## PREFACE

*"Wise men lay up knowledge"*—PROVERBS 10:14

James Boyd Magill was born in 1799 in County Antrim, Ireland, immigrated with his bride directly to Chester County, South Carolina in 1883 and died there in 1880. This book, a work of love and family appreciation on the part of the compiler, records as much data as possible about him, his ancestors in Ireland, and of the descendants of his eight children in America.

The Magill family, itself of ancient and honorable lineage, has had the good fortune to be allied through marriage with many other ancient, honorable and well-known families. Considerable data on a number of these, some of which are early connections in foreign countries, and others, correlated with later descendants here in America is recorded in Chapter 31, Allied Families.

A copy of the old Magill Family Register compiled many years ago in Ireland and further Magill family records will be found in Chapter 32, and the bibliography following records both the sources from which much data was obtained or verified, and from which additional information may be obtained.

Information and data has been gleaned from well-preserved and treasured family Bibles, family trees, registers, records and other family keepsakes, from church, cemetery and military records, and from much contact and correspondence with family descendants and others. In addition, many well-known books, family histories and other authentic sources have been searched for family records and data. These are referred to and acknowledged in footnotes on the proper pages and in the bibliography. Wherever possible, full credit has been given. Only one who has handled and copied so many records and dates can understand and appreciate the many ways in which errors may occur, and no one can regret even the least of these so much as the compiler.

It would have been an impossible task for one person to have gathered together so full and wide-spread a record as is contained in this family history, and the author is greatly indebted to the many descendants and other interested people in Ireland, Scotland, England and Canada, and in many parts of this country who have helped to make this book possible. Many of these were professional people with busy schedules who have freely shared their valuable family records and their equally valued encouragement and good wishes with the compiler in this arduous, but well-loved undertaking. To each of these who have so kindly helped, in so many ways, goes sincere thanks and appreciation. Also, much appreciation is due those early family historians of long ago who collected, compiled, and passed down our earliest family records, and to their descendants, who through the years, have treasured and preserved these early writings for us. Reaching back across the years, we have but joined our efforts with theirs, sharing with them one common goal—the preservation of the Magill family records.

## Chapter 1

### JOHN MAGILL

died after 1704, Ireland

- (1) John Magill, an officer in the Army of King William III<sup>1</sup>, was killed in an engagement near Portglenone, County Antrim, Northern Ireland. He "married Ann -----, a descendant of Lord Montgomery and Sir Arthur Rawdon", both of Ireland<sup>2</sup>.

See Chapter 31, Allied Families: *Montgomery, Rawdon*.

His son:

- (2) Arthur Magill, named for Sir Arthur Rawdon, was born Dec., 1704, Bowlane, Antrim, Co. Antrim, Ireland in the same house where later his sons and grandson were born. He died 31 Oct. 1741 and was buried in a marked grave at Shane's Castle. This castle is still in existence and is situated between Antrim and Randalstown, Co. Antrim, on the edge of Lough Neagh, largest lake in the British Isles. See Chap. 31: *Rawdon*; and Chap. 32, Part 3. Also, concerning the removal of this Magill headstone from Shane's Castle to Kirkinriola cem., see Chap. 10, last paragraph.

One record adds that other children were John, Charles, and Arthur Magill; these three emigrated to America in 1766 (John settled in Va.) and Alexander Magill. See Chapter 32, Part 3, *Magill Genealogy*.

According to a high Scottish authority, the Magill family probably originated in Galloway, a district of southwest Scotland which comprises the counties of Kirkcudbright and Wigtown and famous

for the scenic beauty of its mountains, lakes and moorland. This is the part of Scotland which lies nearest Northeastern Ireland in which County Antrim, home of many of this Magill line, is located.

The Magill family had spread from southwest Scotland to the southeastern and central parts by the 16th century, and the family is certainly found in Ireland by or before the 17th century. The spelling of the name as Magill has been the normal, accepted form of the name for many years in Ireland, but MacGill, Makgill and M'GILL are also common, especially in Scotland. The original spelling, MacGill, is a typically Scottish name, meaning "son of Gill."

One record states that the first Magills of this family line in Ireland were three brothers, who came to Ireland with King William III of England, and each settled in different places—Ballymena, Antrim and in County Tyrone. Another writer states that some of the Magill name came over from Scotland with the Plantation of Lord Montgomery (1606) and settled in Ireland. See Chapter 31, Allied Family—*Montgomery*, and Chapter 1, No. 1 John Magill. A more recent writer recorded that this family is descended from McGill, Viscount of Oxenford (spelled variously), probably in Co. Midlothian, Scotland. (See Chap. 11 and Chap. 32, Part 3, No. 6.)

It appears that the early Magills lived in or near Antrim for many years, but later members of the family line were settled in Broughshane, County Antrim, Northern Ireland, and it was from Broughshane that (No.11) James Boyd Magill emigrated in 1823 with his bride and settled in Chester Co., S. C.

The Magills were of the Presbyterian faith and many of this family, including the immigrant ancestors, attended the First Broughshane Presbyterian church, organized in 1655 and situated in the village. This church, largely rebuilt and modernized in 1925-26, is built in the form of a T. There are three galleries; the steps up to them go from the outside—relics of the old day—and as also was the custom in those days, the graveyard is right up to the walls. It is considered one of the most beautiful of country churches. A recent pastor of this church has written, "The Magills were fine people, with strong qualities of character, very forthright and loyal to their convictions. I am sorry there are now none of them left at Kenbally." (Letter, dated 23 April, 1956.)

Those of the Magill family name who are known to have possessed coats-of-arms usually displayed three birds upon their shield, sometimes heraldic birds called martlets. These were somewhat like swallows, but without feet or beaks—and always "close," that is sitting and never with open wings. The Magill crests vary and some show a bird similar to those on the shield, but with the wings in the act of flight. "The early coats-of-arms, with a simple shield and no crest bespeak a truly ancient family."<sup>1</sup>

One Magill crest shows a phoenix in flames proper, and under the

shield, the motto, "Sine Fine" (Without End) and the name MacGill below this. (See Chap. 32, Part 4)

In 1823, (No. 11) James Boyd Magill and his young bride, Esther Rodgers, left home and friends in Ireland to make the long and dangerous six-months voyage across the Atlantic Ocean. They came from Broughshane, County Antrim, Ireland, directly to Chester County, South Carolina, settling there on Fishing Creek in the fall of 1823, where they spent the rest of their lives. They were the only ones of their family to come to America, although some years later, about 1843, (No. 95) James Magill Beattie, a young nephew of the immigrant ancestor (No. 11) James Boyd Magill, left County Antrim, Ireland and settled near his Magill kin in South Carolina.

