FOREWORD

The record of our immigrant forebears and their descendants has been gathered through many years of research and is now recorded, not for glory but for guidance. Those that have gone before and whose struggles and deeds, aspirations and accomplishments, have become our inheritance, have contributed their portion to our lives for good or evil according to the quality of their living. Verily no man liveth to himself. In the study of our ancestors we gain knowledge which, if properly applied, will tend to the elevation of posterity.

Let the sages of the past speak. Edmund Burke says, "People will not look forward who never look backward," and no less a philosopher than Tacitus himself advises future generations to "think of your ancestors and your posterity."

Lord Macaulay the great English historian says, "It is a sentiment which belongs to the higher and purer part of human nature and which adds no little to the strength of the states. A people which take no pride in the noble achievements of remote ancestors will never achieve anything worthy to be remembered with pride by remote descendants."

But a higher authority than those we have quoted has said in the Holy Writ, "The glory of children are their fathers" and Plutarch admonishes us that "it is indeed a desirable thing to be well descended but the glory belongs to our ancestors."

Without colorful phraseology, but with a plain statement of their lives as exemplified by the records, the deeds of Jacob König and Matheus König and their descendants are herewith presented to posterity for their thoughtful consideration.

The trials and tribulations of our immigrant ancestors on a small ship during a long voyage to America may be the better understood by reference to the personal account as narrated in that illuminating description of "Gottlieb Mittelberger's Journey to Pennsylvania in the year 1750." Our ancestors came the following year and conditions had not changed.

But they were seeking new opportunities of life in a new country and their coming to America has proved a most glorious heritage to their descendants. Thereby we are enjoying the blessings of the finest government in the world.

Much is untold as but little is recorded of the devotion, courage and fortitude of our pioneer folk but that they were freedom-loving, God fearing and patriotic citizens is evident.

This record is presented as a memorial to Jacob König and Matheus König on the 200th anniversary of their arrival in America. ORIGIN OF THE NAME AND FAMILY

The patronymic King is a very common one in the United States and there is scarcely a city of any consequence in which one or more members of the family have not resided within the past decade. In some parts of the country the family was represented early in the seventeenth century, and in 1790, according to the first census of the United States, eight hundred and seventy seven heads of families with more than four thousand persons bearing the family name were living in this country.¹ These were distributed through twelve states and territories. Those living in New Jersey were not included in the above figures as the records for the state were lost but it is known that a considerable number were residents of that state at the time.² In the state of Pennsylvania there were then one hundred and fifteen King families.

The various King families of America are not descendants of a common ancestor, nor indeed from one nationality. It is definitely known that they have come from German, English, Scotch-Irish, Swiss, and Dutch stock and probably from other nationalities. The German and Dutch families who came to America during colonial times wrote the name as they pronounced it in their native tongue,—Koenig or König but their descendants have anglicised it. The Swedish name Cone was first changed to Koenig and later to King.³ The name also appears in its Latin form and we have therefore the Rex Family with its numerous progeny.

No doubt there were several reasons for these changes in the names but perhaps the predominating influence was the fact that the business of the courts was conducted in the English language and the German and Dutch forms were readily anglicised so that in several generations the original spelling entirely disappeared. It was a common custom for Germans who came to America prior to 1800 to so change their names. In the case of those coming during the nineteenth century, however, the German name Koenig is retained in the majority of cases.

There is considerable speculation as to the origin of the name as a patronymic. King means "Father" and takes us back to the patriarchal times when families grouped into clans, clans into tribes, and tribes into nations. The elders of the families formed the senate and each "assembly of elders" had its father (German, Konig; Sanskrit, janaka, a father; Greek, anax; Latin, senex, the old man of the tribe).⁴

Another writer offers the following explanation:

"Cyning, by contraction King, is clearly connected with the word 'cyn' or 'Kin'....I do not feel myself called upon to decide whether Cyning is strictly the patronymic of 'Cyn,' or whether it comes immediately from a cognate adjective (see Allen, *Royal Prerogative*, 176; Kemble, i. 153). It is enough if the two words are of the same origin, as is shown by a whole crowd of cognates, 'cynebarn,' 'cynecyn,' 'cynedom,' 'cynehelm,' 'cynehlaford'....In all these words 'cyn' has the meaning of 'royal.' The modern High-Dutch Konig is an odd corruption; but the elder form is 'Chuninc'....The notion of the King being the 'canning' or 'Cunning' man is an idea which could have occurred only to a mind on which all Teutonic philology was thrown away."⁵

From the foregoing it is apparent that the name King was not bestowed on the family in derision or in mockery as was the case with numerous other family names. Nor do we presume that it was transmitted generation after generation on account of an early ancestor occupying the position of ruler in some early clan. But the indications are that our earliest ancestor who was honored with the name occupied a prominent position in the village in which he lived, was of royal bearing, and carried himself with the dignity of a ruler.

