MESSENGER ANCESTRY.

I. Andrew Messenger was one of the founders and first settlers of Greenwich, Connecticut, in 1640. He sold land there in 1648 to Robert Husted. He was granted a house lot in Jamaica in 1655.

On the eleventh of April, 1662, he and his son (son-in-law?) Richard Darling, entered into a contract with the Town, to erect a "minster's house 26 ffoot long & 17 ffoot wide".

In 1663 he was appointed to buy land "off ye indeans."

In 1661 he was one of ten to agree to inform the Governor and Council against Quakers.

His son Samuel Messenger's name first appears in the Town records of Jamaica in 1670.

16 Nov., 1672, Samuel Messenger "in ye North Rydinge of Yorkshire one Long Island" conveys to "widdow Ludloe" (Elizabeth Ludlam) "howes & half lott" which he bought of Daniel Whitehead.

II. Samuel Messenger m. 20 Apr., 1669, Susanna Mills (?) He died 1685, his will was admitted to probate in that year. His widow survived him for several years. She conveys land to Zachariah Mills in 1686 with the consent of the overseers of Samuel Messenger's estate (2 Jam. Rec., 328).

"A second lot layd out to ye wido Messenger, bounded west by ye little plains east Hempstead line" 19 July, 1708 (2 Jam. Rec., 436, 7).

Will of Samuel Messenger of Jamaica.	D. 20 Dec., 1685 P. 2d Tuesday in March, 1685 R. in Liber A of Conveyances, Page 30, Queens County.
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Gives eldest son Samuel 2 acres of meadows and privileges belonging thereto, also house and homestead.

To my other three sons, Andrew, Samuel and John, each an acre of meadow with privileges and my clothing to be equally divided between these sons.

Gives daughter Alice great chest and lesser chest to daughter Susannah. Other goods, iron, pewter and brasse to be equally divided between two daughters and each of the daughters to have a three year old heifer. Corn and provisions on hand to be used for the support of the family.

If wife Susannah sees fit to marry gives her best cow, feather bed and all furniture thereof beside 1/3 of estate.

Daughter Alice a yew, daughter Susannah a lamb and 5 acres of land I bought of my brother (bro-in-law) Zachariah Mills.

Appoints his wife executrix, Zachariah Mills, Ben Jones, Jonas Woods overseers.

Jonas Woods and Richard Jones, witnesses.

Will of JOHN MESSENGER	D. September 15, 1762 P. 1 June, 1765 before Thomas Braine, Surrogate Liber 25, page 69, N. Y. Co.
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In the name of God, Amen. I, JOHN MESSENGER, of Jamaica, in Queens County, Gent., "being far advanced in age, and labouring under many infirmities of a Decaying Body, but Blessed be God, of Sound Mind." I leave to my only son Samuel the dwelling house where I now live in Jamaica, with the orchard adjoining and the use of half of the barn during the term of his natural life. I leave the use of the other half of my barn to my grandson, Samuel Messenger, during the

life of his father. After the death of my son Samuel, I leave all the said house, barn, and orchard to my three grandsons, John, Samuel and William, equally. I leave to my son Samuel and my grandson Samuel my lot of salt meadow lying on Long Neck, in Jamaica, and to their heirs and assigns. I leave to my son Samuel $\frac{1}{2}$ of my movable estate, both within doors and without, except as herein disposed; the other half I leave to my grandson Samuel. I leave to my grandson Samuel the west half of a certain tract or lot of woodland and cleared land which I formerly purchased of Jonathan Dean. Also 16 acres lying on the North Hills in Jamaica. Also $\frac{1}{2}$ of my lot of Fresh meadow lying in Hawtree Neck in Jamaica which I lately bought of the Woodwards. Also all that my certain lot of cleared land of 20 acres lying opposite to the Homestead where I now live on the south side of the main road leading from Jamaica to the Great Plains, "being the lot I purchased of Joseph Smith, commonly called Clerk Smith." I leave to my grandson William the other half of my lot of woodland and cleared land lying on North Hills, in Jamaica, being the east half. Also $\frac{1}{2}$ of the lot of Fresh meadow which I bought of the Woodwards. Also a lot of 18 acres in Jamaica which I formerly purchased of Joseph Smith and Timothy Roads, both of Jamaica, lately deceased, adjoining the land of Samuel Smith, Esq., and Richard Roads. If any of my grandsons should die, the survivors are to have his part. "I leave to my grandson John one bed and furniture, which he now hath in his possession at New York Ferry," also £10 when of age. And my grandson Samuel is to pay to my daughter Abigail £3, and to my grandson, William Barnet, 5 shillings. I leave to my grandson, William Barnet, the money which he hath lately received of William Weatherbee, being my order for £30,

"also my fine gun or Fuzee, which he has long had in his possession, and which cost me £11." My grandson Samuel shall pay to his sister, Rachael Messenger, £3. when she is of age. My grandson William shall pay to his sister Rachel £5. "I leave to my granddaughter Rachel one small trunk, one gold ring, and my Turtle Shell Snuff box set in silver." My son Samuel is to pay all my just debts, and he and my grandson Samuel shall pay all funeral expenses and the proving of this will. "And Samuel shall help his father in bringing up and Schooling my grandchildren William and Rachel." I make my son Samuel, and my grandsons John and Samuel, and my friend John Roads, of Jamaica, mason, executors.

