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INTRODUCTION.

“What’s in a name?” Such was the question put in the mouth of one of his characters by the Great Poet, and he adds as argument, that it is of no consequence. “A rose by any other name would smell as sweet.” On the other side we have the old adage: “Give a dog a bad name and you might as well hang him.”

Man has, from the remotest times, endeavored to preserve his genealogy and the origin of surnames, without any doubt among the Irish, took its rise from its convenience, as an aid to such a desire. Names in most countries were adopted among the lower orders, from a trade, a color, or occupation of some kind; among the aristocracy, from the estate or place, they took their title from. Whereas, in Innisfail the Island of Destiny, names were adopted in accordance with a usage that was much more ennobling in its effects. Our Milesian surnames were assumed to perpetuate the remembrance of some noble ancestor, who by his conduct in war, either by land or sea, or in some other sphere, had acquired eminence. There is nothing accidental in the origin of Irish names, or if there is, an Irishman may be permitted to say it is accidentally on purpose. Here we may be allowed to observe that the growing tendency in this country to alter, shorten or change the orthography of our Irish names is a pity as it defeats the very end of the adoption of such names; and though some may even seek to disguise and unhirbernicise their surnames, they do not succeed as “The scent of the roses hangs around them still.” and they only get laughed at for their pains, by all sensible people.

Irishmen, keep to the time-honored O and Mac the password that proves you to come of the ancient Milesian race.

CHAPTER I. *On Surnames.*

The most ancient surname we have is Neil, in the first generation, McNeil in the second, and O’Neil in the third; the prefix Mac meaning son of, and O, grand son of. This name carries its derivation far into the past, as it is seen to be the name of the second son of Fenius Farsa, King of Scythia, who was the ancestor of Milesius, King of Spain, whose sons and nephew colonized Ireland. Gallamn

was the Scythian name of Milesius, Mileag Espaine or Hispania, shortened into Milesius (the Spanish soldier), is the Latin name and the common name used by his posterity and historians for that gallant soldier and great General.

Next we have another Nial, one of the ancestors of The Hy Nial tribe figuring in the descent on Ireland, made by the sons of Milesius. This Nial was one of the princes with Heremon the eighth son of Milesius, who landed on the north east coast of Ireland. As the expedition was approaching land, the proclamation was made, that whoever first reached or touched the shore should possess it. As he stood by the bulwark of the vessel, his left hand resting thereon, his battle-axe in his right, he suddenly raised the latter and severed his left hand from the arm, dropping the battle-axe, he seized the sinister hand with his dexter and cast it ashore, claiming the reward offered in the proclamation. His descendants afterwards exercised sovereignty over the north of Ireland, and the northern Eoganachts were introduced into the south about A. D. 550. These were a branch of the Hy Nial Tribe being the descendants of Eogan son of Nial Noy Giollach or Nial of the nine Hostages, who was King of Ireland A. D. 379, and from whose time the name Niel was a permanent patronymic. The same fortitude and devotion to the interests of their people, and bravery has in latter generations been displayed in an eminent degree by the descendants of the hero of the bloody hand. Memorably by the celebrated Hugh O'Neil who defended his country against the english usurpers for such a long period.

The ancient banner of the Tribe also preserved the tradition of the bloody sinister hand. It is emblazoned as argent or white, a sinister hand gules which hand is seen in the banner of many of the provincial princes of the Milesian race.

A curious thing was, that it was given as an augmentation of the arms of those Baronets who received the latter rank to encourage the English invasion of Ireland and their establishment there, in order to perpetuate that foreign yoke.

The celebrated Con Kead, Caha or Con of the 100 Battles, whose blood runs in the veins of many Irish families and who was king of Ireland A. D. 148, was one of the principal founders of many families in this tribe

It is supposed that St. Patrick when a youth was captured in one of the raids made into Scotland under the conduct of Nial. The families of this tribe can be seen in the table, showing the Hy Nials. In this table will be noticed the present name and the ancient. The table also shows when a family is an off-shoot of some other of a still older Patronymic.

At first, of course, all the Tribe were known by the name of Nial or Niel, at some time one of these Neils received the name of Sionagh, or The Fox from his wisdom or cunning, in the third generation, the name becomes a Patronymic as O'Sionagh. This shows the custom of the Milesians, when any one distinguished himself, his descendants used his name with the prefix Mac in the second generation, and with the prefix O in the third, meaning grandson of. The McSweeneys were

first O'Niells, secondly, O'Donnells, to show their descent from Donald O'Neil and finally McSweeney from the circumstance of one of the O'Donnells, using a shield on which were emblazoned two sangliers or wild boars, rampant combatant from which he took the nickname of Suibne, then McSuibne, and finally McSweeney.

Again as another instance, there is Buidhill O'Donnell, a great warrior, giving his name to his posterity as O'Buidhill, afterwards O'Boyle.

The most remarkable name in Milesian nomenclature is Siol N. Dala from which the family of O'Daly formed its name. It means offspring of the oath, and is enigmatical, being supposed to refer to an adventure of him who gave his name to his descendants as a distinguishing mark.

O'Dermody means, the descendants of the Dark Dermot.

The Caulfield family were originally Cathmhaoils which was also the patronymic of one of the families of the Dalriatachs, Campbell, who passed into the adjoining territory of Scotland.

The McCauls were originally McGaghwells, but these changes can all be seen in the proper tables.

