GENEALOGY OF THE MASON FAMILY 1788 to 1930.

An effort has been made to determine earlier record of this family, which developes that no accurate record previous to that which follows is obtainable, as family records were destroyed in the burning of the home of William Mason and his family in County, Tyrone, Ireland in the early part of the year 1788; the family barely escaped from their burning home with their lives, losing all their possessions and immediately thereafter left Ireland for America. Their home was burned thru religious persecution and many Church and County records were destroyed thru the same cause.

William Mason - Mary Bowman Patterson, married at Ten Mile Crossing, County Tyrone, Ireland, and emigrated to the United States of America in 1788, locating near Waynesburg, Greene County, Pennsylvania. From this union there was issue of nine:

Jane Mason 1780-1858 - Micajah Wood.

JANE MASON, born in County Tyrone, Ireland February 5th, 1780, came to America with her parents in 1788, locating in Waynesburg, Greene County, Pennsylvania, married to Micajah Wood of Waynesburg, Pennsylvania in 1801 and died at the home of her son, William Wood, near Holbrook, on Ten Mile Creek, Greene County, Pennsylvania in 1858.

Margaret Mason 1781-1868 - Samuel Jewell 1782-1859.

MARGARET MASON, born in County Tyrone, Ireland December 10th, 1781 came to America with her parents in 1788, locating in Waynesburg, Greene County, Pennsylvania. Married to Samuel Jewell, Waynesburg, Pennsylvania June 10th, 1806, died same place February 9th, 1868. Samuel Jewell born August 1st, 1782 died February 6th, 1859. A descendant of this family, W. A. Jewell, resides in St. Joseph, Missouri.

James Mason 1784-1869 - Mary Sayers.

JAMES MASON, born County Tyrone, Ireland, September 26th, 1784 came to America with his parents in 1788. Married Mary Sayers, Waynesburg, Pennsylvania March 23rd, 1806, died at same place June 12th, 1869.

There was a son, William Mason, from this union of James Mason and Mary Sayers, who located in Athens County, Ohio in 1838 and he had five sons and two daughters, viz: William, Thomas, James, Francis Marion, John, Elizabeth and Mary. William lived at Trimble, Ohio; Thomas lived at Trimble, Ohio; died soon after marriage and widow lives in Columbus, Ohio; John lived at Billings, Oklahoma where he died in October 1921. James removed to Overbrook, Kansas along in the 1870's where he died in February 1916; Elizabeth is living in Trimble, Ohio, did not marry; Mary married a Mr. Hansberry and living in Trimble, Ohio; Francis Marion Mason born in Athens County, Ohio August 17th, 1842 married Mary J. Blackood in December 1876 and soon thereafter, or before 1880, removed to Overbrook, Kansas; he had issue of three, Pattie Marie, Lovella and Luella; Lovella married a Mr. Meridith, lived in Dayton, Ohio, where she died in September 1927; Luella married a Mr. Zimmerman and living in Wichita, Kansas; Pattie Marie married Mr. Minter and resides at 3006 Classen Street, Oklahoma City, Oklahoma; Francis Marion Mason after the death of his wife, his three daughters having reached maturity, made his home with his daughter, Mrs. Minter and with her lived in various places, Florida, California, Oklahoma and died at residence of Mrs. Minter in Oklahoma City, Oklahoma June 20th, 1930; remains in cemetery at Overbrook, Kansas.

2 JOHN MASON, born Waynesburg, Greene County, Pennsylvania September 20th, 1790, married Rachel Haines October 7th, 1813; removed to Belmont County, Ohio March 1827, died near Atlas Ohio May 26th, 1865. Rachel Haines born Waynesburg, Pennsylvania October 3rd, 1793, died near Atlas, Ohio April 25th, 1883; remains of both in cemetery at Atlas, Ohio.

William Mason, II, 1793-1863 - Margaret Rogers 1798-1883.

WILLIAM MASON, the Second, born Waynesburg, Pennsylvania April 3rd, 1793; married Margaret Rogers in 1816, removed to Woodsfield, Ohio in 1820, died October 19th, 1863. Margaret.