HENDRICKSON ANCESTRY.

The use of the family name was not generally adopted by the Dutch settlers in the Nieuw Netherland until after the 17th century, and this makes it difficult to follow the lines back to the immigrant. Especially is this the case where a family subsequently adopted as a surname the descriptive title used by the Dutch, designating the son or daughter by the father's name, adding the se or sen as in Hendricksen, that is the son of Hendrick.

An Early Will Illustrates:

Appeared before William Bogardus, Notary, November 8, 1683, GERITT HENDRICKSE, dwelling near Stuyvesants Bowery. He leaves to each of his seven children "begotten on the body of his former wife, Margaret Moll, deceased," viz, Henry, Huybert, Johanes, Abraham, Isaac, Margaret and Maria Gerrits, 350 guilders in wampum. He leaves all the rest to his wife Josyntie Thomas, and she is to pay all debts, and to bring up the children begotten by her, viz., Elizabeth and Peter. If the Bowery or Plantation be sold, his wife shall see that the children are put at trades. He makes Hans Kierstede and John Johnson Longstrate overseers.

Witnesses, John Peterse Herring, John Tiebout, William Bogardus.

Endorsed on the will is the approval of his sons Henry Gerrittsen and Abraham Gerrittsen, and Lambert Hessen (?) husband of Margaret Gerritzen. (Not recorded.)

The name of Hendrickson is found in the earliest records of the Dutch Church in Nieuw Amsterdam, Breuckelen and Midwoudt.

In 1698 in a census of the Inhabitants of the Towne of Hempstead we find

A fair deduction from this list would be that Harmon and Margaret Hendrickson had nine children of whom Abraham was next to the youngest.

The will of Harman Hendrickson does not mention all of his children by name, but provides for their support.

Leaves income from entire estate to wife for sustenance and support of family.

Gives three daughters cattle and household goods after wife's widowhood.

The dates of the birth and death of Abraham Hendrickson do not appear in the Jamaica records.

He married, first, Helleche Van Nostrand, daughter of Aaron Van Nostrand and Aeltje van Steenwyck, of Flatbush, L. I., and had children, baptized in Jamaica.

In the name of God, Amen. I, WILLIAM GOULDER, of Jamaica, in Queens County, "being now, and having been for a long time sick." I leave to my wife, Gasenah, £100 and the interest of £150, with the bed, linen, and household furniture commonly kept and used in the west room of my dwelling house. I leave to my daughter Antie, £12. To my son Abraham a horse, and £3 to purchase a new saddle. All my movable estate is to be sold by my executors at a public vendue. I leave to my son Joseph, 2½ acres of my meadow on the Far East Neck at the south end of my meadow next to the bay. To my son Nicholas, £30. To my son Jacobus, £20. To my son Abraham, £10. To my daughter Wyntie, wife of Abraham Hendrickson, £5. All the rest to all my children. My wife and family are to have the use of the farm till sold. I make my friends and neighbors, Elias Baylies, John Baylies, and Richard Everitt, executors.

In the name of God, Amen. I, Abraham Hendrickson, of Jamaica, in Queens County, yeoman, being now far advanced in age, but of sound mind. I leave to Wynche, my dearly beloved wife, the use and profits of all my messuages, tenements, lands, meadows, and real estate, so long as she remains my widow. Also during her life my negro wench named Sarah, and three of my milch cows. At her death to be for my three sons, William, Hendrick, and Isaac. To my wife my best bed and furniture, all my linen, cupboard, warming pan, great chair, and half a dozen common chairs, two pewter platters, half a dozen pewter plates, and two iron pots. All to be in full of her right of dower. The residue of my personal estate to be sold at public vendue, to pay and discharge all my just debts and funeral charges; the overplus, if any, I give to my sons William and Isaac. After the death or remarriage of my wife my son William to have the dwelling house he now lives in and two acres of land adjoining; the land joining to the road, beginning by the land of Nehemiah Everit, then running along the road until it comes to the south side of the garden so as to take in his well; then easterly so far as to contain two acres. To my sons, William and Isaac, all real estate, excepting what I have given to my son William. In consideration of what I have above given to my three sons, William, Hendrick and Isaac, they shall

pay to my son Aaron, £5; to my son John, £60; to my son Abraham, £40; to my daughter Altie, the wife of Peter Vangelder, £5; to my daughter Mercy, the wife of Anthony Vannostrant, £5; to my daughter Heliche, £60; and to my grandson, Simeon Hendrickson, £40. I make my sons, William, Hendrick, and Isaac, executors.

