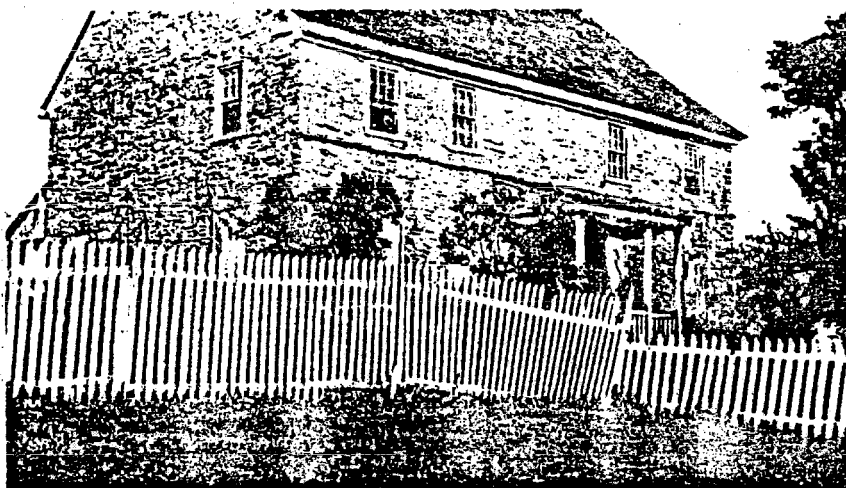

PREFACE.

Few people can trace back the line of their ancestry more than three generations; and if they reach the limit of three score years and ten they will see from two to three succeeding generations, making a total of five or six generations, of whom they have actual knowledge.

Beyond that the past and the future are alike shadowy and mysterious

Here to day:

Gone tomorrow.

Mourned by dear ones,

Soon to follow.

After a few short years, seldom thought of; and, finally, obliterated from the memory of all the living.

Some forty years ago my attention was called to the name of Johann Adam Lesch, in Professor I. D. Rupps collection of upwards of 30,000 names of Immigrants in Pennsylvania, who, with other Palatines, had located with his family, in Tulpehocken valley, Berks County, Pa., in 1723. I knew that my father was born in that section of Berks County, in 1808; and, I assumed that he was a descendant of said Johann Adam Lesch. I knew that my grandfather's name was George Lesch, and after further investigation I learned that his father's name was Balthaser, but whose son was Balthaser? (or Balser as it appears on some records?) From his will, found at Reading, Pa., I learned the names of his children, my father's aunts and uncles, some of whom I had seen, when quite young. From the will of Johann Adam Lesch recorded in Lancaster, Pa., it was learned that Johann Adam Lesch left no male descendants; but he referred to his brother George Lesch, and appointed him as guardian, to look after the property of one of his daughters in North Carolina. The will of George Lesch (Loesch) recorded at Easton Northampton County, Pa., gave the names of his children, among whom was Balser, one of his younger sons. From the archives of the Moravian church at Bethlehem, Pa., reliable data, showing the death at sea of Balthaser Loesch of Gernsheim, Germany, on his way to America, and the ancestral line from him to my great grandfather was established.

To the skillful, painstaking, and unrenitting labors of Mrs. Ora W. Lesh, of Indianapolis, Ind., traveling over the counties of Berks, Lebanon, Lancaster and Northampton, collecting data from wills, deeds, church records, cemeteries, and all possible sources accessible, we owe the completeness of this record, and, without her efforts, or similar work by others, my efforts to compile this sketch would have been a failure.

I am also indebted to Miss Lily M. Lash of Rural Hall, N. C., and Mrs. Jessie Loesch Saunders, of Jersey City, N. J., for valuable data as to the descendants of Jacob and Herman Loesch, brothers of my g. grandfather Balser Loesch; and to Miss Esther M. Lesh of Millerstown, Pa., for list of descendants of my grandfather's brother, Balser Lesh, of Perry County, Pa., and to others, for valuable help.