Rogers, born March 2nd, 1798, died December 13th, 1883. There was a son of William Mason and Margaret Rogers, Doctor George Mason, born December 15th, 1826 at Woodsfield, Ohio, married Janet Park September 12th, 1852; Doctor George Mason died at Stafford, Ohio April 1st, 1907. From the union of Doctor George Mason and Janet Park there were several sons, all born at Stafford, Monroe County, Ohio, viz: Dr. George Mason of Caldwell, Ohio; Dr. Walter Mason of Stafford, Ohio; Dr. J. L. Mason of Lowell, Ohio; William P. Mason, Civil Engineer, Newark, Ohio and Frank Mason, who resided at Woodsfield, Ohio for a time, married Osella Shankland and removed to Oklahoma in 1905. HENRY MASON, born Waynesburg, Pennsylvania September 22nd, 1795 - married Deborah Van Lew December 10th, 1820, removed to Woodsfield, Ohio in 1821, died May 12th, 1876. Deborah Van Lew born May 6th, 1802, died September 7th, 1875; remains of both in cemetery at Woodsfield, Ohio.

GEORGE MASON, born Waynesburg, Pennsylvania March 15th, 1799 - married Catherine Pope, removed to Woodsfield, Ohio 1824. Catherine Pope Mason died September 18th, 1854. George Mason married again - Mary McDonald in 1855, died January 6th, 1888; remains in Mt. Carrick Cemetery, four miles east of Woodsfield, Ohio.

Sarah Bowman Mason 1801-1866 - George Graham 1806-1880.

SARAH BOWMAN MASON, born Waynesburg, Pennsylvania November 1st, 1801; married George Graham March 23rd, 1828; died May 26th, 1866. George Graham born July 4th, 1806, died April 9th, 1880. Lived near Hopewell Church, Greene County, Pennsylvania.

~~From~~ the marriage of John Mason and Rachel Haines, there was issue of twelve, viz: William, Henry, Elisha Sidwell, Mary, John Wood, Elizabeth, George, Sarah Jane, James, Samuel J., Rachel and Marion.

John Wesley Mason was married to Mulvina Jane Thomas near Pennville, Indiana by Lot Coulson, Sunday, October 20th, 1867.

MULVINA JANE THOMAS, was the eleventh and last of issue from Elias Thomas and his wife, Amanda Mulvina Milner; born near Pennville, Indiana December 29th, 1848 and resided near Pennville and at Portland, Indiana until March 1886 when she removed with her family to Nickerson, Reno County, Kansas and in the late fall of 1895, following the death of her husband, she removed to Topeka, Kansas, making a home with and for two of her sons, Jehu Thomas Mason and Leslie Milner Mason, until her death December 23rd, 1896; her remains lie in cemetery at Nickerson, Kansas. *48 yrs old*

From this union there was issue as follows: Charles Leighton, Jehu Thomas, William Robert, Cecil Stanley, Harry Holman and Leslie Milner.

5 CHARLES LEIGHTON MASON, oldest of six sons of John Wesley Mason and Mulvina Jane Thomas Mason, was born near Pennville, Indiana December 24th, 1868; married to Anna Mary Frazier January 7th, 1892 at residence of Alonzo William Frazier, Hartford City, Indiana by Reverend A. J. Arrick, Pastor of Presbyterian Church. ANNA MARY FRAZIER is a daughter of Reverend Jeremiah Frazier, Evangelical Lutheran Church, and Anna Mary Catherine Frazier, nee Frazer, born in Marklesburg, Huntingdon County, Pennsylvania December 11th, 1869, removing thence to Cassville, Huntingdon County, Pennsylvania in 1871, thence to Blain, Perry County, Pennsylvania in 1873, thence to Portland, Indiana in 1881, thence to Chattanooga, Tennessee, in 1889, thence to Hartford City, Indiana in 1891 where she was married to Charles Leighton Mason on January 7th, 1892.

