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P R E F A C E

A GENEALOGICAL RECORD OF THE KEELER FAMILY was compiled and printed, 1892, in a pamphlet of some twenty-five pages. Since then additional matter pertaining to genealogy and personal history has been collected and is now presented in these pages.

The hope is expressed that all who are interested may read this collection and receive a full measure of satisfaction. It would be idle to expect that what is here submitted is free from errors. In some instances I have had access to original documents and records, but in the main a greater portion of the matter has been received from members of our own tribe whose sources of information have been somewhat meagre. One and all, however, have done the best they could under the circumstances, for which there is an all-round appreciation.

I would be pleased to receive in the future any additional information (in whole or in part) about members of our Family; also the pointing out of errors with their corrections—for future use if it be deemed advisable to make a reprint.

I have spent considerable time and money in the endeavor to connect the Keeler line with Old World ancestors, but so far without success. A surname organization might afford the best means through which to work in finding a link to connect our first American forefathers with the remote past. For where there are a number of interested persons working to a common end wonderful results are often obtained.

VARIOUS SPELLINGS OF THE SURNAME
K E E L E R.

In the United States report, entitled: "A Century of Population and of Growth from the First Census of the U. S. to the Twelfth, 1790—1900," under the head of—"Nomenclature Dealing with the Names represented by at least 100 White persons, by States and Territories, at First Census, 1790"—the various spellings of the surname Keeler are presented as follows:

During the years of research many persons bearing the name of Keeler have been gathered who cannot be connected with the line of Samuel Keeler whose descendants comprise the greater part of this Record. But all the lists, sheets, references so far collected will be arranged and inclosed in a suitable binder, labled and filed in the Utah Genealogical Library, Salt Lake City, where any one interested may have access to them. Mr. Samuel S. Keeler of Philadelphia, Pa., has been particularly active in making collections of records of Keelers—early settlers of Pennsylvania, and the results of his labors in this direction must be seen to be fully appreciated.

In this grouping also is a list of over one thousand names of Keelers from Germany, principally from the town of Lauenberg and vacinity, located on the river Elba.

Genealogical Record of the Keeler Family

IMMIGRANT FAMILY

1. **SAMUEL KEELER,** Burlington County, New Jersey.
First American Ancestor.

Tradition says that he and his wife, and probably one child, came from Germany, or Holland. No record as yet has been found of his birth or death; it may be approximated, however, at about 1724-26; and that he died after 1778. He probably lived for a time at Wrightstown, Burlington Co., N. J., this supposition being based on the fact that he and his wife are named in a deed for a half-acre lot located in Wrightstown, and which was conveyed to Samuel and Hannah Keeler, by Samuel Wright, May 2, 1878.

Tradition also says that originally three brothers came to America from the Old World: one settled in the state of New York, one in Pennsylvania, and one (Samuel) in New Jersey.

2. **HANNAH COX,** wife of Samuel above, was born about 1726-7; died June 11, 1806; buried in the Methodist Churchyard, Pemberton, N. J. The following simple inscription on a marble slab marks her grave:

In Memory of
Hannah Keeler
Died June 11, 1806
Aged 79 Years

She was known to be a zealous Christian and an active church worker. Bishop Asbury mentions her in his Journal. Mrs. Jannette Pennock, of Rahway, a great-granddaughter of Hannah, said that it was common knowledge in their family that she gave a piece of land to the Methodist Church, Wrightstown.

Mrs. Fennock, who contributed so abundantly to this Record, wrote (April 24, 1891) of Hannah (Cox) Keeler, as follows: "I am the oldest of this branch of the family," (that is, Jacob, son of Samuel and Hannah.) "I am, or will be, 76 in June, as you will perceive by the family record of Amos Keeler, a son of Jacob, a son of Hannah (Cox) Keeler—for that is my great grandmother's name. It was very much against her people's wish that she married, but they followed her to the vessel, and gave her money to pay her way to this country, and told her she would never see any more happiness.

This tradition has been handed down to us by our father. Also in reading Abbot's Journal, she is found to be one of the first Methodists in New Jersey. When they had no church her house was always open to them.

Once they called on her ('Granny Keeler') to pray, and she replied, 'I cannot pray in English;' so Mr. Abbot said, 'Pray in Dutch, the Lord will hear you.'

I have often heard my father say they could never go to see their grandmother on Sunday, as she did not receive company on the Sabbath".

SIX CHILDREN, all lived in Burlington County, N. J.

3. MARY KEELER, born about 1752; died subsequent to 23 January, 1807.
4. JOHN KEELER, born about 1754; died subsequent to 23 January, 1807.
5. ELIZABETH KEELER, born about 1756; died subsequent to 23 January, 1807.
6. JACOB KEELER, born about 1757-9; died, 1831.
7. WILLIAM KEELER, born 25 December, 1761; died 30 March, 1832.
8. THOMAS KEELER, born about 1763; died subsequent to 23 January, 1807. He married Elizabeth Woolston; one son has been mentioned, but little else is known of him.

