Elizabeth, first wife; died at Groton. JOHN LAWRENCE, baptized at Wisset, Oct. 8, 1609; came to New England in 1630, and settled at Watertown. In 1662 he removed to Groton, where he died. 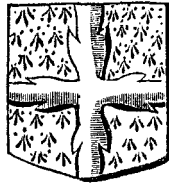

## PREFATORY REMARKS.

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**I**T is now ten years since the printed copy of "A Genealogical Memoir of John Lawrence, of Watertown, Mass.," was put in circulation. That was the first attempt at any thing of the kind; and, as a genealogy, was imperfect in arrangement, incomplete in parts or branches, and incorrect in many of its particulars, yet such as the time and circumstances of the case afforded. Though reluctantly sent forth for the use of the family, it is pleasant to know that its circulation has not failed in respect to the end sought. A gratuity though it was to the individuals and families of the name receiving it, many more copies could have been bestowed, where desired, had not the supply failed. Nor should acknowledgment be here omitted of the many written testimonials and thanks returned for the possession of even so brief and imperfect a genealogy of the Lawrences of New England.

Within the last ten years, several volumes and pamphlets have appeared, contributing more or less of interest and material towards the general subject of the present work. The "History of Groton, Pepperell, and Shirley," by Esquire BUTLER; the "History and

Genealogy of Watertown," by Dr. BOND; the "Family of Isaac Lawrence, of Canaan, Conn.," by Mr. F. S. PEASE, of Albany, N. Y., and others associated with him; and the "Family of Benjamin Lawrence," by Miss MERCY HALE, of Stowe, Mass., — are of this kind.

For the most reliable and satisfactory statements concerning the parentage and ancestry, in England, of *John Lawrence*, of Watertown, a part of which are herein given, we are indebted to H. G. SOMERBY, Esq., through the suggestion and liberality of the late Hon. ABBOTT LAWRENCE. (See New Eng. Hist. and Gen. Reg., No. 4, vol. x.) Yet the greater part by far of what is here found has been gathered by personal labor and correspondence. To those of the name, or related, living in Maine, New Hampshire, Vermont, Connecticut, New York, and some of the Western States, who have contributed towards the collection of the many branches and families comprised in this Genealogy, it will be some gratification, perhaps, that it has greater value, in various respects, than it was possible the former should have.

While the same order of enumeration and the general plan of arrangement are observed, the succession of families is strictly chronological, in accordance with birth and descent, from generation to generation; also, new and important branches, not before given, are herein embraced, and the aggregate of families is nearly five times that of the former volume.

The constantly recurring duties and labors of the pastoral relation preclude opportunity or leisure for travel and investigation to any great extent; as also the necessity for daily effort to support a

family, or want of money, renders such expenditures quite out of question. •

In reference to the price and sale of this volume, it may not perhaps be improper to say, that, for the time and labor expended on the former, not a dollar has been received; while, of the money paid out for the same, and in connection therewith, not the half of it has been returned. My circumstances, if not inclination and professional duties, would have deterred from incurring further liabilities and prosecuting further labors in this matter; but repeated communications and inquiries as to another Genealogy, and a general expectation that I should ere long offer it for sale, have encouraged me to go forward in the work.

Such as it is, for those of the family-name or related alone has it been attempted; and to them it is offered, with the request, that they who detect errors, of which no doubt there are some, if not many, would report and rectify the same; also, that any branches or families of this stock, not given or known by me, be forwarded, as before directed, "Care of Z. HOSMER, 110, Milk Street, Boston."

The chronological period of this little volume comprises about seven hundred years, or from about A.D. 1150 to the present date. The English lineage extends through sixteen generations, and the American line or genealogy runs to the ninth; embracing in the whole about twenty-five generations.

It will be seen that the numeral account takes in only those bearing the name of Lawrence in the male line, and those of the first generation in the female line, and not their grandchildren;

also that all such, having been reported by name or number, are counted. The plan of the whole is quite simple; and, with the help of the reference figures, and the tables or general index at the close, it will be easy for any person to find families, and trace their lineage from the father of our family,—JOHN of WATER-TOWN.

The Family Record is annexed for the use of those who have none, or who please to adopt this.

## T H E   N A M E.

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OF LAWRENCE, as a personal and family name, it is sufficient to say, as to the orthography, that it is now almost universally spelled and written *Lawrence*, and not *Laurence* or *Lawrance*, as formerly was the case.

The derivation of this name of men may be traced to the Latin word *Laurus*, — *Laurentius*. Its signification has been thus given on the Town Records of Hingham, Mass., first page: “Christian names for men now most used with the signification, *Lawrence*, — flourishing like a bay-tree.”

### ARCHBISHOP LAWRENCE.

The first individual of this name who lived in England, yet ascertained, was *Lawrence*, the monk. Collier, in his Dictionary, has the name *Laurentius*. In Harris’s “History of Kent,” it is *Lawrence*. He came from Italy with Austin, who was sent to Britain for the propagation of Christianity in the island.

