THE GENEALOGICAL HISTORY OF THE LANGLITZ FAMILY

The attached record represents the history of the Langlitz family starting in Germany with the marriage of Christian Langlitz Senior and his wife Katherine.

There are some facts that are not complete, where there has so far been no record located, however, a further effort is being made to find the missing data, and it will be completed and forwarded to you, if and when it is secured.

On the surface, this record does not seem too complex, however, close analysis will show that there had to be a tremendous amount of preparation before actual search could be made of family, church and county records. After the records that were available were perused, then the organization and piecing together of the facts that were available followed. Small fragments of information that seemed very minute, and even not worth mentioning sometimes were a clue to an important discovery, and with even so much as a small clue, a very interesting and sometimes important fact could be developed.

Many years ago, it was a family practice to keep a "Family Record", mostly kept in a place provided for it in the family bible. During the past several years that practice has been done away with, and except for the records kept by a very few of the relatives, memory and search had to be relied on to establish facts. It is hoped that this record will become a permanent one in every family, and the only request from the writer is that each adult will send the writer periodically a report of vital occurrences that have happened. All that would be required would be the mailing of a post card giving the date and place of the event, and the name or names of the individuals involved. Could your co-operation be depended upon to this extent?

Credit for information and help in locating vital statistics go to the following people: Hilda Zapf (who furnished most of the framework) Eloise Langlitz Stockard, Mary Langlitz Martin, Lena Langlitz Birnbaum, Dora Langlitz Engel, Kate Elssesser and Kate Langlitz Auhl.

At certain intervals, supplements will be sent out to indicate the events that have taken place since the publishing of this issue, in addition to completing missing information that is not complete on the present record. In the event that there are too many corrections and additions through the years, it is hoped that at some later date, a new form will be published incorporating all the changes. This publication has been rather expensive, both from time involved and the actual outlay of cash. Please preserve your copy to the best of your ability.

Please leave your address, or that of those that you know that are not in attendance at this reunion, so that future supplements can be properly delivered. Also notify the writer when a change in address occurs.

All that is asked of you is that you take care of your copy and report future events, and if possible appreciate the effort that has been extended in the preparation of this publication.

This report has been prepared in accordance with the form advocated by genealogists, and you will notice that each birth recorded carries a Roman numeral, and where there is a future event that occurs to any individual other than a death, a cardinal number precedes the Roman numeral. By using this method it is easy to trace the previous ancestry or future happenings of each individual. In the future if there is a cardinal numerical designation needed where there is not at present a number given, that individual will be assigned a number, in proper

with a letter suffix after it, for example, 43 (a), etc. The most recent generation have all received a cardinal number. May we hope and pray that they carry on.

At present writing, my son, John Owen Langlitz is the only known member of the family that will carry on the name of Langlitz. "Jack" of course is too young to appreciate this signal honor, however, he will be made aware of his responsibilities in due course.

At the present writing there have been a total of 146 births recorded. We know that there are more to follow.

THE DESCENDANTS OF CHRISTIAN AND KATHERINA LANGLITZ
First Generation

1. Christian Langlitz born February 4, 1822 and Katherina April Langlitz his wife, born September 19, 1822 were married in Germany. They are believed to have immigrated to the United States about 1867, lived for a time in Pennsylvania and then settled in the vicinity of Mendota, LaSalle County, Illinois.

They moved to Marysville, Kansas, about the year 1880, with their sons Henry and Christian and their families (it is possible also that their daughter, Katherine also moved there with them). John stayed in Mendota, Illinois.

In later life Christian Senior went to live with his son, Christian Junior, while his wife Katherina lived with her daughter Katherine.

Christian Senior was a tailor by trade. He died September 19, 1898. The date and place of death of Katherina are not known. Both Christian Senior and his wife are buried in Marysville, Kansas.

Because of the large separation in the births of their children, it is possible that there were other children born to the marriage of Christian and Katherina Langlitz, however, if there were, they died as infants and there is no record of them.