Next comes the Tribe of Brune, or Brian called Hy Brune, very powerful and numerous in the catalogue of names of families. They are also descendants of Heremon the eighth son of Milesius.

Brian who founded this tribe was the son of Eocha Moy Veagon or Eocha Morgmeodhin and father of Duach Gallach, the first Christian King of Connaught. He reigned about A. D. 400. This clan had several divisions, the most prominent was the Clanna Mulrooney.

The O'Connors were the reigning family of this tribe, and furnished kings both to Connaught and Ireland. The present O'Connor Don of Clonalis is the lineal descendant of the last king of Ireland. As we have commenced with the descendants of Heremon, eighth son of Milesius, we shall continue until we have exhausted the clans or tribes with their families descended from him.

Fiachra, or Fergus, son of Eocha Moy Veagon, founded the tribe called after him, Hy Fiachra.

The kings or princes of Hy Fiachra were the O'Dowd family.

The family called O'Toole was another princely house under the banner of this tribe. They were kings and princes of Imaile.

The tribe had some divisions, principal among which was the Clan Hy Rongally, Chieftains of which were the O'Shaughans.

And now come the Hy Many, or the descendants of Maine, or of Eocha Doivlen, King of Ireland A. D. 322, sire of the three Collas. The princes of this tribe or Chiefs of Hy Many were of the family of O'Kelley, or O'Callaigs, also Princes of Bregia. This family held their principalities in four different counties: Dublin, Kildare, Roscommon and Tyrone.

The McEogans were Lords of Delvinara, or the Altar of Doivlen, and the head of the Nenys was Prince of Dunnamaine or of the fort of Maine. The Hy Meith Tire, of which the O'Hanlons were Chieftains, were an offshoot of this tribe.

The Clanna Conchorb or descendants of Conchorb, composed of the O'Donegans and Fitzpatricks, were also descendants of Heremon. The ancient orthography of the name was McGiolla Phadruig, meaning son of Gilbert Patrick; but at the coming over of the Normans, under the Earl of Pembroke, in A. D. 1171, the family adopted the Norman-French Fitz, a corruption of Fils, son of, and have used it ever since in the principal branch of the family who were Kings and Princes of Ossory.

But there are many variations showing that the ancient name was preserved by some branches of the family, such as Magilpatrick, McElpatrick, McPatrick, McFetrick, Kilpatrick and Gilpatrick.

The O'Donegans were Princes of Ara (the Altar or Church.)

The Hy Foharta, or Clanna Fohartaid come next as descendants of the third son of Milesius. The O'Higgins were chiefs of this Clan; the O'Fogartys who gave their name to the Tribe or made the alteration in it, and the O'Gogartys which would seem to be the ancient orthography being the other families belonging to it. The O'Fogartys were Lords of Eliogarta or the altar of the Sun, and herein lies the derivation of the name. They are a branch of the Eoganachts.

Fiacha Baiceada, son of Cathire More of the race of Heremon, King of Ireland, A. D. 144, founded the Clan or Tribe of the Hy Fiacha. The Princes of Kinel Fiacha, or of the line of Fiacha were the McMonoughs or the Cavanaghs, Kings of Leinster. The Murphys, or family of O'Morrochus, formed a special division of the Hy Fiacha, called the Hy Reling, or family of Reling.

Fiatach Fionn, who was King of Ireland, A. D. 70, founded a Tribe called Dal Fiatachs or descendants of Fiatach. He was also ancestor of the Scottish family of Campbell.

The McCanns and O'Carrolls, the latter Kings of Orgeil in West Meath, formed this Clan.

Rossa Failge, another son of Cathire More founded the Clan called after him. The Chiefs of this family or Tribe were O'Connor Faly, Prince of Offaly. The Hy Regan, of which the O'Dunns were Chiefs, were an offshoot of the above Clan.

The Deisi were a small Tribe (with O'Bric, Lord of Decies, at their head), founded by Fiacha Suihe, brother of Con Kead Caha, of the line of Heremon.

Also, the Clanna Conchorb with O'Dwyre, Lord of Kilmenagh, Chief, founded by Conchorb or Culchorp, an ancestor of Cathire More of the line of Heremon.

Next, we have the Hy Tuirtre with the O'Flynn as chief, another small clan founded by Colla Huais, a son of Eocha Doivlen king of Ireland A. D. 322, of the race of Heremon.

Another small clan descendant of Heremon are the descendants of Dair Barrach, a son of Cathire More. Chiefs, the O'Mullins Family.

Heber, the third son of Milesius, and the oldest who landed in Ireland, had many and influential descendants: The three great Clans called the Dal Cais, the Eoganachts and the Kianachta, are his descendants. Ollioll Ollum, King of Munster A. D. 177, had three sons, Cormac Cas, who founded the tribe called after him, the Dal Cas and at

the head of which are the O'Briens and Kennedys, the latter, the older name; Eogan Mor ancestor of the Eoganachts, Chiefs the McCarthys O'Donaghoes and O'Sullivans and Kian, the founder of the Kianachta, Chief, of the last the O'Carroll, prince of Ely. We now take take up the Clanna Rory, taking its name from Rory, of the race of Ir or Rory O'More, the celebrated king who reigned in Ulster B. C. 87. The latter gave his name to the clan, although the real founder was Heber Donn son of Ir, the son of Milesius, who was born at Irene on the Mediterranean. Chiefs of the Clanna Rory were the O'Mores, O'Carrollans, the McRannats or McGennises and the O'Mulligans. The descendants of Ith, the uncle of Milesius, are the McClancys, McGlanchys, McAnnathys, McNally's and the O'Driscolls. Chiefs the McClancys and O'Driscolls.