The family name has been prominent both in Europe and America. Among those who gained distinction in Europe we find Emanuel Koenig, 1658-1731, a Swiss medical writer; Frederick Koenig, 1774-1833, a German inventor; George Matthias Koenig, 1616-1699, *Bibliothecs Vetus et Nova*; John Gerard Koenig of Courland, 1728-1785, physician, botanist and traveler; and Samuel Koenig, 1712-1757, Mathematician and philosopher.

In America we have William R. King, 1786-1853, vice-president of the United States in 1852; Rufus King, 1755-1827, an American Statesman who was twice minister to England;

Clarence King, 1842-1901, geologist; Grace Elizabeth King, 1858-1932, writer, and numerous others who were prominent in various fields of activity.

It is not claimed that any of these were members of the particular branch of the family covered by this genealogy but they are simply cited to show that the family is not only a numerous one but that the name is one of which to be proud.

Several reunions of the descendants of Jacob König and Matheus König have been held. The first was held in Oakland Park, near Bethlehem, in Northampton County, Pa. in 1910. This was a gathering of the descendants of Jacob König. In the same year the descendants of Matheus König held a reunion in Lenape Park, near Kittanning, Armstrong County, Pa. These reunions were held for several years only and then discontinued.

Apparently the family covered by this genealogy is of German descent with a probability of Swiss extraction. It has been impossible to secure evidence as to the birthplace of the immigrants from across the sea, but their names and writing were German. It is very likely that they came from the lower Palatinate region in Germany.

There is some variation in the orthography of the name as found in the early records in America. The generally accepted forms are König and Koenig. But we find on a tombstone in Northampton County, Pa., the spelling "Kuenich" and Rev. John Casper Stever in his records writes it "Kuenig." At this date all the descendants write the name "King."

It has not been determined if a Coat-of-Arms had been bestowed upon any of our ancestors. Investigation along this line has been impossible inasmuch as the European ancestry of the immigrants is unknown. A number of heraldic devices granted to persons bearing the name König⁶ are on record but in the absence of ancestral records prior to the arrival of our forefathers in America there is no reason to assume that any of them can be considered in connection with our family.

THE KING FAMILY

On 7 October, 1751, the ship *Janel*, William Cunningham, Captain, arrived at Philadelphia from Rotterdam, last from Cowes. There were on board this vessel two hundred and twenty passengers of whom three bore the family name of König (King). Their names were Abraham König, Jacob König and Mattheus König.⁷

These pioneers, being of German origin, conversed in the German language, wrote in the same language and their descendants continued to use their German name König for several generations. Gradually they assumed the anglicised form "King," due to the English language being spoken in the courts and taught in the schools. To avoid confusion the name King will be used in this record as the family name.

It is impossible to state definitely what relationship existed between these three persons but the following facts may indicate a solution of the problem.

First—Abraham König did not sign his name to the Oath of Allegiance and Abjuration at the port of entry as required by the provincial government, as did Jacob and Mattheus. His name was inscribed by the clerk and no trace has been found of him after leaving the ship.

Second—Jacob König was unmarried on arrival at Philadelphia, it being recorded in the baptismal record of Maria Magdalene, daughter of Mattheus König, in 1754, that he was single. He was likely a lad when he left his native country.

Third—The records of the birth and baptisms of the first born of both Jacob König and Matheus König, namely Mathias, son of Jacob, born 1756, and Maria, daughter of Matheus König, born 1754, indicate that Jacob König and Matheus König were married about the same time and that there was no great difference in their ages.

Fourth—Jacob König and Matheus König bought and lived on adjoining farms, they were sponsors on several occasions at the

baptism of each other's children, and Jacob named his first born after his brother Matheus.

The possibilities are that an entire family set sail for the new world; that the wife died on the long journey leaving the husband and the two sons to enter the new world alone; that the father, Abraham König, also was taken sick, was too weak to sign the Declaration of Allegiance, died soon after leaving the vessel, and therefore no trace of him has been found; that the two boys, Jacob and Matheus, left to care for themselves in a strange land, secured adjoining farms and raised their families in the same neighborhood.