This family of Magills were a cultured, educated and brilliant people, of many good traits and characteristics, and of good blood and ancestry. They left a good home and a very lovely country to come to South Carolina. This book, a work of love on the part of the compiler, is a simple record of the ancestry, background, history and descendants of the immigrant ancestors, James Boyd Magill and his wife, Esther Rodgers, and their eight children.

"The early McGill (Makgill), the O'Neill, the Maitlands of Lauderdale, and the McGovern families of Ireland were related"—from an old letter.

EXTRACT, Autobiography, page 41, of (No. 163) James Robert Magill, Kershaw Co., S. C.: "My father, [No. 11] James Boyd Magill, 1799-1880, was a descendant of McGill, Viscount of Oxford [also written as Oxenford, Oxenfuird, etc.], Scotland."

EXTRACT, letter, in the *Irish-American*, New York, 17 Oct. 1877, signed "Laffen" (Michael Hennesy) to (No. 162) Thomas Rodgers Magill, 1826-1903, Charlotte, N. C.<sup>1</sup>: "Sir James Makgill, prominent in public affairs, was raised to a baronetcy in 1627, and in April 1651, was raised to the peerage under the title of Viscount of Oxford and Lord Makgill of Couseland. His son and successor, Robert Makgill, second Viscount of Oxford, had no male heirs, and thereafter the titles (though from time to time assumed by descendants of his daughters, and claimed by other Makgills of his kindred) were classed, as they are now, among the dormant peerages of Scotland."<sup>1</sup>

## Chapter 2

### GEORGE FREDERIC MAGILL

1762-1828, Ireland

George Frederic Magill (1762-1828), son of Neill Magill I (1729-1785), son of Arthur Magill I (1704-1741) son of John Magill, an officer in the Army of King William III.

- (5) George Frederic Magill<sup>1</sup> (son of No. 3), b. August 1762 in Antrim, Co. Antrim, N. Ireland; d. 7 May, 1828 at Kenbilly<sup>2</sup> community, Broughshane, Co. Antrim and is buried in the Broughshane First Presbyterian church cemetery. He was married on 12 Nov., 1786 in the house of John Boyd in Kupu, Broughshane by Rev. Charles Brown to Sarah Boyd, b. 29 July, 1754, d. 26 July, 1835, Broughshane; buried beside her husband, the daughter of Robert Boyd and Grace Hartley (see Chapter 31, Allied Families; *Boyd and Hartley*). The original Magill Family Register written by their son, No. 7, Rev. Robert Magill says that "George and Sarah [Boyd] Magill are buried in the Burying ground, Broughshane, at the tomb west of the Meeting-house" and the accompanying small drawing shows their graves placed side by side.

## Chapter 3

### REV. ROBERT MAGILL, D.D.

1788-1839, Ireland

Rev. Robert Magill (1788-1839), son of George F. Magill (1762-1828), son of Neill Magill I (1729-1785), son of Arthur Magill I, (1704-1741), son of John Magill, an officer in the Army of King William III.

- (7) Rev. Robert Magill<sup>1</sup> (son of No. 5), M. A.; b. 7 Sept. 1788, Kenbilly, Broughshane, Co. Antrim, N. Ireland; a Presbyterian minister for 19 yrs.; compiler of the original "voluminous" Magill Family Register which is still in existence in Belfast, N. Ireland; d. 19 Feb. 1839, Antrim, buried at Templepatrick, "later his body was raised and interred at Donegore." He was m. 1st on 11 Dec. 1823 by Rev. William Wray to Ann Jane Skelton, b. 18 Nov. 1803, Templepatrick, Ireland; baptized by Rev. Robert Campbell; d. 14 Sept. 1832, after only 6 hrs. illness of cholera;<sup>2</sup> the oldest dau. of Samuel Skelton and Elizabeth Birnie.

He was m. 2nd on 11 June 1838 by Rev. Dr. Cook to Ellen Liggat (being her 1st husband), 2nd dau. of James Liggat, Ballyrobin. No ch. of his 2nd m.

(No. 7) Rev. Robert Magill,<sup>1</sup> 1788-1839, served first as a school-teacher at Ballyporte and later in Broughshane, his birthplace. In 1811 he determined to study for the church, placed himself under the tuition of Rev. John Paul, D.D. of Carrickfergus, and in 1813 matriculated in the University of Glasgow, Scotland. According to the usual custom of the Ulster students of that day, he walked all of the distance from his home to Glasgow, except the 12 hour water passage. He attended some medical classes as well as his ministerial studies and graduated, M. M., in 1817. He spent the long vacations in teaching school at Broughshane. He was a gifted writer and his best known poems are *The Fall of Algiers*, *Currie's Elegy*, *The Thinking Few* and a book, *Poems on Various Subjects, Chiefly Religious*, published 1834, Belfast.

On 11 Aug. 1818 he was licensed by the presbytery of Ballymena, synod of Ulster, and on 20 June 1820, following four Sundays of trial preaching and a unanimous call, he was ordained in First Antrim Presbyterian Church (then called Millrow) N. Ireland as successor to their third pastor, Rev. Alexander Montgomery, 1750-17 Oct. 1820, who also, like Rev. Robert Magill was a descendant of Lord Montgomery, and a native of Broughshane.<sup>1</sup> Those who remembered Rev. Magill's coming say it was like life from the dead. The gospel was preached with great fervor and power. The Meeting-House could not accommodate all who came and many stood during the sermon or until some arose, that those standing might sit. A feature of his ministry was the accuracy with which he kept the records of the families in the congregation. His curious register, containing in places drawings of human figures to represent the members of the household, baptisms, marriages and deaths is deposited in the Historical Society's Office at Church House, in Belfast.

"Rev. Robert Magill exercised a many-sided ministry and especially fostered education. He mentioned examining in many schools and also helped students. In his diary he speaks of examining Robert Gamble of Islandreagh for two hours on Greek and Latin authors. He also records in his Baptismal register of a John Houston of Antrim: 'In 1820 I gave him a premium of 10d. for repeating 19 Psalms. He afterward committed the whole book of Psalms, for which I gave him half a guinea as a premium; and having offered him a guinea if he would commit the New Testament, in two months he was able to repeat the whole of it, for which I gave him one guinea.'"

Neill Magill II, (1791-1854), son of George Magill (1762-1828), son of Neill Magill I (1729-1785), son of Arthur Magill (1704-1741), son of John Magill, an officer in the Army of King William III.

Robert Magill, left the homeplace and settled in Antrim, N. Ireland, and his younger brother, (No. 11) James Boyd Magill migrated to Chester Co., South Carolina, U.S.A. (No. 8) Neill Magill remained on the Magill homeplace and 140 acre farm, where his descendants continued to live until 1951. See Chap. 5, (No. 46), David Magill.

