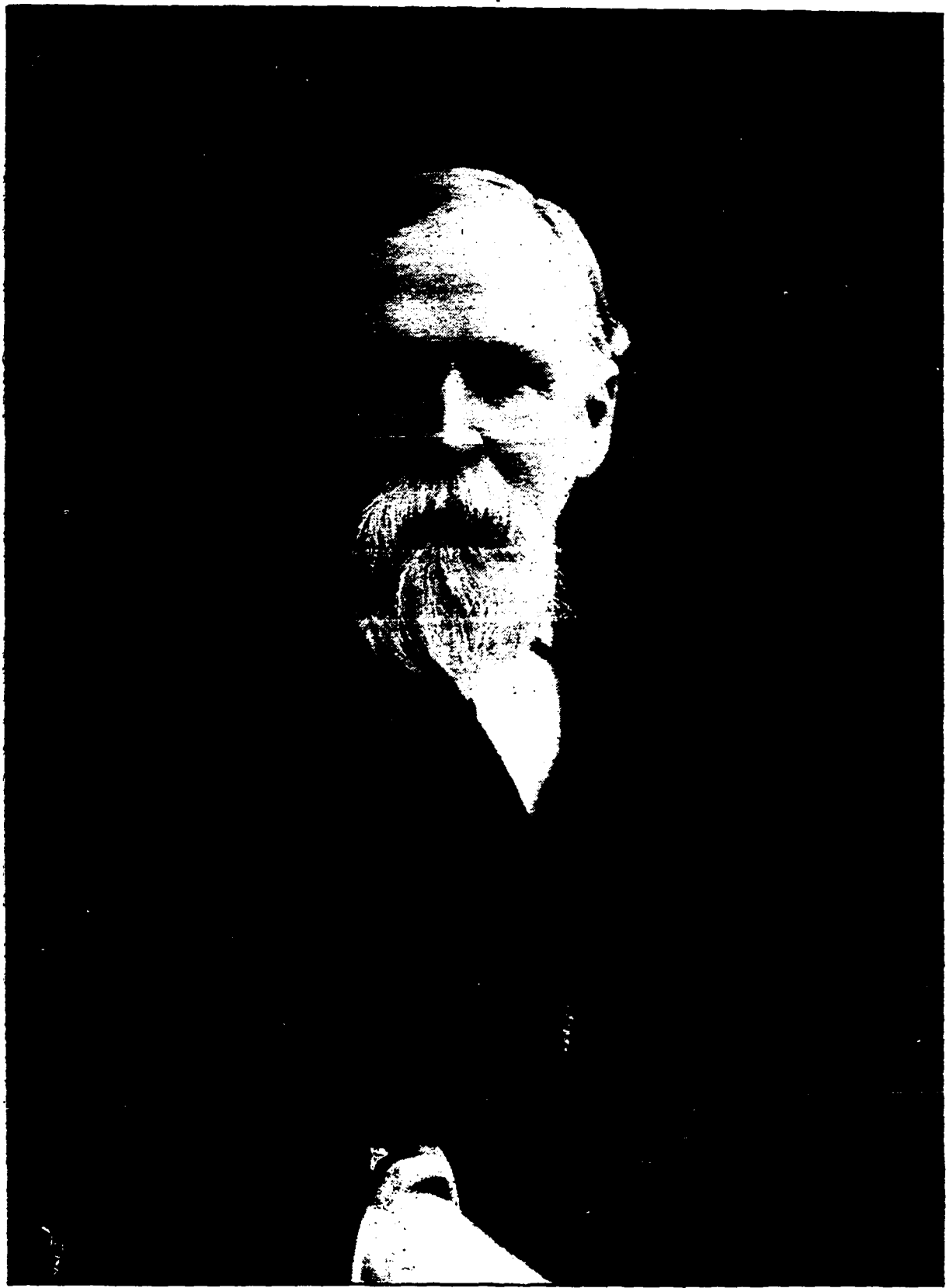

Preface.

In 1900, I printed a pamphlet giving the record of three generations of the descendants of Andrew Moore of Poquonock, Conn. In that publication I promised to print the records of his descendants if it proved possible to obtain them. This book is published in fulfillment of that promise.

I have not accomplished all that I hoped, but I comfort myself with the reflection that the fault is not all mine. Of some of the families it was impossible to get a trace. In some members of the family it was not possible to awake sufficient interest in the work to induce them to furnish their records.

It is very probable that mistakes will be found, but the records of the later generations are in writing furnished by the several families and ought to be accurate.

It is hoped that those who are interested will save all new matter which they are able to obtain, that some later genealogist will be able to make a complete record of the family.

It remains to express my obligations, which are infinite, to the people who have assisted in procuring the records for this work, together with some of the Genealogies drawn upon. Stiles' *Ancient Windsor, Connecticut*, has been indispensable. *The Goodwins of Hartford, Conn.*; *George Hayes of Windsor and His Descendants*, and *The Higleys and Their Ancestry*, are here credited with much valuable matter. The Leonard and Cushman Genealogies have furnished the records of those families.

Mrs. O. A. Moore, of Westfield, Mass., and Comodore John W. Moore, of Brooklyn, N. Y., have been indefatigable in their search for records. V. D. Allen, of Columbus, Ohio, and Mrs. H. O. Moore, of Rutland, Vt., Wm. A. Moore, of Hartford, Conn., and many others, should be remembered by the family for the work they have done in preserving its records. Miss Mary L. Whitman, genealogist, of Hartford, Conn., is painstaking and reliable in all that she does.

"So! now 'tis ended, like an old wife's story."

I hope the family will take as much pleasure in completing the records as I have in gathering those contained in this book.

Andrew Moore and his Descendants.

1. The first mention, yet discovered, of ANDREW MOORE, of Poquonnock, Conn., is the record of his marriage, which is as follows: "ANDREW MOORE & Sara Phelpes yt was Dafter of samuell Phelpes ware married by capten Newberry, february. 15. 1671."¹ **Samuel Phelps** was the son of William, the immigrant, who came to Dorchester, Mass., in 1630, and thence to Windsor, Conn., in 1636. He married Sarah (dau. of Edward) Griswold Nov. 10, 1650, and "Sarah Phelps was born in March, the latter end of 1653." (*Windsor Town Record.*) The Phelps family came from Tewkesbury, England, on the ship *Mary and John*. Sarah Griswold, b. Kenilworth, England, in 1628, came to America with her father in 1639. They settled in Windsor, Conn.

In 1673, 34 members of the church of Windsor, called the new church, signed a paper which Gov. Winthrop endorsed, "Windsor men of the new church, complaint in Winter, 1673." (See Stiles' *Ancient Windsor*, Vol. I, p. 206.) In 1675 Matthew Grant paid Andrew Moore £1, 17s, on "warr account." This must have been for services during the destruction of Simsbury by the Indians. Jan. 23, 1674, the town, by Matthew Grant, paid Andrew Moore, Nathaniel Pinney and Joseph Griswold for making a new ferry boat. They were paid £3, 6s., 8d., in barter, and it seems, too, that the tax levy was assigned before collection in the payment of debts, "In the good old colony times." Here is Andrew's share in payment of the ferry boat account:

August 24, 1678, Andrew Moore and 34 others were sued by James Cornish for a school bill of £0—5—2. His oldest child,

¹NOTE.—Savage says "married Sarah Phelps, perhaps dau. of William," and he married Sarah the dau. of Samuel to John Mansfield. Stiles had discovered the record of Andrew's marriage to Sarah the dau. of Samuel, and then deliberately assassinated Andrew in 1680, and married his widow to John Mansfield in 1683. We object;—still John Mansfield married Sarah Phelps. It is suggested that the Sarah he married was Sarah dau. of Humphrey and Mary (Hull) Pinney, born, Windsor, Conn., Nov. 19, and baptized Dec. 3, 1648, who married William Phelps Dec. 20, 1676. He died Feb. 17, 1681, leaving his widow Sarah Phelps, then 33 years of age. Here is a Sarah Phelps who perhaps married John Mansfield in 1683. The record of the marriage is as follows: "John Mansfield and Sarah Phelps were married Dec. 13th —." The date preceding this entry is Apr. 14, 1668, and the first date following is April 5, 1678. (*Windsor Records*, Vols. I and II.)

Sarah, was then but 6 years of age. It would seem that Andrew was a little slack in educational matters. Dec. 20, 1680, he was paid by the town for labor on the church. He had a grant of land at Salmon Brook, now Granby, Conn., in 1680, in which he is called "Andrew Moore the carpenter, of Windsor, Conn."

Major John Talcott, who had agreed to extinguish the Indian title to Simsbury for 300 acres of land, gives a gloomy account of this, at that time, western country. He says that he "can find no place where any thing considerable can be taken up, the most of that which some call meadow is full of small brush and vines through which is no passing, or full of trees great and small, and in ye place where the best land of that sort is, there is no accomodation of upland to it saving only mighty tall mountaynes and Rockes and the way bad to it, and a great way to all of it, and will be dismally obscure and solitary to any that shall live upon it, and very hard coming at the market, not only because of the remoteness but badness of the passage, and the society of the neighborhood will be very thin, all which will be discouraging."

At a later date Andrew bought land of John Gozard on the "east side of the mountains bounded easterly by Simsbury easterly bounds, southerly by John Pettybone, his lot, (allias Jonathan Moore, his lot) the bredth of s'd lot westerly by the commons is fifty rods." March 29, 1715, Andrew Moore of Windsor, deeded to his son Benjamin Moore "for divers good causes and considerations me thereunto moving, but especially in consideration of my fatherly love and affection I have to my son Benjamin Moore," fifty acres of land in Turkey Hills, now East Granby. In the description of this land Andrew mentions his son William.

Andrew Moore lived in Windsor, where the birth of all his children is recorded except that of William, and died Nov. 29, 1719. The inventory of his estate was made on the 17th of December following, amounting to £320, and his widow, Sarah, was appointed administratrix. He had 15 acres of land in Windsor with house and barn, carpenter's tools, with farming implements, a cider mill, loom, spinning wheel, sword and belt and a library "prised at 8 shillings," besides two pieces of land in Simsbury. The distribution of the estate took place April 5, 1720, and each of his nine children took his share of the property after the widow's portion had been set off to her.

2. SARAH MOORE, b. December 6, 1672, married **Thomas Winchell** April 26, 1690, at Windsor. He was the grandson of Robert Winchell the immigrant, and died in August 1697. His widow was appointed administratrix of the estate. July 18, 1700, **Benjamin Winchell** of Suffield, Conn., married Widow Sarah Winchell. It is probable that this was the widow of Thomas. The will of Nathaniel Winchell, father of Thomas, says Thomas left four children, and the distribution of Nathaniel's estate, July 12, 1701, gives to the children of Thomas, land, and "an oald sword," value £7, 8s., 7d. February 6, 1724, Sarah Winchell "of the town of Hanover and county of Huntington and Colony of New York," sold her share in her father's estate to her brother Benjamin Moore.

Sarah (Moore) Winchell had ten children.

3. ANDREW MOORE, b. Feb. 15, 1674, m. **Mary**, the dau. of George **Sanders**, (Ens.) the immigrant. George Sanders was married three times. The name of the first wife is not known. He m. 2d Mehitabel, dau. of John Bartlett of Windsor, and 3d Abigail, dau. of Dea. John Moore and widow of Thomas Bissell. It is probable that Mary was the dau. of the first wife. May 20, 1736, Andrew and Mary Moore sold to George Cradock of Boston, for £12, 10 s., all their land at Copper Hill, "especially that right that descended to us from our father, George Sanders, long since deceased." He d. Dec. 5, 1697.