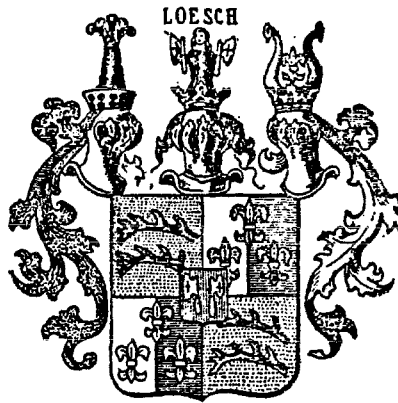

LOESCH.

A family of Hilgartshausen, resident Bavaria during past 400 years, from which William in 1541 was created a knight for services in Algiers. The king at that time presented him with a gold chain in shape of a belt (kind worn by barefoot monks) worth 398 ducats, the ownership of which, according to family law, was always to be passed on to the oldest Loesch. Lang, Vol. I, page 47, says the family of Loesch bore this chain in their arms and in older illustrations it used to hang around the shield. Wolfgang and Adolf Loesch of Hilsgarhausen were liberated by King Leopold in 1653. The family were created counts, 1790. The coat of arms is a red shield upon which are two silver hatchets with gold handles, the edges turned outward. On top of the helmet is a maiden with a red dress (Einsinger names it a butcher-boy), who has, instead of arms, two hatchets. This coat of arms is now used as a centre part of the present escutcheon. The first and fourth quarterings

of the present escutcheon is a gold shield in which are placed two stag horns colored blue (representing the Hirschhausen arms). In the 2d and 3d quarterings the shield is divided, silver and blue, on which are placed three gold fleur-de-lis (representing the Kockeritz arms. This family is of Saxony and it came into the present coat-of-arms in 1653 through the letter declaring them Barons). Of the three helmets, the center one belongs to the Loesch family. The first one to Hirschhausen family (being a crowned blue hat with a silver brim, this brim having on it blue buttons. The hat has five feathers on top, stuck in the crown alternating, blue, silver, blue, silver, blue. The third helmet has on top two Buffalo-horns, one of silver and the other blue; between them a gold fleur-de-lis. (This helmet belongs to the Kockeritz family arms.)

Lambrequin; to the right is decorated in blue and gold, to the left blue and silver. Supporters, two gold Giffons.

INTRODUCTORY CHAPTER.

The country comprising the Lower Palatinate lies on both sides of the river Rhine, bounded by the states of Mainz, Treves, Loraine, Alsace, Baden, and Wurtemberg. Its capital was Heidelberg, and its principal cities are Mayence, Spire, Manheim and Worms. The origin of the name, Palatinate, is derived from the title of its ruler. Its boundaries were changeable with the shifting fortunes of diplomacy and war. Situated between the greater and rival powers of France, and the German princes, its soil was the frequent path of armies and field of battles. With change of rulers came changes in religious tolerance, each ruler endeavoring to stamp out those opposed to his religion whether Lutheran, Reformed or Roman Catholic. The principles of the Reformation had taken almost universal possession of the people. Both Lutheran and Reformed doctrine found a friendly and fertile soil in the Palatinate. At Worms, Luther nailed his Thesis on the church door.

To this day, in the valleys of the Hudson, the Mohawk, the Schoharie, the Swatara, and the Tulpehocken the children of those Palatines, still Lutheran and Reformed, worship side by side as their fathers of the sixth generation gone worshipped on the Rhine.

Frederick III, the first Palatine of the House of Zimmerman, signalized his accession to power by the strenuous advocacy of the Reformed doctrine. During his reign, on his urgency and authority, Olevian and Ursinus, professors of divinity in the University of Heidelberg, published that Catechism which, under the name of Heidelberg, remains to this day throughout the various branches of the Reformed Church, the dearest among its symbolical books. It is specially notable for its freedom from the controversial spirit of the age, and for the high tone of spiritual experience it depicts.

The successors of Frederick III did not all adhere to the Reformed doctrine of the Church.

A Calvinist in the Electorship was pretty certain to be followed by a Lutheran, who in his turn gave place to another Calvinist, to be followed yet by another Lutheran. It was a kind of religious see-saw, in which all the power of royal favor, and influence of Court patronage, and at times the force of decrees and enactments, brought very serious discomfiture and loss to the people.