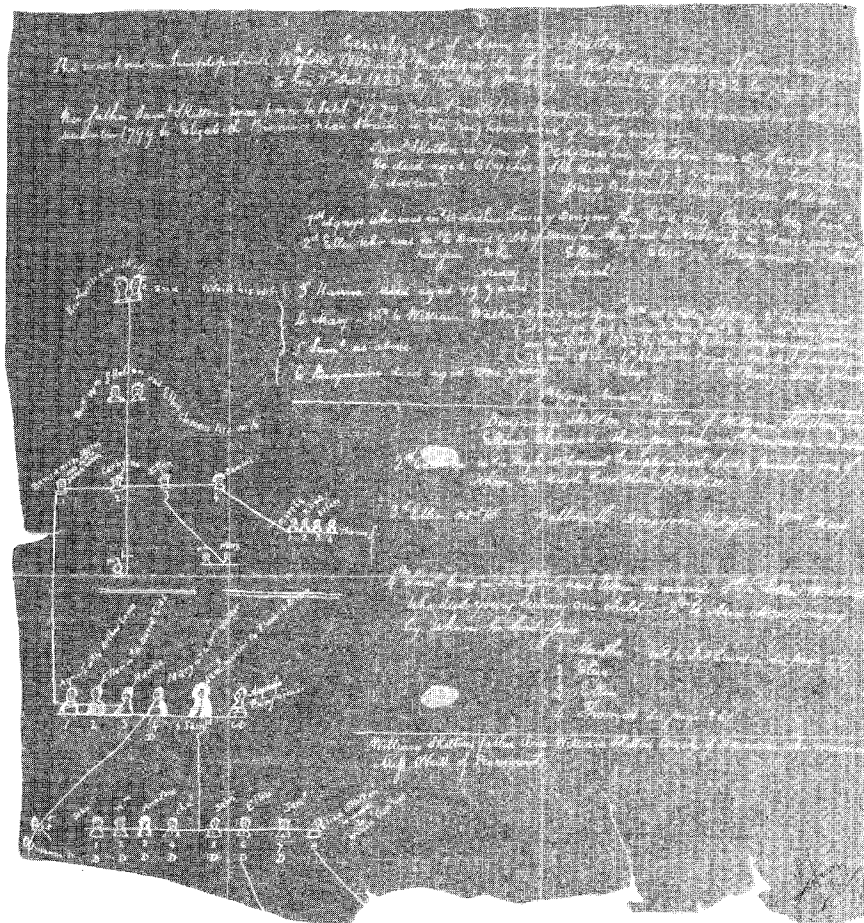

The Magills were keenly interested in the First Broughshane Presbyterian Church, and were largely responsible for its reconstruction in 1925-26. David planned the building of a Church Hall, but died suddenly of angina before the work was begun and George caused the work to be completed as planned."

EXTRACT, *First Antrim Presbyterian Church*, by Rev. M. Ma-jury, B.A., B.D., Antrim, Ireland, 1935; pages 15-17:

(No. 49) Rev. George Magill, D.D., Presbyterian minister of N. Ireland from 1854 to 1902, was moderator of the Synod of Belfast in 1883. He served all his congregations with great zeal, devotion and efficiency; for many years was a prominent figure and one of the best debaters in the meetings of the General Assembly, and was one of the leaders of the Purity Party in the "praise controversies." He took a deep interest in education and advocated the system of National Education in press, platform and assembly.

When the congregation of Millrow (now the First Antrim Presbyterian Church) needed a minister in 1859, they did not go beyond the bounds of their own Presbytery, but called the Rev. George Magill, a nephew of their beloved earlier pastor, the great (No. 7) Robert Magill. Shortly after this, the beautiful church erected during the pastorate of Rev. Robert Magill was destroyed by fire, and Rev. George Magill had the tragic burden of rebuilding it. On the Sunday following the fire, he preached in the Court House from the text, "Our holy and beautiful house where our fathers praised Thee, is burned up with fire and all our pleasant things are laid desolate," Isaiah 14:11.

He had a fine command of good English and was able to put his points in incisive and felicitous language, and to retain the friendship of even those most strongly opposed to his views. He died, full of years and honor, leaving behind him the influence of a strong personality and happy memories of abounding kindness of heart.

1799-1880; County Antrim, Ireland to Chester Co., S.C.

James Boyd Magill (1799-1880), the son of George Magill (1762-1828), son of Neill Magill I (1729-1785), son of Arthur Magill (1704-1741), son of John Magill, an officer in the army of King William III.<sup>1</sup>

James Boyd Magill is said to have been a very industrious, intelligent man, of initiative and natural ability, unwavering integrity and high principles—characteristics common to this Magill family. He taught school many years in what was called "his" academy at Lewisville, now Richburg, Chester Co., S. C. When he became too old to

go to the schoolroom, a group of young men of the community came regularly to classes which he taught in his home. Most, and probably all, of his daughters were schoolteachers. He also read and practiced law.

His wife, Esther Rodgers Magill, is said to have descended from a fine, religious minded family of Ireland, probably, like him, of County Antrim. When they came to South Carolina several months after their marriage, she brought a goodly supply of household linens made of Irish flax which she had carded, spun and woven herself. It is said that it took them six months to cross the ocean, arriving here in the fall of 1823, and that her first child was born about three months after their arrival.

In the winter of 1868 she moved to Brazil, where her husband was successful in his business enterprises and liberally used his income on the education of his children, one of whom at the age of 22 years held the responsible position of Vice Consul General of the United States at Rio de Janeiro. Mrs. Miller was educated at a Moravian school located at Salem in this state (North Carolina). She was very zealous in the cause of education and was a consistent member of the Presbyterian church from an early age. She leaves a husband and four children, three of whom are in Brazil and one in South Carolina."

