The Landis Family in Somerset County

LANDIS—Bale. De gu au lion d'or, tenant de sa potte sen, un oiseau d'arg. en pal, le tranchant en bas. Crest. Un lion iss. d'or.—Armorial Generale, Reitstap Vol 2, Page 16.

The Landis family is a very ancient family. In Europe it is found in France, Switzerland and Germany, and is numerous in those districts formerly comprising the Kingdom of Burgundy. In France and Belgium it appears as Landis or Landen and in Germany as Landes. In France bordering the Bay of Biscay is a province called Landes which name appears to have some connection with the physical characteristics of the terrain. The derivation of the name is uncertain. As a family name it is first noticed in history as applied to Pepin von Landen or de Landis, Major Domus of Clothary II, to the Merovingian Kings of France. (The Abridged Compendium of American Genealogy --Virkus, 1926).

Great interest has been displayed recently in holding reunions of families bearing the same name, in various localities. This naturally led to the tracing of relationship of the group through a common early pioneer ancestor. The search has then gone farther to learn something about the emigrant from whom the common ancestor sprung and the country of his origin. But when the country or particular district of foreign origin is found, it is erroneous to conclude that the family was seated there for centuries. As in ancient times entire tribes migrated, so in later times families moved about from place to place much as they do today.

The progenitors of the Landis Family in Somerset County are first noticed in Switzerland in the vicinity of Basle and Zurich. In Hertzell Switzerland, stands an old Landis homestead built in 1488 (Robert's History of Lehigh County). In this part of Switzerland we find prominent as a Pietist and as a minister in the Menonite faith in 1600, one Schwartzbard, John Landis, whom the Martyrs Mirror calls a pious witness of the Divine Truth. He went to the Rhine country in Switzerland and taught the people.

At this time, those of the Calvinist religious persuasion were in control of the government in Switzerland. This was shortly after the Reformation or rather while that movement was still in progress and the spirit of persecution was still rife.

The activities of John Landis as an expounder of the divine truth as taught by Menno Simons came to the notice of the authorities at Zurich and he was arrested and sent to the Papists The papists however refused to at Zolothurn for discipline. have anything to do with the case whereupon he was returned and beheaded by the Calvinist authorities at Wolfsstadt in Sept., 1614. The officers making the arrest tried to persuade his people that it was for resistance to the civil authorities. This could not have been the case for the text of a letter written by a spectator of the execution is still extant in which it appears that an opportunity was given the prisoner to escape but he refused. The executioner thereupon called upon God to forgive him for what he was about to do to this "just man." The accused accepted his fate tranquilly and forgave the executioner for the deed to be done in pursuance of the decree of the authorities, saying, "I have already forgiven you, may God forgive you also. I am aware that you must execute the sentence of the magistracy; be undismayed and see that nothing hinders you in this matter."

About twenty years later persecution broke out again in this locality and we find two sons of this martyr, viz. Hans Landis and Oswald Landis and a number of others of the same family name among those persecuted. Oswald Landis was lodged in prison where he was permitted to starve to death and the others suffered banishment with confiscation of all their property, which according to the records was considerable. This decree of banishment was not visited on all members of a family alike and frequently carried the additional hardship of separating husband and wife and parents and children. Still later in 1660, others of the same family suffered the like fate of banishment.

These people took refuge in Germany, some settling in Zureburg, and Alsace, others locating in the vicinity of Strasburg and others finding a home in Manheim where they became tillers of the soil.

The persecution by the Calvinists in Switzerland met with the distinct disapproval of their co-religionists in Holland. It will be remembered that at this time the Netherlands were the haven of the religious oppressed, Prince William of Orange having there declared full religious liberty. The church in Holland sent a memorial to their brethren in Zurich remonstrating against the treatment accorded by the latter to the followers of Menno Simons. In this memorial they represented that in Holland the members of this sect had had the protection of the Prince, that they were loyal citizens contributing generously to all worthy enterprises.

Among those persecuting in the name of religion were many zealous persons who sincerely believed that in exterminating what they regarded as a false doctrine, they were really carrying out a christian duty, believing that those who taught a contrary doctrine, though also in the name of Christ, were in fact imbued with the spirit of the evil one who thus sought to frustrate the will of God among men. In this enterprise, the religious zealot was often encouraged for selfish reasons by those in authority in church or state, the two being so related in some sovereignties that it was difficult to determine where civil authority began and religious authority ended. So that in approaching the subject of religious discipline by authority we should do so with the spirit of tolerance which we are prone to conclude that the authorities themselves lacked.