Upon the death of Austin, he succeeded him to the Archbishopric of Canterbury. He is said to have been both learned and pious; and, at his death, was buried in the Abbey of St. Austins, A.D. 916.





# The Ancestral Lineage

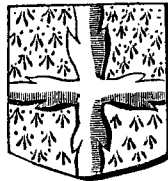
OF

JOHN LAWRENCE, OF WATERTOWN, MASS.

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THE lineal ancestry of this stock of Lawrences in America, now found quite numerous in New England and other parts of the country, has been at length very satisfactorily ascertained. As traced and determined, it originates in and derives from one **Robert Lawrence**, of Lancashire, England; born, probably, as early as A.D. 1150, and the ancestor of the earliest families of the name in England. Attending his sovereign, Richard Cœur de Lion, to the war of the Crusades in the Holy Land, he so distinguished himself in the siege of Acre, that he was knighted "Sir Robert of Ashton Hall," and obtained for his arms, "Argent, a cross raguly gules," A.D. 1191.

The arms of Sir Robert of Ashton Hall, conferred by Richard I., namely, "Argent, a cross raguly gules," were also those of the Lancashire branch generally, thus:—



Also, "He beareth Ermine, a cross raguled gules, by the name of *Lawrence*, of Lancashire." "Raguled" is a term used "to represent the rough-hewn stems of a tree from which the branches have been rudely lopped."

Proceeding with the successive generations of ancestry, we have, in order of time, the first, — Sir **Robert Lawrence**, of *Ashton Hall*.

#### THE SECOND GENERATION.

Sir **Robert**, a son, and the immediate successor, of the knight of the Crusades, to the estate of Ashton Hall, married a daughter of James Trafford, Esq., of Lancashire; by whom he had a son and heir, **James Lawrence**.

#### THE THIRD GENERATION.

**James** of Ashton Hall married, it is said, "in 1252," Matilda de Washington, daughter of John de Washington, an heiress. A son by this marriage, and the successor of James of Ashton Hall, was **John Lawrence**, said to have been living in the thirty-seventh year of Henry III.

Respecting the names "Lawrence" and "Washington," it may be noted, that Lawrence Washington, a brother of the first President of the United States, was one of the earliest proprietors of Mount Vernon.

#### THE FOURTH GENERATION.

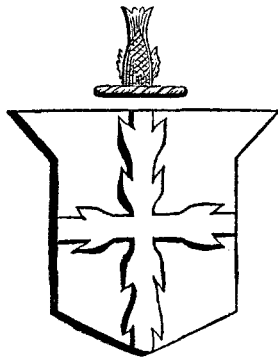
**John** of Ashton Hall married Margaret, daughter of Walter Chesford; by whom he had a son, **John Lawrence**, his heir and successor.

## THE FIFTH GENERATION.

**John**, son of John and Margaret, married Elisabeth Holt, of Stably, in Lancashire; and died, it is said, A.D. 1360, leaving **Robert** Lawrence, his son and heir.

## THE SIXTH GENERATION.

Sir **Robert**, of Ashton Hall, married Margaret Holden, of Lancashire, and had, I. **Robert**; II. Thomas, the father of Arthur Lawrence, Esq., of Prior's Court, in Gloucestershire; III. William, born 1425, or before, who fought under the Lancastrian banner at St. Alban's in 1455, and, having fallen there, was buried in the Abbey; IV. Edmund, who is said to have married a daughter of Miles de Stapleton, a descendant of the distinguished family of that name of Norman extraction. The Gloucestershire branch of the family had the same arms as already given; likewise the Buckinghamshire Lawrences. Thus, "Argent, a cross raguled gules, is borne by a family of the name of *Lawrence* in Buckinghamshire and Gloucestershire." — "Crest, The tail (or hindmost half) of a chub (fish) inverted and erect."



## THE SEVENTH GENERATION.

Sir **Robert**, son of Sir Robert and Margaret Holden, of Ashton Hall, married Amphilbis, daughter of Edward Longford, Esq., of Longford; and had, I. James, heir and successor to the estate of Ashton Hall, who married Cecily, daughter of — Boteler, Esq., of Lancashire, an heiress, and had issue, two sons and a daughter. II. Robert, who married Margaret, daughter of John Lawrence, Esq., of Lancashire, and had sons, Robert and John, the latter of whom commanded a wing of the English army, under Lord Stanley, in the battle of Flodden Field; also William, who became a great landholder. III. **Nicholas** Lawrence.

## THE EIGHTH GENERATION.

**Nicholas**, son of Sir Robert and Amphilbis, was of Agercroft. He married, and had sons, I. Thomas; II. Nicholas; III. Robert; IV. **John**; V. William; VI. Henry; VII. Oliver, the ancestor of the Crich Grange branch of Lawrences. The son and successor of Sir Oliver Lawrence was Edward, who died in 1601; leaving a son, Sir Edward, who was knighted in 1619, and died about 1630.