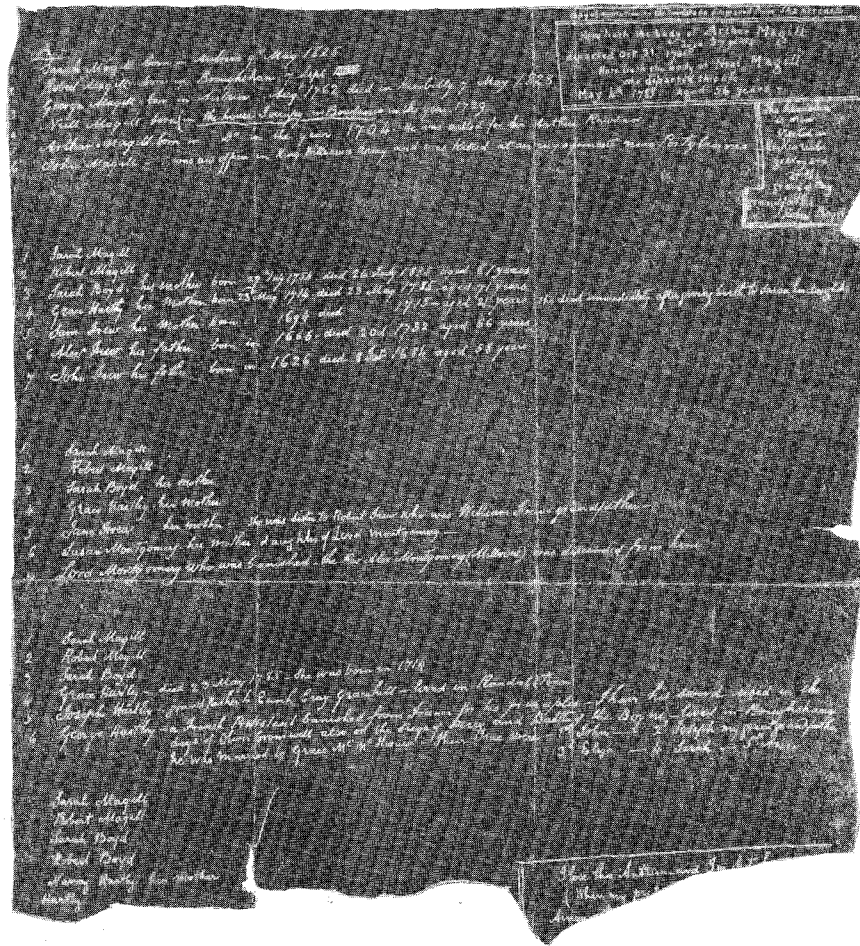

## Chapter 10

### THOMAS RODGERS MAGILL

1826-1903

Thomas Rodgers Magill (1826-1903), the son of James Boyd Magill (1799-1880), the immigrant from Ireland.

Calvary ("The Lancaster Grays"); was not wounded, but always suffered from the effects of the exposure. He was serving, 1850, as postmaster of Lancaster, S. C., and 1861 as postmaster of Cureton, Lancaster Co., where his store was on the N. C. side and his home just across the state line in S. C. He removed to Charlotte, N. C. in 1871, where he was in the retail and wholesale grocery business until retirement in 1894; was one of the founders of the Charlotte A.R.P. church and a trustee of Erskine College, Due West, S. C.; was repeatedly elected on Charlotte, N. C., city board of alderman; poet and author of *The Poems of T. R. Magill*, 1880. "He was a good mixer, firm in his own convictions, but never disputing the same right to others. An outstanding characteristic was his religious zeal. He was proud of his race and of his Irish fatherland, and always had a sincere love of his kindred and his native South." When a young man, he visited his Magill relatives in Ireland, and brought back to S. C. a shortened form of the original Magill Family Register, still treasured in many families today.<sup>1</sup> He was married on 10 Dec. 1851 by Rev. D. P. Robinson to Elizabeth Ann Heath of Charlotte, N. C., dau. of Moses Chappell Heath and Mary Morrow.

EXTRACT, Letter, — Oct. 1877, by Thomas Rodgers Magill, Charlotte, N. C.: "..... my father [No. 11 James Boyd Magill] was born in Broughshane, Parish of Racavan, Barony of Lower Antrim, County Antrim, Ireland, in 1799. He had two brothers, [No. 7] the Rev. Robert Magill and [No. 8] Neill Magill. Rev. Robert Magill married a Skelton and lived in the town of Antrim and there possessed a fine lot on Bowline [Bowlane] Street on a portion of the old lands of the Magills, who once owned large possessions on Lough Neagh. Shane's Castle was their burial place. The bones of [No. 2] Arthur Magill, [my great-greatgrandfather] still rest there, but his monument, after the burning of Shane's Castle in 1816, was removed by [No. 7] Rev. Robert Magill and his brother [No. 8] Neill Magill and placed in a Presbyterian cemetery in Kirkinriola over the remains of the Boyd family. The Magill lettering was taken off this tombstone, and that of Boyd was substituted."<sup>1</sup> This Kirkinriola cemetery is about two miles east of Ballymena, Co. Antrim, Ireland.

James Robert Magill I (1828-1907), son of James Boyd Magill (1799-1880), the immigrant from Ireland.

C., Chronicle, 1890-1900, and reveal his ability as a thinker, writer and public speaker.

He was married on 1 Sept. 1852 by Rev. D. W. Seale to Rebecca Jane Baxter Fraser, b. 21 Sept. 1832, Kershaw Co., S. C.; she attended Grenada, Mississippi, Female Academy; d. 21 July 1868, Lancaster, S. C., buried there near her father in Old Presbyterian cemetery, the dau. of Rev. Elias Lynch Fraser and his first wife, Ann E. Williams, Kershaw Co., S. C. See Chapter 31, Allied Families: *Fraser, Turley and Williams* (1).

James Robert Magill, I was married second on 17 Nov. 1869 by Rev. John S. Croxton to Jane Baxter Fraser, a younger half-sister of his first wife, b. 23 April 1838, Kershaw or Lancaster Co., S. EXTRACT: "Life Sketch of (No. 163) State Senator James R. Magill," written by himself in 1902.

The subject of this sketch was born on the 2nd day of April, 1828 near Lewisville in Chester District, South Carolina. His ancestry were Scotch Presbyterian and French Huguenots; his parents were born and were married in County Antrim, Ireland. They emigrated in 1823 to America and settled in Chester District, S. C. where they remained the balance of their lives. James B. Magill, the father of the author of this sketch, was a descendant of McGill, "Viscount of Oxford." The motto on their family coat of arms is "Sine Fine." The crest is a phenix in flames and three martletts. He received a good English education—principally from his father who was an experienced teacher.

In the Spring of 1863 a Conscription Act was passed, calling overseers into military service. In many cases, slave owners had employed overseers and gone into military service themselves. To have forced these overseers into the army during the absence of their employers

would have resulted in a failure of crops and consequent starvation of the Army—as well as soldiers' families. Hence on the 16th day of May 1863, the subject of this sketch addressed a letter to the Confederate President, Jefferson Davis, asking that said Act be suspended, to which he received the following reply:

“James R. Magill, Esquire. Pleasant Hill, S. C.—Sir:—Your letter of the 16th inst. recommending the suspension of the recent Act of Congress, calling certain overseers into military service until the present crops are made, has been referred by the President to this Department for reply. The Department recognizes the soundness of the conclusion contained in the letter and appreciates the importance of preserving the supervision of the owners and superintendents of plantations during the remainder of the season and the Bureau of Conscription has been instructed to continue as far as necessary for the purpose, the relations previously existing under the laws until the crops shall be secured.—Respectively, James A. Seddon, Secretary of War.”

