INTRODUCTION.

In this record of what may be called the Wiltshire branch of the Moody family, no attempt has been made to carry out the side lines in the earlier generations, as the material available is too fragmentary to be of much value.

It would be interesting to know something of the origin of the family, but with any information obtainable in this country, so far as I have been able to ascertain, little can be done in this direction.

The Marquis of Ruivigny and Raineval, of Scotland, whose mother was a Moodie, is the author of a book called "The Moodie Book," privately printed and distributed in 1906. This book deals exclusively with the Moodie family in Scotland. From a copy placed in the Public Library in New York city, I find that the Scotch family was divided into two branches, known as the Moodies of Cocklaw and the Moodies of Melsetter.

They were evidently of good position and

prominent in Colonial service, holding official and military positions in India, South Africa and Canada. In several instances they have married into noble families.

The author carries their ancestry back in two lines, one of which he traces to Robert "The Bruce," King of Scotland, from 1305 to 1329, and the others to Kings James I, II, III, IV and V, reigning from 1424 to 1542.

As this ancestry in the earlier generations was in the female line, the Moodies entering by marriage, it cannot be claimed by the English family, but without doubt the Moodys of England and the Moodies of Scotland, are of the same origin. From another source I find that, about 1640, Sir Henry Moody was employed by the King of England as an Ambassador to treat with certain tribes of Indians.

Whether he was sent to America for this purpose, or had previously settled here, does not seem certain, but he probably remained as he is spoken of as being, at a later period, a prominent citizen of eastern Massachusetts.

Aside from the date of his burial, nothing is known of John Moody, the first ancestor noted in this genealogy, but he is of interest in view of the period in which he lived.

During his lifetime occurred the Civil war in England, the rise and fall of Oliver Cromwell, the execution of King Charles I, and the death of Queen Elizabeth.

John Moody and Cromwell died in the same year, 1658.

As regards occupation, the Wiltshire family seem to have been largely interested in agriculture, and in many instances held large farms on life-hold leases, sometimes for several succeeding generations.

Mention is made, however, of those who were engaged in other pursuits.

The following is quoted from "Round About Wiltshire," a book of recent date by Bradley:

"Wilton, a small town in Wiltshire, was the first place in England to embark in the manufacture of carpets, and in 1740 a Mr. Moody was granted a patent for making a certain kind of

carpet which he named Wilton, after the town where he had established his factory. This style of carpet is still known by the same name."

As Wilton is very near Upton Lovel, it is highly probable that "Mr. Moody" was a descendant of John Moody.

Thanks are due to the Reverend T. J. Lawrence, rector of the Church at Upton Lovel, who kindly furnished copies of all entries on the parish register relating to the Moody family between the dates 1653 and 1684.

GENEALOGY OF THE MOODY FAMILY.

The earliest known records of this branch of the Moody family are found on the register of the parish church at Upton Lovel, a small village on Salisbury Plain, in the County of Wiltshire, England. These records date back only to 1653.

FIRST GENERATION.

1. John Moody, Sr., died at Upton Lovel, April, 1658.

SECOND GENERATION.

2. John Moody, son of John, married Elizabeth Andrews, in 1654. He died, 1682. They had eight children, dates of baptism on register as follows :

THIRD GENERATION.

4. Edmund, second son of John, with his wife, (name not known), moved from Upton Lovel in 1684, to the parish of Horningsham, in the same county, where he purchased a life-hold estate from Lord Weymouth, the ancestor of the Marquis of Bath. They had one son, (11) Edmund, born 1686, who was early left an orphan and was brought up by two maiden aunts named Parsons.

FOURTH GENERATION.

11. Edmund, son of Edmund, born at Horningsham, in 1686, married Miss Jesser, of Frome Woodlands, in 1707.

The oldest son, Edmund, resided in the City of Bath and became very wealthy.

Thomas, the second son, occupied for many years a farm of over one thousand acres in the parish of Chittern, Wiltshire.

15. John, fourth son of Edmund, born at Horningsham, in 1720, inherited his father's estate and resided there until 1776.

He married Ezit Edwards, of an adjacent parish. They had seven children.

The family moved from Horningsham to Seymour's Court, at Beckington, Somersetshire, in 1776.

This was the manor house of the parish of Beckington, Somersetshire, and the farm comprised four hundred acres of land.

The house was at some early period used as a monastery.

Barrett, in his "History of Somersetshire," speaks of it as being "worthy of note."

It was for a long period owned by the Seymour family and was at one time the home of Lord Thomas Seymour.

John Moody died in 1798, and his wife, Ezit, in 1780.

The last of their six sons died in 1847, their average age being eighty years.

SIXTH GENERATION.

23. Thomas, fifth son of John, was born at Horningsham, in 1767, and moved to Seymour's Court, in 1776, with his parents.

He succeeded his father as lease-holder of the estate, and, in 1792, married Anna Cross, of Maiden Bradley.

John Moody, with his family, came to America, in 1830, being the first of this branch of the Moody family to leave England.

They resided for a short time in New York city; also in New Haven, finally settling in Bridgeport, in 1834.

Edmund Moody came to America, in 1852,
with his wife and children, Bessie and Charles,
then unmarried.

They lived in Bridgeport, Connecticut, until

Edmund died in 1865, and his wife, Eleanor,
in 1879, in Milwaukee Wisconsin.

28. Ezit, daughter of Thomas, married
her cousin, William Moody. They came to
America with her brother John, in 1830. Wil-
liam Moody died in 1832, leaving one daughter.

47. Mary, born 1829, who married Phile-
mon Bulkley.

Mrs. Moody afterwards married Philemon
Carpenter, of New Rochelle, N. Y. They had

They came to America, June, 1857, going directly to Kansas, and have many descendants in Kansas and neighboring states.

The family remained in England, with the exception of John, who came to America about 1866. He went first to Milwaukee, and later to Kansas, where he married his cousin, Margaret Moody.

They first went to Washington county, where Mrs. Mary Butler and four of her children had lived for some years, but moved to Milwaukee, in 1863, where Edmund Moody died, September 7, 1905, and his wife, Susan, March 21, 1892.
