

PREFACE

About the year 1898 I began to look up the Murray family largely as a hobby. I found my interest increasing as I got deeper into the subject and my correspondence increased, bringing to light new clues.

Finding that our family in this country originated in East Guilford Connecticut, I obtained a copy of the Talcott records of the family from the town clerk's office in Guilford. It should here be explained that Dr Alvan Talcott was a local historian and genealogist in Guilford, who died in the late 1870's, and who compiled genealogical records of all the early families of Guilford and East Guilford, bringing such lines down to date that remained living there, and making notations of where they settled after leaving Guilford, but not tracing them further.

The original records are in the possession of the New Haven Colony Historical Society in New Haven, Connecticut, while a copy is on file in the town clerk's office in Guilford. These records were used as a basis for this genealogy to which due credit should be given.

These records established the fact that Jonathan Murray from Scotland was the ancestor of our family in this country, and as colonial families go, it is not large, due to several factors. The principal reason is that a large percentage of the offspring were girls, whose descendants obviously are not traced after one generation after the Murray name changes, – in other words the male lines are running out.

Besides through correspondence, I have made many trips over the country gathering information from many sources and many members of the family. I have enjoyed the friendship and hospitality of these people and wish to express my appreciation and gratitude to all who have so kindly assisted me in this matter.

Lack of space prohibits me mentioning all who have so kindly helped me. Some outstanding contributions of data, such as the descendants of Noah Murray of the Revolution from Mrs Louise Welles Murray of Athens, Pa. the descendants of Nathan Murray of the same period by Mrs Charlotte Hall Fuller of Milton, Vermont; the descendants of Beriah Murray also of the Revolution from Mrs Rhoda Noble of Battle Creek, Mich. and Mrs Carrie Wright of Williston, Vermont; and descendants of Jonathan Murray, grandson of the ancestor, whose descendants settled in Vermont, from Daniel Murray of Burlington, Vermont; should be mentioned.

I realize that many imperfections may be found in this history, for which I make no apologies. I presume anyone who has attempted to compile a family history has been confronted with the lack of interest from some, and the seeming difficulty in getting replies from letters of inquiry. I have written over 7500 letters in this connection and received replies from about two thirds of them.

Like others who have compiled family histories, I have found it is truly remarkable how members of the same family lines often disagree about family data. I have however made this record as complete and correct as possible with the information at hand, and commend the result to the members of the Murray family with my best wishes.

BRIEF HISTORY OF THE MURRAY CLAN IN SCOTLAND

Among the earliest clans of Scotland was the "Clann Mhoraidh" to use the Celtic name for the Murray Clan dating back to the advent of Freskin de Moravia in 1100 A.D. "Costumes of the Clans" by James Logan says "Freskin a chieftain in the army which suppressed the insurrection of the people inhabiting Moray, at that time so extensive a district, was rewarded for his heroism by the gift of a great tract of land then forfeited."

Some authorities say that Freskin was from Flanders now in Belgium but the name Freskin has a Gaelic sound, which would indicate that a clan as distinguished as the Murrays in Scotland, had a Pictish rather than a Flemish origin. Freskin started building a great castle in 1131 for the protection of the clan, the first of several credited to the Murray Clan; one near Stirling and another one between Dumfries and Ruthwell and Blair Castle which is the present seat of the clan in Perthshire. William, the grandson of Freskin assumed the surname of "De Moravia" from which the name of Murray is derived. William de Moravia left several sons from one of whom is descended the Murrays of Tullibardine, progenitors of the Dukes of Athole. The second Duke of Athole succeeded to the sovereignty of the Isle of Man.

Another historian says that the original Scotia or Scotland was Hibernia or Ireland and the Scoti or Scots at their first authentic appearance in history were people from Ireland. They were a Celtic race and their original seat in North Britain was Argyle which was acquired in the Fifth century or thereabouts, either by conquest or colonization.

The Celtic name "Clan Mhoraidh" would indicate therefore that the Murrays went to North Britain or Scotland from Ireland. However the matter is so lost in antiquity and tradition that the exact origin of the clan is extremely difficult to authenticate. The root of the name is the same whether Celtic or Moravian and signified "Great Water" from "Mor" – great – and 'au' or 'av' "water" (muir-moor) 'ray' meaning 'water'.

The history of Scotland reveals that the Murray clan was widely scattered over much territory and their ancient titles show them to have been one of the most powerful and influential clans in the country.

All the Murray crests or coats of arms which have come to the attention of the compiler are much alike in their general appearance – such minor differences as do occur are due largely to alliances with other clans and the nobility. All the crests bear the same badge, butcher's broom and juniper, with the motto "Furth, Fortune and Fill the Fetters". The motto is said to mean "Go forth, be successful and fill the fetters with the feet of all other rebellious subjects." Sir Bernard Burke in his book "General Armory of England, Ireland, Scotland and Wales" (1878) describes the coat of arms of the Earl of Dunmore, who is a Murray and his coat of arms corresponds minutely with those of other Murrays.

From the same book the following interpretation of the Murray clan heraldry will be of interest.

Coat of Arms— a shield with six compartments surmounted by a crown supported by a banner on which is the motto "Furth, Fortune and Fill the Fetters"— a lion on one side and a well formed man on the other side of the shield.

The Earldom of Moray or Murray was one of the seven original earldoms of Scotland, comprising approximately the counties of Inverness and Ross, the two "savages" indicating possibly primitive beginnings.

First section— three stars, azure, 'mullets', argent within, a double tressure, flory, counter flory, orange for Murray.

Second section- a fesse checque, argent and azure for Stewart.

Third section- Paley of six, orange and sable for Athole.

Fourth section - Argent on bend, azure, three stags heads cabossed for Stanley.

Fifth section— Gules, three legs in armour, spurred and garnished, orange, conjoined in triangle at the thigh, for the Isle of Man.

Sixth section- Gules, two lions passant, in pale argent, for Strange.

Crest at top—a demi-savage wreathed about the head and loins with oak holding in the dexter hand a sword, erect, proper pommel and hilt, orange, and in the sinister hand a key to the last.

Supporters— Dexter a lion gules gorged with a collar, azure charged with three mullets, argents, sinister, a savage wreathed as the crest proper. Some illustrations show the figure on the crest with a dagger instead of a sword, and no five pointed stars (mullets) on the lions collar.

The names of Stewart, Athole, Stanley and Strange are those of noble families whose intermarriage with the Murrays are indicated in the designs in the crests.

Section four in the design is interesting because of the "bend sinister" the slant from the upper left to lower right corner, signifying illegitimate descent—which seems to have been true of one of the first earls, but Mary, Queen of Scots reversed this order in the design as a mark of distinction of unusual bravery in a certain battle as proved by the then earl.

The head piece is an earl's coronet. The motto is rather unusual. The blue green tartan is the hunting plaid and is called the Athole Tartan; the bright red plaid is the dress tartan and known, (some say erroneously) as the Tullibardine Tartan.

JONATHAN MURRAY OF EAST GUILFORD, CONNECTICUT

The late Dr Alvan Talcott, local historian and genealogist of Guilford, Connecticut, on page 665 of his "Records of Guilford" indicates that Jonathan Murray came to Guilford in 1685 and that he died 27 Aug 1747 aged 82 years.

Steiner's History of Guilford (p 134) says that Jonathan Murray came from Scotland to Guilford about 1687 and settled in 1688 in the district now called Scotland (page 195). Scotland is some nine miles north of the present village of Madison, formerly called East Guilford until May 1826 when it was incorporated under it's present name. Practically the entire area embraced in East Guilford, was known by the Indian name of Hammonassett during the period of colonial settlement and the old cemetery founded in 1658 is called the Hammonassett cemetery. This is where many of the first settlers are buried including some of the Murrays. It is quite probable that Jonathan Murray and his wife are buried there, but there are no markers indicating this.

Steiner's History of Guilford and Madison further says that early settlement was encouraged in the Hammonassett district, the first ones being about 1658. Some of the first settlers were Ebenezer Thompson and Nathan Bradley from Guilford and Jonathan Murray from Scotland in 1688 and John Bishop from Guilford sometime later.

A search for passenger lists of vessels coming to the colonies from the British Isles in 1685 has been barren of definite results. The Keeper of Registers and Records of Scotland in the General Register House in Edinburgh, says there are no lists in existence of the Scottish emigrants to the American Colonies in 1685-so without absolute proof as to the time and place of his departure from his native soil and subsequent landing in this country, the conclusions must rest on surmise and circumstantial evidence, as to the advent of Jonathan Murray's first appearance in East Guilford, Connecticut.

The following theory seems altogether reasonable—but it still remains a theory. In order to bring out the circumstances which presumably led Jonathan Murray to come to the colonies at this time, a short review of certain phases of Scotch history of that period is necessary. Possibly certain religious convictions and independence of thought were directly responsible for his coming when he did. The ecclesiastical history of that period is well set forth in Wodrow's History of the Sufferings of the Church of Scotland, which was first published in Edinburgh in 1722. Reverend Robert Wodrow, the author, was born in Glasgow in 1679, and excerpts from his manuscripts and correspondence were compiled by Rev. Robert Burns D.D.F.A.S.E. minister of St. Georges, Paisley, 17 January 1828.

James VII of Scotland was on the throne at this time and wanted to be acknowledged head of the church, and those who did not conform to this edict were persecuted, tortured and imprisoned and many banished to the American Colonies.

In his history Wodrow says "The names of as many as are come to my hand who were banished shall be insert just now. Let me only remark that such who had not to pay their freight, were gifted to George Scot, laird of Pitlochy, who freighted a Newcastle ship, Richard Hutton, Master, bound for New Jersey, and all the persons now banished were committed to his care. I cannot give account of all the names of such as were banished with Pitlochy, the reader hath not a few of them above section 4th." This section states that Walter Howman, James

Murray, Malcolm Bryce, James Wilkinson, Thomas Stodhart, and Grizel Alston refused to take the oath of allegiance and to acknowledge the king's authority, and it was ordained that the five last named men have their ears cut off and certain named women have their cheeks burned. On July 31, 1685 others were banished to "His Majestie's Plantations abroad"—a list of names following but this list did not include Jonathan Murray.

On the 5th of September 1685 the "Henry and Francis" of Newcastle, a 360-ton sailing vessel, left Leith, Scotland, bound for Jamaica or the Virginia coast. Scarcely had they started when sickness broke out among them and some 35 of the passengers and crew died. Instead of landing where they expected, the ship was driven by the wind and waves to the New Jersey coast, landing at Perth Amboy on the 18th of December 1685.

Quoting further from Wodrow, he says "It concerns the design of this history only to record the names of the prisoners...perhaps several of the passengers might likewise be sufferers, but I have not set their names down for shortness". As Wodrow seemingly differentiates between prisoners and passengers, it is possible that Jonathan Murray came on this boat voluntarily as a passenger, but whose name was not recorded by the author "for shortness" or lack of time to use the modern version.

Whitehead's "Early History of Perth Amboy" states that the names of all those who set sail cannot be given the whole number being near two hundred. A list of 148 names follows, not including those who embarked voluntarily, but Jonathan Murray's name is not on the list; which again brings up the presumption that he may have paid for his passage.

History records that the passengers did not receive a very warm welcome from the settlers at Perth Amboy as the majority of the settlers were loyal to the king; so many of the new arrivals went on further up the coast to Connecticut where they were accorded a welcome and greater religious liberty. Was Jonathan Murray among them?

Tradition says that Jonathan Murray was born near Edinburgh. Perthshire the present seat of the Murray Clan is less than 50 miles from Edinburgh and Leith from which place the Henry & Francis sailed in 1685, is so near Edinburgh now, that is is practically a part of that city.

The New England Historical & Genealogical Register, Vol. 55 says that "Jonathan Murray—his list was 65 pounds, 10 shillings, 6 pence. He was a farmer." In another publication is found a record of how he marked his cattle in the following words: "Jonathan Murray—his mark for his catell is a crop on top of the offe eare and to slits in the top of the same eare; enterred Aprill 13, 1689."

The earliest land grant to Jonathan Murray is from the town of Guilford dated 10 Feb 1697, which presumably was his farm in the Hammonassett district. (Vol 1 p 15 Guilford Land Records). Other deeds of record are from Jonathan Murray and Ann his wife to Jonathan Murray, Jr (his grandson) dated 7 Oct 1718; another to "widow Silence Doude" dated 23 Aug 1735 (Vol 5 p 208), Jonathan Murray to his son John of Killingworth dated 15 Apr 1742 (Vol 6 p 213) and some others, including some land sold to Sergt. John Parmele of Guilford dated 24 Jan 1715-16.

A copy of Jonathan Murray's deed to "widow Silence Doude" as it appears in Vol 5 p 208 of the Guilford Land Records, dated 23 of August 1735; may be of interest.

"To all people to whom these presents shall come greeting, Know ye that Jonathan Murray of Guilford in the county of New Haven & Colony of Connecticut in New England for & in Consideration of Two parcels of land Conveyed by Deed to Said Murray by ye Widow Silence Dowd & her Son Ebenzer Dowd, having. even date with these presents to my full satisfaction I have Granted, Bargained, Sold Conveyed, & Confirmed with acts of said Ebenezer Dowd one parcel of Land part Rushey Cove & part upland, Situate in Guilford East Society in Hammonassett Quarter near Sequester Gate, Containing Three acres & a half, Bounded northly and Easterly by Nathan Noah Bradley's be it more or less. land, Southly by Joseph Dowd's land & west by high way. To have & To Hold if above Granted premises with all of privelege & advantage to ye Same belonging or in any wise appertaining to him, ye said Ebenezer Doude, his heirs & assigns forever to his and Theirs Sole & only use & behest forever. And I the Said Jonathan Murray for myself, my Heirs, Executors, Admt. Do Covenant & agree to & with ye Said Ebenezer Doude his Heirs and Assigns that at & until ye Ensealing of the presents, I am ye sole owner of ye above Granted premises and am Lawfully Seized & possessed of the same in mine own proper Right as a good & perfect & absolute Estate of inheritance in fee Simple & have in my Self good Right to Sell & Confirm ye Same in ye above manner and that ye same is free from all Encumbrance whatsoever. Also the Sd Jonathan Murray Do by these presents Bind myself, my Heirs, Executors, Admrs. to warrent Same & Defend ye above granted premises to ye Said Ebenezer Doude, his heirs & assigns against all Claims and Demands whatsoever, forever hereinafter for Witness. Whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal this twenty third Day of Aug. A. D. 1735 & in ye Eight year of the Reign of George Second, King, etc.

The last will and testament of Jonathan Murray is on file in the town clerk's office in Guilford. Following is a copy of this, taken from the old records, now yellow and the writing dim with age, making the reading of it a difficult task. The spelling follows the original.

WILL OF JONATHAN MURRAY

"In the name of God, Amen; the twenty-second Day of May A 1745, I, Jonathan Murray of East Guilford in the County of Newhaven in his Majesties English Colony of Connecticutt, in New England, in America, being aged and weak in Body but of Sound mind and memory, thanks be given unto God, therefore calling to mind the Mortality of my Body and knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die.

Do make and ordain this my last will and Testament; that is to Say principally and first of all, I Give and recommend my Soul into the Hands of God that gave it and my body I recommend to the Earth to be buried in decent Christian Burial at the discretion of my Executor hereafter named, nothing doubteng but at the general Resurrection I Shall receive the Same again by the mighty power of God. And as touching such worldly Estate wherewith it hath pleased God to bless me in this Life, I give, demise and dispose of the Same in the following manner and form, my Just Debts funeral and other necessary Charges being first paid.

Imprimis I give and bequeath to Anne, my beloved wife, the whole of my moveable and personal Estate to be at her Dispose forever and the use and Improvement of all my Lands and Buildengs and real Estate during the Term of her natural Life.

Item— I give and bequeath to my loving, son Selah Murrey, the Easterly Side of my Homelot, including all that he hath now in possession and to joyn that part which I have given to my son John in this will, to be to him, his Heirs and assigns forever, after my Sd wife's Decease. I also give to my Sd Son Selah Murray, the whole of my Lot at muddy Swamp, commonly called my thirty acre lot to be to him, his Heirs and assigns forever, he paying and Answering to my Daughters and Grand Daughters according to what is order'd below in this Will.

Item— I give and bequeath to my beloved Son John Murrey, the western side of my Homelot, including my Dwelling House and Barn, and all that part of my Homelot westward of that fence, a little westward of my son Selah's House, which Seperates and parts of what my Sd Son Selah possesses, from the Remainder, to be to him, his Heirs and assigns forever after my Sd wife': decease; he paying and

answering to my Daughters and Grand Daughters according to what is ordered below in this will. And whereas I have Sold and alienated Some Tracts of Land which I designed for my loving son Jehiel Murrey (for his Benefit) and have lately given him three Hundred Pounds money in Hand, that is all the Portion I give to him of my Estate.

Furthermore I give and bequeath to my Three Daughters, Thankfull, Hope and Hester, twenty five Pounds apiece, including what I have paid to them or Shall pay to them during my natural Life, that is to Say, Each of them Shall be paid So much (if anything be yet wanteng thereto) as to make up what they have already had; twenty-five Pounds Each,—and and that by my Two Sons, Selah and John Murrey, whome my will is, Shall pay it Each one an equal Share thereof.

And whereas I have made a Deed of Gift to my Grandson Jonathan Murrey, that is all the Portion I give unto him of my Estate.

And Whereas my Son Daniel Murrey, Deceased, left considerable moveable Estate which I was helpful to him in gaining and which I think may afford a Competent Portion to his Daughter, I do therefore will and bequeath to her, my Granddaughter Mary, the Daughter of my Sd Deceased Son Daniel Murrey, only five Shillings, which my will is that my two sons Selah and John Murrey shall pay each one an equal Share of it.

And I do constitute and appoint my Sd Son Selah Murrey to be Sole Executor of this my last will and Testament, hereby revoking and makeing void all former wills and Testaments Bequests and Executors by me at any time made or named, ratifying and confirming this and no other to be my last will and Testament. In Witness whereof I have hereunto Set my Hand and Seal the the Day of the Date above written.

DESCENDANTS OF JONATHAN MURRAY

1 JONATHAN MURRAY

According to Dr. Talcott, Jonathan Murray was born in 1665 in Scotland quite possibly in the Perthshire area and was about 20 years old when he came to the colonies. The Guilford town records say he was married 17 July 1688 "by Mr Andrew Leete" to Anne Bradley. She was born 16 Nov 1669 and d 1 June 1749 and was a daughter of Nathan and Hester or Esther Griswold Bradley. Jonathan Murray died in East Guilford 27 Aug 1747 and is presumably buried beside his wife in the old Hammonassett cemetery. The oldest Murray stones in that cemetery are those of Daniel Murray oldest son of Jonathan and that of his (Daniel's) son Jonathan. Several Bradley markers adjoin these.

As the wife of the ancestor, it would be in order to briefly sketch the ancestry of Anne Bradley. Cutter says in his "Connecticut Families" that "the first mention of the name in England was in 1183 at the feast of St. Cuthbert in Lent, when Lord Hugh, Bishop of Durham caused all the revenues of his district to be described...... Burke gives 15 coats of arms to the Bradleys, many of them being variations of the same design, having a boar's head, etc. Probably all were derived from the same family.

The first Bradleys to the American Colonies are said to have come from the market town of Bingley in the West Riding of Yorkshire, about 12 miles northeast of Leeds... The town of Bradley (or Broadlea) was about seven miles to the north of Bingley. The name Bradley is Anglo-Saxon meaning a broad field or pasture.

The father of the American pioneer of the family is not known, nor is the name of his first wife. Their son William Bradley according to tradition in the family, was a friend of Cromwell and the "History of Bingley, England" states that he was a major in the Parliamentary Army and removed to New Haven. He was the first of the name to come to Connecticut, stayed for a time at Branford and Guilford, later moved to New Haven where he took the oath of fidelity in August 1644. His step mother, Elizabeth Bradley with her four sons and one daughter is said to have followed him to America in 1648. These children were Daniel,

drowned in Dec 1658- wife and no children; Joshua of New Haven- no record after 1665; Ellen who married John Allin or Alling; Nathan b 1638 m 1st Esther Griswold; 2nd Hannah (Munson) Tuttle, wid. of Joseph Tuttle; 3rd Rachel widow of Thomas Strong. Stephen, b 1642 m 1st Hannah Smith, dau. of George Smith; 2nd Mary Leete, widow of William Leete.

The stepmother Elizabeth Bradley married 2nd John Parmelee; who died 8 Nov 1659; m 3rd 27 May 1663 to John Evarts who d 10 May 1669. Both of her American husbands were from Guilford, Conn.''

Savage says of Nathan Bradley by his wife Esther, had Anne born 16 Nov 1669, Mary and Abigail born 1672, and Esther born 1677. The wife of Nathan Bradley was Esther Griswold, daughter of Michael Griswold. The following quotation from the Hartford Probate Records taken from the will of Michael Griswold who died 26 Sept 1684- Farmington, Conn. "I give and bequeath to my daughter Hester Bradley 20 shillings, and to her children Ann, Abigail, Mary and Hester, to each of them 20 shillings, which legacies I appoint my son Thomas to pay to my daughter Hester and to her children." The wife of Michael Griswold and mother of Hester (or Esther) was Ann Adams.

The following interesting anecdote of Nathan Bradley is from "Connecticut Historical Collections" by John Warner Barber published in 1836 and now out of print.

"Mr Nathan Bradley was one of the first settlers of this town. He built his house about two and a half miles eastward of Madison church and near the Killingworth line. He was but a lad when he came from England. He intended to land at New Haven but was obliged to land at Saybrook and come across the wilderness to New Haven then being in settlement at that time..... Mr Bradley was quite a hunter and was the first white person to discover the source of the Hammonassett river which originates in a pondstill called 'Nathan's Pond'. Mr Bradley lived to an advanced age and he killed several hundred bears while residing in this town. Mr Bradley in his old age went out to see a friend who lived about a mile northerly from the present meeting house in Madison. On his way he met a bear and her cubs. He endeavored to ride around her but as he moved, the bear moved, and when he stopped, she stopped and sitting on her haunches presented an undaunted front and determined to oppose his further passage. Mr Bradley in his old age being somewhat childish, was obliged to turn back; shed tears that he who had killed so many bears should be obliged to turn his back on one of them."

Adjoining the Murray gravestones in the old Hammonassett cemetery is a curious marker, which is apparently that of Nathan Bradley. This marker consists of rough natural stone, on which is crudely cut or chiseled "75- N.B.-1713" in three lines parallel. (see cut). The New England Genealogical & Historical Register, Vol. 57 states that Nathan Bradley was born in 1638 and died 10 Nov 1713. These correspond with the dates on this stone, which mean literally that he was 75 years old when he died in 1713 and the letters N.B. for his name.

Lived in East Guilford & Woodbury, Conn.

