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PREFACE

The purpose of this book is to put into permanent form the cumulation of the knowledge of Nathaniel Mayhew and his wife Mary McFadden, and some of their descendants.

It is hoped that those who come in contact with this book will send in corrections and additions, so that at some latter date a revision of this book may be made.

The compiler is deeply grateful, to all who have sent material. Their cooperation has made this book possible. He is especially grateful to his mother-in-law, Mrs. Mary (Mayhew) Hettinger of Gordon, Nebr, who gave him the interest and incentive to do this research on her paternal family.

Special credit is given to Mrs. Clair E. Wyman, of West Swanzey, N.H. ; Mrs. Frank V. Korten, of Bellevue, Ky.; and Mrs. E.E. Davidson, of Burley, Idaho. They sent much of the early information concerning Nathaniel Mayhew and his wife Mary McFadden.

Every effort has been made to secure accuracy, but there are certain to be mistakes. It will be greatly appreciated if any such mistakes are called to our attention. And that more information concerning Nathaniel Mayhew and his wife Mary McFadden can be sent to the compiler.

Most of the contributions have come from personal family records, family bible records, old letters and old family stories. However, many other genealogical records have been used. a reference list is given after each chapter.

The arrangement of this book is somewhat different than most genealogy books.

It is divided into chapters. Each chapter deals with the descendants of one of Nathaniel Mayhew's children. At the present time the compiler has records of only three of his eight children.

The families in each chapter are set up by generations and given a number. This number has three digits. The first digit is the generation and the second and third digit is the family number of that generation. Such as: 101--Nathaniel Mayhew; 201-- James Mayhew(son of 101); 301--John P. Mayhew(son of 201). See, the family index on page 37. Thus each member of the family is keyed to the father's or mother's number, making it easy to trace each family line through the different generations. When an individual isn't given a family number, it means that there isn't any further information on that family, and the family is dropped.

The compiler will continue to gather and accept additional information concerning this Nathaniel Mayhew and his descendants. Whenever enough additional information is accumulated a revision of this book will be made.

Chapter I.

Nathaniel Mayhew and his wife Mary(McFadden) Jordan.

There is an old family tradition, that Nathaniel Mayhew was a descendant of Thomas Mayhew, first Governor of Martha's Vineyard. It is interesting to note, that this tradition was found in each of Nathaniel's children families that are discussed in this book. However, the Compiler spent some time at Martha's Vineyard going through the Mayhew records that were available. He was unable to find any connection between the descendants of Thomas Mayhew and Nathaniel Mayhew. Although, Charles Edward Banks states, in the Preface of his book, "The History of Martha's Vineyard Vol. III," "It is safe to say that any person bearing the Mayhew name anywhere in 1800 were descendants of our Vineyard blood. Exception is to be made of course, to "Strays" who wandered to America from England for transient residence." "Certainly a large quota of Vineyard families sought the productive valley of the Kennebec in Maine about 1790."

Mrs. Kortton writes, "After making a further study of the census records in Cape Cod, Martha's Vineyard, and Maine, I am now of the opinion that Nathaniel Mayhew's name (when he lived on Cape Cod) was Mayo. There are no Mayhews given in the Cape Cod, Mass. census of 1790--they are all Mayos. However, Mayhews are given in the 1790 census on Martha's Vineyard, Mass. In the 1790 census and also 1800 census of Maine, Nathaniel Mayhew of Bangor was listed as Nath'l Mayo, from Cape Cod. Some authors say the two names are the same family--others say they are not. The U.S. Census Bureau regards the names as belonging to separate families."

Mrs. Wyman gives the following information.
"I believe that the earliest record is the marriage date(int.) of Nathaniel Mayhew and Mary(McFadden)Jordan at Georgetown, Maine 13Nov.1765

As you may know, Georgetown in the early days was made up of not only the present Georgetown, but Phippsburg, Arrowsic, Bath and West Bath, and Woolwich. Woolwich became a separate town in 1759, Bath and West Bath in 1781, Phippsburg in 1814, and Arrowsic in 1841. This may mean that at the period in which we are interested any of these towns could have the records. Georgetown Vital Records only give us the marriage.

The book Wiscasset in Pownallborough by Fannie S. Chase makes mention of lot no. 8 on Jeremy Squam(present day Westport) where Nathaniel Mayhew lived, as having been sold to James Jewett on 24 Dec. 1767. We were able to track this down at the Court House in Wiscasset, the seat of Lincoln County.

