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PREFACE

The extensive research for the data shown in this genealogy was begun in 1916 in Washington, D. C. when the compiler was living there and had access to the exceptionally good collections of historical data in the Congressional and D.A.R. Libraries, Census and Pension Bureaus, etc. Our work dealt primarily with two distinct families, i.e. Loveless and Keeney, but included many allied families and early European and royal ancestries of many colonial pioneers with some carried back to Adam.

To date our printed material includes, OUR FAMILY NAME, (a pamphlet on Keeney name as it appears in the records under more than 36 different spellings) — Vol. I of The KEAYNE-KEEN(E)-KEENEY-KINNEY-KENNEY and allied families. (A book 185 pp.-1942 c.) HENRY and ANN KINNE, Pioneers of Salem, Mass. (218 pp. 1947c.) Vol. II of the above, in press. Also JORAN KYN of NEW SWEDEN in Vol. CV Jan. 1951, *New England Historical & Genealogical Register*. We have also carefully arranged manuscript sufficient for two or more additional books.

Genealogy touches life in its most vital and important relations, — it reveals the origin of a person and the effect of environment and heredity upon his status and estate in society; the connections of a man by marriage, his parentage or ancestry, and the effect thereon upon his life.

Thus we find many are developing a proper pride in their ancestry. "In fact, a lively desire of knowing and recording our ancestors so generally prevails, that it must depend on the influence of some common principle in the minds of men. We seem to have lived in the persons of our forefathers; it is the labour and reward of vanity to extend

the term of this ideal longevity. The satirist may laugh, the philosopher may preach; but Reason herself will respect the prejudices and habits which have been consecrated by the experience of mankind. Few there are who can seriously despise in others an advantage of which they are secretly ambitious to partake. The knowledge of our own family from a remote period will always be esteemed as an abstract pre-eminence, since it can never be promiscuously enjoyed. If we read of some illustrious line, so ancient that it has no beginning, so worthy that it ought to have no end, we sympathize in its various fortunes: nor can we blame the generous enthusiasm, or the harmless vanity, of those who are allied to the honours of its name —" *Edward Gibbon* (1727-1794) English Historian, in his *Autobiography*.

In early records the Lovelace name appears under many different spellings including Loulas; Luvlace; Loveles; Lovelisse; Lawless; Laghless; Loueless; Loweless; Lovelas; Louelace; Lovelass; Lovis.

"Surnames are known to have been assumed, in some instances, before the Norman Conquest; but they did not become general in England until two or three centuries later. Every name originally had a meaning and was at first assumed or imposed from its real or supposed fitness, from some accidental circumstance, or from mere caprice. Each individual is distinguished from his fellows only by his name. But for this system, history and biography could hardly exist." *Suffolk Surnames* — Bowditch, Nathaniel Ingersole, Ticknor & Fields, Boston, 1858.

"Tradition says that the name originated from Loheac, who was a captain of a free company in the service of Edward the Black Prince, and subsequently settled in England." Geo. S. Lovelace, Atty., Union National Bank Bldg., Muskegon, Michigan, 1926.

"The Episcopal registers of the 13th century show us

that the clergy were known by the villages and manors from whence they came. Almost invariably they bore place names. And many of these names became corrupted when the original place name ceased to be generally understood and was assimilated to some name more or less phonetically equivalent, as Lovelass for Lovelace." P. 322 — *Family Names and Their History*, Baring-Gould, 1910.

The pension papers of Joseph Loveless, Rev. sold. from N.Y. State and now in the U.S. Pension Office, show that the family name of all in America should be Lovelace. But in pre-revolutionary times the family was divided by political interests and the Tories or Royalists kept the name and either returned to Europe or removed to Canada, while the patriots or rebels changed the name to Loveless and disclaimed all relationship to the Lovelace family. F. K. Robertson — 1916.

Lovelace (Loveless) is an old English surname, derived from the wearing of a love token. The spelling was originally Loveles in Medieval times, but both spellings soon became common, although the name had one origin. *World Publishing Co.*, Wash., D.C.

Arms — On 3 Laurel Leaves Vert.

Crest — A Demi-Talbot Proper.

EXPLANATION AND DESCRIPTION OF THE ABOVE SYMBOLS:

Gules or red denotes Military Fortitude and Magnanimity.
“The Martyr’s Color.”

Chief — which occupies the whole top and 1/3 of the total surface of the shield of arms, signifies dominion and authority, and it has often been granted as a special reward for prudence and wisdom as well as for successful command in war.

Argent — white or silver, signifies peace and sincerity.

Martlet is a bird — shaped like a swallow with a forked tail and 2 tufts instead of legs.

Sable, or black, denotes constancy and sometimes, but rarely, grief.

Raguly or raguled, is when the bearing or uneven or ragged, like the trunk or limb of a tree left of its branches.

Vert, or green signifies hope, joy and sometimes loyalty in love.

Eagle — which is usually represented with wings “displayed” signifies a “man of action evermore occupied in high and weighty affairs and one of lofty spirit, ingenious, speedy in apprehension and judicious in matters of ambiguity.” The displayed wings signify protection, or yellow or gold, denotes generosity and elevation of mind.

Leaves are the emblem of truth.

Talbot — one of a breed of greyhound, white-colored, quick-scented, hunting dogs with long pendulous ears, now extinct.

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PART I — ENGLISH ANCESTRY OF THE LOVELACE (LESS) FAMILY

CHAPTER I — EARLIEST RECORDS

John Lovelace, the first of the name of whom we find record, was living in 1300, and had sisters or aunts named Marien Shelke and Elizabeth Gateman (p. 54, vol. XX, *Archaeologia Contiana*, fr. Seager's "Baronaquim").

John Lovelace (generation 2), his son, purchased in 1367 fr. William Kinet a manor in Bethersden, west of the parish church, which was afterwards variously known as "Bethersden," "Bethersden-Lovelace," and "Lovelace Place" (*Hasted's Kent*, ed. 2 VII, 489, in final draft copy fr. p. 394, etc., vol. 27, *Vir. Mag.*). He was probably the builder and proprietor of Lovelace Place. In 1876 this ancient mansion had been taken down but a modern substantial farm house on the site contains some oak panelling and the Hulse Arms in stained glass, removed from the ancient edifice (p. 184, vol. X, *Arch. Cont.*, "The Kentish Family of Lovelace," by Rev. A. J. Pearman).

