### Copyist's Note.

This "edition" has been copied by Miles O. Price (see page 59, 1.1.5.3.4.) from an original loaned by Miss Frances Emerson, genealogist, of Plymouth, Indiana, an old friend. Although Daniel McDonald, the patriarch of the clans described herein, compiled this history in 1892, much has been added since, some probably by his own hand (he lived and was active for many years after 1892), and more, certainly, by others.

The aim of the present copyist is (1) to provide for his own daughter an authentic record of part of her paternal background, from which she is geographically separated, while such a record is still available and while professionally active old friends, such as Miss Emerson, are available back in Plymouth, Indiana, who know me and my family; and (2) to bring it up to date as to the posterity of Mary Jane Dickson, my mother.

I have always been proud of my Scots-Irish ancestry, and of its part in the establishment of our nation and the settlement of Indiana and Ohio; a pride which I hope my daughter and her posterity will keep alive.

Physically, this copy, as is evident to the eye, is an amateur job, the mimeograph stencils having been cut by a typist (myself) unfamiliar with this art. However, it is believed that it is legible. Inconsistencies of style and typography are those of the original, the text of which was scrupulously followed. However, following my Scots ancestry, I have frugally filled each stencil page, thereby placing many more words on the page than in the original. On the other hand, because copies of the original are on file in many genealogical libraries, including that of the Daughters of the American Revolution, in Washington, D. C., and are cited in applications for membership in patriotic societies, the original pagination has been preserved throughout. Thus, this copy has no pagination of its own, but does, by the "star paging" device familiar to the reader of reprints of old law reports, preserve the original paging. For example, page 5 of the original copy starts with the heading "The McDonalds" and ends in the middle of a sentence with the word "letter," and page six begins with the word "from."

In citing this copy, always cite the original pages as given, but for accuracy, note that it was taken from the mimeographed copy.

### EXPLANATORY.

For convenience, the relationship has been divided under four different heads, and each of these is numbered 1. Their names are as follows:

The posterity of each of these four branches follow each other in regular succession until that branch runs out, and each one is numbered in succession, so that each person whose name appears in this record can trace his genealogy without difficulty to the original head as given above, which is as far back in each case as it has been possible to go with any degree of certainty.

To illustrate: turn to Elizabeth Helen McDonald, daughter of Platt McDonald. The number preceding her name is 1-1-1-3-2. That means that she is the second child of the third child of the first child of No. 1, who is Enos McDonald. To illustrate further: 1.1.1.3.2. Elizabeth Helen McDonald. Drop the figure 2, which leaves 1.1.1.3. Turn back to 1.1.1.3. and it is found that that number is Platt McDonald, who is the father of Elizabeth Helen. Now drop the figure 3 and the number remaining is 1.1.1. Turn back to 1.1.1. and it is found that that number is Thomas McDonald, who was the father of Platt McDonald. Now drop the last figure 1. and 1.1. remain. Turn to 1.1. and it is found to be Daniel McDonald, who was the father of Thomas McDonald. Now drop the last figure 1, and only 1. remains. Turn to 1. and it is found to be Enos McDonald, father of Daniel McDonald. In this illustration the record stands as follows:

Showing that Elizabeth Helen is the second child of the 3d child of Thomas McDonald who was the first child of Daniel McDonald, who was the first child of Enos McDonald.

Where the number of children is over 9, the Roman numerals are used to designate them as in the name of Thomas McThompson, tenth child of Martha McDonald Thompson.

To ascertain the relationship of any given person on the other side of the house, find the grand father or grand mother, as the case may be, and trace back as in the first instance.

The McDonalds.

McDonald is one of the most prominent, and represents the most numerous clan in Scotland. Originally the name was "Donald" and many still cling to that name. Mc is an abbreviation of Mac, which is said to mean "son." So for instance when a Donald had a son he was called Mac, and finally came to be known as MacDonald, which meant he was the son of Donald. Son was sometimes added as a suffix and then the name became Donaldson. Those who may be interested in the history of the McDonalds of Scotland, from which all the McDonalds in America sprang, are referred to "Tales of a Grand Father," by Sir Walter Scott.