## THE NINTH GENERATION.

**John**, son of Nicholas Lawrence, of Agercroft, was ancestor of the Lawrences of St. James's Park in Suffolk, it is stated in the pedigree of the Lawrences of Ashton Hall. He died in 1461; leaving **Thomas** Lawrence, of Rumburgh, in Suffolk.

## THE TENTH GENERATION.

**Thomas** of Rumburgh held lands in other places; as Holton, Wisset, and South Elmham. He married, and had, I. **John**; II. Richard, of St. Ives. The will of Thomas Lawrence is dated July 17, 1471.

## THE ELEVENTH GENERATION.

**John** Lawrence, son of Thomas of Rumburgh, married Margery —, by whom he had a son, **Robert**. His will was made July 10, 1504, the year of his death: his wife died in 1507. Both were buried in the church of Rumburgh.

## THE TWELFTH GENERATION.

**Robert**, son of John and Margery Lawrence, is named in his father's will, and his *wife* in that of her mother-in-law. Their issue was a son, **John** Lawrence.

## THE THIRTEENTH GENERATION.

**John** of Rumburgh, mentioned in the will of his grandmother, married Elisabeth —, by whom he had, I. Henry; II. **John**; III. Agnes; IV. Margaret; V. Katharine; VI. William, of St. James's Park, South Elmham; exiled during the reign of Queen Mary, he afterwards returned, and labored as a preacher at Fressingfield; VII. Richard, of Wisset and Rumburgh, whose will was dated Jan. 27, 1556.

## THE FOURTEENTH GENERATION.

**John**, son of John and Elisabeth Lawrence, married Agnes —, and had, I. **John**; II. Richard, who died in 1596; III. Susan; IV. Elisabeth; V. Margaret. His wife died Jan. 22, 1583. His will bears date April 27, 1590. He was buried at Rumburgh, May 21, 1590.

## THE FIFTEENTH GENERATION.

**John**, son of John and Agnes Lawrence, was of Wisset, in Suffolk, and married Johan —. They had issue, I. **Henry**; II. Robert, whose will, dated 1641, names his kinsman, Henry North of Laxfield, a son of Sir Henry North, and grandson of Lord North; III. Margery; IV. Katharine. The will of John Lawrence, of Wisset, is dated June 2, 1606. He was buried Jan. 16, 1607.

## THE SIXTEENTH GENERATION.

**Henry**, son of John and Johan Lawrence, married Mary —; by whom he had **John**, born at Wisset, and baptized Oct. 8, 1609. The will of John Lawrence, of Wisset, the father of Henry, refers to him as having removed from Wisset to New England, and settled in Charlestown. And on the lists of those who became inhabitants of Charlestown, Mass., in 1635, is the name of *Henry Lawrence*. Also, "In the first division of land on Mistick side, of ten acres to a house, five of which were given in for after-comers, made, as it appears, Feb. 20, 1638, *Henry Lawrence* received five acres." A house-lot was granted him in 1635 by George Blott.

# THE GENEALOGY.

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## THE GENERATIONS AND FAMILIES.

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### GENERATION NO. I.

1. FAMILY NO. I. — **John Lawrence**, son of HENRY and MARY, born at Wisset, England; baptized Oct. 8, 1609; came to New England, married Elisabeth —, and settled in Watertown. They had children: —

  3. II. **Nathaniel**, b. Oct. 1639. 3, Groton.
  4. III. **JOSEPH**, b. March, 1642; d. May, 1642.
  5. IV. **JOSEPH**, b. May 30, 1643; m., probably in 1670–1, Rebecca —; had dau. Rebecca baptized in the First Church, Boston, Feb. 1679–80. He was admitted a freeman, May 15, 1672; appointed an executor of his father's estate; and held lands in Groton.
  6. V. **JONATHAN**, b. —; d. —; buried April 6, 1648.
  7. VI. **Mary**, b. July 16, 1645. 4, Charlestown.
  8. VII. **Peleg**, b. Jan. 10, 1646–7. 5, Groton.
  9. VIII. **Enoch**, b. March 5, 1648–9. 6, Groton.
  10. IX. **SAMUEL**, b. —; m., it is supposed, Sept. 14, 1682, Rebecca Luen, of Charlestown; and removed to Connecticut.
  11. X. **ISAAC**, b. —; m., April 19, 1682, Abigail Bellows, b. in Concord, May 6, 1661, who through her mother, Mary

Woods Bellows, became heir, with her husband, of an uncle, Dea. Isaac Woods, of Marlborough. Isaac Lawrence lived for a time in Norwich, Conn.