1. ABRAHAM KÖNIG, for the purpose of this genealogical study, is therefore presumed, from the evidence at hand, to be the father and that the children were:

2. JACOB KING (Abraham) arrived at the port of Philadelphia, Pa., 7 Oct. 1751. How soon after his landing he left Philadelphia county and located in what is now Northampton county⁸ is not definitely known but he became a pioneer settler at an early date. According to the baptismal record of his daughter Maria Elizabeth it is certain that he was a resident of the county in 1764. In Henry's manuscript "History of Northampton County" it is stated that Jacob König had thirty acres of cleared land and 160 acres of woodland in 1768. In 1770 he and his brother Matheus were assessed as farmers in Bethlehem township, Northampton County.

From Calvin G. Beitel's "The Penn titles to Northampton County lands," page 15, we learn that he obtained an original Penn title to land in what was known as the "Drylands" where

Lehigh county was erected in 1812 out of part of Northampton. The present area of Northampton County is 370 square miles.

he engaged in farming. This tract was a part of the Manor of Fernor. It contained 200 acres more or less.


Jacob King appeared before John Arndt, a Justice of the Peace, at Easton, on 15 Sept. 1777, and subscribed to the oath of allegiance as directed by "An Act of General Assembly of Pennsylvania, passed the 13th day of June 1777," the record being entered in the Prothonatory's office of Northampton County. As evidence of his patriotism for his adopted country we find he enlisted as a private of the 7th class in Captain George Nolf's company from the Middle Bethlehem township 5 June 1780. (Penna. Arch. s. 5, v. 8, p. 129). On 20 Mch. 1781 he was enrolled a member of the Second Battalion, Northampton County Militia and served at sundry times forty five days and was discharged 12 Apr. 1781. (Pa. Arch. s. 5, v. 8, p. 145.)

Jacob King married Anna Catharine Illick,⁹ the date of marriage not being known. However as he was single on 24 Mch. 1754, according to the baptismal record of Maria Magdalena, daughter of his brother Matheus King, and his first child was born 29 Sept. 1756, the date of marriage would be between these two dates. His wife is recorded as a communicant member of the old Williams twp. church in 1763 the record being given in the Proceedings of the Pennsylvania German Society, Vol. 18. She was buried at Hecktown by the Rev. Fredericus L. Herman 8 May 1787 at age 53 yrs.

Jacob King died prior to 3 Aug. 1781. His estate was appraised at the time of his death at £ 495. Inasmuch as he had no will, his wife was granted letters of administration, her bond being signed 9 Aug. 1781 by George Schnabel of Bethlehem twp. and George Michael of Forks twp. Partition proceedings were started in the Orphans court at Easton, Pa., on 26 Mch. 1792 for division of the farm land among the heirs. As the land could not

justly be divided and the eldest son, Matthias, declining to accept the said premises, Jacob King, the second son accepted the same at the appraised valuation of £ 495.



His signature is found on the Oath of Abjuration which he took when he arrived in America and is here reproduced.

The children of Jacob and Catharine King were:

This company participated in the Battle of Long Island 27 Aug. 1776. - g. Magdalena, b. d. ; married Jacob Buss. They lived in Bethlehem twp. where they owned a property adjacent to lands of her brother, John King. They had a son John born 3 Sept. 1791.
- h. Anna Christina, (known as Christiana in the court records), b. 15 Apr. 1765, bap. 26 May 1765, witnesses: Matheus and Christina Konig; mar. David Kutz, s. David and Catharine Kutz. He was b. 4 July 1764, d. 30 July 1830 of dropsy. They had nine children, 6 living at time of his death—3 sons and 3 daughters. They were mar. between 40 and 50 yrs. She d. of dropsy 20 July 1835. The Democrat and Argus of Easton said of her, "through her long life she was respected by all who knew her."
7. i. Johannes, b. 20 Nov. 1766, d. 24 May 1823.
8. j. Christopher, b. about 1768; d. about 1838.
9. k. Johann George, b. 17 Sept. 1770; d. about 1815.

3. MATHEUS KING (Abraham) came to America 7 Oct. 1751 through the port of Philadelphia. Sometime thereafter he located in Northampton Co., Pa., where he settled with his brother Jacob in Bethlehem twp., now Palmer twp. There they had adjoining farms. A deed for the farm consisting of 108 acres and 133 perches was given by John Penn and Richard Penn by their attorney John R. Coates, to Mathias Konick on 16 Aug. 1802 but this farm was occupied by him years before the date of the deed.