Andrew Moore was made freeman of Simsbury Feb. 7, 1703. Vol. 4, p. 162, *Simsbury Land Records*, has the following entry: "23d day of Dec., 1720, Whereas Andrew Moore of Simsbury,

since Sept. 10, 1717, hath entered and well improved two Intire parcels of Town Common in Simsbury on the east side of the river * * * by virtue of a town Grant, therefore we, Lieut. John petty: bone, Joseph Case Sen. and Samuel Humphries being comitte have for euer Quitt claimed the title the town had to these lands to the said Andrew." Jan. 17, 1720, he sold land to Jonathan Moore.

Andrew Moore made his will May 7, 1752, died May 18, 1752, in Wintonbury, at the home of his dau. Lois, and the property was distributed Aug. 28, 1752. In his will he speaks of himself as of Simsbury, residing now in Wintonbury, and of "having arrived at a great age." The appraisers say he has "In proclama-tion money as followith," £5, 16s. He had a house and barn, orchard, one piece of land in the Marsh of 20 acres and one on the Hill of 5 acres besides household goods, clothing, etc. The estate amounted to about £120, and was given to his dau. Lois Hoskins, dau. Sarah and the heirs of his son Sanders of whom he mentions Sanders and Andrew. He had 6 children, b. Simsbury, Conn.

Mary and Abiah had probably died without issue as they are not mentioned in their father's will.

4. DEBORAH MOORE, b. May 31, 1677, d. Aug. 27, 1734, m. **Samuel Forward**, b. Windsor, Conn., July 23, 1671; d. May 3, 1738. He was son of Samuel and Jane Forward who d. Sept. 16, 1684, and his widow d. June 22, 1685. July 15, 1735, Samuel Forward signed a pre-nuptial contract with widow Martha Winchell of Windsor, giving her certain property in case they should marry.

Extract from will of "Samuel Forward of Simsbury," signed April 10, 1738.

"Unto my loving wife Martha, one roome in my Dwelling house, ye use and ye liberty to Live in it during ye time she shall continue my widow, and ye use of my well and seller, which roome in my house is ye outter north fier roome, (a room with fire-place) but only a liberty for my eldest son samuel forward to have ye liberty to live there with her in said roome—and bequeath unto her likewise ye use of my little bed roome in ye northwest part of my house to own use; and likewise I bequeath & ordain that she shall have ye use of one acree and quarter of plowing land and one acree and quarter of — land, and I will and ordain that whereas there was a joynter (jointure) made with my said wife Martha and myself before our marriage wherein I was obliged to let her have ye use of one roome in my house and ye use of one acree of grass land and one acre of plowing land, ye liberty pasturing for one Cow, and ye use of my sellar and well and ye apels to fill Two barrills of cyder and apels for her own use all she shall have occasion for during the full Terme of Two years after my deceese; and like in said Joynter I was to give her Twenty pounds money to be hers for Ever as her own property. I therefore ordain that whether she lives my widow or not, she shall have ye use of one roome in my house, and ye use of my weell and ye use of my cellar

apels to eate winter, and summer aples, and so many apels to fill Two barreles for ye full term of Two years after my decess—which is included in said Joynter made before marriage, and as according to said Joynter I was to give her ye said twenty pounds to be her own property forever, I hereby confirm it to her and ordain she shall have said Twenty pounds money with this addition viz: Three of my sheep forever to her own Dispose after my decess.”

This widow was Martha, dau. of John and Mary (Dibble) Eno, b. April 6, 1685, who m. John, son of Robert Winchell, Jan. 3, 1705. Samuel Forward gave his property to sons, Samuel, Joseph, Abel, John and dau. Rachel Hawley.

There were 6 children, all b. in Simsbury.

5. JONATHAN MOORE, b. Feb. 26, 1679-80, m. “Widow Hanah larg of Saybrook, January the 9th, 1705-6,” in Simsbury, Conn. (Simsbury Rec.) **Hannah Large** was the dau. of Thomas and Sarah (Wilcox) Long, and m. Simon Large Jan. 24, 1699-1700. They had child Hannah, b. Jan. 6, 1700-1, who m. Joseph Pettibone May 11, 1726, in Simsbury. Sarah was dau. of John, son of John and Mary Wilcox. John Wilcox, Jr., m. Sarah Wadsworth, dau. of William, Sept. 17, 1646, and Sarah was b. Oct. 3, 1648.

At a town meeting held in Simsbury Dec. 15, 1705, it was suggested that “there was a mine of either silver or copper found in the town” and a committee composed of Dea. Holcomb and John Pettibone was appointed to search for the mine. It seems that the mine was discovered, for May 6, 1707, it was agreed that all might mine for copper by paying the town 10 shillings per ton royalty on the ore mined. Jonathan Moore subscribed to this agreement. Some mining was done but finally the shafts and drifts were turned into a Colonial prison named Newgate.

It seems taxation was a matter requiring some attention 200 years ago. Sept. 16, 1702, “The following named inhabitants of the noreath part of the town of Simsbury ask to be freed from the rates for the following reasons: Firstly, the difficulties that attend a new place. 2ly. It being out exposed to many difficulties as enemies. 2ly, remote from meeting and mail. 3ly, the controversies attending the place about the fee simple of the land &c.”

March 7, 1715-16, the surveyor of the town reported he had laid off lots in Turkey Hills as follows; to William and Benjamin Moore

Lot 8, 53 rods. 12 feet and 4 inches. To Jonathan Moore Lot 9, 43 rods and 2 inches. It is probable that these were the three brothers whom tradition has brought down as having come from England and engaged in mining at Copper Hill. On Jan. 2, 1723, grants of land were made to Andrew and Jonathan Moore in Simsbury, and in 1727 Jonathan signed a protest against the distribution of the common land of the town. He died in Salisbury, Conn., Sept. 8, 1770.

The following from the *Colonial Records of Connecticut*. (Vol. XI, p. 147,) proves that if Ashbel died in 1718 another son born subsequent to that date was given the same name:

“Petition of Gideon and Ashbel Moore, late of Simsbury, Hartford Co., Conn., now of Nine Partners in the Province of New York, representing that their father, Jonathan Moore, of said Simsbury, transiently residing at Salisbury, Litchfield Co., who now and for a long time has been under the care of the select men of said Simsbury, together with his estate brought his action against the petitioners and their brother Simon Moore of Simsbury,” etc. The petition was acted on by the Assembly in 1758 and a judgment of £100, obtained by Jonathan Moore against his sons Gideon and Ashbel was set aside.

It is probable that Gideon, Simon and Ashbel had given a bond in someway connected with their father's estate and that Simon “set up a job” on the two brothers who were in New York. He likely got his father to sue on the bond and he accepted service so that the first notice his brothers had of the suit was the execution levied on their land in Simsbury. It is the impression that Simon would bear watching.

The estate of Zebulon Moore was settled in 1746 by Jonathan Moore, administrator. The parentage of Zebulon is unknown.

6. ABIGAIL MOORE, b. Sept. 12, 1682, m. **William Stratton** Jan. 17, 1705-6, at Windsor, Conn. He was one of the unfortunate command that set out to invade Canada in May, 1709, during the old French war. The Connecticut troops got as far as Wood Creek, near Albany, where they lay till fall, suffering great mortality. The town records of Windsor have the following entry: “October, 1709, William Stratton died aboard the vessell, coming from Albany.”

The widow, Abigail Stratton, was appointed administratrix of the estate Dec. 5, 1709. She was still Abigail Stratton when her father's estate was settled in 1720.

They had 2 children.

7. WILLIAM MOORE, b. in 1684, d. in Granby, Conn., May 9, 1780. His headstone calls him "Mr. Wm. Moor," and says he died in his 97th year. He m. 1st, **Elizabeth Case** who d. in Granby (then Simsbury) Sept. 29, 1739. Her headstone says she was 49 years old. No record of this marriage has been found, but William Moore mentioned in his will a "piece of land he bought of his brother William Case." If by brother he means brother-in-law, then Elizabeth, dau. of William and Elizabeth (Holcomb) Case, b. Sept. 1689, was his wife. William Case was the son of John Windsor and Sarah (Spencer) Case of Hartford. Elizabeth had a brother William Case, b. March 22, 1691. William Moore m. 2d, Jan. 20, 1740, **Damaris**, dau. of Josiah **Phelps**, who m. Sarah, (dau. of Nathaniel and Sarah Porter) Winchell. Josiah was the son of Samuel, son of William Phelps the immigrant.

"The aged William Moore" made his will Nov. 7, 1773, and the distribution of the estate occurred Oct. 30, 1781. The inventory amounted to £750. To "my beloved wife Damaris" he gave $\frac{1}{2}$ the dwelling house, $\frac{1}{4}$ the cellar and well, $\frac{1}{4}$ of the barn and $\frac{1}{4}$ of all his lands and movable estate as long as she remained his widow. As Damaris was 81 years old at the time of Williams death, it is not likely that she lost her property by another sacrifice on the altar of cupid.

8. RACHEL MOORE, b. Feb. 6, 1690-1, m. **Timothy Phelps** Dec. 10, 1707. He was the son of Joseph and Hannah (Newton) Phelps, who was son of William the immigrant, and was b. Simsbury, Conn., May 18, 1671. In 1703 he lived in Poquonnock and in 1713 in Simsbury. In 1709 Capt. Matthew Allen, writing from the camp on Wood Creek, says: "Tim Phelps, Obadiah Owen,

Nat Taylor and Bartlett are sick, Taylor the worst." It is probable that this was "Our Tim."

No record of this marriage has been found, but Reuben Moore, the grandson of Benjamin, left a record in his account book, dated March 3, 1784, in which he said: "Noadiah Moore was b. in Simsbury, Conn., Nov. 5, 1730. Noadiah was the son of Benjamin by Eunice Owen, his wife." This record has been preserved at Champlain, N. Y., by the descendants of Noadiah. Another copy of the entry is still a matter of record in a family Bible in Chatham, N. Y.

Aug. 7, 1718, Benjamin Moore sold Ebenezer Holebat (Hurlbut) fifty acres of land in Turkey Hills, 25 rods wide and a mile long, bounded north on land of William Moore and South on land of Jonathan and West on the mountain.

Feb. 24, 1724, he bought of Thomas Griswold, Jr., 26 acres of land bounded East on land of Joseph Younglove, South on land of Nathaniel Phelps, "from ye east runs towards ye mountains, 280 rods."

March 14, 1732, Ebenezer Hayden sold Benjamin Moore, for £70, a half interest in 100 acres of land in Turkey Hills.

March 9, 1734, James Eno of Simsbury sold to Benjamin and Zebulon Moore "One certain Island lying in the Rivulet in Simsbury, called Eno's Island, lying against Scotland." (In the Simsbury map of 1730 this is called Holcomb's Island.)

May 19, 1737, Benjamin and Zebulon Moore sold this Island to Joseph Adams.

Feb. 28, 1737-8, the same parties sold to Elijah Adams of Windsor 22 and $\frac{3}{4}$ acres of land lying against Scotland.

March 17, 1729, Benjamin Moore bought of Roger Griswold 46 acres and 107 rods of land at "Salisbury Plains, so called," in Simsbury.

Eunice Owen was b. at Windsor, Conn., Aug. 8, 1696, the dau.

of Obadiah and Christian (Winchell) Owen. (They m. Sept. 21, 1693.) He was son of John Owen of Wales, who was b. Dec. 25, 1624, and m. Rebecca Wade Oct. 3, 1650. (Rebecca d. Dec. 3, 1711, and John Feb. 1, 1698-9.) Christian Winchell was b. March 9, 1672, was dau. of David and Elizabeth (Filley) Winchell (m. Nov. 17, 1669). David, b. Oct. 22, 1643, was son of Robert Winchell, the immigrant, who came to Dorchester from Wales 1634. Elizabeth Filley, b. March 4, 1650, was dau. of William and Margaret — Filley (m. Sept. 2, 1642).