Menno Simons had been educated for the Catholic priesthood. He taught that simplicity of living was the summum bonum. That the prevailing ostentation of church and state was vanity. It is doubtful that he sought to establish a new sect. It is more likely that he sought to gather together the remnants of the Albigenses and the Waldenses who had been scattered by earlier persecutions. A price was placed on his head and he fled from place to place taking refuge among his followers and finally died a natural death at an advanced age and was buried in his own garden to avoid any posthumous indignity on his body. Secret burial grew into a custom with this sect and probably accounts for the private burial grounds on many farms of this sect and kindred sects in this state and county.

From the vicinity of Manheim where the Swiss exiles fled as we have noted, three brothers, John, Felix and Benjamin Landis emigrated to America in 1717 and settled in what was later Lancaster County, Penn'a. In 1720 a relative also named John Landis came from the same district and settled near Ephrata in that county where he took up 400 acres of land at the junction of Middle and Hamer Creeks. Five generations of this family are buried in the grave yard on this farm. Of the three brothers, Benjamin was a minister of the Gospel and his home was long used as a place of worship and refuge by the early settlers. His descendants now largely comprise the numerous family of that name residing in Lancaster County. Felix Landis settled in that part of Lancaster County later formed into Dauphin County. His descendants followed the Cumberland and Shenandoah valleys, emigrating into the Carolinas, Virginia and westward. John settled in Bucks County, in which county and neighboring counties his descendants are found.

William Penn, the Proprietor of Pennsylvania, was by religion a Quaker. The Quaker is the first cousin of the Pietist. George Fox the founder, received his inspiration from that source, by direct contact through friends and relatives of his wife among the refugees of the Pietist sects in London and Holland. From this it can be readily understood why so many of the Swiss exiles were attracted to Pennsylvania. Penn made special efforts and offered special inducements to attract as many of these settlers as he could to his new province of Pennsylvania. These people were tillers of the soil where they could pursue the simple life and as the needle is attracted by the lode stone, so did their unerring instinct direct them to the choicest soil, and largely through their industry has Lancaster come to be known as the "Garden County." (Penna. Dutch and other Essays, Gibson: Penn'a Scetches-Pennypacker).

The John Landis, from whom the Somerset County family

of that name is sprung, was born March 1, 1752. From all that can be gleaned at this late date he was a descendant of the John who settled at Ephrata in 1720. His wife's name was Elizabeth. Among the taxables comprising that portion of old Cocalicc Township, now embraced in Ephrata Township, Lancaster County are the following for 1780. Benjamin Landis, 118 Acres, 2 horses, 2 cows, 265tb: Jacob Landis, 118 Acres, 2 horses, 3 cows, 265 tb: John Landis, 150 Acres, 2 horses, 5 cows, 4841b; and John Landis, Jr., E. Cocalico Township, 50 Acres, 1 cow. 173 fb. Among those who subscribed to the oath of allegiance at Ephrata during the Revolution War were John, Abraham, and Jacob Landis. Early in the Revolution, these people were loath to take sides for the reason that one of the excuses offered for persecuting their forbears in Europe was the charge that they had resisted the authorities, but later in the struggle they contributed liberally of food and provisions to succor Washington's distressed army. Some of the early members of the 7th Day Baptists at Ephrata were named Landis. Ann Landis was a sister there during the Revolution. Some of this stock still reside at Rothville and Ephrata, others in York County, Pa., and Montgomery Co., Ohio. (Landis Family of Lancaster-D. B. Landis). This family and also the John who settled in Somerset County, spelled their names in German, Landes. John Landis, who appears in the following genealogical table as Senior, continued in Lancaster County until about 1784. His first two children were born there in Cocalico Twp., viz: Henry, 9 July, 1777, and Elizabeth 19 Sept., 1781. From thence he moved his family westward across South Mountain into Franklin County, in Green Township on the Conococheague, where his next three children were born, viz: John, Jr., on the 24 Feb., 1785; Susannah, 7 May, 1790; Jonas, 15 March, From thence he moved his family still further west, into 1794. Somerset County, for as the old family bible records it, "Den staum 1797 yahr, Julind 23 ist geboren Mariah Landesin, in Summersett Gountin in der Klutz." His last child Esther was born here also, 12 Jan., 1800.