Jonathan Murray in his will proved 1 Sept 1747, bequeaths "to my three daughters, Thankful, Hope and Hester" five pounds each". John Meigs the only surviving son of Thankful on 1 Jan 1750-51 administered the estates of his two brothers, indicating no other heirs; therefore it is assumed that Thankful Murray Meigs died between 1 Sept 1747 and 1 Jan 1750-51. Dr. John Meigs son of John and Thankful Murray Meigs was b in East Guilford, Conn. 2 Apr 1725 and died in Bethlehem Parish of Woodbury, Conn. between 17 July 1769 and 1 Oct 1770. He married in Woodbury 22 Jan 1744-5 Rebecca Clark b probably in Guilford about 1726 d in Bethlehem, Conn. 1 Aug 1795 as the "widow Rebecca Meigs 69" dau of Joseph and Ann ---Clark of Durham, Guilford and Woodbury Conn." We recall that Dr. Meigs father, John Meigs cooper, removed from Guilford to Woodbury about 1738 when he purchased a 70-acre tract of land in the North Purchase. Within a year John Sr. and his two youngest sons were all deceased so the oldest son was called upon to administer his brothers' estates, the widow also being deceased by that time apparently, no mention being made of her.

3 DANIEL MURRAY

Son of Jonathan b 24 Feb 1692 in East Guilford, (now Madison), Conn. d there prob. 15 Sept 1716. Buried in the old Hammonassett cemetery north of Madison, Conn. the marker at his grave being the oldest Murray stone there. Daniel was mar. about 1713 probably in New Haven, to Mary the dau of Richard and Martha (Mansfield) Sperry of New Haven Conn. She was bap. 22 June 1690. She again married 27 July 1725 James Vandermark and probably moved from East Guilford. Lived in East Guilford, Conn.

"Sergeant" Selah Murray as he was called appears to have been a leader and prominent citizen of East Guilford: It is quite probable that he earned the title of Sergeant through membership in the Guilford Train Band. These organizations were militia companies which trained in each town, as the "minute men" whose duty it was to respond to alarms. No such alarms however are believed to be on record as having occurred during the lifetime of Selah Murray.

The land records of Guilford indicate that he was an extensive property owner for that period, probably a farmer and he was appointed executor of his father's will, as the oldest surviving son.

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His will dated 16 July 1760 says in part: "Imprimis, my will is that the provisions in my house at my decease, be for the wife of my family which I leave.' Other provisions of the will are that the choice of sale of land of "Point Lot of Land" to son Selah if he so desires same. Third, to wife Ruth he gives a mare, one cow, the brass and iron kettle that was formerly in the estate of Benjamin Strong; two chairs and one new suit of clothes, one third part of moveable and personal property, and instead of dower, the improvement of one third part of lands and buildings. Fourth, to his son Selah certain real estate, also "green sword and belt'; to son Beriah certain real estate; to two sons Samuel and Nathan, certain real estate; seventh- to daughter Lydia, 3 sheep, 5 pair sheets and household goods that her deceased mother brought to his home; eighth to daughter Ruth 3 sheep, one feather bed, 1 pair sheets, bed blanket, bolster, two pillows and all those household goods that her mother and my wife Ruth brought to my house. Ninth; All the rest to the six children, Selah, Samuel, Beriah, Nathan, Lydia and Ruth to be divided equally. Appointment of executors "My beloved wife Ruth and my trusty friend Timothy Hill." Witnessed by John Murray. Junr, Jonathan Todd John Bishop. Inventory taken 18 June 1764, and the will was probated "July ye 2, 1765. Vol 9, Guilford Probate Records".

One of the interesting land records of Selah Murray is the following; "Guilford, March 29, 1748. Laid out to Selah Murray, one piece of 6th division Land containing 43 Rods bounded 37 rods Westerly on Highway 30 rods east on Josiah Willard's Land and 5 Rods on his own Land Northly on the Land of John Murray. Recorded Ap. ye 11, 1748. Test: Sam'l Hill. Laid out by us, Thomas Hodgkin, John Graves Timothy Meigs—Com." (Guilford Land Records p 137)

Some quaint old fashioned markers for this family are to be found in one of the Madison cemeteries. Among them are the following: 'Daniel, son of Mr Selah & Mrs Anna Murray died August 29, 1751 in his 25th year.'' 'Here lies ye Body of Mrs Lydia, ye wife of Mr Selah Murry, who died Augst ye 20, 1746 Aged 40 Years''. In the Guilford vital records may be found the marriage of the widow of Selah Murray as follows: 'Lt Moses Blatchley and Ruth Murray both of Guilford were joyned in marriage by Mr Jonathan Todd, Minister, January ye 8th 1766.''

The land records of Guilford (Vol 6 p 505) show that Thomas and Hannah Pain sold to "John Murre" of Guilford certain land under date of 28 July 1749. There is also a record of a deed on the Saybrook, Conn. records of the sale of land from John and Ruth Murray to George Denison dated 13 Feb 1750. (Saybrook Records Vol 7 p 327.)

Not much information regarding John Murray has been found. He apparently left no will or estate. There are indications that he may have lived in Killingworth at one time- his son John settled there after he was married.

Peter Warren Murray, son of John and his second wife Ruth; was known as "Warren Murray" having dropped the name Peter. The Talcott records indicate that he lived in Berlin, Conn. but other records say he was a resident of Durham, He enlisted from the latter place in the "Durham Barkers" 10 Feb 1777 for the duration of the war, according to the Conn. Revolutionary Pension Rolls. He was assigned to Capt. Noah Warner's Company 6 May 1777. In 1781 he was commissioned as Corporal in the Fourth Connecticut Regiment commanded by His name also appears on the muster-in-rolls at Dobbs Col. Zebulon Butler. Ferry from 1 Mar 1782 to 15 Oct 1782; also muster roll of the Water Guards commanded by Capt. John Pray at Nyack, N.Y. in Capt. Denike's Co. Fourth Connecticut Regiment. He was also in the 5th Co. Capt. Hopkins 3rd Conn. Regiment commanded by Col. S.B. Webb in 1783. No record has been found indicating that Warren Murray was married. The U.S. Census of 1790 list him as a resident of Durham, Conn. his household consisting of one male of age, indicating that he was single.

An apparently authentic tradition in the family states that he went to Kentucky and settled. He was said to have accumulated considerable property for that period but lost it through the operations of an unscrupulous lawyer. Investigation at the Kentucky State Library and Historical Society has failed to find any record of him. His name does not appear on the 1800 census of Durham, Conn. or in that part of Kentucky which was settled just after the Revolution.

A search in the archives of the Revolutionary War in Washington, D. C. fails to show that Warren Murray received a pension.

9 JEHIEL MURRAY

Son of Jonathan, b 28 Mar 1708 in East Guilford, (now Madison) Connecticut. Jehiel Murray was the first and only son of the ancestor to move from his "home town" as we find he "went out west" probably between Mar and Sept 1745 and settled on a farm in a local neighborhood called "Merryall" some six miles from New Milford toward Kent in Litchfield county, Connecticut. The land records at both New Milford and Kent show several instances where Jehiel Murray of Merryall sold land from Feb 4, 1745 to 1755. A judgment against him is recorded in the Kent records in 1753.

Cothren's History of Woodbury, Conn. says that in Oct 1748 eleven persons living in the southeastern part of Kent and nine persons living in the north-eastern part of New Milford petitioned the general assembly for liberty to hire a minister for six months of the year. This was on the ground that the people lived from seven to ten miles from their places of worship in Kent and New Milford. Among the names listed were Jehiel Murray, Samuel Averill, James Terrill, John Guthrie, Samuel Cogswell, John Miles, and others. This church organization was probably located at New Preston, Conn. which is north of

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New Milford and southeast of Kent a short distance. The New Preston church records state that Mary, wife of Jehiel Murray was a charter member, joining by letter from another church. The records of the Congregational church at New Milford say that Mary Murray wife of Jehiel Murray was received into membership there 18 Mar, 1750.

Jehiel Murray married Mary Way, dau of George and Lydia (Sprague) Way, 12 Nov. 1733 "by Richard Lord, J. P." according to the Guilford Vital Records (Vol. 2 p. 52). She was born 7 Aug 1715 and died 12 Oct. 1806. Jehiel Murray died probably in Merryall, 17 June 1798 and is probably buried in the Merryall cemetery, though there is no marker to indicate it.

After Jehiel Murray's removal from Guilford to the New Milford-Kent area we find the vital records of his family were apparently given less attention, as a few scattering church records are about the only public records available. Noah and Irena were apparently twins, Irena having been baptized 14 June 1750 according to church records in Kent, which show that she was at least three years old. The church records also show that Joel was baptized 17 June 1750.

With the exception of Abner Murray, and one other, all the sons of Jehiel Murray fought in the Continental Army. Abner died in 1766 before the Revolution. Joel's army service seems the least authentic as no record for him can be found in the Revolutionary War archives in Washington however, these records are not complete many of them having been lost. Joel's service is mentioned in the Connecticut Revolutionary rolls.

Another well founded tradition substantiated by a member of the family personally known to the compiler, is that one son of Jehiel was a Tory and fought with the British troops. The story goes that he was promptly disinherited and disowned by the family, and leaving home married the daughter of a British officer later; and settled down near the Hudson river in New York state. No record of his given name has been found or anything bearing on this except a branch of the family presumably, living in Saratoga county, N.Y.

Further reference to this branch will be found under Unconnected Lines probably descended from Jonathan Murray on page 325.

Notes on the Ancestry of Mary Way

"Early Connecticut Marriages" gives the marriage of George Way and Lydia Sprague at Lebanon, 19 July 1713. This is confirmed in "The Sprague Families

in America' which further states that she was a daughter of Lieut. John Sprague of Duxbury, Mass. and Lebanon, Conn. The history of Sharon, Conn. shows George Way to have been a resident of Lyme, Conn. also, having gone there from Lebanon. George Way (1691-1760) was a son of George Way (1655-1717) and Susannah Nest: and this George Way was a son of the ancestor George Way of New London, Conn. (1620-1689) who married Elizabeth Smith.

Lydia Sprague wife of George Way III and mother of Mary Way; was a daughter of Lieut. John Sprague and his wife Lydia---. Lieut. John Sprague (1656-1727-8) was a son of John Sprague and Ruth Bassett. John Sprague Sr was a son of Francis Sprague the ancestor. Ruth Bassett was a daughter of William Bassett of Plymouth, Mass.

George Way and Lydia Sprague had a large family, Mary who married Jehiel Murray being the oldest. Her next younger sister Dorcas (1717-1794) married Jonathan Murray, son of Daniel and nephew of Jehiel. After the death of Jonathan Murray she married Reuben Hill.

The Guilford Town Records state that "Josiah Cruttenden & Esther Murray both of Guilford, were joyned in Marriage by Mr Jonathan Todd, Minister, December ye 15th, 1737." Lived in East Guilford, Conn.

The markers at the graves of Daniel and his son Jonathan are the oldest stones found for any of the Murrays of this family, and are the old type of slab very crude and the one for Jonathan is marked with It bears the following inscription, "In memory of Mr. the "Deaths Head". Jonathan Murray who departed this life March ye 3rd A.D. 1764 in his 48th year". From the Guilford probate records we learn that in his will which was dated 2 Feb 1764, that he left his wife Dorcas all his movable and personal estate except 5 shillings; to his daughter Mabel he left 5 shillings; to his son Amassa, ten pounds; and all of the balance to his six sons, Amassa, Eber, Jonathan, Asahel, Daniel and Stephen, to be divided among them. His wife Dorcas and son Amassa were appointed executors. The records state that "Dorcas and Amassa Murray, Executors of the last will and testament of Jonathan Murray late of Guilford, Dec'd; Exhibited Sd will who was Proved and Approved in Court and Ordered to be Recorded and the Sd Executors accepted the Trust therein Committed to them."

"In Witness whereof I have hereunto Set my hand and Seal in East Guilford the day and year written above.

Witnesses: John Murray
Eben'r Doud
Phineas Meigs."

Inventory of the estate was taken 9 Oct 1764. Jonathan and Asahel Murray, sons of the above Jonathan appeared before the court and elected their brother Amassa to be their guardian. The court also appointed Dorcas, widow of Jonathan Murray late of Guilford as guardian to her two sons Daniel and Stephen Murray. The town records of Killingworth indicate that there were two Jonathans and one John Murray living there between 1725 and 1750. This evidently includes this Jonathan and his son Jonathan and John Murray, uncle of the elder Jonathan a brother of Jonathan Sr's father Daniel. This John also had a son John who may have been living there then, and be the one referred to.

Jonathan Murray was married 23 Apr 1740 to Dorcas, dau of George Way and Lydia Sprague of Lyme, Conn. Dorcas was born 1 July 1717 and d 24 Nov 1794. She was a sister of Mary Way who married Jehiel Murray, and after her husband's death she married Reuben Hill.

The Guilford town records give the date of birth of Eber Murray as 1 May 1745 and that of his brother Stephen as 13 July 1757, but the records here given are taken from the old family bible record. Guilford records show the appointment of Jonathan Murray as guardian of his grandson Jonathan Murray on 1 Aug 1727.

16 MARY (MURRAY) MANVIL-TUTTLE-TITUS

Dau of Daniel b 19 Nov 1716 in New Haven, Conn. first m about 1735-6 to Nicholas Manvil, a Frenchman who d 17 Mar 1751. Mary d prob. in Woodbury, Conn. or Middlebury. Sally (Wheeler) Beecher b in Southbury, Conn. in 1794, a granddaughter of Obadiah and Mary (Manvill) Wheeler left the following account of her family. "Grandmother Wheeler's father was a Frenchman by the name of Manville, he came into New Haven and married Mollie Murry. They moved to Quasopeg, they had seven children, six sons and one daughter. She was my grandmother." Lake Quasopeg is in the present town of Middlebury, just over the line from Woodbury. The records of Woodbury show the births, marriages and deaths of some of the family and descendants of Nicholas and Mary Manville.

27 BERIAH MURRAY

Son of Selah b 19 Aug 1746 in East Guilford, (now Madison) Conn. d 1 Oct 1820 in Williston, Chittenden Co. Vermont. When quite a young man he went to Durham, Conn. and settled and there married 21 July 1764-5 Mary Meeker, dau of Nathaniel and Tamar (Leete) (?) Meeker who was born in Durham 25 Jan 1749 and d in Williston, Vt. in May or June 1824. Beriah Murray was admitted to the church in Durham in February 1766.

After about three years residence in Durham, he moved to Claremont, New Hampshire where he farmed until about the time the Revolution broke out; when he enlisted in Capt. Oliver Ashley's Company, Col. Benjamin Bellows Regiment. He went to Fort Ticonderoga in October 1776 when his company was sent there to re-enforce the garrison, and fought in the engagement of 28 June 1777 at the same place.

About 1795 when many new settlers from Conn. and Mass. were taking up land in the town of Williston, Chittenden Co. Vermont, Beriah Murray and his family went there and settled on what is now known as the George Whitney farm in the southeast part of the town. Beside Beriah Murray and his family there were the Talcott, Spafford, Isham, French & Patrick families among others, all being people of respectability and enterprise and accustomed to hardships of pioneer life in a new country. In 1807 a cane was presented to Beriah Murray from the citizens of Williston which is now in the possession of one of his descendants; as is also an old fashioned musket which he carried in the Revolution it is said.

28 SAMUEL MURRAY

Son of Selah b 13 Apr 1748 in East Guilford (now Madison) Conn. The Kent, Conn. town records state that "Samuel Murray died May 30, 1776 in the 29th

year of his age at Shambalee". As this isn't a local name around the Kent area, it is thought it refers to Chambly, Quebec, where he is thought to have been killed in a military engagement. He was discharged from Col. Hinman's 4th Connecticut Regiment 2 Sept 1775, and he probably re-enlisted. He was married in Amenia, Dutchess Co. (then Union Co.) N. Y. 14 May 1772 to Chloe Kelsey, dau of Abner and Ann (Chatfield) Kelsey, who was b 2 June 1748. Lived in Kent, Litchfield Co., Conn.

The widow and two daughters of Samuel Murray were still residents of Kent as late as 1790, as they are listed in the census report for that year. Their names do not appear in the 1800 census and it is thought that they went to New York State settling near Elmira, with other Connecticut settlers including some of the Kelsey family. No records of them have been found by the compiler.

30 NATHAN MURRAY

Son of Selah b 10 Sept 1750 in East Guilford, (now Madison) Conn. d 8 Feb. 1832 in Fairfax, Franklin Co. Vermont. The Guilford probate records state that Nathan Murray, son of Selah, late of Guilford, being a minor, elected Mr. Timothy Todd of Guilford, for his guardian. This was allowed by the court and Mr. Todd gave bond for the faithful discharge of his trust.

About 1770 he went to Cape Cod and settled in Eastham, Mass. Here he married Betsey Cole probably shortly after settling in Eastham. No record of the date has been found however.

On the 1 of January 1776 Nathan Murray enlisted at Roxbury, Mass. in the Revolution, and served as a private in Capt. Oliver Soper's Company, Col. Jos. Reed's Massachusetts Regiment; for a period of one year. In "Massachusetts Soldiers and Sailors in the Revolution' page 143 the following excerpt is found. 'Nathan Murray gave a company receipt to Capt. Oliver Soper for wages for February and March 1776 dated New York; also a company receipt given to Capt. Oliver Soper for return of allowance on march from Dorchester to New York, dated New York, April 29, 1776.' Nathan Murray was in the battle of Harlem Heights and in the retreat from Fort Washington New York he was taken prisoner and held until January 1777 when he was exchanged. He also saw service in the battle of Turtle Bay. He reenlisted in March 1778 at Dover, N.Y. and served one year as a private under Lieut. Weissfels, in Col. Van Cortlandt's New York Regiment. He was also in the battle of Monmouth. According to New York Revolutionary archives, Nathan Murray again enlisted 2 April 1781, and served in Col. Charles Smith's Regiment. Shortly after finishing his military service he moved to New Milford, Conn. and is listed as a resident there in the 1790 census.

Shortly after the turn of the century Nathan Murray took his family and settled on a farm in the southeast corner of the town of Fairfax, in Franklin county, Vermont. On the first Monday in April 1803, he voted at a town meeting in Georgia, Vermont to call Rev. P. V. Bogue of Winchester, Conn. to be the first regular minister of the Congregational Church. Subsequently a few days later a paper was drawn up for subscriptions and Nathan Murray's name appeared

fourth on the list. In addition to farming he followed his trade as a cooper up to 1811. He applied for a pension which was granted 5 May 1818.

Samuel Grangers Company, Gen. Waterbury's State Brigade in defense of the coast from New Haven to Horseneck (near Greenwich) where Gen. Putnam rode down the declevity.

Reference to John Murray's Revolutionary service is an abstract from "The Record of Connecticut Men in the Military and Naval Service during the War of the Revolution, 1775-1783, by Johnston. p. 89. also p. 565. Reference is also made to the DAR Lineage Books. Lived in East Guilford and Killingworth, Conn.

Jesse Murray enlisted 22 Mar 1776 in Capt. Daniel Hand's Co. Col. Talcott's Connecticut Regiment from Guilford. (Conn. Men.in the Revolution, Vol 1 p 388.)

Some traditions have come down in the family regarding the tragic death of Eber Murray who was lost at sea. It is said that one night his mother was awakened by a distinct knock at the door and the words "Mother come down and let me in". Awakening her husband she told him that Eber had come home and to go down and let him in. Jesse Murray listened and not hearing anything told her she must have been dreaming. Later this knocking occurred twice again, so the mother went to the door herself but no one was there. Time passed and one day Eber's ship came into port and word was sent to his parents that Eber had been lost overboard in a gale at midnight three months previously, and when dates were compared it was found it was the night his mother had heard the knocking at the door.





44 EZRA MURRAY

Son of Jehiel b 11 July 1741 in East Guilford, Conn. (now Madison) d about 1815 in Ontario county, near Victor, N.Y. In early boyhood he went to western Conn with his parents when they settled on a farm between New Milford and Kent in the neighborhood called "Merryall". The records of Amenia, Dutchess Co. N.Y. (then in Union Co.) state that "Ezra Murray was married to Hannah Gould 3 Aug 1766 by Roswell Hopkins, Esq." The town records of Sharon, Conn. state

they were married 25 Aug 1766. Hannah Gould was b 4 Jan. 1744-45, a dau of Hibbard and Hannah (Boatman) Gould according to the Gould Genealogy. Up to the time of Ezra Murray's enlistment in the Revolution in 1778 he lived probably in what was known as the "King's District" an area covering the boundaries of eastern New York and western Conn., Mass., and Vermont; the present state boundaries having been fixed in 1820. Ezra Murray lived probably in the vicinity of Canaan, Columbia County, N.Y. the first part of his married life. The records at Kent, Conn. show a sale of land from Ezra Murray of New Canaan, Albany Co. N.Y. to Noah Murray of Kent, Conn. dated 9 May 1774. Columbia county was then a part of Albany County.

The Colonial History of New York Vol. 15 Pg. 274 says that Ezra Murray was 2nd Lieut. in the 17th Regiment, King's District, Col. William Bradford Whiting Lt. Col. Asa Waterman, Major Asa Douglas - July 16, 1778. "New York in the Revolution" also states that Ezra Murray 2nd Lieut. 17th Regiment changes regiment, July 16, 1778. 1 bid - p. 132. A history of Columbia Co. N.Y. says that Ezra Murray was town clerk of Canaan in that county from 1778 to 1785 and justice of the peace in 1786. At a meeting of the residents of Kings District Ezra Murray was one of a committee appointed to send a report to the state legislature of the possessors of the land there for confirmation of titles.

In 1781 Ezra Murray was one of a committee appointed informing officers whose duty was to stop people from traveling on the Sabbath, to take notice of breaches of the peace and treasonable practices and to enter complaint of such persons with the proper authorities.

"New York State in the Revolution" lists Ezra Murray, Reuben Murray and Daniel Murray among names of soldiers in the 17th New York Regiment for land bounty rights.

Sometime between 1781 and 1789 Ezra Murray went to Mohawk Township Montgomery Co. N. Y. He with William Ellis and Eleazer Ellis were witnesses of the will of Samuel Barnard dated 31 Aug 1789, Mohawk District, N. Y. The census of 1790 gives Ezra Murray as a resident of Mohawk Township, Montgomery Co. On 12 Mar 1793 the town of Florida was formed from Mohawk Township, and Ezra Murray lived in that part embraced in the new town of Florida. He evidently was a man of strong personality and a prominent and influential citizen. A tradition comes down in the family to the effect that he was very well dressed and possibly quite dignified and seldom separated from his gloves. One day one of his brothers saw his gloves lying on the table and asked in apparent alarm "Where is Ezra?"

From the Supervisors' Book of the town of Florida are the resolutions passed by a vote of the free-holders at the first town meeting held the first Tuesday in April 1794, at which time organization was formed and officers elected. The following copy of Resolution IX follows: "And it be further enacted that the Supervisor of the town pay to Ezra Murray the sum of One Pound six shillings as a reward for the use of his house this day." Among other papers a receipt from Ezra Murray shows him to have been a very good penman. There is also

a receipt from Ichabod Murray, younger brother of Ezra for one pound, 19 shillings and 8 pence for ballot boxes.

In 1797 the town records show Ezra Murray to have been elected commissioner of schools and overseer of highways, and again in 1798 commissioner of schools. He was elected fence viewer in 1799 and appointed overseer of highways again in 1800. Ezra Murray lived andowned property in the eastern limits of Minaville village then commonly known as "The Street" and "Yankee Street", as the village was not called Minaville until 1812.