Eunice (Owen) Moore d. Feb. 23, 1732-3, aged 37 years, and was buried in the old cemetery at Poquonnock. Her headstone, now broken in pieces only shows the first figure 3 indicating her age at the time of her death.

It is easy, in imagination, to restore the group that attended the funeral of this woman. The brothers of Benjamin and the parental home of Eunice were located only a few miles from Poquonnock on the road to Suffield. There was double mourning in the house of Amos, for his wife, Martha, was the sister of Eunice. The eldest of the orphaned children was 16 and the youngest a babe of less than two months. Eunice and Tabitha, daughters of 15 and 11, tried to hide their own grief and still the sobs of their brothers and sisters while they stood around the open grave that seemed so deep and cheerless in the accumulated snows of a Connecticut winter.

What a burden had descended upon the shoulders of these two girls. How they managed to bear that load of care we shall never know,—that they did it well we have proof in the fact that these children grew up to be honored and respected men and women.

Next to the last record we have of Benjamin is the record of the sale of land in 1738. The last is the record of his death in the British Army (Conn. contingent) at Cape Breton Island, Jan. 19, 1745-6. He belonged to the 11th Company of the Conn. troops. (See roll in Library of Connecticut Historical Society.)

A recent writer says of Cape Breton Island, "The fortifications enclosed an area of one hundred and twenty acres, more or less. The burying ground on the point of land to the eastward where hundreds of bodies are buried is still shown. Louisburg forms today the grandest ruins in this part of the continent." Probably this is all true but to the hundreds who were buried there and to their families it is likely the compensation is a trifle inadequate.

It is probable that all the children except the last were born in Simsbury. There were 9.

Amos Moore made his will Sept. 4, 1782, and the inventory of the estate was made March 21, 1785. He had land, furniture, farming implements and clothing. He had "1 great Bible, 15s; 3 bee hives, 2 sheep, sheep shears, and an hour glass." He dressed in brown. There were "An old beaver hat, 6s; old streight body'd brown Broad Cloth coat, 11s; old home-made brown do., 6s; old brown breeches, 1s." The dwelling house was appraised £65; barn, £20; old log house, £6; 21½ acres of land, £205; 32 acres in the great lot on the west side of the road, £160; 10 acres mountain, £40. March 7, 1737-8, he sold for £226 two pieces of land in Simsbury,—one in the corner marsh and the other in the great marsh.

What was left he divided between his sons "according to inventory appraisement." Dec. 4, 1750, guardians were appointed for all his children except Mary.

Aug. 16, 1722, the dau. of Benjamin and Eunice (Owen) Moore. At the time of her marriage the groom was past 80 and she was 69 "going on 70." When this woman was 11 years old her mother died, leaving a family of 9 children. Tabitha's sister Eunice was 4 years older, but she married 3 years later, and at the age of 14 Tabitha was left with the care of the family, the youngest being but 3 years old. Who can tell of the heroic efforts of this girl to keep the family together and care for them? Her father, undoubtedly, provided for the family while he lived (he d. 1745) but she filled the office of mother to these young children. After they were all married and she was left alone she took upon herself, by this marriage, the care of the old soldier, Capt. Forward.

The descendants of Benjamin Moore ought to find the grave of this woman and erect over it a monument that will perpetuate her memory

"To the last syllable of recorded time."

The History of Chautauqua County, N. Y. gives a sketch of Jehial Moore, a son of Capt. Roger Moore, a revolutionary soldier. He was Captain of a company in the war of '12. He died in Hamilton Co., Ohio, in 1817. Four of his children settled in Cayuga County, N. Y. He was probably a son of this family.

Stephen Pettibone, Jr., m. Rachel Segar June 5, 1744, and died Dec. 11, 1750. This wife must have been the mother of David's 3 younger children. Rachel Segar was b. Oct. 16, 1724. The North Granby records have the following: "Widow of David Moore died 1825, aged 74." Mary Adams, the wife of David Moore, Jr., was b. Jan. 15, 1754. She was not a widow in 1825, as David, Jr., lived till 1841. It is evident that somebody has blundered.

The estate of David Moore amounted to £430, and included 100 acres of land with house and farming tools, clothing, etc. He had two Bibles, a sermon and hymn book. The invoice includes "Puter, one large mothers platter, £0, 3, 6d; feather bed, Mother's, £0, 15s, 6d." Perhaps this was the "setting out" of Elizabeth Case when she married William Moore.

James Moore d. March 5, 1788, and is buried in East Granby, Conn. He made his will Dec. 19, 1782, disposing of land in Mooretown (a neighborhood now in Southwick, Mass.) and land in Turkey Hills, now Granby. He remembered his widow as follows: "To my beloved wife Rachel, the use of one half my brick house and home lot containing about 44 acres to use as long as she shall continue my widow and to have ye liberty of ye use of my well and to get Wood on my Mountain Lots during her Widowhood, and $\frac{1}{3}$ part of my movable estate after debts and funeral charges are paid out of my movable estate (not my legacies) to be her property forever." The following shows he was opposed to trumped up accounts: "If any one or more of my s'd children shall bring in any Debts or Charges whatever against my Estate after my decease unless it is Legacies or by Note or Obligation under my hand well executed, he or she or they are to have No other Portion out of my Estate Only what is Recovered By Virtue of S'd Debt or Charge and not to take Any advantage of my Legacy made to them in this will."

The beloved Rachel was 84 (?) years old when she acquired the use of this property.

enough as she was baptized at Simsbury, by Rev. Dudley Woodbridge, March 12, 1698-9. She gave to her son, Rufus, the "Great Bible." Her string of gold beads to dau. Miriam Moore. The balance of her estate she divided between her sons and her daughters, Mary, wife of Joseph Moore, Honorah, wife of Isaac Gillett, and Miriam, wife of Shadrach Moore. The date of her death is recorded in Joseph Moore's Bible: "The Wd. Miriam Stevens died May 24, 1790 in the 92d. year of her age."

Shadrach Moore made his will Nov. 24, 1796, and the inventory was received March 18, 1799. He had 120 acres of land, a house and barn, sheep, hogs, farming tools, 2 tons English hay, 2 tons meadow hay, brass kettle \$3, 8 pewter plates \$2, furniture and clothing, loom \$8.34, 2 great wheels \$2, quilling wheel, swifts, 2 Dutch wheels and "Great Bible," all valued at \$2350.81. He says of the widow: "Unto my beloved wife Miriam (I give) one third of my dwelling house and barn * * * I give to her after my decease for her own use as long as she shall live, one half my home lot taking in all the orchard, mowing etc. and one third of all my lands east and west the highway and one good cow and six good sheep and a side saddle which I now have, and the Great Bible and the whole of the household movables as long as she shall live, and my desire and will is that my son Shadrach Moore Jr. shall provide her with a horse to ride to Meeting and to see her children, and other places which it is necessary when she shall want, and that he shall provide her with wood and cut it fit for the fire when she shall want for herself and use, and I also give unto my beloved wife all my Bees at my decease for her use and benefit."

They had 7 children, all but the first 2 born in Westfield, Mass.

Miriam was the first child of Peter and Widow Mary (Gillett, Bissell) Buel, m.

June 30, 1698. The Simsbury records say this marriage occurred June 30, 1699, and "thereby hangs a tale."

Nov. 10, 1697, Rev. Dudley Woodbridge organized the church at Simsbury with Peter Buel and Widow Mary Bissell, with 23 others signing the covenant. Peter, son of William Buel, the immigrant, was b. at Windsor, Conn., Aug. 19, 1644, and m. Martha Coggens in 1670. She d. in 1686, leaving 9 children. Peter m. Mary Strong in 1687, who d. May 4, 1688, aged 22 years, without issue. It will be noticed that in 1697 Peter was 53 years old and was already something of a matrimonial repeater.

Widow Mary (Gillett) Bissell, b. Oct. 21, 1667, was dau. of Jonathan and Mary (Kelsey) Gillett, Jr., and grand-daughter of Jonathan, the immigrant. She m. Jacob Bissell and had one child, Jacob, b. June 8, 1694. In the Fall of 1697 the widow Mary was 30 and Peter some 23 years older; still the Winter and Spring seem to have been passed very pleasantly by them, for on the 28th day of June, 1698, a deed was put on record in Simsbury, from which the following is copied:

"To all Christian people to whom these presents may come, Greeting. Know ye that I Peter Buel being now to be speedily married (Gods Providence permitting) to my well beloved and espoused Mary Bissell * * * * I do therefore by virtue of these presents give, grant, enfeoff, set off and pass over, ratify and confirm unto the said Mary Bissell" property as follows: He gave her his house and lot at Hop Meadow and half his meadow lot during her life. Peter acknowledged this deed before John Higley J. P. on the 28th of June. This was on Tuesday. Apparently the 29th was passed in further negotiation, as this widow appears to have had an eye to business as well as matrimony, for on the 30th of June an addition was made to the gift of two days before of £60 in movable estate. This contract reads: "in case we enter into marriage bond and covenant as is now intended by us." In this last agreement Peter expressed some doubt as to whether they would ever be married at all, while in the first he said he expected to be married "speedily." The first contract was made on the 28th and the second on the 30th of June, 1698, when "they were married and lived happily ever afterwards," the Simsbury records to the contrary notwithstanding. Peter Buel died Jan. 8, 1729, aged 84 years. His widow died Aug. 19, 1734, aged 66.

Joseph Moore and Micah Miller presented a memorial in 1773 to the Connecticut Assembly, showing that they were settled on land lying North of Simsbury, South of Westfield, Mass., and West of Suffield, Conn. They were in a sort of "no man's land" and asked to be annexed to Conn. The Assembly annexed the land in question, making it a part of the town of Simsbury and of the Society of Salmon Brook. After a long contest this land finally went to Massachusetts and is now represented by the notch taken out of the State of Connecticut where the boundary line of Massachusetts

"Comes me cranking in and cuts a monstrous cantle out."

Joseph Moore was appointed Lieut. of a train band in Simsbury, March 2, 1775. He belonged to Capt. Jonathan Buttolph's Company, 18th Regt. Conn. Militia, commanded by Col. Jonathan Pettibone. The regiment marched to the defense of New York in August, 1776, where Lieut. Moore was taken prisoner and died on the 3d of November following. A pay abstract of his company preserved in the War Department at Washington reports him "taken prisoner" and sets down the amount of pay due him at £7. 4. The record in his Bible reads: "Joseph Moore, Husband of Mary Moore — Who left His Family the 14th of August 1776 — He was taken at the Giving up of New York — the 15th of September following, being in prison Seven Weeks. He Died the 3d Day of November — following Being Fifty Six Years and four Months old."

He was probably one of the eleven thousand who died on the *Jersey* and whose bones bleached on the sands of the Wallabout.

The inventory of his estate amounted to £788. 12. 6. The widow Mary Moore and son Benjamin were appointed administrators March 4, 1777. Benjamin d. on the 15th of Sept. following, when Roger Moore was appointed to administer on Benjamin's estate. It would be interesting to know what fatality carried off both Benjamin and his sister Eunice on the same day.

Among Joseph Moore's books were: One great Bible, Book of Bunyan's, Religious Life, The Contempt of the world, Spelling Book, Very pleasing to Christ, Common Prayer Book and Psalm Book. In the settlement of the estate in March, 1777, the widow petitioned to have some things set off to her that she might keep house. Among other things she got:

The roll of this company is still preserved in Simsbury, the name of Sanders Moore heading the list.

