

THE NEWLAND (NEWLON) FAMILY

A brief genealogy and history of the family whose various branches may use either of these spellings and of other families, related or unrelated, who may spell or pronounce their name similarly.

THE NEWLAND (NEWLON) FAMILY

There are many members of this family who will declare that there is no relation between the various families who may use either of the two spellings indicated, but their opinions probably have no foundation in fact. Actually there are at least a dozen variations in the spelling of the name, and most of them are known to have been used by related branches of the family, or to have been used in Court Records or censuses. In some cases four different spellings have pertained to the same person. The variations already observed are: Newlan, Newlen, Newlin, Newlon, Newlun, Newlyn, Newland, Newlands, Nuland, Newlund, and Newling. The variations Nowlan, Nowland and Nowlin have also been found in Court Records.

There are many lines or branches of the family whose common relationship has never been established, and they may therefore be unrelated in this country. There is one Newlin line which is quite prominent, very numerous, and whose history and genealogy are rather well recorded. This line begins in this country with Nicholas Newlin, born circa 1630, who married Elizabeth Paggott. Nicholas came from the Quaker Church at Mt. Mellich, Ireland, to the Quaker Church in Pennsylvania in 1683. Other lines which are rather well identified and quite numerous are those of George Newland and William Newland who were immigrant to Massachusetts in 1643. (See Freeman's "History of Cape Cod," p. 44). The authors hope the genealogy of this line will be established and recorded and that a study may be made as to whether these lines have a common origin with others.

The primary purpose of this brochure is to record, insofar as possible, the genealogy and history of the descendants of William and Hannah (Benson) Newland who were married in 1741, probably in Chester County, Pa. As to the ancestry of this William Newland much has been conjectured but little is known. Regarding this and much other data on the Newland (Newlon) family I am indebted to Mr. R. L. Brownfield, Jr., of Atlantic City, N. J., who (about 1908-1912) did much research on this subject.

Besides the Newland's who immigrated to Massachusetts in 1643 and the Nicholas Newlin who immigrated to Pennsylvania in 1683 we find early records of the following persons of the name:

Richard Newland was immigrant to Virginia in 1653 with the Warrick Company, Capt. Nathan Hurd, guarantor.

Will Newland witnessed a will in Carrituck Co., N. Car., in 1710.

James Newland entered land in Carrituck Co., N. Car., in 1721.

John Newland married Mary Gray, May 21, 1720, at First Presbyterian Church, Philadelphia. New Jersey license. (See records of that church, p. 52.)

Thomas Newland brought Certificate of Removal from the Monthly Meeting at M't.troth, Ireland, dated June 28, 1726. Joined Philadelphia Monthly Meeting October 3, 1726.

Daniel Newlin (Newlon) deed recorded in 1765 at Warrenton, Fauquier Co., Va.

John Newland of Wythe Co., Va. Said by descendants to have come from Germany and settled there in 1750.

William Newland had application for survey in Washington Co., Pa., in 1769. Surveys were made in that county in 1785 for Herrod Newland, George Newland, Mary Newland and William Nowland.

By far the greater part of the data collected and assembled by the

authors pertains to the descendants of William and Hannah (Benson) Newland (or Newlon), of John Newland of Wythe Co., Va., and of the Newland's who lived probably in Washington Co., Pa., late in the eighteenth century. No attempt will be made to bring this data down to date, for such an attempt would be much too ambitious at this time. The writers hope, however, that the effort they have begun will be continued by others until a fairly complete history of the Newland (Newlon) family in America will result. Errors of many kinds are apt to occur in this first endeavor. All persons discovering such errors, or having data which should be incorporated in later editions of this pamphlet, should provide the writers with such corrections or data as soon as their certainty is assured.

An exhaustive study of the parentage of William Newland who married Hannah Benson in 1741 has been made by the authors as well as by genealogists of the Philadelphia region. No positive proof as to his parents could be found, though the following possibilities are admitted:

1. John and Mary (Gray) Newland who were married in 1720 at First Presbyterian Church in Philadelphia. This seems the most likely possibility for the reason that we find this John Newland owned land in Whiteland (now West Whiteland) twp., Chester Co., Pa., in which township William and Hannah Newland lived. There were also Gray's living in this region. Uwchlan Twp., home of the Benson's, was adjacent to Whiteland Twp. John Newland died prior to 4/15/1778 when Isaac Nutt and wife, Peninah, executed a release for her interest in the land to her brother, John Newland. Hannah Newlin, a sister, also released, each for £55. No indication is given as to the number of children of John Newland, Sr. The son, John Newlin, died in West Chester, Pa., in March, 1812, and in his will appointed his nephew, William, executor. Letters were granted 3/20/1812 to William Newlin and Joshua Gibbons. Names wife, Mary; nephew, William; nephew, John Lockhart; sister, Peninah Nutt; niece, Jane Richards. The nephew, William, died in 1849. Letters were granted 8/5/1849 to his son, Samuel, and names sons, John and Samuel. Wife, Lydia, daughters, Rebecca, Zeruah and Deborah.