13. XI. ELISABETH, b. May 9, 1655, in Boston.
14. XII. JONATHAN, b. —, in Watertown; probably m., Nov. 5, 1677, Rebecca Rutter, of Cambridge; died in 1725, leaving no issue. By his will, dated Aug. 27, 1725, approved Oct. 29, 1729, he left to the town of Groton "£100 towards the purchasing and procuring a good meeting-house bell, and the putting it up." It was voted, "that the name of Lieut. *Jonathan* Lawrence be set thereon." Also he left "to the church of Christ in Groton £40, to be laid out for the procuring of some silver vessel or vessels for the church's use, as they shall order;" also "£20, the income to be annually paid or accounted for to the settled or ordained minister."
15. XIII. ZECHARIAH, b. March 9, 1658-9, in Watertown. He was a mariner, and lived probably in Boston. Elisabeth, wife of John Lawrence, died in Groton, Aug. 29, 1663. He m., Nov. 2, 1664, Susanna, daughter of Wm. Batchelder, of Charlestown; by whom he had, —
16. XIV. ABIGAIL, b. Jan. 9, 1666, in Groton.
17. XV. SUSANNA, b. July 3, 1667, in Groton.

He was admitted a freeman, April 17, 1637, when about twenty-eight years old; though it will be seen, by the early Massachusetts Records, that the freeman's oath was given at first to males of only sixteen years. Feb. 28, 1636, he received three acres of land, his share of a grant then made to the townsmen, a hundred and six in number. In 1650, he bought of the town fifteen acres of common land (called King's Common). "In 1654, Hugh Mason received of John Lawrence, clerk, £2. 17s. 6d., money for town or parish use." His removal to Groton is determined by various facts and dates. Town Records are in exist-



ence, dated June 23, 1662; the first probably made. As one of the original proprietors, he owned "a twenty-acre right." The sale of his lands and mansion-house in Watertown was made in 1662. In December of the same year, it appears by the records of Groton, "meet men were found amongst the inhabitants," of whom "John Lawrence" was one, "who were chosen selectmen." He was evidently a man of some intelligence and influence, and held a good place in the public esteem. Though a large landholder for the times, he is said to have carried on the business of a carpenter both in Watertown and Boston. He died in Groton, July 11, 1667; leaving his sons Nathaniel and Joseph, and wife Susanna, executors of his will. The widow, Susanna Lawrence, died July 8, 1668, in Charlestown.

*Extracts from the will of John Lawrence, sen., deceased 1667.*

- 1st, Of himself. — "I commend my soul into y<sup>e</sup> hands of him who gave it; and my body to y<sup>e</sup> earth, to a decent burial, in full hope of a joyful resurrection, when in my flesh I shall see God."
- 2d, *Of his wife.* — "I will, y<sup>t</sup> besides what hath been formerly, by legacy, contract, or *otherwise*, engaged to my wife, and is her due, there be added to it threescore pounds. And my will is, y<sup>t</sup> she have free and full liberty in the first place, and before any other legacy be paid, to make choice out of the whole Estate, either lands or moveables;" "provided, if of lands she shall take of land and meadow proportionable;" "provided, also, that foure oxen be reserved out of the moveables." "And, if she will live in the house during the time of her widowhood, it shall be without molestation."

*Passages from the Will of Deacon Nathaniel Lawrence, sen., given while residing in Charlestown.*

*Inprimis.* — I commit my soul into the hand of God, who gave it; and my body to the dust, in hopes of a happy and a glorious resurrection through the power and merits of my alone Saviour Jesus Christ, my Redeemer.

*Item.*—My will is, that my funeral charges be satisfied out of my estate, in the first place.

*Item.*—I give to my eldest son, Nathaniel Lawrence, besides what I gave him before, ten acres of land in Groton, at a place called Indian Hill, and one acre of meadow near Brown-loaf Plain; and, at Cow-pond Brook, I give him ten acres of meadow, with six acres of upland adjoining to it. And I give £10 more to my son aforesaid. Also,—

*Item.*—I give to my son John Lawrence £20, besides what he has had before.

*Item.*—I give to my daughter Holden four acres of meadow at a place called Rock Meadow, at the lower end, and also sixty acres of land at a place called Mulpus, and six acres of interval; all which I value at £20.

*Item.*—I give to my daughter Mary Wheeler \$20.

*Item.*—I give to my son Samuel Page the remainder of Rock Meadow, with two acres of meadow at a place called Squauna Cook. And sixty acres of land at Mulpus, with six acres of interval, with a ten-acre right, I give to my daughter Holden and my son Page, to be equally divided between them, which I value at £20.

He gave also to daughter Elisabeth Harris, £20; to daughter Deborah Tufts, £20; and to a grand-daughter, Jane Lawrence, "a porridge-pot" at his decease. The balance of the estate was to be equally divided among all the heirs. Nathaniel and John Lawrence were sole executors of this his last will and testament, Aug. 4, 1718.

