

# Lathrop Genealogy.



**1** REV. JOHN LATHROP, pastor of First Congregational church in London, came to New England in 1634, and was pastor of the church at Scituate, Mass., and afterwards of the church at Barnstable (*See Sprague's Annals*, Vol. I, 49).

**2** His son SAMUEL LATHROP, of New London, who removed to Norwich, Conn., in 1648, from England, and died Feb. 29, 1700, had by his first wife, Elizabeth Scudder, who he married at Barnstable, Nov. 28, 1644, nine children as follows :

- ii    *Elizabeth*, who married Isaac Royce, Dec. 15, 1669, of New London.

- viii   *Abigail*, born May, 1665; married John Huntington.
- ix    *Ann*, born Aug., 1667; married William Hough; died Nov. 19, 1745.

*ISRAEL LATHROP*, of Norwich, marked No. 3, had by his wife, Rebecca Bliss, ten children, seven sons and three daughters, as follows :

ISRAEL LATHROP, JR., marked No. 4, born Feb. 1, 1689; married to Mary Fellows, had children as follows:

- i *Israel*, born March 11, 1711.
- ii *Ephraim*, born Jan. 23, 1714.
- iii *Mary*, born Sept. 3, 1715.
- 5 iv JEDEDIAH, born Jan. 4, 1718; died June 9, 1792; was married, by Henry Wiltse, pastor of the second church, Norwich, to Abigail Hyde, Sept. 27, 1742, second daughter of Daniel Hyde, and Abigail Wattles, she was born Oct. 2, 1723, and she died Oct. 1, 1751. He was called Capt. Jedediah Lathrop. Their children were as follows :
  - i *Israel*, born April 30, 1743, at Norwich, and died Oct. 2, 1760.
- 6 ii JEDEDIAH, JR., born at Norwich, Conn., Feb. 9, 1747; was married, Dec. 18, 1769, by the Rev. Benjamin Troop, of same place, to Amey Gardner, daughter of Jonathan Gardner, and Mary Houghton both of Bozrah, Conn. They removed on the 19th March, 1793, to the town of Starke, Herkimer

- Co., State of New York, where he died Jan. 6, 1824, aged 77 years. Jonathan Gardner was born in 1724, and was a son of Stephen Gardner and Amey his wife, both of Bozrah, Ct. Mary Houghton wife of Jonathan Gardner, died Feb. 29, 1760, and he died at Bozrah, Feb. 8, 1812, aged 88 years.
- iii *Ephraim*, born July 22, 1749, at Norwich; died Oct. 13, 1798, unmarried.
  - iv *Daniel Hyde*, born Sept. 14, 1751, at Norwich; died Sept. 23, 1751.
  - v *Mary*, born April 23, 1745; married Elias West, Oct. 31, 1765.

CAPTAIN JEDEDIAH, marked No. 5, then married for his second wife, Jemima Birchard, who was born Feb. 13, 1729, daughter of John Birchard and Jane Hyde, of Norwich, Ct. He died June 9, 1792, at Bozrah, where she d. Sept. 1, 1749. His children by his second wife were four sons and four daughters, as follows :

- vi *Daniel*, born July 31, 1752, at Norwich, Ct.; died Nov. 4, 1773.
- vii *Uriah*, born May 12, 1755, at Norwich; he married — Tracy of Bozrah, and settled at Pittsfield.
- viii *Zepheniah*, born March 9, 1760, at Norwich; married Rachel Wood, and settled at Hadley, Mass.
- ix *Israel*, born Nov. 18, 1770, at Norwich; probably married, Nov. 18, 1794, Deborah Lathrop, born March 23, 1770, daughter of Capt Andrew Lathrop.
- x *Abigail*, born Feb. 24, 1757, at Norwich; married Joseph Fish, and removed to Pittstown, N. Y., and had a large family.
- xi *Phebe*, born July 1, 1762, at Norwich; married John Gardner.
- xii *Olive*, born July 13, 1764, at Norwich; married Joshua Starke, 1786,

- xiii *Jemima*, born Dec. 31, 1767, at Norwich; married Lemuel Gardner.

