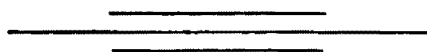

BRIEF BIOGRAPHY OF JOHN MOSS

JOHN MOSS came from London to Philadelphia in 1793 and lived there the rest of his life. He was first a minor merchant. A newspaper, Claypoole's "*American Daily Advertiser*," December 1, 1796, gives his advertisement as a Glass Engraver, and he is so listed in the Philadelphia directories for 1797 and 1799. Beginning 1800 he is listed as a Shop-Keeper and Merchant. Family tradition says that his wife assisted in the shop in the early days. His business increased and he then owned ships trading with Europe, as well as a great deal of Philadelphia Real Estate. In 1814 he purchased the residence 189 Spruce St., where he lived until his death in 1847, and where his widow lived until about 1857. His estate sold the house in 1865. The number was later changed to 625 Spruce St. The house was torn down in 1931. Samuel Moss, brother of John, lived in the next house, 191 Spruce St., later changed to 627 Spruce St. and still standing in 1936.

John Moss was prominent in Philadelphia affairs, a director in several corporations and a member of the City Council. He is said to have caused the erection in 1809 of fountain of a Nymph with a Swan on her Shoulder which stood in front of the Water Works building in Centre Square, now the site of the Philadelphia City Hall. It was a wooden carving by William Rush, a famous carver of figure heads for ships, who later produced many artistic carvings and was highly esteemed as the first American sculptor. The Nymph was afterward moved with the Water Works to Fairmount Park. The wooden carving was decaying, so it was used to make a bronze statue, which still stands in Fairmount Park near the Aquarium and at the base of the cliff on which is located the Philadelphia Museum of Art. It is regarded as a notable work of Art. He also imported from Italy two Marble Lions, copied from Lions carved by Canova for the tomb of Pope Clement XIII in St. Peter's Cathedral, Rome, and about 1835 placed them on the steps of the Merchant's Exchange at Third and Dock Streets, Philadelphia. When this building was remodeled about 1923, the Lions were removed, and they are now on the steps of the Philadelphia Museum of Art in Fairmount Park, on the side opposite the Parkway which leads to the City Hall.

John Moss had a distinctive signature "J. Moss," with the J. joined to the M, with the two s's of the same style (instead of with one double looped s as was the custom of the day), and with a lot of flourishes under the signature. This signature is on his Edouart silhouette, on the portrait in the Ritter book, on the Historical Society letters, on his will and on the administration papers of his father-in-law, Eleazer Lyons.

John Moss was not educated, and this is shown by one of the codicils of his will, written wholly by himself, and by a letter written by him just before his death. The other codicils were written by lawyers and the letters in the Historical Society by secretaries. A family tradition relates that a certain judge often used to consult him, and once remarked, "If he had been educated would he have been so wise?"

REMARKS ON THE GENEALOGY

IN THE FOLLOWING GENEALOGY, the earliest known generation is given the index ¹ which results in an index ⁶ for the generation of adults in 1936. Whenever a woman is referred to, including mention of her marriage, she is always given her full married name, to avoid confusion of sometimes referring to her by her maiden name. All descendants of a person are given immediately following him, then his next brother or sister and so on. Successive children of each generation are given with a distinctive type and a distinctive numeral for that generation as follows:

Generation 3 *I* GREAT GRANDPARENTS
Generation 4 **1** GRANDPARENTS
Generation 5 **I** PARENTS
Generation 6 **1** *Adults in 1936*
Generation 7 **i** CHILDREN
Generation 8 **A** Grandchildren

With a person with several first names, the generation number is placed after the usual first name.

Abbreviations: b-born; m-married; L-living; d-died; dau-daughter; bu-buried; cty-cemetery (cemetery in town of death unless noted). The data were collected as a pastime from family bibles, tombstones, old newspapers and other published records, probate and town records, and personal statements of relatives. Great pains were taken to have everything correct but of course errors may have crept in, and notice of them would be appreciated. The interest of the author in collecting the data did not extend to the recording of the many varied references for it, and carefulness of the author and his informants will have to suffice as evidence of accuracy.

The name of the father of John Moss was Joseph, who probably lived in London, and who had a son Henry, as well as other children in England of whom nothing is known, except their mention in the will of Samuel Moss. There were also sons, brothers of John, named Samuel Moss and Jacob Moss, who came to Philadelphia and who have many descendants. The author has most of their data and hopes

to publish their Genealogies, as well as that of Rebecca (Lyons) Moss, wife of John Moss. The wife of Jacob Moss was Catherine (Lyons) Moss, sister of Rebecca.