For further information as to the founders of families, we refer to the proper tables, wherein will be found their genealogies and the counties where they held possessions.

It will be observed by the reader that while some of the principal surnames of the descendants of Milesius, date back even to before the coming of Christ, very many of them date to the fourth century and none later than the time of Brian Boroinhe in whose reign all were compelled to take a surname for themselves to descend to their posterity, in order that each family might know their descent from a common ancestor.

This circumstance shows how far advanced in civilization the Irish Nation was at that early date as they were the first to adopt a system of patronymics and make it universal among all.

Surnames were not adopted universally in England until the reign of Queen Elizabeth. In Wales they did not become universal until the 17th century. That singular law that enacted the regulation that none but descendants of Milesius could inherit, any of the principalities, crowns or lordships in Ireland, was the cause of the early establishment of surnames in that kingdom. Certainly a common patronymic was the simplest manner of accomplishing the desired end: that of showing a connected genealogy of a family for many generations.

CHAPTER II.

We now place before the descendants of Irish families, as well as those of Irish birth, a monument to the Great King Brian Boroinhe, Monarch of all Ireland, composed of a Genealogical and Heraldic Chart with a book giving the genealogies of all Irish families, and much interesting information pertaining to their nomenclature.

In his time the Irish Nation attained their greatest eminence. He conquered the Danes in the great Battle of Clontarf and destroyed their power in Ireland, but lost his own life at their hands. The genealogies and history are extracted from those great books, "The Annals of the Four Masters," the Histories of Ireland, of The Abbe, McGeoghegan, O'Halloran, Keating and others; "The Illustrated History of Ireland," by Sister Clare; the Genealogical Works of Sir

Bernard Burke, Ulster King at Arms, and many other works and private papers from the records of distinguished families, in which are quoted others far more ancient such as "The Saltairs of Tara and Cashel;" "The Book of the Conquests and Invasions," "The White Book," and the "History of the Kings," a copy of which was preserved in the Abbey of Icolmkill as late as the 7th century, and is mentioned as having been seen there by him by George McKenzie.

After the landing of the Milesians in Ireland, there was a law or regulation made that none but the descendants of Heber, Heremon and Ir, the sons and Ith, the son of Breogan, uncle of Milesius, should inherit any of the principalities, lordships or provincial thrones, or that of the Ard Righ or Chief Monarch of that country. This regulation was the cause of the institution of an office called Ollam, (pronounced Ollave and meaning antiquary or herald), whose duty it was to keep a record of genealogies of families and the gallant acts of all heroes.

Ollam Fodla, (a name he obtained from his great knowledge and learning) reigned as King of Ireland B. C. 680, about three centuries after the landing of the Milesians. He established a triennial assembly of these Ollams, to be held at Teamur or Tara, at the same time as the Assembly of the States, which assemblies were collectively called Feis Teamrach signifying the assembly of the nobility, Druids, historians and other learned men. It was held in October and November. The king then granted coats of arms to the chiefs, of each family, which were hung on the wall opposite the place assigned to each person.

Before this time the chiet banner was the dead serpent and wand or sword which is still seen in the arms of many ancient Irish families and alludes to the incident in the life of their ancestor, Geodhal, related further on :

It was decreed at this assembly that each Lord should maintain a Brehon or Judge, whose duty it should be to see to the observance of the law in his lord's municipality and record alliances, births, deaths and all actions of his prince, which was presented to the Assembly for probate every third year, and was then submitted to the criticism of three princes, three Druids and three historians, before being approved and recorded in the Saltair.

Very severe penalties were incurred by any persons offering any evidence that could not be sustained or verified and no prevarication was allowed as even the succession to the throne of the Ard Righ or Chief Monarch was determined by the records or genealogies compiled on these occasions.

These Triennial Assemblies were held up to the establishment of Christianity in Ireland and as long as the Throne of the Chief Monarch was situated at Tara.

The history or genealogy of the Kings was compiled by order of Cairbre Liffeachair, Monarch of Ireland in the 3rd Century; a book which is mentioned by Sir George McKenzie in his "Defense of the Royal Line of Scotland," as having been seen by him preserved until the last century in the Abbey of Icolmkill.

Carbre, who was monarch six generations before the advent of St. Patrick—that is, about the beginning of the Christian era—had the White Book, and the Book of the Conquests and Invasions written. These are quoted and repeated in the Saltair of Cashel, cited by Keating the historian.