NOTE—The order of ages as placed above is based on the arrangement of their signatures to a deed, dated 23 January, 1807, conveying land to William Keeler; also on the fact that Jacob's marriage license is of record, and dated April 17, 1777, and William's dated January 17, 1785. I have approximated the births from the birth of William which is quite accurately known. The wills of Jacob and of William were filed in the years 1831 and 1832, respectively.

(3). **MARY KEELER II**, of Burlington County, New Jersey,

(1). Samuel I.

She was probably first child of Samuel and Hannah (Cox) Keeler. She had two husbands; no children by either being mentioned.

She married, 1st, Mr. Hurley (Turley or Thorley), of Philadelphia, Pa., who had a son Charles: but whether his mother was Mary Keeler, or whether he was a child by a former wife is not known.

She married, 2nd, Frederic Muscott (or Muscat). He is mentioned in a deed with his wife who signed the document as one of the heirs of Hannah Keeler. He may have been dead at the time of the signing of said deed (23 January, 1807) as his name does not appear as one of the signers. In the Register of marriages, Burlington County, N. J., is the record of a marriage license obtained by Frederic Muscat and Mary Thorla, dated December 5, 1768. The question arises: did Mary have also a husband named Thorla, or is there a confusion of names? Or does the marriage license refer to other parties?

(4). **JOHN KEELER II**, of Burlington County, New Jersey.

(1). Samuel I.

Date of birth and death unknown. It is said that he lived at Columbus, N. J., though this is indefinite. It is a tradition that he was born on shipboard at the time his parents were coming to America. He married Bathsheba-----, Issue.

9. **MARY KEELER**; date of birth and death unknown.

(9). **MARY KEELER III**, of Burlington County, New Jersey.

(4). John II, Samuel I.

Date of her birth and death unknown at this writing, 1924. She probably resided for a time in Columbus, N. J. Her husband was Mr. Aaronson (or Mr. Horner). For some reason the children took their mother's maiden name.

FIVE CHILDREN: probably born in Columbus, N. J.

10. CHATMAN KEELER, born.....; died about 1831-2.
"when his only son was a year old."
11. Morris Keeler, no data.
12. Charles Keeler; no information of birth or death. He married Miss Warren, daughter of Adam Warren. "They had one child and moved out West."
13. La Fayette Keeler, born 30 December, 1824, at Mt. Holly, Burlington County, N. J., died 5 April, 1852. He was a shoemaker.
14. Ann Eliza Keeler; no data as to birth or death. She married Joel Brown.

(10). CHATMAN KEELER IV, of Burlington County, N. J.

(3), Mary III, John II, Samuel I.

He probably lived in Columbus, N. J. He was born 1831-2. "When his only son was a year old". He married Mary Birch. Issue.

ONE CHILD.

15. Chalkley Keeler, born about 1831; died 28 March 1893, "In his 63 year". He was formerly of Columbus, but latterly of Trenton, N. J.

(5). ELIZABETH KEELER II, of Burlington County, N. J.

(1), Samuel I.

She was the 3rd child of Samuel and Hannah (Cox) Keeler. So far little of her history is known. She married Uriah Robinson; no issue is mentioned. The name Robinson occurs quite frequently in Burlington County, so it is hoped that we may in the future obtain an addition to this brief record.

DEED

From the heirs of Hannah Keeler to William Keeler, said property having been previously conveyed, May 2, 1778, to Samuel and Hannah Keeler.

THIS INDENTURE made this 23rd day of January in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and seven, between Frederic Muscott, Mary Muscott, John Keeler, Bathsheba Keeler, Uriah Robinson, Elizabeth Robinson, Jacob Keeler, Janet Keeler, Thomas Keeler, and Elizabeth Keeler, heirs of Hannah Keeler, deceased, of the one part, and William Keeler of the township of New Hanover in the County of Burlington of the other part,