John Lawrence, and Anna his wife, were received into the church in Lexington, Feb. 9, 1698-9. She died Dec. 19, 1732, aged sixty-three years. He died March 12, 1746-7, aged seventy-nine years seven months. He was a man of understanding and piety, and sustained important offices and relations in society, devoting himself especially to the support of schools and the gospel of Christ. A few clauses from his will are given:—

1st, *Of himself*. — “Calling to mind the mortality of my body, and knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die, I do make and ordain this my last will and testament. That is to say, principally and first of all, I give and recommend my soul unto the hands of God who gave it, hoping, through the merits, death, and passion of my Saviour Jesus Christ, to have full and free pardon and forgiveness of all my sins, and to inherit everlasting life; and my body I commit to the earth, to be decently buried at the discretion of my executor, nothing doubting but at the general resurrection I shall receive the same again by the mighty power of God.”

2d, “I will, that all those debts and duty I owe in right or conscience to any manner of person or persons whatever shall be well and truly paid, or ordained to be paid in convenient time after my decease, by my executor hereafter named.”

3d, *Of Samuel*. — “I do give unto my son, Samuel Lawrence, one hundred pounds, old tenor, out of my estate, beside what I have given him: out of which, all his just debts due in this country shall be paid, and the remainder to be refunded to him if living; if not, to be equally divided amongst my other children, it being in full of his part out of my estate.”

4th, Of Anna and Sarah. — "My will is, that my daughters, Anna Bancroft and Sarah Fisk, have one hundred pounds apiece, old tenor, out of my estate."

5th, Of four of his sons. — "My will is, that my sons John Lawrence and William and Benjamin and Amos Lawrence, do have one hundred and twenty pounds apiece, old tenor, out of my estate."

EPITAPH. — "Here lye the remains of Col. WILLIAM LAWRENCE, who departed this life May 19, A.D. 1764, anno ætatis 67.

"He was a gentleman who, in military life, rose from the rank of Capt. Lieut. to the command of a regiment. In the year 1739, he was made Justice of the Peace; afterwards Quorum Unus, a special Justice of the Court of Common Pleas for the county of Middlesex, and a standing Justice of that county. He for many years represented the town of Groton, with the districts of Pepperell and Shirley, in the General Assembly of this province. In all his public betrustments, he acquitted himself with fidelity and honour. In private life, his behaviour was becoming his Christian profession. He was remarkably industrious in the improvement of time; just in his dealings; a good neighbour; a faithful friend; patient of injuries, and ready to forgive them; grateful to benefactors; very ready in affording assistance to the widow and fatherless; and merciful to all proper objects of pity. He was a strict observer of the Lord's Day, a constant and serious attender on the public exercises of religion, and devout worshipper of God in his family."

"Blessed are the dead who dye in the Lord."

"Here also lies Buryed the Body of Mrs Susanna Lawrence, Relict of the above-named Col. Wm. Lawrence. She was a woman of Piety and good sense; an industrious, prudent wife; an indulgent parent; a good neighbour; a faithful Friend; a hater of Hypocrisy and Guile; a lover of Hospitality; Patient under affliction; and Resigned to the will of Heaven in death, by which she was called out of the world, to receive the Rewards of a faithful servant, on the 10th of September, in the 80th year of her Age, A.D. 1771."

lated a valuable property; had several large farms, which he kept under cultivation; was the owner at one time of twenty slaves, to whom he gave their freedom before his death, excepting one, who was made free by his heirs. He made provision also for the aged and infirm, and the comfort of those that were needy.

"It is said, that, when Lord Gordon and the Earl of Morris passed through the Colonies to ascertain their resources, and ability to bear taxation, they put up at Capt. Isaac's house. His lordship expressed surprise at the apparently good condition of his slaves, and asked them if they always fared so well. Their spokesman was London, who said, 'Yes, massa: we have vittle enough, clo' enough, and work enough.'

"He held various town-offices, and was a representative to the General Assembly of Connecticut in 1765.

"It is truly stated, that his extensive business transactions, bringing him in contact with a great number of persons, his excellent reputation, and the veneration in which he was held, afford the best evidence of an honorable and benevolent course of life.

"The frequency with which his name appears in the records of the business meetings of his church, and information from other sources, afford good reasons for believing he was an exemplary Christian."

"Captain Thomas Lawrence, of Pepperell, is represented as a man of gigantic stature, herculean strength, bold and courageous, experienced in Indian warfare, and holding in thorough contempt the valor of the savages."

He was commander of a company enlisted for the French war, in 1758, from Pepperell and its vicinity. Rev. Mr. Emerson preached a sermon, on the occasion of their departure to join the army, creditable alike to himself and the soldiers addressed.