We now give a narrative of the descent and adventures of Milesius, extracted from the noble work of the Abbe MacGeoghegan. Magog, son of Japhet, had three sons, Baath, Jobath and Fathocta; Fenius Farsa, a descendant of Magog, who was King of Scythia, (ancestor of the Milesians), had two sons, Nenual and Nial. Nial journeyed into Egypt, where he was united in marriage to Scota, daughter of Pharaoh Cincris, the King of the country. He had a son, Gaodhal, of whom it is related that (at or about the time Moses was preparing to conduct the Children of Israel out of Egypt) he was bitten by a serpent and cured by a touch of the wand in the hands of that great Prophet, who then foretold to him that his descendants should inhabit an island where there were no serpents, nor any other noxious reptiles. This is actually true of Crete and Ireland, of which his descendants were, and are now inhabitants of the latter. After Moses cured the wound, the scar always remained green, from which circumstance, Gaodhal received the surname of Glas, which means green, and combining the names Gadelas, which gave his descendants the distinctive name of Gadeliens. This circumstance is kept in remembrance by the armonial bearings of many families of Ireland. In the third generation from Gaodhal, his posterity became very numerous and excited the jealousy of the Egyptians, who drove them out of their country, under the leadership of Sur, son of Easur, son of Gaodhal, and in the time of Pharaoh en Tine. The Gadeliens, under Sur, journeyed to the Island of Crete, where they landed and established themselves, and Sur died. Heber Scot, his son, succeeded him as leader and governor. He went back to Scythia, the country of his ancestors, where he had four sons born to him, Agnamon Tait, Adnoin and Lamphion, who each succeeded to the conduct of his host.

The Gadeliens were finally driven from Scythia under the lead of Adnoin, and settled in the country of the Amazons. After sojourning there some time, they took their departure and emigrated, under Lamphion, to Getulia in Africa, where they remained during the lapse of eight generations. The leaders in these several generations were Heber Glun Fion, Eibric, Nenuaill, Niagatt, Alluid, Earchada, Deaghatha and Bratha.

Breogan, or Bragan, son of Bratha, lead his followers into Spain, where he built a city called Braganza. Breogan had ten sons, as follows: Cuailgne, Cuala, Blath, Aibhle, Nac, Breagha, Faad, Muirtheamme, Ith and Bille. Bille was father of Gallamn, or Mileag Espaine, in Latin, Milesius. Milesius became the chief of the colony in his turn. He determined to visit the country of his ancestors, Scythia.

He was gladly received and hospitably entertained by his kinsman Riffloir, the reigning prince, who was well aware that he and Milesius were descended from the two sons of Fenius Farsa; Riffloir being descended from Nenual the elder, and Milesius from Nial the second son.

Rifflor made Milesius his General-in-chief and Prime Minister, and gave him his daughter Seaug to wife, by whom he had two sons, Donn and Aireach. His wife dying soon afterwards, he conducted his followers into Egypt, where Pharaoh Nectonebus, recognizing the ability of the great general and warrior, gave him the chief command of his army, Pharaoh being then engaged in war with the Ethiopians. He carried the war to a successful end, and as a reward was given Scota, Pharaoh's daughter, as his wife; two sons were born to him in Egypt, Heber Fionn and Amhergin. He now determined to return to his kingdom and colony in Spain, and set out, first however, having twelve of his young followers instructed in all the learning of the Egyptians, that they in turn might teach their countrymen in Spain.

He remained for seven years in Egypt, and on his way to Spain landed at Irene, in Greece, where his son Ir was born. On the voyage from there to Spain, another son, Colpa, was born, and in Spain two more, Aranann and Heremon.

After some thirty years' reign in Spain, in profound peace, a continuous drought caused a great famine, and Milesius called an assembly of all his chiefs and princes at Braganza, to deliberate on what was to be done. They met accordingly and determined to abandon their settlement, in Spain and journey further.

In this they were encouraged by Caicer, their Druid, who told them that they should travel until they discovered the most western island, where they should settle and flourish for ages.

Ith the uncle of Milesius, was entrusted with the command of the expedition, which was prepared to set out on this voyage of discovery. He set sail with his son Lugadh, and after coasting along the shores of Spain and France, they discovered the Island of Innisfail, or Isle of Destiny, sometimes called Ennis Ealga.

Here Ith landed, and with one hundred of his soldiers as an escort, marched to Oileag Nead, now Innis Owen, where he was honorably received, and had referred to him some differences as to the succession to the throne which was claimed by three sons of the deceased monarch of the country. Having satisfactorily adjusted these disputes, he set out on his return when he was treacherously attacked by an overwhelming force, under the command of the princes of the country, the Tuatha de Danains, who were alarmed at his congratulations on its beauty and the mildness of the climate.

He fought long and bravely, against a force that far outnumbered his followers who succeeded in re-embarking, but bearing Ith with them fatally wounded. He died on the return voyage to Spain. On their arrival in Spain, they found their nation mourning the death of Milesius, who had passed away peacefully after a reign of thirty-six years, and Lugadh added to that sorrow by exhibiting the dead body of his father Ith.

He made them an eloquent speech, reminding them of the insult to their nation, and the treachery and violation of hospitality of the people of Innisfail, and exhorted them up and arm, and drawing the sword, to throw away the scabbard, and never to cease warring until they should conquer the island for themselves and their descendants.

They embarked accordingly on a large fleet and set sail with forty chiefs, principal among whom were the eight sons of Milesius, with their mother Scota, and Lugadh the son of Ith.

On approaching the coast of Ireland, they were caught in a great tempest before they could obtain a haven, and suffered the loss of a large part of their fleet, and forces. Donn was lost with his vessels and followers at Teagh Duinn. Aanann was driven to sea, where his vessels foundered with all on board. Ir was wrecked upon the Southern coast, his body cast upon the shore, where it was buried at Skeily Mihil, near Dingle in Kerry, as it is called now the Middle Skelligs. Heremon, Aireach and Colpa were driven to the North. Aireach and Colpa perished with their followers, Colpa at Inver Colpa, near the mouth of the River Boyne, below the City of Drogheda. Heremon escaped alone of the three, and landed at the same place where his brother Colpa perished. Heber and Amhergin also escaped with their mother Scota, and Lugadh, son of Ith, and landed at Inver Skeiry, now Bantry, in the County of Kerry.