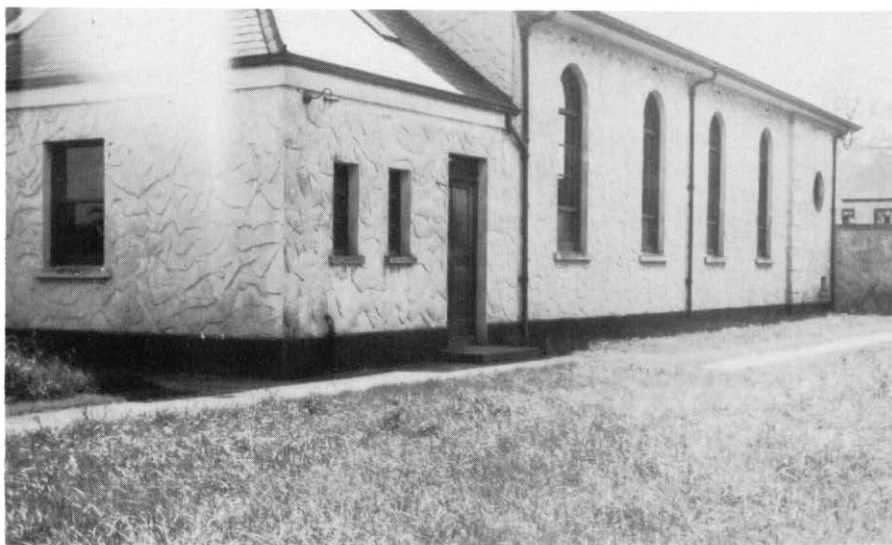

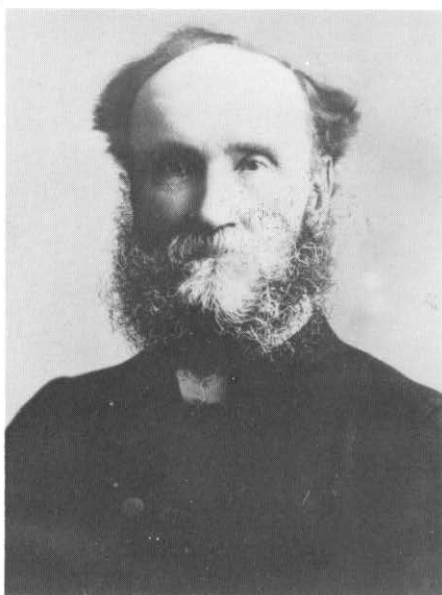

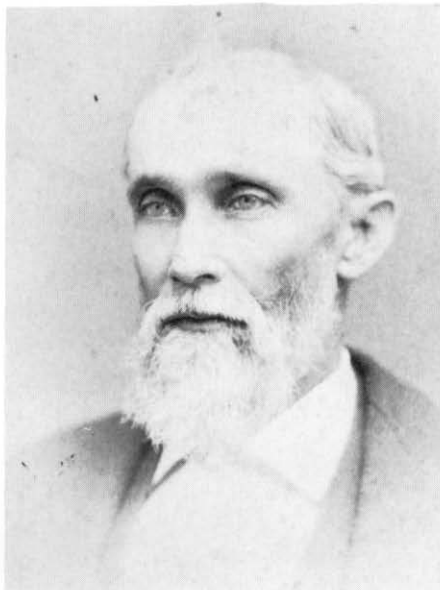

#### BOYD<sup>2</sup>

The Boyd family, wearers of the Stuart tartan, one of the earliest and most famous clans of Scotland, may have come there earlier from England, and for many centuries has played an important part in Scottish history. It was said that Robert Boyd I, son of Simon, was remarkable for his fair complexion and hence was called Boyt or Boyd from the Celtic word Boidh, meaning "fair". In 1745, James Boyd,

Earl of Kilmarnock,<sup>1</sup> Scotland, joined the Scottish Highland clans who supported Bonnie Prince Charles' claims to the throne of England, and in the second Jacobite Rebellion, known as "The Forty-Five", was taken prisoner in the decisive Battle of Culloden Moor, 16 April 1746. He was sent to the Tower of London, tried with other prisoners of war, and executed as a traitor to England in Aug. 1746. The Scottish Highland Clan of Fraser of Inverness-shire also took a leading part in the Jacobite Rebellion and their chieftain, Sir Simon Fraser, Lord Lovat, was also taken prisoner, sent to the Tower of London and beheaded as a traitor on 9 April 1746. See Chap. 31, Allied Family: *Fraser*. Only a few leaders were executed for their part in this Scottish uprising against the King of England; nearly a thousand others were condemned to death, but had their sentences commuted.

The colors of the coat-of-arms of the Boyds of Kilmarnock, Scotland are: base, green; squirrels, brown; shield, maroon with green and gold check; motto, "Confido, Virtute, Industria," blue.

Members of this Fowler family in America are direct descendants of Sir Richard Fowler of England, hero of the Third Crusade.

"Many Highland clans of Scotland were founded in the fourteenth and fifteenth centuries. Among these was the Clan Fraser of Lovat, whose lands lay largely in East and Central Inverness-shire, Scotland. This clan grew rapidly, largely because of the good fortune and intelligence of its chiefs, who did not come to the Highlands as conquerors or refugees but as legal heirs to former rulers in an established society.

The first authentic document connecting a Fraser with the lands

of Lovat and the Ard or Aird (the Coastal Strip and Hinterland) is dated 12 Sept. 1367.

The first of the name of Fraser—and the spellings vary greatly—undoubtedly came from France, though exactly when and whence is not known. Whatever their origin or the precise spelling of their name, Frasers appear as landholders in England during the twelfth and thirteenth centuries. In Scotland the first recorded is one Simon Fraser, who in 1160, gave a large tract of land to the monks of Kelso. The Frasers, of Norman descent, moved from East Lothian, their first stop in Scotland, to Tweeddale in the twelfth and thirteenth centuries, and later to the shires of Aberdeen and Inverness. (A line of Frasers owned Oliver Castle, County Peebles in the thirteenth and fourteenth centuries.<sup>1</sup>)”

The Clan Fraser of Lovat has long played an important part in the history both of Scotland and of many other countries of the world. This clan under the leadership of its chieftain, Simon Fraser, 11th Lord Lovat (12th by some writers' way of numbering), took a leading part in the Scottish Jacobite Rebellion, siding with “Bonnie” Prince Charles Edward Stuart, the “Young Pretender”, 1720-1788, in his effort to depose King George II of England and take the throne. This uprising was defeated on 16 April 1746 in the Battle of Culloden Moor, about 6 miles east of Inverness, Scotland. Simon Fraser, 11th Lord Lovat, fled for his life, but was captured on 7 June 1746 after a period of wandering, imprisoned in the Tower of London, tried on a charge of treason against the English king, condemned to death, beheaded on Tower Hill, London on 9 April 1749 and buried there in the Chapel of the Tower.<sup>2</sup> (See Chapter 31, Allied Family: *Boyd*.)