JEDEDIAH LATHROP, JR., marked No. 6, born Feb. 9, 1747, who married Amey Gardner, had children as follows :

- i *William Lathrop*, born Sept. 30, 1771, at Norwich; died Jan. 16, 1772.
- ii *William Lathrop*, born Sept. 11, 1773, at Norwich.
- iii *Nancy Lathrop*, born Sept. 24, 1775, at Norwich; died June 25, 1789.
- iv *Ariel Lathrop*, born Nov. 27, 1777, at Colchester, Ct.; married Mary Anderson, at Starke, Herkimer Co., N. Y. She born October, 1780, and died in the town of Starke, Herkimer Co., N. Y., April 22, 1834. He died Aug. 11, 1856. They had eight children, four boys and four girls.
- v *Mary Lathrop*, born at Colchester, July 26, 1780; married at Starke, Herkimer Co., N. Y., to John Perry, of Johnstown, Montgomery Co., N. Y. He was the father of the Hon. Eli Perry, for many years mayor of the city of Albany, N. Y., at this writing, member of Congress from Albany Co., N. Y.
- vi, vii *Dyer and Amey Lathrop*, twins born at Colchester, Ct., April 20, 1783. Dyer Lathrop, died aged three days.
- 7 viii DYER LATHROP, was born at Bozrah, Ct., May 4, 1788, and was married at Albany, N. Y., to Jane Ann, dau. of Elizabeth and Daniel Shields, of same place (Albany), May 16, 1824, and died April 18, 1855.
- ix *Nancy Lathrop*, born at Norwich, Ct., Nov. 13, 1792.

DYER LATHROP, marked No. 7, born May 4, 1788, who mar-

ried Jane Ann Shields, had seven children, four boys and three girls, as follows :

- 8 i *Daniel Shields Lathrop*, born April 13, 1825, at Albany, N. Y.; married Harriet M. Wilson, at Albany, Dec. 18, 1855, daughter of James A. and Jane Monteath Wilson, of said city.

- iii *Jane Elizabeth Lathrop*, born at Albany, Aug. 25, 1828, and was married by the Rev. L. F. Beecher, at Albany, Sept. 30, 1850, to Leland Stanford, ex-governor of California, and at this writing, president of the Central Pacific Railroad Company of California.
- iv *Ariel Lathrop*, born at Albany, Dec. 30, 1830; married in the same city, by Rev. H. W. Pohlman, Oct. 6, 1857, to Catharine P. Beardsley. He occupies the position of paying and receiving teller of the Union National Bank of Albany.
- v *Anna Maria Lathrop*, born Sept. 22, 1832, at Albany N. Y.; in California.
- vi *Henry Clay Lathrop*, born May 20, 1844, at Albany, N. Y.; single, in California.
- vii *Charles Gardner Lathrop*, born May 11, 1849, at Albany, N. Y.; married — Griswold.

DANIEL SHIELDS LATHROP, marked No. 8, born April 13, 1825, and who married Harriet Monteath Wilson, at Albany, N. Y., has three children as follows :

- ii *Tiena Dunn Lathrop*, born July 4, 1862.
- iii *Amey Gardner Lathrop*, b. Aug. 13, 1865.

Dyer Lathrop was an old and esteemed citizen of Albany, N. Y., and was known by every one in that city, and respected

as universally as he was known. He removed from Herkimer county to Albany, in 1811, and commenced his life there as a merchant, remaining in business until his death in 1855. He was one of the "old school" of men, decided in every feeling, of uncompromising integrity, and great industry. Endowed with the solid sense and virtues of the olden time, he pursued the "even tenor of his way" and after a successful career through life, died an honored man. He was benevolent of heart, and the appeals of honest charity were never made to him in vain. He was one of the incorporators of the Albany Hospital, and one of the founders of that Heaven-born institution the Asylum for Orphan and Destitute Children, and from the time of its organization 1829, to the time of his death, was one of its main supporters. He was its treasurer for nearly twenty-four years, and to his exertions and those of two or three other philanthropists, was the asylum indebted for its very existence. In the hour of trial, when it seemed inevitable that it could not be sustained, their individual means were freely given for the noble object, and thus the storm was weathered.