Heber fought the Battle of Slieve Mish, with his followers, against the inhabitants, who were called the Tuatha de Danains, and were commanded by the Princesse Eire and defeated them. The place is now called the Barony of Truchanaimy in Kerry. In this battle Scota was slain, and was buried at Glean Scoithin, where her grave is still shown.

Heber now advanced to the North, where he united with the army under his brother Heremon, and together they gave battle to the three princes of the Tuatha de Danains, who were all slain. These two princes completed the conquest of the country and divided it between them. Heremon obtained Leinster, Heber Munster, Heber Donn, son of Ir, the ancestor of the Clanna Rorys, the Kingdom of Ulster, and Lugadh, son of Ith, had conferred upon him the sovereignty of Corca Luidh.

Heremon was married to Thea, daughter of Lugadh. Heber was induced by his wife to quarrel with his brother Heremon, with whom he went to war, and fought the Battle of Geisiol, where the latter slew him.

CHAPTER III.

The regulations of the ancient Milesians were excellent in all things. Their militia was called Fionra Erionn, from Fionn Mac-Cumhal, a descendant of Miagha Neaght, King of Leinster, the ancestor of the McCool family who was their first commander.

The ancient names of Ireland, according to different historians, were as follows: Orpheus of Crotona, B. C. 543 calls it Ierna Invenal; Pomponius Mela Solonius calls the island Inverna; Ptolemy; Iris, Diodorus Siculus, Iren, Claudianus, Strabo and Stephen of Byzantium, Ierne; Rufus Festus Avienus calls it the Insula Sacra; Plutarch, Ogygia, meaning the same "The Holy Island;" Cæsar, Pliny; Tacitus and most of the Latin historians call the island Hibernia.

The English gave it the name of Ireland, "the land of Ire." It is also called Innis Alga and Innisfail, the Island of Destiny. The correct name, however, is Erin. Scotia was an ancient name also.

Heremon was the first absolute monarch of the whole island.

The most noted Kings after him during the time of Paganism, were Tighernmas, who introduced Idolatry. He was the discoverer of the gold and silver mines, and he also established regulations for dress showing the rank of the individual by the number of colors in his scarf. The mechanic and workmen wore but one color; the soldier, two; the officer, three; those who kept hostleries for the accommodations of the traveler or stranger, four; the nobles, five; the historians and the learned men, six. This shows how learning was esteemed. Kings and Royal Princes wore seven colors. A remnant of this custom is shown in the tartan of the Scottish highlander, a descendant of the Clan Dal Riada.

Eocha II re-conquered the Picts, compelling them to pay the tribute imposed by Heremon, B. C. 851. Aongas Oll Buagagh, son of Fiacha I, won 30 battles over the Picts.

Enna I, surnamed Airgeah, (Wealthy) gave silver shields to those distinguished in battle. Mnemon instituted the order of Knights of the Golden Chain.

Aldergode gave rings of gold to those who showed skill in the Arts and Sciences. Rotheart II invented chariots of war. Seadna established the Militia and gave them pay, B. C. 400. The Militia was called Fionra Erionn from Fionn McCumhall, a descendant of Miagha Neaght, King of Leinster, the ancestor of the McCools, who was their commander. Enna II coined money. Conang Bog Aglach, (the Fearless) and Duach II, called Laighrach, B. C. 431, were renowned, the first for his justice and moderation as well as bravery; the second, for his promptitude in administering justice and punishing the guilty.

Ugane More, twentieth in descent from Heremon, B. C. 300, made a regulation that the office of Ard Righ, or Chief Monarch, should remain hereditary among his own descendants.

Rory O'More was Chieftain of Ulster, B. C. 87. He gave his name to the Clanna Rory. Fergus, his grandson was the first King of Ulster. Eocha IX, B. C. 14, made all the provincial principalities into Kingdoms.

The descendants of Heber were called collectively Deirghtine. Those of Ith, Dairine. Munster was governed by them alternately until the usurpation of the tribe of the Earnochs, who usurped the throne, B. C. 50. Duach Dalta Deagadh introduced them, and Modha Nuagadh, the chief of the line or descendants of Heber, put a stop to their usurpation in the reign of Con Kead Caha.

The Princes of the House of Laogare Lorc, son of Ugane More, always governed Leinster. Rossa Ruadh, son of Feargus Fairge was the first King.

Fiatach Fionn, monarch, A. D. 70, was the ancestor, who gave his name to the Dal Fiatachs.

Con Kead Caha (Con of the Hundred Battles) reigned A. D. 148.

Nial Noy Giollach (Nial of the Nine Hostages) reigned A. D. 379. Dathy, the last Pagan King of Ireland, was son of Fiachra, brother of Nial.

After the Conquest of England by William, the Norman Conqueror and during the reign of Henry 2d and John, there was a considerable influx of Normans, with some Saxons, into the sister island where some of them intermarrying with the native princes, became, as the saying is, "More Irish than the Irish themselves."