EXTRACT, from an address, *The Recollections of a Thirteen Year old Boy of the First Year of the War in Virginia*, by Hon. W. D. Trantham, Camden, S. C. and delivered 1 Aug. 1896:<sup>1</sup> Samuel Dickinson Jones "teacher of the Sand Hill school in his home community when the War Between the States began," joined the Flat Rock Guards (now Kershaw, S. C.) when it was organized in early 1861 and marched away with it to Camden, S. C. for the Virginia battleground on 28 April 1861. During camp at Fairfax Court House, Va. on 10 July 1861, two companies, the Brooks Guards of Charleston, S. C., and the Flat Rock Guards were placed on picket duty about three miles from camp, and near Bull Run. Dickinson Jones had not been on picket and on his request, exchanged places with his 13 yr. old soldier friend and mess-mate, W. D. Trantham of Camden, S. C., who had already been on picket. On 17 July 1861, enemy troops marched across the Southerners' front in an effort to turn their left flank. Ordered to fall back at once, Gen. Kershaw of Camden, S. C., refused to move until his picket returned. Just then the picket appeared, were given hearty cheers, rejoined the regiment and all marched off at double-quick, barely two minutes ahead of being captured.

Samuel Dickinson Jones took part in this retreat to Centerville, Va., about three miles from Bull Run. It was a fast march on a very hot day and the men suffered greatly. One died of sunstroke and

others were sick for a long time. The regiment marched back to Bull Run, three miles distant, after midnight.

Several days later, on 21 July 1861, the real First Battle of Bull Run began. Along with others, the men of Kershaw's Flat Rock Guards moved forward to cross a mown wheat field, which was surrounded by a fence. They easily crossed the first fence and the wheat field, but encountered some trouble when they met the enemy at the fence on the other side. "Among those killed at this point were Jesse Nettles of Co. E., S. Dickinson Jones and Robert C. Gardner of Co. G. As we were crossing the fence Dickinson Jones told me he would see that I was cared for if I should be wounded, and I promised to perform the same office for him . . . The 2nd Regiment did not have on its roll four more gallant spirits than those brave young men who were the first to give their lives in defense of their country—Edward Barrett (killed before he reached the front), Jesse Nettles, Dickinson Jones and Robert Gardner."

### LUCK<sup>1</sup>

Francis Luck, nominated as a captain of the Virginia Militia at a meeting of the Committee of Safety for Pittsylvania Co., Va. on 27 Sept. 1775 and made a colonel on 10 March 1780, is possibly the same one that is mentioned in a 1756 Cumberland Co., Va.; deed as the previous owner of 150 acres on south side of Deep Creek. He lived in Pittsylvania Co., Va. as early as 1767, died in 1781 and the household of his widow, Sarah Luck, is the only one (Luck) listed in the 1782 and 1785 county census. His will names sons John, Nathaniel and Richard Hubbard Luck, 7 dau. and a granddau., Mary, only child of his son, Joseph Luck.

### MONTGOMERY (Scotland to Ireland)

The Montgomery family is a very ancient and honorable family of Scotland, and there are many references to its members in records of early Scottish genealogy and history.

"Robert of Montgomery obtained from Walter, 1st High Steward of Scotland, in the latter half of the 12th centry, the lands of Eaglesham in county Renfrew."<sup>1</sup>

His descendant:

9. Sir Hugh Montgomery, Knight; 6th Laird of Braidstane; styled Privy Counsellor in a deed dated 23 May 1618; was raised to the peerage of Ireland, 1622, as first Lord Viscount Montgomery and Earl of Mount Alexander of the Ards, County Down, Ireland. About 1600. King James I, of England gave to Sir Hugh Montgomery a grant to vast areas of land in and around County Down, Ireland, and in May 1606 Montgomery left Scotland and began his colonization of these lands, called the Settlement, or Plantation.<sup>1</sup> With him came members of allied families, among them, Shaw, Boyd, Nevin, Moore, Neill, and Catherwood. Montgomery gave large tracts of land to these and they became minor gentry of the country. (See Chapter 31, Allied Families: *Boyd* and *Rawdon*.)

Sir Hugh Montgomery settled his vast estates in Northern Ireland with a Plantation of sturdy Scots, built for himself a princely mansion and established towns, churches and schools. He married 1st, about 1587, Elizabeth Shaw, sister of John Shaw of Greenock, Scotland; he m., 2d, the Viscountess of Wigtown, S. Scotland. He died in 1636 and was buried at Newtownards.<sup>2</sup>

10. Hugh, second Viscount Montgomery, b. about 1598, Scotland; removed to Ireland in 1608; a Royalist Colonel in the Irish Rebellion of 1641; died suddenly of a "drowsy distemper" on 15 Nov. 1642, aged 45 yrs. He m., about 1623, Jean Alexander,

At the same time King James I also granted vast neighboring lands to James Hamilton, Earl of Claneboye, of Scotland, who also made a similar Plantation in Ireland.

oldest dau. of Sir William Alexander, Earl of Stirling, the King's Secretary for Scotland.

His oldest son:

Hugh, third Viscount Montgomery, Earl of Mount-Alexander, "with the heart of oak for honesty and fidelity to right principles; most likeable of the Montgomerys;" was b. about 1623; resided at Comber; d. suddenly 15 Sept. 1663 of the same "drowsy distemper" of his father; buried at Newtown. He m., 1st, in Dec. 1648, Mary Moore, d. 1655, sister of Henry, first Viscount Moore. He m., 2nd, in 1660, Catherine (Jones) Parsons, dau. of Arthur Jones, second Viscount Ranelagh.

In the political troubles between the King and Oliver Cromwell, Montgomery sided with the King, and was appointed General of the Royalist forces in Ulster. When the King and his forces were defeated, Lord Montgomery surrendered to Cromwell and was banished to Holland, 1650-51; his estates were confiscated and heavy fines were levied against him.<sup>1</sup> At the end of the winter, 1652, he petitioned Oliver Cromwell to be allowed to return and his request, was granted, under certain conditions. On 29 May 1660, Charles II became King of England, and Montgomery's political troubles were over. He was created Earl in 1661 and received new land grants, honors and appointments.

The immigrant ancestor, Thomas Parker, sailed 11 March 1635 from London with the company which filled the ships *Susan* and *Ellen*, fitted out by Sir Richard Saltonstall Lord Mayor of London. It is tradition that he was connected by marriage with the Saltonstall family and it is probable that his lineage ran back to the ancient Parker line of Browsholme, England. Thomas Parker settled first at Lynn, Mass., later removing to Reading, Mass., and became an influential, prominent citizen and an extensive landowner."

Daily Spy*, 21 March 1854, which he signed "Plebian" asking for "all opposed to the extension of slavery and who would like to form colonies to emigrate to the West" to meet at Worcester City Hall on Tuesday, 18 April 1854. This aroused widespread interest and resulted in the sending of colonies to Kansas and Nebraska. However, Henry Parker, who had started the movement, died shortly before the meeting that he had called, and the fact that he had not signed his name to the call prevented him from receiving the credit that he deserved."

