PREFACE

This compilation started in 1938 as an individual attempt to trace the history of this family back to the original American ancestor. Work was stopped for the period of World War II and several years thereafter, but considerable research showed that years might be required to assign Thomas Lillard in his proved place in the Colonial Virginia family of Lillards. Therefore it was decided to start with Thomas Lillard, leaving to further research the determination of his exact ancestry.

This manuscript lists all known descendants of Thomas and Rhoda (Patterson) Lillard, covering some 158 years. Material was procured by research and correspondence. As addresses herein indicate, descendants have spread far from the Iowa origin. Omissions are unintentional: some individuals could not be located or did not respond. Omissions and factual or typographical errors can be corrected in a future revision.

Although it appears that this work is the first comprehensive compilation since the marriage of Thomas Lillard and Rhoda Patterson in 1820, it should not be the last. It is to be hoped that this history will be kept alive--that each generation will find one descendant who will persist until the record is current.

Many descendants, and sincere friends of families herein, have contributed to this compilation. Several of them are now deceased. Space will not permit citing them all. However, particular acknowledgement must be made of the encouragement, enthusiasm, and suggestions of the late Attie (Jordan) Lillard, who provided intelligent inspiration at the very beginning of this project.

I sincerely hope that this work will serve a useful purpose, to some extent sufficing to give greater unity to the descendants of this pioneer couple and to provide answers to questions that have interested many of us.

EXPLANATIONS

Small Roman numerals are used in this compilation to indicate order of birth in each family. Consecutive Arabic numerals, starting with Thomas Lillard¹, are reserved for the children whose line is carried on. To illustrate, under section 1 on page 5 is found "8. vii. David Patterson, . . ." indicating that the line of David Patterson Lillard is carried forward to section 8 and that he was the seventh child in order of birth. In the same section 1 is found "xiii. Martha E.," the absence of an Arabic numeral here showing that the line is not carried forward for this daughter, the thirteenth child.

Descent by generation is indicated by the names and numbers in the parentheses after the name of the subject of a particular section. For example, in section 57 after the name of the subject, HARRIETTE METIER, is found "(Lavenia³ Elizabeth² Thomas¹)," indicating the subject to be herself 4th generation, the daughter of Lavenia, 3d generation; granddaughter of Elizabeth, 2d generation; and great-granddaughter of Thomas Lillard. Descent is thus indicated through individuals, male and female, who trace blood relationship to the progenitors, Thomas and Rhoda (Patterson) Lillard.

Each biographical section is designated by the appropriate Arabic numeral placed before the name of the descendant who is the subject of that section.

A reader may work backward from a particular individual by selecting the name, and appropriate section and page number, from the index. Then by successive reference to the index he may determine the section and page numbers on which the earlier ancestors are discussed. To illustrate, again continuing the example with Section 57, HARRIETTE METIER, a reader will note that the index makes reference for the preceding ancestor, "Alice Lavenia Stiles," to "Section 23, page 19." After reading that section, reference to the index will give "Section 4, p. 9" for the second generation ancestor, "Elizabeth Lillard." From there, the reader will find Section 1 for the first progenitor, Thomas Lillard.

1. THOMAS LILLARD was born in Virginia, in Culpeper County according to his obituary and family tradition, on 28 December 1792*. He died 16 April 1881 on his farm near Garden Grove, Decatur County, Iowa, and was buried on Easter Sunday, 17 April 1881, in the Garden Grove cemetery.

The parentage of Thomas Lillard has not been proved. All American Lillards are held to be the descendants of John¹ and Mildred (Jones) Lillard who resided in colonial Virginia. John Lillard was traditionally from the Loire District of France, a Huguenot, who with a brother Benjamin¹ came to Virginia about 1690, and there Benjamin drowned in the Thames River near Richmond. John Lillard¹ married Mildred Jones about 1700, and their known surviving son was Benjamin², born about 1701, who married Elizabeth Lightfoot, lived in Prince William and Culpeper counties, and raised a large family in Culpeper County, from which all Lillard lines across the nation have sprung. ["Lillard, a Family of Colonial Virginia, " by J. E. Stout Lillard, Richmond, 1928].

Thomas Lillard was in all likelihood a grandson of one of the several sons of Benjamin² and Elizabeth (Lightfoot) Lillard, but acceptable proof is still lacking. Traditionally, he was left an orphan when young, perhaps between seven and ten years of age, for one of his grandsons [Hardin W. Lillard] stated that he often recalled that his parents had once set a broken arm for him. He traditionally had brothers and sisters.