These families will be found in a special index. To enumerate a few of them, we would mention, first, those who are called the Strong-bownians, the followers of Reginald Strongbow, Earl of Pembroke, who was invited over by Dermot McMurrough, or Cavanagh, King of Leinster, and to whom he gave his daughter Eva in marriage, to induce him to aid him in the recovery of his throne, from which he was expelled through the following events.

Derforquill, the daughter of Mortough McFloinn, Prince of Meath, was compelled by her father to marry Teighernan O'Rorke, Prince of Brefny. She secretly loved Dermot, the son of the King of Leinster, who had been paying his addresses to her. She, in the absence of her husband, sent and begged Dermot to rescue her from her hated position and a husband whom she disliked.

Dermot hurried to the place of meeting with a following of Knights, and carried off the Princess to the Castle of Ferns. O'Rourke appealed to Roderick O'Connor the Ard Righ for redress. He heard O'Rourke's complaint, assembled his own forces and massing them with those of the husband and father of the Princess Derforquill, attacked the King of Leinster whose own subjects cast off their allegiance, being disgusted with his crime. He had no refuge but England to which country he fled.

From thence he went to Aquitaine, and having obtained an interview with Henry Second, he obtained from him his consent to the raising of troops in England, to assist him in regaining his throne.

A young Nobleman named Richard, surnamed Strongbow, who was then at Bristol, having squandered his patrimony and being willing to do anything to retrieve his fortune, offered Dermot his services. He was the son of the Earl of Pembroke, sometimes called the Earl of Strangwell.

Dermot received him with open arms, offered him his daughter Aoife, or Eva, in marriage, and promised him the accession to the throne of Leinster on his decease.

Dermot then obtained the services of Robert FitzStephen and Maurice Fitz Gerald his half-brother, promising him the city of Wexford and surrounding country, as a provision for him and his posterity. FitzStephen raised 400 men and landed in Wexford in May, A. D. 1169. Maurice Prendergast re-inforced him some time after.

Thus, through the crime of Dermot McMurrough, King of Leinster, the sassenagh gained a footing in the Island of Destiny, and has maintained it there ever since, by the divisions among the Irish themselves, fostered in every way by the oppressors. However many families obtained possessions in Ireland who, have always made the

cause of the people their own, and many of the descendants of the followers of Strongbow did brave fighting for their adopted country. The Strongbow followers did not present themselves as enemies to the Irish people; they came as aid to restore Dermot to his throne; they came on his invitation and he paid them by giving them the city of Waterford and two hundred villages around it. Many of these adventurers became attached to the country, adopted its language and customs, were not behind its own people in fidelity to their Princes, intermarrying among the natives, and finally, from their devotion, incurring the taunt thrown at them by the English, "that they had become more Irish than the Irish themselves." The leaders of the first expedition were Robert FitzStephen, Harvy de Monte Marisco, Maurice Fitzgerald, Barry, Cogan, Raymond le Gros, and some others. They all founded families and these families of ancient and eminent lineage before, can boast of an antiquity of over 700 years and a nobility sustained by their virtues and generous sentiments. At the head of these families stands the noble house of Fitzgerald, or Geraldines, descended from Otho, an Italian Baron, who was a descendant of the Dukes of Tuscany. Walter, the son of Otho, landed in England with William the First. His son Gerald built the Castle of Pembroke. He married Nesta, daughter of Rees Gryffidh, a Prince of the Welsh, and her sons were ancestors of the Fitz Gerald, Fitz Walters, Fitz Henrys, Fitz Stephens, Fitz Maurices, Fitz Gibbons and Raymonds. The first Raymond was called Raymond Le Grosse, and he is the ancestor of the family Grace, or Grassach. The Barrys are of Norman descent, and Sir William De Barry, who married Angereth, sister of Robert Fitz Stephen, son of Nesta, is the ancestor of the Irish family of Barry.

The Butlers are descended from the great House of Clare, in England, and took the name of Butler from the office of Lord High Butler, hereditary in their family.

The Burkes, or De Burgo family, are descendants of Wm. Fitz Adelm who landed in Ireland in the reign of Henry 2d, a descendant of Serlo, or Harlowen de Burgo, son of a Norman Lord, called Eustace.

The De Lacys are descendants from Walter and Ilbert, who accompanied William the Conqueror into England.

Sir Hugh, the ancestor of the Irish family, went to Ireland in A. D. 1172, with Henry 2d.

The Nugents are descended from Sir Gilbert de Nugent, of Norman descent, who came to Ireland in A. D. 1172.

The De Courcys are descendants of Sir John, who was married to the sister of William the Conqueror, and who was a lineal descendant of Charlemagne the great Emperor.

The De Lacys brought in their following the distinguished families of the Tyrels, Petits, Naugles, Tuites, Missets, Husseys, Flemings, etc.

The De Birninghams take their name from the City of that name, which belonged to Sir Peter in the reign of Henry 2d. In Ireland this family gave rise to the families of MacYaris, MacYeoris, MacPheoris, Ferris, Faris, MacGeorge and George Horrish, and Hovish.

The Prestons are descended from the Prestons of Lancashire.

The Roches from Hugh de La Roche, who was a companion of William the Conqueror.

The Barnewalls also came from Little Britany, as fellow soldiers with the Conqueror.

The Plunkets, or Plugnets, are of Danish origin, and came to Ireland tempo Henry 2d.

