

#### ENGLISH ORIGIN OF THE NAME

The name of Lancaster had its origin in England and all persons bearing the name trace their ancestry to that country and presumably to a common ancestor.

The city of Lancaster, birthplace of the name, is on the site of an old Roman camp on the left bank of the Lune where traces of the old fortification walls are still visible. That Lancaster was a Roman station of the first order is proved by the number of Roman antiquities found there such as, urns, statues, coins, pottery and inscribed altars. The termination caster was given by the Saxons to the names of towns located on old Roman sites, and this suffix combined with Lune (Lan) forms the word Lune-caster or Lancaster, the castle or camp on the Lune.

#### ADOPTED AS A SURNAME

The first person to bear the name Lancaster of whom we have record was William Taillebois, fifth Baron of Kendal, a lineal descendant of Ivo Taillebois of the House of Anjou, follower of William of Normandy in 1066, and one of the most powerful nobles of his day in England. William Taillebois, fifth Baron of Kendal, became Governor of Lancaster Castle during the reign of Henry the Second, about 1180, and caused himself by royal license to be called William de Lancaster.

William de Lancaster, Governor of Lancaster Castle, married Lady Gundred de Warren, widow of the Earl of Warwick and great granddaughter of William the Conqueror, and he is in all probability the progenitor of all bearing the name of Lancaster. (Dugdale's and Baines's Lancashire).

In Domesday Book the name appears as Loncastre and in the Pipe Roll of 1218-19 the form is Lancastre.

The arms of the Lancaster family are given as follows:—Arms: Argent, two bars gules, on a canton of the second a lion passant guardant, or.

Crest: A lion's head erased, argent, charged with a crescent gules.

#### A FAMILY TRADITION

A tradition of ancestry, handed down from generation to generation in at least one branch and held by families widely separated in location and unknown to one another but of common lineage, is to the effect that the immigrant was shipped out of England to America when a boy by relatives who wished his estates and titles; that he came to America as a stowaway and landed in Boston; and that one of his descendants of the third generation removed to Woolwich and there established the Maine branch of the family.

It has been a source of interest to the compiler to find that the family history as she has worked it out agrees in the main with this tradition and would seem to prove its authenticity.

### FIRST GENERATION

1 Joseph¹ Lancaster, pioneer ancestor, was in Salisbury, Massachusetts, before 1664 when he gave testimony in court, being then about twenty-six years of age. On June 23, 1666, he was a court witness. Sept. 27, 1693, he made deposition that he was fifty-six years old, hence born about 1637 or 1638.

In 1669 he was given "common rights," the right to use the common or undivided lands. In 1677 he took the oath of allegiance. In 1680 he was a member of the "training band," and in 1690 he was made freeman.

He was a carpenter and aided in building the new meeting-house. He was a deacon of the church and as such "was to sit with the deacons."

He was twice married. His first wife was MARY CARTER, born Oct. 6, 1641, daughter of Thomas Carter, an original settler at Salisbury in 1639.

Some time after 1676 Joseph married, secondly, Hannah—, whose family name has not been learned. Joseph's will, dated Apr. 7, 1718 and proved Feb. 2, 1719 mentioned no wife. His eldest son, Joseph, Jr., was named as sole executor, and to him was given the homestead which, upon his decease and that of his wife Elizabeth, was to belong to his son Micah. Another lot of land bordering on Haverhill was left to the four daughters of son Henry, deceased. Bequests of money were made to the remaining children and grandchildren. The witnesses were John Bagley, Jacob Sargent and John Sargent. Joseph died between Apr. 7, 1718, and Feb. 2, 1719.

2 Joseph<sup>2</sup> Lancaster (*Joseph*<sup>1</sup>) was born at Salisbury, Mass., Dec. 25, 1665, in the section later incorporated as Amesbury. In 1693 he was appointed as one of the first "tithing men," an important office in the early days, says Merrill, and one similar to that of State Constable of the present day; the badge of office was a black staff tipped with brass.

He married, Mar. 31, 1687, Elizabeth Hoyt, born Feb. 8, 1661, daughter of John and Mary (Barnes) Hoyt of Amesbury.

Thomas Hammond of Ipswich, and died June 26, 1748.

Sarah was one of a group of seven young women, who, in 1702, after galleries had been added to the meeting-house, were granted the right to build a pew in the women's gallery. Whether this hastened their marriage is not known, but history while commending their modesty records the fact that they soon began to disappear till the pew was finally empty.