Thus, although Thomas Lillard was probably of the fifth generation of American Lillards, in this manuscript he is considered as the first generation for the purpose of compilation of his descendants.

As an orphan he was raised in Bourbon County, Kentucky, traditionally by a neighboring family and possibly by a member of his mother's family, Delaney. Although the actual Delaney family group has not been proved after considerable research, there is a probability that it may have been the family of Daniel Delaney, or one of his sons, who was in that county from 1797 until his death there in 1849, and who lived in the vicinity of the old Elizabeth Baptist Church and Johnson's Tavern, about five miles from Paris on the road to Georgetown, Kentucky.

The first positive record mentioning Thomas Lillard is that concerning his first enlistment for the War of 1812. He enlisted at Nicholasville, Jessamine County, Kentucky, and was mustered in at Georgetown on 15 August 1812 as a private in the infantry company commanded by Captain James C. Price, 5th Regiment (Lt. Col. William Lewis), Kentucky Volunteer Militia. He participated in the arduous winter campaign of Major General William Henry Harrison against the British and Indians under General (then Colonel) Henry Proctor, surviving the scourge of

typhus fever that in November 1812 struck the troops under General James Winchester at Fort Defiance (Ohio), which he assisted in building, that fort being the most advanced and most remote from supplies. He took part in the almost continual action against the Indians, engaging in many skirmishes prior to the two principal battles of Raisin River, near Frenchtown (now Monroe, Michigan) on 18 and 22 January 1813. At the second and major battle of 22 January 1813, a disastrous defeat and surrender followed by massacre of the Kentucky wounded by the Indians, Thomas Lillard was among those surrendered by General Winchester after some six hours of successful resistance from within the picket fence that surrounded the few houses in Frenchtown.

His movements after surrender may be accepted as those described in the following quotation from the "Historical Sketch of the Second War between the United States of America and Great Britain," by Charles J. Ingersoll, Philadelphia, 1845, page 145: "After being detained in Malden four days, they were conducted by Detroit, over Lake St. Clair, to the mouth of the Thames, up which they marched 90 miles, thence across to and down Grand River to Lake Ontario and to Fort George, where they were paroled not to serve until exchanged, and put across to Fort Niagara. Hence the late prisoners travelled to Buffalo, to Erie, to Pittsburgh, and down to Maysville in Kentucky, and home, having marched, during the campaign, a round of about 1300 miles." Pertinent also is this quotation from the "Pictorial Field-Book of the War of 1812," by Benson J. Lossing, 1868: "[They] suffered much from the severity of the weather and the bad treatment of their guards . . . The loss of the Americans in the affair of the Raisin was 934. Of these 197 were killed and missing; the remainder were made prisoners. Of the whole army of about a thousand men, only 33 escaped. . . The war cry of Kentucky soldiers after that was REMEMBER THE RIVER RAISIN!"

Thomas Lillard, one of those thus paroled, made his way back to Kentucky, in the depth of winter. In Kentucky he found the people, aroused by the defeat and deaths suffered at Raisin River, enthusiastically engaged in raising new forces to send against the British and Indians. Therefore, on 20 May 1813, at Ralph Jacoby's near Paris in Bourbon County, he reenlisted for a period of six months in the mounted company of Captain Richard Matson of the Kentucky Mounted Infantry regiment commanded by the famous Colonel Richard Mentor Johnson. He was appointed 3d Sergeant of the company.

Realizing that recapture by the British would undoubtedly result in his summary execution for breach of the terms of his parole, and upon the advice of friends, he being a minor,

he reenlisted under the name of Thomas Delaney, taking his mother's family name. He served throughout the summer and fall, including participation in the decisive Battle of the Thames near Moraviantown, Ontario, Canada, on 5 October 1813. It was this battle in which the power of the British and Indians was completely broken and the great Chief Tecumseh killed, according to many by Colonel Johnson himself. Although Captain Matson's company was considered a unit of the 1st Battalion under Major Payne and therefore should have been used with that battalion to assault the British regulars on the right, it is reported traditionally that Thomas Lillard saw Colonel Johnson kill Tecumseh, which anecdote would place him with the 2d Battalion, for that day at least, which defeated the Indian allies on the left.

As Sergeant Delaney he was discharged 19 November 1813 at William Johnson's Old Johnson's Tavern in Bourbon County, Kentucky. His official Army pay record shows that he drew the sum of \$139.60: \$66 in pay computed at \$11 per month; and \$73.60 for forage for his mount computed at 40¢ per day.

His military service has been accepted in support of application for membership in the General Society of the War of 1812.