John Lovelace (g. 3), m. Johanna ———. In 1391 he witnessed a deed; mentioned as proprietor of Lovelace Place in 1412 when he bo't some marble pits in Bethersden of John Gybon. d. before Apr. 15, 1417, when a charter fr. Henry V (reigned 1413-1422) mentions his heirs as landholders in Bethersden, and bur. with wife Joane or Johanna in Bethersden Church. He was the ancestor of the various branches of the Lovelace family, i.e., Brayford, Sedingbourne or Sittingbourne, Kingsdown and Huxley.

1. William, d.s.p. Aug. 26, 1459, when as heir he was succeeded by his brother Richard. Bur. in Bethersden

Church with inscription showing license was given in 1460 by Henry VI for the founding of a Chantry in the Chapel of Bethersden to pray daily for the soul of William Lovelace and his parents, John and Johanna Lovelace.

+2. Richard, b. betw. 1390 and 1395, d. 1466, m. heiress of Eynsham.

3. Robert, living at Bethersden in 1437, d. 1466. In 1414 he became owner of two pieces of land, called Wilcooks at Snode, doubtless Snode Hill. Mentioned in list of Kentish Gentlemen in 1434. May 17, 1437 (15th year of the reign of Henry VI) his name appears in a grant with Richard Lovelace.

His will of that year directed that his property be sold and proceeds divided among his daughters and son William, then under age, to be "scholed" out of the profits in land in Bethersden. Seager's "Baronaquim" refers to his "cousin" Sir Richard, patron of the Chantry of Bethersden. He was also of Merton in Surrey, being one of those pardoned in 1450 for share in Jake Cade's Rebellion. Oct. 1, 1455 he was supervisor of the will of Thomas Heath of Woolwich.

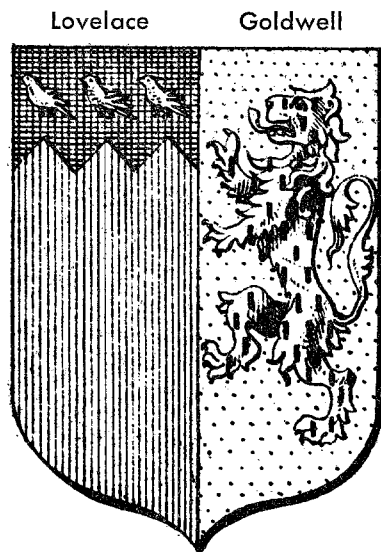
A. Ellen, m. William Stephens of Kent. By some she is ascribed to be the dau. of William of Wickhambreaux. Her dau. Johanna Stephens, m. (1) John Nethersole, Esq., and m. (2) Richard Simonds of Corden, co. Dorset. Her dau. and sole heir, b. Nov. 29, 1579, Faversham, was mother of Sir Simon D. Ewes. In 1591 there was erected in a room at Coxden, over the chimney of the dining hall, Coxden

C. William, b, at Wickhambreaux (records of New Romney), admitted to franchise of Romane June 1, first year of Richard III. He left no s., so property at Bethersden devolved on relatives Sir Richard and William of Kingsdown. But he could have been the father, not brother, of Ellen, who m. William Stephens.

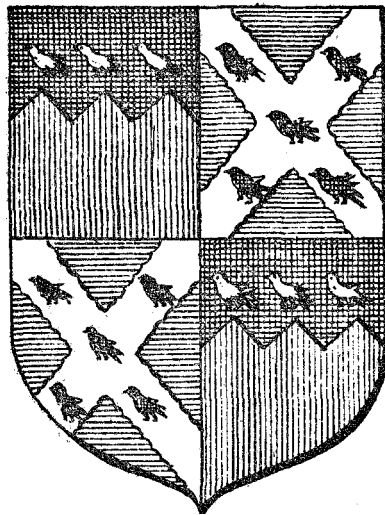

Col. Richard Lovelace or Louelace, (g. 4), John (3), (2), (1), b. betw. 1390 & 1395, Sittingbourne. He was apprenticed to Wm. Foucher & admitted freeman of Mercers Company, London, in 1415. In 1459 he succeeded his brother William as proprietor of Lovelace Place. He was ancestor of the direct line of Bethersden Lovelace's. Res. at Queen-shithe, London, in time of Henry VI. Purchased Bayford Castle, known as "Bayluce," & Goodneston Manor in Kingsdown. He was Marshal of Calais. Pardoned in 1450 for participation in Jake Cade's insurrection. He d. 1466 when will was probated. Will dated Apr. 4-1466, written in Latin, in which he describes himself as "Citizen & Mercer of London," mentions by name only "younger son" John, to whom he left manors of Bayford & Goodneston in Sittingbourne & dau. Katherine to whom he willed the manor of Hever in Kings-

down. By success in business as well as by marriage he ac-
quired considerable wealth.

(g. 5) of Bethersden s. of Robert (g. 4): — Dec. 4, 1492, was given a pension for his services: — Feb. 11, 1486, he received annuity out of town of Calais & ten days later he & Adrian Lovelace were confirmed in previous grant of letters patent. He d. before 1511 when he is mentioned as deceased. He was Captain & Marshal of Calais; — an eminent soldier. Bur. in Sittingbourne, Kent, with monument. Left no ch. but had m. Elizabeth Cromer or Crowman, probably late in life. She was dau. of Jacob Crowner & gr. dau. of Sir. Wm. Cromer, Sheriff of Kent, whom Jake Cade beheaded. She m. 2nd Sir Wm. 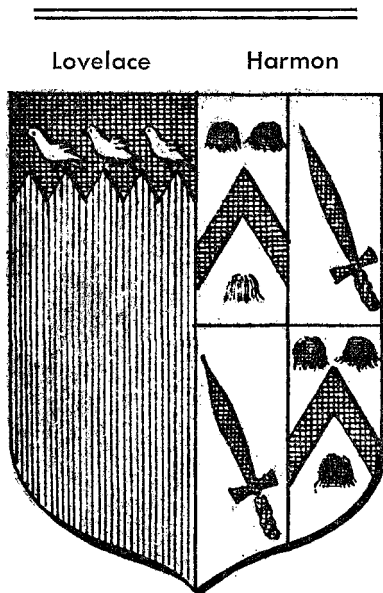

CHAPTER IV — THE BETHERSDEN LINE

William Lovelace (g. 6), William (5), Richard (4), John (3), (2), (1), b. abt. 1480. Although a 2nd s., he succeeded his uncle, Sir Richard Lovelace as proprietor of the Lovelace Place & was ancestor of the Bethersden line, being 2nd Lovelace of Bethersden. d. 1541. Will dated Dec. 18, 1540, proved Apr. 6, 1541, in Archdeaconry Court of Canterbury, states he desired to be buried in Bethersden Church at a spot to be chosen by Alice, his wife. He names bro. John Lovelace & nephew Thos. Lovelace as supervisors thereof. He left "monies" to each of 3 ch., m. Mrs. Alice (Stevens) Shawe who d. 1541 when all her children were under age as shown by her will dated Mar. 28, 1541, & proved July 28, 1541, Canterbury, in which she mentions bro. Wm. Stevens & s. of 1st hus. John Shawe.

