

Foreword

Thanks to the hearty coöperation of most of the members of the Metz family, the following Genealogy of JACOB METZ is practically complete. The authorities for the European data are the church records at Rosenthal, Niedergirmes and Greifenstein, and the family records of some of the cousins now living there. Family bibles, gravestones and family records have been consulted in order to obtain the information given as to the American family. The writer would greatly appreciate having his attention called to any inaccuracies or omissions.

The consecutive system of numbering has been used, the A_I series applying to the European branches. A + placed before a number indicates that more information will be found later on under the same number in heavy faced type.

Short Autobiography of Jakob Metz

"Jakob Metz was born March 4, 1813, in Amt Rosenthal, kreis Frankenburg, Kur Hessen.

I remember my father put me in school when I was six years old. During my childhood I gladly heard about Jesus. My father died February 17, 1823, when I was ten years old. From this time on, on account of changed conditions in the family my school life was hampered and I was obliged to rely upon myself and the grace of God. I had the ambition to become a good Christian man. I was glad when my confirmation day came and my visits with the pastor brought me many happy days in the Lord. I learned my lessons with great pleasure. When in the woods I felt like praising the Lord. With snow three feet deep on the ground I prayed. I also preached and praised the Lord in succession, and my soul was full of delight. On Easter day I was confirmed and on Pentecost I went to the Burgomaster for an emigration pass, but he, being a relative to my stepsister, refused and told me to stay at home. So I came to my oldest brother, who was a real brother. I found work in a spool factory but my earnings were small. In the late summer my other brother came home. He set up a loom for me and one for himself and taught me how to weave, but my other brother traded our looms off. We

went to Schwelm, three hours from Elberfeld. Here we both got work and fared well. Then mother died. I could hardly believe it. I made a favorable impression on the people and did all I could to establish my character but from this time on I indulged more in worldly pleasure. In Schwelm I worked in the cotton industry, and later in Elberfeld in the silk industry. In these places I worked four years. Here I experienced a great many things. This was during Rev. Krummacher's pastorate in the Reformed church. I heard many good sermons, but I knew nothing of a change of heart. I was Lutheran and was taught to do right. After four years I went back to my birth place. I was of military age. I worked at my old trade, weaving, until 1834. I was twenty-one years of age, and free. At this time many of our community went to America. I was one among them. We started on our journey June 7, and left Bremen June 21, and landed in Baltimore August 21."

The above introduction to Jacob Metz is a translation by Rev. Mr. Schweitzer of Boonville, Indiana, of a paper written in German script by Jacob Metz. The original is in the possession of his son, Charles Frederick Metz of Boonville, who also has the original birth certificate in German, which, translated, reads as follows:

Extract from the parish register of the evangelical church in Rosenthal in Electoral Hesse.

In the parish of Rosenthal, law district, Rosenthal, there was born on the fifth of the month of March one thousand eight hundred and thirteen (5 March, 1813) and baptized on the 7th of the same month: JAKOB METZ.

Legitimate son of Johannes Metz, citizen and farmer, and of his wife, Maria Magdelena, whose maiden name was Balzer. The Godfather was: Jakob Balzer.

The correctness of the abstract is vouched for with signature and church seal at Rosenthal in Electoral Hesse on the 26th of May, 1834, by

The Pastor, SIEMEN

There is seen to be a slight discrepancy in the birth date of Jacob Metz. He gives it in his Autobiography as March 4, 1813, while the birth certificate states it was on March 5, 1813. The church record at Rosenthal agrees with the latter date, March 5. The village of Rosenthal lies twelve miles north of Marburg, and about sixty miles directly north of Frankfort. It is a typical German village, the inhabitants being mostly farmers owning land outside the village which they go out to work, returning to their homes to spend the nights and rainy days. Only the most prosperous have horses to do the work of ploughing and cultivating. The usual beast of burden is the cow, performing double duty of field work and providing milk for the family. The houses are usually of timber and plaster type, of three stories, the first floor for the cows, pigs and chickens, the second floor for living quarters and the third floor for storing grain.