Records submitted to the writer, the place where the elder Langlitz family lived in Germany was referred to as Hessen Darmstadt. An acquaintance who lived at Frankfurt, less than thirty miles from Darmstadt, tells me that formerly the state was given previous to the city (for example, Illinois, Mendota), however, in recent years they have changed their terminology and now refer to the location as Darmstadt, Hessen, Germany, the same as we would say Mendota, Illinois, USA.

Darmstadt is a large city that contains a considerable amount of cultural background, and is known as an artistic and musical center. The city contains the largest chemical works in Germany and a medical supply house similar to Merck in this country. Darmstadt was known as a military training center of great importance to the state, and it gained such importance in a military way that a song was written about the soldiers in Hessen Darmstadt. During the last war it was severely damaged by bombs and fire, for because of the important chemical plants there, it was the target on many bombing raids.

2. John Langlitz was married the first time to Elizabeth Kirchner on November 10, 1867, at Mendota, Illinois. The ceremony was performed by Johann Hickie, a minister.

There were four children born to this marriage, and three of them were either born dead, or died as small infants, for there is no record of their sex, or birth and death dates.

Elizabeth (Kirchner) Langlitz died at Mendota, Illinois 1872 and is buried in the Brooklyn Lutheran Cemetery.

2. John Langlitz was married the second time to Anna Marie Kehn on July 29, 1873, at Mendota, Illinois, with Charles A. Rutherford, a minister, performing the ceremony. They lived to celebrate their fiftieth wedding anniversary at a well planned celebration, with many children, grand-children and great-grand-children attending, along with many friends.

John Langlitz died on October 5, 1925 at Mendota, Illinois, at the age of 51 years, 8 months and 9 days.

Anna Marie (Kehn) Langlitz was born May 18, 1834 at Wolferborn, Germany, the daughter of Elizabeth (Schlengel) and Peter Kehn. She died at Mendota, Illinois on August 4, 1937 at the age of 83 years, 8 months and 17 days.

3. Henry Langlitz and Julia Ebrecht were married June 9, 1872 at Mendota, Illinois. The ceremony was performed by Charles A. Rutherford, a minister.

Julia (Ebrecht) Langlitz was born in Hanover, Germany in 1842.

The family lived in Mendota where six of their seven children were born, and then moved to Marysville, Kansas, about 1884 where the seventh child was born.

Henry Langlitz died at Marysville, Kansas on July 29, 1895, and is buried there.

Julia (Ebrecht) Langlitz died at Grand Island, Nebraska on March 18, 1922, and is buried at Marysville, Kansas.

4. Christian Langlitz, Jr. and Mathilda Wecker were married at Mendota, Illinois on September 20, 1874.

According to family bible records, Christian Jr. came to America and settled in Mendota, Illinois on June 21, 1870. He and his family moved to Marysville, Kansas about 1870 and later removed to Salina, Kansas and then returned to Marysville. Once again they removed to Salina, and after a few years the family followed Lena Langlitz to Kansas City, Missouri. After Emma Langlitz's marriage, her husband was transferred to Seattle, Washington to work in the shipyards, and after the war went to work for the University of Washington as custodian of their large rose gardens. He was a marble carver and roller by trade, however, in his declining years such employment was too strenuous, so he had to resort to other things. For about five years previous to his death in 1932 he was completely paralyzed and bedridden.

Christian Langlitz Jr. died February 15, 1932 and Mathilda (Wecker) Langlitz died February 20, 1932. Both died at Seattle, Washington in the home of Lena (Langlitz) Birnbauer.

Because of a lung condition, Henry and his family moved to Wisconsin where they established themselves in what was at that time a primitive wilderness, and succeeded in forging ahead to the end that the Langlitz family in Wisconsin is now recognized as one of its solid roots. Henry Langlitz died at Mendota, Illinois November 3, 1935, and Christine, his wife, died January 19, 1949, at Mendota. Both are buried there.
