## EXPLANATORY STATEMENT

There are two general kinds of genealogical record. (1) The "family history" type starts from a common ancestor and fans out downwards, listing his children and their marriages and descendants through successive generations, with chief attention to those families which bear the common surname; such a history may reach a total of thousands of names within a few generations. (2) The "personal ancestry" or "pedigree" type starts from a common descendant, living or recent, and fans out upwards, enumerating his two parents, four grandparents, eight great-grandparents, and so on, the number of family lines and surnames doubling in each generation until the tenth generation enumerates 1024, with a cumulative total of 2046 ancestors in all ten generations. Because of inter-marriages between more or less distant relatives the number of different names will be somewhat less than these figures. The ancestral roster herein presented is of this second type, starting with our two parents, Wayland Briggs Kingsbury and Flora Jane Bush Kingsbury. Since most of our immigrant ancestors were in the ninth generation before them (the tenth before my generation) the magnitude of the outcome is suggested by the figures cited above.

As far as I have been able to go in my search, the Kingsbury-Bush ancestry seems unusually homogeneous. Every immigrant ancestor thus far found (and all our American ancestors were immigrants or descendants of immigrants--although they called themselves "emigrants") came to New England not earlier than 1623 nor much later than 1650, most of them between 1630 and 1642, with the 14,000 Puritans who settled the Massachusetts Bay Colony during those dozen years. Although this homogeneity does not lessen the individual variety in temperament and ability which our forefathers displayed, it did give them (with exceptions, of course) a fairly uniform and definite cultural inheritance, of characteristic New England pattern--pious, frugal, industrious, conscientious and Calvinistic, of strong conventional morality, but narrow and intolerant of unorthodoxy (the clergy and officials more than the general population), living in villages and not on isolated farms--so long as there was danger from Indians--believers in schooling but not "well-read", and devoted to their families. Families were usually large, although with high infant mortality, and often having two or three or even more mothers in rather rapid succession. Occasional hints of this culture, mellowed through later generations, my brothers and I can remember in the virtues of our Kingsbury grandparents.

This genealogical summary is in two parts, the Kingsbury-Brown ancestry (pages 1-16) and the Bush-Moore ancestry (pages 17-32). In each part the material is presented in two ways:

1. The first way is a chart or table (a variant of the familiar fan-shaped chart) in which the names of ancestors are tabulated in columns of successive generations, working backward from each of our two immediate parents (1st generation back), two grandparents (2nd generation back), four great-grandparents (3rd generation), and so on. Because of space limitations, only the five latest generations can be fully named on the first page, the earlier generations being continued backward on following pages, two tables to the page. Each of the 16 ancestors in the 5th preceding generation is then taken as a new starting-point for the 6th and earlier generations, and his (or her) ancestry is continued on the following numbered pages. "Page" or "P" as used in index, tables, and cross-references, always refers to one of these 16 continuation pages, not to the book-pagination (which is in lower-case Roman numerals at bottom of page). These page numbers in right and left margin of the tables give easy reference to the corresponding pages in the family-line summaries which follow. An "Index" appears at the beginning of each of the two (Kingsbury and Bush) ancestries.

2. The second way, "family lines", presents in condensed form dates and other personal information about individuals, and follows the genealogical tables. It is a modification of the form used in Virkus's "Abridged Compendium of American Genealogy", and is perhaps as practicable a way as any of presenting what must be, in any form, a very complicated array of facts. The following explanation of the method of presentation will perhaps make it easier to follow.