He belonged to Capt. John Brown's Co., 18th Reg. Conn. Militia, that marched to the defense of New York in August, 1776. Sanders made his will Sept. 12, 1787, and the inventory of the property is dated Nov. 19, 1787. He gave the widow, Damaris, "1/3 of the Well, the use of 2 roes of apple trees on the south side of the orchard (16 in all), the north west room in the dwelling house and the chamber over it," and some land besides. He had a "blue straight bodied coat 10s, 1 blue jacot 5s, pairs of leather, linen and woolen breeches, a lite coullered coat 2s, and a pair of pale blue stockings 3s."

To encourage economy, frugality and industry. To promote agriculture, arts, and manufactures, especially wool. To discourage extravagance,—for mourning, men should wear a piece of crape or ribbon on the arm; and the ladies wear a black ribbon or necklace. To sell manufactures at a reasonable price. Andrew Moore was one of a committee of five to enforce the observance of these regulations.

The wars of this period were attended with great mortality, as those who took part in them seemed to be fully aware. Obadiah Owen of Farmington made his will May 24, 1762, beginning, "I, Obadiah Owen of Farmington, being now going into his Majesties' service in the intended expedition." He gave his property to his wife Mary and the estate was settled Oct. 8, 1763.

February 9, 1810 he bought of Elijah Gillett 50 acres in Salmon Brook. On the same date, of Josephus Walters, 50 acres. September 12, 1815 he bought of Zopher Brown 12 acres in Granby. March 25, 1830 he bought of Lewis Holcomb 10 acres in Granby. December 22, 1830 he bought of Eli L. Moore 30 acres in Granby and Suffield. July 6, 1831 he sold to Daniel and Gaylord Holcomb a half interest in 190 acres in Salmon Brook.

On the same date he bought of the same parties 160 acres "southerly on Abel Adams land, west on the Lordship line." After the death of his brother Benjamin, Roger was appointed administrator of his father's estate and also of his brother Benjamin's estate. His will was signed April 10, 1833 with John Mills, E. D. Beach and Harrison Foot, witnesses. His son, Roger S. Moore, was made administrator. The will was probated September 10, 1838. He divided his land among his heirs by will.

In 1796 the "Western Reserve" or "Connecticut Reserve" or "New Connecticut" in northeastern Ohio was surveyed and opened for settlement. Roger Moore bought of David, Fidelio and Ebenezer King, Jr. four pieces of land in Portage county. In Lot No. 16 in Mantua township, 434 acres. This was the Tamarack Swamp where the boys and girls used to go in the winter, when it was frozen over, to gather tamarack gum. In Lot No. 23, 105 acres. In Lot No. 37, 176 acres. In Lot No. 18, 109 acres. It was in a log house on this piece of land that the people of this country had the first opportunity to make the acquaintance of the writer. This fact is mentioned here in order to save future generations from interminable wrangles in trying to fix the exact spot.

"Seven wealthy cities claimed great Homer dead,
Through which the living Homer begged his bread."

The other piece was in Lot No. 39, 120 acres in the township of Aurora.

Roger wrote to his son Homer from Southwick, Mass., April 3, 1811: "I wish you to view my lands in New Connecticut and rite to me wheather in your Opinion it is better to Exchange them for land here or to keep them, and likewise what the lands there are worth per acre." The letter is addressed:

Samuel Moore sold his property in Suffield, Conn., and removed to Mantua, Ohio, in 1806. The means of transportation consisted of a wagon, a yoke of oxen and a pair of horses. A cow was led behind the wagon. He crossed the Hudson river at Fishkill, passed through Carlisle and Pittsburg in Pennsylvania and entered Ohio at Youngstown. He passed through Warren, containing at that time but a single frame house. He settled on Lot 24 of Mantua township, buying of John and Richard Redding.

These first settlements on the Western Reserve were as completely isolated from the outside world as Plymouth, Mass., was in 1620. They had to be equally self-supporting. Game furnished most of the meat for the family and after a clearing was made wool and flax furnished the material from which the family was clothed. Wheat and rye were hacked in among the stumps and girdled timber to furnish the bread rations. These people did what the settlers from New England have done everywhere. They dispossessed the Indians, cleared away the primeval forest, built school houses and churches, and made the wilderness a fit habitation for civilized man.

Eunice Moore was one of the 14 who organized the first Congregational church in Mantua, May 31, 1812.

She d. Champlain, May 2, 1825.

Judge Pliny Moore's education was more liberal than was usual at the time. In 1775, he enlisted in the 1st Reg. N. Y. "Line," and was in the expedition to Canada under Benedict Arnold, which captured the fort at St. Johns and the city of Montreal and ended in the death of General Montgomery and disaster at Quebec. He was at the battle of Saratoga and the surrender of Burgoyne, Oct. 17, 1777. He was a Lieut. in Capt. Job Wright's Co. of Col. Marinus Willett's Regt. of "Levies," and was made Adjutant of the regiment, serving as such during the remainder of the war.

While the army was in retreat from Canada, early in 1776, the Division to which Mr. Moore belonged forded the Big Chazy River at a point of great beauty. Mr. Moore was struck with its many advantages and determined to return there and settle. After the close of the war, with 17 others, he obtained a grant of 11,600 acres of land on the Big Chazy River, on the west shore of Lake Champlain, and in March 1785, accompanied by two friends, located and surveyed the tract which was known as the Moorefield Grant. In 1787 Lieut. Moore took a party of friends, relatives and tradespeople to the Grant and clearing the surroundings of the ford, settled the village of Champlain. He at once built a dam across the river above the settlement and erected the first saw, grist, carding and fulling mills in the section.

In 1774, the British occupied Point-au-Fer on Lake Champlain as a military post and erected a stone fort with a strong stockade and called it "The White House." On the 1st of each month following the settlement of Champlain by Lieut. Moore he was visited by a corporal and file of men sent from Point-au-Fer to notify him that his title to the Grant from the State of New York would not be recognized and warning him "off the soil." Of course no attention was paid to these repeated warnings, which continued until the British formally gave up possession of the Post in 1796.

Selecting a beautiful site overlooking the settlement on the opposite side of the river, Lieut. Moore put up a comfortable log dwelling to which, in 1789, he brought his young wife and in which they lived until Dec. 1801, when they moved to a stately mansion on the hill above, which is still in a good state of preservation. The frame and floors of this house are of oak while the wainscoting, stairs and front door are of first growth cherry. This finish is now as dark with age as mahogany. The title to the property still remains in the family.

Lieut. Moore was made the first Justice of the Peace in 1788, and the following year was chosen County Judge of the Court of Common Pleas, For 17 years he was the first judge on the bench. In politics he was a Federalist of the Washington school, and in all public matters was an extremely popular leader. He was the first Postmaster in Champlain and also the first merchant.

In 1811 Judge Moore introduced the first piano or harpsicord into Champlain, and the ladies of his family were regarded as among the most fortunate of the land. He was prominent in building a large brick school house which was used for many years as a place of public worship by all sects. In 1816 he was chairman of a meeting called to organize "the Clinton County Bible Society" and was chosen its first President. He often led worship on "Lord's Day" when there was no minister present, and never neglected family worship. He was the owner of three slaves whom he emancipated at an early day. One, Phillis, remained in the family and received an annuity, by will, from the Judge on his death. He left a large estate, consisting of 5,000 acres of land and other valuable pieces of property. He willed the old burying ground to the village, an acre of ground to the Congregational Church and \$1,000 to aid in its construction.

He was a man of candor, firmness, honesty and ability; a good husband, father and neighbor. He was a citizen who filled with honor and credit some of the first and highest offices in the town, county and state.

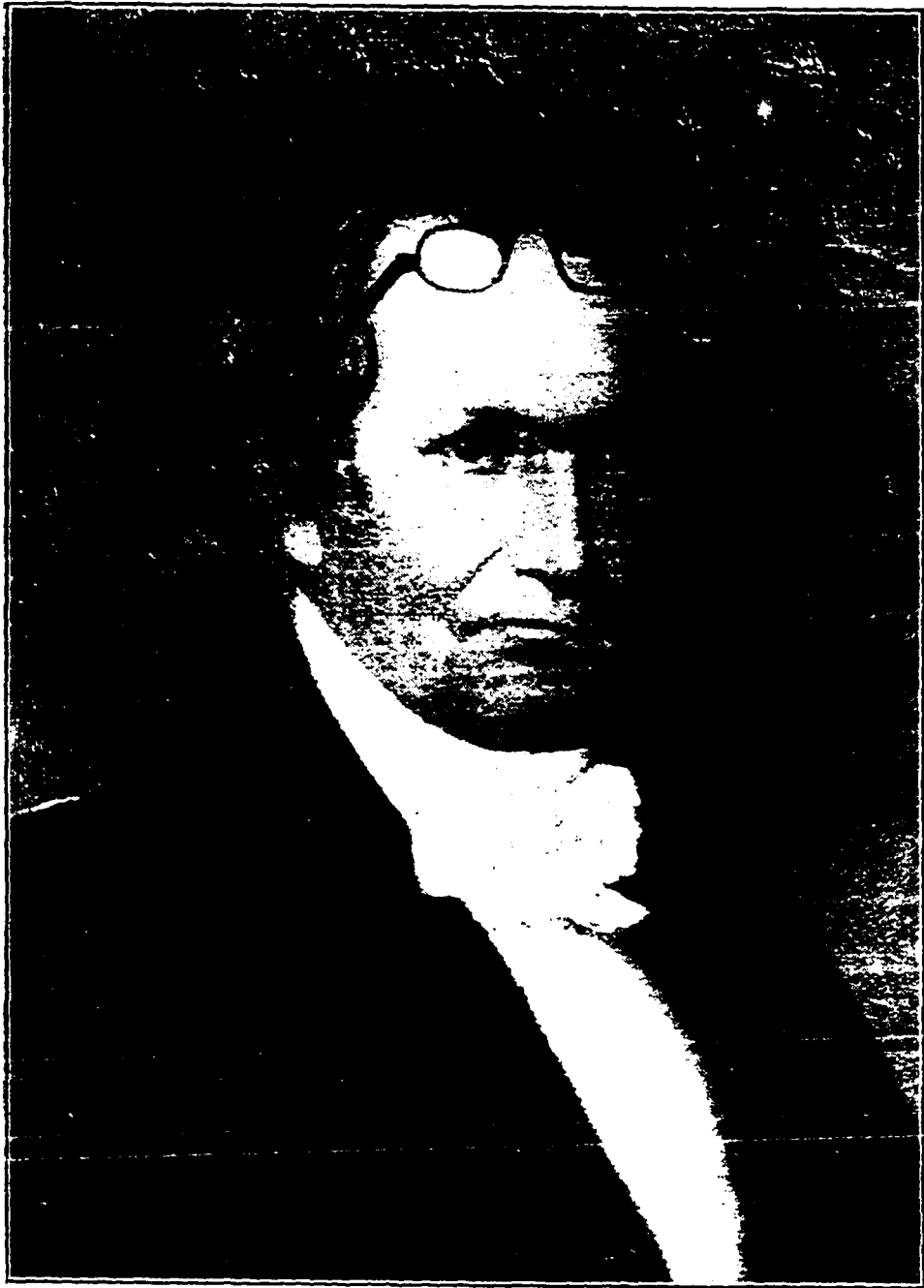

He penetrated 5 miles an unbroken wilderness, following a line of blazed trees before he found a suitable location. He contracted for two hundred acres in the southeast part of the town and immediately commenced the work of clearing the land where he lived till he was 81 years old, and where he was finally buried.

"His wealth consisted of his clothes, an axe and a few shillings in money. With the latter he procured a few days rations in Oxford and started with a stout heart and an indomitable will to carve the future history of the Moore family in Chenango Co. He soon succeeded to the agency of the Ludlow lands in the county on account of the dissipation of the son. This brought him into prominence with the people of the town where he successively held all the offices in the gift of the people."