Child. (3 or more) — (g. 7) — *Vir. Mag.*, Vol. 27, p. 393.

1. Elizabeth, living unm. in 1540.
2. Margaret, m. July 13, 1556, at St. George's Canterbury, Austin Cooke. She was a widow in 1576 according to her brother's will.
3. poss. John (Peckham charts give him as the ancestor of the wife of Lord Byron, but other records show this to be erroneous).
4. Sir William, "only son," who inherited all lands upon his attaining the age of 26 yrs. according to his father's will. Elected M.P. for Canterbury in 1558 & returned 3 times thereafter. b. at Lovelace Place prob. betw. 1525 & 1530 as he was a minor in 1541. He was Sergeant at Law. He succeeded his father as proprietor of Lovelace Place &

so ancestor of the Bethersden line. He was also of Lydden Manor, co. Kent. Admitted to Gray's Inn, 1548. Called to the bar in 1551. Became Serg. at Law in 1567 & attained great rank in his profession. Justice of Assizes for Oxfordshire, Feb. 27, 1571, & thereafter. He left a large number of properties in various parts of Kent. High Steward of Liberties of Christ Church — Founder of Hospital of St. Lawrence, which purchase involved his heirs in costly legal proceedings & forced them to sell his properties in St. Stephens to his tenant, Roger Manwood, who, later, as Baron Manwood, instigated legal proceedings against his son & exhorted heavy payments. His name frequently appears in accounts of corporations of Faversham & Canterbury. He was a writer of authority upon wills. Dulwich Gallery, London, contains his portrait in his red robes, painted on a panel 26" x 22", & displays Lovelace Arms & motto, "Virtute Duce." He left a large no. of properties in various parts of Kent as indicated by his will which mentions "cosen" Thomas Lovelace of Kingsdowne.

d. Mar. 23, 1577, in London. Will dated July 20, 1576; bur. Apr. 1, 1577, in Canterbury Cathedral with monument inscribed, "William Lovelace and Anne, dau. of Robert Lewis, Alderman of Canterbury." There must have been something remarkable about his death because on May 3, 1577, Henry Benneman of London paid the Stationer's Co. of London for the right to print "The Brief Course of the Accidents of the Death of Mr. Sergeant Lovelace." Leonard Lovelace was a witness of his will.

m. (1) Anne Lewis (dau. of Robert Lewis, Alderman & Mayor of Canterbury, who d. Oct. 28, 1567). She d. & was bur. Feb. 25, 1569, in Canterbury Cathedral. She left no will.

m. (2) abt. 1570, Mary or Margery or Maria (White or Wight) Carrell, dau. of Sir. Thos. White of Hampshire & widow of Thomas Carel or Caryll, of Wormham, co. Sussex.

Her will, dated Jan. 25, 1577/78, proved Apr. 29, 1578, requested burial at South Warmborough, & named previous husband, Thos. Carrel & daus. Frances Carrell & Mabel Lovelace. She was 1st dau. of Sir Thos. White (of Swansboring). m. Agenta or Agnes White, dau. of Robert White of Farnham & gr. dau. of Thomas White of Peruise in co. Southampton. She was sister of John White, Bishop of Winchester, & Sir John White, Mayor of London in 1563/4 & of Aldershot in co. Southampton. Note 2 Johns according to p. 12, *Vis. of Hampshire — Har. Soc. Pub.* Vol 64. "2 sons in same family by same first name are sometimes found in the records of this period." 1st s. of Robert White (of Swanborne, m. Elizabeth Inglefield, dau. of Thos. Inglefield, the elder, knight.) s. of Robert White, (of Southwarmborne, 14 y. old in 9th yr. of reign of Edward IV, (1461-1483), therefore b. abt. 1475, m. Margaret Gaynsford, dau. of John Gainsford), 1st s. of John White (of Swanborne, obseques 1469, m. Alice Hungerford, dau. of Robert, Lord Hungerford.) s. of Robert White (of Yeatley & Farnham & wife, Alice.) p. 83, Vol. 28 — *Vir. Mag.* & p. 48, *Sussex Genealogies*.

Child. (9 — 7 by 1st & 2 by 2nd wife.) (g. 8)

a. Margery, bur. July 6, 1560.

b. Nicholas, bur. Feb. 2, 1561.

c. Richard, bp. Sept. 14, 1560, bur. Sept. 11, 1561, St. Alphege.

+d. William, b. 1561, m. Elizabeth Aucher.

e. Thomas, b. Apr. 12, 1563, bp. Apr. 25, 1563. *Vis. of Kent* — 1574, p. 64, says "2 sons." d. Oct. 23, 1591, bur. Bethersden. He was prob. the Thomas Lovelace who made a pilgrimage to Rome in 1583. He inherited Manor of Monkton, Mayfield, by father's will.

f. Mary, bp. Oct. 8, 1564. Rec'd a legacy of 200 francs — 10 times what her father had left to his sisters —

with her mother's jewels. m. Richard Lovelace, (g. 8), of Kent. s. of Thomas (7) & Elizabeth (Clement) Lovelace. He d. before June 2, 1630.

Child. (2) — (g. 9).

A. Elizabeth, bur. Apr. 12, 1596, St. Alphage, Canterbury.

B. Margaret, m. 1619, Henry Coke.

g. Annie, bp. Dec. 6, 1567, bur. Aug. 20, 1568.

Child. by 2nd wife.

h. Jane, b. abt. 1570, bur. July 29, 1572.

i. Mabel, bp. Aug. 19, 1572, living in 1577 when she received in father's will a legacy of 200 pounds sterling and her mother's jewels. p. 189, vol. X — *Arch. Cont.* & p. 193 which pictures six Lovelace Shields from the windows of Hever Place & Great Chart Church.