This summary is built up around 57 longer or "key-family" lines, roughly half of them in each of the two ancestries, Kingsbury-Brown, and Bush-Moore. If it ever proves practicable to fill in such gaps as exist, especially (as of 1958) in the Blackman, Briggs, and Howard lines for which conclusive data are still elusive, the number will be more than sixty. Three "hypothetical lines" (Curtis, Hobart, Mason), rather plausible but not yet verified, have been included with a brief summary of the evidence pro and con. Each key-family designated by a sub-heading is arbitrarily defined (with one exception) as any family in which three successive American male ancestors occur, either known or probable. Shorter family lines, including only one or two American male ancestors, are summarized under the key-family line into which their daughters and granddaughters married. Limiting the criterion to three American ancestors reduces the number of key-lines to more wieldy proportions. Names in CAPITALS indicate immigrant ancestors, male or female.

Each individual is marked by a number, 1 to 11 or more, which indicates the number of generations before our own in which that person lived; Wayland and Flora are "1", our four Kingsbury and Bush grandparents are "2", and so on. Usually the number precedes the name, e.g. "7-Partridge"; but when tracing ancestors of some other surname the number follows the name; so that to find in one long paragraph the father of a given individual (say Josiah Whitcomb-8) one looks for the same surname but bearing the next higher generation number (John Whitcomb-9). Shorter family lines are indented to separate them more clearly. Cross-references following listings of intermarriages between families (see for example Adams-9, page 16) make it possible to follow a particular line of descent by reference to two or more tables.

If this scheme is once understood, it will not be difficult to trace the American lineage of any of these surnames which vanished through marriage in the second or third generation after arrival in New England. The tabular charts, previously mentioned, make it easy to visualize the line of descent from any ancestor. After each name, year of birth (or baptism) and year of death, if known, are given in parenthesis. One slight complication of the generation-numbering occurs in those families which descend from a common ancestor by two or more lines, through intermarriages between more or less distant relatives. These lines are distinguished by adding "A", "B", or "C" to the generation-number. Most important of such lines are Partridge, Thayer, Whitney, and Chapin (Kingsbury ancestry), and Dewey, Sawyer, Partridge, Morse, and Adams (Bush ancestry). The advantages of bringing together on one page all the lines that start with a common ancestor outweigh, I hope, the slight inconvenience of following cross-references from one page to another in tracing a single line of descent.

A number of abbreviations are used (usually omitting periods), most of which are familiar or readily identified, including those of the usual military, ecclesiastical, and political titles, or where the context makes the meaning clear. Others include:

Dates are usually given "New Style", although many 16th and 17th (and some 18th) century records give both old-style and new-style dates, thus: 1658/9. When the change from the old-style Julian calendar to the New style Gregorian calendar was made (in 1752 in England) not only were 11 days skipped (and must be added to be precise), but New Year's, formerly March 25, was changed to Jan. 1; so that many January, February, and March dates take, by new style, the second of the two years named. There is no certainty that every date herein is accurate, for recorders varied in practice, some using old-style, some new-style, and some both; I have had to use my judgment as to which was intended, and I have probably often guessed wrongly.

One other practice relative to places of residence should be mentioned. Since most of our immigrant ancestors came first to Massachusetts, that colony is implied, unless Conn. (or Ct.), Me, R.I., N.Y. or some other colony or state is specified. There is one exception; some families (several in the Bush ancestry) went from Massachusetts to Connecticut with Parson Hooker's "Great Exodus" of 1636, or soon thereafter; and whenever names of several Connecticut towns (Hartford, Windsor, Wethersfield, Farmington, New Haven, and some others) occur in close succession, "Conn." may have been omitted. If I think any doubt may arise I have usually named the colony or state.

#### THE ANCESTORS

Now, a few additional comments about individual histories. While this summary is confined chiefly to families in America, names of a number of English ancestors are given, sometimes because they point to an interesting earlier history, or have some other characteristic, such for example as the Adams family's fondness for the ancestral names "John" and "Henry". Jordan & Kimball's "Your Family Tree", occasionally mentioned, traces some of these European ancestral lines, historical or legendary. One minor (but sometimes major) source of confusion is the spelling of names; for during the 17th and 18th centuries (before Noah Webster) most people spelled by ear and not by note. Often the bad speller was a town or church clerk who wrote down names as they sounded to him. One consequence is that relevant records are easily overlooked. Plenty of examples will be found in these pages of variations in spelling, not only from one generation to the next, but within the life and practice of a single individual. To discover and record the "correct" spelling is obviously impossible when any spelling is acceptable.