WITNESSETH—that the said Frederic Muscott, Mary Muscott, John Keeler, Bathsheba Keeler, Uriah Robinson, Elizabeth Robinson, Jacob Keeler, Janet Keeler, Thomas Keeler, Elizabeth Keeler, for and in consideration of the sum of fifty cents to them in hand, paid at or before the sealing and delivery of these presents, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged by the said Fredric Muscott, Mary Muscott, John Keeler, Bathsheba Keeler, Uriah Robinson, Elizabeth Robinson, Jacob Keeler, Janet Keeler, Thomas Keeler, and Elizabeth Keeler, and thereof forever discharge him to said William Keeler, his heirs, executors and administrators and everyone of them by these presents hath granted, bargained, sold, aliened, enfeoffed, released, conveyed and confirmed and by these presents, doth grant bargain sell alien enfeoff release convey and confirm unto him the said William Keeler and to his heirs assigns forever all that lot or piece of ground situate lying and being in the village of Wrightstown in the township of New Hanover aforesaid. Beginning at a stone for a corner the same being the North West corner of Jacob Platts lot and on the South side of Hill Street thence along said street North seventy-three degrees west one chain sixty-two links to a stone thence south nine and an half degrees West, three chains and twelve links to a stone, thence South seventy three degrees east one chain sixty-two links to a stone corner to said Platts lot thence along said line of Platts lot three chains and twelve links to the place of beginning; containing half an acre to be the same more or less; together with all and singular the improvements, ways, waters, water courses, rights, priveledges, hereditaments, and appurtenances whatsoever unto the said lot of land belonging or in anywise appertaining, and the reversions and remainders, rents, issues and profits thereof and all the estate, right, title and interest of them the Frederic Muscott, Mary Muscott, John Keeler, Bathsheba Keeler, Uriah Robinson, Elizabeth Robinson, Jacob Keeler, Janet Keeler, Thomas Keeler, and Elizabeth Keeler, of in or to the same belonging or in anywise appertaining (which said described lot or piece of ground was formerly conveyed to the above named Hannah Keeler & Samuel Keeler by Samuel Wright as by Deed dated the 2nd day of May 1778). To have and to hold the said lot or piece of ground as above described together with all the improvements thereon erected; and all other the advantages, improvements and appurtances thereunto belonging or in anywise appertaining to the only proper use benefit and behoof of him the said William Keeler their heirs and assigns forever.

And the said Frederic Muscott, Mary Muscott, John Keeler, Bathsheba Keeler, Uriah Robinson, Elizabeth Robinson, Jacob Keeler, Janet Keeler, Thomas Keeler, and Elizabeth Keeler do for themselves their heirs and assigns covenant and agree to and with the said William Keeler his heirs and assigns in manner following (That is to say) that at the time of en-sealing and delivering of these presents they have full power, lawful and absolute authority to sell and dispose of the same hereby granted lot of land and premises in manner and form as above expressed free and clear from any

finer feoffments, mortgages, Judgments or incumbrances whatsoever and further the said Frederic Muscott, Mary Muscott, John Keeler, Bathsheba Keeler, Uriah Robinson, Elizabeth Robinson, Jacob Keeler, Janet Keeler, Thomas Keeler, and Elizabeth Keeler their executors or administrators against all forever defend by these presents.

NOTE—Mary, John, and Elizabeth, children of Samuel and Hannah (Cox) Keeler, evidently could not sign their names in English; they may have been able, however, to write the German.

(6). JACOB KEELER II, of Mansfield Township, Burlington County, New Jersey.

(1), Samuel I.

He was the fourth child of Samuel and Hannah (Cox) Keeler. His will, which is dated 4 August, 1830, was filed 21 February, 1831, said will being of record in the archives at Mt. Holly, Burlington County, N. J. He may have lived most of his days at Columbus. His birth can only be approximated, and was probably about 1757-9; he died in the fore part of February, 1831.

He married, 1st, Janett Brackney, their marriage license being dated at Burlington, N. J., April 17, 1777. Her grave is in the Methodist Church yard, at Pemberton, and the tomb-

stone inscription reads; "In Memory of Janett Keeler, died November 12, 1816. Aged 54 years." There was also on the stone other lettering, a verse, but time has made the words illegible.

He married, 2nd, in 1820-21, Rachel (Robbins) Folks, a widow, who died about 1865. No issue.

WILL OF (6) JACOB KEELER II, 1830.

Recorded in Book D of Wills, page 262, Burlington County, N. J., Archives.

I, Jacob Keeler, of the Township of Mansfield, in the County of Burlington, in the State of New Jersey, being weak in body but of sound mind, memory, and understanding, do make and publish this my last will and testament, in manner and form following, that is to say:

First—It is my will and I do order that all my just debts and funeral expenses be duly paid and satisfied as soon as conveniently can be after my decease.

Item—I give and bequeath unto Elizabeth Keeler wife of my son Amos Keeler one double coverlid her choice.

Item—I give and bequeath unto my daughter Ann Duble wife of Benjamin Duble my eight day clock.

Item—I give and bequeath unto my daughter Hannah Akers wife of Richard Akers, the sum of five dollars.

Item—I give and bequeath unto my grand-daughter Jennett Keeler, daughter of my son Amos Keeler, my silver tea spoons.

Item—I give and bequeath unto my son Aaron Keeler the sum of fifty dollars.

Item—I give and bequeath unto my son Samuel Keeler the sum of five dollars.

Item—I give and bequeath to the Methodist Society of Pemberton the sum of six dollars.

Item—I give and bequeath unto my grand son Jacob Keeler son of my son Joseph Keeler deceased the sum of eight dollars.