"At a meeting of the directors of the Albany Orphan Asylum held April 19, 1855, the president announced the death of Mr. Dyer Lathrop, their late treasurer, and it was resolved as a sense of the board.

"That in the death of Mr. Lathrop the community has lost one of its best citizens, and the board a most valuable officer. Not often have we known so unassuming a manner united with such benevolence of heart, and such energy of action. For twenty-four years he has watched over the interest of our institution with the fidelity of a parent. With no reward but an approving conscience, he has not only during this long period been the faithful guardian of its finances, but in its many and often protracted embarrassments, when other means have failed, his credit has always been our reliance till the exigency has been passed. It is the sentiment of every member this of

board, that a good man has gone from us, and that the Orphan has lost a friend, whose place it will not be easy to supply. etc., etc.

Know all by these p'sents That I John Elderkin of Norwich Carpenter with the free consent of my wife Elizabeth Doe give grant bargain & sell unto Sam<sup>r</sup> loutroup of the same Towne certain p<sup>r</sup>cells of land situate lyeing & being in the same Towne of Norwich in the Collony of Connecticott in the County of newlondon as ffolloweth :—

Imp<sup>r</sup>: A parcell of land containing fourty acres more or less lyeing upon Showatucket river abutting on the river on the East upon the land of Mr. fitch on the South upon the com<sup>on</sup>s on the West and North:—

Item Six acres of land more or less abutting on the high way against Goodman Tracy<sup>r</sup> house, on the South & upon other high waies on the North East & West<sup>r</sup> Item a parcell of mowing land containeing ten acres more or less: lyeing upon yantick brooke abutting on the s<sup>d</sup> brooke on the North upon the land of John Baldwin on the South upon the lands of John Tracy on the East uppon the land William Hide on the West these above s<sup>d</sup> parcells of lands I the s<sup>d</sup> John Elderkin with my wife Elizabeth have given granted bargained & sold unto y<sup>e</sup> s<sup>d</sup> Sam<sup>r</sup> louthoup; his heirs executores adminestratours & assignes for & in the consideration of fourty eighty pounds received & doe hereby pass over the right title & entrest: of the above s<sup>d</sup> lands unto the s<sup>d</sup> Samuell his heirs executours administr<sup>r</sup> & assignes to have & to hold forever: without any molestation from me my wife or heirs administrat<sup>r</sup>: execut<sup>r</sup>: & assignes

forever, in witness whereunto wee the s<sup>d</sup> John and Elizabeth have set to o<sup>r</sup> hands & seale the day & yeare above written—

Whereas I John Elderkin of Norwich in the county of new-london in the Collony of Connecticut in new England with my Wife Elizabeth have formerly sold unto Samuell louthroup sen<sup>r</sup> of the same Town & County afores<sup>d</sup> certaine parcells of land and meadow as appears by a Deed under our hands: & seales bareing date August 24<sup>th</sup> Anno 1668 the which lands Samuell louthroup hath peaciably possessed & improved ever since the Deed drawn & two years before, but now he & some others makeing a scruple whether the convayance was soe full & legall and thereby it may look as if it had some reflection upon us by reason of a writing made to some friends for the preserveing an Estate in theire hands not knowing what changes might be &c. but now the s<sup>d</sup> louthroup may doe well to consider whether he hath paid the price or value and however for the satisfying of the s<sup>d</sup> louthroup & others & that y<sup>e</sup> world may see & know: that wee did: and doe: entend nothing but what was honest: and therefore I the above s<sup>d</sup> John Elderkin & Elizabeth my Wife doe by these presents further ratify & confirme to all intents & purposes: the s<sup>d</sup> Deed of sale unto s<sup>d</sup> louthroup as need is or may be from us our heirs executors adminestrators & y<sup>t</sup> neither I the s<sup>d</sup> John Elderkin my Wife

our heirs executors administrators or assignes will not molest: disturb: the s<sup>d</sup> louthroup nor his heirs in the quiet possession & improvement of the s<sup>d</sup> land nor that the s<sup>d</sup> Samuell louthroup shall never be molested ejected by us nor our heirs or assignes nor by our friends Jacob Drake & John Gayler nor their heirs nor by noe other person or persons whatsoever proceeding from us or them: as wittnes our hands & seales this the 2<sup>d</sup> of December Anno Dom. 1686.