In 1770 he was assessed as a farmer in Bethlehem twp., in 1783 he was assessed for 185 acres and four horses and in 1788 for 178 acres four horses and four head of cattle.

Matheus King was a member of the Reformed and Lutheran congregation in Dryland at an early date. It is recorded in their church records that "Matthews Konig war Bau Meister vor die kirck in Trockenland in 1764." (i.e., "Matheus King was the builder of the church in Dryland.")


Matheus King was frequently called upon to assist in the settlement of estates in Northampton County. On 27 Oct. 1775 he was an appraiser of the estate of Peter Young. (File 679, Register of Wills office.) On 7 Jan. 1778 Elizabeth Roth, widow, Adam Roth, Conrad Kocher and Matheus King, all of Bethlehem twp., were appointed administrators of the estate of David Roth and the inventory was taken by Conrad Kocher and Matheus King. (File 805, Register of Wills.) On 30 Jan. 1779 he with George Keck witnessed the will of George Wolf, father of George Wolf who was Governor of Penna. 1829-1835. (File 1349, Re. of Wills.)

In 1784 he was a corporal in Capt. Michel's Company, Northampton County Militia.¹⁰ He married Eva Christiana Hartzel, daughter of George and Catharine Hartzel.¹¹ She was b. 28 Jan. 1739. Both he and his wife were confirmed at the Blue church 11 Nov. 1753.

In 1794 he moved to Mt. Pleasant twp., Westmoreland County, Pa., with his family. Here he purchased 50 acres of land from William McGeary, Jr. and his wife Mary on July 4 of that year. This land with a further purchase of twenty-two acres and fifteen perches which he bought on 11 May 1796 was a part of the late proprietor's Manor of Sewickley. It later came into the possession of his son John King.

It appears that his daughters, Maria Magdalena and her husband, Nicholas Weitzel, and Catharine and her husband John Spielman had migrated to Westmoreland county as early as 1776¹² inasmuch as the baptism of their first born children, namely Anna Catharine Weitzel and John Spielman are recorded in that year in the records of Zion Evangelical Lutheran church (Harrolds church), Westmoreland county.

Matheus King died July 1810. His will, written in German and dated 12 Feb. 1807, was probated 31 July 1810 at Greensburg, Westmoreland Co. and recorded in the Register of Will's Office in will book 1, page 252.

His wife was Catharine. They had the following children: 1. John of Lower Saucon twp, b. 27 Feb. 1740; 2. Frederick, of Lower Saucon twp.; 3. Adam of Lower Saucon twp; 4. George of Lower Saucon twp.; 5. Eva Christina, b. 28 Jan. 1739, wife of Matheus King; 6. Maria Margaretha, b. 20 Apr. 1743, wife of Philip Stuber of Allen twp; 7. On 3 June, 1831 Jacob Wolf and wife gave a release to the executor of her father's estate in which they state they are of Armstrong Co. She signed the document by a mark. She was known as "Teany." 11. f. George Adam, b. 11 Feb. 1765, d. 9 Apr. 1843.
 - g. Rachel, b. 25 Jan. 1767, bap. 15 Mch. 1767. (Hecktown church record.) She was baptised "Regina." In 1784 she married Isaac Townsend, b. 27 Dec. 1763, d. 3 Nov. 1837.¹⁴ She d. 17 Mch. 1855. Both are buried in the old Hines graveyard near Avonmore, Westmoreland Co., Pa.¹⁵ They owned the farm on which the Iron Works and city of Vandergrift are now built.
12. h. Johannes, b. 26 Jan. 1770; d. 1846.
 - i. George David, b. 14 Jan. 1773, bap. 24 Oct. 1773; witnesses, Jonas and Catharine Hartsell. This child presumably died shortly after birth inasmuch as the next son born was given the same name. This was a common custom.