Yet it was when in command of a ranging party of about twenty men, in 1758, at a place called "Half-way Brook," near Lake George, and they were suddenly surrounded by Indians, that Captain Lawrence was mortally wounded. Many of his men fell at the first fire: a few escaped. "His body, when found, was in a horribly mangled state."—"Bullets taken from the spot near where he fell, and a platter marked 'C. T. L.' are in the possession of the family of the late General Thomas Longley."

Rev. William Lawrence entered Harvard College in 1739, when in his seventeenth year; graduated 1743; and was ordained pastor of the church in Lincoln, Dec. 7, 1748. "During his labors, the church enjoyed great peace. The number of persons admitted into full communion was one hundred and twenty-two; baptisms, six hundred and five; marriages, one hundred and twenty-two; and two hundred and ninety-four deaths."—"In memory of Rev. Wm. Lawrence, A.M., Pastor of the Church of Christ in Lincoln, who died April 11, 1780, in the fifty-seventh year of his age, and thirty-second of his ministry. He was a gentleman of good abilities, both natural and acquired, a judicious divine, a faithful minister and firm supporter of the order of the churches."

"Hon. James Prescott was much engaged, during a long life, in business of a public nature. In the militia, he passed through all the grades of office, from ensign of a company to colonel of a regiment. Jonas Clark, with Deacon James Browne, and Jonathan Lawrence, delegates from Lexington; Rev. John Hubbard (scribe), and delegate from Northfield; and the Rev. C. Sumner, from Keene, N.H. The articles of agreement were signed by Micah Lawrence, Josiah Willard, and Phillip Goss. Rev. Mr. Lawrence labored here for thirteen



years with a good measure of success. His style of writing was characterized by method, clearness, closeness, and strength. In doctrine scriptural and sound, in order and discipline careful and unyielding, his constant reference was to the law and the testimony. Highly conservative in spirit, and loyal beyond most of that day, his political sentiments became the occasion of disaffection among a portion of the people; yet it was not until after a second or third council had acted upon the matter that a dismissal was obtained, — the only ground of dissatisfaction being a suspicion that he was “unfriendly to the war.” After 1777, he preached in other places; and died in Keene, N.H., 1794, aged fifty-five years. Mrs. Eunice Lawrence died in Keene, N.H., 20th October, 1788, in her forty-fourth year.

Deacon Samuel Lawrence died in Groton, the 8th of November, 1827, aged seventy-three years.

He was one of those who rallied at Concord to oppose the progress of the British troops. At the time the news of their approach reached Groton, he was in the field; when, mounting his horse, he rode through the adjoining towns, giving the alarm, and returned in season to join his company at the meeting-house. In the battle of Bunker Hill, he received a slight wound; and his hat and coat, pierced with the balls of the enemy, were preserved for many years. At the time of his marriage, while the ceremony was in progress, the tolling of the meeting-house bell called out the minute-men; whereupon he parted from his bride as soon as the rite was finished, and marched

to Rhode Island, but shortly returned, on furlough, for a few days, after which she did not see him again until the birth of their first-born. He continued in the service till the close of the war, was promoted major, and fought in many of the hardest battles of the Revolution. Respected and beloved by his townsmen, they willingly elected him to those offices in which he would serve. Hospitable and kind in his manners, he is still remembered for the cordial welcome and comforts his house afforded. He was a religious man, and, for many years before his death, a deacon in the church. In connection with others, he originated and established, for the good of the community, the institution now called, with great propriety, the "*Lawrence Academy*." In this school his sons received their early education; and well have they remembered its origin, and the advantages they there enjoyed.

During the forty-nine years of his pastoral labors, there were two hundred and fifty-five baptisms, three hundred and twenty-six marriages, and a hundred and twenty-one church-members. The number of deaths, four hundred. The church was organized Nov. 30, 1789. Mr. Lawrence studied with Rev. Mr. Jackson, of Brookline. He wrote a history of the town of Tyngsborough, in 1815, for the Massachusetts Historical Collections.

Hon. Luther Lawrence was a graduate of Harvard College in 1801. He studied law, and had a good practice in his own and the neighboring counties. He was elected a member of the State Legislature, and chosen Speaker of the House. After his removal to Lowell, his professional business increased; yet he never encouraged litigation, but rather advised against it. Elected mayor of the city, he was very much interested, and did much for the improvement of the place, evidence of which is still seen. His large, athletic person and manly bear-

ing, united with native firmness and integrity of character, gave him that address and influence so desirable in men of station and active life. With good natural abilities, he possessed extensive acquired knowledge, a faithful spirit, and habits of active usefulness. He was killed suddenly (while showing to a friend and relative, Tyler Bigelow, Esq., of Watertown, the large mill of the Middlesex Company), by falling into an open wheel-pit, April 17, 1839, when in the sixty-first year of his age.

