John Satterfield came into court and was examined concerning John Marshall's dec'd last will and said that he lost it out of his possession and that he supposed it to be stolen.

1785, Mrs. Tabitha Marshall returned on oath her account as guardian to her children (to wit) Peggy, Charles, Matthew and William.

John Marshall and William Marshall attended Warrenton Academy 1809-1810. (Prob. Charles Marshall's sons).

William White, Edgefield Co., S. C., appointed William Marshall of Granville Co., N. C., his attorney, to act for him as executor of the estate of John Marshall. (William White was John Marshall's son-in-law.)

John Marshall owned 34117 A of land when his estate was settled, 6856 A in Sumner Co., Tenn., 7669 A in Granville Co., N. C., 10,001 A in the western waters, the remainder was probably in Warren and Franklin Co. (Bute then) N. C. and Brunswick Co., Virginia.

John Marshall's personal property was valued at 2298 L - 19 s - 9 d, but since it was valued at 6 d to the dollar, the actual valuation was \$91,959.

The Colonial Records mention Court Martial of a John Marshall of Warren County. He was not our ancestor who died in 1781. This John Marshall disappeared and the authorities were still looking for him in 1787. (Don't relax, he could have been an uncle (?))

John and Tabitha Marshall had five sons. William, Dixon and Charles, with some of their descendants, are accounted for. Although I don't know Matthew's descendants, I know he remained in Warren Co. I have no records of John after the estate was divided. Dixon Marshall, in a letter written to his son-in-law and included in this record, said he stopped at Grant Allen's, (his brother-in-law's), and that John Marshall's wife died there while he was there. John Marshall was not of age in 1782 and at his age 1785, he would hardly have been in a position to commit the crime with which this man was charged. This John was "charged with having committed frauds upon the treasury of the state and being concerned with procuring fraudulent accounts to be passed the Commissioner of Army Accounts." He "fled from the state and removed his property therefrom."

If he should prove to be our uncle, we may console ourselves with the fact that most families have a "bar sinister" somewhere along the line; besides he has no lineal descendants in this record.

Tabitha Dixon Marshall was the daughter of Mary or Molly Mason, said to be a relative of John Young Mason, Secretary of the Navy, 1844-1845 and 1846-1849, who was perhaps the only man in history to hold three different cabinet posts, Secretary of the Navy, Secretary of State and Secretary of War.

John Marshall, who married Tabitha Dixon Marshall, was said to be



<sup>2nd cousin</sup>  
a relative of Chief Justice John Marshall. He couldn't have been a descendant because he was married before Chief Justice John Marshall was born. The Chief Justice John Marshall was born in 1755 and died in 1835. He was for 34 years Chief Justice of the U. S. Supreme Court.

Tamor Duke, wife of William Wortham, was the daughter of William Duke who married Mary Green, daughter of Edward Green and his wife Henrietta Powell of Virginia. Tamor Duke had ten children by William Wortham, then married Edmund Jones, a widower with ten children; they had four children making a family of twenty-four. Tamor Duke's twin sister, Anne, married first John Christmas, second Robert Jones, in whose flower garden Anne Carter Lee, daughter of Gen. Robert E. Lee, was buried.

William Wortham and Tamor Duke were the parents of Nancy Wortham, who married William Marshall. Nancy Wortham and William Marshall were the parents of Mary Green Marshall who married Spottswood Burwell.

According to the First Federal Census, 1790, William Duke owned 53 slaves. He was the seventh largest slave holder in Warren Co. at that time.

#### LIEUTENANT DIXON MARSHALL, REVOLUTIONARY OFFICER OF WARREN COUNTY

Lieutenant Dixon Marshall of Warren County was the son of John Marshall, wealthy planter and slave owner of Bute County. Although his father's division of personal property was recorded in Warrenton showing that his home was in that county, (Bute then) an inventory of John Marshall's land signed by Dixon Marshall in Oxford showed that he also owned 7670 acres of land in Granville County, 6856 acres in Sumner County, Tennessee, 10,001 acres on the western waters, and 9591 elsewhere, a total of 34,117 acres.