About 1801 Ezra Murray moved to Ontario county on a farm near Victor and not far from W. Bloomfield. His son Reuben preceded him as he lived in the vicinity of Farmington in that county as early as 1797. Under date of 4 July 1810 there was a deed made between Hosea Aldrich of Bloomfield and Rachel his wife to Ezra Murray of said town and county. Inasmuch as Ezra's wife is not mentioned we might assume that she was dead at this time.

Another deed dated 22 Aug. 1810 from Ezra Murray to Lucretia Ellis his daughter for and in consideration of love and affection also for her better support and livelihood - witnessed by Stephen Ellis and Roswell Murray. Ezra and Roswell Murray helped lay out the old cemetery which adjoins the Ellis farm and Ezra was one of the first to be buried in it. No stone marks his grave however - there are no markers for any of the family so that the location of the graves is apparently lost.

"Mrs Murray died Aug 14, 1825 aged 72." From the West Bloomfield Congregational church records. She possibly may have been a second wife of Ezra Murray.

45 REUBEN MURRAY

Son of Jehiel b 17 Feb. 1743-44 in East Guilford, (now Madison) Conn. Not very long afterward his parents moved to a farm near New Milford, Conn. to a neighborhood called "Merryall" which name this locality bears to this day. Growing up in the rugged surroundings of the period he developed considerable initiative and resourcefulness and when the Revolution broke out he was among the first to enlist.

The Connecticut Revolutionary Rolls and Lists showing names of field and staff officers of Col. Charles Burrall's Regiment as contained in a payroll submitted February 24, 1776, the following item appears; "The Regimental Commissary Book adds the following names and information; 'Ruben Murry, Lt. in Swift's Company'. Page 10 of "Connecticut Men in the Revolution" includes his name in a list of Lieutenants in the roster of Col. Charles Burrall's Continental Regiment, the first name being omitted. From another source it is learned that Lieut. Reuben Murray is listed under Col. Heman Swift's Company. Record of him as having served in Col. Charles Burrall's Connecticut Regiment in Continental Service and was rendered Supernumary on 'Reform of the Army' Jan 1777 is said to be on file with the Society of the Cincinnati. Reason for his

being supernumary was disability. This record is the one which qualifies him as having served in Washington's Army; which tradition has come down in the family.

Later presumably about the time Reuben Murray moved to Columbia Co. N. Y. (then Albany Co.) he either was transferred or re-enlisted in the 7th Regiment of the Albany County Militia commanded by Col. Abraham J. Van Alstine. He also served as Lieutenant in the 17th Regiment, Albany County militia, commanded by William Bradford Whiting, and in Capt. Daniel Herrick's Company of this regiment. His name appears on the list of land bounty rights together with his brothers Daniel and Ezra, as having served in the 17th Regiment, Albany County Militia. Manuscript record Vol. 2 p 76 in the New York State Library, says: "Cert. No. 6618 for L4, 15 s 3d issued to Reuben Murry for services as lieutenant in Capt. Daniel Herrick's company of Col. Wm. B. Whiting's regiment of Albany county militia (Kings District)".

It seems a little difficult to say definitely where Reuben Murray lived after his marriage in 1766, but it is evident that he lived in the western part of Litchfield county, Connecticut until sometime in 1777-78, when he moved to Columbia county, (then Albany Co.) N.Y. in the vicinity of Chatham. In 1794 he was living in the town of Florida, Montgomery Co. N.Y. where he lived until about 1796 when he moved to near Pompey, Onondaga County, N.Y.

According to the History of Columbia County, N.Y. Reuben Murray was elected Justice of the Peace which office he held from 1786 to 1792, and that he was appointed on a committee to prevent election frauds in 1792. This was done at a meeting on the 10th of July 1792 which was called to prevent every attempt to oppose the right of suffrage in any way. This committee was to act in conjunction with other like committees in the state to secure a law whereby to prevent the abuse of the power reposed in the board of canvassers in the last election.

The following family anecdotes were written by Reuben Murray, III grandson of Lieut. Reuben Murray. These were written about 1888 when Reuben III was 72 years of age. As with all family traditions these anecdotes contain some mistakes due probably to misunderstandings and faulty recollection of related facts, but very interesting nevertheless, revealing certain outstanding facts about Reuben Murray in particular and the family in general.

"Reuben Murray's grandfather - our grandmother, from Scotland. His mother was Sarah Wade, his wife Sarah Guthrie. His brothers were Daniel, Solomon, Joel, Ezra and Ichabod. None of us remember only Daniel and Ichabod who frequently visited Pompey when we were young. We think grandfather had other brothers and at an early day when the family was quite young he moved from Litchfield county, Connecticut to Columbia County, New York.

There were four sons, Philo, Reuben, Heman and Allen, and four daughters, Lucinda the wife of Dr John Frisbee, Mary wife of Roger Carpenter, Sarah wife of John Reddington and Aurora, wife of Isaac Jerome. We think grandfather had other brothers. One was a Universalist minister in Connecticut, who performed the marriage ceremony for Peter Smith who eloped with his intended from this state. (Gerritt Smith's parents). A cousin of father's who lived in Connecticut, a cooper by trade, drew \$100000 prize in a lottery, was the Murray Hill man. When he drew the prize a party of New Yorkers chartered an extra coach and went to Connecticut for him and brought him on to New York, and from that time until eight or ten years ago the Murrays lost all trace of him,

until at the Manlius and Pompey fair, brother Minor was exhibiting a pair of horses, a man asked to ride with him, saying 'I am going to cousin you' My name is Murray'. I live in Cazenovia now. I want you to name over all the old Murrays you can remember.' Minor named them but none connected him with us. Finally he asked him to try again. Then Minor told him about a cousin of father's, a cooper in Connecticut drawing the \$100000 prize, then Mr Murray said that was my father or grandfather, I forget which', who was the original owner of Murray Hill. This Murray sold out in Cazenovia and moved to Geneva in Ontario county, where he died. He said we are cousins and I shall certainly visit you.'

I remember further that grandfather had one brother who was disinherited and disowned and driven from home for being a Tory in the Revolution; that he went to New York City and married the daughter of British officer of high rank. This branch of our family was lopped off by our great grandfather, who declared he would shoot him if he returned as soon as any other Tory.

Joel Murray was a Revolutionary soldier, was taken prisoner and escaped from the enemy, but nearly starved to death on his way to the fort. When he came home and told the story, he was made to stand guard against the boys' shots at his unsatisfied appetite, as we guessed, was as uncle Martin Butler used to say of himself, was the only great thing about him; but we may be mistaken-his history is lost to us at least.

The preacher of glad tidings was also a stranger. Grandfather's replies to questions was 'Yes, we had a brother who was a little underwitted, and they made a preacher of him,' in joke, of course.

We are not familiar with the genealogy of our ancestors and like most families have been careless in the preservation of any anecdotes which we may have heard We have always understood that our great grandparents were from Scotland on the Murray side and settled on the Hudson river near New York City, but their names and dates of immigration are forgotten if ever told. Our grandfather lived in Canaan, Litchfield Co., Conn. and suppose he was born there; his father's name is not remembered, but his mother's name before marriage was Sarah Wade, and father claimed connection with Benjamin Wade through her. Our grandmother's maiden name was Sarah Guthrie. Several of their children were born in Connecticut. Our father Reuben Murray was two years old when they moved to Columbia county, this state (N.Y.) I think to Chatham, but am not sure; this was in 1778 and they moved from there to Florida, then to Pompey, Onondaga Co., N.Y. about 1800, where he died Nov. 26, Grandfather was for many years a Presbyterian and in 1810 aged 67 years. trying to reconcile the creed to his reason had spells of insanity.

Reuben Murray was a man of more than ordinary intellect. Poetic, imaginative, witty many anecdotes are still related of him, illustrating his keen mind and ready wit. His personal appearance is described as being very impressive. He was tall and commanding in figure, handsome, graceful and elegant in bearing. His sons and daughters must have inherited many of his distinguishing qualities, as Allen and Aurora are still remembered for their charm and wit, and some of the others were also spoken of as handsome and agreeable. Among his intimate friends he numbered many of the most influential men of the state-the Patroon Van Renssalaer, Gen. Root, Mr. Bush and others. I will here relate an anecdote.

General Root and Mr. Bush called upon him and in discussing religion, asked him to describe heaven. He described it as a perfect paradise, the lawn was smooth,

green and beautiful and said there was not a Root or a Bush there and never would be. At the time Van Renssalaer was candidate for governor, grandfather canvassed western New York for him and used to frequently visit Albany, New York, Saratoga and other places on invitation and in the company with Van Renssalaer, who would always insist on paying all expenses.

Grandfather served in the Revolution and at the taking of Ticonderoga was commissary and volunteered to go with Ethan Allen to take it, but Allen said 'No Reuben you must provide for the men and cannot be spared'. After the taking of Ticonderoga Ethan Allen went into the commissary's quarters for rations, which at that time consisted largely of New England rum and fresh fish. As he and his menentered, the fish and rum smell caused him to say 'Reuben this smells as though you had damnation on tap'. He wrote and sang a song on the taking of Ticonderoga.

At one time he was sent across Lake George on the ice. His horse broke through the ice and was drowned, and although wet and nearly frozen he reached his destination and delivered the dispatches on time.

Though Reuben Murray was not a lawyer, he practiced in justices' courts considerably. One case in this neighborhood: Moses Hinsdale sued a well digger for damages. The proof of defendant was that he dug down to the rock and Moses said 'There is water enough, stone up the well'. The well digger stoned up the well which afterward proved not to yield a sufficient quantity of water, hence the suit for damages. In summing up grandfather cited the proof and closed by saying the defendant had done his duty now let Moses smite the rock.

It seems the Murrays were originally enthusiasts on religion, one brother of our grandfather at one time was so zealous that he neglected his business and became quite poor and said he could hear the angels sing. Grandfather took him a barrel of pork, flour and meal and told him that a full stomach would drown the angels' songs. Grandfather left home once for New'York and his friends Gen. Root and Mr. Bush found him domiciled at a hotel. He had purchased a fine pair of four-in-hand outfit and was living in grand style. They finally settled up his affairs and brought him home. I relate these things thinking they may be new to the Jeromes in a mixed and desultory way, as they occur to my memory.

AN ACROSTIC – written by grandfather Reuben Murray a short time before his death. He was requested to write one and wrote it as fast as he could write.

Remote from earth my soul doth take it's flight Enclosed in earth, in organs as dark as night, United here a time to earthly soil By plastic nature, sensitive awhile, Eternal Life forbids me long to stay, Nature's great law I willingly obey, My soul exults this mantle here to leave Unsullied glories wait the great repose Reason forbids my soul to ever doubt, Rejoice to see my glass so near run out, 'Mong the blest I wish to join my song, Ye doubting souls why would ye stay so long.

Cousin Caroline H. Slosson sent a copy of the acrostic written by grandfather with the following: 'And yet, I must say, spare the ancestral tree'.

A preacher it bore with glad tidings for all,
And patriots sound to the core,
And a poet whose verse still lives to rehearse
His name and fame to his race,
An artist it bore, whose fame and renown
Rang from city to (Murray) Hill, and from hill to town,
And others it bore whose name might adorn,
But neither in song is it told nor in story
That it's branches bore a thief or a Tory.'

Grandfather Stephen Butler's grandfather was a Baldwin, his wife Sarah Rossiter; her mother was a Gould. Their children five sons and four daughters: David Butler of Troy, Episcopal Minister; Gould Butler, Martin Butler; George Butler died in New York City. Daughters Rena Butler married Phelps Harwinton, Rachel Butler married Cook Harwinton, Rhoda Butler married James W. Gold of Pompey, Sabra Butler married Reuben Murray the second."

In the light of further investigation some of the points given in the foregoing sketch, the following corrections can be made.

The mother of Reuben Murray, subject of this sketch, was not Sarah Wade, but Mary Way, wife of Jehiel Murray. Quite possibly some confusion of the names Way and Wade caused a misunderstanding of the names, being similar in sound.

The anecdote about the cousin in Connecticut who was a cooper by trade and drew a lottery prize, is possibly based on truth. Philo Murray son of Abner Murray, an older brother of Reuben, lived in Woodbury, Connecticut and was a cooper by trade. He was not, however, a cousin but a nephew of Reuben. There seems to be a tradition among the descendants of Philo Murray that he was wealthy; but the reference to Murray Hill in New York is not borne out by the facts. Murray Hill was named for the Mrs. Murray who entertained General Howe during the Revolution, while Washington's forces defeated the British. The husband of this Mrs. Murray was from a Pennsylvania ancestor and was not of our family in this country.

The preacher referred to was evidently Noah Murray, brother of Reuben, who introduced Universalism in Bradford county, Pa. He is probably the one who married Gerrit Smith referred to in the sketch.

Authentic information regarding the Tory brother places this anecdote beyond the range of tradition. His given name, however, has not been learned, but the grandfather of the compiler confirmed this fact to his daughter many years ago. Further reference to him will be found in the "Unattached Families" in this book.

The story of the immigrant ancestor living on the Hudson near New York is incorrect, as the Guilford, Connecticut records show otherwise.

Record of a deed dated 12 March 1778, shows land conveyed in North Britain, King's District, Albany Co. N.Y. to Reuben Murray of Kent, Conn. and witnessed by Ezra Murray. Other records of land conveyances from Reuben Murray to Samuel Murray dated 10 Mar 1772 and from Samuel Murray to Reuben Murray the same year are on file at Kent, Conn.

Reuben Murray m 1st in 1766 to Sarah, dau of John and Abigail (Coe) Guthrie of Woodbury, Conn. She was born 30 Apr 1744 and d in 1792. In 1793 Reuben Murray married 2nd to Mrs Sarah (Knickerbocker) Griffin widow of David Griffin and probably dau of John and Jemima Knickerbocker, b 1 Mar 1752 (Salisbury, Conn. Records). Reuben Murray died in Pompey, Onondaga Co. N. Y. 26 Nov 1810. He lived in various places in Litchfield county, Conn. including Canaan and Kent and later in Chatham, Columbia Co. (then Albany Co.) N.Y. and Pompey, Onondaga Co. NY.

46 - NOAH MURRAY

Son of Jehiel b 11 April 1747-8 in Merryall, Litchfield Co. Conn. a small neighborhood settlement between Kent and New Milford. Here he probably grew up on his father's farm, the early pioneer life of the period developing the sturdy characteristics manifested in later life. Like some of his brothers he was apparently a man of strong convictions with a keen sense of right and wrong. While still quite a youth he enlisted in Col. Putnam's Connecticut Battalion, 2nd Company commanded by Capt. Foote, on 30 March 1764, and was discharged 4 Dec 1764 in the French and Indian War. His name appears on the French and Indian War Roll on p. 365, Vol. II. As a young man he embraced the Baptist faith, but later when Universalism was just becoming known he changed to that faith, introducing it in Bradford county, Pennsylvania, something which required considerable courage in those days.

Mrs. Louise Welles Murray, whose husband was a descendant of Noah Murray, was probably the best posted person on Rev. Noah Murray, as she was historian of Bradford county, Pennsylvania for many years has written in part:

"We find no record of Noah's birth which occurred 11 April 1747-8, About this time according to records his father moved to Kent, Connecticut, and the Congregational Church records say that the baptism of Noah and Irena Murray took place 3 April 1750, by Rev. Cyrus Marsh. Noah married Mary Stowe of Middletown or Watertown, but we have failed to find any record of their marriage. His eldest child was born in 1765. He had seven children who grew to maturity. An infant was buried at Watertown according to church records. It seems safe to assume that his wife was from Watertown, Conn.

Noah seems to have been sort of a nomad as we have records of his life in a number of places. We have none, however, prior to the Revolutionary War, except that he bought some land in 1774 from his brother Ezra in Kent. Also that one of his brothers jokingly told that Noah was a stranger to the family

adding "Yes, we had a brother who was a little under-witted and we made a preacher of him".

On the first call for troops April 1775 Noah enlisted for six months in Col. Hinman's 4th Connecticut Regiment of Volunteers. This regiment was recruited mainly from Litchfield county.

Upon the surprise of Fort Ticonderoga, Gov. Trumbull ordered this regiment to march as soon as possible to secure that post and Crown Point against recapture. Noah Murray was discharged 2 Sept 1775 on account of sickness. We do not know whether he accompanied his regiment to Canada under Montgomery in August. According to certified records he re-enlisted 6 May 1777 for three years and was appointed sergeant in the company of Capt. Ebenezer Hill, 7th Battalion, Connecticut line commanded by Col. Heman Swift and recruited in Fairfield and other counties. Tradition says that Noah enlisted from Windham. He went into the field at Camp Peekskill, New York.

In September 1777 under Gen. McDougall he joined Washington's Army in Penn. He was in the Battle of Germantown 4 Oct. 1777, wintered at Valley Forge, and was engaged in the Battle of Monmouth in June 1778, and was discharged 14 Dec 1778 by Gen. Huntington. These records are from 'Connecticut Men in the Revolution''-his second enlistment is also on record in the War Department.

We will give here a slightly different account of Noah Murray from a letter from his son Noah Murray, Jr. 'On the commencement of the War of the Revolution, my father early enlisted in the good cause and during the struggle held an orderly sergeant, a post in the beginning and was promoted to a lieutenancy before he left the army: was wounded slightly and was engaged in a number of battles and returned to his family poor and without any remuneration save the consolation of helping to drive the tyrants back to their island home.'

He next appears as a Baptist preacher, having charge of a church at Lanesboro, Mass. In 1784 he embraced the comparatively new doctrine of Universalism; there are records of his preaching at Hinsdale, Berkshire county that year and in 1786 a letter from the Rev. John Murray of Boston (who was not a relative) says 'There is now with us a Mr. Noah Murray, a preacher of Jesus Christ, statedly laboring in the Oblong and adjacent parts. I am exceedingly pleased with him and considering his advantages, think him a very extraordinary man.' (The Oblong was a tract of land between Connecticut and New York, now a part of the latter state.) Noah's name appears on the fragmentary church records of the Baptist Church of Cheshire, Berkshire Co. Mass. about this time.

In 1787 he removed his family to Shawnee, Luzerne Co. Pa. He preached there occasionally but organized no recorded society. On 23 Nov. 1788 he was appointed by the supreme executive council one of the Justices of the Quarter Sessions of Luzerne for the first district. (At the June sessions in 1788 the court agreed to divide Luzerne county into districts for election of Justices of the Peace. Three districts were thus formed, the first extending from the upper line of the county about Tozer's Bridge to a line east and west in Wycox.)

His commission in this office is still in existence. Doubtless by reason of this appointment he came up the river with his family. Landing at Queen Esther flats he found a deserted log cabin and took possession of this and doubtless purchased land. He cultivated the flats for some time. He and his son Abner obtained certain lots there in 1790. These lots or tract was across the Chemung river and comprised the farm which is still in possession of the Murray family (1896)."

"Though cultivating his farm he was not idle in promoting a knowledge of Universalism throughout this locality, preaching Sundays as often as the opportunity presented, at Sheshequin, Litchfield, Murraysfield and Athens, where his name is still revered as that of the founder of Universalism in Bradford County.

In the summer of 1895 when curiosity led us to seek his grave and old home in Murraysfield (now Springfield) we accosted an old man at random, saying, 'Did you ever hear of Noah Murray?' Springing to his feet and coming rapidly to our carriage he exclaimed, 'Noah Murray, why he was the greatest preacher of all, and the only one, and after you heard him you wanted to hear no other!' We laughingly asked 'Did you know him?' 'Know him, he died eighty-four years ago. My father was the only man in this section at the time of his death who remembered Noah Murray personally.' (Told by Diton Brace).

In 1793 Rev. Moses Park, who preached the Baptist doctrine in Sheshequin, became alarmed at the success of Noah Murray and decided to try and silence his heresy. In this enterprise he was joined by Joseph Kinney, another Baptist, who was a great reader and logical reasoner. A challenge was sent to Mr. Murray, and at sunset one evening they sat down, bibles in hand, to the contest. Mr. Park had procured the only large bible with a concordance that there was in the country. Sunrise the next morning found them sitting there still. All the strong texts and all the arguments brought forward by Mr. Park were swept away like thistledown before the wind; and the challengers not only acknowledged themselves beaten, but converted to Universalism. Another Baptist brother felt this defeat so bitterly that he made the remark that if "Squire" Murray should go to heaven he did not want to go himself. Mr. Murray replied. "You cannot help yourself brother S----. You have got to go there. When our Savior has destroyed the works of the devil with which you are now connected you will be perfectly willing to go in my company."

Noah Murray revisited New England several times, and was ordained in the general convention in 1803 in Winchester. By advice of brethren he accepted an invitation to the Lombard Street Church in Philadelphia in 1807. He was pastor there but one year, feeling too old to lead a city church thru the stormy days of Universalism. He returned to this vicinity in 1808 and made a home at Murraysfield, (a grant of land made to him by The Susquehanna Company March 15, 1795, now a part of Springfield). Here he lived opposite Dr. Corey's lot, improving his property until his death, which occurred May 16, 1811. After his death this property consisted of "200 acres with a small improvement which he had made after his return from the city." We infer from this that he made his home in Athens until 1807. His son, Noah, Jr. lived on the Murraysfield property a year or more, when he sold it and returned to Athens living in a home built by his wife's brother, just north of town.

The following account of Noah Murray (Sr's) death is taken from a Universalist paper of the day: "Intruders endeavored to shake the dying saint by inquiring if his faith in Universalism was not weakening. Unable to speak, he motioned for a piece of chalk and wrote on a board 'Stronger'.

This account was confirmed by his son Abner Murray in 1848. His great grand-son Millard P. Murray remembers seeing this board and writing when a little boy. It is but a few years since the Universalists of Bradford County erected a monument at his grave in Springfield, Bradford Co. Pennsylvania. It is of interest to state here that one of his great grandsons and namesakes, Noah Murray Gaylord, became a Universalist minister and was filling a pulpit in Boston at the time of his death.

Noah Murray was evidently always active in promoting the welfare of old Tioga Point. When the Academical Association was organized in 1797 he was the first to subscribe for a share, and his signature stands first on the list in the old book of record now in the museum at Athens. He was chairman of the first board of trustees, and was succeeded in that office by his son Abner. A noble man, no word or record can be found against his worthy name. Let his descendants honor his memory. Of his wife, little is known, except from stray letters, etc. After his death she spent the remainder of her life with her sons, Abner and Noah, Jr. It is said she died while on a visit to a granddaughter. No family or bible record has ever been found, though diligent inquiry has been made.

Note- John Stowe and his wife Elizabeth came over in one of the Winthrop companies in 1634, settled in Roxbury, Mass; their son Samuel graduated at Harvard in 1645, and was the first minister in Middletown, Conn. Doubtless Mary Stowe, wife of Noah Murray, was one of his descendants."

Among the list of taxpaying residents of Waterbury, Conn. for the year 1767, we find Noah Murray rated at 27 pounds.

The town records of Stockbridge, Mass. have the following extracts: P. 145. Dec 26, 1768 "Voted to accept the proposal made by those of the profession of the church of England" an agreement to be taxed as proprietors until the sum of L300 is reached for the erection of a meeting house. Petition dated Dec 8, 1768. A list of names not present includes Noah Murray.

"There is a dispute concerning Seth Warrin and Noah Murray as to their being churchmen. If they will not make full profession thereof in some public meeting their entering their names in the list is to be null and void."