Enos McDonald, our great-great-grandfather, emigrated from Scotland about the year 1750 and settled in Nottingham Tp., Washington Co., Penn., where he remained until about 1800, when he removed to Butler Co., Ohio, where he probably died. The only information I have been able to get upon which any reliability can be placed is contained in a letter

from Mr. Andrew McDonald of Kammerer, Penn., in reply to a letter of inquiry on the subject. Among other things he says:

"I have in my possession the old docket of Nottingham Tp. which bears the date of Feb. 21, 1791, and which contains a complete list of all taxables and voters to the year 1801. In referring to the same I find that Enos McDonald was a voter and taxpayer from 1791 to 1800, when his name is dropped from the list. It seems that he was quite a prominent man in the Township in his day, as the book shows him to have served as Constable and Supervisor for a number of years and was also one of the largest taxpayers. One of my neighbors, Samuel Davis, who is now seventy years old, says he has many times heard the old people talk about Enos McDonald. I will transmit to you one of the pages that has become loose from the old docket where the name Enos McDonald appeared as Supervisor, and his name is listed among others for taxables, which is computed in Pounds, shillings and pence. This leaf is for the year 1797

The record as shown by the leaf is handsomely done with a goose quill pen. The amount of taxes charged to him was 2 lb, 8 s. 5d. which in our money would be about \$12.00. This is all the information I have been able to obtain.

McDonalds.

Daniel McDonald, son of Enos, was my grandfather, was born in Washington Co. Penn., in 1785. He had two sisters, named Rachel and Leah. They both married about the same time and both died about six weeks later within a week of each other, probably in Butler Co., Ohio. Their mother, widow of Enos McDonald, afterward married Abraham Crum by whom she had several children. Abraham, Dr. Peter Crum, etc., were half brothers of Daniel McDonald. Margaret Crum Logan, wife of Henry Logan, was a sister of these Crums and half sister to Grand father Daniel Mc Donald, who moved to Butler Co., Ohio, about 1800, where he married Catherine Logan in 1806. About 1850 he moved to Rush Co., Indiana, where he died

Oct. 30, 1822. His last will and Testament was the first recorded and probated in Rush Co. In substance it was as follows:

"In the name of God, Amen. I Daniel McDonald, of Rush Co., Union Tp., being weak in body but of sound and perfect mind and memory, do make and publish this my last will and Testament, in manner and form following; that is to say: I give and bequeath unto my beloved wife, Catherine McDonald, sixty acres of land, together with all my household goods, debts and movable effects: To my son Thomas, sixty acres of land, and to the other children in like proportion."

He appointed his wife, Catherine, sole executrix. The will was dated Nov. 2, 1822, and witnessed by John Morris, John Houghton and R. Blakely. He is said to have been, by those who knew him, a man of pleasant disposition, a moral and upright man of sterling qualities. He was tall, with blue eyes, light complexion, smooth shaven and would weigh about 175 pounds. He is said to have died of lung disease.

1.1.1. Thomas McDonald, my father, and oldest son of Daniel, was born in Butler Co., Ohio, and when young settled with his parents in Rush Co., Ind., but later moved to Fayette Co., where he remained until 1836.

At that time he settled in Marshall Co., where he resided continuously until his death, March 6th, 1875. He assisted in the organization of the county and taught one of the first schools of the county. Among the official positions which he filled in the county were, County Commissioner, Land Appraiser (two terms), Auditor (2 terms of 4 years each), County School Examiner and County Supt. of Schools, which office he held at the time of his death. He was the founder of the Marshall County Democrat, now the Plymouth Democrat, and was for many years its editor. A brief biographical sketch of him and his wife (our mother), with portraits may be found in a "History of Marshall County" by the witer of this, published in 1881. Daniel McDonald, the compiler of this history, resides in Plymouth, Indiana, and was for many years editor and publisher of the Plymouth Democrat. He served in two sessions of the Indiana Legislature and two terms of upwards (eight years and seven months), as Clerk of Marshall County, and has held many other positions of honor and trust in fiscal and social organizations. His life has been a busy one, and such, as he believes, as to reflect no discredit on the family name.

His son Louis, was connected with the publication of the Plymouth Democrat all the time that his father was editor, and as its business manager for many years, proved himself a good business man and won the respect and esteem of its patrons and the best citizens of Marshall County.