Item—My will is and I do order my executors hereinafter named to make sale of all the residue of my estate both real and personal whatso-

ever and wheresoever situated and to make good and sufficient title for the said real estate, and the money arising from such sale or sales after deducting all expenses commissions and the balance or residue to be divided as hereinafter mentioned into eight shares.

First—I give and bequeath unto the children of my son Joseph Keeler deceased by his first wife one eighth thereof to be equally divided among them.

Second—I give and bequeath unto the children of my daughter Charlotte Ware deceased one eighth thereof to be equally divided among them.

Third—I give and bequeath unto the children of my daughter Amy Rankins deceased one eighth thereof to be equally divided between them and my will is that the legacies of the minor children of my deceased daughter be placed in the hands of my son Amos Keeler, and I do order him to pay over to them respectively their legacies whatever it may be together with the interest thereon arising to them when they arrive to lawful age that is the boys at the age of twenty-one years and the girls eighteen years of age, and in event of the death of either of said children then the survivor of them their brother or sister of such child to take the share of such deceased child or children and if it should so happen that all the said children of either of my said deceased daughters should die before they arrive to the ages or in their minority then I give their legacies to my son Amos Keeler.

Fourth—I give and bequeath unto my said daughter, Hannah R. Akers one eighth thereof and in the event of her death before my will takes effect then to her children.

Fifth—I give and bequeath unto my said daughter Ann Duble one eighth thereof and in case of her death then as above to her lawful heirs.

Sixth—I give and bequeath unto my son Aaron Keeler, one eighth thereof.

Eighth and Lastly—I give and bequeath unto my son Samuel Keeler the other eighth thereof to be placed in the hands of my son Amos Keeler for his use and to be paid out to him at the discretion of my said son Amos when he thinks it most advisable.

Lastly—I hereby appoint my said son Amos Keeler and my friend Samuel Black executors of this my last will and testament hereby revoking all former wills.

In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal of the Fourth day of August in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirty.

JACOB KEELER, (L. S.)

Signed sealed published and declared by the said Jacob Keeler to be his testament and last will in the presence of us. The word one "third" was stricken out and the word "eight" was interlined before signing.

(16). JOSEPH KEELER III, of Burlington County, N.J.

(6). Jacob II, Samuel I.

He was the first child of Jacob and Janett (Brackney) Keeler, and was born 5 March, 1779, died in May, 1819. He

married Amy Hutchinson, daughter of James and Sarah (Tindall) Hutchinson, of Washington Township, Mercer County, N. J.; she was born 15 August, 1779; died 3 June, 1819. Joseph probably married again after the death of his wife Amy, as it is intimated in the will of his father Jacob who made a bequest to the children of Joseph's "first wife"; no name being given or children mentioned.

25. JAMES KEELER, born 3 September, 1803; died 10 March, 1876.
26. ISAAC KEELER, born 28 September, 1804; died 27 September, 1851.
27. JACOB KEELER, born probably 1806-7; died probably, 1868.
28. Delilah Keeler, born 5 July, 1810; deceased; married, 1829, Samuel J. Dancer who was born 2 September, 1803, and died 29 January, 1835; his father was Wesley Dancer, a blacksmith of Hamilton Square, N. J. After Mr. Dancer's death Delilah married Marmaduke S. Earle, who was born 24 November, 1800; died 27 April, 1872. He kept a store in Hamilton Square, in 1834, and later, one in New Sharon, N. J. He was a local preacher of the Baptist faith. There were no children by this marriage.

He is first son of Joseph and Amy (Hutchinson) Keeler, and was born 3 September, 1803; owned a gristmill and sawmill in Milford, N. J., which he left at his death to his son William. He married, 1st, Delilah Allen, of Hightstown, N. J.; She was born, 28 December, 1806. He married, 2nd, 28 December, 1831, Abigail McMichael, of Hunterdon County, N. J., born—; died 29 September, 1879. She was Scotch

descent, and was a sister of U. S. Senator McMichael, of Newark, N. J.

33. William Keeler, born 16 March, 1842; died 1 March, 1906 (?) and is buried in the family plot at Hightstown, N. J. In his early days he followed the business of miller, at Milford (now Etra), near Hightstown; and later he lived in Trenton, N. J., and followed the vocation of book-keeper. He married Anna Bilyen, of Philadelphia; her father was of French extraction. She lives (1922) in Trenton.

He was second son of Joseph and Amy (Hutchinson) Keeler; was born in Columbus, N. J., 28 September, 1804-5; died near Hightstown, N.J. 27 September, 1851. He lived in Philadelphia for a numbr of years following the trade of blacksmith; then he moved on a farm near Milford where he died. He married, 1 May, 1828, Mary Ann Taylor, who born in West

Chester, Penna., 6 September, 1806; died in Philadelphia, 2 November, 1877. She was the daughter of Enoch and Elizabeth (———) Taylor of West Chester, Pa.