The next record we have is the purchase of 352 acres at Georgetown, on Robin Hood Cove, from Miles Trask 7Sept,1770. (This was only a short distance across the bay from Jeremy Squam). On 11Feb.1771 Nathaniel sold some(or all?- it merely says "bounded in deed") of this property to Simon Connery. About three years later Nathaniel apparently was in Bangor(or as it was known in those days-Conduskeag)."

The Bangor Historical Magazine- 1885/6 Vol. 1, page 2, says, " In 1774 Robert Treat and family from Boston, Nathaniel Mayhew and family, and Dr. John Herbert were here." From the same Vol. page 119- a list of the settlers was given and Nathaniel Mayhew had lot 18, and Daniel Webster had lot 19. Also Bangor Historical Magazine, Vol. VII, p.176, says, " Nathaniel Mayhew came here with his family, 1774".

It is not known how long Nathaniel lived in Bangor. An old letter says, " he lived in Bangor until he died." But we find in Court records at Ellsworth, Maine. Book of orders Vol. 4 p.94. "To Elisha Mayhew of Ohio Settlement in county of Hancock, notice of appointment as administrator of estate of Nathaniel Mayhew of Kenduskeag Settlement in County of Hancock- yeoman deceased dated 28Oct. 1808."

Elisha posted notices in Kenduskeag and Bangor as he was ordered to do. On 24Oct.1809 Elisha swore to completion of all the duties he had been committed to fulfill- and court was noted as being held at Castine in county of Hancock.

Letters of Administration- Hancock County- Vol. 2, p. 115 states that as Nathaniel died intestate, Elisha of Ohio Settlement was appointed administrator, to make inventory of estate etc., and to exhibit same into Registry of Court of Probate for the county aforesaid at or before 28th day of January next ensuing and to render plain and true account of administration on oath at or before 28th day of October 1809.

At court of probate in Castine, County of Hancock on the 24th of October 1809 Elisha Mayhew appeared and swore that the above was complete and correct- and that if anything further should appear he would see that it was added to inventory.

We are assuming that the above Nathaniel Mayhew is our Nathaniel Mayhew, and that Elisha Mayhew was his son. However, it is said that Nathaniel Mayhew had a half-brother named Elisha.

Much more is known about the ancestry of Nathaniel Mayhew's wife Mary McFadden. Her grandfather was Andrew McFadden, who was born 1675 in the Highlands of Scotland. In 1693 he moved to Ireland. He died prior to 1766 (at which time he was referred to as Jan's late husband). Andrew 1st married Mercy Mallory, and 2nd Jane Lindsey, in 1704. In 1718 he came to America in the "Maccallum". And settled at Merrymeeting Bay.

Andrew McFadden's son James McFadden was born 1701 at Garragh, Londonderry, Ireland; died 1754, Georgetown, Me.; m. ca 1728, Rebecca Pierce. He came to America with his father in 1718, and first lived at Merrymeeting Bay. It is said that he left there because of Indians. He then went to Georgetown, Me. .

No record of Elizabeth(Mayhew) Inman has been found in the Washington Co., Ohio records. However in the 1930, 1940, and 1950 Federal Census the members of the family are found.

As a boy Washington worked in the cooper shop helping to shave shingles etc. thus learning the cooper trade.

When he was about 13, his step-father heard that a canal was to be built in Ohio. His step-father had worked on the Erie Canal and had a dump cart of two wheels and one horse. So they loaded the cart high with mother on top of the load, and started to Ohio. The men and children walked. And the children were barefoot. The summer was passed when they arrived in Ohio on the Muskingum River. There was no money, no housing, but the game was plenty. Plenty of timber to build cabins. All pitched in and soon a cabin was built and made tight for winter.

George Washington Mayhew's family continued.

Most records show that he went by the name of Washington Mayhew.

When he was 23 years of age he married Mary Pattin, dau. of "Daddy" Pattin.. Daddy Pattin was married four times and had 13 children. He died in 1859, at the age of about 88 years, (he didnt know what year he was born.) He was bur. in the Wetherfield Cem. Henry Co., Ill.

When Washington was 26 he bought 80 acres of wooded land, built a log house and a cooper shop. He had his father's cooper tools, as his father was a cooper. He hired 5 or 6 men at 50¢ per. day. A cabin was built for each man and family. The men worked in the woods, cutting and making stock for the shop. Washington did the shop work. The whiskey and pork barrels were sold to the Dave Putman store at Harmar which was about 6 miles from his shop. Deed book, Vol.22,pl54;"Washington Mayhew of Warren Twp. from Russell Fuller of Marietta, for \$100.00 for 80 acres in Warren Twp., Sec.15,Twp.2 Range 9, the W $\frac{1}{2}$ of 160 A. Lot#301 drawn in the name of William Moulton, 25Mar.1829."