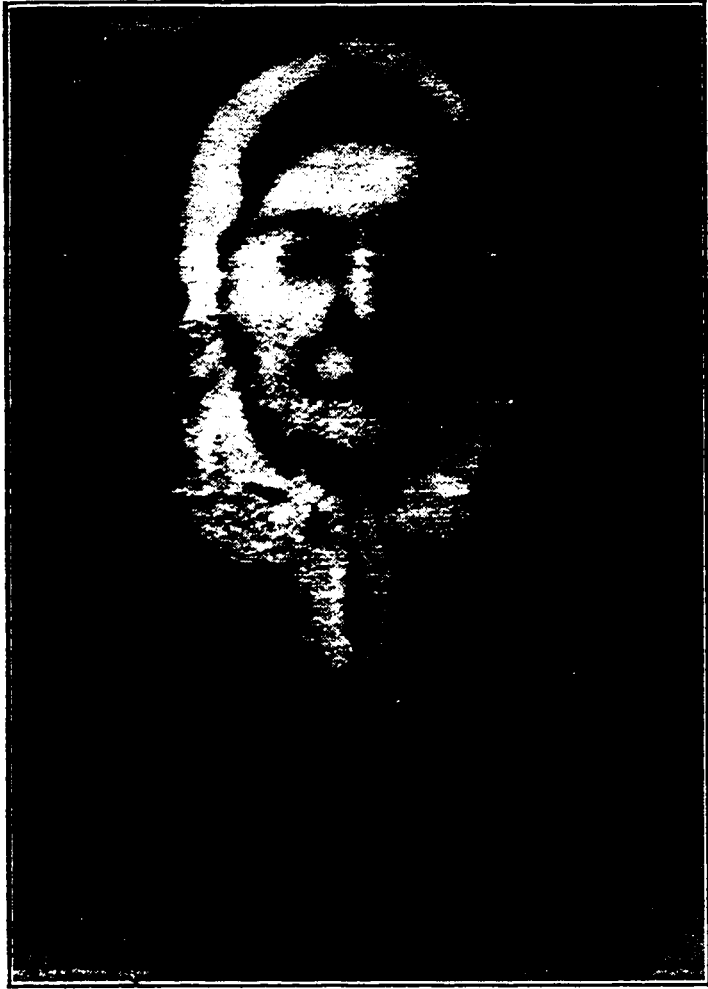

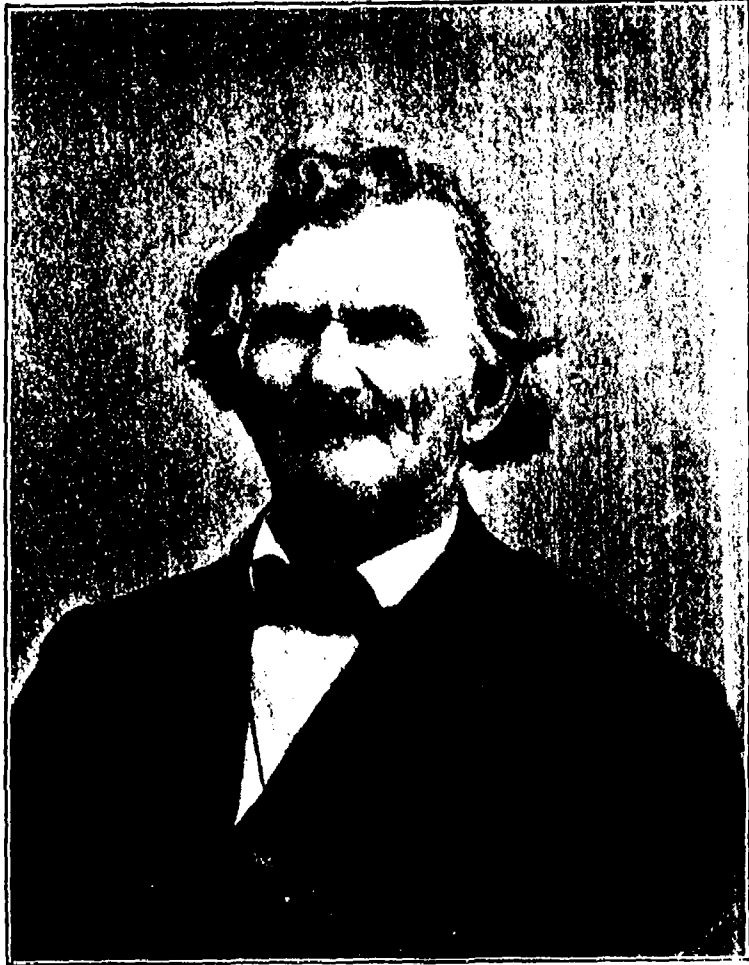

Amaziah Keyes moved from Middlesex, Yates Co., N. Y., to Auburn, Ohio, in 1816 or '17. Elizabeth (Keyes) Moore became a member of the Baptist Church when she was 16, and was always very zealous in the performance of her religious duties. She joined that church at Garrettsville, Ohio, after her marriage. This church disbanded in 1838, when she joined the M. E. Church in Mantua.

Mr. Moore moved from Connecticut to Ohio with his father's family in 1806. In 1813, he bought of his uncle, Roger Moore, 109 acres of land in lot 18, in the township of Mantua. Four years later he had cleared a part of the land, built a house and married. As this house was a fair sample of the style of architecture adopted by the early settlers of the Western Reserve, it has been thought best to give a description of it. Judge Elias Harmon has left the following entries in his diary:

"July 1, 1799, began to cut logs for our house.

"July 2, put up and moved into our house,

"July 3, got timber for floor. July 4, laid the floor."

Mr. Moore did better than this. The following was furnished by Dr. H. H. Moore, D. D., who was born in this house and lived in it till he was 16 years of age:

"The house in which 8 of us were born was built of hewed logs, 12 to 14 inches in diameter, about 20x24, had 3 rooms below, two of which were bed rooms. The fire place was on the north and built of stone. The chimney, which extended about a foot above the roof, was stone and better than usual in those times. A good well of water was about 10 feet from the north end of the house. There were windows in the front, east side, and south end. For many years Mother baked all the bread in a kettle which had an iron cover. Coals were piled on this cover to bake the top of the loaf. After some years the fire place was provided with a crane and pot-hooks. In '28 or '29 an oven was built outside the house and then the boys were required to keep on hand a supply of oven-wood. In 1830 an addition was made to the house. It was of split whitewood logs, two feet in diameter and extended the length of the house on the east side and was about 15 feet wide. A chimney was in the south end of this addition and in the northeast corner was a cheese room. It contained two beds. Its primary design was about the same as barracks for the tumultuous boys. It was our workshop, sleeping room and place of banishment, especially when father came in tired from a hunt. The chamber of the old house was all one sleeping room. Bedsteads were made with an axe and auger, and broad strips of basswood bark served for bed cords. Mother's bed was never without its trundle bed. The house had an unwallled cellar and a trap door from the kitchen, dining room, parlor, etc., led into it. The wood pile was in the road in front of the house. The roof of the house was of shakes, four feet long, held in place by poles laid on them, reaching from one end of the house to the other."

In the winter of 1835-6, the new house was completed and the old log house abandoned to its fate.

Life among the pioneers was one of unremitting toil, both indoors and out. The forest was the one implacable enemy. Nothing could be done till that was cleared away. The trees were cut down, the timber piled in log heaps and burned, and this let in the sunlight. The stumps still remained which rendered it impossible to plow the land. Rye and wheat were hacked in among the roots, a little corn was planted and these furnished bread for the family.

Every home had its wheels—little and big, reel, quill wheel, swifts and loom. Here the flax and wool were made into clothing by the women of the family.

The first drag or harrow was always the top of some bushy tree, like a thorn bush, and this was the best, for there were no teeth to catch the roots and stumps. The old plows were provided with a wooden mould board. The woods were full of game, and venison steaks were every day occurrences among the first settlers. Mr. Moore was heard to say that his rifle had often saved his father's family from a scant dinner. He used to tell how he had killed his first deer on the 4th day of July, 1806. In 1845, he killed the last wild deer ever seen in Mantua.

These Ohio pioneers are all gone:

"Each in his narrow cell forever laid,
The rude forefathers of the hamlet sleep."

"Nor you, ye proud, impute to these the fault,
If memory o'er their tomb no trophies raise."

No hatchment or rusted mail hangs over the last resting place of these pioneers, but their trophies are greater than these. Their sons have girdled the land with railroads and flecked the sea with ships. They have led great armies to battle and to victory. The pulpits and court rooms are resonant with the voices of boys born in the log cabins of the West, and in the halls of congress the sons of the pioneers are shaping the destiny of the nation.

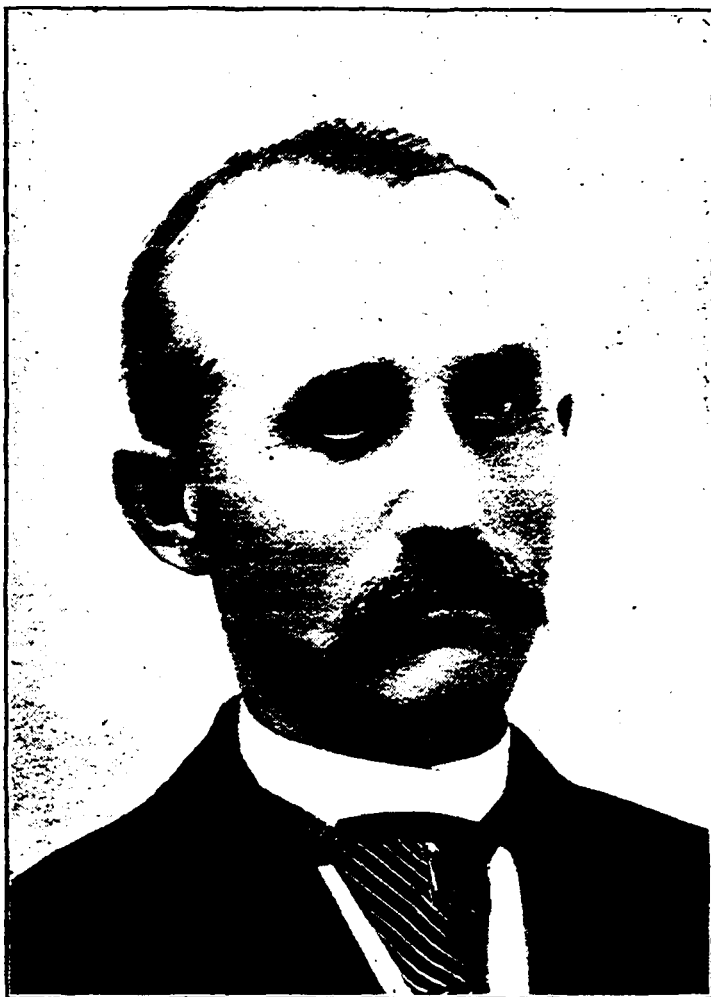

Mr. Moore was a farmer and lumberman. He was born when Chenango county, New York, was covered with the primeval forest. As he grew to manhood he began the clearing for his farm of over three hundred acres where he lived till about seventeen years before the date of his death. He had always enjoyed the best of health, never but once having called a physician for himself until about two years before his death, when he began to feel the infirmities of advancing years. About two weeks before his death he sustained a paralytic shock and from that time on he gradually failed till the end.

"He was an old line Whig, but after the formation of the Republican party he voted its ticket, and has never missed but one election since, and then was absent from home in the West."