Platt McDonald in early life learned the printer's trade and was one of the founders of the Plymouth Democrat in 1855, and later was owner, editor and publisher for several years. He also was editor and publisher of the Rochester Sentinel for a year or two while publishing the Plymouth Democrat. In 1862 he re-established the La Porte Democrat at La Porte, Indiana, and continued the paper for three years. His last newspaper work was as editor of the Enterprise at Torreon, Old Mexico, a position he held for two years. Since 1879 he has employed most of his time in mining in Colorado, New Mexico and Old Mexico. His home is in Chicago, where he resides when not engaged in mining. His son, William Lane, who is a civil engineer, makes his home in Chicago, when not employed in his profession. His daughter, Elizabeth Helen, was married to Thomas W. Gilmore, a business man of Chicago, Dec. 1, 1894, and they have since made their home in Chicago.

John McDonald died of consumption. He was a practical printer and for a year or two was owner and editor of the Plymouth Democrat. He was tall and slender, had dark hair and sparkling black eyes; was a fine musician, full of life and mirth, and was a bright, intelligent, congenial companion. He went through life scattering sunshine along his path.

Phoebe and Jane both died young, before their characters had been formed.

Catherine McDonald (afterward Cleveland) was born in Marshall County, Ind., and all her life resided there. She was a cheerful disposition, even under trying circumstances, as her later years of life proved. She was a fine singer and in every walk of life a true and noble woman.

1.1.4. Samuel McDonald settled in Marshall County in 1836, where he resided until his death. During his life he filled several positions of honor and trust; was a pleasant, congenial neighbor and friend, and passed away with the respect of all who knew him.

As to his ancestors or brothers or sisters, it has been impossible to gain any information. It is probable, however, that Enos was the only one of the family that came to America.

#### The Logans.

1. Patrick Logan, the elder, emigrated from Ireland in his youth, and finally settled in Washington Co., Pa., where he married Nancy Sally Harper, of whom nothing definite is known except that she was born in 1763 and died in 1800. Patrick Logan was a full blooded Irishman, a man of intelligence, of great force of character and possessed many of the characteristics of his countrymen. He was a private soldier in the War for Independence and was a patriotic, law abiding citizen. He was a weaver by trade and followed that occupation to a greater or less extent while he lived. The last years of his life were spent with his daughter Catherine, in Rush County, Indiana, after the death of her husband, Daniel McDonald. Patrick Logan was the progenitor of all the Logans related to the McDonalds and others whose names are contained in this record. He died January 17, 1828.

1.8. Henry Logan, the eighth child of Patrick Logan, was the best known among the kinfolk generally of any other member of the family. Except Thomas, all the other brothers died as far back as 1820-34. He was probably born in Washington Co. Pa., Jan. 10, 1783, and was married to Margaret Crum in 1807. In 1812 he united with the Christian Church, afterward known as the "Old Christian" or "New Light" Church, in which he soon became an ardent exhorter. Not long after, he was sent as a missionary to preach to the Shawnee Indians, then located near the present site of the city of Muncie, as he understood fairly well the language of that tribe. Upon his arrival at the house of the Chief, which was built of logs, and not having previous notice of his coming, the Indians went in every direction among the lodges to give notice that there would be a preaching at the chief's house that night. By some means, a keg of powder, said to have contained 32 pounds, was exploded by some Indian boys setting fire

to it. One of the boys was blown to atoms. The roof was blown off the house and three of the five persons in the room were killed instantly, Uncle Henry being one of the survivors but in a madly mangled and suffering condition. Several of the swiftest runners among the Indians were dispatched to the white settlements; a doctor was secured and he was finally restored to health and to his family and friends. About 1833 he joined the reform movement, generally known as the "Campbellites." Being ordained an evangelist, he continued to preach the doctrines of that denomination until the year 1843, when he united, as did most of the members of the church to which he belonged, with the "Adventists," in which faith he continued to preach and labor until he died. He was a faithful, Christian man, of more than ordinary ability, and left pleasant memories clustering around his name which will abide so long as his posterity survives.

Thomas Logan, brother of Henry, was a farmer and physician, an honorable and upright man. He died in 1849, loved and respected by all who knew him.

1.1. Rachel Logan, who married John Houghton, and Catherine, who married Daniel McDonald, were women of more than ordinary intelligence. They were both devoted Christians, and it is said that they could make a prayer or exhortation equal to any of the local preachers of those days. They were model women in the family, in the Church, and in all the walks of life, and the recollection of their life work will ever be a bright page in life's memories.