Sir William Lovelace (g. 8), (7), (6), (5), Richard (4), John (3), (2), (1). b. 1561, bp. Sept. 30, 1561, St. Alphage, Canterbury, Eng. He was of Woolwich & Bethersden in Kent. Proprietor of Lovelace Place in Bethersden, which was his principal residence, but he spent his latter days in Canterbury. Admitted Grey Friars Inn, in 1580. Knighted, at Dublin, Ireland, on order of Queen Elizabeth, June 30, 1599, by Robert, Earl of Sussex & Lord Lieutenant of Ireland, for part he took in suppressing the Irish rebellion. Nov. 27, 1604, he was licensed to serve as a member of the Virginia Company of London & incorporater of the 3rd Virginia Charter in 1614. There is a painting of him in the Dulwich Gallery (no. 367 — panel 42" by 32") which was seen by compiler in 1927 when she toured Europe.

d. Oct. 11, bur. Oct. 12, 1629, in his 69th y. at "house of the Grey Friars, Bethersden, Canterbury." Will dated Oct. 6, 1629, proved Oct. 19, 1629, in local consistory court at Canterbury, by Ann, widow of Sir Wm. Lovelace the younger. His picturesque old house of the Grey Friars, built partly upon some graceful gothic arches over a stream,

and commanding a striking view of Canterbury Cathedral, was the place of his death.*

m. 1580/1, Elizabeth Aucher (133 gens. from Adam, see his chart which shows her ancestry, b. abt. 1565, dau. of Sir Edward & Mabell (Wrothe) Aucher, & sister of Sir Anthony Aucher, member of Council for the Virginia Co. Her first cousin, Jane Aucher, m. Sir Humphrey Gilbert, half brother of the famous Sir Walter Raleigh (35 generations descended from Charlemagne). The Auchers came into England with Wm. the Conqueror. The name is found in the roll of the Battle of Abby. It was variously written as Le Archer, or Archard. Robert, s. of Fulbert Archer, was tutor to Henry I, & recd. a grant of 7 manors in co. Berks. The elder branch, originally seated at Lizard (where the Aucher Hall still exists) became extinct by the marriage of Jane, dau. of Archard or Archer to James Levelis, time of Henry VI, p. 33, Vol. I, Burke, *Landed Gentry of Great Britain* (1879). Elizabeth above d. & was bur. Dec. 3, 1627 in Canterbury Cathedral. p. 205, Vol. X, *Arch. Cont.* show pictures of Grey Friars. Also p. 88, Vol. 28 — *Vir. Mag.*

Child. (3) — (g. 9)

1. Richard, b. abt. 1581, bp. Jan. 1, 1582, d. in youth, ae. abt. 20, bur. Oct. 24, 1602, in Canterbury Cathedral.

+2. Sir William, b. abt. 1583, bp. Feb. 12, 1583/4, m. abt. 1610, Anne Barne. He is mentioned in his father's will as only son.

3. Mabel, mentioned in father's will as only dau., b. 1584, bp. Dec. 26, 1584/5, St. Alphage, Canterbury.

*The substantial part of his personal property he had conveyed by indenture to Richard, Thomas & Wm. Lovelace; which indenture was confirmed in his will. He also mentioned Elizabeth Lovelace as his heir upon her attaining her 18th birthday. These were probably his grandchildren, (ch. of Sir Wm. the younger who had m. Ann Barne & d. shortly before his father). It appears that he must have visited Virginia or more probably his s. Sir William, as on Feb. 12, 1717, Capt. Argall was allowed bills for the transport of 24 persons to Virginia, including Sir William Lovelace, Sir Anthony Aucher & Mabell, Lady Collymore. p. 939, vol. 2 — Brown — *Genesis of the United States*.

Bur. July 7, 1627, Bethersden Church. m. at St. Thomas Apostle, London, Feb. 17, 1603/4, of St. Bride's, London, dau. of Knight of City of Canterbury, to Sir John Collymore, "mercier of St. Thomas Apostle, ae. 29, Knighted at the Tower, Mar. 14, 1604." He was b. abt. 1574, s. of James Collymore, merchant of St. Thomas, & bur. July 30, 1620, Canterbury Cathedral.

Child. (3) — Collymore — p. 158, Vol. XX, *Arc. Con. & Marriage Licenses*, London.

a. Robert, bur. Nov. 18, 1611, Canterbury Cathedral.

b. Mabel, only dau., living in 1629, d. unm. at Dr. Harde's House in 1668 & bur. Cant. Cath.

c. James, bp. May 21, 1609, Bethersden — living in 1629.

CHAPTER V — THE ANCESTORS OF ALL AMERICAN LOVELACE-LOVELESS FAMILIES

Sir William Lovelace (g. 9) (132 generations from Adam) (8), (7), (6), (5), Richard (4), John (3), (2), (1). b. abt. 1583, bp. Feb. 12, 1583, St. Alphage, Canterbury. Known as Sir Wm. Lovelace of Woolwich through wife's estate but called Sir Wm. Lovelace the younger in will. In May, 1609, he is referred to as Capt. Wm. Lovelace, member of the Virginia Co. — Knight of Bethersden-Kent, & direct ancestor of the Bethersden line & probably ancestor of all of the name or family who are to be found in America, today. Knighted at Theobald's in Eng. by James I, Sept. 20, 1609. Served in the Low Countries, i.e., the Netherlands. He was a member of Parliament for Canterbury in 1614.

His portrait is in the Dulwich Art Gallery, London (gal. No. 265, panel 25 x 21 inches). A copy thereof is shown on p. 176, *Vir. Mag.*, Vol. 28. This portrait is disappointing as he was said to be strikingly handsome. But an excellent copy of the portrait, in oil, is in the collections of Mr. Walter de C. Poultney of Baltimore, Md. who is prob. a desc. of Ann Sandys & 2nd hus., Edward Poultney.

d. Aug. 12, 1628, fighting for the Dutch Republic against Spain. Killed at the Siege of Groll, Holland, where he had served with Sir Horace Vere. England & Holland, as members of the Protestant Alliance, were then at war with Spain, & Lovelace fell only a few days before the stronghold of the Groll was recaptured by the allies from the Spaniards. He d. abt. a year before the death of his father in 1629, otherwise he would have succeeded as proprietor of Lovelace Place. His will, dated July 15, 1622 was proved Sept. 23, 1628 in Prerogative Court of Canterbury.

m. abt. or before 1610, gr. dau. of an Elizabethan Chief Baron of the Exchequer, Anne Barne(s), b. abt. 1587, youngest ch. of Sir Wm. Barne(s) & Anne Sandys. She was 128 gen. from Adam. See her ancestry & *Ancestral chart of Gov. Francis Lovelace*.