While town histories usually give too little biographical information to satisfy us, and the original records of towns, churches, ministers, wills, and courts (our principal primary sources) give almost none, some classes of information do frequently appear. Admission as freeman, the nearest approach to an "aristocracy" or "ruling class" is often mentioned; freeman status, with its privilege of voting for governor, deputies, and magistrates, requiring as it did in early Massachusetts church membership and a certain property valuation, was enjoyed by 138 out of 254 of our own first and second generation ancestors, about



four times as many in proportion to population as among 17th century New Englanders in general, a fact which helps describe their status; although I feel sure not all our freeman ancestors of that century are so noted in the records. Selection by the community for some position of civic responsibility is usually a matter of record, such as selectman (sometimes called "townsman"), town clerk, constable (who was evidently much more than a patrolman), deputy or representative to the General Court of the colony, at Boston, Plymouth, or Hartford-New Haven, which was the law-making and frequently a judicial body. Still higher distinctions were Assistant or Governor's Assistant, a group which eventually developed into an "upper house", and is often termed "the magistrates", Commissioner of the United Colonies of New England (from 1643 to 1684), two from each colony, and even higher positions. The title "Mr." was restricted to the minister, sometimes the schoolmaster (especially if he were a graduate of Harvard College), and a few other leading citizens; the usual form of address for most men was "Goodman So-and-so", and his wife was "Goodwife"; although they were most commonly referred to by their given names. Military rank was often mentioned, most frequent being "Cornet", the lowest commissioned cavalry officer, and "Ensign", substantially a sub-lieutenant, so called because he carried the colors; these and higher ranks ordinarily meant rank in the local militia unit. One possible exception I have not always been able to check; "Captain", especially around Salem and Lynn, may have been a marine rather than a military title. The Ancient and Honorable Artillery Company of Massachusetts (patterned after English companies) of which some of our ancestors were members, was an important source of military officers, a sort of 17th century West Point. Among the 116 first and second generation American male ancestors not recorded as freemen, I find nevertheless that 40, i.e. 34% of them, held positions of some political, military, or church distinction, as compared with 69% of the 138 freemen so distinguished. More complete records, I suspect, would increase these percentages.

It is rather surprising how seldom information is given in the records about individual occupations, until we remember that at first practically everyone was a farmer or "planter", at least part-time; although quite a number of skilled and semi-skilled trades and professions are mentioned. Church status, even membership, was considered a distinction, but I have usually indicated only that of deacon or elder, and occasionally ruling elder. Church membership can usually be assumed during most of the 17th century if a man was a freeman, although many male church members, due to limited financial standing, were not freemen; and contrary to common opinion, only a minority of Massachusetts residents of that period were admitted to church membership. Late in that century when the religious test was eliminated and the base of freemanship broadened, it became too common to be mentioned specifically. English birth and emigration to New England, even when not specifically mentioned, can usually be assumed in most of those born before 1630, although I have made notations in cases where there might be doubt.

Our forefathers who undertook the arduous ocean voyage were not old men. A check of 113 males for whom birth and migration dates are given shows a median age of 29; half were between 20 and 40, and nineteen were children under 16 years; only three were noted as over 60, two of them being over 70; these came with younger relatives. Wives, of course, averaged still younger.