Noah Murray married Mary Stowe, (born Nov 16, 1747 d Jan 27, 1827) They lived in various places, principally Tioga Point, now Athens, Pa. and Murraysfield, now Springfield, Pa. where he d 16 May 1811.

The tax list from the Kent, Conn. records for 1774, 1775, 1776 gives the name of Noah Murray. In 1778 Noah got an abatement on his tax of 6/7. In 1779 his name appears on the New Preston list.

48 JOEL MURRAY

Son of Jehiel b 14 June 1750 near Kent, Litchfield Co. Conn. and according to Vol 1 p 89 of the Kent Congregational Church records was baptized 17 June 1750 by Cyrus Marsh, pastor. He d after January 1801 in or near Smithfield, Bradford Co. Pa. His first marriage was to Abigail Peet, dau. probably of John and Rebecca (Fairfield) Peet. "Early Connecticut Marriages" states they were married 29 Dec 1774 in Washington, Conn. Abigail Peet was born in 1752 and

d prior to 2 Jan 1790. The will of David Peet, brother of Abigail, dated 2 Jan 1790, apparently being unmarried devised his property as follows: To his mother Rebecca, brothers Edmund, John, Daniel and Albe; sisters Thankful wife of Willian Smith, Mabel wife of John Turrell, Abigail former wife of Joel Murray, Rebecca former wife of Salmon Cruttenden; and specifically states "as to the former deceased sister Abigail, formerly wife of Joel Murray, to her children I give nothing." This indicates that Abigail was deceased at the time his will was made, also the probability that she left children. No records of any have come to the attention of the compiler however.

Joel Murray's second marriage was to Susan Tozer, dau. of Samuel and Dorothy (Newton) Tozer of Colchester, Conn. according to Tozer family records. They moved to Tioga Point (now Athens) Bradford Co. Pa. near to where Joel's brother Noah lived and ran a sawmill, and at which Joel is said to have worked during the period between 1798-1800.

In an old day book commonly found in country stores at that time, and now in the Tioga Point Museum in Athens, are some items referring to Joel Murray, disclosing purchases of various articles for women. Also items charged to one Polly Stowe, who may have been a sister of Joel's brother Noah's wife who was Mary Stowe. The following entry was noted; 'Dec 24, 1798, Joel Murray to 3 1/2 galls. of whisky for his wedding sometime since.' Indications seem to point that he and Polly Stowe were married and moved to Smithfield, Pa. a small settlement some nine miles from Athens, at which point the record disappears.

The U.S. Census report for 1800 shows Joel Murray as a resident of Tioga Twp. Lucerne Co. (now Bradford Co.) Pa. as head of a family consisting of one white male of 45 and upwards and one white female of 45 and upwards. Census reports of 1810 and 1820 do not mention him.

Connecticut Revolutionary Rolls say that Joel Murray enlisted from Kent, Conn. in 1777 and was in Capt. E. Couch's Co. Col. Moseley's Regiment, to serve until 1 Jan 1781. A tradition comes down that Joel Murray was taken prisoner but escaped and nearly starved to death before reaching the American lines. He is not mentioned in the Revolutionary Pension Records— which however are said to be incomplete. Joel Murray was listed as a taxpaying citizen of Waterbury, Conn. in 1770, his ratable tax being 19 pounds.

49 DANIEL MURRAY

Son of Jehiel b 9 June 1753 nr Kent, Litchfield Co. Conn. d 18 March 1835 nr Pike, Wyoming Co. (then Alleghany Co.) N.Y. He married 6 July 1774-5, Elizabeth Raymond, b 24 Sept 1755 d 1 May 1840. She was a daughter of Daniel and Elizabeth (Blackmer) Raymond; the latter being the widow of Isaac Doty when she married Daniel Raymond. Both Daniel Murray and his wife are believed to have been buried in the old Doty cemetery adjoining the Doty farm near Pike; many of the Doty and Murray families are buried there; including Lieut. Reuben Doty of the Revolution and his wife Hannah Delano Doty.

Shortly after his marriage Daniel Murray and his wife moved to New Canaan, Albany Co. N.Y. now Canaan, Columbia Co. N.Y. living in the vicinity of his brothers, Ezra, Reuben and Solomon Murray. About 1781-2 he moved to Fairfield, (then Oneida Co.) now Herkimer Co. N.Y. Town records show him to have been a resident of the town of Florida Montgomery Co. N.Y. from

about 1793 to 1795, then in Nunda, then Alleghany Co. now Livingston Co. N.Y. About 1798-1799 he moved to Pike, then Alleghany Co. for a short period. now Wyoming Co. N.Y. where he remained the balance of his life.

Revolutionary War records show that Daniel Murray enlisted as a private in March 1776 for nine months service and was in Capt. Josiah Warner's Co. Col. William Bradford Whiting's Regiment- residence at the time given as New Canaan, Albany Co. N.Y. In July 1777 Daniel Murray again enlisted for three weeks in Capt. Cady's Company, Col. William Bradford Whiting's Regiment. "New York in the Revolution" mentions him as having served in the 2nd New York Regiment commanded by Col. Philip Van Cortlandt. He applied for a pension 27 Aug 1832 which was allowed.

According to Vol. 73 p 140 of the DAR Lineage Books, Daniel Murray saw service at Fort George and Fort Edward while in Capt. Cady's Co. The Doty Genealogy on page 705 says that Daniel Murray was in the same company as his brother Ichabod, commanded by Lieut. Reuben Doty,

In appearance Daniel Murray is described as having been about 5 feet 6 inches in height, very genial and whole-souled, always ready to help anyone. He was generally very well liked by those who knew him.

50 ICHABOD MURRAY

Son of Jehiel b 16 Aug 1755 in Merryall, Litchfield Co. Conn. Prior to his enlistment for Revolutionary service, nothing is known of the early life of Ichabod Murray, but he probably grew up on his father's farm at Merryall, some few miles from New Milford, Conn.

At the early age of 20, he enlisted 1 Dec 1775 in the Revolution. The records in the Pension Office in Washington, D.C. state that the length of his service was 13 months, as a private in Capt. Bostwick's Company, Col. Charles Webb's Regiment, Connecticut. Battles engaged in- none mentioned. Date of application for pension 16 April 1818; residence at time of application, Lowville, N.Y. Age at time of application 62 years. Claim for pension was allowed.

The records of the Revolutionary soldiers in the Pension Office are very incomplete and fragmentary as a rule so that some of the men probably saw service when the record in the Pension Office does not mention it. This is apparently

true in this case, as shown by the following extract from the "Doty-Doten Family" Genealogy, page 666. "Reuben Doty was an officer in the Continental Army, being in 1777 a Lieutenant in Col. Humphrey's New York Regiment. His grandson, Reuben M. Doty reports on authority of Ichabod Murray and Daniel Murray, that when the Revolutionary Army was lying before Saratoga, a call was made for one hundred volunteers for a dangerous service; Lieut. Reuben Doty commanded and Ichabod Murray was one of the party. They marched by a circuitous route to the rear of Burgoyne's Army, where the second morning after leaving their camp, just before daylight, they burned his stores and mills. They then made the circuit of the British Army and brought into their own camp 21 prisoners of whom six were officers, besides twenty-one horses and twenty cows."

On page 705 of the "Doty-Doten Family" the following is to be found: "Ichabod Murray lived probably in the vicinity of Amenia, N Y or Sharon, Conn as he was a Revolutionary Soldier, and with his brother Daniel was in the company commanded by Lieut Reuben Doty.......Ichabod Murray and wife removed with her father about 1797, to Fairfield, then in Oneida Co now in Herkimer County, N Y."

Town records of Florida, Montgomery Co. N. Y. show Ichabod Murray to have been a resident there about 1794 or 1795 for a short time only. He probably went to Fairfield after that, where he lived until after 1805, when he moved to Harrisburg, Lewis Co. N.Y. a short distance from the village of Lowville.

The History of Lewis County, New York, mentions a re-union on July 4, 1826 of the Company that Ichabod Murray served with, his name being mentioned in this connection and that he enlisted from New Milford, Connecticut.

It has come down to us that Ichabod Murray was a carpenter and joiner by trade, that in general appearance he was uncommonly straight and dignified in carriage, tall and slender and of a very jovial nature.

He died 16 July 1831 in Harrisburg, Lewis Co. N.Y.

The following is an extract from the probate records in Lowville, Lewis Co. New York.

"To the Surrogate of the County of Lewis, the petition of Joel Murray respectfully sheweth that Ichabod Murray, my father is dead, that he died on the 16th of July 1831; that he was an inhabitant of the town of Harrisburg, that at the time of his death he left no widow surviving, and left no will as far as has been discovered or heard,; that in the opinion of your petitioner the whole of the personal estate left by the said Ichabod Murray will not amount in value to more than \$34.00. Your petitioner reserves the right and letter of administration on the said estate, and requests that the said Surrogate would appoint Charles D. Snow, who is a son-in-law of the deceased, as a proper person to administer the said estate, and your petitioner will ever pray," etc. Dated July 21, 1831 (Signed) Joel Murray.

Charles D. Snow, Solomon King and Jonathan Ball gave bond for \$70 dated July 26, 1831, as executors of the above estate. (Lewis Co. N.Y. Probate Records.)

In a little rural cemetery, now neglected and overgrown, in a field off the high-way, lie the remains of Ichabod Murray and his wife. Juba, their son is also buried here. A slab erected by the D.A.R. inscribed "Ichabod Murray, died July 16, 1831, aged 76- A Soldier of the Revolution" stands at the head of his grave. No marker,

other than a large rock marks the grave of Lois, his wife. This cemetery is between the village of Lowville and the smaller village of Harrisburg.

Ichabod Murray was married in 1782 to Lois Doty, oldest daughter of Reuben Doty and Hannah Delano, probably at Amenia, N.Y. Lois Doty was a sister of Sabra Doty who married Reuben Murray, son of Ezra Murray, who was an older brother of Ichabod. Ira Doty, brother of Lois and Sabra, married Betsey Murray, daughter of Daniel, who was a brother of Ichabod and Ezra. Mercy Doty, another sister married Noah Murray, as his second wife; Noah being a son of Daniel Murray and brother of Betsey, Still another interesting alliance between these families was the marriage of Chloe Doty, sister of Lois, Sabra, Ira and Mercy Doty, to John Slosson of Pompey Hill, Onondaga Co. N.Y. This couple is believed to have been either the parents or grandparents of Stephen O. Slosson of Pompey Hill, who married Caroline H. Murray, daughter of Heman Murray and granddaughter of Reuben Murray of Pompey Hill, who was a brother of Ichabod, Daniel and Ezra Murray.

Reuben Doty, father of Lois, was an officer in the Continental Army being in 1777 a Lieutenant in Col. Humphrey's New York Regiment, according to the Doty Genealogy. Reuben Doty was a descendant of Edward Dotey a passenger on the Mayflower in 1620. He was from London, although a Welshman, and in the service of Stephen Hopkins. Hannah Delano was a descendant of Philippe de la Noye, a French Huguenot who came to Plymouth, Mass. in 1621 from Leiden, Holland, where his parents had taken refuge from persecution in France. Hannah Delano, wife of Reuben Doty was a daughter of Thomas Delano and Lois----, his wife, of Sharon, Conn. and Amenia, N.Y. according to the Delano Genealogy.

Lois Doty was born probably in Amenia, Dutchess Co. N.Y. 12 Feb 1767 d in Harrisburg, Lewis Co. N.Y. 30 Jan 1824.

Calvin Murray third son of Ichabod and Lois Murray was quite talented musically and played the violin. Crossing a creek one night after playing at a dance, he fell in and was drowned. His brother Norman died as a young man while attending the academy at Lowville, N.Y.

An abstract from the pension application of Ichabod Murray dated 19 Sept 1820 says that Ichabod Murray aged 64 of Lowville, Lewis Co. N.Y. swears that he was a private in Capt. Jacob Bostwick's Co. Col. Charles Webb's Regiment, Connecticut Line; that he enlisted 1 Dec 1775 for 13 months, served until 1 Jan 1777, was discharged at New Milford, Conn........... That by occupation he was a farmer—unable to pursue it or do any labor for 13 years due to an injury received in his head by the falling of a tree. Family with him were his wife Lois and his son Truman aged 15 last August. Schedule of property shows no real estate. Another affidavit shows that he was formerly of New Milford, Conn. but now of Harrisburg, N.Y. Andrew Bell of Genesee county, N.Y. testified that he and Ichabod Murray served together. Certificate of pension issued 3 June 1820 and sent to Silas Stowe, Esq. of Lowville, N.Y.

Ichabod Murray and his wife lived in several localities in New York state among which were Amenia, Fairfield, Lowville and Harrisburg.

51 SOLOMON MURRAY

Son of Jehiel b 17 Aug 1758 in Merryall neighborhood, near New Milford, Litchfield Co. Conn. It is possible that the record of his birth was on the Congregational church records of New Milford, but the records between 1754 and 1770 are missing. As Solomon Murray applied for a pension in 1818 stating that he was 60 years of age, we assume that he was born in 1758. His estate administration papers state that he was born 17 Aug 1758 d 25 Jan 1822 in Copake, N.Y. The following sketch of Solomon Murray from the pen of Miss Helen L. Peet a great granddaughter is of interest.

"Solomon Murray the youngest of the eight sons of Jehiel and Mary (Way) Murray was born in 1758 and died 25 January 1822 in Copake, N.Y. at the home of his son William. Like all his brothers he served in the Revolutionary War but at first not being old enough, he went as a servant to one of his brothers who was an officer. Later he had one year's actual service for which he was allowed a pension. At the time of his discharge he served in Capt. Swift's Co. of infantry in Col. Charles Burrill's Regiment."

In 1787 Solomon Murray and his wife and family left their home near Washington, Litchfield Co. Conn. going on horseback, with their goods following in an oxcart for Canaan, Columbia Co. N.Y. where two of Solomon's brothers lived. From there they moved to Claverack where Solomon served as sheriff. This was about 1798. While living there his wife died in 1802. After leaving Claverack Solomon lived with his daughter Elizabeth who married Samuel Chase, whose change of location was so frequent that he was called "Wild Goose Chase" living in Boston, Springfield, Mass., Hudson, N.Y., Richmond, Va., Annapolis, Md., Buffalo and Albany among other places. Pension rolls of the Revolution state that Solomon Murray died in the town of Taghkanic, which is near Copake, Columbia Co. N.Y.

Solomon Murray was quite prominent and well-to-do for that period and from his picture taken about 1797 was a gentleman of the old school, possessing keen judgment independence and dignity. He was married 14 Aug 1782 to Martha Averill, dau of Moses and Martha (Cogswell) Averill. She was b in 1760 and d 1802.

59 AMASSA MURRAY

Son of Jonathan b 24 Feb 1741 in East Guilford, Conn. (now Madison) d there 29 Oct 1822. His wife's given name was Elizabeth, but no record has been found of her family name or date of their marriage. Neither has any record of any children come to light, so we assume they had no family. Lived in East Guilford, Conn.

Amassa Murray enlisted I Feb 1778 in Capt. Sizer's Company of Artificers for three years according to 'Connecticut Men in the Revolution.' The will of Amassa Murray dated 14 Nov 1779 bequeaths first his real estate and personal property to his wife Elizabeth. Second he provides for the remainder of his property to go to his brother Eber, and heirs of his deceased brothers Jonathan and Asahel, and his brother Stephen, to be equally divided. (Vol 22 p 33 Guilford Probate Records) This would indicate that Amassa and Elizabeth had no surviving children. Elizabeth his wife died 5 Mar 1825 aged 86 years.

60 MABEL (MURRAY) GRAVE

Dau of Jonathan b 11 July 1743 in Killingworth, New Haven Co., Conn. d 10 May 1779 in East Guilford, (now Madison) Conn. m 23 Feb 1763 to Elias Grave or Graves b 10 April 1733 d 31 May 1802. Lived in East Guilford, Conn.



61 EBER MURRAY

Son of Jonathan b 12 Nov 1745 in Killingworth, New Haven Co., Conn. d 23 Nov 1826 in Orwell, Addison Co., Vt. In Vol 9 of the Guilford Land records there is a deed recorded from Eber Murray of Litchfield to Dorcas Murray 'his honored mother' dated 7 June 1768. From this we assume he was a resident of Litchfield, Conn. at the time. Many of the early settlers of Conn. emigrated to Mass. and Vt. at this period and it is in Lanesboro, Mass. that we next find him mentioned. Register of Deeds of Berkshire Co. Mass. Vol 9 p 247 shows that Noah Murray of Lanesborough sold to Eber Murray of the same place, for 20 pounds, Lot No 75 in the 2nd Divison, signed 19 June 1771 and recorded 17 Some fragmentary records of the Cheshire Baptist Church in the Pittsfield Public Library indicated that Eber Murray or 'Murrough' as it is on the record was baptized 3 Oct 1773 and later dismissed. Azubah Murray or 'Murrough' was also baptized 6 Nov 1774 and on another list undated but apparently later says that 'Azubah Murrough' was dead. It is assumed that this Azubah was Eber Murray's first wife, by whom he had three dau Elizabeth, b 1770, Mabel and Azuba. Inasmuch as his dau Azuba grew up and was married, it was probably Eber's wife Azuba whose death was mentioned. In Book 12 of

Registry of Deeds of Berkshire county, p 392 is recorded a sale of land from Eber Murray of Stockbridge to Elijah Higbee dated 23 Mar 1776 and in Book 27 p 239 shows another land transaction from Eber Murray of Stockbridge to Simeon Rawson dated 23 Mar 1776 and recorded 3 Dec 1788. No signature of wife of Eber Murray, but sometimes omitted. This deed was in possession of the compiler. A historical sketch of the Baptist Church of Wallingford, Vt. shows Eber Murray as one of 21 persons who helped organize that society 10 Feb 1780. Shortly afterward he probably settled in Sunderland, Vt. where he found his second wife, Abigail dau. of David and Hannah (Sheppard) Dunning. In 1783 Eber Murray in company with Ephriam and William Fisher went to Orwell, Vt. being the first white settlers there and organized and built the First Baptist church located on Eber Murray's farm and he was elected a deacon by the members 27 Dec 1787. In a History of Orwell, Vt. (1763-1850) by Hon. Roswell Bottum, Dea. Eber Murray is mentioned as one of the original settlers who helped furnish cabins for the surveyors when the village was laid out. He was also an active and prominent citizen of the community and accumulated quite an estate for that period. The New Hampshire State Papers state that Eber Murray served 27 days in Capt. Gideon Brownson's Company for defense of frontiers, enlisting 29 June 1776.

Since the death of his first wife Azuba in Cheshire, Mass. about 1774-1775, Deacon Murray apparently remained single until about 1781 when he married Abigail Dunning, in Sunderland, Vt. She was born 17 Nov 1752 and d in Orwell 1 June 1836.

62 ASAHEL MURRAY

Son of Jonathan b 16 April 1747 in Killingworth, New Haven Co., Conn. d 11 Sept 1784 in East Guilford, Conn. (now Madison) by falling off his horse onto a scythe. His will was probated 20 Dec 1784. (Guilford Probate Records Vol 13 p 424) leaving his property to his widow.

The following copy of a letter tells something of Asahel Murray's Revolutionary War service. 'State of Connecticut, Military Department, Adjutant General's Office, Hartford, 27 Sept 1915: To Whom It May Concern; This is to certify that Asahel Murray served as a guard in the seacoast guard at Sachem's Head, Guilford, 19 Feb 1781 for three days in the 2nd Company under command of Lieut. Samuel Lee, 7th Regiment, Col. Worthington.' He also enlisted as a private 16 May 1779 from Newtown, Conn. in Capt Botsford's 16th Connecticut Regiment.

Asahel Murray married 25 Sept 1770 to Thankful Plum, dau of Ebenezer Plum of East Guilford. She was b 13 April 1743 d 14 Aug 1824. Lived in or near East Guilford, (now Madison) Conn.

The records of the Episcopal church of Guilford show that Samuel Plum Murray was admitted to membership 1 Jan 1804. No further record of him has been found.

63 JONATHAN MURRAY JR.

Son of Jonathan b 10 Aug 1750 in Killingworth, New Haven Co., Conn. d 1 Mar 1785 in East Guilford, Conn. (now Madison). Jonathan Murray served in the Lexington Alarm list for six days being in Capt. Samuel Gates Company from Killingworth. He also enlisted as corporal in the 8th Connecticut Regiment on 6 May 1775 and was discharged 19 Dec 1775. (Connecticut Men in the Revolution p 76) He married 20 Feb 1777 Abigail Hull, dau of John and Lucia (Buell) Hull. She died 17 Sept 1822 aged 72 years Lived in East Guilford (now Madison) Conn.

64 DANIEL MURRAY

Son of Jonathan b 13 Sept 1755 in Killingworth, New Haven Co., Conn. d 1 Jan 1842 in Sudbury, Rutland Co., Vt., m to Elizabeth ----. The Guilford Conn. land records record a deed from Daniel Murray and wife Elizabeth to Joseph Doud dated 3 Feb 1797. (Vol 16 p 23). This states that Daniel Murray and his wife were residents of Guilford supporting the theory that they went to Sudbury, Vt. after 1797, or thereabouts.

Daniel Murray and his wife had no children but raised a boy named George Denison Doud. From what was learned from a descendant of George Denison Doud, it is surmised that probably he was a relative of Elizabeth, wife of Daniel Murray and that perhaps her maiden name may have been Doud. This is strengthened by the land transaction to Joseph Doud mentioned above. Several deeds are recorded at Sudbury, Vt. in which Daniel Murray is a party, the last one bearing the date of June 1807. The vital records of Sudbury were burned but the date of Daniel Murray's death was obtained from a bible record.

Stephen Murray was a carpenter by trade and enlisted 11 Feb 1778 in the Revolution with his brother Amassa as a private. They were in Col. Jeduthan Baldwin's Regiment of Artificers, Capt. Sizer's Company. According to the DAR Lineage Books he had previously served as a private in Col. Newbury's Regiment Capt. Bezaliel Bristol's Co. in 1777. He is recorded as being a pensioner as of 1 June 1840. (Vermont Historical Gazeteer Vol. 3 p 1139).

It is thought that he left Guilford and settled in Granville, Mass. around 1781-1782 and was still a resident there in Nov 1787 as shown by the record of a deed which Reuben Hill and wife Dorcas of Guilford and Stephen Murray of Granville, Mass. gave to Joseph Doud dated 19 Nov 1787. (Guilford Land Records Vol 13 p 187.) Between this time and June 1789 he moved to Sudbury, Vt. as shown by a deed under date of 4 June 1789 to Stephen Murray from William Buck recorded in Sudbury, Vt. Another deed between the same two principals dated 15 Jan 1794 is also recorded in Sudbury. William Buck was the husband of Elizabeth Murray Buck, a daughter of Eber Murray.

Calvin Murray came to the town of Williston with his parents at about the age of 16 where they settled on what is known as the George Whitney farm. Later in life he went to Hinesburgh where he operated a mill with one of his sons. His will was witnessed by Chauncey Brownell, Josiah N. Barrows his brother-in-law, and Selah Murray his brother.

Suskenath Mackenzie Murray generally known as Mack Murray probably came to Williston when his father moved the family there from Claremont, N. H. about 1794-5. He apparently married his first wife about this time, but information as to who she was and where from and the date of their marriage has not been found. The early town records of Williston were partly destroyed by fire which probably accounts for many omissions of dates.