The following data regarding the European ancestry of Jacob Metz was given the writer by Pastor Tiegeler of the Lutheran church at Rosenthal, and by members of the family now living there.

Metz Family in America

FIRST GENERATION IN AMERICA

1 JACOB METZ, (Johannes, Johann Georg, Elias 1) the immigrant, son of Johannes Metz and Maria Magdalena Balzer, was born in Rosenthal, Germany, March 4 or 5, baptized March 7, 1813. Together with others of his community he sailed from Bremen, June 21, and landed in Baltimore, August 21, 1834. Became an American citizen at Dayton, Ohio, August 31, 1842. He married twice. First in Baltimore, according to his son Julius, date unknown, Anna Fischbach (daughter of Lorenz Fischbach and Philippina Metzger) who was born in Klein Germes, Germany, December 4, 1813, and died at Dayton, Ohio, July 1, 1853. Eight children were born of this marriage. He married, second, at Greenville, Ohio, October 9, 1855, Katharine Helwer, who was born August 28, 1834, and died at Boonville, Indiana, January 27, 1899. Thirteen children were born of this marriage, of whom nine are still living. After arriving in Baltimore he practiced his trade of weaving for several years and then removed to Dayton, Ohio, where he set up a small factory for weaving. About 1856 or 1857 he removed to Boonville, Indiana, where he engaged in farming until his death, January 1, 1901. For

many years he was a "local preacher", often filling the pulpit of the German Methodist church when there was no regular pastor. He was baptized in the Lutheran church, the church of his fathers, at Rosenthal, but connected himself with the German Methodists soon after arriving in America. Fischbach-Metzger

Anna Fischbach, the first wife of Jacob Metz, was the daughter of Lorenz Fischbach and Philippina Metzger. Lorenz Fischbach was born in 1778, as shown on his tombstone at Dayton, Ohio. He was a member of the German Methodist church in Dayton and died there March 21, 1857, leaving a wife and eight children. In the fall of 1928 the writer visited Germany and attempted a little research work at Niedergirmes and also at Greifenstein, the birthplace of Philippina Metzger. The pastor of the present Lutheran church at Niedergirmes said that formerly the town had been called Kleingirmes. We were shown a house standing next to where the old Fischbach house had been. It had been torn down but was a duplicate of the one we saw. The church records there state that Lorenz Fischbach was born at Niedergirmes, May 1, 1781, and married Philippina Metzger, July 22, 1810. It will be noted that the Niedergirmes records give his birth as three years later than the Dayton records. The local church records made at the time of the event are probably the more accurate. The children of Lorenz Fischbach and Philippina Metzger, according to Dayton records, are as follows, all born in Germany, except Frederick, who was born in Baltimore:

- 1 Conrad, born about 1811; died and was buried at sea, 1832; unmarried.
- 2 Sophia, born September 17, 1812; died at Dayton, Ohio, August 15, 1883; married Philip Weber; six children.
- 3 Anna, born December 4, 1813; died at Dayton, Ohio, July 1, 1853; married Jacob Metz; eight children.
- 4 Henry, born October 6, 1815; died at Dayton, April 2, 1901; married Katherine (Lange) Vollmer, a widow; three children.
- 5 Philip, born July 15, 1818; died at Dayton, November 16, 1895; married Mary Margaret Haas; five children.
- 6 Catherine, born June 25, 1820; died at Dayton, Ohio, May 8, 1898; married Philip Marquardt; nine children.
- 7 John William, born June 24, 1824; died at Dayton, Ohio; buried at Waverly, Ohio; married Veronica Margaret Pretzinger; seven children.
- 8 George, born April 17, 1829; died at Greenville, Ohio, June 11, 1911; buried in Woodland cemetery, Dayton, Ohio; married Caroline Kimmel; nine children.
- 9 Christina, born April 17, 1831; died at Dayton, Ohio, April 7, 1902; married Henry Haas; eight children.
- 10 Frederick W., born about 1834 in Baltimore, Maryland; died at Dayton, Ohio, December 19, 1875, aged 41 years; married Jennie DaMee, a widow; no children.