4. MATTHIAS KING (Jacob-Abraham) was born in Northampton county, Pa. 29 Sept. 1756 and according to the records of the Tohicken church in Bucks Co. he was baptised 16 Oct. of the same year. The witnesses were Matheus König and his wife Christina. On 18 Apr. 1778, having reached his majority, he took the oath of allegiance to the provincial government before

In 1788 he was reported a resident and taxpayer in Bethlehem township¹⁶ with 200 acres of land, 2 horses and 2 head of cattle. Matthias was a prominent citizen of Northampton county and was frequently called upon in the settlement of estates. On 11 Dec. 1779 he was appointed one of the administrators in the estate of George Kleiss. (File 876, Register of Wills.) In the estate of Jacob Hartzell we find his signature on the inventory dated 28 May 1789. (File 943, Register of Wills.) On 25th Feb. 1789 he was one of the appraisers in the estate of Martin Ritter in Nazareth twp. (File 1275, Register of Wills.) He was also one of the administrators in the estate of Margaret Knecht, the bond being dated 6 Dec. 1789. (File 1302, Register of Wills.) He also inventoried the estate of George Wolf, father of Governor Wolf of Pennsylvania, 26 Nov. 1790. (File 1349, Register of Wills.)

In addition to farming he was elected one of the assessors of Northampton county 11 Oct. 1780. In this election he received 439 votes. He was a tax collector in Bethlehem twp. as early as 1780 as will be noted by the copy of a receipt issued: "Aug. the 26, 1780 then received the county tax of Jacob Loesch to wit: £88 per me. Matthias King, Collector." We find he held the office again in 1783, he having served in the interim in the militia. He was also collector in 1788.

On 6 Feb. 1780 he and Miss Meickels were sponsors at the baptism of Christina Illick according to the records of the Williams twp. congregation. In 1780, 1781 and 1782 he was a private in Capt. Geo. Nolf's company, Northampton County Militia and in the latter year he served as a corporal of the company. (Pa. Arch. s. 6, v. XI, p. 253.)

His father died in 1781 when he was still a single man. Although entitled under the law to two shares in his father's estate, he being the eldest son, he showed his magnanimous spirit in agreeing to accept one child's share only, a one-tenth part which amounted to £45. 5. 8.¹⁷

He married Eva Elizabeth, daughter of Melchoir¹⁸ and Catharine Young, 6 Mch. 1782. She was b. 27 Jan. 1758 and d. 12 Feb. 1813.¹⁹ Matthias King died 12 Aug. 1816 and both he and his wife are buried in the Hecktown cemetery. He left no will, his estate being administered by his sons-in-law, Christian Braun, Jr. and William Lawall. The U.S. Census of 1790 reported one person of his name in the county with a family consisting of one male over 16 years of age and one female. The children of Matthias and Eva Elizabeth King were:

5. JACOB KING (Jacob-Abraham) was born about 1759. He was a farmer in Bethlehem twp., Northampton Co., Pa. On 15 June 1778 he took the oath of Allegiance to the Provincial

Government before John Arndt as shown by the records in the Prothonotary's office at Easton. Ten years later he appears on the assessment rolls as a single man.

He was twice married. His first wife was Catharine Fogel, daughter of Leonard Fogel. She died prior to 1800. His second wife was Elizabeth, dau. of George Fetterman.²²

Jacob King and his brother Adam were privates in the Northampton County Militia, being members of Capt. Nolf's Company in 1781 and 1782 and are shown on the military rolls as having received depreciation pay. (Pa. Arch. s. 5, v. 8, p. 145, 163, 182 and 523.) In 1782 Jacob King was a private, 5th class, 6th Co., 6 Bat., Militia of Northampton Co. commanded by Col. Henry Geiger, Maj. Frederick Saylor. (P. A. s. 5, v. 8, p. 512.) He was also a private in Capt. Michel's Company in 1784. (P. A. s. 6, v. 3, p. 18, 821), and was in the service at Wyoming 31 July to 25 Aug. 1785, in Capt. Lewis Stecher's Co., 6th Bat. N. C. Militia. (P. A., s. 2, v. 14, p. 603; s. 5, v. 8, p. 475; and s. 5, v. 12, p. 826.)

On 8 Dec. 1806 he was one of the administrators in the estate of Elizabeth Snyder of Bethlehem twp., widow of Philip Snyder. (File 2417 Reg. of Wills.) After the death of his father he acquired the homestead having accepted it at partition proceedings in the Orphans Court. He d. 23 Mch, 1832 and is reported in "Der Friedens-Bothe as "a highly respected citizen." His will dated 14 June 1831 was probated 9 Apr. 1832. Had issue:

6. ADAM KING (Jacob-Abraham) was born in Bethlehem twp., Northampton Co., Pa. 17 May 1762. In a tax list of 1788, published in the Penna. Archives, he is entered as a single man. Sometime between that date and 1791 he mar. Catharine, dau. of John Dewalt.²⁶ She was b. 20 Dec. 1774, d. 5 Mch. 1842. They resided in Forks twp. where they had a farm. Members of Reformed church.