The Dillons are of Irish extraction, and are of the race of the O'Neills, being descendants of Logan, son of Hugh Slaine, of that ancient sect.

The Nettervilles have their origin from Robert, Duke of Normandy, oldest son of William the Conqueror.

The Bedlows, or Bellews, are on the Battle Abbey Roll. Their ancestor being Marshal of the Army to William the Conqueror.

The Taffs, or Taafs, landed in Ireland, in the end of the 13th Century.

Sir Roger le Poer, the ancestor of the Powers family, came to Ireland with Strongbow in the 12th Century, and a descendant of his, named Eustace, founded the house of that name.

The Walshs and Welshs are the descendants of two nobles from Wales, in the reign of Henry 3d. They were called Brannaghs, in Ireland, and gave rise to a family of that name.

The Warrens are descendants of William, Count of Warren, in Normandy.

The Whites are of very ancient Saxon origin, and the name is derived from the Saxon Vitus, Wite, or Weight, and dates in England as far back as the 5th Century. Sir Walter first moved with his brothers to Ireland.

William Wale, a scion of that ancient family, founded the family in Ireland in the 12th Century.

The Stacks are descended from the ancient Gauls, and followed William the Conqueror to England.

The Darcys are descended from Sir John, Lord Justice and Viceroy in the 14th Century.

The Aylmers are descended from Aylmer, Earl of Cornwall, in the reign of Ethelred, King of England in the 10th Century.

The Browns are descended from Sir Nicholas, who was a descendant of Viscount Montague, and the name is found on the Battle Abbey Roll.

The Wogans are the descendants of Sir John, Lord Chief Justice of Ireland in the 13th Century.

The Suttons are descended from Sir John Lord Dudley, Viceroy of Ireland in the 15th Century.

The family of Devereux owe their origin to the Earl of Essex, and are descended from the Counts D'Evreux in Normandy.

The Archers are descendants from the ancient Cornish family. They came into England with William the Conqueror, and are found mentioned on the Roll of Battle Abbey. They were settled in Ireland under Strongbow in the 12th Century.

The Armstrongs founded the family in Ireland, shortly after the Battle of Worcester.

The Daltons passed into Ireland about the same time, and are descendants of Sir William Dalton, a descendant of the ancient family of Kingston-upon-Hull.

The Wallers are descended from Sir Hardress, one of the judges at the trial of Charles the First, a descendant of Sir Richard Waller, one of the heroes of Agincourt.

The Cliffords are representatives of the ancient house of Clifford, and were founded by a scion of that family, who came to Ireland under Strongbow.

The family of Parker owes its origin to a descendant of William de Parker, of Monk Hall, in Entwistle, who lived in the reign of Henry the Fourth.

In the Table will be found many more of those English families who have been, for many centuries, resident in England.

The Plan of the Monument is an Irish Cross, decorated with the Banners or Escutcheons, of the principal septs to which the number before each name in the alphabetical list refers. In the centre oval is a view of the tragical end of Ireland's great King, who, being well advanced in years, during the battle was occupied in his devotions and prayers to God for success, when a gigantic Dane entered his tent and slew him with his battle-axe. The Dane was afterwards despatched by his guards.

The other Pictures are of St. Patrick and his ecclesiastical procession on their way to Teamur or Tara, (he there converted the Monarch; and afterwards the Nation to Christianity, by passing from one Kingdom and Principality to another,) and the interview between Dermuid Na Nagal, McMorrough or Cavanagh, King of Leinster, and the officers of Henry II, King of England, which gave the first actual foothold to the English in the Island of Destiny.

To consult the Genealogical History and Monument, first, find in the Table of the various modes of spelling the names of the Milesian families of Ireland, the name sought for, then look up the column until you come to the name in small capitals, which is the original name; opposite it are given the No. of page of the Tribe as shown at top of first page of the Table. Where there are two Tribes having a family of the same name, the county number in the last column of the Tribe Tables will decide to which Tribe the family belongs, whose genealogy is sought. This having been ascertained, the first column gives the number of the escutcheon on the chart; next, the name; next column, the ancient name; next, the number referring to the family founder at head of the same Table in the Pedigree; next column gives the meaning of the name translated; next gives the title of the Head of the Family, and the last column shows numbers, which by reference to the same numbers in the table of Counties, will show where the family, in ancient times, held their possessions.

I now give a short description of the effect of the different letters in the Irish language in order that the reader may understand the changes made in the names and how one name has produced another different now in sound.

There are 18 letters in the Irish alphabet or as it was anciently called Beth Luis Nion; each of them is the name of a tree, viz; B. Beithe, Birch, L Luis, Wild Ash, F Fearn, Alder S Suil, Willow, N, Nion Ash, H Huath, White Thorn, (rather an aspirate than a letter however.)

D Duir, Oak, T Timne, Furze, C Coll, Hazel, M Muin, Vine, G Gort, Ivy, P Peith or Beith Bhog meaning soft B. in old manuscripts the letters are found interchangeable and thns comes the Irish family of Polandhe from Bolandhe. R Ruis, Elder, A Ailm, Fir or rather Palm tree, O Onn, Broom, U Ur, Heath, E Egdhadh, Aspen, I Idho, Yew. There are two classes of vowels, the broad and the slender, the broad are A, O and U, the slender E and I. When unaccented any one of the broad is interchangeable with another as Horraghan, Harraghan, Hurroghan and slender with slender as Belrigh Bilregh. For the sake of prosody, poets in ancient times inserted letters, between vowels which afterwards assisted in changing the pronunciation of the same word, these were not pronounced at first except in scanning the metre the gh together in many names was introduced in this way.