Record of a deed conveying some property from John Cook of Guilford, Conn. to Mackenzie Murray of Williston is on file bearing date of 1 Sept 1805. There

is also another deed recorded 10 Feb 1797 conveying land from Beriah Murray to Mackenzie Murray of Williston. Another deed is recorded from Mack Murray to Beriah Murray 10 June 1806. A note is added to this record to the effect that this sale included the last of Mackenzie Murray's land in the town of Williston. He was but 35 at this time and no later record of his movements has been found so it is a matter of conjecture whether he died soon after or located some other part of the country. Up to this time he lived in Williston.

Asahel Murray was an early settler in Richmond and probably went there about the time of his marriage. He was a farmer and considered well-to-do for that period, as records show that he owned property in both Williston and Richmond.

The will of Asahel Murray dated at Richmond, 27 Dec 1822 names his brother Selah as executor and was witnessed by Allen Murray, Chauncey Brownell and Andrew Pine. His will directs that his wife should have the home farm, personal property and some specified land. To his son Asa B. Murray he gives some land in Richmond and Huntington. To his daughter Sally he bequeaths \$750 with interest and the household furniture after his wife's death, on Sally becoming 18 years of age. To his other son Eli B. he gives his farm, farming utensils and stock in Williston. To his grandson Nathan Murray Fay he leaves \$400 when he arrives at the age of 21, one half to be paid in money and one half in grain and cattle. Should all the legatees die, his property is to go to his brother Warren Murray. A codicil to the will says that all his just debts are to be paid out of the portion willed to his son Asa B. and that he pay his daughter Sally an additional \$100 in Cattle and grain two years after she arrives at the age of 18.

The following anecdote comes down in the family. When Gen. Lafayette visited this country in the early 1800's he traveled through Vt. on his way to Burlington, to be present at the dedication of his statue on the campus of the University of Vt. When Lafayette's party reached the outskirts of Richmond, Asahel Murray met him with a carriage hitched to four white oxen. Gen. Lafayette got into the carriage and was conveyed through town, probably the first time he was ever hauled by a spanking double team of white oxen. Another story is handed down to the effect that Asahel Murray traveled on horseback all the way to Va. with the object of buying Mount Vernon the former home of Washington. At this time it was run down and the buildings in a very delapidated condition - it probably could have been bought for \$10000 or \$12000 - anyway the deal fell through.

Allen Murray was a Methodist minister and lived in various places in Vt. and New York State. He was an early resident of Richmond, Vt. and lived in Williston in 1820 according to the census. He was listed as head of a family with five females, one female and one male in the 26-45 classification. The 1830 census of Chittenden Co. Vt. does not list him.

His name appears on a memorial tablet on the East Schuyler Methodist Protestant church located in the country near Frankfort, Herkimer Co., N. Y. He was pastor of this church in 1839 for one year, when he was elected president of the Onondaga Conference in 1840, serving in this capacity through 1843. He then served in various pulpits and in the 1850 census is listed with his wife and one daughter as a resident of the village of Steuben, Oneida Co., N. Y. Later he moved to Rome, N. Y. where he is believed to have had a pulpit. While there in 1852 his wife and daughter Lois died. The various conference and church records do not mention him again until 1854 when he is listed as without a pulpit. There are records of land transactions between Allen Murray and Calvin and Asahel Murray, who are believed to have been sons and these deeds are dated during the period from 1842-1845 for lots now located in the city of Syracuse.

Soon after the marriage of Rebekah Murray Clark to Julius A. Owen they started for the west, settling in Harvard, Ill., about 50 miles west of Chicago. A tradition comes down in the family to the effect that Selah Murray, brother of Rebekah, started west to visit Rebekah, but never arrived there and nothing was

ever heard of him further. It is believed that he was either killed by the indians or robbed and murdered. Although about 40 when he was supposed to have started west, no record has been found to show that he was married.

One page 645 of the History of Chittenden Co., Vt., Sylvanus Murray is listed as one of the residents of Milton, Vt. who fought in the Battle or Plattsburgh, in 1814, under the command of Capt. Luther Taylor. Later he settled on his father's farm in the southeast corner of the town of Fairfax where he remained the balance of his life. The story comes down that Sylvanus Murray refused to take any interest in the railroad built in Vt., although it ran very near his house, being hidden only by a hill. One day when he was salting his sheep he heard the whistle of the locomotive and looking up he saw a train crossing a trestle over a stream. Upon his return home he told his wife about it, remarking that he knew it was the work of the devil.

101 SEYMOUR MURRAY

Quoting from Connecticut Archives of the Revolution, Series 1- 'A list or role of the train band belonging to East Guilford, being the 6th company in the seventh regiment, in the colony of Connecticut in New England; Capt. Daniel Hand; Seymour Murray, 12 half days training, dated 16 June 1775.' On page 388 of 'Connecticut Men in the Revolution' is the statement that men in Capt. Daniel Hand's company were enlisted the 22nd of March 1776 and discharged 18 April 1776.

Seymour Murray was one of the first settlers of Norwich. He was first married 8 March 1781 to Philena Willett who was born 30 Sept 1754 and d 28 Oct 1806. His second marriage in 1812 was to Hannah Stowe.

Albert L. Murray grandson of Calvin Murray has written the following sketch of his grandfather: 'Calvin Murray settled in that part of the present town of Madison called the northwest school district and only a short distance from the present town line, so that all his descendants lived in that locality some five miles from 'Scotland.' He was a builder of boats nearly all the Murrays of that date were sea faring men or connected with that calling. Calvin Murray died in Hartford, Conn. about the year 1810. He was suffocated while asleep in the cabin of his boat by charcoal fumes escaping from a stove. He was a man of high character and sterling integrity, and worthy to be classed as one of our Puritan ancestors, than whom no greater men have lived.

Son of Jesse b 18 March 1790 in East Guilford, (now Madison) Conn. d 3 Oct 1840 near Somerset, Hillsdale Co., Mich. m 15 Feb 1815 to Laura dau. of David and Rebecca Wilcox of Middletown and Cromwell, Conn. She was b 15 June 1794 d in Hastings, Mich. 21 Oct 1874.

Tradition tells us that Harvey Murray like many of his forebears, followed the sea while living in East Guilford and had the reputation of being highly proficient. Soon after his marriage, with his wife he moved to Troy, N. Y. their first two children being born there. About 1818 a movement was started among friends and neighbors to move to the Western Reserve in Ohio which was just opened for settlement especially for Conn. settlers.

Records of the Congregational Church at Hudson, Summit Co., Ohio some 12 miles from Akron, show that Harvey Murray and his wife Laura joined the church from Troy, N. Y. on 22 Aug 1819. There are several deeds recorded at Akron, county seat of Summit county, showing land transfers between Harvey Murray and Edwin Wilcox from 1828 to 1835.

Another story is told to the effect that Harvey Murray met a sea captain named Slayton and they came west to Ohio together and later went to Mich., Slayton settling in Hillsdale county and Murray near Paw Paw, Van Buren Co, Mich. However after 1835 there are no records of any kind showing Harvey Murray as a resident of Hudson, Ohio and the census of 1840 for lower Mich shows Harvey Murray to have been a resident of Somerset, Hillsdale Co, Mich and that he was a farmer.

Lewis Murray was in the Mexican War, enlisting as a private 24 Feb 1842 from Litchfield, Conn. in Co. B Second Dragoons. He was wounded 25 April 1846 at La Rosia, Mexico, and discharged 24 Feb 1847 at the expiration of his time. (Conn. Men in the Regular Army in the Mexican War p.177). Lived in Torrington, Conn.

Lewis Murray and his wife had no children, but raised Warren Brooker a son of Russell Brooker and great grandson of Abraham and Tamar (Murray) Brooker. Warren Brooker was born in 1833 and went by the name of Murray during his childhood but later married and went by his own name of Brooker.

Lewis Murray and his wife adopted one son, Dennis Dewire, born 6 Aug, 1847 and d 17 March 1914. (437)

162 PHILO MURRAY

Son of Abner b 1760 in Woodbury, Litchfield Co, Conn. d 25 Aug 1821 in Ridgeville, Ohio. He was an only child his father having died when he was six

years old and his grandfather Judge Samuel Orton was appointed his guardian in 1766. Under date of 27 May 1782 the Woodbury town records state that 'Philo Murray a minor of the town of Woodbury, of Lawfull age for coopering..' indicating that he was being trained for the trade of coopering. However he did not apparently make this a lifetime pursuit. He is the cousin referred to in the sketch of Reuben Murray on p 22 who was said to have drawn a prize in a lottery. He was reputed to have left quite an estate for that period.

Cothren's History of Woodbury says 'Philo Murray, Esq. was born in Woodbury, Conn in 1760 where he resided for fifty-nine years. On his maternal side he was connected with the Orton family his mother being a dau of Judge Samuel Orton of Woodbury. He was a man of sound and sagacious mind and a great reader and clear thinker. He was an active politician being what is termed a Republican and identified as one of the first founders and promoters of that party in town. He is celebrated as the first man, who under the 'stand-up' law of Conn., rose up as a voter on that side of the question and in process of time (1815) was chosen a member of the general assembly by his constituents, as the successful and dominant party. Thus has it increased from one to a majority. Philo Murray served in the assembly through 1818. In 1819 he removed to the Western Reserve, Ohio, where he soon died honored and respected by all. His three sons Jamison, Philo and Abner still reside there (1854) and are respectable and thriving farmers.'

Philo Murray is buried in the old cemetery at North Ridgeville, where many of the early settlers from Conn. were buried. An upright flat headstone with the inscription 'Sacred to the memory of Philo Murray, Esqr. who departed this life 25 Aug 1821 in the 59th year of his age;' marks the grave.

He was married about 1784 to Lydia....., who died 20 Dec 1803 in Woodbury aged 36 years. According to the census of 1790, Philo Murray with his wife and family were residents of Coxsackie, N. Y. for a brief period between 1788 and 1791, but apparently returned to Woodbury, Conn. Lived mostly in Woodbury, Conn.

Son of Ezra b about 1770 in Canaan, Columbia Co., N. Y. d near West Bloomfield, Ontario Co., N. Y. after Feb 1832 - possibly as late as 1837.

In 1787 the town of Mohawk in Montgomery Co., N. Y. was attracting settlers and Roswell Murray went there with his parents. On the 12 of March 1793 the original town of Mohawk was abolished and the new town of Florida was laid out from part of it. The Ellis, Murray, Waterman and Cady families were among

the first settlers of Florida and the first annual meeting of the newly formed town was held at the residence of Ezra Murray on the first Tuesday in Apr 1794. This group of settlers lived mostly on a tract of land formerly owned by Sir Peter Warren and was known as 'Warrensbush' and later Warrensburg, south of the Mohawk river in the township of Florida. The present village of Minaville now occupies this approximate location.

According to an old road book of the town, Roswell Murray was elected 'Fence viewer' for the town in 1802 and he lived a short distance west of the village of Minaville on the corner passing the old mill turning left into the village. In 1801 he lived where Ivan Hillman now lives (1935) and operated the Minaville mill, and the lane leading down to the mill was commonly known as Murray's street. This old mill was one of the early landmarks of the village having been built in 1795 by the Winegar family, early settlers from Conn. The mill was totally destroyed by fire in 1938. Records of deeds of land transactions indicate that Roswell Murray went to Ontario county, N. Y. late in 1810 or 1811 and bought the farm of B. & S. Ellis not far from the village of Victor. Adjoining this farm is an old cemetery laid out by Ezra and Roswell Murray, and in which both are buried but there are no markers to indicate the locations. Roswell Murray was described by a grand daughter as being a man of short stature and carried his head on one side, and possessed a very jovial nature.

According to the Warrensburg church records made by the Rev. James Dempster between 1778 and 1803, the marriage of Roswell Murray is thus recorded. 'Roswell Murray and Mary Wilson, the man of Warrensburg and the woman of Ransomsbush, 25 Nov 1792.' The old Warrensburg church was a wooden structure in the Minaville neighborhood and has been long since destroyed. From records of the (Latter Day Saints (Mormon) church in Salt Lake City, Utah, it is surmised that Mary the first wife of Roswell Murray died soon after their marriage without children however no records have come to light on this point.

About 1798 Roswell Murray was married to Susannah Fitch; a dau probably of Ebenezer and Hannah (Way) Fitch. She was born 7 April 1771 and died after Sept 1813, as her name appears on a deed of that date. On 2 Feb 1832 Roswell Murray married Mrs Fanny (Young) Howe-Carr, sister of Brigham Young. She was born 8 Nov 1787 d 11 June 1859 in Salt Lake City.

Son of Ezra b about 1775 in Canaan, Columbia Co., N. Y. d June 1849 on his farm near North Farmington, Oakland Co. Mich. From the fragmentary records collected, it is assumed that Reuben Murray grew to young manhood in the neighborhood of Canaan, Columbia Co. and about 1795-6 was married to Sabra Doty of Amenia, N. Y. a dau of Reuben and Hannah (Delano) Doty. The young couple moved to Farmington, Ontario Co., N. Y. shortly after their marriage and went to farming, not far from where his father Ezra Murray lived.

Sabra Doty was baptized 9 Aug 1778 and died in 1851 near North Farmington, Mich. As was the custom in those days, Reuben Murray and his wife were buried on their farm, but there are no markers now standing to show the exact location.

About 1842 Reuben Murray with his wife and family went to Mich. when many settlers from N. Y. state and the east were seeking new homes in Mich. territory, and settled in Oakland county, a short distance north of the present village of Farmington, probably so named from their former home of many of them in N. Y. state.

Although records of military service in the War of 1812 have not been located in Washington, for Reuben Murray, there is a well founded tradition that he served in that war and a sword which he is said to have carried at that time, is in possession of some of his descendants.

The reference to his brother Philo having lived in Clinton is thought to be a mistake, as Philo died in 1826 in Otisco, N. Y. and probably never came west.

Heman Murray married about 1808 Prudence Hale, who returned to Manlius, N. Y. after the death of her husband and died 24 March 1857 aged 73. They lived in the Pompey-Manlius neighborhood in Onondaga Co., N. Y. prior to moving to Clinton, Wis.

'Reunion and History of Pompey' published in 1875 says that Heman Murray donated \$20 to a building fund for the new Episcopal Church to be built at the Four Corners, formerly called Clapp's Corners. This was under date of 25 Aug 1828. A reunion at Pompey 29 June 1871 is also mentioned at which time Minor B Murray and Frederick R Murray sons of Reuben Murray, Jr were on certain committees.

John S Murray settled in Clinton, Rock Co., Wis. in 1841 at the time his father went there. The gold rush of 1849 saw him started across the plains for Calif., the trip taking him seven months. He remained there for six years engaged in mining after which he traveled extensively in the west settling in San Francisco for two years. He returned to Rock county, Wis. in 1866.

Allen S Murray is mentioned by some of the family as having been a man of strong personality and very witty, charming and handsome in his younger days. He was a celebrated checker player and proverbially the greatest wit in western N. Y. for years. The following story is related of him. He was on the bus enroute from Syracuse to Manlius. President Slocum of Manlius was also on the bus and asked Mr Murray his age, to which Mr Murray replied that he had outlived the 70 years allotted to man by the Lord and had been living the past 20 years on his own hook. About 1850 Mr Murray came west to Clinton, Rock Co, Wis. with his wife and family where he lived the balance of his life. He and his wife are buried in the old cemetery at Clinton Corners. Previous to moving west he lived in the Pompey-Manlius N. Y. area where many others of his family lived for years.

Aurora Murray Jerome was witty and wholesouled possessing a very attractive and charming personality. At the time of her marriage to Isaac Jerome her father was a man of means and her husband enjoying an inheritance which promised them a very successful start in life. Adversity overtook them however through losses in connection with contracts for the building of the Erie canal. These were made up however in later years by the love and devotion of their

children who surrounded them with every comfort that filial affection could suggest. In 1857 they celebrated their 50th wedding anniversary of happy married life.

The following newspaper article dated from Lockport, N. Y. 30 Dec 1898 entitled 'Pompey Hill's New Year' will be of interest, as it is, as the article states 'A Gathering at which Lady Randolph Churchill's Grandmother Figured.'

'How the grandmother of Lady Randolph Churchill attended a New Year's house party in central N Y more than a half a century ago is told by John T Murray of Lockport. Mr Murray is close onto four score years, is still engaged in the practice of law, and is the oldest attorney in Niagara county. He was born in the Pompey Hill district of Onondaga county, which was settled by New England farmers who promptly mortgaged their unsettled farms in order to found an Said Mr. Murray:' The New Englander who settled Pompey Hill went up onto the mountain, passing by the fertile valleys not so much because they wanted to get nearer God as because they desired to avoid the devilish malaria in the lowlands. And so it was that Pompey Hill was tilled to the top while the level meadows in the valleys lay fallow for years after the settlers came into that section. Steep hills and stones were the features of the landscape. I am told that one day my father was driving by the homestead of one Hiram Smith. Hiram was occupied as most Pompey hill folks were three fourths of their working hours, picking up stones in a field. Stopping his horse, father cried banteringly, 'Why Hiram where did you get enough stones to lay your hull farm out in four-acre lots with fences around 'em higher'n the walls of Iericho and so wide that they'd be higher yet, if they tumbled down?

Smith raised himself up from his task and straightening out his back with hand, replied warmly, 'Why you ole fool, cant you see where I get 'em.' Father responded with a chuckle, 'No, I havent missed any.'

'At this time I recall with no little pleasure a New Year's house part as the present generation would call an old-fashioned holiday gathering of kinfolks and other friends for a good time, held on Pompey Hill more than half a century ago. My aunt, the grandmother of Lady Randolph Churchill, figured prominently in the festivities. On the south side of the hill which is the highest arable land in New York state, being more than 2000 feet above the sea level, was what was in the old days called the Murray district. Four families three Murray brothers, and the Jerome family, into which my father's sister Aurora Murray married, held the district. It consisted of a quadrangular inclined plane, about one mile each way, with a farm house at each corner. A road connected the four houses that is by driving round the block. It was a cold afternoon on 31 Dec. The greater portion of Onondaga county which we could see from our house looked like an immense mantle of white, dotted here and there with woodland spots, so that it resembled a vast cloak of ermine. Father came in from work early and told mother he was in favor of having the folks over to spend the night, so as to see the good old year out and greet the new coming in. The suggestion received unanimous approbation, so we soon had the team hitched on to the big sled and we were plowing our way rapidly through the snow round the block. The first place we reached was the Jerome's. I declare to goodness, to use a homely expression, I shall never forget aunt Orie's look of despair when we presented our invitation to the New Year's party to be accepted forth-Her sleeves were rolled up and her plump arms were concealed to the Said she 'I dont see how we can come; it's my baking day, elbow in dough. and that's the most important of the week at this house with its roomful of

children.' Father solved the problem by telling her to roll all her bread into a clean sheet and throw it into the sleigh, promising her that the boys would split the wood and bake it in our oven at home. This was done and aunt Orie Jerome made one of the New Year's party at our house. It snowed so hard during the night and next morning that the party had to stay until we could shovel out the roads, so we had to eat aunt Orie's bread. Her granddaughter, Lady Randolph Churchill never ate better.'

As may be seen from reading the foregoing anecdotes, a grand daughter of Isaac and Aurora Murray Jerome married Lord Randolph Churchill of England. She was Jennie Jerome daughter of Leonard W and Clarissa (Hall) Jerome and a famous beauty of that period.

After a short residence in Palmyra, N. Y. Leonard Jerome with his brother Lawrence, went to Rochester, N. Y. and engaged in newspaper business Leonard Jerome having founded the Rochester American. He reached the pinnacle of his business career however in New York City with his brother Lawrence with whom he was associated. Both brothers were born in the old Jerome homestead on Pompey Hill, since becoming locally famous as being the birthplace of the father of Lady Randolph Churchill, and grandfather of Winston Churchill, Britain's War Chief.

The following anecdote of Lord Randolph Churchill and Jennie Jerome is told. While dining at Delmonico's, a famous restaurant and gayety center of the N. Y. aristocracy of that period, a chance meeting of Miss Jerome and Lord Churchill took place. He was said to have confided to a friend that he intended to have Miss Jerome for his wife, as her beauty, charm and wit had convinced him that she was the most attractive girl he had ever met. He made good his ambition and they were married in Grace Episcopal Church in New York in 1873. Their son, Winston Leonard Spencer Churchill, afterward Prime Minister of Britain, was born in 1874.

Additional interest is connected with a small rural cemetery in the town of Pompey near the village of Watervale. In this cemetery, enclosed by a rustic stone wall and iron fence, lie the remains of two grandfathers of Lady Churchill. Her paternal ancestor Aaron Jerome came from Stockbridge, Mass. to Pompey in 1793- he died in 1802 at 37- a comparatively young man. A modest marker stands at the head of his grave. Her maternal ancestor, Lieut. Reuben Murray, an officer in the Revolution and the father of Aurora Murray Jerome, is also buried in this cemetery on the Murray lot, a white stone slab marking the spot. Both Aaron Jerome and Reuben Murray were farmers and prominent citizens of the community.

Mrs Louise Welles Murray writes of Abner Murray that he was an energetic successful farmer and lumberman, having three large saw mills in operation at one time. He also seems to have been inventive. In those early days when conveniences were hard to obtain he did not let his family stay in need of them. He rudely manufactured useful household appliances such as chopping knives, apple parers, locks and keys, etc some of which are in the Tioga Point museum in Athens. He even took out a patent on a churn, fanning mill, cider mill wind mill planes and draw knives. He also made a business of raising bees in the attic in winter and shipped large quantities of honey down the river.

The Abner Murray homestead built by his father in 1809, just outside the village of Athens, still stands, shorn somewhat of it's former glory. A description of this old homestead by the late Mrs. Louise Welles Murray former historian of Bradford County; is given herewith.

'Across the meadows, bare and brown The windows of the wayside inn gleam red with firelight toward the town, And noon and night the panting teams Stop under the great trees and throw Tangles of light and shade below--Across the road the barns display their line of stalls, their mows of hay and half effaced by rain and shine a huntsman shows up on the sign that creaking sign, that to and fro swings, singing of long ago.'

I can give no better description of Murray's Inn at Tioga Point, the subject of my sketch, than the lines above from Longfellow's 'Wayside Inn.' And yet I do not want you to think of our Inn merely as a public house. In the early days of the settlement of Tioga Point, there were few houses indeed that were not frequently open as public houses.....

When the old log house across the Chemung river from town (built by Noah Murray about 1791) was to be replaced by a new and commodious dwelling, it was with a thought of public need that it was planned. First from the old red signpost north of the house and later over the high gateway southeast of the house, swung the old sign, still in existence. This sign beside the inscription 'Murray's Inn, has a curious indistinct figure of a man holding in his right hand a torch painted right over him in vivid colors, are an anchor, a pair of scales and a twisted cable and a row of fourteen or fifteen stars around the whole - whether coat of arms or plain sign- who can tell?

The house still standing in 1921 was built in 1809 by Abner Murray son of Noah. Originally it was a true colonial mansion, 'the best house in Bradford county' so said the old carpenter who came back years after to see his work......A huge chimney stack rose in the centre just back of the stairs....Opening on this chimney upstairs and down, were six great fireplaces with brick hearths and quaint carved mantles. All the woodwork was home made and the big timbers joined with wooden pins......The mantel with its pineapples done in colors, the sprawling wondrous vines and flowers are now in the dining room of M P Murray's residence in Athens, Pa. The second story of the old house though divided into several bedrooms, had an unusual device by which it could be altered into a great ballroom. All the partitions were hinged at the top and arranged to hook up to the ceiling on great staples.