William Lawrence, Esq., had charge of the paternal farm and mansion in Groton, which he had greatly improved, and rendered one of the most pleasant and valuable of country estates. On this farm he worked several years after his brother Amos removed to Boston, sometimes spending the winter in teaching school. By his own exertions and enterprise in commerce and manufactures (with the inheritance of his wife), he acquired a large property, of which he gave liberally for benevolent objects. The Lawrence Academy, in Groton, received a rich and permanent endowment, by the donation of fifteen thousand dollars to the funds of the institution, from this gentleman. A library of about two thousand volumes of most valuable books, for the use of the students; apparatus for experiments and illustrations in the sciences; the large and commodious houses on each side of the Academy, occupied for boarding; and the residence of the principal, with the general improvement of the grounds, and the erection of the iron fence in front to enclose the buildings, — are a few instances showing the taste, spirit, and ability of the man, and of his brother Amos, associated with him in this enterprise. He was a representative in the Legislature for several years; and took an active part in effecting that arrangement known as the "Suffolk Bank System," so useful in securing a uniform currency in New England. Affable and intelligent in society, and in all business transactions fair and just, he manifested, towards all classes of persons with whom he met, a spirit of kindness and good-will. He died Oct. 14, 1848, aged sixty-five years.

This gentleman was engaged in mercantile business quite early in life, having been for a considerable time a clerk with Mr. Brazer, in Groton. He entered into business in Boston during the time of the embargo, and was uniformly successful in whatever he undertook. Discriminating, careful, and persevering, he soon gained a handsome property. Having persuaded his brother Abbott to come to Boston, after a short time he made him a full partner in business. They became importers of English goods to a large amount, and afterwards made investments in manufacturing. For years, Amos was not actively engaged in business, though still a partner in the firm of A. and A. Lawrence and Company. Devoted to the well-being and happiness of others, to works of private charity and objects of public good, the streams of income from business and invested capital were diverted to these noble purposes, by which the accumulation of wealth beyond the principle adopted was safely prevented. As a merchant and capitalist, his rank is with noble equals; while, as a philanthropist and benefactor, he has a higher place than many of equal ability can claim. To Williams College he

gave generously. To the academy in his native town—but it is not convenient nor necessary here to enumerate the many instances of his benefactions. Bunker-hill Monument will be a witness while it stands to the exertions and liberality of this individual for its final completion. Nearly all the public charities of the last thirty years have received aid at his hands. The interests of education, humanity, and patriotism, thus nobly befriended, will furnish a memorial that shall outlive the monumental pile. He died Dec. 31, 1852, aged sixty-seven years.

This gentleman, the youngest of the Groton brothers, continued with his father, at home, until nearly of age, when he left to live with his brother William in Boston, by whom he was soon taken into business as a partner. Their foreign trade called him many times to England, and gave opportunities for acquaintance abroad, as well as for increasing his skill and knowledge in the transaction of business at home.

A few years after his firm became interested in the business of manufacturing at Lowell, he removed from Boston to Lowell. His extensive operations in manufacturing, and general acquaintance with the wool growers and dealers of the country, added to his own personal ability and enterprise in business, would go far towards placing him at the head of the woollen manufacture of New England. Of the "new city," Lawrence, he and his brother Abbott may be considered the projectors and founders. By his endeavors, and the aid of his associates in the business, there was accomplished in one year what is indeed remarkable in the history of towns and labors of human enterprise in this country. He now resides in Andover.

## A P P E N D I X.

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THE *Centennial Celebration* of the descendants of ISAAC LAWRENCE, of CANAAN, Conn., was held the afternoon and evening of *Thanksgiving Day, Nov. 27, 1851*. The Committee of Arrangements previously appointed were Isaac Lawrence, of New-York City; Frederick Lawrence, of Canaan; and Robert W. Adam, of Pittsfield, Mass. A Committee to prepare a brief historical account of Capt. Isaac Lawrence's family, lineage, and descendants, consisted of Frederick S. Pease, of Albany, N.Y.; and Isaac Lawrence, of New-York City.

A Committee of ladies to provide the dinner consisted of Mrs. Abiah Plumb, Mrs. Betsy L. Franklin, and Mrs. Huldah T. Lawrence. The Misses Charlotte L. Franklin, Frances C. Adam, and Catharine C. Lawrence, were assistants.

The meeting was held in the Old Lawrence House, or Hotel, in Canaan. William Lawrence, President, of Canaan; Harvey Lawrence, Vice-President, of Canaan; Robert W. Adam, Secretary, of Pittsfield. Select passages of Scripture were read by Mr. Frederick Lawrence, and prayer offered by Deacon George K. Lawrence; after which, an ode, composed by Mrs. Huldah T. Lawrence for the occasion, was sung. Mr. Pease then presented his historical Memoir; which was followed by addresses from Messrs R. W. Adam and Isaac Lawrence, containing facts and truths of great interest.

