#### Will of Lyonel Wheatley:

Imp. I give to my three youngest children by Abigail, my last wife, viz: Martha, William, & Abigail, £50 apiece, hesides the land given by my Father-in-law, Thomas Matson, and my uncle, Theodore Atkinson, to my said wife and her heirs, namely the children aforesaid, and also what shall be the part of my father-in-law Matson's estate after the death of my mother-in-law. (After mention of three children by first wife, he gives:) To Abigail, Martha, & William one guiney of gold and two rings; (also to Abigail) five pewter dishes, which are in the hands of my mother-in-law Matson.

143. <u>ABIGAIL WHEATLEY</u>, daughter of Lyonel Wheatley and his second wife , Abigail Matson, born Jun. 9, 1677, was married by Mr. Benjamin Coleman, Aug. 28, 1701, to <u>CAPTAIN SIMON SLOCOMB</u>. They had two children. She died in 1707, and, Nov. 11, 1708, he married Elizabeth Cashier. Captain Simon Slocomb was a seaman and commander of the sloop "Seaflower", used as a transport in his majesty's service. He served from Dec. 27, 1723 to Apr. 24, 1724, and from Nov. 20, 1724 to Sept. 2, 1725.

Eastern expedition. Journal of Colonel Thomas Westbrook, 1723-5: 1723, May 8. Sailed (from Falmouth) for Winter Harbor, Captain Slocomb being left shore sick.

May 15, proceeded to Casco in a whale-boat.

May 16, Slocomb's sloop came in from Biddeford.

May 30, 1723, Georgetown, about Noon, arrived with Mr. Slocum from Casco Bay.

Letters from Colonel Thomas Westbrook:

Falmouth, Sept. 8, 1724, \* \* \* Captain Slocum arrived the 7th curr<sup>t</sup> with 24 fierlocks, w<sup>ch</sup> was not as many as wee wanted and sundry necessaries, as Blanketts, shoes, stockins, &c., which the men could not march before they had y<sup>m</sup>, &c. \* \* \*

Fort Mary, Feb'y 16, 1725. \* \* \* I am dispatching Captn. Slocum immediately with capt. Bean for georges, their Being an interpreter wanting. Falmouth, 22d June, 1725. \* \* \* I would have sent Capt. Slocum with the Hostages before this had there been any winds,tho'loth to part with the sloop till another sloop arrived, it being of absolute necessity to have one constantly here, we having frequent occasion to remove Provision from place to place according to our marches. \* \* \*

#### WHEATLEY.

Falmouth, July 8, 1725. \* \* \* If Capt. Slocum be not sailed, it would be for the service to send him (Mr. Bell, a pilot) with Slocum, & if he be, to send him by the first; wee very much want Slocum.

Letter from Commissioners John Stoddard and John Wainwright:

On Board the Sloop Merry-Meeting, at New Castle, Jun 28th, 1725.

\* \* \* Since we wrote, Capt. Slocum came into this Harbour with two Indians.

P. S. - This goes by Captn. Slocum, who we desire may be dispatched to Casco Bay, as soon as may be, where we shall leave directions where we may be found. \* \* \*

Letter from Wm. Dummer to Commrs. Stoddard and Wainwright:

July 9, 1725. \* \* \* I hope ere this you'l receive my letter by Capt. Heath, who sailed yesterday Morning in Capt. Slocum.

Col. Westbrook writes from Falmouth, July 13, 1725, stating Capt. Heath arrived on the 11th, and again from York, August 25, 1725, saying "Capt. Slocum arrived here last night from Falmouth."

The sloop Seaflower was about "60 Tonns, w<sup>th</sup>4 Guns." By his second wife, Elizabeth Cashier, Captain Simon Slocomb had six Children: 3. John, born Sept. 22, 1709, died young; 4. Elizabeth, born Aug. 4, 1711; 5. Mary, born May 19, 1714, married ..... Thayer;

1431. <u>CAPTAIN SIMON SLOCOUR</u>, JR., son of Captain Simon Slocomb and his first wife, Abigail Wheatley, born in Boston, Jul. 26, 1705, married <u>ABIGAIL METCALF</u>, daughter of Eleazer Metcalf of Wrentham, Mass. His name appears on a petition to the General Court, June, 1736, for a separate church in Wrentham. This was granted Feb. 16, 1738, and the deed for an acre of land for the meeting-house was put in his charge. He was precinct clerk in Franklin, Mass., in 1740-3, 1748, and 1752, and moved to Medway, Mass. later. A deed dated Nov. 5, 1758, gives his residence as Medway. Their first four children were born at Wrentham.