She was sister of Sir Wm. Barne of Woolwich & niece of George Sandys, poet, & Edwin Sandys, who induced James I to permit the Puritan fathers to settle in America. Her mother was Anne Sandys (b. June 21, 1570), who m. 2nd Edward Poulton (Poultner) (Poultney). Anne (Barne) Lovelace m. (2) Jan. 20, 1630, at Greenwich, Jonathan Brown, Phd. & L.L.D., by whom she had one child. She d. & her will was proved May 22, 1633, p. 79, Vol I, Burke — *Landed Gentry of Great Britain* — 1879. She left her husband guardian of all her children, together with her brother, Miles Barne. "Barne of Scotterley & Dunwich" says Sir Geo. Barne, Knight, was Lord Mayor of London in 1552, his s. & heir, Sir Geo. in 1586. He was succeeded by oldest s. Sir Wm. Barne, Knt. of Woolwich, Kent, who m. Anne, dau. of Dr. Edward Sandys, Archbishop of York. They had 6 sons & a dau. Ann.

Child. (8) — (g. 10) — p. 213, Vol. I, & p. 939, Vol. II, Brown's *Genesis of the United States*. Local parish registers of this period are not in existence so birthdates are only estimated.

+1. Anna (g. 10), b. shortly before 1611, m. 1628, Rev. John Gorsuch.

2. Richard (g. 10), eldest son, b. Dec. 6, 1617, poet & cavalier. b. at Woolwich, Kent (p. 178, Vol. 28 — *Virginia Magazine*). He became proprietor of Lovelace Place, Bethersden. Received M.A. Degree at Gloucester Hall, Oxford in 1636. Known as Sir Richard & Colonel Richard. He wrote several poems which commemorate the memory of his brother, Francis Lovelace. He sold Lovelace Place in 1649 to Richard Hever or Hulse. p. 183, Vol. 28 — *Vir. Mag.* This ended the connection of the Lovelace family with

Bethersden. As a Justice of Kent he presented to the House of Commons the well known Kentish Petition for the restoration of the King. For this, in April of 1642 he was committed to Gatehouse Prison in London where he wrote his most celebrated poem, i.e.

“Stone walls do not a prison make nor iron bars a cage
Minds innocent & quiet take that for an hermitage;
If I have freedom in my love and in my soul am free

Angels alone that soar above enjoy such liberty” etc. His fame as a poet rests largely upon the above lyric and “To Lucasta, Going to the Wars” which ends with “Yet this inconsistency is such as you too should adore; I could not love thee, dear, so much, loved I not honor more.” This poem was written during his service for the Revolutionary Cause & created a rumor that he had been killed at Dunkirk & thereafter his Lucasta married another. He was prominent in the court of Charles First. He d. Apr., 1658, unm. in London, bur. at St. Bride’s Church, near the body of his kinsman, Wm. Lovelace of Gray’s Inn. He was greatly impoverished by supplying his two brothers, Francis & William with money and arms for the King’s cause & furnishing his young brother Dudley “Posthumus” with means for the study of tactics & fortification in Holland. He was also very liberal to needy scholars & musicians & wounded soldiers. Called the handsomest man of his time. There is a rather poor picture of him in the Dulwich Gallery, London.

3. Thomas (g. 10), bpt. 1619. Referred to in his father’s will as “2nd son.” Went to Charterhouse School (Sutton’s Hospital), London. He was an active Royalist & came to America to escape the Civil War in England. He purchased a farm known as Lovelace Plantation on Staten Island which farm was inherited by his niece Mary (prob. Mary Hayne, dau. of Elizabeth Lovelace and Daniel Hayne),

wife of Ellis Duxbury of the Barbadoes & later of New York. He became very prominent in New York colonial affairs — with his brother Francis, Gov. of N. Y. as member of Governor's Council in 1671; alderman & sheriff of N. Y. City, same yr. Capt. of a Foot Company, Staten Island in 1672, Justice of N. Y. Patented land from the Crown, tract known as "The Globe" in 1674. Sheriff of Richmond, N. Y., 1684/5. When the Dutch captured N. Y., he & his brother Dudley were ordered to leave but Thomas obtained a stay of 6 months. Meanwhile the return of the British made it possible for him to remain on Staten Island. He d. 1689 & was survived by his wife Mary ?. He had one son, William, & probably other children. William was buried with great ceremony at Fort James in 1671. "The elaborate funeral of Mr. Wm. Lovelace in America, 1671," is recorded in the *Ashmolean Papers*, Bodleian Library, Oxford, Eng. Also described on p. 255, *Manor Houses & Homes of Long Island* 1928. He had sent for his niece, Mary & her husband Elias Duxberg, from the Barbadoes but he d. before they reached N. Y. They later settled in Richmond Co., N. Y. *N. Y. Gen. & Biog. Rec.*, July, 1920.

Among the Egerton Mss. in the British Museum (no. 25531, folio 503) is a letter from Charles I to the Governor of Sutton's Hospital, London, later known as Charterhouse School, apparently written in 1628, endorsed "for one of Sir Wm. Lovelace's Sons" directing that the Lord Bishop of Canterbury bestow a "prize place" upon Thomas Lovelace in recognition of his father's war service.

+4. Col. & Gov. Francis (g. 10), b. 1620, "3rd son," m. Blanche Talbot.

5. Joanna or Joan (g. 10), b. after July 15, 1622 when named in father's will as "child born to me." She was appointed administratrix May 10, 1686 of bro. Dudley's estate & to succeed said Dudley as administratrix of Bro. Francis. (*Prerogative Court of Canterbury — Administration Acct. Bk. 1686 & fol. 76d*) d. & bur. St. Catherine's

Church, near the Tower, with husband & 2 of her daus. She m. Robert Ceasar, s. of William in Herlfordature, who was living in 1686, & was 2nd s. of Sir John Ceasar, Knight & gr. s. of the famous master of the rolls, Sir Julius Ceasar.

Child. (3) — Ceasar (g. 11).

Anne, m. Sir John Poyntz of Iron Acton, Gloucester. She d. June 23, 1739 & was buried in church of St. Catherine near Tower of London.

Julianna, m. Thos. Sage of Butley, Sussex.

Johanna, m. John Rampayne. She d. Dec. 15, 1694, in childbirth. Their uncle, Richard Lovelace wrote *Priss's Second Judgment* of these 3 girls.