He took great interest in the preservation of the records of the family, and contributed materially to the search for the records of the descendants of his grandfather, Jonah Moore. Feb. 25, 1898, Mr. Moore sent the following records to the writer. He said: "I have an old book in my possession, that was my father's, which was printed in London in 1748 and has these death records: 'William Gibbs departed this life March 22, 1777. Elizabeth Gibbs died Nov. 4, 1789, aged 81 years. Mary Moore died Dec. 1, 1807, age 74 years. Jonah Moore d. Nov. 28, 1813, age 78 years.'" He adds: "William and Elizabeth Gibbs were my father's grandparents; Jonah and Mary Moore were my father's parents." The mistake in this record is material. In 1740, the Episcopal parish of St. Andrews in Simsbury, Conn., was organized. In 1744, Rev. William Gibbs was sent to the mission by a missionary society of London. After 10 years he was rendered incapable of performing the duties of his office by the savage treatment of the authorities for refusing to pay a tax for the support of the Congregational Church. He died March 22, 1777, "in the 63d year of his age, and the 33d of his mission, and 23d of his illness." Elizabeth Gibbs, who died in 1789, at the age of 81 was his sister and kept house for him for 30 years. These two people were brother and sister, neither of them ever married, and still they have gone into the records as the ancestors of numerous descendants. The mistake occurred in this way:

When Rev. William Gibbs d. in 1777, his sister, Elizabeth, was appointed administratrix and Jonah Moore went on her bond. When the property of Elizabeth was distributed in 1800, it went to widow, Sarah Holcomb, and to Mary Moore, the wife of Jonah Moore.

Here is a letter from William Ridout to Mrs. Mary Gibbs, his mother-in-law. Scrawled on this letter, evidently by another hand and at a subsequent time are "Mary" and "Ridout."

BARBADOES, March ye 3d, 1734-5.

HONORED MADAM:

I congratulate you on your sons safe arrival After twenty-five days passage. I hope these lines will find you and my dear children as well as it leaves me and your son William. (He speaks of his satisfaction in having) "2 of ye 3 lovely children—left me by my dear Wife in their early years in the care of her loving mother—She was not only good to you but was a loving Tender Chaste, industrious obedient & Charmingly pleasant Wife to me. Pray give my love to my children, to Brother Gibbs (the painter), To Sister Elizabeth Gibbs.

WILLIAM RIDOUT.

It seems that the youngest, Mary, went to live with her uncle and aunt, William and Elizabeth Gibbs, took their name and was finally, by her grandchildren, supposed to be their daughter.

Dr. Hebbard was the son of Timothy, lumberman with a large family, so that the young man was forced to a life of hard labor from the time he was 6 years old. His environment was exactly such as is most likely to produce great men. It was by his own efforts that he secured sufficient money to get some primary schooling. He then taught school. At 18 he studied for the ministry, and was soon after recognized as a minister. After his marriage, the father-in-law suggested that the ministry was not a bread-winning business and that it would be better to study medicine. The young minister took this advice and attended several courses of lectures at Harvard.

After his graduation he practiced his profession at Fall River, Mass., and then at Waltham till 1854. The doctor was celebrated as a platform speaker, and being an anti-slavery man, was active in the Fremont campaign of 1856. At the close of the campaign he gave up the active practice of his profession and traveled through New England and as far west as the Mississippi river, giving his great lecture on physiology and health. He treated patients in connection with his lectures and his books show that more than 200,000 people sought his professional skill. These lectures were endorsed by Judge Russell of Boston, Hon. J. Z. Goodrich of Boston, and the Poet Longfellow said: "They are spirited and vigorous." Wendell Phillips said: "They cannot fail to thrill cold Saxon blood into enthusiasm. Warrant the strongest endorsement."

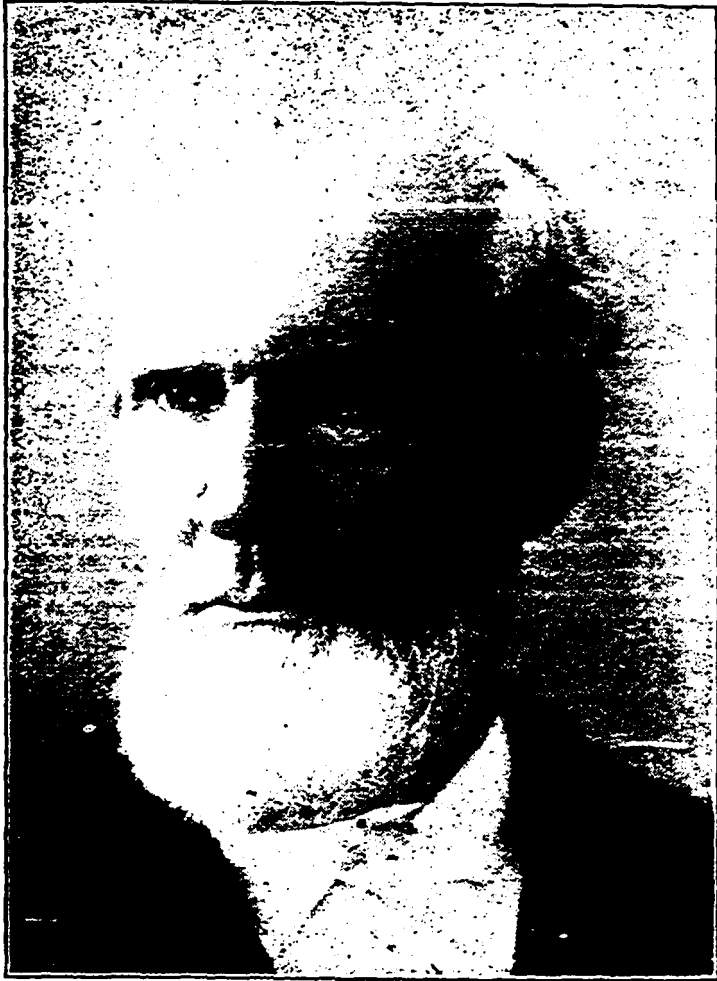
Actuated by an intense desire to see Kansas made a free state, in 1857 he transferred to the Kansas Conference, and in 1861 entered the army as chaplain of the 3d Kansas Regiment. In 1863, went to South Carolina to assist Col. Montgomery and others in the organization of colored regiments. In 1864 he was appointed superintendent of education for the state of Florida, and co-operated with the Freedman's Bureau and certain Northern Aid Societies. He resigned in May, 1865, and returned North. At the next session of the Erie Conference he entered the work of the itinerary again.

Seeing that Chautauqua Lake was likely to become a summer resort, in 1869 he, at his own expense and on his own motion, attended a camp-meeting at Round Lake, N. Y., to study the situation as an aid to the formation of a judgment in regard to establishing a permanent camp ground at Chautauqua Lake. The following week he attended a camp-meeting at Dayton, Cataaugus Co., N. Y., and explained to the preachers and principal laymen the superior facilities Chautauqua Lake afforded for a permanent camp-meeting ground, when a committee was appointed to survey the lake and select a site. This was soon done, "Fair Point" selected and 50 acres bought for \$10,000. After a number of camp-meetings had been held Lewis Miller and Dr. J. H. Vincent, in 1873, requested the privilege of holding a Sunday School Assembly there the following year. This was granted, the assembly was a great success, and in 1877 Rev. E. J. L. Baker, Dr. W. W. Wythe and Dr. H. H. Moore were appointed a committee by the Erie Conference to transfer the camp ground to the chartered Chautauqua Assembly. Mr. Moore, who was vice president of the Camp-meeting Association, was made a trustee of the Chautauqua Assembly and remains such at the present time.

Dr. Moore has at different times occupied the Chautauqua platform as lecturer, questions of speculative philosophy or theology always engaging his attention. He was one of the editors of the *Chautauqua Daily Herald* during the first 15 years of its existence.

Besides many contributions to church papers and the *Methodist Review* he is the author of 5 volumes—"Ida Norton, or Life at Chautauqua," "Matter, Life and Mind," "Sickness as a Profession," "The Anatomy of Atheism," and "The Republic to Methodism, Debtor."

In 1887 Allegheny College conferred upon Mr. Moore the degree of Doctor of Divinity. He was a member of the general conference in 1880, '84 and '92, and for a term of 4 years was a member

When Mr. Moore was 21 years of age he went to Kentucky and then to Alabama, where he taught school 2 years. On his return he studied medicine with Dr. T. J. Trask of Hiram, Ohio, and attended lectures at the Cleveland Medical College, where he acquired the degree of doctor of medicine. He practiced his profession at Washington, Pa., and at Vienna, Ohio, removing to Huron, Atchison Co., Kansas, in 1857. In the fall of 1861 he assisted in raising a company of volunteers for the war and was mustered in as 1st Lieut. Co. "D," Second Kansas Cavalry, Nov. 20, 1861. He resigned and was mustered out of the service on account of disability, Aug. 12, 1863. It was this disability contracted in the army that finally caused his death.

His service in the army was extremely arduous, for the Second Kansas Cavalry opened every battle of the army of the frontier and was the last in pursuit of the enemy after the battle was won. It happened he was in Lawrence with his family at the time the city was burned and the inhabitants massacred by the guerrillas of Quantrell, where his life was saved by the presence of mind of his wife. She destroyed his captain's uniform and by persistently addressing him as Doctor succeeded in deceiving the enemy as to his being in the army. The night following the raid a rumor was circulated through the town to the effect that the raiders were returning. Captain Moore secured a horse and picketed the road leading east from the city during the whole night, determined to warn the town in case the rumor proved to be well founded.

Dr. Moore's health was so broken by his army service that ten years after his resignation he was obliged to give up his medical practice. In 1881, he moved to Cleveland, Ohio, and from that time on his leisure was spent in writing, for which he had a decided

taste. A great many fugitive pieces of verse and prose from his pen were printed from time to time in the Cleveland papers. A single one is reproduced here. It is the last he ever wrote, and was written when the hand of death was on him.

TO BE A BOY AGAIN.

I would I were a boy at play,
To roam the woods and fields;
I would forego the brightest day,
Successful fortune yields;
I would ignore the wise and great,
And all the rich rewards of state,
That bold ambition wields,
To be a boy this bright June day,
And roam the flow'ry fields at play.

Along the glades where spring brooks run,
Are groves of maple trees,
Whose vistas echo songs of fun
And life on every breeze;
'Tis not these scenes for which I crave,
But for my youth, so strong and brave;

Y., April 26, 1833, was a farmer in Troy, Geauga Co., Ohio, and Congregational minister. He moved to Cleveland, Ohio, where he now resides, on Lockwood Avenue. He still preaches and is engaged in real estate business. He has been very successful as a farmer and is a preacher of great earnestness and power. He has always taken much interest in politics; is a prohibitionist, and for several years has voted with the opposition to the Republican party. Mrs. Fairbanks was prominent in the order of Patrons of Husbandry. She was president of the Geauga Co., Ohio, W. C. T. U. for 3 years, and was president of the Troy Soldiers Aid Society, during the war.

Y., May 11, 1830, is living at 136 Putnam St., Cleveland, Ohio, 1903. Dr. Moore's youth was spent on a farm and his education acquired at the public schools of his native place. At the age of 17 he began teaching school in Stark Co., Ohio, and after his marriage a few years were spent in farming. He soon abandoned his farm (this family was never celebrated for possessing great talent in that line) and began the study of medicine. He graduated at the Medical College in Cleveland, Ohio, and began the practice of his profession in Green, Trumbull Co., but soon after removed to Cleveland. Here he continued to practice to the time of his death.