In the expedition against Canada, he commanded a company in Colonel Hoseph William's regiment. May 25, 1757, the soldiers receipt in full for their billeting money. May 23, 1758, there is a list of men enlisted to serve under him. His company served till June 26, 1760.

take some indirect Measures for their own Relief, which I should be very sorry for, as I very much expect will be the case Except some Method be taken to Make them More Easy than they appear to be at present. Many of these Soldiers are men of Substance, having farms of their own, which must in a Grate Measure now Lie unimproved, so that they are sinking in their estates beyond what their wages will amount to. Which not only hurts the Men and their families, but the Publick also, for as the Men in 59 were Rased by a Levey, these Men went to Do their own turn in the War, with a full Expectation of being relieved the first of November last, Relying on the faith of the Gouernment.

Therefor your Memoralist Prays that this Hon<sup>ble</sup> Court, on whose Patarnal Care and Conduct the Soldier depends, would take the Case and Curcumstances of these Poor Soldiers into your wise and Prudant consideration, and in your wisdom Contrive Some Way that these Poor Discontented Soldiers may be relieved, and your Memoralist, as in Duty Bound, Shall Ever Pray.

GOVERNOR OF CONDECTICUT. 133373. HONORABLE VILLIAM ALFRED BUCKINGHAN. UNITED STATES SENATOR FROM CONNECTICUT, son of Samuel Buckingham and Joanna Matson, his wife, was born at Lebanon, New London, Co., Conn., May 28, 1804. His early education was obtained at the local schools and at Bacon Academy, Colchester, Conn. He taught in the district school for one winter, and worked on his father's farm three years, when, in 1822, he took a clerkship in a store in Norwich, whither, in 1826, after a short service as clerk in New York, he returned and engaged in the dry goods business for himself. In 1830 he added the manufacture of ingrain carpets, and piloted his business successfully through the great crisis of 1837. In 1848, he, with two or three associates, began the manufacture of rubber shoes, with which he was connected through the remainder of his life. He was mayor of Norwich in 1849, 1850, 1856 and 1857; presidential elector in 1856; and was elected governor in 1858, to which office he was chosen for eight consecutive terms, for the last of which he received a majority unprecedented in the history of the state.

#### BUCKINGHAM.

Governor Buckingham was married at Norwich, Sept. 27, 1830, to ELIZA RIPLEY, daughter of Doctor Dwight Ripley and Eliza Coit, his wife, by whom he had two children, one of whom, a daughter, still survives. Mrs. Buckingham died Apr. 19, 1868. The family life of Governor Buckingham was most attractive, the spirit of the household being one of cheerfulness, kindness and boundless hospitality. He died at his home in Norwich, Conn., Feb. 5, 1875, a short time before his senatorial term was completed. The day of his funeral was observed in the state, and was one of general mourning in the city of his residence. His hospitable home, which had included among its guests Lincoln, Grant, Garfield, and manyaother notable man, was thronged for hours by a ceaseless procession of the high and the lowly, to take a last look at the face they had loved and reverenced. Upon his monument in Yantic cemetery in Norwich is this inscription: "William Alfred Buckingham, governor of Connecticut (1858-1866), U. S. Senator (1869-1875). His courage was dauntless. His will inflexible. His devotion to duty supreme. His faith in God absolute." In 1898 the home of the "war governor" was bought by Sedgwick post, No. 1, G. A. R., to be known as the "Buckingham Memorial." Previously the Connecticut branch, Sons

of the American Revolution, had bought, as a memorial of the "war

governor of the revolution", Trumbull's "war office" at Lebanon.