Adam King served as a private in Capt. Geo. Nolf's Co., Northampton County Militia in 1782. (Pa. Arch. s. 5, v. 8, p. 138.) and in 1784 he was a member of Capt. Michel's Co. (Pa. Arch. s. 6, v. 3, p. 818, 821.) He was one of the executors of his father-in-law's estate in 1814. He d. 13 Aug. 1827 and was buried in Easton but later transferred to Farmersville where his wife was also buried. The Argus of Easton in reporting his death referred to him as George Adam King and states that he was "an old and respected citizen." Had issue:

JOHANNES KING (Jacob-Abraham) was born in Bethlehem twp., Northampton Co., Pa. 20 Nov. 1766, bap. 26 Dec. 1766; witnesses: Johannes and Magdalena Knecht, same being recorded in the records of the Hecktown church. He resided in Lower Nazareth twp. where he followed his trade as a blacksmith. He married (prior to 1792) Maria Catharine Fogel, a daughter of Andreas Fogel²⁷ of Lower Nazareth twp. She was b. 14 Nov. 1771, bap. 22 Dec. 1771. On 23 Oct. 1802 Johannes King purchased land containing 30 acres and 58 purchases and the usual

allowance of six per cent for roads, etc., being a part of the Manor of Fermor, from John and Richard Penn, proprietaries of Pennsylvania. (Deed Book C. 3, p. 58, Easton, Pa.)²⁸ A further purchase of land of three acres is recorded 30 Sept. 1811. John King was sergeant in Nov. 13, 1814 in Capt. Jacob Shurtz's Company of the 18th section of Riflemen commanded by Col. Thomas Humphreys. (Pa. Arch. 2nd ser. vol. XII, page 445.) He was a member of the Reformed Congregation at Dryland church. He d. 24 May 1823. Had issue:

They were members of the Lutheran church and are buried at Hecktown, Pa. Their children were:

10. JOHN JONATHAN KING (Matheus-Abraham) was born in
Northampton Co., Pa. 31 Oct. 1757; baptised according to To-

the oath of allegiance before Thomas Hartman. (Prothonotary's
Office records, Easton, Pa.) In his early life he was a soldier
in the Revolutionary War. Before he was 23 years of age we
find he was a Lieutenant in Capt. John Santee's Company of
Northampton County Militia (P. A. s. 5, v. 8, p. 125, 150, 197)
and as an officer in the company he issued the following certifi-
cate, "This is to certify that Jacob Mouser of Capt. Nolf's

Company of Militia has served a half month in the militia in his dour for guarding prisoners from Easton to Reading in Dec. 1782. Jevin under my hand this 15th day of July, 1781. Jonathan King, Lieut." (P. A. s. 5, v. 8, p. 147.) The spelling is like the original but the date "Dec. 1782" should be Dec. 1780. He is also listed as having received depreciation pay (P. A. s. 5, v. 4, p. 330). From July 30, 1784 to Aug. 23, 1784 he served as a private in Capt. Jacob Balliett's Company at Wyoming (P. A. s. 6, v. 3, p. 786) and again in 1785 he enrolled in the Northampton Co. Militia in Capt. John Santee's Company (P. A. s. 6, v. 3, p. 831).

In the census of 1790 his name appears as a resident of Northampton Co., the family consisting of one male over 16 years of age, two males under 16 yrs. and two females and on Dec. 22 of that year he was one of the administrators of the estate of Wm. Hooker. On 1 Apr. 1792 Jonathan King and his wife Christina were witnesses at the baptism of his namesake in the same county. In the Pa. Arch. 6 ser., v. 5, p. 424 Jonathan Konig is named as captain in the 3rd Regt., 1st Bat., Company 4 of Northampton Co. Militia, John Mulhallon Lt. Col. and Isaac Hartsell 2nd Major. On the same page under the title "Rank of Ensigns and their names" appears George A. Konig, 4th company and Matthias Konig, 6th company and on page 429 under date of June 9, 1794, John Craig, Brigade Inspector certifies that John Hartsell has been elected and returned Captain of the 4th company in place of Jonathan Konig removed.