He was an ardent Republican and enthusiastic in the temperance cause. He lectured on temperance in most of the cities of western Pennsylvania at the solicitation of the various temperance societies. At the time of his death he was a member of Scoville Avenue Methodist Church of Cleveland. Not long before this time the presiding elder of the church and the bishop made an effort to sell this church property and appropriate the funds to the payment of the debts of another M. E. Church in the city. Dr. Moore took the case into the courts and finally succeeded in saving the Scoville Avenue Church property to its rightful owners. Dr. Moore was stricken with apoplexy while in the country and breathed his last in the old home where he was born. His remains have been removed to the East Cleveland Cemetery. The following obituary was printed in the *Cleveland Leader*:

"The death and burial in the family burying ground in Mantua, of Dr. M. G. Moore, of No. 136 Putnam Street, Cleveland, deserves more than a brief record of the event. It is an event of public interest to a large circle of friends in Geauga and Portage counties, and to numerous friends in this city.

"Dr. Moore's material interests were all centered in Cleveland, where he received his medical education, and where he had practiced his profession nearly a quarter of a century. If ambition, or the desire for fame and renown were moving forces in his character, his conscience sometimes stood in the way of preferment, as was said to be the case when he was offered a professorship in a Cleveland medical college. Modest, unassuming, distrustful of his own abilities, he put forth no effort to obtain the larger rewards of a successful politician, or of a platform orator, for which he was eminently qualified by abilities of a high order. The writer heard him deliver an extempore address in Erie county, Pennsylvania, several years ago, which was a masterpiece of oratory. Few public speakers in this State could so arouse an audience.

"To say that Dr. M. G. Moore was an honest, honorable Christian gentleman is high praise, but the fact is unimpeachable and unquestioned by all who knew him.

"He had not an enemy in the world, so far as the writer knows; but he had friends whose love will survive all life's changes, time and death.

"When trouble came to Scoville Avenue Methodist Episcopal Church, and despair filled the hearts of the people, a brave man whose indignant soul could not brook a wrong, entered the lists as the sagacious defender of the legal rights of the church. To the tireless energy, to the wise and skillful management of Dr. Moore, is the membership of the Scoville church indebted to-day for a place of their own to worship God on the Sabbath day.

"His skill as a physician was widely known, and he was often called to desperate cases in the country where other help failed. The sympathetic pressure of his warm hand, inspired by his warmer heart, has often given courage and comfort to friends, and hope to the dying. Thoroughly acquainted with the fundamental principles of his profession, he knew well how to apply his therapeutic knowledge to the relief of human suffering, and the saving of life. But the light of that strong intellect, that came as a benediction to many troubled homes, is extinguished, it has gone out forever.

"The only son, Samuel Moore, is an eminent young lawyer of the Kansas City bar. Since he left home the doctor and his amiable wife have occupied their home on Putnam street. Their house has been a veritable Mecca to friends and acquaintances from the country when visiting Cleveland. People in trouble found him a wise counselor and a sympathetic friend. The generous, genial soul of hospitality presided at his fireside and table, and long will friends remember that they were always met with a smile and words of welcome. When the message was borne to this city that he had been stricken with paralysis, the most sincere sympathy and anxiety were manifest in the large circle in which he moved; and when word came that he was dead, the shock sent a thrill of dismay and discouragement to many whose lives had been closely bound with his. W.

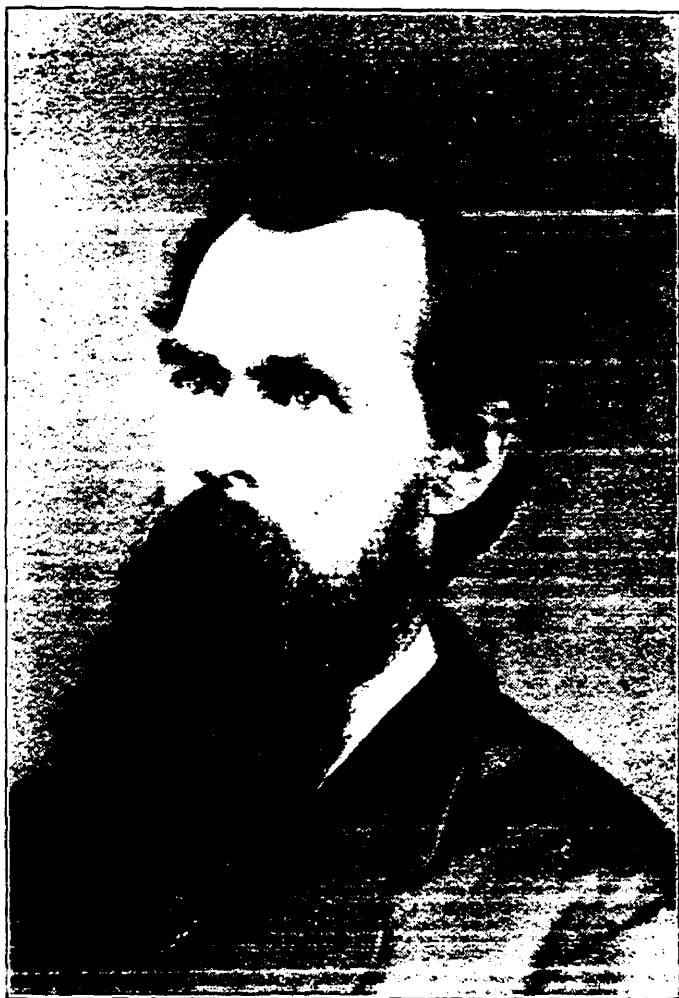

Mr. Moore got his education at the district school and at Hiram, Ohio. He taught his first school at Yankeebush, near Warren, Pa., when he was 17 years old. In 1858 he removed to Kansas with his brother Francis, who d. a month after their arrival in Atchison county. He taught a six months' term of school in Barry, Clay Co., Mo., in the winter of 1859 and '60, where he became a mason. He studied law in the office of Christian & Lane in 1860 and '61, till he enlisted in a three months regiment, the 2d Kansas Infantry, on the 14th of May, 1861, as a private.

In the organization of his company, "D," he was made a corporal and served till the 31st of October, participating in all the battles of the regiment. He re-enlisted on the 31st of October and was made 2d Lieutenant on the re-organization of "D" Co., 2d Kansas Cavalry, Dec. 11, 1861; promoted 1st Lieutenant, May 1, 1862. He was promoted Captain of his company in 1863, but never mustered, as he was commissioned Lieutenant Colonel of the 4th Arkansas Cavalry by the Secretary of War and mustered into that regiment, Feb. 18, 1864, which he commanded to date of its muster out, June 30, 1865. (See *Adjutant General's Report Kansas and Arkansas.*)

In 1867, he commanded a Battalion of Cavalry, called the 18th Kansas, with the rank of Major, in service on the Plains against the hostile Indians. During the winter of 1868 and '69 he commanded, with the rank of Colonel, the 19th Kansas Cavalry, a 12 company regiment, in a campaign conducted by General Sheridan, that resulted in forcing the hostile Indians onto their reservations. (See *Kansas Historical Collections, Vol. VI.*)

After the close of the war, Mr. Moore conducted a grocery business in Lawrence, in Trinidad, Col., and Las Vegas and Albuquerque, N. M., under the firm name of Moore, Bennett & Co. He sold his business in 1882 and returned to Lawrence. Subsequent to this he was treasurer of Douglas Co., Kansas, for two years, and later a member of the 53d Congress, elected as a Democrat from the 2d district of the state.

He now resides in Lawrence, Kansas, and for the last 7 years has been engaged in compiling the records of the Moore family. Is now (1903) Vice-President of the Lawrence National Bank.

Mr. Moore prepared for college at the Plattsburg Academy but very much to the disappointment of his father declined to go and insisted upon entering the navy.

Failing to obtain an appointment, he, on the advice of Admiral Bailey, went to New York and studied for the Engineer Corps, that promising to become the most important branch of the service. He received permission of the Hon. Secretary of the Navy to appear before a Board of Examiners at the Philadelphia Yard where he competed with seventy one other applicants, the result being that fourteen of the candidates passed satisfactory examinations and were admitted to the service, Moore being No. 1 of the successful class.

He was appointed 3d. Asst. Engineer, May 21, 1853; promoted to 2d. Asst., June 27, 1855; 1st Asst. July 21, 1858, and Chief Engineer, Aug. 5, 1861. His sea service has covered nearly 16 years and his shore duty 23 years. This duty was in office of the Engineer in Chief of the Navy Department, Washington, D. C., 1853; steam frigate, *Saranac*, Mediterranean Squadron, 1853-6. This cruise covered the whole of the Crimean War. The combined English, French, Sardinian and Turkish fleet was visited while at anchor in the Bosphorus before it passed into the Black Sea; steam frigate *Niagara*, first trans-atlantic cable expedition of 1857; flag ships *Colorado* and *Roanoke*, home squadron, 1858-60; brought from Aspinwall to Hampton Roads the Japanese Commission, which followed the opening of Japan by Commodore Perry; flag ship *Richmond* of the Mediterranean Squadron, 1860-1. He was present at the bombardment of the fortifications at Gaeta and Messina and the capture of the latter by the combined forces of King Victor Emanuel and Garibaldi. He was with the West-Gulf blockading Squadron, 1861-3 and participated in engagements at the head of the passes of the Mississippi River with the rebel ram *Manassas* and steamers and fire-rafts, Oct. 12, 1861. He was in the attack on rebel defenses at the entrance to Pensacola Harbor, Nov. 22, 1861; Forts Jackson and St. Philip, April 24; Chalmette and capture of New Orleans, April 25; passage of Vicksburg batteries, July 15, 1862; passage of batteries at Port Hudson—(serious injury to *Richmond*) and repassage of the same, March 15; bombardment and capture of Port Hudson, July 8, 1863.

Commodore Moore was the originator of the plan adopted by the vessels composing the fleet of Admiral Farragut for protecting the sides of the ships with their chain cables and of covering the ships with a paint made from the mud of the Mississippi River to screen them from view at dusk and at night. This is now called "War-Paint". He also introduced "fighting tops" to the navy by fitting a howitzer, protected by boiler iron, in the fore-top of the *Richmond* to clear the levees of sharp-shooters while passing up and down the river. This device is now used on all fighting ships.

After the fall of Port Hudson, and the opening of the River, the *Richmond* returned North for repairs in August, 1863, when Mr. Moore was detached and ordered to duty in the office of the General Superintendent of Iron Clads, in New York. 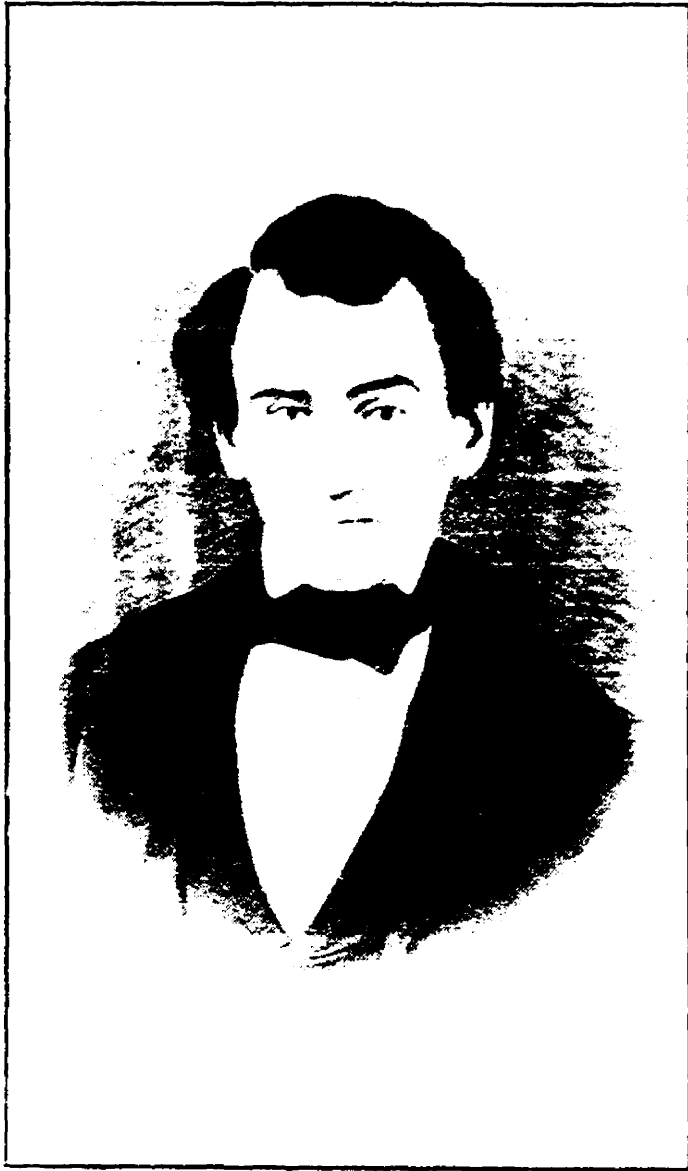