The Conococheague district referred to in the old bible as the birthplace of the three children above named, comprised a region early settled, surrounding the meanderings of a considerable stream of the same name, one branch of which rises in the South Mountain and flows through old Green Township in Franklin This region was protected by the fort at Carlisle and County. by the frontier forts of Littleton and Louden and consequently was a place of refuge to which the more remote settlers fled in times of Indian uprisings, as witness the influx of refugees there, some from the region now embraced in Somerset County, during the French and Indian War, Pontiac's Wars and the Indian massacres accompanying the Revolutionary War. The region also furnished a base of operations for the hardy hunters and trappers, who leaving their families here on their plantations under the protection of the forts during the winter months, went into the western mountain regions of Somerset County, to return in the spring with a crop of pelts for which there was a lucretive market.

Through Green Township also passed the road from Carlisle and Philadelphia to Ft. Littleton, later to be known as the Pennsylvania Road, the emigrant's road, originally extended by Co. James Burd in 1755—to succor Gen. Braddock's army—westward across Bedford County and through Burd's or Deeter's gap in the Alleghenies, into the Glades, across the dividing ridge between the waters of the Stonycreek and the Buffalo Lick. Burd's improvement ended here and dwindled off into three trails, one extending southward along and across the mountain to Wills Creek or Ft. Cumberland and the other two leading in the general direction of the Turkeyfoot.

It is not surprising then that our pioneer ancestor should find his way to the headwaters of the Buffalo in Bruders Thal. We first find him occupying a tract of about 140 acres of land here, called Hopewell, in the right of Christian Burns to whom a warrant had been granted in 1784. This tract was later patented to Michael Ullerich in 1796 from whom John Landis acquired a deed through his son-in-law, Peter Kover. He made the first improvement on this land. He also improved an adjoining mountain tract and later acquired a tract of 95 acres from Jacob Wingert adjoining the first tract on the west. The Wingert tract was one of the first occupied in that section of Brothersvalley. It was warranted to Jacob Wingert in 1770 and had been already improved prior to that date. The residue was later known as the Louis Berkley farm. The exact date that John Landis, Sr., came into Somerset County is uncertain. We do know however from the Bible record that his son Jonas was born in Franklin County in March, 1794 and that his next child, Mary, was born in Somerset County in 1797. Also that the first assessment record of Somerset County for the year 1796, shows John Landis as a resident in Brothersvalley Township, where he is assessed with improved land. There is also evidence that he came out and improved the land before bring-Of his son Jonas there is no record except ing his family out. the date of birth. He probably died in infancy. His daughter, Susanna reached maturity for the old family bible records that in 1810 she received certain moneys from her father, also certain other property but no further trace of her can be found. Esther died August, 1817 and is buried on the family burial plot on the farm. The names of the other children appear in the following record.

John Landis, Sr., built a water power saw mill on the Ulerich tract which was later removed to the Wingert tract and enlarged by John, Jr., so as to include a Grist Mill and Carding Mill. In the first assessment record of Somerset County, we find John Landis assessed in 1796 in Brothersvalley Township, with 140 acres, 2 horses, 2 horned cattle and 1 house. In 1799 we find his son Henry also assessed in this township. In 1815, we find him assessed with 165 acres in Brothersvalley, 2 horses, 3 cows and a house and lot in town of Berlin; John Landis, Jr., carpenter, assessed with 123 acres in the township, 1 horse, 2 cows, and a house and lot in town of Berlin. 1825, he was assessed with 220 acres, a saw mill, 2 horses, 3 cows and a house and In 1829, John Landis, Jr., was assessed with 220 acres, a lot. grist, saw and carding mill. Henry Landis was assessed with 134 acres in Stonycreek in 1807, and in 1817 he was assessed with 250 acres in Brothersvalley and 130 acres in Stonycreek.