His brother Nathaniel and a sister, had moved to Kewanee, Henry Co., Ill. So in the fall of 1852, he sold out, and the whole family went to Illinois. Ase Cole and family also went. (Ase Cole was the brother of Rowena-wife of Morris Mayhew.)

They stopped at Wethersfield, which is about a mile south of Kewanee and bought an 80 acre farm. The farm was about 3 miles S.W. of Wethersfield.

After a few years the farm work became too hard, so he sold the farm and bought a house in Kewanee. He contracted with a cooper shop to set up barrels at 10¢ each. He would set up 10 barrels a day making a dollar a day and was satisfied.

Then in 1868 he and wife Mary, went with their son Sheldon to a farm near Afton, Union Co.,Iowa to live. He lived with Sheldon until his death in 1890.

working in the woods, hauling, or doing farm work.
When he was 21 he went to Cincinnati, where he worked on a tele-
graph line from Cincinnati to East Burlington. This job took all
summer. Next he drifted to Henry Co., Ill. where he drove a four
horse stage from Geneseo to Peoria, Ill. He drove this stage
until the line moved west.
He then returned to Washington Co., Ohio and married Rowena Cole,
dau. of Malachi Cole and Romenta Harris.

Malachi Cole, m.1st.1816, Romenta Harris and had 10 children,
Rowena being the sixth child; m.2nd.1841, Mrs. Sophia(French)
Johnson, and had 5 children.

Rowena Cole is a direct descendant of James Cole, b.1600, London,
England; d.1692 Plymouth, Mass. He was first settler of Cole's

weighed about 2500 lbs. It is said, " that this team took first
prize at the First State Agricultural Association of Illinois,
at Springfield. This was in 1853or54."

Morris lived near Kewanee, until the fall of 1869, when by
covered wagon(the children walking behind the wagon) the family
moved to a 160 acre farm, 1 mile north of the Sciola community,
Montgomery Co., Ia.
The farm had rich black soil, some timber, and a stream ran through
the farm. This was their home for the rest of their lives.

His wife was Orrel Wheeler, b. 1830, in Ohio, dau. of Thomas Wheeler, b. cal 1793, New Haven, Conn. and Polly Ann Judd, b. 24 July 1800, Watertown, Conn. Polly Ann (Judd) Wheeler came from a well-to-do family. She ran away when a girl to marry Thomas Wheeler, somewhat of a "never-so-well" and moved to Ohio where her children were born. She lived to be over 100 years old. The following account is taken from the "History of the County of Montgomery, Iowa, by W.W. Merrett, Sr. Pub. 1906, pages 273-274."

"Several years ago, an event of more than ordinary interest occurred at the home of Merritt Wheeler of Washington Township. It was the celebration of the one hundredth birthday of his mother, Mrs. Thomas Wheeler, who was born in Watertown, Conn., July 24th, 1800. She had the unique distinction of having lived under every national administration except that of Washington. She was born seven months after the death of the first President of the United States and was twelve years old at the time of the Battle of New Orleans. She was seven years old when Robert Fulton propelled the first steamer up the Hudson and nine years old when Abraham Lincoln was born. Her father was soldier of the Revolution War from 1776 to 1783; two of her brothers were soldiers in the War of 1812. Of her ten children, two were soldiers in the War of the Rebellion. One son was a member of Co. D. Twenty-ninth Wisconsin Regiment and was killed at the Siege of Vicksburg in 1863. The other is now living in the State of Washington. Mrs Wheeler was married in 1820 and moved to Trumbull County, Ohio. In 1843 they removed to Wisconsin and in 1870 to this county. Her husband died in this county in 1878, aged eighty-two years. Her hearing was slightly defective and she had lost the sight of one eye. Although slightly built, weighting only seventy pounds, her power of endurance was remarkable. She was an expert at the loom and, besides caring for the household, she in ten months' time wove 980 yards of cloth. It is said that at the age of ninety she was at the loom early and late. She was vivacious and an interesting conversationalist. Upon the attainment of her one hundredth birthday, eight hundred people of the surrounding country assembled and spent the day in social enjoyment, with a program of speeches and music. Mrs. Wheeler entered heartily into the spirit of the occasion.

Lilly and John Damuth lived on a farm near her father's farm, where her children were born and raised. John Damuth died in 1925, and Lillie went to live with her son, Sam Damuth.