6. William (g. 10), b. abt. 1624, named in mother's but not father's will as it was written in 1622. He came to Vir. abt. 1644. He was a professional soldier & had served under his brother Richard at the siege of Carmerthan Castle, Wales, & elsewhere. He is probably the Sir Wm. Lovelace whose will was probated July 23, 1648. No record of his marriage has been found but it is probable that he had the following children & perhaps others, i.e. — a. John (g. 11), b.? (since John Lovelace, Gov. of N. Y., is erroneously called nephew by Gov. Francis Lovelace. But Gov. John Lovelace was really of the Hurley Lovelace line, i.e.—Gov. John (g. 10), Wm. (9), Francis (8), Richard (7), (6), John (5), Richard (4), as above. Hence we conclude Gov. Francis did have a nephew by the name of John.) b. Wm. Lovelace (g. 11) transported to Annapolis, Md., in 1664 Liber 6 (8) folio 294 Md. Records. c. Francis Lovelace (g. 11) of Baltimore Co., Md., who was of the Bethersden line. Some records erroneously confuse him with Gov. Francis. But he was b. 1644. His will is recorded at Baltimore, dated Mar. 3, 1683, & proved May 19, 1684, indicating that he d. in America abt. the same time as Gov. Francis d. in Eng. In this will he bequeaths property to Matthew Wood's youngest dau., Mary Woods; to cousins Ann Jones, David Jones, Miles Gibson, Sarah Gibson & Ann Gibson. To Charles Gorsuch

he gives his soward. All of these appear to be descendants of Alice (Lovelace) Gorsuch. Family records indicate that he had at least one child, i.e., A — Wm. Lovelace (g. 12), who m. a dau. of Beal. & was the father of +John Baptist Lovelace (g. 13), ancestor of an extensive southern family of the name.

7. Elizabeth (g. 10), b. abt. 1626. m. Mar. 23, 1664, Daniel Hayne of Waltington's Parish, Kintbury Eaton, co. Berkshire, s. of Thomas Hayne of Auborne, Wilts. & wife Katherine Gorsuch (sister of Rev. John Gorsuch, who m. Ann Lovelace). Hence he was a nephew of Rev. John & their ch. were double cousins. He was b. abt. 1624 as ae. 37 at time of marriage. Will dated Apr. 3, 1663, proved May 11, 1687.

Child. (8) (g. 11) — Hayne — mentioned in will.

Daniel, b. abt. 1665, to go to Oxford; —John, also to go to Oxford; —Thomas, to be sent to Cambridge to study law at the Inns of the Court; —Ann; —Katherine; —Elizabeth; —Francis and Mary, who m. Prof. Ellis Duxbury.

8. Capt. Dudley (g. 10), b. after Aug. 12, 1627, date of his father's death, as he was known as "posthumus." d. before May 10, 1686, at Newington, Butts, co. Surrey, Eng., when administration of his estate was granted to his sister, Joan Ceasar. Account on his estate mentions "Mary Lovelace the relict, remaining." He was furnished money by bro. Richard to study tactics & fortification in Holland. An ardent royalist. Captain in bro. Richard's regiment under Louis XIV. With Charles II during his exile. In New York in 1670, with bro. Gov. Francis Lovelace. Commissioner to grant lands at Hurley in Ulster Co. One of the officers at Fort James, N. Y., when it capitulated to the Dutch & he was taken away on a Dutch ship to Fayal & sent back to Europe. Owned a plantation on Staten Island adjoining the plantations of his brothers, Francis & Thomas. In 1659 he published a 2nd collection of his bro. Richard's poems as "Lucasta." "Posthumus Poems of Richard Lovelace Esq." —London — 1679. In 1667 he with bro. Francis was to

have been a lieutenant in a regiment to be raised. Dec. 22, 1675, he was placed in control of bro. Francis' property in Eng. He had a dau. who d. unm. & was bur. Mar. 23, 1678, at St. Margaret's, Canterbury. Also prob. a s., Dudley, b. abt. 1643 as ae. 35 at marriage on April 20, 1678, to Mary Lovelace (g. 9), who was b. abt. 1608, dau. of Will Lovelace (g. 8), Henry (7), John (6), Wm. (5), Richard (4), John (3), (2), (1), and Susan Philpott. He prob. had other children.

CHAPTER I — SOME CHILDREN OF SIR WILLIAM AND ANNE BARNE LOVELACE, OR LOUELACE, OF KENT

Ann Lovelace (g. 10), William (9), (8), (7), (6), (5), Richard (4), John (3), (1), (1), b. shortly before 1611, i.e., after Aug. 3, 1610. She inherited holdings in the East India Company from her father. d. 1657, in Virginia, presumably near West River, Maryland, where she & six of her children had settled in 1650, after the death of her husband.

“The numerous connections between the Lovelace Family & various persons prominent in the early settlement of Virginia would seem to be sufficient reason why Ann selected Virginia as the place where her younger children should cast their fortunes. Both political & religious difficulties were at their height in Eng. & her husband, Rector John Gorsuch, an aggressive Loyalist, suffered persecution & death because of his favorable views toward the King.” *Vir. Mag.*, p. 327 — *Visitations of London — 1633-4-5 Haleian Soc. Pub.*, shows Gorsuch ancestry & Coats of Arms.

m. 1628, Rev. John Gorsuch, D.D. (b. ? s. of Daniel or Dengell & Alice (Hall) Gorsuch). He was rector of Walkern, Kent. In 1633 he was rector of Walkholme, Herefordshire.

Daniel Gorsuch was a London merchant. Alderman's deputy, Bishop Gates Ward, in 1633. His wife, Alice Hall, was the dau. of John Hall of Lind. Daniel was son of Wm. Gorsuch & Alice Hillson, descended out of Lancashire from Gorsuch or Armschurch.

Child. (11), (g. 11) — Gorsuch. They were double cousins of the ch. of Elizabeth Lovelace & Daniel Hayne,

whose mother was Katherine (Gorsuch) Hayne, sister of Rev. John Gorsuch. From them has descended a considerable line of prominent citizens of Britain & America.

1. Daniel, b. abt. 1629. Letters of administration were issued to him in Eng. June 2, 1652, on estate of his father & referring to him & mother as late of Weston, Va. But he remained in Eng. & was living there in 1662, when he was known to have one child — Ann.

Wm., Jr., of Pyanketank River, Middlesex, d. 1676/7, unm. Will dated July, 1676, & proved July 23, 1677. Wm. Whitby, Sr., d. abt. Oct. 9, 1655.

5. Robert, bp. Nov. 19, 1635, Walkern, came to Va. d. betw. 1714 & 1720, as will dated June 25, 1714 & probated June 14, 1720. It mentions 3 ch., Daniel, Robert & Dorothy & 2nd wife, Johanna, who d. 1728. His first wife had been murdered by Indians Apr. 11, 1661.

6. Richard, bp. Apr. 19, 1637, Walkern. He went to New York State with uncle, Gov. Francis Lovelace. d. intestate. Estate administered Apr. 4, 1677, by his widow, Elizabeth, whom he had married Nov. 12, 1664, & by whom he had 6 Gorsuch ch. She was Elizabeth Roe, dau. of Edward Roe, of Talbot co., Va., who left legacies to these Gorsuch ch. before Sept. 23, 1678.