TWELVE CHILDREN: born in Philadelphia, Pa.

35. JOSEPH TAYLOR KEELER, born in Philadelphia, 5 July, 1829; died in Avalon, N. J., 29 July, 1919, having gone there for a summer vacation; a blacksmith by trade and employed for years by J. B. Lippencott, Publishers, Phila.; afterwards was employed as clerk by Reading Railroad, retiring when he was seventy years of age. He married 8 July, 1856, Margaret T. Merry, of Phila.; she died there 11 March, 1892. She was the daughter of John and Margaret Merry, and her Grandfather John Merry was an English Sea Captain.

 - d. Isaac Keeler, born 21 April, 1870; died 15 February, 1875.
 - e. E. Virginia Keeler, born 8 August, 1875; died 9 December, 1878.
36. Charles Radcliffe Keeler, born 19 November, 1830; died 21 September, 1907. A carpenter by trade. He married, 24 August, 1854, Mary Caroline Smith, of Philadelphia, Pa., and was living 1922.

He was the fifth child of Samuel and Hannah (Cox) Keeler.

In his early life he learned the tanner's trade, and followed that vocation for a number of years. His holdings of real estate were quite extensive, a part of which he farmed. It is shown by the records of deeds that he bought land located in New Hanover, (later named Pemberton) from William Budd, November 15, 1787.

"Our great grandfather," writes T. Clifford Keeler, of Mount Holly, "seems to have had some means, and to have been a man of more or less influence on the community. Father tells me he was the keeper of the Burlington County Alms House, from 1815 to 1825. And if it was in that day as it is now it took considerable political influence to get the office."

The tombstone inscription which marks his grave in the Methodist churchyard, Pemberton, reads:

"In memory of William Keeler who departed this life March 30, 1831 (or 1832), aged 70 years 3 months, and 5 days."

Time and the weather have badly worn the lettering on the tombstone which made it difficult to read, but from other evidence it appears quite probable that he died in 1832; and this would place his birth on December 25, 1761.

He married Theodosia Budd, their marriage license being issued at Burlington, N. J., January 17, 1785. She was the oldest daughter of Samuel and Sarah (Briggs) Budd.

Theodosia, through her father's line, descended from the Rev. Thomas Budd, of the Parish of Montock, Somersetshire, England. The Burlington County Budds, and the greater portion of the Budds of New Jersey and Pennsylvanis, are descendants of this distinguished ancestor, through four sons who emigrated to this country early in 1678.

John Budd, (born 1682; died about 1731), the grandfather of Theodosia, "at the time of making his will, undoubtedly expected another child which caused him to put this provision in his last testament: 'That if my wife Hannah, has a child and it is a son, to receive 150 acres of land', which said son was born and named Samuel, who married Sarah Briggs". They had three children, Theodosia, Hannah and Lydia. Hannah, who died February 20, 1846, aged 80 years, 4 months and 18 days, married Samuel Shinn. Lydia married Moses Gaskell.

Theodosia Budd died May 7, 1828, "aged 67 years, 4 months, and 14 days," and is buried at Pemberton, N. J.

B Keeler and his wife during their natural lives and the life of the survivor of them and that immediately after his and their deaths the said principal sum shall be equally divided between all the children of my son John B Keeler that may be living at the time of his death yet nevertheless the said Joseph Hartshorn if he shall think it necessary for the comfort and convenience and well being of my son John Keeler and his wife at the wirtten request of my son may advance to him at any time so much or all of the said sixth part or share of the residue of my said estate as to him shall seem proper for their comfort and well being and should any part thereof remain unexpended at their deaths the same shall be divided as aforesaid and further it is my will that in case either of my children or either of my sons in law shall make any claim or demand whatsoever against my estate I do hereby order and direct the same shall be set off against their share of my estate so devised in this my last will and testament and lastly I do hereby nominate constitute and appoint my son William Keeler my son John B Keeler and my son in law William Springer to be Executors of this my last will and testament with full power and authority to them and the survivor of them to make sign execute deliver and acknowledge good and sufficient deed or deeds of conveyance of all and every part of my real estate so as fully to vest in the purchaser or purchasers thereof the fee simple of the same in as full and ample manner as I could have done if in full life to do the same and I do declare this and this only to be taken and received as for my last will and testament. I, John B. Keeler of the Township of New Hanover in the county of Burlington and State of New Jersey being of sound and disposing mind memory and understanding do make and publish this my last will and testament hereby revoking all former wills by me at any time heretofore made, in the manner following, to-wit:

FIRST—It is my will and I hereby order and direct that all my just debts and funeral expenses be paid by my executors hereinafter named as soon as practicable after my decease.

SECOND—All my wearing apparel I hereby give and bequeath to my three sons VIZ, Samuel S. Keeler, John B. Keeler and William H. Keeler to the survivor or survivors of them.