At seven, P.M., the old "ballroom," having been finely decorated, was opened, and one of the best of New-England Thanksgiving dinners was disclosed to the happy family. Among the ever-

greens hung about the hall, the dates "1751" and "1851," wrought in leaves of laurel and encircled with wreaths of pine, were conspicuous above the tables. After the family were all seated, the divine blessing was asked by Mr. John Franklin, of Canaan.

The feast of good things was succeeded by the flow of sentiment, and the expression of grateful feelings and respectful testimony in honor of their worthy ancestor.

The following sentiment, offered by Mr. Isaac Lawrence, of New York, was in point: "*Our Absent Relatives*, — Providentially prevented from meeting with us in the wholesome pleasure of this festival, we would here assure them of our affection and sympathy; 'rejoicing with them that do rejoice, and weeping with them that weep.'"

The evening was devoted to social acquaintance, reading of letters from absent relatives and friends, and of poems composed for the day, with some items of business. After all which, on motion of Mr. Pease, the meeting was adjourned for a hundred years.

ISAAC LAWRENCE CAME HERE JUNE 2, 1738.

THIS HOUSE BUILT  
1751.

ISAAC LAWRENCE DIED DEC. 2, 1793,

LYDIA HEWITT, HIS WIFE, DIED NOV. 11, 1767,  
AGED 60 YEARS.

## BRIEF NOTICES

OF

OTHER LAWRENCES EARLY SETTLED IN  
NEW ENGLAND.

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I. *THOMAS*, of Hingham, in 1637. — He is given as a landholder for that year, and was admitted a freeman the year following. In 1638, he became "lawful owner of four hundred acres of land, bounded westward with Cedar Swamp, and eastward with the land of Thomas Clap, &c." In 1647, there were "given unto him, by the town, two acres of salt marsh, &c."

He married Elisabeth Bates, a sister of James Bates, of Dorchester, whose children were, —

- I. *NICHOLAS*, b. in Hingham.
- II. *MARY*, b. in Hingham; m., 28-8-1658, Thomas Moseley, of Dorchester.
- III. *ELISABETH*, b. in Hingham; m., in 1658, William Smead.  
Mr. Thomas Lawrence died Nov. 5, 1655, at Hingham.  
The "Widdow Lawrence," named on the town-records, shortly after the decease of her husband, removed with her family to Dorchester, where her son Nicholas married, and had by Mary, his wife, — I. Patience, born in Dorchester, June 13, 1658, and died young; II. Mary; III. Rebecca; IV. Nicholas; V. Benjamin; and possibly another.

Nicholas Lawrence, sen., died in 1685. Nicholas, his son, married, Nov. 3, 1681, Mary Harris; and had,—I. Patience, born Aug. 12, 1682. About this time he removed to Charlestown, and, after the death of his wife, married again, as is found, II. "Abigail, daughter of Nicholas and Abigail Lawrence, born Aug. 26, 1693;" died Nov. 5, 1713, aged twenty-one years. They were admitted to the church in Charlestown, Feb. 15, 1707–8. Nicholas Lawrence died Feb. 28, 1710–11, aged 49 yrs. 8 months.

II. *GEORGE*, of Watertown, in 1657.—His name appears on the town-records as early as the 29th of the seventh month, 1657, when his marriage is given; and, in the succeeding pages, births of his children are recorded. It is possible that he was born in this country. No evidence of this has been discovered; nor, on the other hand, of his arrival from England. He lived to be an old man, as is found. George Lawrence died March 21, 1708, "*an aged man*." By Elisabeth, his wife, he had children, as follows:—

VIII. MARY, b. Dec. 11, 1670; m., April 5, 1689, John Flagg, of Boston.

IX. GRACE, b. June 2, 1680.

Mrs. Elisabeth Lawrence died May 28, 1691. The descendants of this family have lived in Watertown, Waltham, Weston, and Charlestown, of this State, and in other States of New England and the Union.



III. *ROBERT*, of Portland, in 1680 and 1685. — In the “History of Portland” is found the name of one Robert Lawrence, who, about 1686–7, married the widow of George Munjoy, of that place, and thus entered into possession of considerable property. He improved, for some time, the farm belonging to the Munjoys; and had a good deal of dispute with different individuals, a man by the name of Davis in particular, about the title of some lands. It would seem that he had some military spirit; as he was made a lieutenant, and, in 1689, was one of a council of war held in Falmouth. He held a garrison a short time; was promoted captain; and was mortally wounded in the attack made on the fort, in 1690, by the French and Indians. He left no children; nor is any thing known of his origin and relation.

IV. *JOHN*, born in the Isle of Jersey. — He married (was published), Aug. 28, 1713, Marian Beauchamp, of Boston. He was a “sea-captain;” and had children, one of whom, John, went to Connecticut; settled in Hartford; was Treasurer of the State in 1774, and for several years succeeding. He had a grandson, William R. Lawrence, living in Hartford.