B was commutable with P. It is sometimes combined with the asperate as bh when it has a peculiar asperated sound. C is often substituted for G so Carraghan and Garraghan are the same names and is sounded like K. Any word beginning with a T admits a change to D or Th. F is a weak consonant and when an asperate h is put after it which is allowed it loses its sound completely. G is a heavy consonant, but when it has an h subjoined it becomes light and loses its sound, so comes Hara from Ghara. L is a light consonant and when referred to persons plural is pronounced double with A before it. M is a strong consonant and when h is subjoined it is sounded as V, it is sometimes prefixed to words beginning with a vowel and then means my as M'Anam my soul. There is reason to believe that M sometimes was interchangeable with B. and P. N is a light consonant but when it has a G following it becomes strong, when the n was meant to be doubled a stroke was made over it, this indicated that it was to be strong and from ignorance in other places caused the introduction of an N where it ought not to be, the dash meaning an accent. P was interchangeable with B, meaning soft B. S is called the Queen consonant as none other corresponds with it in certain cases, however, the S is eclipsed or destroyed in sound by a T set before it. T is a hard consonant and interchangeable with D. T when followed by an H. and asperated in the beginning of a word is lost, the H only being sounded.

The combining of many vowels in words in the Irish language makes no alteration in the sound or meaning as no number of vowels placed together can be pronounced over one syllable.

These explanations will be sufficient, if referred to when looking over the tables giving the different Milesian names classified to make every thing clear to the reader.

When a broad vowel is before any or more consonants the same must follow them and the same rule applies to the slender.

Hoping that what little we have done to make each descendant of an Irish sept know his ancient origin, will encourage the offshoots of

that glorious nation to emulate the gallant deeds of their illustrious forefathers, as well as their virtues and piety. We say farewell, and ask for the patronage of our countrymen and their descendants in the United States and elsewhere.

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THE LEGEND OF ST. PATRICK'S HAND.

A tidal branch of Lough Cone, alias Strangford, connected with the Irish Channel, flows up the River Quoile at Downpatrick, and washes the base of those gently-rising hills on one of which the ancient Cathedral of the see of Down once stood, now replaced by a modern edifice. The consecrated ground still remains distinct; rendered more sacred as the burial-place of St. Patrick, who died about A. D. 493, and was there interred. In the same narrow house are said to be deposited the mortal remains of St. Bridgida, (not the Swedish Saint and Princess), the Canoness of the adjoining Nunnery of Saul, which was founded under the holy auspices of the former saint. However this may be, they are generally supposed to occupy one grave, and the traditional tomb attracted the visits of innumerable pilgrims to do homage to their sanctity. A splendid memorial at their place of sepulture, was said to have been erected by St. Columba, who left other monuments of his architectural piety at Hy-Columb-Kill—that is, the Island of Columba's Church, or Iona, on the coast of Argyle, in Scotland. He was supposed to have been a disciple of St. Patrick, and had frequent intercourse with Ireland, during the reign of Laogare, one of the ancient Kings, whom he assisted in arranging an amicable settlement, with his turbulent bards or fileas, who seem to have been the Senators or Privy Councillors of the kingdom. After the death of Laogare, who was converted to Christianity by St. Patrick, St. Columba carried on the work of conversion, and left a solemn injunction that, whenever he died, his body should be laid in St. Patrick's grave. He breathed his last at Icolumbkill, but at that period, during one of the hostile vicissitudes which impeded the early progress of Christianity, the Druids or Pagans had obtained possession of Lecale, and their presence was marked by the destruction of all sacred buildings, among others, of the cathedral of Down, and the tomb of St. Patrick. Under these adverse circumstances it became impossible at that time to comply with the dying wishes of St. Columba. After the lapse, however, of many years, when the rites of Christianity were revived, and a solemn assembly was held for the first time, on the 17th of March, the birthday of their patron saint, in the ruins of the cathedral, then, on looking down the hill, a small skiff was seen to float with the incoming tide, and steer its course directly to the place where the worshippers had assembled. The singular appearance of the boat without a helmsman awakened astonishment in the people, and on nearer inspection its only freight was found to consist of a mouldering coffin, which appeared to have lain in the ground for a long, long period. A scroll on the lid gave the name of its occupant,—“St. Columba,” with a direction that it should be deposited in St. Patrick's grave. All vestiges of his tomb had long since been obliterated; an insuperable difficulty, therefore, arose in fixing on the precise place of sepulture, when, in the midst of discussion, and anxious inquiry as to the exact site, an aged hand was seen slowly to emerge from the ground with an episcopal ring on one of the fingers, as if held forth to offer the hospitality of a resting-place to his saintly brother. The mysterious omen was accepted by the clergy, and the people; the immigrant coffin was deposited in the grave thus distinguished, and in testimony of this miraculous intervention, the protruded hand was severed by some of the holy men then present, was covered with a case of silver wire gilt, and for a long time used as a charm in the cure of various diseases. For many centuries it remained in possession of a respectable family named Russell, with whom it was seen by the writer of this note. It is now said to be in the safekeeping of a right reverend prelate of the Catholic Church.—*Illustrated London News.*

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