THIRD—I give and bequeath to my son Daniel Keeler the sum of three hundred dollars, if he or they shall appear and claim the same within two years from the time of my decease, but in case my said son Daniel Keeler or his heirs shall not appear within said two years then I do order and direct the said sum of three hundred dollars to be placed to the residue of my estate and divided by my executors as is hereinafter mentioned and specified.

FOURTH—I give devise and bequeath unto my grand daughter Georgeanna Sexton and to her heirs the sum of Two Hundred Dollars the same to be kept at interest by my executors hereinafter named until she shall arrive at the age of twenty one years, at which time I direct the amount of principal and interest then due to be paid over to her or to her heirs, the interest thereon not to commence until one year after my decease. And in case of the death of my said grand-daughter before arriving at the age of twenty-one years and without leaving lawful issue, then it is my will and I hereby direct the said sum of two hundred dollars be added to the residue of my estate and divided as hereinafter mentioned.

FIFTH— I give devise and confirm unto my daughter Elizabeth Ellis wife of Decline Ellis and to her heirs and assigns all the household goods and kitchen furniture which I loaned to her at the time of her marriage, which goods and chattles I value at the sum of three hundred dollars.

SIXTH— I give devise and bequeath to my son William H. Keeler and to his heirs and assigns all my real estate situated in Lewis County in the State of Virginia to have and to hold unto him his heirs and assigns forever.

SEVENTH— It is my will and I hereby order and direct my executors hereinafter named to make sale of all the rest and residue of my estate, both real and personal, either at public or private sale as to them shall seem best as soon as conveniently can be done after my decease hereby giving to my said executors full power to sell and convey my said real estate and to make as good valid and effectual assurance thereof to the purchaser or purchasers thereof as I shall or may be possessed of at the time of my decease.

EIGHTH— It is my will and I hereby order and direct that all moneys arising from the sale of my real and personal estate after the payment debts and legacies aforementioned and the costs and expenses of the execution of this my last will and testament be divided into six equal shares or parts.

NINTH— I give devise and bequeath to my son Samuel S. Keeler and his heirs to my son John B. Keeler and his heirs and to my son William H. Keeler and his heirs each the one equal sixth part of my said residue.

TENTH— I give devise and bequeath to my friend Ewan Merritt and to his heirs executors and administrators the equal one sixth part of the moneys aforesaid in trust nevertheless upon the following trust to wit, to place the same at interest at such time and upon such security as to him shall seem meet and proper and the interest thereon to collect yearly and every year and the same pay over to my daughter Theodosia Bunting during her natural life and after her death to, pay over the principal sum and the interest then due thereon to lawful heirs of my daughter Theodosia share and share alike.

ELEVENTH— I give devise and bequeath to the said Ewan Merritt and to his heirs executors and administrators one other equal sixth part of said residue in trust nevertheless upon the following and no other trust, to wit, to place the same at interest upon such security as to him shall seem fit and proper and the interest to collect in yearly and every year and the same to pay over to my daughter Martha Ann Haines wife of Franklin B. Haines during her natural life and after her death upon this further trust, to divide the same into three equal shares or parts and the one third part to pay over to each of the children of my daughter Martha now born and living to wit, Clara Haines, Ame Haines and their heirs, and the other third part to pay over to Irene Keeler daughter of my son William H. Keeler and her heirs.

TWELFTH—I give devise and bequeath to the said Ewan Merritt and to his heirs executors and administrators one other equal sixth part of the said residue, but in trust nevertheless upon the following and no other trusts, to wit in trust to place the same at interest upon such security as to him shall seem proper and the interest to collect in and pay over yearly and every year and the same to pay over to my daughter Elizabeth Ellis wife of Decline Ellis during the term of her natural life and after the death of my said Daughter Elizabeth Ellis upon the further trust, to pay thereout to each of the said children of said Elizabeth living at her decease the sum of Five dollars and the residue to pay over to the children of my son John B. Keeler then living share and share alike.

THIRTEENTH— It is my will and I hereby order and direct that all the expenses attended on the execution of the forgoing trust and each of them be paid from the yearly income arising from each of the said trust funds, it being my intention to preserve each of the trust funds unimpaired at the death of each of the parties for whom the trust is, and further I do order and direct that the yearly interest aforesaid to be paid to my said daughters personally and not to their respective husbands and that the receipt of my said daughters shall be sufficient vouchers of payment in the hands of Ewan Merritt in all Courts of Law or Equity notwithstanding their Coverture.

FOURTEENTH— It is my will and I order and direct that in case any of my sons or son-in-law shall bring any account against my estate for board or otherwise except such sums as each may be found credited with on my book of accounts at the time of my death that then such sum as may be received with interest and costs be deducted from the share of such one or the share of the wife of such one after the distribution thereof.

LASTLY— I nominate constitute and appoint Daniel Same of New Hanover and Ewan Merritt of Mount Holly Executors of this my last will and testament.