Thomas Lillard first appeared on the Tax Books of Bourbon County in 1814, without statement of his age, he evidently then being 21, the legal age at which individuals were placed upon the tax books. On the Tax Book for 1815 he is listed in Captain Francis Butler's Company, 71st Regiment (County Militia), as "1 voter, 1 white male above 21, 2 horses valued \$120.00." He continued to be on the Tax Books for 1816, 1817, and 1818. The latter year was the last of entry and his last in Kentucky, for in 1819, a year of great westward migration, he left for Missouri Territory.

In Missouri, he went into the present St. Louis County, where on 1 January 1820 he was married by the famous pioneer missionary, John Clark, to Rhoda Patterson, a daughter of the pioneer and Revolutionary soldier, John Patterson, Senior, and Keziah (Horneday) Patterson, his wife. Rhoda Patterson was born 1 April 1804 in the present St. Louis County, Missouri; died 29 September 1887 on the family farm in Garden Grove Township, Decatur County, Iowa; and is buried beside her husband in the Garden Grove cemetery.

John Patterson, Senior, the father of Rhoda (Patterson) Lillard, was born in Bucks County, Pennsylvania, on 15 October 1760, moved to North Carolina near Hillsboro, where in

the fall of 1783 he served in the North Carolina Militia in companies commanded by Captain Christmas and Captain Schoby [Pension application R. 8005, dated 25 May 1838, National Archives]. After the Revolution he lived in South Carolina, Pendleton District, for several years; and about 1795 he moved to Jefferson County, Kentucky, where he resided for about a year and a half. He was one of the earliest American settlers to enter the present State of Missouri, having settled in 1797 on Cold Water Creek about fifteen miles northwest of the city of St. Louis on a tract granted him, although a Protestant, by the King of Spain. With his large family of five sons and several daughters he established the Patterson Settlement of some fifteen hundred acres. Today, Patterson Road, near to the town of Florissant, bears his name and generally marks the area of his Settlement. He died 31 January 1839 and was buried in the Cold Water Cemetery [History of St. Louis County," Wm. L. Thomas, 1911, Vol. 1, page 87]. His will mentioned his surviving children, including "Rhoda Lillard" [Will Book N², page 397, Office Recorder of Deeds, City of St. Louis, Missouri]. His military service has been accepted in support of application for membership in the Daughters of the American Revolution and in the Sons of the American Revolution.

After their marriage, Thomas and Rhoda (Patterson) Lillard lived for twelve years in St. Louis County, Missouri, and there six of their children were born. The entry for Thomas Willard (sic) on page 18, Volume 8, Federal Census of 1830 for St. Ferdinand Township, St. Louis County, Missouri, generally among those for John Patterson, Senior, and his family, undoubtedly pertains correctly to Thomas Lillard. During his period in Missouri, for part of the time at least, he worked as a stonemason and is reported to have helped on the first court house in St. Louis.

On 30 November 1832, Thomas and Rhoda (Patterson) Lillard removed to Calhoun County, Illinois, to a farm near Point Pleasant and Dear Plain, where they lived from 1 December 1832 until April 1857. There the remainder of their children were born. Both being connected with the Methodist Episcopal Church, although Thomas Lillard was originally a Baptist, their home was a welcome place for the travelling minister of those days.

In 1857, bade adieu by the entire assembled community, they removed to Iowa, arriving at Garden Grove, Decatur County, on 17 April 1857. There they lived the remainder of their lives on their farm about four miles from that town on the road to Chariton, Iowa.

Thomas Lillard was allowed 160 acres of military bounty land for his two periods of active service in the War of 1812, upon his applications dated 20 October 1850 and 13 September 1851, respectively [Warrants 5058 and 44219]. He also received military pension of \$8.00 per month upon application dated 7 April 1871 and allowed by Certificate 6034. Rhoda (Patterson) Lillard applied 17 June 1882

for pension, which was allowed her by Widow's Certificate 32957. Her application contains supporting statements of two children, John Wesley Lillard and Elizabeth (Lillard) (Nixon) Stiles, and attestation by a brother, David Patterson, of her marriage to Thomas Lillard.

Wherever they lived, by their way of life, Thomas and Rhoda (Patterson) Lillard won the affection and respect of their neighbors. He was industrious, honest, and upright, without enemies, and strong of religious faith; she was of great firmness and persistence of purpose, a loyal, worthy, and affectionate partner. At Garden Grove they continued active in the Methodist Episcopal Church, in which there is a window donated by them. After the death of her husband, Rhoda (Patterson) Lillard lived out the remainder of her days on the old homestead with her youngest son, James Monroe Lillard.