Lieutenant Marshall, who was born August 10, 1753, was given his mother's maiden name. His maternal grandmother was Mary Mason from Virginia. His brothers were John, William, Matthew, and Charles; his sisters were Tabitha, who married Captain Grant Allen, Mary, who married John Wortham, Peggy, who married Richard Tunstall, Mrs. Richard Moore, and Mrs. William White, wife of Captain William White of Edgefield County, South Carolina. His wife Lucie Nichols, was the daughter of Julius Nichols of Abbeville District, South Carolina. (Julius Nichols was prominent in Bute County before his removal to South Carolina). Lieutenant was a Mason member of Blandford Lodge, Warren County, North Carolina.

Dixon Marshall was an Ensign in Thompson's Company, March 28, 1777. He was in the first regiment of which Rev. Adam Boyd was Chaplain. He became Second Lieutenant April 26, 1777. Receiving his commission July 4, 1779. Lieutenant Marshall was one of the Continental officers of the Revolutionary War, who continued to the end thereof. He

was a prisoner at Charleston, May 12, 1780, but was exchanged June 14, 1781.

In payment for services rendered in the Revolutionary War, Lieutenant Dixon Marshall was granted twenty-five hundred acres of land on the Cumberland River in Tennessee. While in Tennessee in the interest of his property, he was scalped by Indians. His death occurred August 22, 1824.

His sword and diamond knee buckles are now in possession of Mrs. Tabitha Reavis of Warrenton, N. C., who is his great granddaughter. Mrs. Arthur Wiggins of Henderson is also a lineal descendant. His daughter, Tabitha, who married Richard Duke had no children. Besides these there are numerous descendants of Lieutenant Marshall's brothers and sisters in Warren, Granville, and Vance Counties. Among them is Thomas F. Wiggins of Henderson, who is a lineal descendant of Mary Marshall, a sister of Dixon's. His brother William Marshall's descendants live in Granville, Vance, Warren and Mecklenburg County, Virginia.

Dixon Marshall was said to be a relative of Chief Justice John Marshall on his father's side through his grandmother, who was Mary or Mollie Mason, he was said to be related to John Y. Mason, Secretary of the Navy.

The following is a copy of an advertisement written by Dixon Marshall:

#### WESTERN LAND FOR SALE

I will sell one thousand acres of land lying in the State of Tennessee, it being the most valuable part of twenty-five hundred acres which was granted for my military services during the Revolutionary War. This tract was among the first locations and lies on the Cumberland River about fifty miles below Nashville, five below Palmyra and is as fertile and all well-watered as any in the State of Tennessee. Any person desirous of purchasing will apply to the subscriber.

Dixon Marshall, Warren County.

June 16, 1804

The following letter was written to his son-in-law, Richard Duke of Warrenton, N. C. The original is in the possession of his great granddaughter.

Clarksville, Tenn.  
September 17, 1820

Sir:

After a tedious and fatiguing journey I have arrived in the region where my business is to be done; though I have not yet done any of it. I apprehend I shall not train so as to cross the mountain before winter which will make it necessary that I should remain in this country 'till spring, the road being very bad I shall not attempt it during the winter.

My health is as good if not better than when I left home save only that the water purges me a little, this however I regard as a small matter.

I passed Grant Allen's where I found all my relations well, except John Marshall's wife who died at Grant's while I was there.

Communicate these circumstances to my family and believe me.

Your friend,  
Dixon Marshall.

(Captain Grant Allen married Dixon Marshall's sister. John Marshall mentioned in the letter was Dixon's brother.)

Judge Cook, son of Charles Marshall Cook, was a descendant of Dixon Marshall's brother, Charles Marshall. The Ben Moore home in Ridgeway was the home of Charles Marshall. This was a hotel or tavern as they were called in those days. Said to be the first house in Warren County to have glass windows.

#### HEITMAN'S HISTORICAL REGISTER OF OFFICERS OF THE CONTINENTAL ARMY

Dixon Marshall (N.C.) Ensign, 1st North Carolina, March 28, 1777, 2nd Lieutenant, April 26, 1779. Taken prisoner at Charleston, May 12, 1780. Exchanged June 14, 1781. Served until the close of the war. Died Aug. 22, 1824.

N. C. Pension Roll. Lieut. Dixon Marshall, Smith Co., Tennessee. \$240 annual allowance. Pension in 1824. Age 72.

In payment for services rendered, Lieutenant Dixon Marshall was given lands in Tennessee by the government at the close of the war. While in Tennessee in the interest of his property, Mrs. Reavis' information is that he was scalped by Indians. His sword and knee-buckles are now in the possession of Mrs. Tabitha Reavis who is his great granddaughter.

Lieutenant Dixon Marshall died Aug. 22, 1824.