The Elector Palatine, Philip William, died in 1690. His son and successor, John William, a devoted adherent of the Roman Catholic Church, set himself to compel the conversion of his people to his own faith. They were Protestants; mostly Lutherans and Reformed. Under

his rule the poor people of the Palatinate suffered in their religious affections and privileges intolerable hardships and cruelties, impelling many of them to break off their attachment to the fatherland and to make and seek new homes in distant America.

They went from the Palatinate to other parts of Germany; the larger number to Holland; and, by invitation of Queen Anne, thousands were transported to England in 1707-08-09, where they encamped near London.

Of the large number that came to England, seven thousand, after having suffered great privations, returned in despondency to their native country. Ten thousand died for want of sustenance and from other causes.

Ten ships were freighted with upwards of four thousand of these people for America; among them Balthaser Loesch and family. They departed from London, December 25, 1709; and, after six months tedious voyage, reached New York in June, 1710. The father, Balthaser Loesch, died at sea.

On the inward voyage and immediately on landing seventeen hundred died. The survivors were encamped in tents, on Nuttings, now Governors Island.

Here they remained until late in the Autumn, when about fourteen hundred were removed one hundred miles up the Hudson river, to "Livingston Manor." The widowed women, sickly men, and orphaned children remained in New York. The orphans were apprenticed to citizens of New York and New Jersey.

Among these, so apprenticed was the writer's paternal ancestor, Johann George Loesch, son of Balthaser Loesch, who was then a lad of 12 years of age. He was apprenticed to a linen weaver in New York. His mother, Susanna P. Loesch, remarried; name of second husband and stepfather not known.

After serving his apprenticeship, he removed to Schoharie County, and joined his parents and family. On December 15, 1721, he married Anna Christina Walborn, who was born July 24, 1700, at Wisbach, Nassau, Germany.

At Livingston Manor, the Germans being unjustly oppressed, became dissatisfied with their treatment and with their situation Governor Hunter resorted to violent measures to secure obedience to his demands. In this he failed.

One hundred and fifty families, to escape the certainty of famishing, left late in the Autumn of 1712 for Schoharie Valley, some sixty miles northwest of Livingston Manor.

They had no open road, no horses to carry or haul their luggage. This they loaded on rudely constructed sleds, and did tug these themselves, through a three feet deep snow, which greatly obstructed their progress. Their way was through an unbroken forest. It took them three full weeks to reach their destination.

Having reached Schoharie, they made improvements upon the lands Queen Anne had granted them. Here they remained about ten years, when, owing to some defect in their titles, and the *sharp practice* of some of the *Governor's agents*, they were deprived of both lands and improvements.

After much vexation and many fruitless efforts to secure to themselves what was intended for them by the Indian present to Queen Anne, and, having heard of unoccupied lands on the Swatara and Tulpehocken, in Pennsylvania, thirty-three families left Schoharie for Pennsylvania. They wended their way in a southwesterly direction, guided by the Indians, until they reached the Susquehanna river. Here they constructed canoes, freighted them with their families, and floated down the river. Their cattle they drove by land. Arriving at the mouth of Swatara Creek, they worked their way up the creek until they reached the Tulpehocken Valley, then Lancaster County, Pa., where they settled among the Indians in the Spring of 1723. Others from Schoharie followed later on, among them the celebrated Conrad Weiser, a leader, and prominent as their defender, in their troubles with the governor of New York.

No other people in the world's history of the human race suffered more persecution, or longer continued privations, on account of religious intolerance, than did the Palatines, for decades of years. Only when they reached the glorious land of Penn did they find relief from persecution and a haven of rest. No wonder that during the following thirty years tens of thousands of their countrymen followed them, and joined them on the fertile soil of Lancaster, Berks, Lebanon, Northampton, Chester and Philadelphia Counties. It was here that the problem of human freedom was wrought out, and the part that the children of the Palatines performed in the achievement of our national independence was noteworthy. The daughter of Conrad Weiser was destined to be the mother of the Speaker of the first national House of Representatives, and of other celebrated sons; who became famous as clergyman, statesmen, and soldiers, in the Revolutionary War. There have been few families in American annals that have been more illustrious than that of the Muhlenbergs.