In the name of GOD AMEN. I, William Keeler of the Borough and Township of Pemberton in the County of Burlington and State of New Jersey being of sound disposing mind and memory do make and publish this my last will and testament in manner and form following hereby revoking and annulling all other will or wills by me made and leaving this only as my last will and testament.

FIRST—I do order and direct that all my just debts funeral charges and other expenses be paid by my executors hereinafter named as soon as conveniently can be after my decease.

SECOND— I give and bequeath unto my beloved wife Mary Keeler all my house goods and kitchen furniture which shall be in and about my dwelling house at the time of my decease including the contents of the cellars, to her, her heirs and as assigns forever, and I also give and devise unto her all the rents issues and profits of the house and lot where I now dwell for and during the term of her natural life.

Item 3rd—I give and bequeath unto my son Jacob N. Keeler the sum of five thousand dollars to be paid to him by my executors in one year after my decease and I do hereby exonerate and release him my said son Jacob from the payment of all notes on hand and bonds with the interest thereon held by me against him at the date thereof.

Item 4th,— I give and devise unto my son William Budd Keeler all that farm and plantation situated in the Township of Pemberton whereon he now lives and also all my wearing apparel and I do exonerate him from the payments of all debts due me except the sum of four hundred dollars, for which I hold a note of hand and which is to be paid by him to my executors as part of my estate, and I do further order and direct my son William pay unto his mother Mary Keeler yearly and every year during her natural life the sum of one hundred dollars which said one hundred dollars I charge as a lien upon the farm herein devised to him as aforesaid.

Item 5th— I give and devise unto my son Franklin Keeler all the farm and plantation situated in the Township aforesaid wherein he resides together with the cider mill presses stills and appertainences thereto belonging to him his heirs and assigns forever, and I do further give and devise unto him a lot of land lying on the North east corner of Diamond and Parry Streets in Kensington in the County of Philadelphia and State of Pennsylvania which I purchased of John Cresler and also

a house and lot of land in the Borough of Pemberton willed to me by my Aunt Hannah Shinn and I do order and direct that my son Franklin pay to his mother Mary Keeler yearly and every year the sum of one hundred dollars during her natural life which said sum I charge as a Lean upon the farm herein devised to him as aforesaid and I hereby reserve upon the last mentioned farm the privilage for my son William Budd Keeler to enter thereon for the purpose of diging marlup on the east side of the run meadow and also to have the right and privilage of turning the water along the bank to prevent any inconvenience to him while diging which said privilage and reserves together with a right of way and there from, I give and grant unto my son William so long as he shall hold and enjoy the farm where he now lives in his own right.

Item 6th— I give and devise unto my sons William Budd and Franklin Keeler all that lot of cedar swamp situated on Shoal Branch near the place called three bridges which I purchased of the executor of Stacy Watkinson dec'd to be held by them as tenmants in common to them their heirs and as assigns forever.

Item 7th— I give and bequeath unto my daughter Theodosia B. Dungan the interest of five thousand dollars which said principal sum of five thousand dollars I order and direct my executors to secure by first mortgage upon good landed property and the interest thereof to be paid to her annually during her natural life, her receipt being a sufficient voucher therefor, given to the mortgagor, excepting the sum of fifty dollars which I direct to be paid out of the aforesaid interest to her mother Mary Keeler during her natural life and in case my said daughter should die without lawful issue that she may be permitted to dispose of the said sum of five thousand dollars, by her last will and testament, provided the same shall be distributed among her brothers and their heirs or legal representatives as she may deem proper.

But in case she should die without lawful issue, and without first making her will as aforesaid, I then order and direct the said sum of five thousand dollars to be equally divided amongst my three sons aforesaid of their heirs and legal representatives share and share alike.

Item 8th—In case there should be a surplus in the hands of my executors after settlement of my estate and payment of debts and the aforesaid legacies, I then order and direct the same to be equally divided amongst all my aforesaid children and their heirs or legal representatives share and share alike.

The children of my deceased child only to take their parents share but in case there should be a deficiency of estate upon settlement to pay said debts and legacies then order and direct that my two sons William and Franklin each pay to my executors the sum of two hundred dollars annually, and that my son Jacob and my daughter Theodosia each pay the sum of one hundred dollars yearly to my said executors or their proportion and said ratio until the said deficiency shall be fully made up as intended and herein expressed.

Item 9th— I order and direct by executors to sell all the residue of my personal goods and chattles, and also the residue of my real estate whatsoever and wheresoever situate, and to make execute good and sufficient conveyances in law to the purchasers thereof, and the proceeds of said sales to be added to and be taken as part of my estate.

Item 10— The aforesaid bequests and legacies herein before given to my wife Mary Keeler is intended to be in full for right of dower in and to all of my estate.