In general, our American ancestors, and their English forebears as well, were a pretty respectable and responsible group of men and women, even if the English authorities did not always so regard them, and even though not many were nationally distinguished. A few were prominent beyond their immediate communities-- a Major-general (Humphrey Atherton) in command of all Massachusetts troops, even though his death was not notably heroic (he fell off his horse which stumbled over a cow in the road after dark); and another military leader, Major Simon Willard, perhaps even better known to posterity; one or two governors, several

magistrates, assistants and commissioners, and others of local prominence. One (Deacon Samuel Chapin) is commemorated in Augustus St. Gaudens' well-known statue of "The Puritan"; and another (Jonathan Fairbanks) built the oldest house in New England still standing. Not all stayed out of the court records; one man (Lawrence Waters) and probably his wife were haled into court and "warned" for having danced, and apparently they were so disgusted by Watertown bigotry that they pulled out for the wilderness and built the first house in what afterward became Lancaster. Most of the offenses were at the level of fence-line disputes with neighbors, or (less often) failure to go to church regularly on Sundays or to lectures on Thursdays. Only two men, so far as I know, had a record of marital discord or laxity against their names; and one of these was forgiven and reconciled to his wife. Ancestors who served in the American Revolution are so noted, ten in the Kingsbury lineage, and six (possibly more) in the Bush line.

#### THE INDEX OF FAMILY LINES

Each index (Kingsbury-Brown, Bush-Moore) lists each surname occurring in that ancestry, the page on which it appears (sometimes two pages, "a" and "b"); and, when there are two or more families of the same name, the given name of the first American ancestor of each family. The symbol (E) when used means an English-born ancestor or ancestress, whose family-name was not continued in America. The longer or "key" families, as previously defined, are marked with an asterisk (\*); other lines can be quickly located by means of the index-notation of page-number, key-family name, and generation-number (e.g., Lovell-6) under which they are described.

#### SOURCES

This compilation started many years ago with family recollections given me orally or in writing by my two grandmothers. Apart from some correspondence it has been mainly a library research job, carried out in the Yale University, University of Chicago, Newberry (Chicago), and Chicago Public libraries, and more recently in the public libraries of Los Angeles, Seattle, San Francisco, Riverside, and Redlands, the Sutro State Library at San Francisco, the University of Washington library at Seattle, and loans from the New England Historic-Genealogical Society library. Sources have been family histories and genealogies (too many to specify here), Vital Records of many Massachusetts towns, state, county and town histories and gazetteers, 110 volumes of the New England Historical and Genealogical Register and other like publications, such as those of Essex Institute, Massachusetts Historical Society, New York Genealogical and Biographical Register, D.A.R. and N.S.D.A.C. lineage books, standard works including Savage's 4-volume "Genealogical Dictionary", Pope's "Pioneers of Massachusetts" and "Pioneers of Maine and New Hampshire", Holmes's "Ancestral Heads of New England Families", Jordan & Kellogg's "Your Family Tree", several genealogical collections including Colonial Families of U.S., Colonial Families of America, Abridged Compendium of American Genealogy, most or all of Cutter's regional series (19 volumes), encyclopedias of biography, Revolutionary War Records of three states, History of the A&HACo. of Massachusetts, 1790 census reports of several states, Probate Court records of Connecticut, and other sources. A fellow genealogical fan, Dr. S. Stillman Berry of Redlands, has given me a number of helpful details and suggestions.

Validity of this ancestry depends on identification of "Susanna Hubbard" who on Mar 27, 1728 at Dedham m Nathaniel Hawes (1701-1776), with the Susanna Hobart described below. "Hobart" and "Hubbard" are interchangeable spellings; Edmund-10 below was known as Hubbard at Charlestown, and changed it to Hobart at Hingham. Dedham and other Mass. town records list no other Susanna Hubbard of that time. She was b at Braintree 1706 and doubtless lived there after her father's death in 1718, until death of her mother (and also maternal grandfather) in 1725 left her and her bros and sisters orphans. Presumably the Susanna Hobart who d at Braintree 12/13/1725 was her mother. No record is found of the children, but since Dedham is less than 10 miles away, it is plausible that she (or they) may have gone there to live with some unidentified relatives or friends, and there met N. Hawes whom she m a little over 2 years after her mother's death.