In Archives at Harrisburg are found the names of Balser Lesh. Peter

Lesh, Jacob Lesh and Philip Lesh, Revolutionary soldiers; the great grandfather and relatives of the compiler of this collection.

Among those arriving in Tulpehocken in 1723 were Johann Adam Loesch, and Johann George Loesch and their families, sons of Balthaser Loesch, who died at sea.

They settled near each other and helped to found Christ Evangelical Lutheran Church near Stouchsburg, Berks County, Pa.

In 1742, the Moravian, Count Zinzendorf, came to Berks County and preached in the house of Conrad Weiser, and in 1745, George Loesch and wife were admitted to fellowship in the Moravian Church. The older brother, Johann Adam Loesch, remained with the Lutheran Church, and both he and his wife Sophia are buried in churchyard near Stouchsburg.

The Moravians built a stone church in Heidelberg township in 1750, known as the Corner Church, and the George Loesch family took a prominent part in the founding of this church, also in founding the Moravian Church at Quittopshille (now Lebanon), and at Nazareth and Bethlehem, Pa., and in Bethania, North Carolina. Here Jacob Loesch, the elder son of George, became business manager for the Moravian Colony, and his younger brother Herman also took a prominent part in organizing the colony in North Carolina. The little colony left Bethlehem, Pa., October 8, 1753, with their goods stored in a large wagon. The night before arriving at the Susquehanna river they sojourned at the house of Mr. George Loesch, the father of Jacob and Herman, in Heidelberg township, Lancaster County, Pa. Here they were hospitably entertained; the mother filling their boxes with provisions, and the father placing a part of the load on his own wagon, till the river had been forded. The width of the Susquehanna was a surprise to them.

The one picture which stands in clearest light is the piety and religious fervor of members of this colony. Night and morning they rejoiced in the spiritual food, afforded by the songs, the prayers, the scripture, and words of admonition spoken by their minister. The writer had the pleasure of meeting one of the grandsons of Jacob Loesch, Hon. Israel George Lash, member of Congress from North Carolina in the 70s.

The children of George Loesch having married and left home, the old folks sold their farm in Berks (formerly Lancaster) County, and removed to Gnadenthal, near Nazareth, Northampton County, Pa., 1770. On December 15, 1771, they celebrated their fiftieth wedding anniversary. His wife died December 17, 1782, and he died August

15, 1790, in his ninety-second year and both are buried in the Moravian Cemetery at Nazareth, Pa.

Baltzer Loesch, one of the younger sons of George Loesh, did not join the Moravian Church, but remained a Lutheran, and the house which he built near Hamlin, Pa., is still standing and is now owned by a Mr. Grill. His son, George Loesch (Lesch), was my grandfather, and when a boy about 13 years of age I visited my grandfather, then living near Logan Mills, Clinton County, Pa. He was then a very old man, and could remember and describe scenes and incidents that transpired at their old home in Berks County, when he was a child—their troubles with the Indians, and how the children and women would be gathered into the forts and stockhouses, while the men would fight the Indians. He told me of a thrilling scene in which his mother, Christina Lesch, was a heroine. It was after dark. She and the children were alone in the house, the father had gone to the city. She happened to look out of the window towards the barn, and noticed Indians in single file marching around the end of the barn and hiding under the overshot in the dark. She immediately began to sing and to dance, talk fine and coarse, light candles in every room, roll tubs and buckets and overthrow chairs and make all the noise she could. The Indians listened and then sneaked away, evidently under the impression that the house was full of people. My grandfather told me several Indian experiences in which he figured as a child, also when a boy and young man, of hauling provisions for his father into the American Camp and seeing General Washington and the soldiers. His father being in good circumstances was very patriotic, and helped the cause of the Colonies with provisions and money to his utmost ability. He and his older sons, Peter and Jacob, were soldiers in the Revolutionary War. Peter, being a private in the Tenth Regiment Pennsylvania Continental Line (who received Depreciation Pay for his services) and Jacob, and the father, Baltzer, were members of Capt. Wolf's Company, Berks Co. Militia. He, grandfather, told me of a horseback ride to Virginia where his brother Jacob removed, after the Revolutionary War. He could remember incidents that occurred during this journey,—where he stopped over night, and all that happened. He was a fine looking old man, over 6 feet, stood erect, with good square shoulders and very good face and form.