## RHODES<sup>1</sup>

(Switzerland to Virginia to South Carolina)

"Some early records state that Daniel Roth, 1703-1737, immigrated from Switzerland to Pennsylvania, having a wife, Anna Margaret and a son, Peter Roth, 1737-1814, who married Sabina Kohler. Peter Roth and his descendants are said to have taken the English form of Rhoads (Rhodes) as their surname."

There were many different spellings of this name: Road, Roads, Rhoads, Rhoades, Rhode and Rhodes. The following line of the family were "Rhodes" when they moved from Va. into N. C. and upper S. C.<sup>1</sup>

**(North Carolina to South Carolina to Mississippi)**

1. Robert Williams,<sup>1</sup> b. about 1760 in N. C., of Welsh descent;<sup>2</sup> removed before the Revolutionary War to upper Kershaw Co., S. C., became a prosperous landowner and planter, d. there 1823-25; was a Revolutionary soldier and served 30 days under Col. John Marshall.<sup>3</sup> He m., about 1796, Mary Turley ("Mollie"), b. about 1775; Kershaw Co., S. C.; d. 18 March 1842, Yalobusha (Grenada) Co., Miss., dau. of Peter Turley and Elizabeth Hiatt. See Chap. 31, Allied Family: *Turley*.

After the deaths of Robert Williams and their dau. Ann (Williams) Fraser, his widow, her remaining children and the 2 surviving small dau. of Ann, left Kershaw, S. C. and removed to Coffeeville, Yalobusha Co., Miss., where they became very large, prosperous landowners. When her grandmother, "Mollie" Williams, d. in 1842, Rebecca Jane Fraser, younger dau. of Ann (Williams) Fraser, returned to her father, Rev. Elias Lynch Fraser in Kershaw Co. and was the only member of this Williams family to return to S. C. to live.

The Robert Williams grave and family cemetery are located near the Kershaw-Camden, S. C., Highway, about 3 miles from Kershaw, on the plantation formerly owned by Duren Peach, now the property of Hoyt Stover. Rev. Elias Lynch Fraser (See Chap. 11, No. 163) who died 1851, Lancaster, S. C., was first buried in this Williams cemetery near his first wife, Ann Williams (see "d" and "2" following) and their two babies but later his remains were removed and buried in Old Presbyterian cem., Lancaster, S. C., where their youngest daughter, Rebecca Jane (Fraser) Magill (see No. 163) was buried. (All these family graves have markers.)

The following Magill Family Register was prepared several generations ago by No. 49 Rev. George Magill of Ireland from a handwritten "voluminous" and more complete family register compiled about 1839 by No. 7 Rev. Robert Magill of Ireland, who was a brother of No. 11 James Boyd Magill, the immigrant to South Carolina. Copies of the following shortened form of the "Register" have been prized possessions of Magill descendants in several countries for many years. The original, fuller *Magill Family Register by No. 7 Rev. Robert Magill* is in the possession of descendants in Ireland.

#### 1. Family Register of the Magills

The following is a correct extract from the Family Register in the possession of the Rev. George Magill, Minister of Donaghedy Presbyterian Church, in the handwriting of the late Rev. Robert Magill, Minister of Millrow Presbyterian Church, Antrim, Ireland:

"Copy of inscription on the Tombstone I removed from "Shanes Castle". The Head-stone is now erected in Kirkinriola Graveyard at the Grave of my Grandfather Robert Boyd:

"Here lieth the body of Arthur Magill aged 37 years departed this life October 31st, 1741."

"Here lieth the body of Neil Magill who departed this life May 4th, 1785, aged 56 years."

GEORGE MAGILL, born in Antrim, 1762; died in Kenbilly, 7th. May, 1828;

His Father

NEILL MAGILL, born (in the house I now occupy in Bowlane) in the year 1729;

His Father

ARTHUR MAGILL, born in the same house, in the year 1704. He was called for Sir Arthur Rawdon.

JOHN MAGILL, was an officer in King William's Army and was killed in an Engagement near Portglenone.

SARAH BOYD, wife of said George Magill, was born 29th. July, 1754, died 16th. July, 1835, aged 81 years.

JOHN BOYD, Great, Great, Grandfather of the late Rev. Robert Magill was married to Jane Forsythe and lived in Bally Garvey between Ballymena and Broughshane.

- 6th. MARGARET. Died Young.

JAMES BOYD, (the above James) was born in 1683, was married as above to Nancy Henry and secondly to Jane Davison, aunt of the late Thomas Davison, Esq., of Knockboy. He died 1759.

ROBERT, his son, was married to Grace Hartley (his second cousin) 13th. July, 1742. He was born in September 1712, and died 13th. March, 1791. She was born in May 1714 and died 23rd. May, 1785.

The "Register" contains a great mass of information too voluminous to copy, hence only the extracts giving names and dates, which are correct so far as they go.

The Rev. Dr. George Magill, born 1829, (died 1923, Country Antrim, Ireland) is a Grandson of Sarah Boyd Magill above through her son Neill Magill who was a brother to our immigrant James Boyd Ma-

gill. He therefore, is first cousin to Squire James R. Magill, and is a well known, highly honored and praised Presbyterian minister of Ireland and a nephew of the Great Rev. Dr. Robert Magill who was a son of Sarah Boyd Magill.

## 2. Historical Notes <sup>1</sup>

### MAGILL

The following notes concerning this Magill family and other related families were copied directly, many years ago, from a book, *Ireland Illustrated*, author and date of publication now unknown, "a huge volume which once belonged to (No. 162) Thomas Rodgers Magill, Charlotte, N. C." They were received too late to be included in the first chapter of this family history and are given here as valu-

able and interesting further data concerning this Magill family. Most of them bear the approval, shown by his personal signature, of No. 162 Thomas Rodgers Magill, a son of the immigrant from Ireland and known to have been much interested in acquiring and preserving the family records.

"Gilford in County Down, Ireland, was owned and settled by the Magills. They held it and a larger portion of territory by a land grant." (signed) T. R. Magill.

"Robert Magill, living in 1660, was invested with an estate, Tullycain, Co. Antrim, Ireland which became the seat of the family."

"In the year 1722 Shane O'Neill of Shane's Castle built the Claneboy Tombs or Crypts at Shane's Castle for a burial place for his own family and that of his kindred alone to be buried in. The Magills are there buried, William Hawkins Magill having married an O'Neill. Arthur and Neill Magill, my direct forefathers are there entombed"<sup>1</sup> (signed) T. R. Magill.