The following biographical notice is contained in a note to the 19th volume of Day's Connecticut Reports of cases in Litchfield County, page 533:-" Judge Waite's absence from the Court, during the whole of this term was occasioned by the illness of his son George C. Waite, Esq., and his expected return to his native place. His father wished to be at home to receive him; and he was not deprived of this melancholy satisfaction. The young nan returned with a fatal disease fastened upon his lunge. He languished until the 11th of August, when he died. ' ?urpureus voluti que flos succisus aratro Languescit Boriens. He was born in Lyne, Aug. 13, 1820, and was graduated at Male College in 1840. He read law in his father's office about a year and a helf, and then reseved to Troy, N. Y. and completed his studies under the instruction of George Gould, Reg., a see of the late Judge Gould. He was admitted to the bar in the state of New York in 1844 and immediately aftermards entered upon the practice of the law in Troy. Although he began

his professional career mong strangers, without patronage, and in a crowled profession, yet by his increatry, integrity, and aniable deportment, he soon rose to an honorable rank among his brethern and obtained a fair proportion of business. He was also the respect and confidence of his associates at the bar. During his residence in Troy, he was an active and efficient member of the heard of education, and to him is that city mainly indeited for its present free school system, which promises so much benefit to the rising generation.

"His memory will long be cherished and his loss mourned, not only by his immediate relatives but by all with whom he was acquainted. On hearing of his death the members of the bar of the County of Rensellaer held a meeting at the Court house in Troy, the Hon. Abram B. Olin in the chair, expressing their grief at his departure, and their high appreciation of his professional and private character, of the soundness of his understanding, and the goodness of his heart, with a tender of their condolence and sympathies to his parents and other relatives."

Among his papers, after his decease, a memorandum was found containing the following rules evidently written for his private use.

#### "Therefore to succeed

- "1. I must practice economy in every possible way.
- "2. Hust improve every moment by study.
- "3. Hust make every honorable effort to get business.
- "4. Must do in private as I would do in public.
- "5. Must improve every opportunity to speak in public.
- "6. Must practice speaking when alone.
- "7. Must rise early in the morning.
- "8. Must extend my acquaintance as fast and as far as practicable.
- "9. Must endeavor to make myself sociable and popular among my associates.
- "10. Must improve every opportunity to cultivate the art of conversation.
- "11. And last, though by no means least, must do nothing

of which I should be ashamed if the whole world should find it cut, keeping in mind that passage of scripture which says, 'Know ye, that for all these things God shall, one day, bring thee to judgment.' "

His disorder was the hip complaint which came upon him at about the age of nime years, and made him lame for the remainder of his life. He was, however, able to attend to business the greater part of the time, and, before he left Utica, had make arrangements to go into partnership with Mr. Wells in a large dry goods store to commence the spring before his death. These arrangements were not carried into effect in consequence of his declining health.

ß eldest son of 12272561. REVEREND LEWIS ELMONS MATSON, Newell Matson, and his first wife Pluma Emmons, was pastor of Plymouth Church, Chicago, Ill., and died in Lyons, France, Jun. 21, 1868. A young man of rare intellectual gifts and a heart altogether consecrated to Christ, he fell a prey to consumption, superinduced by his zeal and incessant application. His church was dedicated only the Fall before his death, to accommodate the increasing numbers who sought his ministry. It is a large and costly edifice on Wabash Ave. A graduate of Vale and Andover, an accurate scholar, abounding in gifts and graces, pure-hearted, true and brave, able and attractive as a sermonizer, eloquent as a speaker, a lover of man, and popular as a pastor, he left a vacancy most difficult to fill. The Rev. William Alvin Bartlett, pastor of the Elm Place Congregational Church, Brooklyn, N. Y. preached his memorial sermon at Plymouth Church. He briefly and beautifully traced the life of the deceased clergyman from the time he was converted to Jesus at the age of 14; then his college life at Andover; his labors MADAIL VIL in the ministry at Racine and Milwaukee, and his crowning efforts in Chicago, down to the day of his death on a foreign soil. He died at the



age of 29 years. He married, 186\_, HELEN FLANDERS, daughter of Walter

P. Flanders of Milwaukee. The marriage occurred at Milwaukee.

THANKSGIVING DISCOURSE. - The Presbyterian Church in this city was densely crowded on Thanksgiving Day, and the services of more than usual interest. The singing by the choir, assisted by members of other churches, showed the benefits to be derived from having such a teacher as Prof. Fargo visit the city occasionally.