If I had known then (1847) that some future day I would be collecting data and writing a historical sketch of our American branch of the Loesch family, I might have learned much that would be interesting from grandfather.

Here I have to make a statement that I regret. When our ancestors

separated from their original homes in Pennsylvania, they changed the spelling of the name from the original Loesch, to Lesch, Lesh and Lash. This was a serious mistake, and makes the tracing historically of the different families much more difficult. All German names have a meaning,—Loesch or Lösch signifies to soothe, to mollify. To change the spelling obscures the meaning.

The old stone house built by Johann Adam Lesch, near Wonselsdorf, Berks County, Pa., is still standing. In the gable end of the roof is carved the name of his son, Johan Jacob Lösch—1753. Upon the death of John Jacob, his only son, he sold the property to John Kurtz, and it still remains in the hands of this family. The Moravian Church at Bethania, North Carolina, is still occupied. In 1909 the congregation celebrated the Sesqui Centennial of their organization—1759-1909.

In this church is an organ built and played by Jacob Loesch. It is perfectly preserved, and a beautifully tuned instrument, and still in use. It is also a pleasure to note the record of the descendants of the Loesch family as to education. Many of them were and are, college graduates, and stand high in the communities where they reside. It is said that the graduates of the Salem Academy and College, at Winston-Salem, N. C., that are descendants of the Loesch family far outnumber those of any other family.

In arranging the names, figures denote the generation, and the small letters of the alphabet the names of the children, in the order of their birth—"a" representing the older—"b" the next, and so on to the younger, each member of the family having his or her own letter, which is carried forward through each successive generation. b. after name stands for born—d. died and m. married.

The survivors reached New York in June, 1710. Their encampment on Nuttings, now Governors Island, N. Y., removal to "Livingston Manor"—and Schoharie Valley, N. Y., and from there to Berks County, Pa., have already been described.

BOEHLER ANCESTRY

Furnished by Mrs. Jessie Loesch Saunders, Jersey City, N. J. William Boehler, Sr., b. Gernsheim, Germany, 1725. Came to New York, December 12, 1756, on the ship "Irene," under supervision of his cousin Bishop Peter Boehler. Spent three years in Indian Mission, and was proficient in Delaware language. He was married August 24, 1768, to Anna Catherine Ehrenhardt (1742-1810), a daughter of Jacob Ehrenhardt, one of the founders of Emaus, Pa. (In 1758 Jacob Ehrenhardt of Macungy, and Sebastian Knauss, donated more than a hundred acres of land for a Moravian settlement, the site being laid out the following year. In 1761 it received the name Emaus, and is now a boro, on East Penn R. R., about five miles from Allentown.)

William Boehler, Sr., had two sons and 1 daughter. He was Curator of Sisters Home, Bethlehem, and member of Board of External Supervision. He died in Bethlehem, 1806.

William Boehler, Jr., a son of William Boehler, Sr., and Anna Catharine Ehrenhardt, was born, Bethlehem, Pa., 1769. On May 30, 1797, at Bethlehem, he married Barbara Woodring (Wootring), who was born, Graceham, Md., April 17, 1776, her parents belonging to Huguenot families. They had six children, William, Philip, Wilhelmina, Lucretia, Fanny and Amos.

William Boehler, Jr., died, Bethlehem, 1823, and his wife Barbara (m. n. Woodring) died in 1865.

Wilhelmina Boehler, b. Bethlehem, September 24, 1801, a daughter of William Boehler, Jr., and Barbara Boehler (née Woodring) and taught Moravian Seminary, Bethlehem, at Salem Academy, North Carolina, from 1820-1823, and at Emaus after the death of her husband, Charles Henry Lösch, 1832, whom she had married May 29, 1823, in Saler