Daniel seems to have resided for a time at Haverhill, then removed to Methuen, and about 1738 he located in Georgetown, Maine, in the section later set off as Woolwich. A letter of Daniel to the leading land proprietor reveals some difficulties in the beginning. He had asked for land for himself and sons and seemed to feel that promises made to him had not been fulfilled. "Remember," he warned, "you have a soul to save." Apparently the land question was satisfactorily settled for the plan of survey of May, 1740, shows his house already built and occupied, lot number thirty-four, east side of the Nequasset River.

He named his son Joseph sole executor of his will and left to him the homestead which has been held by his descendants from that time to the present.

She died, Aug. 31, 1808, at the age of ninety-one.

Thomas was a selectman of Rowley, and a representative to the General Court for twelve years.

In his will dated Dec. 12, 1788, he named Samuel as sole executor and intimated that Thomas had received his portion in his liberal education.

He married at Georgetown, Apr. 30, 1756, Hannah Bubier, born at Marblehead, Sept. 3, 1738 and died at Woolwich, Aug. 17, 1808, daughter of Joseph and Mary (Stacy) Bubier. She was fifth in descent from the immigrant ancestor Joseph Bubier, sturdy Huguenot, who was at Marblehead as early as 1668 (Savage). It was a member of this family, a shoemaker by trade and "an upright and intelligent man" who removed to Lynn and there set up a shop next to his house. This man's son learned the trade of his father and in time became the largest manufacturer of ladies' shoes in Lynn. His factory, which by 1856 covered an entire block, had displaced the little shop.

#### WITH WASHINGTON AT VALLEY FORGE

Investigation has shown there were men from Maine in each of the eleven Massachusetts regiments at Valley Forge, and in some cases entire companies were composed of Maine men. Among the number at least four men, Joseph Lancaster, Thomas Stinson, William Stinson, drummer, and National Webb, corporal, all of Woolwich, are ancestors of families named in this history.

The Maine marker at Valley Forge Park is a granite boulder on which is placed the following inscription in bronze:

TO COMMEMORATE THE OFFICERS AND MEN
FROM THAT PART OF NEW ENGLAND NOW KNOWN
AS THE STATE OF MAINE
WHO SERVED IN MASSACHUSETTS REGIMENTS
IN THE CONTINENTAL ARMY
UNDER WASHINGTON AT VALLEY FORGE
IN THE WINTER OF 1777-8
SHARING THE HARDSHIPS THERE ENDURED,
THIS MEMORIAL
IS ERECTED BY THE STATE OF MAINE

66 EBENEZER<sup>6</sup> Lancaster (Stephen<sup>5</sup>, Joseph<sup>4</sup>, Daniel<sup>3</sup>), centenarian, was born at Bowdoinham, Oct. 16, 1799, and died there Nov. 12, 1901, at the age of one hundred and two. He married, Jan. 22, 1831, Maria Preble, daughter of Alexander and Rhoda (Whitmore) Preble, and descendant of Abraham Preble, one of the founders of Scituate, Mass., 1635, and of York, Me., 1642, member of the General Court of the Province, sometime treasurer and chief military officer; and of Capt. Samuel Whittemore, Revolutionary patriot. She was born Aug. 16, 1811, and died Mar. 18, 1892.

Born in a log cabin on the Post Road, for a full century he lived the hardy, active life of a New England farmer and became one of the most industrious and prosperous men of the county. He never shirked his duty either to man or God and by precept and example emphasized the importance of right living. He read without glasses, was fond of music, and possessed a wonderful memory. Born two months before the death of Washington he had lived under every president succeeding him.

His 100th birthday party was attended by three hundred guests including children, grandchildren and great grandchildren, as well as neighbors and friends from far and near. One son traveled two thousand miles to be present. Over and over again Uncle Eben was heard to exclaim, "Bless my soul, I never expected to see this day!"

In 1900 he cast his ballot for McKinley and Roosevelt. Then a year beyond the century mark he was said to be the oldest man in the United States at the polls that day. He was also the first to vote in his home town. Up at five in the morning, he roused the family and made ready for the drive to the village. Once started, he was in a hurry to get there. "Can't you let the critter out a little Carleton?" he called to his son who always drove a high-stepper.

Shortly after election he received a courteous letter of appreciation from the President.

29 David<sup>5</sup> Lancaster evidently left Norridgewock at some time after 1825 for when he made application for a pension, Oct. 20, 1832, he was a resident of Newport, Penobscot County. He enlisted at Woolwich, Nov., 1777, served three and a half years, first under Capt. Grant and Col. North, later with Lt. Wade, Capt. Bailey and Col. Jackson's Mass. Regt. He was then given a furlough on account of sickness and returned home. (Data from papers on file in Rev. War pension claim, R. 6108, based upon military service of David Lancaster.)