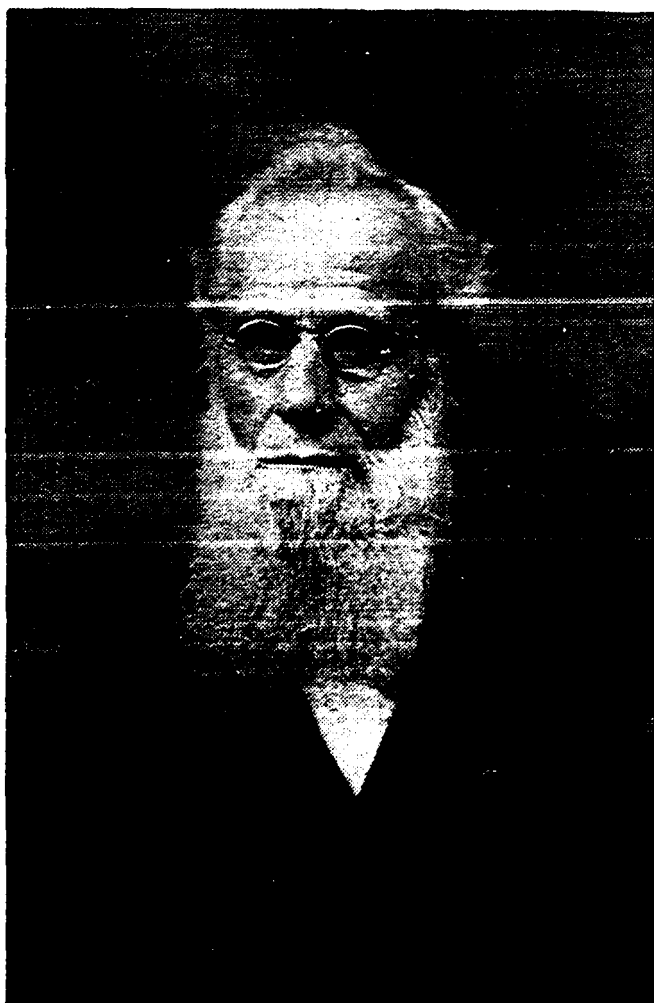

The following extracts are from a published memorial: "Mr. Moore was educated at Wilbraham Academy and at Suffield Institute, and upon leaving school engaged in mercantile life in the town of Vernon, Conn. In 1868, when only twenty-four years of age, he represented that town in the General Assembly and served on the committee of finance. Three years later he entered the employ of the State as clerk in the comptroller's office. In 1877, he was appointed chief clerk, which office he held continuously until his death. His services for the State covered a period of over twenty-six years, under eleven different comptrollers,—longer than that of any other state official with the exception of the state librarian. Unassuming, accommodating, faithful, a model of integrity, and devoted to the interests of the State, he knew every detail of the office, and was the possessor of a vast fund of official information which rendered him invaluable. He was an officeholder of whom Connecticut has a right to be proud." Mr. Moore joined the Congregational Church in Talcottville within a few months of its organization, continuing with it until his death, and serving it in various capacities.

PRESIDENT JOHN HENRY BARROWS.

The sudden death, from pneumonia, of President John Henry Barrows, upon June 3, will be deeply felt by the whole Christian world, as well as by the imme-

diate constituency whose interests he was so ably serving in connection with Oberlin College and Theological Seminary.

Dr. Barrows was born in Medina, Mich., July 11, 1847. Both his father and mother were among the earliest graduates at Oberlin. At the age of twenty he graduated from the classical course in Olivet College, where his father was professor of the physical sciences. His theological course was pursued at Union, Yale, and Andover seminaries. He was settled over Congregational churches in Springfield, Ill., Lawrence and East Boston, Mass., and finally, for fifteen years, over the First Presbyterian Church of Chicago.

Early in his career, Dr. Barrows obtained wide popularity as a lecturer upon a variety of patriotic, biographical, literary, moral, and religious subjects. During his pastorate in Chicago he was chiefly instrumental in organizing, in connection with the Columbian Exposition, the unique and most important World Parliament of Religions, at which there were gathered the leading representatives of every religion and sect in the wide world. This was regarded by Max Muller as "one of the most memorable events in the history of the world." The fruits of this parliament are preserved in two volumes, of eight hundred pages each, containing the papers which had been read. The great work of editing this was performed by Dr. Barrows in the midst of his pastoral duties, and remains the most important single monument of his life's work.

As an outcome of the World's Parliament of Religions, the Haskell Lectureship of Comparative Religion, with Dr. Barrows as the incumbent, was founded in Chicago University. Among the incidents of this lectureship was a tour (1897-98) of India, Japan, and China, in which he gave more than one hundred lectures and addresses to native audiences.

Dr. Barrows published many single sermons and discourses, and was a valued contributor to the pages of the *Bibliotheca Sacra*. He also published six books: "I believe in God," "Life of Henry Ward Beecher," "The World's Parliament of Religion," "A World Pilgrimage," "Christianity the World Religion," and "Christian Conquest of Asia."

His death occurred while he was still engaged in intense activities of every kind, and in the midst of innumerable broad plans for the promotion of the highest interests of the civic, educational, moral, and religious improvement of mankind. Surely the ways of the Lord are higher than ours, and His thoughts past finding out. It is only by the exercise of the sublimest faith that, in the presence of such an affliction, one can say, "He doeth all things well."

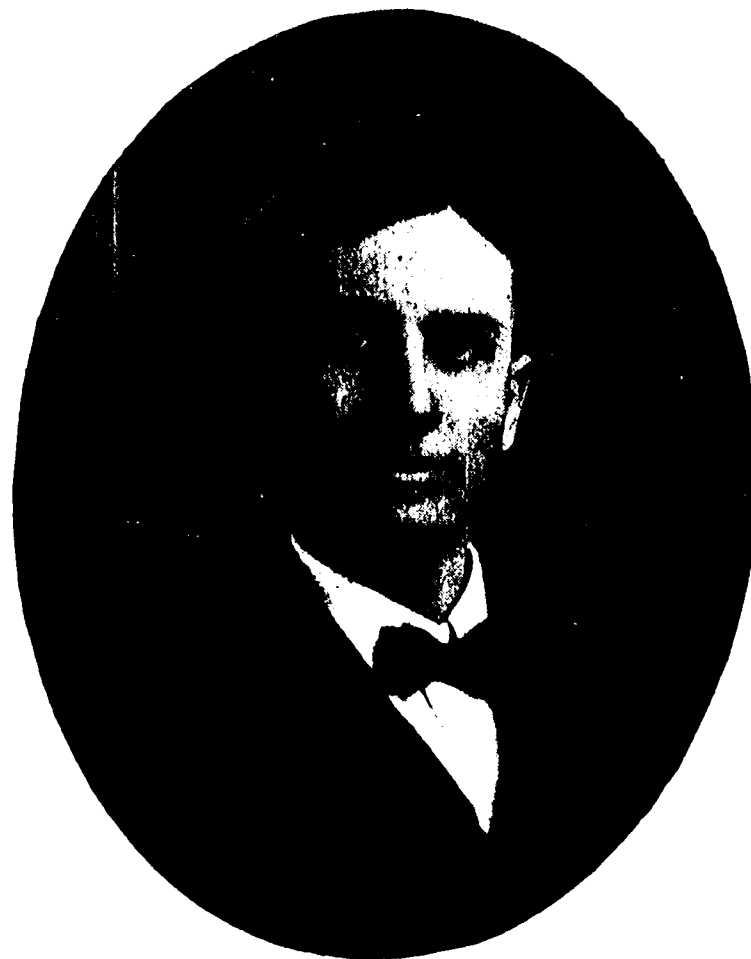

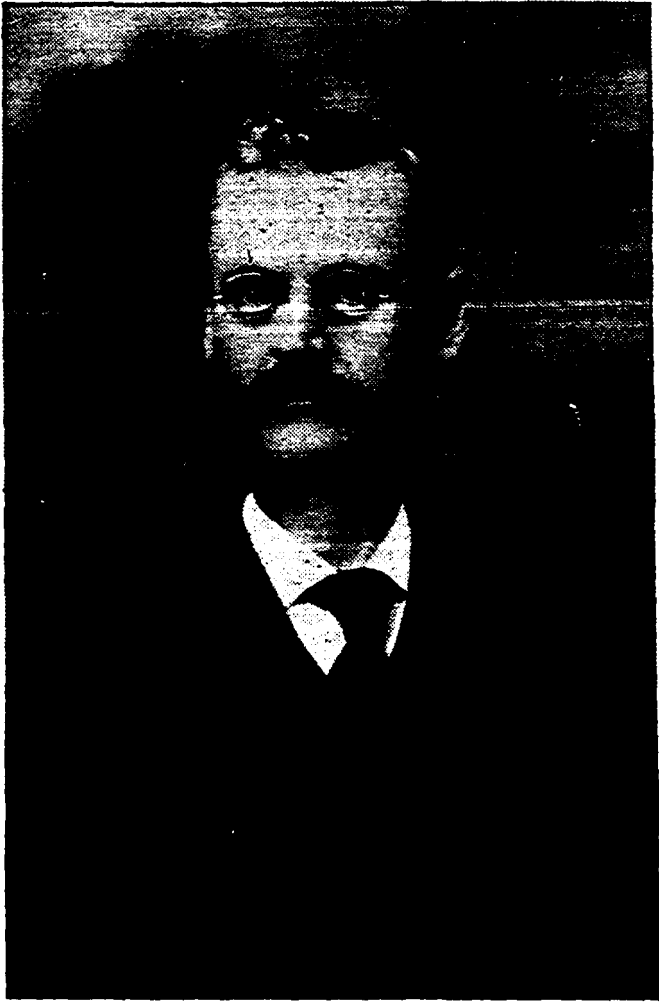

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THE DESCENDANTS OF ANDREW MOORE.

The first mention, yet discovered, of ANDREW MOORE, of Poquonock, Conn., is the record of his marriage, which is as follows: "Andrew Moore & fara Phelpes yt was Dafter of famuell Phelpes ware married by capten Newberry, february. 15. 1671." **Samuel Phelps** was the son of William, the emigrant who came to Dorchester, Mass., in 1630. Samuel married Sarah (daughter of Edward) Griswold in Windsor, Conn., Nov. 10, 1650. Sarah (Phelps) Moore was born March 16, 1653-4. Andrew had a grant of land in Simsbury, Conn., in 1680, but he lived in Windsor where the birth of all his children is recorded, except that of his son William. He died there Nov. 29, 1719, and the inventory of his estate was made on the 17th of December following. The distribution of the property took place on the 5th of April, 1720. The estate was appraised at £320. Each of his nine children took his share of the property. The widow Sarah Moore, was appointed administrator of the estate.