Of Mary Logan the writer has been unable to get any definite information. She was first married to a Mr. Stoughton, by whom she had one child. After his death she was married to John Brown, by whom she had a large, intelligent and in every way respectable family. Of the posterity of these children, of whom there are many, it is not necessary to speak, as I have not the data from which to speak advisedly. Most of them are living and their life work is not yet done.

She is a devout member of the Christian Church, well versed in the Scriptures and on general topics, and is a most excellent and exemplary woman in every respect. Her sisters

Zenobia Russell and Catherine Corbin, were bright, intelligent women, about whom only good can be said. They spent the greater part of their lives in Plymouth, where they died several years ago.

James E. Houghton was a Lieutenant in the Army and served with distinction during the War of the Rebellion. He was at one time Post Master at Bourbon, Ind., and later Mail Messenger from Chicago eastward. His later years were spent in Plymouth, Indiana, where he died several years ago.

## The Dicksons.

Christopher Dickson was born, or settled, in the State of New Jersey, about 1750, and was married probably about 1775, to Mrs. Phebe-Lewis Bayless, whose name was perpetuated in his son, Platt Bayless Dickson; in his daughter, Phebe Lewis Dickson, and in his son, Bayless Lewis Dickson. The son of Christopher Dickson, Platt B. Dickson, was the only child of whom anything definite is known. He had a son, Elias, who was killed by the fall of a tree, where Cincinnati now stands.

Platt B. Dickson was born in the state of New Jersey, Jan. 12, 1780, where he resided until he was about fifteen years old, when he and his brother, Elias, went down the Ohio River, finally settling in the village of Cincinnati, which at that time had about 500 inhabitants. They bought four acres of land near where the Cincinnati Post Office now stands, for the sum of \$14.00. While cutting some timber with which to erect a cabin, Elias was caught by a falling tree, breaking his back, and killing him.

instantly. Platt B., being left alone, sold his four acres for \$100 and went into Butler County, Ohio, near Middletown, where he married Elizabeth Brownlee, and settled down to the realities of Pioneer life. Here they remained until most of their children were born, when they settled in Preble Co., Ohio. In 1813 they moved to Fayette Co., Indiana, where they remained until 1836, when they settled in Marshall County, where they remained until the end of their lives. Platt B. was six feet in height, of slender build, erect and precise in his movements. He was a farmer all his life. He was a good neighbor, a kind and indulgent husband and father, and a man of whom nothing but good could be said. He died at the home of his son, Hugh B., in Plymouth, Indiana, Dec. 12, 1855, respected by all who knew him.

The family of Platt B. Dickson consisted of eight children, four males and four females, all of whom have passed beyond. The first born were Elisabeth and Phebe, twins.

Elizabeth, mother of the writer, married Thomas McDonald, and Phebe married Lewis Thompson. After the death of Elizabeth Dickson McDonald and Lewis Thompson, Phebe Thompson and Thomas McDonald were married. During their early childhood these women favored each other so much that strangers could not tell one from the other. They were accomplished singers, and they had no equals in all the country around about, in the rendition of the popular music of those days. They were both members of the Christian Church and lived lives void of offense toward God and man. Their memories will ever remain fresh and green with all who knew them.

Bayless Dickson was a preacher in the Old Christian Church. He was a good singer, an enthusiastic revivalist and accomplished much good in his day and age.

John and Elias were farmers and men of extensive reading, and well informed on general subjects. They were men of excellent character, and passed away with the respect

of all who knew them.

Jane died young, and Sophia in 1879. Sophia was tall and slender, with dark features and piercing black eyes. She raised a large family and passed to her final reward without an enemy, so far as is known. Her children were raised to manhood and womanhood near Maxinkuckee Lake.

John B. Dickson had several children, all of whom have passed away except Elizabeth and Nancy Eldora.

Of the children of Phebe Dickson Thompson, Alexander C. Thompson resides in Plymouth, Indiana. He was elected Auditor by the Democrats and served three terms -- twelve years. He established the Huntington Democrat, and was for some time -- in 1860-1861 -- Editor of the Plymouth Democrat.

William D. Thompson, now deceased, was Justice of the Peace, and also served two terms as Township Trustee of Center Tp., Marshall County, Ind.