On the main floor was a square hall which opened to the north into the parlor, at the back into the great diningroom with it's tiny bedrooms at either end. South of the hall was a store in the days of Abner. This was converted into a family sitting room after Abner's death. In the corner of the great diningroom which extended nearly the entire length of the house, on a little platform stood the old clock, a beautiful family heirloom, inlaid with many colored woods in a wondrous fashion.

On the other side of the room was the huge yet beautiful sideboard of curly maple inlaid with cherry and object of wonder to the children, with it's deep drawers for decanters, slides for extra dishes and many brass knobs. Another heirloom worth mentioning was the ancient secretary or desk of cherry inlaid with tiny strips of maple. One of the sons of the house used to beg his grandmother to hurry up and die as she had promised to bequeath this desk to him. Grandmother, not responding, the impish youth filled all the keyholes surreptitiously with paper wads, so that she could have no use thereof. There are also many inlaid stands and curious tables of mahogany in the family.

Over the mantel in the kitchen on the deer horn hooks, hung the ancient flint-lock musket, doubtless the very one Noah carried in the Revolution.....

Births, weddings and deaths were here for three successive generations of which the following record is as complete as possible. After the great flood of 1865 when the water came into the lower story of the house, the widow of Edward Murray, alarmed for their future safety decided to raise the entire structure. This necessitated removing the great chimney and the cherry fireplaces, and much also of the beautiful hand carving on the exterior was destroyed or cast aside. Other changes of various kinds were made until now in 1921 while still solid, the house stands as a ghost of it's former self, shorn of it's ancient glories within and without.'

'Upon Christmas day 1797 weddings were in order in the Murray family and perhaps some others. Abner, Elizabeth and Mary Murray with their chosen mates repaired to Squire Buck's at Chemung, N. Y. and all were married.' From a family letter.

The dates of birth and death of Mary Murray Collins can only be approximated - no records have been found. Her husband and two younger children went west to Jacksonville, Ill. in the early 1820's soon after the state was admitted to the union. In the history of Morgan county, Ill. where Jacksonville is located, Ambrose Collins is mentioned as one of the early settlers - the two children are also mentioned but not his wife, so it is believed that she died in Athens before he went to Ill., about 1820.

Murray McConnel settled in Jacksonville, Ill. about the same time that his uncle Ambrose Collins did about the time the village was laid out. Soon thereafter he put out his 'shingle' in the new town having studied law before he went west. The town and surrounding rich farming country developed fast, with many new settlers coming in. From the day Murray McConnel launched out into the legal profession he was a leading factor in both the town and the state politically. For more than thirty years his name appeared in the reports of the state supreme court decisions of important litigation. During the Black Hawk War he served with the rank of Major on the staff of General Henry, with considerable distinction. In the early thirties when the state capital was at Vandalia, he served in the lower house in the legislature. Later he was appointed on the State Commission and under his energetic personal supervision a railroad line was built from the Ill river to springfield, the new state capital.

Murray McConnel was always a liberal active Democrat. He took Stephen A Douglas 'under his wing'so as to speak, when that youth came from Vermont and furnished him with law books, gave him letters by which he secured his first school. In 1853 Murray McConnel was appointed as an auditor of the Treasury by President Pierce, and he held the office until the increasing bitterness between the Buchanan faction and those who supported Stephen A Douglas,

led him to resign from the government service and retire to private life. When the south struck the opening blow of the civil war he lost no time in aligning himself with the northern side, giving his voice, vote and energy to the upbuilding of patriotic sentiment and action. When the fortunes of the union looked darkest he was elected to the state senate as a war Democrat. When the war ended he was spokesman for the little band of Democrats in the legislature which enabled III. to be one of the very first states to ratify the amendment to the constitution abolishing slavery.

This was typical of his character. His senatorial term expired soon after the close of the war and he lived in Jacksonville in retirement until he was struck down by an assassin in Feb 1869, for causes never fully known. Murray Mc Connel was one of the bold clear-sighted indomitable, creative spirits, who together founded in a wilderness and built up the present imperial civilization of the Mississippi Valley. (Extracts from the writings of Mrs Louise Welles Murray).

In a family letter dated 7 Aug 1857 from Warsaw, Ind Noah Murray Jr says that he first saw the light of day 24 Jan 1783 in N Y state. This must have been about the time his parents moved from Lanesboro, Mass. where according to well authenticated accounts Noah Murray Sr was preaching, in 1783.

About 1811 shortly after the death of his father Noah Jr moved to Murraysfield, now Springfield, Pa. occupying a farm of about 200 acres which had belonged to his father. After living there about 18 months, he sold this property and returned to Athens. He was Justice of the Peace there from 1816 to 1831, during which time he married 53 couples, according to his own account. About this time Noah Murray Jr took his family and moved to Warsaw, Ind., where he lived the rest of his life.

Ira Murray was a farmer being one of the early settlers of Pike, N. Y. He was one of the substantial citizens of that community and several interesting anecdotes have been handed down in the family regarding him. One of these goes somewhat as follows: There were some petty thieves near his farm north of Pike and coming home one night Ira saw a man running from the rear of his

house. Investigating he found another man in the basement reaching his hands out of the window with chunks of pork in them and in a hoarse whisper berating his partner for not taking them. Ira took the pork placing it in the pan provided for it, later giving his visitor his hand and helping him out of the window. He then compelled the man to take the pork home, advising him to take other methods when in need.

Missing some corn from his crib one day, he set a bear trap just inside the hand hole. Peeping out of the window one Sunday morning at dawn he saw a neighbor standing by the crib, so back to bed he went for a long time. Finally when he got up to feed his stock, he pulled his hat low over his eyes and went to the barn in a round about way. After finishing his work he returned slowly to the house. His neighbor called to him and received some good advice but no prosecution. While Ira Murray was quick tempered he was reasonable withal.

Adjoining the old Doty farm just outside of the village of Pike, is the Doty cemetery where Ira Murray and his parents and many others of the Murray and Doty families were buried. Six children were born to Ira Murray and his wife.

Seymour Murray served in the War of 1812 for a short period as a drummer and was stationed at Sackett's Harbor, N Y. He was appointed sergeant in the 184th N.Y. Regiment of the state militia, 30 Mar 1835 and afterward made First Sergeant Quartermaster. He lived in several places in northern N Y state, first locating in Theresa, Jefferson Co. where he followed his trade of shoemaker being the first in that line of business there. This was in 1818. Later he moved to Philadelphia, Jefferson Co. then to Westmoreland, Oneida Co finally locating in Lowville, Lewis Co. where he died. When quite a boy Roswell Doty Murray moved with his parents from Fairfield in Herkimer Co to Harrisburg, near Lowville in Lewis Co, N Y where he received his schooling in the district school. After finishing school he learned the trade of a stone mason which he followed successfully for some years.

In the meantime he enlisted in the War of 1812, enrolling in Capt Cook's Company, Col Carter's Regiment at Lowville and was discharged at Sacketts Harbor in Nov 1813; according to the Pension Office report at Washington. He was a drummer and served again in Capt Joel Murray's company from 30 July 1814 to 21 Aug 1814. Another report says that he served six weeks as a substitute for his brother Norman at Brownsville in 1813 under Capt William Root. A memo to this report further states that Norman Murray was in Capt Joel Murray's company from 1 Mar, to 20 Mar 1813.

Returning to his trade as stone mason he was known for the excellence and thoroughness of his work and was appointed superintendent of construction when the barracks at Sacketts Harbor was projected, and later took a prominent part in the construction of the Black River dams.

Shortly after his marriage he bought a farm near Rutland in Jefferson Co not far from Watertown, and here on the farm he lived for several years, all his children being born here. About 1848 he moved to Watertown where he opened a crockery business on Court St taking his son Leonard into partnership.

Roswell D Murray was distinctly progressive, new inventions always commanding a keen interest for him, and while on the farm he was one of the first to supplant the old brick oven with a new cook stove. He was an ardent Whig and later Republican, very musical, and with his brother Truman sang in the choir of the Universalist church of which he was a member.

Truman Murray was closely associated with his brother Roswell and with whom he lived in Rutland after his father's death. He learned the trade of a stone mason from his brother. He was very musical and sang in the Universalist choir with his brother for many years.

Like many others of that period, the western fever took possession of Truman Murray and in 1845 he made a trip to Chicago via the St Lawrence river and great lakes, and from there to Rock Co, Wis was probably by stage, where many of his cousins from Onondaga Co, N.Y. had settled. Returning shortly to Watertown, in 1846 he came back to Wis bringing his family and settled permanently. He first went to Beloit, then later on a farm nr Clinton in Rock Co, Wis.

In 1849 he left there going by ox-team to the thriving village of Jefferson, Jefferson Co, Wis where he lived for several years. His brother-in-law George W. Gillett who had come west from Watertown, N Y at or about the same time, drove the ox-team through to Jefferson with them. In 1857 Truman Murray moved his family to Galesburg, Ill, in order that his children might have the advantage of a college education at Lombard University which had just been established there and was a Universalist college.

After the death of his wife in 1861, he enlisted in the Union Army receiving the appointment of drum major, taking part in the battle of Fort Henry and Shiloh. Later he was discharged on account of his age. He then went to Aurora, Ill, where his son was learning to be a pharmacist, and where he met and married his third wife. Late in 1865 they moved on a farm near Lawton, Van Buren Co, Michigan, where they resided until going to Santa Barbara, Calif. in 1870 where they remained for the balance of their lives.

Very little information concerning the early history of Daniel Murray is available. It appears however that he left Vt probably around 1825 or 1826. Indications are that he went to the Western Reserve in Ohio about the time it was opened for settlement, his oldest child, Ambrose being born there in 1827. The other two children were born in Ind according to the 1850 census. In 1845 Daniel Murray homesteaded 640 acres in Dallas Co, Texas, part of which is still the home of his grand dau Mrs Browder.

In 1849 Daniel with his two older boys joined in the gold rush to Calif. Ward Murray the younger of the boys returned home the next year and in 1851 his father returned as far as Alexandria, La from which point he mailed a letter his wife saying that he had struck it rich and would be home the following week and that was the last ever heard of him. It was believed that he was murdered. Probate records in Dallas Co, Texas, reveal that final settlement of Daniel Murray's estate was petitioned for in 1855, heirs named being his widow Abigail and three sons, Ambrose R, Ward and Daniel Jr. Ambrose R Murray returned to Texas shortly after his father's death and further records of the probate court show that he died intestate in Dec 1872 leaving no surviving wife or children.

According to an old indenture in possession of one of his descendants, Seymour Murray Jr was apprenticed to his brother John Murray 17 Apr 1810, to learn boat building. The indenture 'Witnesseth That Seymour Murray Jr of the town and city of Norwich in New London County, son of Seymour Murray, Carpenter of said Norwich, doth herebye with the consent of said Seymour Murray the father that himself as an apprentice to John Murray of said Norwich, Boat Builder.' This was for four years. Original agreements are also in possession of descendants between Seymour Murray Jr and certain firms for the construction of boats by Seymour Murray in 1825 and 1836, showing that he pursued his trade.

During the War of 1812 Seymour Murray Jr served as a private. On page 92 of the Record of Connecticut Men in the regular army and state militias of the War of 1812, he is listed as a private in service at New London, Conn. June 14-16, 1813 under commander Luther Edgerton; also as a private 9-23 Aug, 1814 under Commander Erastus Coit. These records were compiled from the rosters in the Adj. General's office in Washington, D.C. Shortly after Seymour Murray's second marriage in 1819, he went to China for about two years.

Jonathan Murray was probably a farmer and lived near Champion, Jefferson Co, N Y most of his married life. His father Curtis Murray left Conn abt 1816 for northern N Y state and that is probably when the rest of the family went, as Jonathan's brothers settled in the neighborhood and near Copenhagen, Lewis Co, about the same time. Later Jonathan and Augustus moved to Point Breeze, Orleans Co, N Y. 

With the tide of emigration from Conn to the Western Reserve in 1819 came Jamison D. Murray with his father and other members of the family and settled in Carlisle township, Lorain Co, Ohio, not far from the present city of Elyria. Members of the family together with Mr. Murray settled on a high point of land still known as Murray Ridge where he remained the balance of his life as a prosperous farmer and influential citizen. It is safe to assume that he was one of the promoters of the South Murray Ridge Cemetery where he and many of the family are buried-one of the roads running along side of the cemetery being known as Murray Ridge Road. His will dated 3 Oct.1853 divides his estate into 6 shares to which his surviving children and grandchildren are named heirs.

'Rev. Rufus Murray was the youngest son of Philo Murray Esq and was b in Woodbury, Conn in 1796. His education was completed under the instruction of Rev. Dr. Bronson, who was at the head of the institution at Cheshire where most of the Episcopal church of that day were educated: it being at the time the only institution in Connecticut under the patronage of that church. He followed his family to Ohio and was ordained deacon by Bishop Chase in 1822. He was soon after called to rectorship of St Pauls Church at Mayville, N.Y. where he received priest's orders from the Right Reverend Bishop Hobart. He remained in western N.Y. discharging his ministerial duties with pleasure to himself and profit to his church for many years. Having embraced the doctrines of Mormonism, William Ellis Murray sold out in East Bloomfield and went west to Nauvoo, Hancock Co, Ill in 1843 and settled with a group of others of the same faith. When they were driven out of Nauvoo about 1846-47, he with others started for the Great Salt Lake country in Utah, but he died in May 1847 in Snyder, Mo. His widow and children continued west with the others, and in 1853 she married Capt Sam Brown and lived abt 11 miles from Sacramento, California, taking Heman with them. Heman never married as far as can be ascertained.

Carlos G. Murray, son of William Ellis and Mary Springer Murray married Abigail, dau of Peter and Charlotte (Harrington) Haws of Essex county, upper Canada. She was b there 15 June 1828. From the Latter Day Saints Biographical Encyclopedia, Vol. 4 p 713 by Jensen, the following extract is given: 'Murray, Carlos G, one of the original pioneers of Utah, was b in Ontario Co, N.Y. in After the arrival of the pioneer company in Great Salt Lake valley he assisted establishing the little colony in their Rock Mountain home and later the same year returned to winter quarters with Brigham Young. In 1848 he came back with President Young and when some distance from the city went ahead to secure some needed supplies. Sometime later he went to Calif, and on his return reported that one of his company had been killed by the indians. The man had gone to the encampment of the previous night to fetch his serape (Indian blanket) and was killed by an arrow from one of the indians. In 1856 Carlos Murray, his wife and a man named Redden met a similar fate near the Humboldt river (now The report of the tragedy was sent in by some U.S. surveyors and investigation disclosed a gold pencil and earring which A.P. Haws identified as the property of his sister, wife of Carlos Murray, and Bro. Murray's pistols were found in the possession of some travelers who said they bought them from the indians in the desert.

After his marriage he lived in or nr Otisco, N Y then he moved to Granby, Oswego Co, N Y. About 1835 he took his family and household effects and came to Chicago by water through the Great Lakes, taking 49 days for the Journey. From Chicago he came to Grundy Co, Ill by team, settling nr Mazon, then on the old Chicago and Bloomington trail. Here he built his cabin which was called the 'Half Way House', as it was about equal distance from the terminus of the trail. The family moved in before a door to the cabin was secured and they used a blanket for a door until one could be made. Jonathan Cady Murray can be classed among the pioneers of Ill. and of Grundy Co.

In 1844 while serving on the grand jury at Morris, Ill, Mr. Armstrong who furnished meals and lodging for the jurors, ran out of meat. Mr. Murray volunteered to return home that night and get some meat from his smokehouse and bring it to Morris the next day. A heavy rain fell that night and Jonny Run creek was badly swollen, and in attempting to cross the stream on horseback with the meat, Mr. Murray lost his balance and fell into the water and was drowned. In 1858 his widow married Daniel Ross of Mazon who died in 1860.

Albert G. Murray went to Canandaigua when a young man and took an active part in politics as an anti-slavery Whig. He served as postmaster there from 1861 to 1865 appointed by President Lincoln.

Albert Morse Murray, oldest son of Albert G. and Emily Morse Murray won a brilliant record in the civil war. Appointed 2nd Lieut in the 5th New York Artillery 17 June 1862, he was promoted to First Lieutenant the 6 of Oct-of the same year. He also had the brevet title of Captain conferred on him for gallant service at Antietam. In 1864 he was taken prisoner and died in Libby prison the 8th of Aug, of the same year. He was a graduate of West Point in 1862.

William Butler Murray was employed by the Pacific Mail Steamship Company as purser running between California and China. He afterward joined Col. Tritle in mining operations in Nevada and Arizona.

Frederick E. Murray was born in Canandaigua and received his early education at Canandaigua Academy and later attended Yale but did not graduate. He was an artist of no mean ability and contributed to several well known publications of that period. He assisted his father in the postoffice at Canandaigua for a time.

Later he went west and became connected with the old United Verde Copper Company at Jerome, Arizona and through association with his Jerome cousins became superintendent and engineer of the mine. This was in 1883.

Mr. Murray at one time went back east to visit his cousin, Reuben Murray at Pompey, N.Y. who was the owner of a famous breed of cattle. While there some Englishmen of high social standing who desired to replenish their herds, came to this country for that purpose and visited Pompey and purchased some cattle from Reuben Murray. Subsequently Frederick Murray drove them to the railroad station at Manlius, passing the old Jerome homestead, which was looking rather worse for the wear and lack of paint. Pointing the house out to the visitors Frederick Murray said 'In that house Lady Randolph Churchill's father used to Live'. Lord Churchill was at the height of his fame about that time, and the Englishmen were reluctant to believe Mr. Murray's statement. Said one of the Englishman 'I think you must be mistaken, Lady Randolph Churchill's father was an eminently famous banker of New York.' Frederick Murray assured the Englishman that he knew what he was talking about as he was a cousin of Lady Randolph Churchill himself.

Frederick Murray is believed to have been mar. late in life but there seems to be little known of him the latter part of his career. It is thought he returned to New York city and perhaps died there.

Leaving his home neighborhood to enter a business career, Edward D, Murray went to Syracuse while a young man, mar. there and became prosperous and influential. In the early 1850's when the western country of Mich, and Wis, was attracting settlers, he took his family and moved to Beloit, Wis, where many of his family had preceded him from Onondaga Co. N.Y. With many of the others of his family he helped build up the city of Beloit, was an extensive property holder and became mayor of Beloit.

At the outbreak of the civil war he with his two oldest sons enlisted in the 22nd Wisconsin Volunteers Inf. and he was promoted to the rank of major. After his family were all grown he moved to Chicago where he lived the balance of his life. He was a very tall handsome man of great dignity possessing a charming personality and very devoted to his family.

Although educated for a civil engineer, Edward A Murray devoted his life chiefly to farming. He lived nr Athenson the farm inherited from his father and enjoyed a wide circle of friends and was a leading citizen in the community.





555 CHARLES LEFFERTS MURRAY

Hon, Charles Lefferts Murray was b in the village of what was then known as Murraysfield, Bradford Co, Pa. The name of the village as been since changed to Springfield. When quite young he moved with his parents to Athens, Bradford Co, Pa where he lived until he was abt 13 yrs old, when he went to Towanda, Pa to learn the printing trade with his brother-in-law Warren Jenkins. In 1829 they moved to Milan, Huron Co, Ohio where he followed the printing business. In 1831 he went with Mr. Jenkins to Columbus, Ohio. In 1833 Mr. Murray moved to Jacksonville, Ill, where his uncle, Murray McConnel lived. He did not stay there long however, returning to Columbus, where he again worked for Mr. Jenkins and others in the same line of business.

In 1834 Mr. Murray left Columbus and went to Piqua, Ohio and with another brother-in-law, David R Espy, started the publication of a newspaper, the Piqua Courier. Mr. Murray was editor of this paper, which was printed for a while on an old wooden press. Later a new press was purchased. The Piqua Courier was the first paper in the state of Ohio to run up the name of Gen. Harrison for presidency. This was in 1835. The following year he bought out his brother-in-law. Shortly after this Mr. Murray was prevailed upon to go to Goshen, Ind and open a printing shop, selling the Piqua Courier.

The first number of the Goshen Express was published in 1837 with Mr. Murray as editor. This was the first paper published in the county. In 1840 Mr. Murray was appointed postmaster of Goshen by President Harrison, selling out his printing business shortly thereafter. Under President Tyler, Mr. Murray was removed from the postmastership, so he turned his attention to agricultural pursuits on some land which he had purchased. This continued until 1846 when he printed the Republican, published in Monoquet, Kosciusko Co, Ind for a year. From there he went to Indianapolis where he became assistant editor of the Indiana State Journal. In the fall of the following year he returned to his farm in Elkhart county where he resided until 1870, when he moved with his family to Goshen. During the winter season Mr. Murray went to Indianapolis and reported in the Senate, serving through seven sessions in that capacity.

In 1859 Mr. Murray was elected to the House of Representatives by the Republican party by upwards of 900 majority. He served his constituents acceptably thru both the extra and regular sessions. In 1860 he was nominated as a candidate to the Senate and elected by over 1200 majority.

In the spring of 1861 President Lincoln having called for 75000 men to put down the rebellion, Gov. Morton called an extra session of the legislature and issued a proclamation for the assembling of Indiana's quota of militia to join the Union forces.

Mr. Murray being a member of the State Senate before repairing to the capitol, issued a call for volunteers thru the two newspapers of Goshen, and made out the first muster roll heading it with his own name. He went to war as a private, was promoted to orderly sergeant, then quartermaster of the 48th Indiana Infantry, which position he resigned on account of sickness, but on account of his

efficiency as an officer and a soldier it was three months before his resignation was accepted. In 1862-63 he resumed his seat in the legislature and after the expiration of his term, he continued by all honorable means to sustain a vigorous prosecution of the efforts of the government to suppress the rebellion.

In 1870 he sold his farm and moved into Goshen and subsequently contributed as a miscellaneous writer to the Democrat. In 1872 he took the stump for Horace Greeley, having been appointed a member of the state executive committee by the 'Liberal' party. The next year he purchased the Goshen Democrat and in Dec 1872 he took possession of the South Bend Herald with his son C.T. Murray in charge. In 1876 he removed to South Bend and took entire charge.

On 15 Mar 1881 Mr. Murray retired from the field of journalism. Later he became an ardent Prohibitionist and began editing the Sun the organ of the Prohibition Party. In his advocacy of the doctrines of his party, the columns of the Sun bore ample testimony that his whole soul was in the work. When the publication of the Sun was transferred to a stock company, Mr. Murray retired from active business life.

Mr. Murray was engaged in active political life from his youth up. He had the advantage of the personal acquaintance of nearly all the public men of Ind and Ohio, was very well known and highly regarded. He was a self made man, never having attended school a day from the time he was 11 yrs of age, and inured by actual experience and manly struggles to a pioneer life.

The foregoing extracts were taken from an editorial by Gordon N.Murray, son of Charles L. Murray, and published in 'The Nappanee News' of 17 July 1889; of which Mr.G. N. Murray was editor and publisher.