According to tradition, two brothers also accompanied John Landis, Sr., into Brothersvalley. It is probable that the Abraham Landis, joiner, who resided at East Liberty in that township on a parcel of land acquired from Jacob Glessner, was a brother of John. He was an aged man at the time of his decease about 1836, and his will dated 1835 and probated in 1839, is witnessed by John Landis, Sr. Nothing is known of his family except that his will mentions his wife Elizabeth. About 1825, Samuel and Daniel Landis, shoemakers, coming from Lancaster County, settled in Berlin and followed their trade there for many years. They have no connection with the following chart except that David a son of Daniel, married Sally a daughter of John, Jr. There was a Benjamin Landis of Dauphin County who early in the history of Somerset County took out a warrant for a large tract of land in Quemahoning and a Christian Landis also of Dauphin County who about the same time took out a warrant for land in Elk Lick. It does not appear that either of these men ever resided in Somerset County for when their interests were conveyed, it was by their heirs in Dauphin County. There was another Benjamin Landis who owned a farm in Brothersvalley in 1832. He appears to have been a son of the Samuel Landis, shoemaker, mentioned above. He removed from this county about the same year and nothing further is known of him.

With the exception of Joshua Landis who was engaged in the insurance business in Berlin about forty years ago, and with the exception of David Landis whose second wife was Sally Landis a daughter of John Landis, Jr., no other descendants of Daniel Landis, the shoemaker are known to reside in Somerset County. Joshua Landis' family consisting of three daughters moved to Pittsburgh some years ago. David Landis whose second wife was Sally Landis, a daughter of John, Jr., was first married to a Fritz and had four sons by this marriage who likewise removed from the county many years ago. John D. Landis, a son, was drowned in the Johnstown Flood. Some of his descendants and those of his brother Jeremiah Landis, reside in Johnstown, Pa.

From the foregoing assessment record, it would appear that John Landis, Sr., prospered in his new home. He and his sons were farmers and framers and built many barns in the new county. Being a wood worker and miller, he chose his land as suitable for a mill site rather than for any promising fertility but by dint of industry, he brought it to a good state of cultivation. It remained in the family to the fourth generation when it was sold by his great grand sons, John M. and C. Wesley Landis, to the Niver Coal Company. A part of the farm is at present owned and operated by Robert Fritz.

On a high hill on the farm is a private burial plot surrounded by a high picket fence and overrun with mrytle, in which are interred the remains of the pioneer and his wife and some of their children and grandchildren. This burial plot was excepted in the sale of the farm and is cared for by his descendants.

John Landis, Jr., succeeded to the home farm and operated the mill; at his death his son Annanias Landis acquired the home farm and built a fine brick residence thereon and continued to operate the mill. At the death of Annanias the farm was divided among three of his sons, viz: John M., C. Wesley and Jesse. The latters interest was later acquired by the first two. John M. Landis was the last to operate the old mill. The mill has since been razed and the site is now occupied by a store conducted by C. L. Fisher. The old homestead stood directly across the road from the old mill between the Buffalo Lick and Bitt-The original home of John Landis, Sr., however, ner's Run. was farther up the valley on the farm later owned by Jesse In the line of John Landis, Jr., the descendants of Joel Landis. Landis, a patriarchal man now aged 88 years, are the most numerous. Of John Landis, Jr's., sons, Jesse was a Constable in Berlin and Henry was a Constable in Brothersvalley. Henry Landis, (of John, Jr.) moved to Jenner Township in 1840 where he followed farming and distilling and served as Justice of the Peace. He removed to Brothersvalley Township, on a farm adjoining his father's, in 1852 where he likewise followed farming and distilling and served as Justice of the Peace.

Henry Landis, son of John Landis, Sr., settled along the Glade Road in the vicinity of Roxbury. He operated a farm and an oil mill and for a time owned the old Tavern Stand at Roxbury. He married into a pioneer family, his wife being Magdalena Stoner a descendant of one of the first settlers. His son Abraham was the father of eleven children most of whose numerous descendants reside in Stonycreek Valley. Abraham operated a mill on the farm now owned (1935) by Irvin E. Brant, near Roxbury. The old Tavern site is now Engle's Store in Roxbury. Both of John Landis, Sr's., daughters married into pioneer families. Elizabeth married Peter Cober II a Brethren minister and Mary married a son of George Stull, the first blacksmith in Berlin, a man noted for his great physical strength.