7. Ann, b. 1639. d. before Sept. 2, 1702, when her 3rd husband remarried. m. (1) abt. 1655, Capt. Thomas Todd, of Toddsbury, Ware Parish, Gloucester Co., Va. He had come from Eng. in 1637. Settled in Baltimore, Bath Co., Md., in 1664. Burgess from Balt. in 1674/5 (b. 1625, d. 1676 on voyage to Eng. & bur. at sea). Will probated May 30, 1677. s. of Robert Todd (b. 1602), of York, Eng. m. (2) Jan. 16, 1678, Capt. David Jones. (Gave his name to Jones Falls.) His plantation was on site of present city of Baltimore, Md. Will dated Feb. 3, 1686, & prob. Feb. 21, 1686/7. m. (3) Capt. John Oldton, who m. 2nd, Sept. 2, 1702, Mary, widow of Francis Watkins. He was owner of a large tract of land on North side of Spring Valley. Will dated May 4, 1709, & prob. June 30, 1709. 11 or more Todd children & prob. other ch. p. 306 — *Colonial Families, etc.*, continues Todd descendants, also Lovelace Coat of Arms. p. 95, *Peckham Gen.* — Todd Chart. Vol. 26, p. 89, Todd ancestry.

CHAPTER II — GOVERNOR FRANCIS LOVELACE OF NEW YORK STATE AND SOME OF HIS DESCENDANTS

Col. and Gov. Francis Lovelace (g. 10), Sir William (9), (8), (7), (6), (5), Richard (4), b. abt. 1621. He inherited jointly with brother William lands in Shoulden, Kent. He was a court favorite and page to Charles I, who reigned 1625 to 1649; imprisoned in the Tower of London by Richard Cromwell as an active Stuart partisan, but after the restoration Charles II (who reigned 1660 to 1685), made him Court Attendant for his loyalty to the Tory cause during the Puritan Revolution. He served the Royalist cause in Wales and commanded Caermarthen Castle from June, 1644, until it was captured by Langborne in Oct., 1645.

He came to Virginia in 1650.* In May, 1652, he was sent by Gov. Berkley of Virginia to inform Charles II of the surrender of Virginia to the Parliamentary forces. In 1667 he succeeded Col. Richard Nicholas as Gov. of New York. His task was to bring the Dutch quietly under English authority. He fostered social relations between the Dutch and English settlers; bought land from the Indians; opened the Boston Post Road and established the first mail routes to Boston and Philadelphia. He lived in Newcastle, N. Y., his home standing there until the 19th century. He had visited Long Island in Oliver Cromwell's time, and before becoming Governor of New York had been sheriff of Richmond County and on Staten Island. Apr. 3, 1670, he received a deed of Staten Island from the Indians. (p. 255, *Manor Houses and Homes of Long Island*, 1928.) In 1671 he

*"Francis Lovelace, Gov. of N. Y., was long believed to be identical with the 2nd son of Richard, first Baron Lovelace of Huxley; but recently it has been ascertained that he was really the same Royalist Officer who came to Virginia during the Civil wars in Eng." p. 228, Vol. 17, 1919, *Virginia Magazine*.

bought a farm of Anneke Jenö and his heirs, which was confiscated in 1674 by the Duke of York. Jan. 21, 1671, Gov. Lovelace granted 3,000 acres on Cedar Creek, Sussex Co., Delaware, to Richard Perrott. He was absent on business in Long Island when the Dutch fleet anchored Aug. 7, 1673, opposite Staten Island, and Fort James surrendered.

He died May 10, 1683 or 1686, at Woodstock, Oxfordshire, England. Some records say unmarried, because his brother Dudley succeeded to his English estates. But in America he had married secretly, when about 38 yrs. of age, and was later forced or persuaded to leave his wife.

m. 1659, Blanche Talbot. Although her exact birth date and parentage not found, she was probably of the Talbot line shown in *Ancestry of Peter Talbot* and could have been sister of Richard Talbot, of West River, Maryland. In those days of extreme class feeling it is likely she was opposed by the Lovelace family as not being as closely associated with royalty as themselves.

Child.

1. Edward (11), b. abt. 1662. d., killed in battle in 1714. He was a Naval Lieutenant. He had a son, John (12) Lovelace, who came to America in 1715 with his uncle of the same name. They settled in Dutchess Co., N. Y., where the family owned large tracts of land. The 63 acres of the Jumel estate, a portion of which now belongs to Trinity Church, originally belonged to John Lovelace and was deeded by John Lovelace in 1715 to the Trinity Church Corporation. (We have had many inquiries from Lovelace descendants seeking to prove a financial right in this property through inheritance.) Had son, John Lovelace (13), d. 1803, Syracuse, N. Y.

2. John (11), came to America in 1715. He or John (12), above, had a son, Francis Wentworth, who was killed at Ticonderoga.

Another Francis Lovelace (9) (1594-1664), was son of

Launcelot (8), Henry (7), John (6), William (5), Richard (4), John (3), (2), (1).

Rachael Van Hook. He was probably the son who went from New York State to Kentucky and a small hamlet was named after him in that state; Jeremiah Loveless (g. 13), Revolutionary soldier of Johnstown, New York; and Joseph Loveless (g. 13), who was a baker in the Revolutionary War and m. Mary?. We note that all of these who fought with the colonists had changed the spelling of the name to Loveless as result of the political antagonisms of the day.

and Joshua Loveless, while Albany Co., Militia, 14th Reg. Col. John Knickerbocker, lists Benjamin, Elisha, John and Jeremiah Loveless.

John Lovelace (13), John (12), Edward (11), Gov. Francis (10), Wm. (9), etc. He d. in 1803 and was bur. at Syracuse, N. Y.

His children were John (14) b. 1760, d. 1835; a daughter who married a Williams, who was one of the captors of Major Andre at the time of the attempted surrender of West Point by Benedict Arnold; George Loveless (14) who m. Rhuma ?.

Rensselaer Co., *New York census of 1800*, mentions Joseph and George Loveless. Albany Co., N. Y., *Census of 1790*, mentions George, John, Jeremiah, and Joseph, Jr.

John Lovelace (14), John (13), (12), Edward (11), Gov. Francis (10). b. 1760, Circa, N. Y. d. 1835 and buried Syracuse, N. Y.