Know y<sup>e</sup> that Samuell louthroup have Given Granted and by these p<sup>r</sup>sents Doe Give Grant Alienate and confirme absolutely & freely by Deed of Gift: unto his son Sam<sup>l</sup>e louthroup of the same Towne & County afores<sup>d</sup> Twenty Two Rods of land where his house stands: and three acres & three quart<sup>r</sup> of pasture land on the East side of the Brooke: against his house: as bounded in the Records: Samuell louthroup sen<sup>r</sup> afores<sup>d</sup>: have Given & enfeofed aliened & passsed over his

whole right title entrest in and unto the above s<sup>d</sup> land: unto his son Samuell louthroup to him his heirs or assignes to have hold & possess forever: to his or his heirs or assignes benifet & profeit and that by his or theire improvement: forever never nor any time after the ensealing hereof that his s<sup>d</sup> son Samuell louthroup shall in the quiet possession & improvement of y<sup>e</sup> s<sup>d</sup> land nor his heirs nor assignes executors adminstrators: be molested ejected by him Samuell louthroup sen<sup>r</sup> his heirs or any under him or them in wittness & confirmation of the p<sup>r</sup>misses Samuell louthroup sen<sup>r</sup> above s<sup>d</sup> hath afixed his hand & seale this the 27<sup>th</sup> of Novemb<sup>r</sup> Anno 1688:

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Know all men by these Presents that I Israel Lothrup of Norwich in the County of New london and colony of Connecticut in New England for and in consideration of y<sup>e</sup> Love an parentall affection that I have and do bear toward my well beloved son Jedidiah Lothrup of the same Norwich affores<sup>d</sup> and as part of his Portain of my Estate, Have Given & Granted and by these presents Do fully freely and absolutely Give Grant Enfeofe Demise Convey and Confirme unto him, my said Son, Jedidiah, his heirs & assigns forever: one Certain Tract or percell of Land Lying and Being in the parish of New concord in s<sup>d</sup> Norwich containing by Estimation about one hundred acres. Be the Same more or Less, as it is Contained Within the following Bounds: Beginning at y<sup>e</sup> South Westerly Corner, att a heap of Stones by the highway, thence running

East Twenty one Degrees South one hundred and fifty-three Rods to a heap of Stones, abutting Southerly on Land of Capt. William Whiting, thence runing North Twenty Five Degrees East one Hundred and Sixteen Rods to a heap of Stones and abutts Easterly on Land of Gibson Harris; from thence Runing West Twenty one Degrees North one hundred and fifty five Rods to y<sup>e</sup> highway, and butts Northerly on s<sup>d</sup> Harris, thence abutting on y<sup>e</sup> highway Westerly one hundred and fifteen Rods to y<sup>e</sup> first corner With all y<sup>e</sup> Priviledges and appurtenance<sup>s</sup> thereof. To Have & To Hold, the above Given and Granted premises with all and Singular the appurtenances and priviledges to the Same Belonging unto him y<sup>e</sup> s<sup>d</sup> Jedidiah Lothrop his heirs & assigns for Ever; and I the Said Israel Lothrop for mysele my his heirs Executors and admi<sup>l</sup> Do hereby Covenant promise Grant & agree to and with him, y<sup>e</sup> s<sup>d</sup> Jedidiah his heirs & assigns in manner following (that is to say) that on the Day of the Date untill the Ensealing and Executing of these presents I the Said Israel Lothrop am the True Sole and Law full owner of the above Granted and Bargained Premises with the appurtenances and that the Same is free and Clear from all Incumbrances Whatso Ever, and that I Will for Ever hereafter Warrant and Defend y<sup>e</sup> Same unto him, the Said Jedidiah Lothrop, his heirs and assigns for Ever; against all just Claim whatso Ever. In Witness Where of, I have hereunto Sett my hand & Seal the Seventh Day of June A.D. 1740.—
