MAN FAMILY.

1. EBENEZER MAN, M. D. , b. about 1734; d. Feb. 12, 1796,
"in his sixty-second year", at Vergennes, Vt. He
married in Kent, Conn:- "Ebenezer Man and Anne Berry
was joyned togather in marriage Jan'ry ye 4th, A. D.
1759. She was born Mar. 31, 1734, in Tolland, Conn.,
daughter of Capt. Nathaniel Berry and Rebecca Hatch.
Dr. Man's name appears from 1765 to 1785 in deeds
which give his residence as Kent. In one record in
1769, there is: "Eben'r Man and Anne, wife of ye said
Eben'r(various other names)...all of us children
and heirs of Capt. Nathaniel Berry, late of Kent,
Deceased, and all of Kent". In deeds of 1787 and 1788,
he is "Ebenezer Man of Warren", (which was once a part
of Kent). About 1788 he removed to Vergennes, Vt., where
he gave bond of one hundred pounds, Sept. 29, 1788,
that he would convey to the city one twentieth of his
land within two years. There is no record that this
bond was enforced. At the first town meeting of
Vergennes, Mar. 12, 1789, he was elected a member of
the Board of Selectmen, being the first chairman of
that body. He also held the office of Town Clerk of
Vergennes. His name appears on the "Grand List" of

1794 and 1795 for taxes. From 1788 to 1791 his name appears on the land records of the town of Ferrisburgh, (which was originally a part of Vergennes).

The "Mann Memorial" by George S. Mann says on page 43: "He (Ebenezer Man) served as Brigade Surgeon under Washington at White Plains and was at the surrender of Lord Cornwallis at Yorktown".

of Plattsburgh. She b. Sept. 25, 1786; d. Feb. 3, 1873.

Albon Man died Sept. 13, 1820, in Ft. Covington, from

injuries received in a fall from a horse. His widow m.

Rev. Frederick Halsey, Oct. 31, 1827.

Dr. Albon Man removed from Kent to Vergennes with his father about 1788. There his name appears on the

"Grand List" of 1790, 1794 and 1795. He was Constable, and presiding officer of the Freeman's Meetings in Vergennes up to Feb. 10, 1795. In 1795 he sold land in Ferrisburgh. There is no further record of him in either of these towns, but in Bridport we find this record: "Morning Sun Lodge, F. & A. M. Upon petition signed by ...John N. Bennett, Albion Mann,....Aldric Mann, 'worthy brothers in Masonry', The Grand Lodge of Vermont on Oct. 13, 1800 granted to said petitioners 'a regular lodge of Free and Accepted Masons under the style and designation of Morning Sun Lodge No. 18' ".

In March 1803, he removed with his brother Alric to northern New York where they settled in Franklin Co. in that part of the town of Constable which was later cut off as Westville. In the same year he built the second saw mill in the town. With William Bailey he held the land agency of the town. At his house in 1806 the first school was taught . At the first town meeting of Constable in 1807, he was chosen Supervisor, and Poundkeeper. The office of Supervisor he held 1807-1810; 1812-1813. In 1808 he was one of the Supervisors of Franklin Co. He was appointed Judge in 1810, and Surrogate in 1814. With his brother Alric he formed the firm of A. & A. Man

which sent down to Montreal some of the largest timbers ever cut in that part of the country. These were more than 165 feet long and were used for three decker frigates in the British Navy.

The "Mann Memorial" says that Dr. Man was "a surgeon in Gen. Wilkinson's army in 1813-1814".

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4. ALRIC MAN, (Ebenezer), b. May 15, 1771, in Kent, Conn. d. Mar. 11, 1849; buried in Pine Grove Cemetery. Married Sally Vallence. With his father and brother Albon he removed about 1788 from Kent to Vergennes where his name is on the "Grand List" of 1794 and 1795. In 1800 he was one of the petitioners in Bridport for a lodge of Free and Accepted Masons. In March 1803 he moved with his brother Albon to Franklin Co., N. Y. where he settled in the town of Constable. In 1807 he was Overseer of the Poor, and Commissioner of Highways in Constable. He

was one of the trustees of Westville when it was formed from Constable in 1829, and became Supervisor from 1833 to 1835, and 1842 to 1843. He was appointed Judge in 1814. When the Congregational Society was formed 1817, he was one of the trustees.

General Alric Man's career in the army is noted in the Military Minutes of the Council of Appointment of N. Y. This shows that in 1806 he was appointed an Ensign in the state militia and soon rose to Captain, then Major, and finally in 1814 Brigadier General in command of the 42nd Brigade. During the war of 1812 he commanded the 66th Regiment .

Dr. Man was appointed first postmaster when the West Constable Post Office was established Jan. 12, 1828. At the first town meeting of Westville in 1829, he was appointed Assessor, and Commissioner of Schools. In 1851 he was elected Supervisor of Westville. In the Malone Directory for 1868-9 he is listed as "land agent" with residence at 17 Elm St.

Buel H. Man, inherited his fathers farm in Westville,
and on his death willed it as follows: Two thirds of the
land and the choice of the two houses to his only unmarried
daughter, Celestine. The remaining third and the other house
to his son Albert, who was then farming it. Albert willed
his share to his daughter, Susan (Man) Clark, who deeded it
to her aunt, Helen K. Man. Upon her death this share went
to her sister Celestine who now owns the whole farm.

When Westville was formed from Constable in 1829,
Buel H. Man was appointed Commissioner of Highways.
He was Supervisor 1840-1.