The last will and testament of Thomas Lillard only mentioned by name his wife, Rhoda Lillard, referred to but did not name his surviving children, and described the farm on which they lived, and which he bequeathed to his widow, as follows: Southeast quarter of Section No. 14 and also the Northeast one-fourth of the Southwest quarter of Section No. 21, all in Township No. 70 North of Range No. 24, West of the Fifth (5) Principal Meridian [Records of District Court, Decatur County, Leon, Iowa].

* This date was adopted after research. His bounty land application of 29 October 1850, sworn to before Justice of the Peace Nathaniel Shaw, his friend for many years and father of the wives of two of his sons, reads in pertinent part: ". . . will be aged on 28 December 1850, 58 years." His obituary, 21 April 1881, which contains several errors of fact, gave date of birth as 11 December 1793. One family record claimed to have been copied from the old family Bible gave date of 11 December 1796. Bourbon County Tax Books, as explained above, indicate that he became age 21 in 1813, for he was first placed on the rolls in 1814; this tax entry corroborates his year of birth as 1792.

Therefore, since earliest official records indicate 1792, and his own military bounty land application contains the positive statement concerning 28 December, the date of birth of 28 December 1792 was accepted for this manuscript.

2. JOHN WESLEY LILLARD (Thomas¹), son of Thomas and Rhoda (Patterson) Lillard, was born 4 April 1821 in St. Louis County, Missouri; died on his farm near Garden Grove, Decatur County, Iowa, on 2 March 1883; and is buried in the Garden Grove cemetery.

He married Emeline L. Shaw, daughter of Nathaniel and Elizabeth Shaw, in a ceremony performed by Reverend Moses Champit, on 28 March 1844 in Calhoun County, Illinois. She was born in 1827 in Illinois; died in September 1854 in Platteville, Grant County, Wisconsin. Her family was prominent in early Calhoun County, her father being Justice of the Peace for many years.

John Wesley Lillard was married again, on 18 May 1856, in Calhoun County, Illinois, to Harriet Jane Divird, daughter of William Alexander and Elizabeth N. (Burgunder) Divird, by R. G. Andrews, Justice of the Peace. She was born 14 June 1835 in Pennsylvania; died 25 September 1926 at Prosser, Washington, while living with her daughter and son-in-law, John and Grace (Lillard) Abercrombie. She was buried in the Garden Grove cemetery.

He removed with his parents from St. Louis County, Missouri, to Calhoun County, Illinois, in 1832. There he married, had his own farm, and showed interest in the political affairs of the county sufficient for him to run for county constable in 1841, 1843, 1844, and 1846 [Election returns, Vol. 68, page 5, Illinois State Library]. Sometime after 1850 he removed with his family to the vicinity of Platteville, Grant County, Wisconsin, and there his first wife, Emeline L. (Shaw) Lillard, died. He returned thereafter to Illinois, remarried, and continued to live in Point Precinct after his parents moved to Iowa, until he, too, left for Iowa in 1864.

He became in Franklin Township, Decatur County, Iowa, a prosperous, admired, and respected farmer, esteemed in the township as a devoted husband and father, and loyal friend whose sympathetic nature made him ready to listen to and to relieve the distress of the unfortunate. He was Methodist Episcopal in religion and Republican in politics. [History of Ringgold and Decatur County, Iowa, 1887, page 483.]

His tragic and untimely death resulted from his being struck and instantly killed by a collapsing scaffold which was being used to raise a steer from a well into which it had fallen.

He died intestate. The initial report of the administrator of estate, Cyril C. Wood, subscribed and sworn on 22 March 1883, listed all children with dates of their birth and described the real estate holdings of approximately 1200 acres in Sections 14, 22, 23, 24, 25, and 30, of Township 70, in Ranges 24 and 25. Final report of administrator was dated 14 March 1887. Two guardianships were opened for minor children: the first opened in 1885 and closed on

23 January 1890 by the guardian, James Monroe Lillard; the second opened 22 January 1890 by Frank Marion Lillard, duly appointed guardian, whose last annual report was of 23 April 1896.

3. AUGUSTINE (AUGUSTUS)* LILLARD (Thomas¹), son of Thomas and Rhoda (Patterson) Lillard, was born 7 February 1823, according to family Bible records, in St. Louis County, Missouri, and died in 1845 in Calhoun County, Illinois, during a cholera epidemic which swept the Mississippi valley.