Julia A. Harsch lives in South Bend with

Hugh B. Dickson was for many years engaged in the hardware business in Plymouth. He also assisted in establishing the Marshall County Democrat. He was for many years state agent for the Oliver Chilled Plow Works of South Bend, and afterward established the largest storage and transfer establishment in Indianapolis. His eldest son, Nathan, resides at Plymouth, and his daughter, Lulu Dickson Goode, resides at Indianapolis, Ind.

### The Brownlees.

The present generation of Brownlees descended from Scotch ancestors, of whom Lord John Brownlee born 1695, and his sons, Thomas and John, are as far back as any record could be found.

The estate having fallen to Thomas, as eldest son, in 1760, Archibald, his son and the eldest, and six sons, left Scotland for America, taking James, a lad of fifteen, with them. In a storm that overtook them, the youngest son of Archibald, Hugh, a boy of seven, was washed overboard and drowned.

The Brownlees settled first in Exeter, Pa., but about 1765 located in Washington Co., Pa.

In 1771 James married a Scotch-Irish girl, Jean Rankin, who bore him three sons and two daughters.

From 1800 to 1810 the families traded largely along the Ohio and Mississippi Rivers, loading a fleet of barges at Pittsburg and Cincinnati, with pork, salt, flour and corn.

With their cargoes, they slowly descended the rivers during the spring, supplying the various towns along the course, ending at New Orleans by selling the remainder of their produce, with the boats, and returning on horseback across the country.

About 1809 John, the eldest son, married in Louisiana and never returned. His descendants are now scattered over Mississippi, Louisiana and Texas.

James Brownlee was of a commanding presence, fully six feet four in height and weighing 220 pounds. He had strong features, dark hair and eyes, and was a giant in strength. A rigid Covenanter, he was scrupulously exact in his dealings, and a devout Christian to the last. He died at the home of his son Hugh, at a good old age, yet erect and with firm step even to the last year of his life. His wife, Jean, died in Penna. about 1783, and was buried near Canonsburg. There were five children born to them, the last being James, in 1781, who about 1813 removed to Fayette Co., Indiana, and in 1815 married Kate Ewing. She died in 1854 in Marion, Ind.

He was as large as his father, very portly and with strong common-sense ideas. He was a member of the first convention at Corydon that organized Indiana as a state, and his oldest son, John, was born while he was absent at the convention. For several years preceding his death he was an associate judge of one of the Circuit Courts of Indiana.

Of the older Brownlees, James Brownlee resided many years in Marion, Ind., where he practiced law. He died several years ago. He served nearly ten years as Auditor of his county and was also Treasurer one term. He was a pleasant, intelligent gentleman, thoroughly respected in the community where he lived.

Hugh Brownlee and Johnson Brownlee died many years ago. Hugh was a farmer all his life, until he retired from labor. In politics he was a Republican, and in religion a Methodist.

He was a quiet citizen, honorable and upright in all the walks of life.

Johnson was a tailor by trade, later a dry goods and general merchant; was Recorder of Marshall County one term of four years. He was a very industrious, sprightly business man. He was an active working Democrat. He belonged to no church.

Elizabeth Brownlee, deceased, resided in Marion, Indiana. She was the mother of a family of eight, who grew to be intelligent men and women, one of whom, James C. Neal, was a physician and Director of the Government Experimental Station at Stillwater, Okla.

Thomas C. Neal is a Methodist preacher in Indiana.

Hiram Brownlee is a lawyer of ability and has several times represented his County (Grant) in the Lower House of the Indiana Legislature as a Republican.

#### Conclusion.

The foregoing contains in brief all the information I have been able to gather in relation to the posterity of the four branches of the "Family Tree" of which I am an obscure branch.

As to the matter contained in this genealogical record, there will, no doubt, be found many errors of omission and commission. Many who read these sketches, and know all about the facts attempted to be recorded, will observe these errors and wonder why they were made. Early recollections have been found to be very imperfect, and the family record in many instances was, or had been, lost. Many letters asking for information were written, to which no answers were returned. Having exhausted every source of information within my reach, I submit the result of my labors to my relatives, for whom it is intended, with the hope that it will be the means of stimulating greater care in preserving dates and biographical sketches of the various branches of the family tree and that it will be preserved and handed down from generation to generation for all time to come.