Charles W. Murray was b nr what is known as the 'Five Corners'a few miles north of Pike, Wyo Co, N.Y. His father died when he was quite young and left a debt of \$300 on his farm, which he and his brothers determined to pay off. At the age of 16 he hired out to a farmer for six months at \$6 a month and taught school in winter. Afterward he went to Pittsburg, Pa, and worked on a lumber raft on the Ohio river. This work was not to his liking so he got a release from the captain at Marietta, Ohio, and started on foot for Buffalo, N.Y. then on back to Pike. He later decided to go west and settled at Galesburg, Ill.abt harvest time and worked at this for \$1 a day. Later he took up trucking and hauled wheat to Chicago, returning with merchandise for Galesburg merchants. This meant being mired in the prairie sloughs considerably. He then returned to Pike where he was married and soon afterward went back to Ill, bought a farm nr Plainfield where he lived the rest of his life with the exception of two yrs. He was quite a worker in his church and a well liked and substantial citizen in his community.

When a boy of about fifteen, Allen Murray, as was the custom in those days, apprenticed to Harvey Goodrich of Albion, N.Y. About 1837 he took over 160 acres of land in Schuyler Co.III, from the government, where he moved with his wife and father, Henry Murray. He settled on this land which is not far from the present village of Littleton. In 1872 he retired from active business and moved to Macomb, with his wife, living with their dau, Mrs. Lucinda Applegate. Allen Murray was a thrifty, pioneer, of the upright, rugged type, many of whom came from the east to settle up the middle west.

At an early age, William T. Murray left his native city with his parents and came west to Wis. As a boy he attended the school at Jefferson, Wis until he was through with the primary grades. In 1857 the family moved to Galesburg, Ill, where William T. and his sister Emma, attended Lombard University, one of the first that was ever founded by the Universalist Church. After the death of his mother in 1861, he went to Aurora, Ills and entered a drug store, where he learned the drug business. Soon after this, the civil war broke out, and he enlisted 25 July 1862 in the Union Army, ranking as a private in Co H 124th Illinois Volunteer Infantry. Shortly after he was put on detached service, working among the wounded and distributing medicines, etc on account of his knowledge of pharmacy and drugs. He continued in the service of his country until honorably discharged after the surrender of Vicksburg 1865. After this he went to Mich to visit his father who was living on a farm nr Lawton, Van Buren Co. Here he met his future wife, the dau of Gen. Thomas A. Granger, a close friend and former neighbor of Truman Murray in N Y state. In 1867 William T. Murray went to Peoria, Ill, where he again worked at his profession, that of a druggist, going with the firm of Fursman & Kinnear. In 1869 he was m and from 1871 to 1873 was in business with M.A. Breed of Peoria. He then moved to Bloomington, Ill, and went in the drug business with A.C. Eddy, one of the leading druggists of that city. In 1877 he returned to Peoria, where in 1880 he entered the government service continuing in this service until his voluntary retirement in 1920.

Mr. Murray was possessed of keen judgment, a good reader of human nature, a strict sense of justice and high sense of honor. He was very musical, and had a fine tenor voice. He was a great reader, and well informed on history. He went to the bottom of things in which he was interested and was considered the best informed man in the country on Internal Revenue Law, having been called to Washington, D.C. on different occasions for consultation. He had great diginity of bearing, highly respected and his judgment and advice was much sought on different matters. His keen sense of humor was also a feature for which he was known among his friends. He was widely and prominently known in Peoria, and with his wife, who was also quite musical, opened the doors of their home informally to their many friends, who count these memorable occasions as friendly gatherings indelibly impressed on their lives.

William T. Murray married 12 Oct.1869 to Julia C. Granger, dau.of Gen. Thomas A. and Julia Ann (Hubbard) Granger. On her father's side she was a descendant of Launcelot Granger who came to this country from England in 1648. On her mother's side she was a descendant of George Hubbard who settled in Middletown, Conn. early in the 17th century. Their married life was spent in Peoria, Ill, with the exception of a short time in Bloomington, Ill. Two children were born; viz.

Daniel Murray grew up on his father's farm, the same one his grandfather Dea, Eber Murray took up in 1783, near Orwell, Vt. He attended the district school until he was 17 when he went to Newton University at Shoreham, Vt. and the Vt. Scientific and Literary Institute at Brandon, Vt. He then taught school for six winters nr Hinesburg, Vt. and engaged in farming. After his marriage he moved to Burlington, Vt. where he followed the wholesale tobacco business with great success, retiring in 1884. He was one of the leading citizens of Burlington, well

known and highly respected. Much of the early history of his branch of the family is due to his extensive contributions to this genealogy.

Orlando Murray probably went with his parents to Aurelius, Cayuga Co, N.Y. then perhaps to Niagara Co, N. Y. and later to Pontiac, Mich. Like many others of the Murray family, Orson Smith Murray was a man of strong convictions, a deep thinker, and a forcible talker. The Cincinnati Price Current of 18 June 1885, edited and published by his son, Charles B. Murray, gives a sketch of Orson Smith Murray, extracts from which are given herewith:

Throughout the entire career of Orson S. Murray, life has been to him an affair of profound interest and earnestness. He has had thoughts and convictions quite independent of those inculcated by education, association or the popular sentiment. He has been governed by an impulse to know the truth, and a courage to stand by and to proclaim without fear that which he has esteemed to be the truth, however much at variance with the popular voice, and at whatever provocation of censure of condemnation of those with whom he differed. He has dared, at all times and under all circumstances, to think and to speak for himself, and to hold others to an accountability for what have seemed to him their shortcomings or waverings from the line of integrity or sincerity. Thus he has led an unpopular life. He has been radically progressive in his views and teachings, gaining much of recognition, but not getting so distinctly to the front in this respect as those who have been influenced by mercenary motives or a desire for personal distinction. His actions have had little reference to self; his labors have been for the general good of others, so far as his judgment enabled him to estimate what was promotive of such good.

In early life his opportunities for education were limited, but he made the best of them, doing more in this respect than is usual, under like circumstances. He eventually succeeded in securing a classical course, completed after his marriage. Information once acquired was well retained, and his clear and analytical intellect enable him to grasp and to master subjects with more than ordinary proficiency and effect.

Reared under strict church influences, he became a zealous and earnest adherent of the teachings thus inculcated; and later, with entrance upon the mature yrs of manhood, he became prepared for the ministry, and was ordained, in the denomination of Baptists.

In Oct 1835 he became controlling owner and editor of the Vermont Telegraph, a weekly newspaper, the organ of the denomination of Baptists. Previously he had prepared himself for the ministry, and was ordained, but he chose the other course for his labors.

He was the first, so far as he knew or ever learned, to frame and to offer a legislative declaration in the interest of anti-slavery, by a resolution submitted to the Vermont Legislature, to petition Congress to abolish slavery and the slave trade in the District of Columbia, and the interstate traffic.

As a public speaker, his words were perhaps more effective for their logic than for his oratory; for his reasoning, his analysis, his criticism, rather than for the polished persuasiveness of manner which some may have.

Through the progress of reasoning from cause to effect, encouraged by acquirement of enlarged knowledge upon the natural sciences, the time came when Mr. Murray found difficulty in being reconciled to the church doctrines under which he had been educated, and at the end of six yrs of service in editorial labors on behalf of the church, he felt constrained to take a more independent stand, and during the next two yrs his paper was the advocate of free thought, which in time led to complete Atheism.

He was not without a liberal following in this new field. In order to better carry out his work of modifying what he regarded as religious thraldom, he removed to New York, late in 1843. His talents as a writer had attracted the attention of political parties, and he was strongly urged to lend his efforts in such a cause,

with the most flattering assurances of material to be furnished, and of support. But he felt that he never could be bound by party chains, and that he could not find contentment in politics.

In New York he began the publication of The Regenerator, and anti-religious and anti-slavery journal. In 1844 he removed to Ohio, being shipwrecked on Lake Erie, where he lost the greater part of his effects. His publication was re-established, and was continued many years--until 1856.

With but brief exception, he maintained a connection with farming operations throughout his twenty yrs of publishing career.

In late yrs he has lived in quite a retired manner, at his home in Warren county, twenty seven miles distant from Cincinnati. He has been a frequent contributor to newspaper columns, although a large part of his writings have been so radical and so severe in their criticisms upon public men and measures that the political press have often denied them publication.

Few men have taken a more practical view of life. In his use of language, in his speech and in his writings, words were used to give expression to meaning, and not to obscuring what was intended. He dodged no issue, and he practiced well the better teachings which he inculcated.

The pen of Mrs. Carrie Murray Wright has contributed much of interest to this compilation, concerning her branch of the family. Greatly interested in it, her remarkably active mentality recalled much which might otherwise have been lost. She possessed a keen sense of humor and an interesting personality.

Soon after Mrs. Wright's first marriage to Silas Whitcomb, a native of Richmond, Vermont, the young couple went across the continent to live in California, settling down on a large cattle ranch near Sacramento. Here Mr. Whitcomb was highly successful due in part to the wonderful cooperation of his wife in doing her part in their pioneering life. After eleven years Mr. Whitcomb died and in 1870 she married George B. Wright, a native of Milton, Vermont, then living at Lake Minnetonka, near Minneapolis, Minn. Mr. Wright being a widower with children, she fitted admirably into his home making an ideal step mother for his children and the step son was always a faithful guardian of her interests as well as a devoted son.

After Mr. Wright's death Mrs. Wright deemed it a privilege to care for an aged aunt Mrs. Alonzo Noble of Battle Creek, Mich with whom she lived for twelve yrs until the death of Mrs. Noble. At various periods in her life she has lived with different members of her family and in many places, spending sometime with her dau. in Paris and other places in Europe. Mrs. Wright was a woman of generous sympathies and her life one of noble service, and her home whereever located has sheltered from time to time many of her relatives and friends and her extended travels brought her in touch with many acquaintances who

afterward became devoted admirers and friends. She possessed a rare gift, the ability to portray vividly and one might say dramatically with her pen.

Augustus A Murray lived in Jefferson county, N.Y. until he was 25 yrs old, going to school and helping his father on the farm. He started teaching school at 17 for a while and working in neighborhood stores. Hearing tales about the opportunities and rapid growth of the west, he moved to Springfield, Ill, where he opened a grocery store. Selling out after five yrs he went back to farming nr Bloomington, Ill, for another five yrs. Going from there to Decatur he opened a livery business. In 1864 he was elected sheriff for two yrs but did not care for public office. He had a reputation for being a good business man and was highly successful and well liked. In 1878 he moved to Valley Falls, Kansas, where he remained for the balance of his life.

Coming to Fort Worth, Texas, in a stage coach in 1872, Mrs Burchill was truly one of the pioneers of Fort Worth. She was the city's first postmistress, being appointed in 1881 by President Arthur. The following review of the life of William H. H. Murray was written by his dau. Mrs. Ruby Murray Orcutt of Madison, Conn and was read before the Dorothy Whitfield Historical Society, Inc at Guilford, Connecticut 16 Oct 1931.

'My father was b 26 Apr. 1840 in the section of Guilford known as Nortontown, the fourth child in a family of three girls and two boys. His father was Dickinson Murray of Scotch descent, and his mother was Sally Munger largely of English blood. Dickinson Murray's mother was Diadema Norton a descendant of Thomas Norton, who settled about the middle of the seventeenth century in the northeastern part of Guilford later called Nortontown.

Thus my father was closely identified with that section by blood as well as by birth.

Sally Munger was one of the North Madison Mungers, a dau of Chauncey Munger. Previous to her marriage she taught in the district schools, something unusual in those days over a hundred yrs ago when most of the teachers were men. She was a woman of keen intellect and inclined to be serious-minded. Her people are reported to have been very religious and somewhat visionary. Dickinson was of the opposite type. He was an interesting talker and debater, buoyant in temperament and very energetic. He was a ship carpenter by trade, a hard worker, but improvident. These things I mention since it seems to me that my father's character was a composite of his parents' and by considering their lives it is easier to understand this.

Old friends of my father have told us that in his boyhood he was both studious and prankish. He learned easily, was a constant reader and early had a reputation as a debater. His religious cant must have developed early because his youthful playmates soon discovered that he could take this part of a minister best when the game was 'playing church' because he could pray the longest and hardest. His brother Chauncey, three yrs older, also a very able boy, and who later became a minister was more conventional and less tempestuous than my father. The boys were always together yet not too near. One old resident remarked that when Bill Murray was seen to pass the house you could count on seeing Chauncey in about ten minutes go by in the same direction.

A few of my father's boyhood pranks have come down to us. Once he set fire to a newspaper held by a beau of his elder sister Sarah, a wooer far too leisurely to suit my father's notions of how a courtship should proceed. Another time to liven up things in a district school he placed a small charge of gunpowder in the wood stove. He was a very fast walker and on walking home from evening prayer meeting at Madison with his brother and sisters, unually did not remain with the group but outdistanced them. On one such occasion he had not got very far ahead when he stumbled over a skunk and had to bury his clothes before entering the house. The other children said it served Bill right for hurrying on in the way he always did. This story was related to me by my aunt.

My father attended district school at Nortontown under a teacher whose name was Meigs. Like many of the school masters of those days he was a man well educated in the classics and was prepared to teach capable students most of the subjects necessary for entrance to college. Under him the Murray boys made a beginning in Latin, Creek, algebra and literature. When the Guilford Institute opened, its representatives came to urge my father's mother to send her boys there to prepare for Yale. She needed no urging and both boys went, walking the five miles night and morning. My father entered Yale in 1858 but how

long he attended the institute I do not know. I would be very glad if this date could be supplied to me, but few if any of his schoolmates are now living.

The problem of four yrs at Yale now confronted my father and his brother. Their parents were poor and probably were able to contribute very little towards the higher education of these two sons.

A wealthy and childless man who had been impressed with the promise and ability of William Murray offered to pay his way at college if he would take the surname of his benefactor. This my father refused to do. The conditions however, were accepted by another Guilford boy who later became a distinguished lawyer. Chauncey Murray secured a position as waiter to earn his board and did other work to help himself along. My father walked from New Haven to Guilford each week end and carried back a supply of bread, butter and other foods prepared by his mother and elder sisters. These devoted women also bought and made the boy's clothing (they were expert seamstresses in those days) and I have a picture of the two taken in my father's freshman year at college, wearing their academic hats to surmount their homemade clothes. These and other expedients afforded them a means of livelihood during their struggle for an education. In addition my father's best source of income was farm work of all kinds but especially the harvesting and threshing of grain performed during his summer vacations.

He was graduated from Yale in 1862 at the age of 22 yrs. On the day of graduation as I have been told he married Isadora Hull of East River. He had complained of the slowness of his brother-in-law's courtship. Apparently he was on the dot with his own. How the struggling young couple made out during those early years I do not know. My father had now to complete his training as a minister. This he did at East Windsor, Conn and under private instructors.

His first work in the ministry was at Washington, Conn, in Litchfield county for about a year in the capacity I believe, of assistant to the pastor or acting pastor. He then went to Greenwich stone church, Greenwich, Conn about 1864-1865. His eloquence and charm attracting attention immediately, he was called to Meriden and remained two yrs, 1866-67. At each of these pastorates he made hosts of friends who were to remain loyal to him throughout his life. There was also some criticism quite naturally, of the young pastor's informality and originality of ideas and conduct. He was never one to pattern his life after others but pursued his way with a freedom of step, sincerity and independence of thought, a lack of ostentation and hypocrisy that endeared him to the more liberal minded, while it left those more bound by convention very much at a loss to understand him.

It was while at Meriden that my father, already a finished marksman and delighting in hunting and fishing and out of door life in general, inaugurated his yearly trips to the Adirondacks during his summer vacations. His instructive sense of authorship, joined to his desire to spread the doctrine of out of door life, led him to write 'Adventures in the Wilderness' in the form of short stories or sketches, many of them humorous, some serious. This little book published first in 1869 had an immediate and tremendous success. From all parts of the country the Murray Rush for the Adirondacks commended and caricatures appeared in the newspapers depicting 'Murray's Fools'. Hotels and camps were few. Those that existed had been hurriedly thrown together to accommodate as many tourists as possible. Guests slept on the floors and tables and yet seemed to en-

joy themselves. Nor were the tourists men only. Women who had never dreamed of out-of-door life as we know it, yielded to the example of the popular preacher and his friends and spent their summer vacations in the woods.

Mean while criticism was rife among the older element of the church deacons. In his book 'Deacons' printed later, my father states that no minister of his day was supposed to take a step longer than 14 inches. This being the case, it is not unnatural that a minister who took trips to the wilderness, was an expert marksman and woodsman and who unblushingly displayed a liking for fast trotting horses, should come in for his share of condemnation. However the more liberal among the church officers as well as the great majority of his congregation, continued to acclaim the young pastor, the fervor and eloquence of whose preaching could not but gain him recognition as one of the rising young preachers of New England.

In 1868 after two yrs at Meriden he was called to be pastor of the Park Street Church in Boston, a very important post at that time. Here he remained for seven yrs. During this period in addition to his preaching and clerical work, he continued to write tales and stories the central figure of which was John Norton the Trapper. This character embodies the author's ideal of our pioneer forefathers. John Norton is sturdy in mind and body, resourceful in all emergencies, a true woodsman handy with a rifle, a philosopher and friend to the various men who came his way in the wilderness.

The story 'John Norton's Christmas' is considered to be the outstanding work in the series of Adirondack Tales. The others are: John Norton's Vagabond, a companion work, The Story the Keg told Me, The Story of the Man who Missed It, The Man who didnt Know Much, The Mystery of the Woods (unfinished), Henry Herbert's Thanksgiving. 'The Story of the Man who didnt Know Much' while not equalling the Christmas story in number of sales, came nearest to it in popularity.

While in Boston my father founded and published 'The Golden Rule' a literary weekly to which he contributed largely and in which many of his works as well as his weekly sermons were first printed. Meanwhile in Guilford he owned and conducted a stock farm of considerable size, as many as eighty thoroughbred Morgan horses being housed there at the height of its activity. In connection with this enterprise brought out a book called 'The Perfect Horse' a tribute to the animals he loved so well. Other stories about horses are the humorous sketch called 'Deacon Tubman and Parson Whitney' also 'A Ride with a Mad Horse in a Freight Car,' which was used for many years by elocutionists and entertainers. The remains of the great stock barn and vestiges of the racetrack behind it may still be seen in Nortown today.

In 1874 prompted by an increasing resentment of the interference of his deacons and with characteristic independence and complete disregard of the construction that might be placed on his action, he resigned from pastorate of the Park Street Church and devoted himself entirely to his literary work for a period of one year. In '75 however most of his former congregation having remained loyal to him, he was persuaded by its representatives to open an independent church. This he decided to do and for three years he addressed packed audiences at Music Hall. The place was filled to overflowing, camp chairs were placed in the aisles and entrances and it is recorded that even the steps and adjacent sidewalks were crowded.

At this period my father was doubtless at the height of his career. He was in

his middle thirties possessed of tireless energy, enthusiasm, a burning desire to preach the truth as he saw it, a longing also for time to continue his creative work, with no taste whatever for the routine part of clerical life such as parish calls and social activities in general, with tremendous physical energy which necessitated the outlet afforded by his stock farm, his trips into the wilderness, his hunting and fishing, with the strong-headedness that was his from first to last with exceeding personal charm which made him much sought after and exposed him to many temptations not all of which he was able to resist.

In 1878 at the end of the third year of work with his independent congregation, he resigned permanently from the ministry after sixteen yrs of clerical life. At about this time he separated from his first wife and in the course of two or three years they were formally div. From 1878 to 1886 he continued his literary work, adding to his already considerable list such books as 'The Busted Ex-Texan', certain other collections of short stories and numerous addresses on various subjects. His home ties being broken he traveled extensively in this country, spending much time in the south and west. He visited England and South Africa. He also filled many lecture engagements in Canada and United States.

It was while on a lecture tour in Canada that, in 1885, he met Frances Rivers, my mother, an English Canadian, many yrs his junior, and a native of Glouscester county, New Brunswick. In Sept of '86 they were married. They first settled in Burlington, where my father was commodore of the Champlain Yacht Club and owned a yacht called the Champlain which I believe was built by Philo Blatchley of East River Bridge. He now entered the lecture field more intensively than ever, being managed by the Redpath Lyceum Bureau of Boston and one fruit of this period was the little book 'Lake Champlain and its Shores'. His interest in writing was still keen and he planned works that were to be finished later. They remained in Burlington until 1891.

Someone now wrote my father that his birthplace and former home in Guilford was for sale and he was immediately consumed with a desire to again own and dwell in his ancestral home. Accordingly in the spring of 1891 my parents with their two small dau, moved from Burlington, Vt, to Guilford, occupying first the house known as the Charles Francis house, where their third dau was b and a little later in 1893, moving into the Murray Homestead where the youngest dau came into the world.

Up to about 1900 my father was still active in literary work and produced the book 'Daylight Land' an account and description of a trip over the Canadian Pacific railroad then just being opened: also the companion idylls 'Mamalons' and 'Ungava', sagas of John Norton's early life in the north woods and considered by the author to be his finest literary endeavor. These idylls are in fact prose poems of great beauty and finished literary form. Two other poems 'The Leaf of Red Rose' and 'The Blind Indian Maiden' represent my father's only effort in blank verse. 'The Old Apple Tree's Easter' beloved by many, belongs to this period also. He meanwhile lectured widely throughout New England and New York, giving readings from his works and especially of 'John Norton's Christmas' which in all he read five hundred times before New England audiences.

My father's family of four dau coming so late in his life, was to him a constant source of interest and delight. As the problem of his children's education became imminent, the inadequacies and limitations of education en masse as

practiced in our public schools apparently filled his with very much the same distrust that it does thoughtful parents of today.

In an effort to give his children something finer, something freer, something, more likely to release in them such endowments as might be theirs, he devised an original plan of education for young children. This plan is described in the final work to come from his pen, 'How I am educating my Daughters', a book that met with rather unusual success.

Beginning about 1901 the wear and tear of his busy life and strenuous temperament began to tell on his naturally strong constitution, yet he was optimistic and seldom appeared to think of the possibility of death. As illness increased his great wish was to be cared for by his family, and this wish his devoted wife and elder daughters fulfilled. I have the happy memory of hearing my father say that life had been so full of good things for him and that if the next world held only half of the sweetness and delight of this one, he would be well content. He died very peacefully surrounded by his family on 3 Mar 1904, not quite 64 yrs of age and was laid to rest in accordance with his own instructions, a few rods south of the house in which he was born.

A newspaper of that period speaking editorially of Mr. Murray says in part; 'Adirondack Murray was a well known character whose reputation as a preacher of the gospel and an owner and driver of fast horses was nation-wide. He came to Greenwich in 1864 at the age of 24. He stood over six feet in height, was straight as an arrow and of massive physique. His large well shaped head was covered with abundant black hair. As a pulpit orator he was incomparable. There was a peculiar charm in his delivery, a magnetism in his presence and a profound logic in his reasoning which rendered his talks positive rhetorical studies.

Those fortunate enough to have become personally acquainted with Mrs Walling were soon impressed with the fact that she was a woman of keen intellectual perception, well informed and a deep thinker. Her interests were many and she was a leader in the many activities in which she was interested. Much credit is due her for information of her line of the family.