### BOYD

"Ballycastle, Antrim (Ireland), consists of two parts, upper and lower; the lower is usually termed Quay, and the two are joined by an avenue of fine trees. The town was almost entirely the creation of one energetic gentleman, Hugh Boyd, Esquire, to whom Alexander, Earl of Antrim, granted in 1736 a lease in perpetuity of all coals, mines, etc. from Bona-Margy to Fairhead. He built a church, erected coal furnaces, iron foundries, salt pans, glass furnaces, breweries, tanyards, and in short, obtained for the infant settlement, within a singularly short time the reputation of being the most flourishing town in Ireland . . . Hugh expended \$750,000 of his own private fortune on building up the City and Harbour of Ballycastle (Antrim) After Mr. Boyd's death, which happened in 1780, his son did not continue to work the mines."——added to this by (No. 162) T. R. Magill: "Hugh Boyd, ancestor of Magills."

Modern English description: A red shield with three birds of gold; these birds, martlets, having no feet, but short legs which do

not show, being covered with feathers from the body;<sup>1</sup> and "so given to put the younger brethren in mind to trust their wings of virtue and merit to raise them up. Thus the bearing of martlets in armory may be said to signify a person who has made a happy use of this lesson."<sup>2</sup>

The crest, an imaginary bird, the phoenix, is in natural colors of brown-black feathers and yellow beak and claws, fixed amidst orange-red flames.<sup>1</sup> "The phoenix: a mythical bird of ancient Egypt. According to popular belief, the phoenix consumed itself by fire periodically, and a new young phoenix sprang from its ashes. It was therefore considered an emblem of immortality and resurrection."<sup>3</sup>

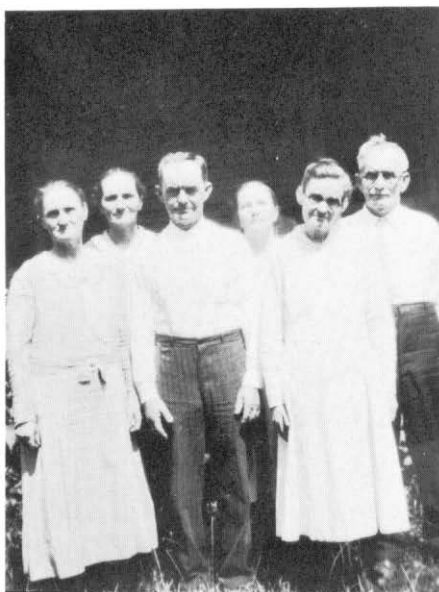

9. THE FLAT ROCK GUARDS<sup>1</sup>

2nd Regiment, South Carolina Volunteers, 1861-65

The list, *Confederate Soldiers in Virginia in 1861*, following this extract was compiled from the above address, especially for this book.

South, in January 1861, a meeting of the young men of upper Kershaw County, S. C., was called in Camden, S. C. for the purpose of organizing a company of volunteers from this area. The response was most gratifying and a company called the Flat Rock Guards was organized. The present town of Kershaw, S. C. was not named or incorporated until 1888 and this section was known as Flat Rock at that time. By common consent, Columbus Cureton Haile was chosen captain and other officers were Thomas J. Clyburn, 1st Lieutenant; Thomas R. Cantey, 2nd Lieut. and William J. Jones, 3rd Lieut.

The usual meeting place was Flat Rock (later Kershaw, S. C.) and a few days after Virginia seceded from the Union, a communication was read to the group from Col. Kershaw of Camden, S. C., asking that the Flat Rock Guards go to Virginia as a part of his regiment, the 2nd Regt., South Carolina Volunteers. The vote on this was unanimous and two days later on a bright spring day, April 28, 1861 this group left the present Kershaw, S. C. to march to Camden, S. C. to join Col. Kershaw's men there. Shortly before they reached Camden, they fell in with a similar group, the Lancaster Invincibles under Capt. Amos McManus, who had received the same invitation and were bound for the same destination.

These men were royally treated upon their arrival in Camden, and left there by train shortly after midnight, traveling by way of Sumter, S. C. where the Sumter Volunteers under Capt. John S. Richardson joined them, and on by Wilmington, N. C. They arrived at Richmond, Va., where the other companies which were to compose the 2nd Regiment, S. C. Volunteers, joined them. Among these were the Palmetto Guards, Butler Guards, Governor's Guards, Columbia reys (spelling?), Secession Guards, Brooks Guards and Camden Volunteers.

After a brief stay in Richmond they were sent on to Manassas, Va. On the way their train collided, head to head, with the train from Alexandria, Va., with the loss of one man and with serious injuries sustained by several, among them William Truesdale of Kershaw Co., S. C. The Flat Rock Guards soon took a very active part in the First Battle of Bull Run or Manassas, Va., the first important battle of the Civil War. Much credit is due both the 2nd Regiment, S. C. Volunteers and the 8th Regiment (also to Kemper's Battery and Kirby Smith Command) for the important part they played in turning the very doubtful beginning of the battle into a great Confederate victory.

Most of the brave young men from Kershaw and Lancaster who marched away to Virginia that bright April 28, 1861 filled soldiers' graves and never saw their loved ones or home again.

Perryman, Capt. W. W.—Secession Guards, 2nd Regt., S. C. Vol.

Prentiss, ————, —private, Palmetto Guards, 2nd Regt, S. C. Vol.

Pritchard,—(drummer?)

Reeder, ————, —Palmetto Guards, 2nd Regt., S. C. Vol.

Rhett, Capt. A. Burnett,—Charleston, S. C.; Brooks Guards, 2nd Regt., S. C. Vol.

Richardson, Capt. Jno. S.—Sumter Volunteers 2nd Regt., S. C. Vol.

Trantham, Hon. W. D.—13 yr. old soldier, Kershaw Co., S. C.; 2nd Regt., S. C. Vol.; survived the War, living in 1896.

Truesdel (Truesdale now), Capt. Jesse Erasmus—Flat Rock Guards, Co. G, 2nd Regt., S. C. Vol.; in First Battle of Bull Run. Va. July 1861; later wounded at Battle of Gettysburg; survived the war, returned to his home near Kershaw, S. C. to find his home,

many bales of cotton and other supplies burned up by the Northern raiders.

Truesdel (Truesdale now), William—Co. G, 2nd Regt., S. C. Vol.; seriously injured in head-to-head collision between train carrying Flat Rock Guards in Va. and train from Alexandria, Va. at Orange Court House, Va. (Probably he is the brother of Capt. Jesse E. Truesdel above, whose brother William Truesdel was killed later at the Battle of Gettysburg.)

Vaughn, Lewis—Camden Volunteers, 2nd Regt., S. C. Vol.; survived First Battle of Bull Run, went on to Richmond, Va.

Villepigue, Capt. James I.—an officer on Col. Kershaw's staff, 2nd Regt., S. C. Vol.

Wallace, Capt. William—Columbia reys, 2nd Regt., S. C. Vol.

Wardlaw, Lieut. S. Watt—7th S. C. Calvary.

Warren, Col. Thomas J. 15th Regt., S. C. Vol.; later fell at Gettysburg.

Wells, David E.—went on to Richmond, Va.