John Landis, Sr., when coming into Brothersvalley affiliated with the Brethren Church as did his immediate family. Many of his descendants down to the present generation are members of that church. His grand-son, Abraham Landis, (of Henry I) married into the Glessner family which was early prominent in the Reformed Church and has continued so to be, and many cf his descendants are prominently identified with that denomination.

The Landis family in Somerset County furnished eight recruits for Union service in the Civil War. Abraham G. Landis, was a private in Co. I 52nd Regt.; Edward Landis, a private in same Regt.; William H. Landis a private in Co. G 61st Regt.; Rufus C. Landis, 1st Srgt., Co. A 10th Reserves; Joseph Landis, private, Co. G, 88th Regt.; John D. Landis, private, Co. E, 54th Regt., Pa. Vol. Inft.; Jeremiah Landis, private, Co. E, 212 Regt., 6th Pa. Vol. Artillery; Daniel Landis, private, Co. C, 212 Regt., 6th Pa. Vol. Artillery. The last three mentioned were sons of David Landis. Daniel Landis is also said to have served in the Mexican War. All these men saw arduous service. In the battle of Fredericsburg, where the Reserves assaulted Stonewall Jackson's entire brigade and drove it to the woods but through some misunderstanding were unsupported and obliged to withdraw, it is authoritively stated that the ranks of "A" company were so decimated that no officers were left and Srgt. R. C. Landis, withdrew the remnant of his company, some twenty men, from the field after the engagement. Bert F. Landis, Norman B. Landis (of Jesse) and Sylvester K. Landis, served in the Spanish Ameri-Bert F. Landis and Norman B. Landis, Co. I, 5th can War. Pa. Vol. Inft. After the Spanish American War Bert F. Landis was for a time an officer in Co. C of the Penna. National Guards. Norman and Sylvester enlisted in the Regular Army. Sylvester K. Landis was in the Department of the Quarter Master in Manilla, P. I. for many years. He made occasional trips to the States for the purchase of supplies. He died in Manilla, P. I., and is buried in the I. O. O. F. Cemetery at Berlin, Pennsylvania.

John Landis, Sr., served in the Revolutionary War from Cocalico Township, Lancaster County; but as there are several of the same name from Cocalico and Lampeter Townships, Lancaster County, it is difficult to determine in what organization he served, or the several services.

The following members of the Landis family in Somerset County served in the World War.

George W. Landis, Stonycreek Township, assigned to Co. H, 320th Infantry. Charles Elroy Landis, Brothersvalley Township, Private, 2nd Training Batallion. Last served with the Co. E, 131st Infantry, 33rd Division. Samuel Landis, Rockwood, Pa., Corporal Co. C, 110th Infantry. Wounded July 15, 1918, Marne River, France. In Walter Reed Hospital, Washington, D. C., Oct. 23, 1918. Robert E. Landis, Boswell, sent to Camp Greenlief for training. Perry E. Landis, Shanksville, Pa., sent to University of Pittsburgh for training. George Dewey Landis, Stoyestown, Pa., sent to Camp Meade, Md. James B. Landis, served as an Inspector of Selective Service Boards. The Armistice was signed before this was made a branch of the military service.

On the Civil list, we find that several members of the family held Borough and Township offices in various of the districts of the county. Among the County Officers, Bert F. Landis served as Register of Wills and Clerk of the Orphans Court from 1909 to 1915 and James B. Landis served as District Attorney from 1928 to 1931.

It is a purpose of this brief volume to trace the descendants of John Landis, Sr., who was born in Lancaster County, March 1, 1752 and settled in Brothersvalley about 1790. In effecting this, the female line has not been fully extended, but we believe that sufficient information has been given that interested persons can trace it. The male line has been extended as completely as the compilers were able to ascertain. Neither are any biographies of his descendants included. Only brief mention is made of significant events, circumstances or characters that left their impress on the lineage. For the investigator who desires more intimate knowledge of these events, there is ample bibliography.

There are certain sturdy traits that characterized the ancestry to remote times, which we believe it would be well for the present generations to emulate. That these brief lines may stimulate such interest, and that those who today bear the name may strive to perpetuate the virtue of fidelity to principle, and faithfully serve their day and generation, is the sincere wish of the authors.