2. Nicholas and Edith (Pyle) Newlin, m. Aug. 1715. This Nicolas was grandson of the immigrant Nicholas Newlin. A definite obstacle to consideration of these as parents of William is found in a deed executed 10/27/1780 by their son, Thomas, in which deed it is clearly stated that Thomas was the only son of this Nicholas Newlin.

3. William Newland himself may have been immigrant, or may have been descendant of the New England Newland's.

At any rate William Newland apparently was not a Quaker, as were nearly all descendants of Nicholas Newlin. In support of this statement, and in order to throw some light on the early history of the family, the following information extracted from the records of Goshen Monthly Meeting are included:

Extracted from Records of Goshen Monthly Meeting (near W. Chester, Pa.)

1/15/1742—Hannah Benson is complained of for marriage before a priest with one not of our Society. Jane Malin and Alice Eavenson are appointed to visit her.

2/19/1742—Her case continued.

3/17/1742—Phebe Thomas and Margaret Evans appointed to assist to prepare a testimony against Hannah Nowlin (women's minutes) Joseph Helsby appointed to assist women to draw up a testimony against Hannah Newlin (men's minutes)

4/21/1742—A testimony signed against Hannah Newland for marriage by a priest to one not of our Society. Noble Butler appointed to read it at Uwchlan meeting.

Sarah Jenkins and Phebe Thomas appointed to read the testimony against Hannah Nowlin to her.

8/19/1754—Women produce acknowledgement of Hannah Newlin for marrying out, for which she was disowned years ago. John Edwards is appointed to read it at Uwchlan meeting.

2/17/1755—John Edwards is appointed to assist women to prepare a certificate for Hannah Nowland to Warrington M.M.
(This is crossed off.)
Hannah Nowlan requests a certificate to Warrington. Phebe Thomas and Hannah McCord are appointed to make inquiry respecting her.

3/17/1755—Hannah Newlin hath altered her mind and is not removed.

4/10/1761—Hannah Nowlan requests a certificate to Warrington. Susanna Brown and Elizabeth Brown are appointed to make inquiry about her. Thomas Milhouse is appointed to assist women to prepare a certificate for Hannah Nowland to Warrington.

5/ 8/1761—A certificate is signed for H. Nowland, wife of William, to to Warrington, York Co. Hannah Benson, daughter of Robert and Jane Benson, of Uwchland, Chester Co. was born 1/31/1720. William and Hannah Newlan were witnesses to marriage of William Benson, 3/7/1747.
(These records copied at West Chester Pa., Historical Library, August 5, 1940 by Robert E. and Leon L. Newland. Goshen M.M. is situated at edge of town Goshenville, half way between West Chester and Paoli, Pa.)

The parents of Hannah Newland, born Jan. 31, 1720, were Robert and Jane Benson of Uwchlan Twp., Chester Co., Pa. Robert Benson's will (sealed July 3, 1746, proved Aug. 12, 1746) is recorded Chester Co., Pa., Will Book "B", page 203. He bequeaths to his wife, Katherine (she was his second wife), and daughter Ann Benson, the income from all his estate, real and personal, during their lives, and after their decease to son, William, he paying certain legacies. Son, John Benson, is bequeathed £20, son, James Benson, is bequeathed £25; grandsons, John, William and James Newlan are bequeathed £5 each; daughter, Hannah, is bequeathed 5 shillings. Executors of his will were his sons, John and William.

William and Hannah Newlan were witnesses to the marriage of her brother, Robert Benson, March 7, 1747.

From the records of Goshen M.M. and of Warrington M.M. we learn that William Newland and family moved from Chester Co., Pa., to York (now Adams Co., Pa.) between May 8, 1761, and June 12, 1762. The following extracts from the records of Warrington M.M. offer some interesting information:

Extracted from Records of Warrington Monthly Meeting

6/12/1762—Hannah Newland produced a certificate from Goshen, dated 5/8/1761.