It was about this time or probably in the fall of 1793 that Jonathan Konig and George A. Konig emigrated to Westmoreland county and located in Mt. Pleasant township. After an indefinite sojourn there he removed with his family to Brady's Bend twp., Armstrong Co., Pa., and was one of the original settlers in that territory where, in 1804, he was assessed with 200 acres, 1 horse and 3 cattle at \$148 and with the same acreage and an additional horse the next year at \$158. He was residing on this tract when he was commissioned the second sheriff of Armstrong county by Thos. McKean, Governor of Pennsylvania, Nov. 12, 1808, and took the oath of office Dec. 1, 1808, before Paul Morrow, Prothonotary. After the close of his term, on being asked if he had made or saved any money from the income of his office, he replied that he had not, but that he had had "a good living" during his term.

Armstrong county was established by Act of Assembly in 1800 and organized for Judicial purposes in 1805. Previous to Mr. King's commission as sheriff, he was appointed county

commissioner by Gov. McKean and as such there was conveyed in 1807 by James Sloan and James Mathews, Trustees for Armstrong county, appointed under Act of Assembly creating said county, to Jonathan King, James Jackson and Thomas Johnston, the then County Commissioners, lands held in trust by them for the use of the county, the deed being recorded in Deed Book, Vol. 1, p. 383. There is in possession of the late Hon. James W. King, former Judge of Armstrong County a document as follows:

"This indenture made the 17th day of November, 1826, by and between Charles Campbell of Indiana County, and state of Pennsylvania, of the one part and Jonathan King, Sen., of Armstrong County and state aforesaid of the other part: Witnesseth that the said Charles Campbell has bargained and leased to the said Jonathan King the part of the land he lives on in the said county for and during his natural life and Christina during her natural life and they are to have full possession of said part of the said place free and clear of all incumbrances but paying the taxes as they accrue thereon, and the said Jonathan King does promise to keep the place in tenable repair during his life and at his death and his wife's the said Charles Campbell is to have the full and free possession of that part of the tract of land and the said King is to make proof of his settlement on said land and the said Campbell is to pay the expense of said proof. Given under our hands and seals the day above written."

This was a part of the tract known as "Campbelltown" in Sugar Creek township, Armstrong Co., and likely on this tract Mr. King lived and died on 16 June 1837. His wife was Christina -----.

11. GEORGE ADAM KING (Matheus-Abraham) was born in Nazareth township, Northampton Co., Pa. 11 Feb. 1765, bap. 17 Feb. 1765; witnesses: Jacob and Magdalena Gross. He married

Maria Catharine George, daughter of Conrad and Susan George, born in Nazareth twp., 25 Oct. 1768. About 1793 he moved with his family to Westmoreland County and settled in Mt. Pleasant twp. and later to Armstrong County, Pa., where he purchased a farm as early as 1812. This farm contained 118 acres and later he became owner of 139 acres of land in Pine township.³¹

He was one of the pioneers in Armstrong County which was organized in 1800. He was the first constable of Kittaning twp. of said county, serving during the years 1807, 1808 and 1809 and was also frequently called as a juror. In 1806, with 11 other men and their wives, George Adam King and wife organized St. Michael's Lutheran church, then in Kittaning twp., now Burrell, still a vigorous congregation. In 1922 a monument was erected at this church as a memorial to Matheus King and wife and son George Adam King. His wife Maria Catharine King, died about 1830. He married a second time about 1832, Margaret Devers,³²

³¹Hon. James W. King, former Judge of Armstrong County, wrote the author that in his opinion "there is no doubt that George Adam King on first coming into Armstrong County settled or lived awhile in Kiskiminitas township (it was then old Allegheny twp.). About the same time that he came, or perhaps sooner, his sister Regina, intermarried with Isaac Townsend, settled in said township. So did his sisters, Christina intermarried with Jacob Wolf, and Magdalena intermarried with Nicholas Weitzell, settled in the same township. Isaac Townsend remained there, Jacob Wolf moved later to the northern part of Armstrong County and settled in what is now Washington twp. or Bethel twp. Descendants of his lived and still live in each of said townships. Of Weitzell, I have no record of where he died, nor as to his wife. George Adam King came and settled in the twp., now Burrell, then Kittanning, near the present Brick Church P.O."