His probable children were George (g. 15), who came to Warren, Ohio, May, 1800, and was father of George Loveless, b. 1802, Warren, Ohio; John (g. 15), m. Eliza Holden. (She was a singer of note.) For generations Clarks Hill, Indiana has been a center of Loveless Families, all of whom appear to be descendants of John and Rachael (Van Hook) Loveless. Quite recently they had family reunions, yet our persistent inquiries have brought no response except from Ora L. Loveless and his letters gave traditional rather than genealogical information.

July 2, 1824, Samuel T. Loveless, Box 374, Albernathy, Texas, wrote Ora L. Loveless that he had 2 bros. & 2 sisters living, one brother in Alabama and one in Oklahoma. His father was Rev. Benjamin Franklin Loveless, a Baptist Minister, b. in Georgia, removed to Texas, d. abt. "30 yrs. ago"

or 1894. Benj. Franklin had 2 bros. — Abe of Georgia and Jacob who went to California.

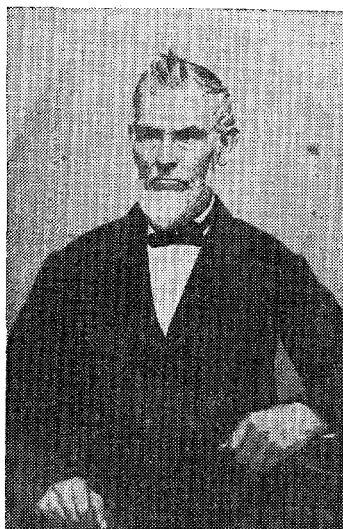

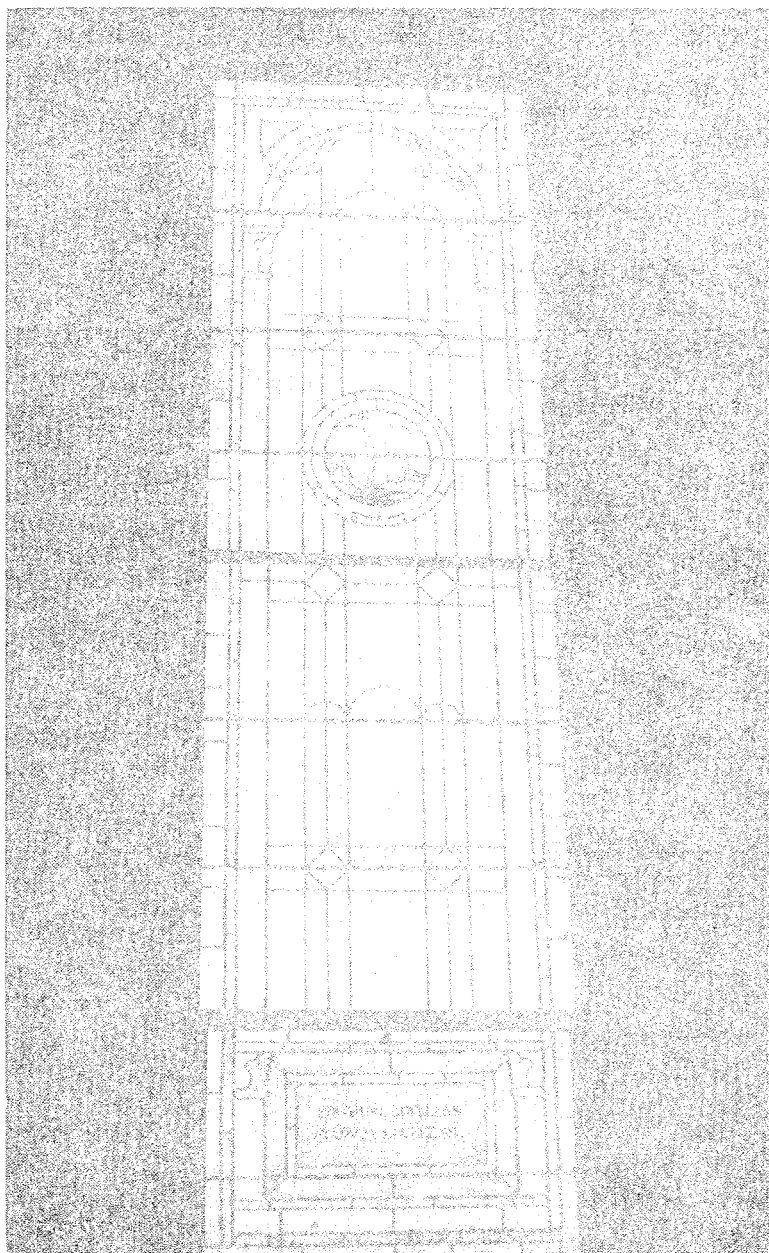

The Lovelace House was the scene of many important and dramatic events in the History of the British Empire.

In the crypt were held the secret meetings of the plotters who invited William of Orange to become King of England. A sister of Edward the Confessor is buried nearby. In 1932, Col. C. N. Rivers-Moore, distinguished English Archaeologist, was seeking early relics there.

CHAPTER II—LOVELACE, LOVELESS—MISCELLANEOUS AMERICAN RECORDS

Unlike the unplaced records of most families which are hopelessly indefinite, these have been proved by many years research and a long process of elimination, to have all descended from the one main Lovelace line — i.e., the children of Sir William Lovelace, of the Virginia Company, who m. Ann Barne. Although any record of a few of the earlier and intermediate generations in America of these families are not found, there is ample proof in both English and American lists of the period that no others of the Lovelace-Loveless name ever came to America. Hence all are of the main descent, as shown in this book.

Sir William Lovelace was of the 9th generation in descent from the first known Lovelace and of the 132nd generation from Adam.

Isaac Loveless. Probably he was the Isaac Loveless who left Maryland & moved to the Carolinas, where his name appears in Union Co. Census of 1830.

“He with family & slaves moved from near Cassville, Barton Co., Georgia, to Chattanooga Co., 2 miles from Summerville, abt. 1853. He & adult sons were good farmers, bo’t land & kept adding to it until they were of the richest men in Chattanooga Co. But at the surrender they were stripped of all stock, foodstuff, & slaves. But one of the faithful slaves hid the personal saddle horse of Tempy, dau. of Burlingame Loveless, with which they started anew.” (Mrs. W. W. Crawford, Cedartown, Ga., 1936; 1483 Boulevard, N.E., in 1937.)

The names and locations indicate he was a descendant of John Baptist Lovelace, or assuredly of the same general Lovelace-Loveless line, but exact recorded proof not found. He probably was one of the colonists who for political reasons changed their name from Lovelace to Loveless during the Revolutionary period.