Item 11— In case there should be any dispute or difficulty arise amongst my aforesaid legatees, or any of them in relation to my estate, I order and direct that the same be submitted to three disinterested parties as refferees, whose decision shall be conclusive and final to all parties concerned. And in case of any decent from said decision, the parties so dissenting shall be held liable and responsible for all costs that may accrue in consequence thereof and which shall be deducted out of said legatees shares so descenting or demurring at said decision.

Lastly— I nominate constitute and appoint my two sons William Budd Keeler and Franklin Keeler to execute this my last will and testament written on three half sheets of paper attached together at the top by wafers.

Settlement of Pemberton

On July 4, 1891, the citizens of Pemberton, Burlington Co., N. J., celebrated the 200th anniversary of that historic place. One of the features of the day was a speech by Rev. J. C. Buchanan, a synopsis of which was given in a Mt. Holly paper and is here copied:

Mr Buchanan, after reverting to a number of very interesting points in Colonial history in general came down to that of Pemberton which was founded by William Budd, who died in 1721, and who was the first to locate lands in Pemberton on the west side of Main street, which he devised to his sons, William, Thomas, John and James. The tract consisted of 500 acres.

Afterwards he located an additional tract of 500 acres in the vicinity of Mount Pisgah. A re-survey of the tract afterwards showed that it contained 2000 acres. These lands were sold in 1701 to John Garwood and Restore Lippincott. These surveys included some of the most fertile land to be found in the State. The descendants of the founder are still living about Pemberton, one of them, Hon. Theodore Budd, being well known throughout the State. John Budd, of Camden and Gloucester counties, was another descendant. Burlington county was established in 1677, but more definitely bounded in 1708. One of the towns then existing was Hampton and Hanover, now Pemberton, the records showing that it was founded in 1691.

For a while it was known as New Mills, and in 1826 it was incorporated as the borough of Pemberton. The first houses were built of wood in primitive style, but none are known to be still standing. It was then a favorite resort for Indians, and

many of their implements and pieces of pottery have since been found. The Indians were the Leni Lenapes, and were always on friendly terms with the settlers. For a hundred years the pioneers enjoyed immunity from the dreaded war cry and the murderous attack. The Indians fought among each other, but never attacked the white settlers here, who had always treated them with such uniform kindness. A treaty was made with them at Crosswicks in 1758, which was never broken. By it the Indians were given 3000 acres on the Edgepellock reservation in Shamong, this county. There they remained until 1802, when they removed to Central New York.

The first business enterprise in Hampton-Hanover was the rafting of timber down the Rancocas. Agriculture also received attention as soon as it was found the soil was fertile. A mill for grinding flour was erected at Budd Run, near the site of the present mill. A map of the town as it existed in 1752 is still in existence, and in a fine state of preservation. The oldest house stands where the present residence of Anthony J. Morris now is, and is included in the new residence. The flour mills have been in continuous operation since 1752, and are now run by Mr. Morris. A deposit of iron was early found near here, and an iron furnace established at Hanover.

A fulling mill was another industry of importance which has long since been abandoned. Among the early merchants of the town were the Budd Brothers, Jacob Heisler, William Bryan, Samuel Budd, James Campbell, Thomas Lacy, William Roberts. Daniel Wills kept the first tavern. Since 1871 no licenses for the sale of intoxicating liquors have been granted.

Pemberton was named in honor of James Pemberton, of Philadelphia, a "public friend," as he was called, who was one of the largest shipping merchants of that city. The early residents of Pemberton did not take much interest in the Revolutionary War; they belonged to the Society of Friends, and were opposed to bearing arms, although it furnished Colonel Thomas Reynolds, a gallant soldier, who, while on a visit to his home in

Pemberton on one occasion, was surprised and taken prisoner by the British.

The oldest religious organization is the Babbtist Church, which traces its origin to Francis Briggs in 1735. Years after, it and all the records were destroyed by fire. A second church was built in 1823, which is still standing. Next in order of age is the Methodist Church. The first church of that denomination in West Jersey was erected here in 1770. The celebrated Francis Asbury preached here frequently. This church was afterwards sold, and is still standing, being owned by Mr. Samuel Elliott. The Protestant Episcopal church is of comparatively recent origin, having been built in 1840.

The early school buildings were of the most primitive character, made of rough timbers and bare furnishings, beyond a few desks and benches. The teacher's pay limited and uncertain. One of the ancient school buildings is still standing. Among the first instructors were John Bull and William Mann. The former was an Englishman, and was considered one of the most accomplished teachers of the day. The early residents of Pemberton were people of considerable prominence. Anthony Morris afterwards became Mayor of Philadelphia. Then there are the Forts, Bodines, Gaskills, Keelers, Shinns, Lambs, Woolstons, Nutts, Lippincotts and others, including James Logan, afterwards Chief Justice of Pennsylvania, and many others whose lives and achievements were an honor to their home and their country.

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