³²Margaret Davers was the widow of George Shoemaker, a substantial farmer, who seated the tract called "Monmouth." In his last will and testament he devised said land containing some 250 acres to his widow. She afterward married Barnard Davers, of South Bend twp., who died shortly afterward. Her third husband was George Adam King. Before her marriage to Davers and to King an ante nuptial contract was entered into, signed and acknowledged by both parties and then recorded in Armstrong county in deed book vol. 7, page 460. The purpose of this instrument was principally to preserve the estates of each from change in title by reason of said marriage. In both instances husband and wife lived separately, each on his or her own farm and there was no interference in ownership or management by the respective owners during the week, and on Saturday the husband would go to his wife's residence and stay over Sunday with her. She required each of her husbands to pay, as they cheerfully did, an annual stipend in flour for his boarding and horse keep. She survived Mr. King but did not marry again. She is buried on the Shoemaker farm.

of German parentage. He died 9 Apr. 1843, and is buried in the old graveyard on the Bush farm, in what is now Burrell twp., Armstrong Co., Pa. A well preserved gravestone with the following neatly carved inscription was found on the Bush farm in 1916 on the grave of Geo. Adam King: "1843, D. Aprile 9, G. A. King." 12. JOHANNES KING (Matheus-Abraham) was born in Nazareth twp., Northampton Co., Pa., 26 Jan. 1770, bap. 25 Mch. 1770; witnesses: Johannes and Catharine Schweitzer. Recorded in Hecktown church records. His wife was Catharine -----. The census of 1790 states that he was a resident of Northampton Co. and that the family consisted of one male over 16 years, one male under 16 and one female. About 1794 he migrated with his family to Westmoreland Co., Pa. and located in that part of Hempfield twp. which later became Mt. Pleasant township. There he purchased a farm on the waters of the big Sewickly creek containing 100 acres. On 10 Oct. 1838 he sold a part of this farm, 72 acres 15 perches, to Joshua Evans for \$1400, deed being recorded in Westmoreland Co., deed book 27, p. 443. This tract was conveyed 6 July 1844 to Daniel Kuhns. This was the original homestead of his father, Matheus King. Johannes King was the executor of his father's estate. He d. Mch. 1846. Issue:

13. GEORGE DAVID KING (Matheus-Abraham) was b. in Northampton Co., Pa. 14 Jan. 1776; bap. 21 Jan. 1776; witnesses: Geo. and Susanna Dörrhamer, recorded in the Hecktown, Pa. church records. He moved with his parents to Westmoreland Co., Pa., about the year 1794 where he was known as "David" King. On 14 Dec. 1829 he gave a release to his brother, John King of Hempfield twp., Westmoreland Co., Pa., for his portion of his father's estate. In this release David King is named as of Indiana Co., Pa. He married Margaret Ringle.³³

³³Mathias Ringle was born 1742 and died 1852. He married 1783 Julian Pohr, b. 1769, d. 31 Jan. 1840. He is buried in St. James cemetery, Westmoreland Co., Pa. His children were: Margaret (known as Peggy), b. 1784 wife of Geo. David King; Eva married Mr. Yockey; John; Abraham; Elizabeth mar. Mr. Cyfert; Stofel; Daniel; Johan; and five other children. Mathias Ringle was an ensign during the Revolutionary War in the 3rd Company, 1st Battalion of Northampton County Militia, Capt. Geo. Groff, Colonel, Geo. Hubner commanding, 1777. (Pa. David King and family spent the early part of their married life in Livermore, Pa. He was a boatman on the canal. They lived at the "Headquarters," later moving to Saltsburg where he was a lock-keeper, living at the lock house.

There his wife died very suddenly about 1838-1839. David King died at the home of his son David about 1852 and was buried in the old graveyard at Saltsburg. There are no tombstones for him and his wife. Issue:

Catharine his wife, William King and Catharine his wife, Henry King and Rachel his wife, Chrissy King wife of Abner Sletuz, all the heirs and legal representatives of Henry King, late of the state of Ohio, deceased, who was one of the sons and heirs of Matheus King, late of Westmoreland county, Pa. deceased. 55. THOMAS D. KING (Thomas-Johannes-Jacob-Abraham) was widely known throughout the Lehigh Valley and the Delaware Valley as a professor of penmanship. He was born in Lower Saucon township, Northampton County, Pa., 23 Apr. 1841. In 1870 he moved to Easton, Pa., where he was a teacher in the public

schools of South Easton. For a number of years he also taught in the schools of Williams twp. and Lower Saucon twp. and later conducted schools for penmanship in various towns of the Lehigh Valley. Under his brother Stephen he served as deputy Recorder of Deeds for Northampton County. For nearly a score of years he suffered with writer's palsy.