Her dau. Mrs Brace has written the following of her; 'Physically delicate the first few yrs of her life, she was unable to mingle in the active sports of childhood and so developed mentally to a precocious degree. At six years of age Elizabeth read and wrote fluently and sometimes composed childish verses which she embellished with pen drawings. At 18 she married James Walling of Victor, Domestic cares absorbed the busy years following but not to the exclusion of intellectual and social employment. Her home became the center of a musical and dramatic coterie to which she contributed talent and superior In 1852 she joined the Universalist church where her leadership was immediately recognized. As a contralto singer in the choir, a director in the church festivals and entertainments, a teacher and superintendent in the Sunday school, she has long been pre-eminent. It was during her ten years service as superintendent of the Victor Sunday school that she evolved the valuable system of study known as the Walling system which she published in 1897. From 1887 to 1897 Mrs Walling was vice president of the Western New York Universalist Sunday School Institute. She was also a member of the W.C.Y.U. and for a year edited the temperance column of the Ontario County Times;' which charge she relinquished for more active church work. While working in a comparatively small community and for a few interested, yet she kept in touch with all important movements of the world.'



Charles P Murray enlisted in Co B of the 22nd Wisconsin Volunteers commanded by Capt Northrop when his regiment was mobilizing in Racine. Mr. Murray served three yrs with this company and saw a great deal of active service at Lookout Mountain, Chickamaugua, siege of Chattanooga, and Missionary Ridge and was with Sherman in his march to the sea. After being mustered out in May 1865 Mr Murray returned to the farm for a brief period then moved to Iowa and bought a farm near Waverly. After his mother's death in 1867 he returned to Wis and eventually bought out the interests of his younger brothers in the homestead where he lived until 1891 when with his family he moved to Beloit.

Cherished by his family are some heir-looms among which was a checker board of light and dark wood which had belonged to his father who was a famous checker player, also a calf bound copy of Shakespeare which Sylvester Murray read without glasses when in his early eighties, and a very heavy silver mounted muzzle-loading rifle.

The following sketch of Millard P Murray is from the pen of his wife, Mrs Louise Welles Murray. 'Millard Parmenter Murray was born in Athens, Pa in the old Murray home built by his grandfather, Abner Murray and occupied by four generations from 1791 to 1885. His whole life was spent in Athens and to its development he devoted himself. His grandfather was one of the keenest business men in this section. His father Edward A Murray was upright and honorable, and his early death threw his three sons on their own resources.

Millard Murray had a good heritage and when he was a mere lad, he entered the office of Col Charles F Welles, a live public spirited man whose watchword was progress, and whose life was one of untiring service to humanity. Thus the young man became interested in the development of real estate for which he quickly showed inherent ability. He finally purchased from the estate of C F Welles, a farm on the edge of the town where growth was inevitable.

This was platted and sold on easy payments, thus enabling the laboring man to secure a home, indeed he had no greater praise than from the poor whom he favored. The developments of this plot proved a heavy burden, but he never faltered, streets were opened trees were set and all possible details conducted personally. He was keen for every town interest, stood firmly for the right regardless of his own party politics. He helped to draw business and manufacturing interests to the valley. For 25 years as president of the cemetery association, he was unfailing in his efforts to develope and beautify the plot given originally by his mentor, Col C F Welles. Throughout the town he was known as a lover and planter of trees in the public park and along many streets which he opened in developing the Murray plat. It was written of him 'A planter of trees here between the rivers of his native valley his memory will live in the beauty and spirit of the trees that he planted; and he shall be like a tree, planted by the rivers of water that bringeth forth his fruit in his season. His leaf also shall not wither and whatsoever he doeth shall prosper.'

For more than 20 years he was an active trustee of the Robert Packer Hospital, laboring well and loyally to aid its development and interests. The study of the Indian was his greatest pleasure, and his own collections from the nucleus of the archaelogical treasures of the Tioga Point Museum. By the request of the donor, he had charge of the erection of the Spalding Memorial Building designed for a museum and library, and in the historical collections he maintained a lively interest until his death.

Naturally reserved, he was a genial companion, ever ready with a pleasant smile, kind word or helpful advice to all he met along the way, even little children cherish his memory. Inherited from his father, he had an unusual love of nature, delighting not only in trees, but buds and flowers. His chief pleasure was carrying flowers to the hospital, starting seedling fruit trees or rooting grapevines for his younger neighbors. He loved his home, his friends, his community and went

happily out of life with a smile on his face- a blessed memory.'

Charles T Murray attained considerable note as a newspaper writer and correspondent. He also wrote several books based on his experiences at home and abroad. The following account of him appeared in the Goshen (Ind) Daily Democrat, some years prior to his death. It is entitled.

'The Story of a Goshen Boy'

Charles Theodore Murray was born in Goshen 30 March 1843. His father was the late Charles L Murray, printer, editor, soldier and politician.

Of a large family young Charlie was the only Goshen boy. He was still a small boy when the family settled on the well known Murray farm in Jefferson township. There he remained until he reached his teens, alternating farm labor with the three months winter schooling. The township circulating library system came in and the local books were at the Murray home. By the light of the blazing logs in the big fireplace, the old time tallow candle and the burning rag in a saucer of grease young Murray pored over standard fiction, biography and history and unconsciously laid the foundation of the eventful life that was to follow. There are living in Goshen old men who played with him as boys. For he was accepted as one of the town boys from the start. Coming in with a basket of fresh vegetables from the farm he hurriedly disposed of his stock at hotels and on the street and then joined the gang in the old court house yard, trudging back later to the farm four miles away. To thus foot it back and forth for a days fun with the boys on big occasions was not considered extraordinary. And when his elder brother Frank, was working in the old Democrat office, Charlie often stole upstairs and played the 'devil' temporarily, as Billy Beane yanked the Washington hand-press, emerging from this early experience, usually, covered with printers ink and glory.

Farm life soon became too prosaic for his vivid imagination and one night he slipped out of his bedroom window and started out to see the world. His outfit consisted of a loaf of bread, a brass watch and a silver dime. He struck out across lots, through forest and field, to cut the railroad for Toledo. It was pitch dark still when he hit the rails near Ligonier. When the train came in Charlie sought the conductor and offered him the brass watch and cash for passage to Toledo; but that cold blooded official simply beckoned to a fat man on the platform and said: 'Here's your little man.'

The fat man was Sheriff Vesey. The telegraph had been quicker than the runaway's short legs. In the sheriffs buggy Charles was restored to farm life. There he remained until the first serious mutterings of war. Charles had organized 'Murray's flying artillery' company, the 'artillery' consisting of a cast iron cannon about a foot long and the 'company' of two boys besides himself. Some three years later the three boys fought side by side in the Rebellion.

Two years before this, however, the restless farm boy again stole away from home, this time successfully evading recapture, and finally winding up near Fort Wayne, where he subsequently enlisted in the 30th Indiana. He participated in all the hard marching of the Army of the Cumberland until left for dead on the bloody field of Murphysboro. At that time he was the youngest and smallest soldier of his brigade, and generally known as the 'little corporal.' His third 'French leave' was from a field hospital, where he was being exhibited as a 'remarkable case': and he was carried to his regiment by chance comrades guarding a passing wagon train from Nashville. At the regiment he found an order from the Secretary of War sending him home.

At the seige of Corinth he had met his father, the latter having serven three months with Milroy and joined the 48th as quartermaster. One early morning, after being half drowned the night before in the overflowed rifle pits under the big guns of Corinth, his detail was returning to camp when a soldier from a different command recognized him. It was one of the ancient 'flying artillery.' He laughed with the rest, who were jeering the mud-bedraggled boys, but incidentally remarked that the quartermaster over in Pope's division looked quite as bad. An hour later an orderly arrived to take Charles to his father and there, the latter and his son were reunited for five minutes. Then the muddy old Murray mounted his mule for Pittsburg Landing and the muddy young Murray returned to his command.

At the expiration of his furlough Charles was detailed as orderly to the commandant at Indianapolis, where he served till mustered out of the regiment. In the very beginning he saw that his lack of education had relegated him to a lowly place-and he felt this more keenly than physical suffering. His disability debarred him from farm labor-his ignorance closed other avenues. He started out at once to remedy this by going to night school business college, and study by day in his orderly chair at headquarters.

As soon as he was discharged he took his arrears of pay and bounty money and entered the preparatory department of the State University at Bloomington, Ind. - at 21 Years of age.

Early in this period of his life he developed a yet unknown talent for literary work. In his preparatory year his poems, essays and sketches attracted the attention of the faculty and secured him a place of honor among the higher students and post graduates. He became secretary, then president of one of the two literary societies before getting into the college proper; was unanimously chosen by his class in champion prose and poetical composition against the entire college, law students and post graduates inclusive; was made editor of the secretly produced college paper.

After a few months rest he accepted an appointment in the Treasury Department at Washington under Secretary McCullough. He at once entered the Columbia Law school, for night classes, and, receiving his degree, was admitted to the bar of the District Supreme court.

But the idea of becoming a lawyer gave way to the hereditary lure of the From writing letters to the Indianapolis News he gradually became Absorbed in journalism, and his humorous Washington stuff to the Danbury News attracted wide attention. He soon resigned his government clerkship, retired from the presidency of the Indiana Republican club, and returned to run a democratic newspaper in South Bend. The Herald was a hot paper in a hot town and young Murray was in hot water from the start. For he was an aggresswriter like his father, who was then publishing the Goshen Democrat. The Murrays, father and son, headed their respective delegations to the Indianapolis convention that nominated 'Blue Jeans' Williams for governor. style of young Murray involved him in no end of fights, libel suits and, finally, resulted in his being shot through the lungs by a justice of the peace named The victim of this cowardly assault fell backward downstairs. He was borne to the nearest drug store, a silk handkerchief passed through his lungs and was pronounced as good as a dead editor. When he recovered consciousness his ante-mortem statement was taken, and his obituary appeared in the next morning's issue of The Herald. This was 23 Nov 1875.

But Mr Murray's interesting career had scarcely begun. In a serial entitled 'The Autobiography of a Pair of Pistols' opening in the first issue of the New York Sunday World in its new building, Mr Murray later used the South Bend episode. The Herald not proving a success financially Mr Murray returned to Washington newspaper work. On a fishing trip in West Virginia (near the picture-esque spot he subsequently made his home) he began his first novel. 'Sub Rosa,' a story of Washington life. He then became managing editor of 'Brick' Pomeroy's Democrat at LaCrosse, Wis. Murray was a writer after 'Brich's' own heart, and having left him in full charge with the instruction to 'keep things hot' Pomeroy went off to Denver. Within a week the owner of the paper was violently assaulted, inside of a month had been shot at twice. Then the young proprietor suggested that things be 'toned down a little' until 'Brick' got back to take his own medicine.

'Sub Rosa was a biting satire on Washington social and official life. It ran through eight editions. About the time of its appearance the author was doing literary work on Ramsdell's Republic and was that writer's assistant on the Philadelphia Times and St. Louis Globe Democrat. He was also earning the ridicule of his associates in practicing the art of dictation. His excuse was that once choosing a profession a man should equip himself to conduct it in the most efficient manner in all emergencies.

The result of this self-training was that when his employer broke his leg at the very beginning of the Garfield emergency Mr Murray conducted that heavy work with such distinguished ability that he was made regular Washington correspondent not only of the papers mentioned but of the Pittsburg Dispatch and Charleston News and Courier, with liberal office expenses and assistance. Such was the demand for his pen that a single manifold letter (through one of his stenographers) brought him an average of \$25 a week. The report of Guiteau's pistol had aroused the whole newspaper world to frenzy. It also plumped Murray into some \$200 a week and at the top of his profession. He still holds the record for the greatest and most voluminous report ever sent over the wiresthat or the Guitean trial and conviction of which eleven columns of solid non-pareil in a single night through the Western Union to the Globe-Democrat.

With all this success Mr Murray yearned for something beyond ephemeral new-spaper fame. His notable achievements were in the handling of great events, descriptive work, a keen analysis of important legislation and motives of the political leaders of the day- the broader view of governmental movement. For him the petty local affairs, small appointments, departmental rulings, and trotting after small congressmen for district gossip was intolerable.

All of his personality at Washington went to the elevation of his profession. He was the organizer of the famous Gridiron club, selected its original membership, carried it financially to stability, and, with the late John Chamberlin, arranged its early dinners no vaudeville was introduced-the quality of the dinners alone drew the envious attention of the bonvivants. Distinguished men did not disdain to angle for invitations. Congressmen who had enjoyed the newspaper board gave a return dinner- a grand affair with eighty members of the House and Senate present. Vice President Hendricks and Samuel Randall were once Mr Murray's personal guests; also the secretary of state 'Tom'

Bayard, Phil Sheridan, 'Tom' Reed, and many other distinguished public men with whom he had intimate relations.

In the summer of 1885 Mr Murray threw up his Washington work, wrote a serial called 'Summer Girls,' and went to Europe. The small Goshen boy who secretly departed barefooted in the night with his loaf of bread, brass watch and dime to see what the rest of the world was like was now on his way. While abroad he traveled in England, France, Italy, Germany, Austria, Holland and Belgium, writing syndicate letters by the way. Upon his return he became interested in a patent, moved to New York and lost all he had accumulated by newspaper and Going back to the only business for which he was fitted by literary work. training he set up an office on upper Broadway and entered the competitive field of general syndicate and dramatic presswork. The character of his short stories attracted the attention of the New York Herald and he was soon engaged on that great journal exclusively. His extraordinary versatility gave him wide range from humorous paragraphs of city life, theatrical sketches, local politics, national compaigning on the road, short stories special correspondence from Washington on tariff, finances, etc. His special work on the Silver Repeal debates won him the complimentary resolutions of the New York Chamber of Commerce. At the in auguration of Cleveland he had twentyeight columns in one issue of the Sunday Herald at \$8 a column, his expenses It was the work he loved and could best perform. When they wanted him to make police court sketches, however, he refused, and was promptly 'fired.' He had spent twenty-five years in journalism with out having anything to do with police, crimes and criminals and declined to begin that branch now.

He was sent to Albany for a week with the Barnum & Bailey show and enlivened a Sunday page with such effect that McClure's Syndicate put him out on the road with the big snow for a special article. The following winter his growing nomadic tastes were further encouraged by regular advance work of a theatrical company that covered more than a score of states. During this he wrote stuff on show life that made him an authority and opened magazine work. The next season he put in with Barnum & Bailey, writing a circus story entitled 'A Modern Gypsy.' When the big show went abroad Mr Murray was sent with it by McClure's and the N Y World. He had an artist and went with the animal ship and performers.

When the show had opened in London our literary nomad started for Paris. He went straight to the heart of the Latin quarter and established himself in a small flat 'en garcon.' From this point of view he wrote syndicate letters on Parisian life, mastered the language and gathered material afterward to appear in 'Mile Fouchette,' Lippencott's. He joined the student mobs in the Zola-Dreyfus riots, danced at the Bal Burllien and took his beer with the grisettes in front of the cafes of Boulevard St Michel. Keeping away from places where English is spoken, doing his own marketing shopping and housekeeping he rapidly absorbed real every-day humble French life with the language of the country. His estimate of French character as set forth in his novel 'Mile Fouchette is formed from personal contact, not from library information.

Since his retirement Mr Murray made his home in the West Virginia hills, within a few miles of where he once fished while on his first novel. He built an artistic bungalow overhanging a trout stream on the edge of, an isolated mountain village called Wardensville. Here he lived alone for the last ten years, doing his own domestic work and leading the 'simple life.' Incidentally he developed a wild spot into a most beautiful retreat. It is the show place of the village and is

visited by the general public for miles around. During the past he had entertained the young people with dances and dinners and picnics, but the growing infirmities of age have gradually reduced his life to that of a recluse and his place to the designation of 'The Hermitage'.

Among visitors who sought the old hermit in his sylvan retreat one wondered how such a man could be content to thus live apart from the great world of activity.

'Madam,' he replied. 'I'm tired, that's all. My adult life has been in crowds and amid noise and confusion. I've seen all I wish to see, done all I wish to do and now I desire profound rest. I hope never again to see street car, a railroad or steamboat. I know when I've had enough. My ambition has been satisfied. I have not been out of my grounds for more than three years. My only wish is to live like a gentleman and die like a soldier. Let me just curl up here on the bosom of Nature.'

And when that time comes, he wrote his brother Gordon Murray, of Nappanee, he hoped to lie in the old Goshen burying ground with his early playmates and his comrades of the glorious 30th Indiana. The only one of his family born in Goshen he would return to the land of his nativity and begin his eternal sleep where his life began.





In 1888 Mr Murray purchased the 'Nappanee News' and continued as editor of this until 1914, when he was appointed postmaster of Nappanee serving in that capacity until 1922. At the end of his second term, he bought the 'Plateau Voice', a small paper published in Colbran, Colo. He continued the publication of this paper until 1926 when he disposed of it and returned to his former home in Nappanee, Ind in Oct of that year. On 12 Dec 1927 Mr Murray was run down by an automobile in Nappanee, from which he never recovered.

Mr Murray was a charter member of the Nappanee Kiwanas Club also of the Knights of Pythias. He was a member of St James Episcopal Church of Goshen, and president of the Men's Fellowship class of the First Presbyterian Church of Nappanee, Ind.

For many years Charles Burleigh Murray occupied a prominent position in the business and social life of Cincinnati. For more than 40 years he was editor and part owner of the Cincinnati Price Current. Following are some excerpts from biographical notes which Mr Murray has written of himself.

'I was six and a half yrs old when my parents removed from Brandon Vermont to New York city in Dec 1843. After something like a year and a half in New York City my father decided to move to Ohio. Soon afterward he located on a farm 26 miles from Cincinnati. In my early boyhood the district school house was more than two miles from our farm home and reached only by forest pathways nearly all the way. Under these conditions I received no school room advantages until attendance one winter at Maineville Academy, two miles away. At the age of 19yrs I was allied with my father in the agricultural and farm affairs on land which he had removed to in 1856 on the west side of the Little Miami river, near Foster's Crossing.'

In Mar 1872 Mr Murray together with a partner issued the first number of their weekly paper - a business paper 'The Cincinnati Commercial Review'. In July 1872 the editor of the Cincinnati Price Current having died; Mr Murray and his partner bought this publication continuing the publication of it with their paper under the name of the Cincinnati Price Current.

Continuing his biographical sketches, Mr Murray goes on to say, 'In 1891 when I had been conducting editorial and statistical work for nearly twenty yrs there was a prospect of a vacancy in the Cincinnati Chamber of Commerce service in the position technically described as Superintendent- the executive secretary. I was tendered the appointment or rather was elected to the position without consultation with me by the Board of Directors...... I had made no application for the position......but my journalistic and statistical work had brought such recognition as to induce those in authority to regard myself as the most fitting for the place. Previous to my appointment as superintendent I was five times elected a member of the board of directors without seeking such appointment. My position in the Chamber of Commerce continued until the end of May 1911 covering a period of a little short of twenty yrs...... In the report

of the President of the Cincinnati Chamber of Commerce appear these expressions. I desire at this time to pay formal tribute to the worth of Mr Murray... for nearly twenty yrs he served the organization faithfully and more than any other one man contributed to its upbuilding and the spread of it's name abroad. He helped to place it in it's commanding position and gained for his work and the work of the Chamber of Commerce a recognition of the utmost importance. The debt to Mr Murray is one that cannot be paid in words'.

In Nov 1896 a daily newspaper at Columbus, Ohio, took occasion to mention my name in connection with a position in President McKinley's cabinet as Secretary of Agriculture. This was followed by complimentary comments by our local morning papers and by various other publications in other cities. In 1912 I offered the Price Current for sale and it passed into the hands of Chicago publishers at the close of that year.'

Dr Joseph H Murray was graduated in 1884 from the Iowa College of Physicians and Surgeons at Des Moines and practiced medicine in Nebraska six yrs preceding his locating in Nampa, Idaho. Here he opened one of the first drug stores and carried on a large practice for a new settlement of some 250 people at that time. Dr Murray has served one term of mayor of Nampa; two terms in the city council, twelve yrs on the school board, city physician for six yrs and served the Oregon Short Line railroad in the same capacity for ten yrs. He was also in the state legislature, served two yrs as Lieut. Colonel on the governors staff and was vice president of the First National Bank.

Defying the old saying that physicians are notoriously good on giving advice but poor on taking it, Dr Murray celebrated his 90th birthday with open house seeing many old friends and patients.

Joseph Howard Murray Jr son of Dr Joseph H and Mary (Robertson) Murray enlisted in and served with the Idaho National Guard, Co B Second Regt from 11 Dec 1911 to 11 Dec 1914 as First Sergeant. On 30 June 1916 he was commissioned 1st Lieut at Boise, in the 2nd Idaho Infantry. On 3 July 1916 he was mustered into the Federal service as 1st Lieut, and attached to machine gun company 11 Nov 1916 and served with the border patrol at Nogales, Ariz to Dec 1916. Returned to Boise Barracks 19 Apr 1916 and subscribed to Federal oath 16 June 1916 and left for overseas 24 Dec 1917. On arrival in France he was attached to headquarters company of 146th field artillery as operations officer serving through the second battle of the Marne Chateau Thierry and the Argonne Muese operations to the signing of the armistice. He then went to Coblentz, Germany with the 146th artillery and died there in the army hospital. His remains were subsequently brought to Nampa for burial.

Louis Ross Murray was born and raised on the old Murray farm nr the old village of Mazon, where his grandfather Jonathan C Murray had settled some 25 yrs previous. Louis R Murray received his early education at nearby rural schools, on completion of which he attended the Northwestern Normal school in Morris, Ill. On returning to the farm in 1881 after his marriage, he settled down there, when in abt two yrs his first wife died. After his second marriage he continued to live on the farm until 1887 when he purchased a mercantile business in Mazon which he successfully conducted for several yrs. While not a politician, Mr Murray was a public spirited citizen and prominent in all affairs for community betterment. He was a life long member of the Methodist church.

Later Mr Murray moved to Chicago and edited and published a trade journal. building up a friendship and business which constantly increased in volume.

Louis R Murray and his brother Frank A Murray took an active interest in this genealogy and were untiring in their efforts in furnishing information on their branch of the family.

Frank A Murray was b and brought up on the old Murray farm nr Mazon where he lived until his parents moved to Mazon in 1880, his father having gone into the grain and lumber business there. He attended the local schools later going to normal schools in Morris and Geneseo, Ill, and business college in Chicago. After his marriage he took a position in the bank in Mazon, but finding indoor work too confining he went back to the farm.

Based on a conversation with a grandson of Calvin Murray together with facts and tradition handed down in other connecting lines of descent, it seems safe to assume that the father of Calvin Murray was a son of Jehiel and Mary (Way) Murray, who was a Tory and joined the British forces when the revolution broke out. As stated on page 7 of this book, one son of Jehiel Murray sided with the British while the rest of the sons tought in the American troops, and the Tory was duly disowned by his father. No record of his given name however has been found.

During the course of a conversation with a grandson of Calvin Murray, the compiler was told that Calvin Murray on his deathbed told his son Jesse, that his father (Calvin's) fought with the British army, but he did not mention his given name. This lines up with what the grandfather of the compiler, who was a grandson of Jehiel Murray, told as having an uncle who was a Tory. Similarity of given names among some descendants of Calvin Murray is another angle which should be considered. No records however have been brought to the compiler's attention to further substantiate this.