The father of Anna Mary Frazier, Reverend Jeremiah Frazier, was born in Frederick County, Maryland, February 16th, 1828, married Anna Mary Catherine Frazer at Hanover, Pennsylvania by Reverend Sechler, October 24th, 1854, died at Portland, Indiana of Typhoid fever September 13th, 1885, remains in cemetery at Portland, Indiana; entered the preparatory department of Pennsylvania College, now Gettysburg College, and graduated in 1855; studied theology under Reverend H. Bishop, Evangelical Lutheran Church at Emmittsburg, Maryland, licensed in 1859 by the Synod of Virginia. First charge, Middleway, West Virginia, next at Gerrardstown, West Virginia, next at Newry, Blair County, Pennsylvania 1865-1868, next at Marklesburg,

Huntingdon County, Pennsylvania 1868-1871, Cassville

 Pennsylvania 1873-1881, and at Portland, Indiana 1881 to 1885.

C. L. MASON, SANTA FE HEAD HERE, DIES

SUCCUMBS THURSDAY AFTER A 5-DAY ILLNESS.

With Railroad Company 51 Years—
Missouri Division Superintendent
Since 1920.

Charles L. Mason, 69 years old, superintendent of the Missouri division of the Santa Fe railroad here the last eighteen years, and an employee and official of that company the last fifty-one years, died about 4 o'clock last Thursday afternoon at the Putman Memorial hospital here.

Heart disease was the cause of Mr. Mason's death. He was stricken October 14 at Baring, Mo., and was brought immediately to the hospital here. He was to have retired from service November 1.

Funeral services, conducted by Dr. George P. Baity, pastor of the Westport Avenue Presbyterian church in

Kansas City, and the Rev. E. C. Wadlow, pastor of the Methodist Episcopal church here, were Saturday afternoon at the Methodist Episcopal church here. A quartet—Norman Julian, Dr. P. L. Patrick, James T. Hier and Denzil Bunch—sang, "Day Is Dying in the West." Mrs. Mabel Johnson was the organist. The active pallbearers were Howard Lillingston, Robert Cruze, Frank McVay, Paul White, Newell Whitney and George Rosado. The

honorary pallbearers were Frank Stephens, Sam Patterson, Harry Wells, Sam Mercer, B. F. Smith and Bert Gridley. Burial was in Mt. Olivet cemetery here.

Mr. Mason was born December 24, 1868, at Pennville, Ind., the son of John Wesley and Mulvina Jane Thomas Mason. He attended the public schools at Portland, Ind. He was assistant postmaster at Portland from the fall of 1885 to March, 1887, when he moved to Sterling, Kas., where he was a clerk in the postoffice until he started his railroad career.

Mr. Mason and Miss Anna Mary Frazier were married January 7, 1892 at Hartford City, Ind.

Mr. Mason started his railroad career June 10, 1887, at Sterling, Kas., as cashier for the Santa Fe. In November, 1887, he was transferred to Nickerson, Kas., as cashier. At that time, Nickerson was headquarters of the middle division.

In September, 1889, Mr. Mason was promoted to the cashiership at Great Bend, Kas., an important early-day town of Western Kansas. Later, he was transferred to Wichita when that city had a population of less than 20,000 persons. In 1891, Mr. Mason was transferred to Chicago and later was made agent at Streator, Ill. In 1902, he was made terminal superintendent at St. Joseph and after several years service there was made train master at Emporia, Kas.

Mr. Mason was at Emporia one year and then was promoted to the superintendency in Kansas City and on February 1, 1920, he was transferred to the superintendency of the Missouri division at Marceline.

In his fifty-one years with the Santa Fe, Mr. Mason saw the steady growth of that great system. The line between Chicago and Kansas City had not been built when he started his railroad career. In these fifty-one years, the Santa Fe mileage has more than doubled and the road has developed from a pioneer Western line of the early days to probably the most prosperous railroad in the United States.

Mr. Mason was a friendly counselor to all railroad men—section hands, clerks or executives. All received the benefits of his rich experience in transportation problems as well as the problems of life itself. He never was too busy to give of his time to aid the men and women railroad workers over the

Missouri division. Their problems became his problems and they cherished that friendship which grew with the years. He appreciated also the problems of others not associated with the rail industry and there are many men and women in this group who have received the benefits of his wise counsel, practical advice given from more than a half century of business experience.

Mr. Mason was a most interesting and friendly visitor. He was interested keenly in present-day problems and his comments always were sincere and timely. In his passing, the Santa Fe system loses a most efficient and loyal official and Marceline a most valuable citizen.