Dated December 28, 1776. Witnesses, James Everit, Samuel Mills, Barnardus Hendrickson, all of Queens County, yeomen.

Hendrick Hendrickson, according to his family Bible, was born 25 Feb., 1742, and died in 1812-3. He married Johanna Hubbard (dau. James Hubbard) 26 May, 1770.

Sons Abraham Hendrickson and James S. Hendrickson to have homestead and half of salt meadow on Amberman's neck, other half having been given to sons Hendrick A. and William L. A small piece of upland is given to 4 sons. To 4 sons a piece of fresh meadow that formerly belonged to John Hagerman, 8 acres.

To Abraham and James S. Hendrickson outdoor movables stock and farming utensils.

Abraham and James S. Hendrickson to pay Adrianor and Catherine Hendrickson \$250 each, and 4 sons to furnish each a mourning suit.

To Hendrick A. and William L. Hendrickson \$500 each.

To Abraham and James S. Hendrickson time of my colored boy James until he arrives at lawful age.

To son Abraham, large clock

To son James S., desk

Wearing apparel to 4 sons

To Abraham and James S. Hendrickson, each 1 bedstead and bedding

To Abraham and James S. Hendrickson, 1 table and half dozen best common chairs and dairy outfit.

Books and silver spoons to all his children.

To daughter Adriana and Catherine one bedstead and 4 beds with bolster, pillows and bedding marked with their names, carpet, looking glass and 8 chairs in west room, best table, blinds, hand-irons, 1 pair candlesticks in west room and best trunk and 1 set of curtains (choice).

Daughters Adriana and Catherine remaining unmarried to have use of west room and bedroom in rear and as much cellar room as necessary, so long as unmarried, but shall not let out said space, they to have living for one year out of the farm.

Remainder to 4 sons.

Household furniture to 8 daughters.

Elizabeth's daughters to get mother's share, to be divided 1 year after my decease.

Four sons executors

Codicil dated 18 January, 1841, gives 3 silver table spoons marked H. I. H. to Hendrick A. Hendrickson. To William L. Hendrickson 6 silver tea spoons marked S. L.

To daughters Adriana and Catherine 6 silver tea spoons marked E. A. H.

To Adriana and Catherine 1 cow, the choice of

the yard and pasturing and wintering on the farm.

To Adriana and Catherine best tea board, best

set of china, stand in west room, cupboard in entry room.

To Adriana and Catherine use of southeast bedroom upstairs, use of enough of garret to set 3 barrels, use of 1/3 garden on the west side, wood sufficient for one fire cut up at door out of property given to Abraham and James S. Hendrickson as long as daughters retain use of west room.

Abraham and James S. Hendrickson to furnish sisters named above shoat each year at killing time weighing not less than 150 pounds, as many eggs as they wish to use, 100 weight of wheat flour as many potatoes and turnips as necessary for their use as long as they retain west room.

Brass andirons, shovel and tongs.

LUDLAM FAMILY.

I. William Ludlam, with his wife Clemence, came from Matlock, Derbyshire, England, to Boston, Massachusetts, in 1640 and removed to Southampton, Long Island, about 1653. He built an extensive flour mill on a small stream nearby, now called Water Mill. He died about 1666. He had seven children.

William Ludlam's will was the first recorded in New York County Surrogate's office, Liber 1, page 1.

Will of William Ludlam	D. April ye 27, 1665. Pr. at the Court of Assizes, November 2, 1667. Liber 1, Page 1, N. Y. Co.
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WILLIAM LUDLAM, Southampton. Leaves to his son Anthony "all my housing and lands at the old ground," and a £50 right of commonage in town of Southampton. Leaves to his son Joseph "my new dwelling-house with two acres of land adjoining, and thirty acres of land adjoining to the mill and mill pond, on the east side of the mill river, and a £100 right of commonage." Leaves legacies to daughters, Grace, Frances, and Mary, also to "eldest child of my son William," "my son Henry's child", "my daughter Grace's child," and to "the eldest child of my daughter Frances." Mentions "a covenant between me and Samuel Davis" concerning use of land. Makes his son Henry executor, and he is to build up the mill, and he is to have half the mill, and his brother Joseph the other half. Also leaves to Henry thirty-six acres of land at the head of the mill-pond.

Quietus granted to Henry Ludlam, of Southampton, as executor of will of his father, William Ludlam, October 5, 1666.

II. William Ludlam, born in England about 1628, died at Huntington about 1667, m. Elizabeth at Southampton, Long Island, ceremony performed by Captain Tappin, magistrate of Southampton, L. I. William Ludlam did not come with his father but later with his sister Grace in ship "Triall" to Boston, Mass., in July, 1648. He went

to Southampton with his father and later removed to Huntington, L. I.

These facts are set forth in a series of depositions made in 1701 for the purpose of prosecuting a claim for property in Matlock, England (see 15 G. R. 93).

The presence of the family in Jamaica is shown in the early town records.
