INTRODUCTION.

"As you like your father to be an honorable man, why not your grandfather and his ancestors before him?"—Thackeray.

FAMILY history is at best a compilation of various records, and the historian may be at fault in the record he has selected. We make no apology for the present history, it being our object to place it in the hands of the present generation, so that corrections may be made. This record is complete only as to one branch of the family of the founder, and we trust that other branches will complete their records. In the mean time, we will make corrections and additions to this record.

Our access to original records has been limited, and no doubt much valuable information can be obtained from them. We were desirous of including a map showing the location of the old homestead at North Stratford, but were unsuccessful.

The following may be of assistance to others in making searches: The first census of the United States, taken in 1790, has been republished, and in it we find the following: Lakes in Connecticut who were at that time heads of families: Reuben (844), at Stratford; Peter, John, and David, at Newton; Elnathan (63), at Derby; Jabes (62), at Huntington; James (71), at New Milford; and Samuel, at Kent. Also, in old Albany county, New York: Abraham, Garritt, and James, at Cambridge; Christopher, Garritt T., Henry and Henry T., at Hoosick; Edward (86), at Freeholdtown, now Greenville; Matthew (84), Thomas, and Timothy, at Coxsackie.

The Thomas Lake who settled at New Haven, Conn., in 1641, and was killed by the Indians in Maine, Aug. 14, 1676, was not the father of Thomas Lake of Stratford; the family of the former all returned to England with the exception of a daughter. Thomas Lake of New Haven had a son Thomas, who inherited the title of his uncle, Sir Edward Lake.

It has been a pleasure to receive letters from the different members of the family, and we are deeply grateful for the information they furnished, as this record is almost complete of the present generation. The balance can be easily obtained before it is finally published in book form, together with other branches of the family.

We are indebted to Orcutt's "History of Stratford" for much valuable information.

We are unable to place this record in the hands of each member of the family, as we had at first intended, as the expense is too great, but have made arrangements to furnish copies for a small sum to those who wish the record.

The indexing that we have used has been found the most satisfactory in other family histories. The numerals after the name each represent a generation, thus: My great grandfather is number 846; he was the 6th, son of his father, who was the 4th, son of his grandfather, and his grandfather was the 8th, son of the founder.

THE

DESCENDANTS OF THOMAS LAKE

Thomas Lake and his wife Sarah settled at Stratford, Connecticut, about 1695, purchasing some land, which was subdivided Feb. 6, 1694, on the east side of the Falls of the Pequonnock River. A road, passing the homestead, was laid out in 1705 and extended to Pulpit Rock. Thomas Lake was still alive in October, 1718, as the records of the General Assembly of the Colony of Connecticut show that he was allowed costs of twelve shillings ten pence for attendance at the assembly to answer petition of Richard Hubbell. His widow, Sarah, was probably alive at the time of the organization of the church at North Stratford, Nov. 18, 1731, as we find her name, together with that of her son, David, and his wife, in the list of charter members. A pew in the Second Episcopal Church at Stratford in 1745 was in the name of Thomas Lake; we are unable to decide whether this was the father or the son.