All except Conrad and John William are buried in Woodland cemetery, Dayton.

In the year 1832 the son, Conrad, was approaching the age when he was subject to military draft. His parents had serious objection to the military policy of Germany. They had also embraced the Methodist faith, which was not popular in Germany at that time. So they decided to emigrate to America, the land of the free, and escape the military and religious hardships of the Fatherland. They sailed on an old boat which the captain intentionally wrecked before they had gone far on their journey, his object being the collection of insurance for the owners. A storm arose and by the time the lifeboats were lowered many had died from exposure. The two youngest of the children, Christina, aged one year, and George, aged three, were numb from the cold, and were thrown on a pile with the dead. The parents were completely distracted and lost their heads. In the emergency Sophia, the oldest daughter, took matters into her own hands. She is said to have had a very commanding way with her and was powerfully built physically. After placing father, mother and the other children in the lifeboat, she picked up the two babies, placed them in a wet blanket, and started for the boat. The captain refused to let her enter unless she would leave the children behind. This she firmly refused to do, and informed him that if anyone had to stay behind it would have to be the captain and not those two babies. Convinced that she could enforce her ulti-

matum, and probably fearing the menacing attitude of the other passengers who by this time were well aware of the motive for wrecking the boat, the captain permitted them all to enter the lifeboat from which they were soon rescued by another boat. Sophia worked over the babies for hours rubbing them near a hot stove until her hands were sore and bleeding, but she saved their lives, and they both lived to a good old age, Christina dying at the age of seventy-one, and George at eighty-three, leaving many descendants who owe their existence to the energy of Sophia Fischbach. The entire family with the exception of Conrad, who lost his life in the storm, went back to Germany, having lost everything except the clothes on their backs. The captain who was responsible for the wreck, was taken back to Germany in irons by the rescue boat, but he committed suicide before he could be brought to trial. Two years later the Fischbach family left Germany again, March 20, 1834, and after a rough voyage landed in Baltimore, where they lived for a few years and then removed to Dayton, Ohio. Their many descendants hold an annual reunion at the Haas farm near Dayton.

Philippina Metzger, the mother of Anna Fischbach, was the daughter of Johann Christof Metzger and Luise Schoendorf. She was born, according to local church records, at Greifenstein, Kreis Wetzlar, between 12 and 1 P.M., May 9, and baptized May 13, 1792 (one year later than the Dayton records). The four godparents were Friederika Sabine

(wife of Friederich Bott of Greifenthal), Philippina Volland (single), Johann Heinrich Schoendorf, and Johann Georg Blecher. We were told that it was a mark of unusual distinction to have so many godparents. She died in Dayton, Ohio, May 26, 1858, one year after her husband, Lorenz Fischbach.

Greifenstein, the birth place of Philippina Metzger, is very picturesquely situated on the top of a high hill. The village proper is located just outside the walls of Greifenstein Castle. The original castle was destroyed in the year 1300, and present castle dates from that year when they started to rebuild it. It is now in ruins except for the chapel, which has been in constant use since its construction in 1448.

There is a local tradition that in the seventeenth century a certain Theobald Metzger went to sea, became a pirate and amassed an immense fortune. He returned home, was received so coldly that he went to Holland, where he was welcomed with open arms and was made an admiral or general. He died in 1699 and his property was confiscated by the Dutch government. Several efforts have been made by so-called Metzger heirs to recover this inheritance which they claim is rightfully theirs. For years it is said that two lawyers have made a living collecting fees from members of the family so as to investigate and press the claims. So far the Dutch government has not been convinced that it should turn over this wealth to the Metzger family.