The discourse was delivered by Rev. L. E. Matson, pastor of the Congregational Church, and was one of the most appropriate and eloquent Sermons to which we ever listened. It ought to be printed in pamplet form and given a more enduring place in the history of the times than the fleeting memories of those who heard it on Thanksgiving day.

PLYMOUTH CHURCH, - The first ordinary Sabbath service in this church, which was formally dedicated on the 13th instant, was held yesterday. The attendance was large, and there is every prospect that the spacious auditorum will be none too ample to meet the wants of the society. The luxurious elegance and exquisite taste of the church make it an attractive place of worship, but the rare eloquence of the young pastor, (Lewis E. Matson) constitutes the chief attraction. Freedom from affectation,

originality of thought, earnestness of purpose and thorough sympathy with the advanced ideas of the age are demanded in the modern pulpit, and it is but just to add that this demand is met nowhere more fully than in Chicago, and that the pastor of Plymouth is the peer of our best pulpit orators. This city is now hardly less famous for its religious than its business enterprise, and it is to be hoped that the two will always characterize it.

THOMAS MATSON, JR., son of Thomas Matson and his first wife Rachel Fox, born in Glastonbury, married, Jan. 14, 1767, MARY GOODRICH, born Nov. 18, 1745, daughter of William Goodrich and Rachel Savage, his wife. In 1767 the town voted to grant Thomas Matson, Jr., to build a saw mill near his house, provided it did not obstruct the highway. This was near the month of Roaring Brook. Thomas Matson was in the lumber business, and went up the river and bought logs and raftent them down the river to a place they called log landing. Thomas Matson's second wife was widow MARY KILBORN FRATT, who died in 1794. His third wife was widow of Abijah Collins. He sold out his lumber business in Glastonbury about 1801 and removed to Owego, Tioga Co., N. Y., with his three sons and three daughters. Thomas Matson, Jr's., granddaughter, Mrs. Frances Mary Hurd, thus describes their migration and settlement:

"They moved in wagons covered over, and took their provisions with them, and when they ran short would stop at some farm house and bake a new supply. In one place they were asked where they were going; when told to Owego, they said they were going right into hell. The two oldest brothers, George and Reuben, were married before they moved to Owego. They bought a farm in company and settled down in old log houses and all worked together

and each had a share. They built a grist and sawnill and built or bought

a clothing mill, with a carding machine, the first in the country up to that time".

Thomas Matson, Jr., lived with his son Reuben. They did a good deal of business with the saw mill every spring and sometimes. in the summer; they made rafts and floated them down to Baltimore, sold their lumber and then had to walk home over the mountains. About 1812 Thomas Matson had a

paralytic stroke, which was the cause of his death.

Her mother died when she was three years old and when she was ten she was taken to Owego, N. Y. by her father, who had married again. Nancy Matson had an uncle Elizur Tryon, whose wife was sister of her mother, Mary Kilborn Pratt. Elizur Eryon was very wealthy. He was a vessel builder and had ships at sea. He and his wife wanted Thomas Matson, Jr. to leave the little girls - Nancy and Fanny - with them, but he would not leave them. They thought it was too bad to take them to a new wild country. In Owego Nancy Matson was sent to school long enough to learn to read and write and that had to finish up her education. She lived with her brother Reuben for a while and did a large share of the work. Her father also lived ivith Reuben. Afterwards she stayed about one year in Madison, N. Y., with her half-sister Amelia Risley, then returned to her father in Owego. After her father's death she became acquainted with and married LUMAN BROWN, Sept. 4, 1818. They lived near the village about one and one-half years, then moved to Augusta, Oneida, Co., N. Y., where he worked at his trade, cabinet work, and in the latter part of the winter making spinning wheels. They

lived in Augusta until 1838, when Luman Brown got the western fever. He

started for Chicago but settled finally at Conneaut, Ohio.