He married 16 November 1843 to Martha (Marzella)* Cresswell before Nathaniel Shaw, Justice of the Peace [Marriage Record Book, Calhoun County, Illinois, 1825-1870, page 59, Number 267, in Office of Clerk of Court, Hardin, Illinois]. She was of the family established early in Calhoun County by the pioneer Robert Cresswell.

Augustine and Martha (Cresswell) Lillard are reported to have had two children born in Calhoun County [Hardin W. Lillard], but nothing is now known of them or of their descendants. The surname Cresswell was still in Calhoun County as late as 1880, at least [History of Calhoun and Pike Counties], in DAR Library, Washington, D. C.]

** By family Bible record it is stated that "Augustin" and "Martha" Cresswell were married as shown. The marriage record cited above shows "Augustus" and "Marzella" as the names. Both spellings are therefore given here.

4. ELIZABETH LILLARD (Thomas¹), daughter of Thomas and Rhoda (Patterson) Lillard, was born 20 October 1824 in St. Louis, County, Missouri; died at Leon, Decatur County, Iowa, on 20 October 1891; and is buried in the Leon cemetery.

She married James W. Nixon on 9 March 1843 in Calhoun County, Illinois, before Nathaniel Shaw, Justice of the Peace [Marriage Record Book, Calhoun County, Illinois, 1825-1870, Number 248, in Office of Clerk of Court, Hardin, Illinois]. He was the son of James Nixon, one of the earliest settlers in Pike County, Illinois, and prominent in the formation and administration of Calhoun County when it was cut off from Pike County. James W. Nixon died about 1848 in Calhoun County, Illinois.

Elizabeth (Lillard) Nixon was remarried on 26 May 1850 in Calhoun County, Illinois, to Henry Gardner Stiles, himself a widower, by the Reverend John Housewealt [Marriage Record Book, Calhoun County, Illinois, 1825-1870, Number 442, in Office of Clerk of Court, Hardin, Illinois]. He was born 18 July 1810 in Orange County, Vermont, the son of Mr. and Mrs. Aaron Stiles, who with a large family were in Calhoun County, Illinois, by 1830. He died 10 August 1876 in Decatur County, Iowa.

Henry Gardner Stiles was prominent in administration of Calhoun County, Illinois, being one of the three County Commissioners at the first meeting at the new county seat, Hardin, on 6 December 1847 ["History of Calhoun County," by George Carpenter, 1934]. 5. SARAH EMELINE LILLARD (Thomas¹), daughter of Thomas and Rhoda (Patterson) Lillard, was born 20 June 1826 in St. Louis County, Missouri; died 2 August 1893 at Weldon, Decatur County, Iowa; and is buried in the Garden Grove cemetery.

She married Thomas Jefferson Eals on 30 October 1845 in Calhoun County, Illinois, before Nathaniel Shaw, Justice of the Peace [Marriage Record Book, Calhoun County, Illinois, 1825-1870, Number 287, in Office of Clerk of Court, Hardin, Illinois]. He was born 10 March 1825, in Kentucky, of parents born in England [Federal Census, Iowa, 1880, Franklin Township, Decatur County, page 193, in DAR Library, Washington, D. C.], and traditionally he

was raised in Harrison County, Kentucky. He died 8 May 1898 and is buried in the Garden Grove cemetery, Garden Grove, Iowa.

Thomas Jefferson and Sarah (Lillard) Eals removed to Decatur County, Iowa, in 1857, when her parents did likewise. There they established their family and stood high in the esteem of the community. Thomas Jefferson Eals was a prosperous farmer, noted for his blooded cattle and Kentucky horses.

7. SANDERS P. LILLARD (Thomas¹), son of Thomas and Rhoda (Patterson) Lillard, was born 15 August 1830 in St. Louis, County, Missouri. He died 6 August 1895 in Lincoln, Nebraska, and was buried in the cemetery at Garden Grove, Iowa [Department of Health, Lincoln City-Lancaster County, Nebraska, Death Records].

He married Ellen E. Shaw, daughter of Nathaniel and Elizabeth Shaw on 17 April 1853 in Calhoun County, Illinois. She was born in Illinois on 6 March 1838; died 26 March 1864; and is buried in the Garden Grove cemetery.

Sanders P. Lillard was apparently the first of the children of Thomas and Rhoda (Patterson) Lillard to remove to Iowa, he and his wife living in Garden Grove, Iowa, on 16 July 1856 [Iowa State Census, 1856, State Historical Department, Des Moines, Iowa]. He was a favorite of his mother, by whom he was called "Jack."

He was subsequently reinterred at the National Cemetery, with 469 other dead from the Island, in Sections 63, 64, and 68
