthern Army. Discharged November 8, 1777, service 43 days. First Lieut. in Capt.Joseph Bradley-e Varnum's Company, Col.McIntosh's regiment, Gen.Lovell's Brigade, with roll dated at Dracut and engaged July 29, 1778 and discharged September 11, 1778. Service one month and eighteen days on expedition to Rhode Island and including five days (106 miles) travel home.

Nathaniel Kendall probably settled in Windsor, Wermont shortly after his marriage (November 26, 1789) as he appears in the first United States Census of 1790/with his wife and daughter Hannah, who was born October 29, 1790. He removed in 1807 to Derby, Vermont and purchased a farm north-west of the village. Here he was a deacon in the Baptist Church.

Samuel Stillman Kendall studied medicine with Dr.Moses French

Colby and graduated from medical departments of Vermont University and Dartmouth College. He began practice in Coventry, Vt.

He was town clerk 1836-1844, and 1851-1854. He was town treasurer 1836-1846 and representative to the General Assembly

1838-1851.

About June 1, 1852 he moved to Georgeville Province of Quebec and continued the practice of his profession. His medical attainments were of the very first order and he ranked high in his profession, and with the most unassuming but sincere piety were combined all the qualities which constitute the real gentleman, asys B.F.Hubbard, the historian of Staustead Co.Quebec, Canada.

He and His family were members of the Congregational Church.

Nathaniel Temple Kendall returned to Vermont after the death
of his father in Georgeville, P.Q. in 1856. In the fall of
1857 he came to Warsaw, Ill. to clerk in the store of Charles
H.Case, whose family were patients of Dr. S.S.Kendall. Mr.
Case said Thaniel was so fond of music he would forget has
meals when listening to it. He worked on the farms of Hammond
and Huddleston. He taught school in winter. He taught singing
school. In August 1861 he joined the Black Hawk Colony- was
wounded December 1861 and August 1862-Enlisted in 118th Ill.
Infantry,--Nov. 1862 After siege of Vicksburg he was detailed
for clerical work at Gen. Bank's headquarters in New Orleans.
Recieved his discharge Oct. 1, 1865.

In 1872 he visited his mother in Vermont and then came to Chicago to work for Crane Brothers. He was organist at Reunion Presbyterian Church 1873 to 1884 and at Campbell Park Presbyterian Church 1884 to 1893. He sang first base in the Apollo Quartette and later in Lexington Quartette.

Caroline Morse Huddleston came with her family to Clay County, Missouri in 1846 and to Hancock County, Illinois in 1850. She taught school at Warsaw, Abingdon, Galesburg, in Illinois and Keokuk, Iowa where she was married in 1873. She was a member of the Presbyterian Church. She was fond of good reading and a flower lover and successful gargner.

Laura Melissa Kendall was a graduate of King School and West Division High School in Chicago. She taught at Farragut Elementary School from May 1895 to June 1925 and at Mason School from September 1925 to June 1929-Both schools zee in Chicago. She built a home in Elmhurst, Illinois and moved there April 1911. She joined Christ Church later called First Congregational Church. She enjoyed active membership in Martha Ibbetson Chapter, Daughters of The American Revolution.

Nathaniel Huddleston Kendall inherited a love of music. As a boy he sang in the Episcopal Choirs of St.Luke's, Calvary, and Church of The Epiphany. After hes marriage, he and his wife sang in the Choir at Campbell Park Presbyterian Church and in Elmhurst he sang in the choir at the Congregational Church.

He began work for the B.& O. R.R. as a boy-and became accountant for Chicago Division. Later was Coal Contracting Agent for the Erie R.R. and then Commissioner of Chicago Coal Dealers Association and afterwards of Illinois Coal Dealers Association.