3/ 8/1766—William and James Newlin of Menallen Monthly Meeting request to be received into membership with us and no objections appearing, their request is granted and they received.

9/12/1767—William Newlin Jr. and Margaret Morton declare intentions

10/10/1767 of marriage (spelled Newland by women).

11/ 3/1767—William Newlan of Menallen Township in County of York and Province of Pennsylvania, son of William and Hannah Newlan, and Margaret Morton of the township, county, and province aforesaid, daughter of John Morton and Mary, his wife, married at Menallen Monthly Meeting.

5/ 7/1768—James Newlin is complained of by Menallen Meeting for marriage by a priest, although cautioned.

6/11/1768—He is disowned. (also spelled Newlon).

11/12/1768—Ann Newlen (spelled Newland by women).

5/13/1780—William Newlan of Menallen Meeting requests certificate to Hopewell M.M., Fred County, Virginia, for self, wife, Margaret and children.

6/10/1780—Certificate signed; children named—Mary, William, Tamer, John and Margaret.

9/ 7/1782—Catherine Newland produced a certificate from Menallen M.M. dated 7/15/1782.

10/ 9/1784—Catherine Newland received certificate to Menallen.

2/ 8/1794—Ann Newland sent an acknowledgement for her outgoing in marriage; Redstone M.M. to be requested to visit her.

4/12/1800—Favorable report from Redstone received, her acknowledgement dated 1/1/1794, accepted.

5/10/1800—Ann Newlan receives certificate to Redstone.

William Newland died probably in spring of 1770, for his will dated October 15, 1769, was registered March 13, 1770. Following is as nearly as possible an exact copy of the will, the copy having been made from the will book in York, Pa., Courthouse.

"In the Name of God Amen

I, William Newlon of Menallen Township in the County of York and Province of Pennsylvania being weak in body but in perfect mind and memory, blessed be God, I do on 15th. day of October in the year of our Lord 1769 make and ordain this my last will and testament in maner following, that is to say my soul I commit to God that gave it and my Body to be deasonely Buried and then as tuching my worldly Affairs.
1.—I alow thirty two Bushels of Wheat and all my Ry and beef Cow and also all my hogs for the support of my Beloved Wife Hannah Newland and my children now Living With me til Nex Spring and also the hea and Rof foder for the Cattel till Nex Spring and Also I alow the Woling Web for the use of my Wife and children now Living with her to Cled them.

1.—Itam I gave and begath to my beloved Wife a bed and beding and a hos and her Sadel and the Choise of Eny one of my Cows two Least pots and the Rest of the Lithe Household forneter and her flax and Wheel and twenty pounds in money out of the Land prise When Sold as I alow it to be Sold as Swon as possible after my decease Itam I also alow ten pounds out of the Land prise Reas and Chol or help to do it to my three yougest children Itam I alow to my Daughter Ann Newland the other Bed and Beding and her Spinning Wheel.

1.—Itam then I alow after all my Debts and funeral charges and all other Charges is paid that the Remainder of my Estate Real and personally to be Equally divided among my children Namely William James

and Ann Eligah David John and Deborah and Beniamen and Equal share Each and Every of then of the Resedue of my Estate
1.—Itam also appoint and Nomenate my beloved Wife Hanah Newland and my Son William Newland to be my hold and sole Excutors of this my Last Will and Testament this fifteenth day of October 1769"

After the death of William Newland his widow and children remained in York County but a few years. In the office of the Clerk of the Court at York this record is found:

"Came into Court, May 28, 1771, David Newlon, aged nineteen years, one of the sons of William Newlon, deceased, late of Menallen Township, and prayed that his brother James Newlon be appointed guardian. The Court thereupon appointed James Newlon guardian of his brother David."

There are no deeds at York under Newland name. A search through the records of births, baptisms and marriages of thirteen churches of York County (not including Quaker Churches) did not reveal the name "Newland."

An interesting, if inaccurate, statement of his ancestry was dictated in 1889 by Dr. Elijah Newland of New Albany, Ind. Dr. Newland's father was Benjamin, of Little River, N. Car., who is believed to be a son of William and Hannah Newland. Dr. Newland's statement follows:

"My great-grandfather came from Tipperary County, Ireland, with William Penn in 1682. Settled in Philadelphia. My grandfather, John Newland, was married to Hannah Ellison. Settled in York Co., Pennsylvania on Youghaney River where my father, Ben Newland, was born. My father had one sister, Deborah. She married a man named Simon Moon. Also four brothers. Their names were Elijah, William, John and James. My father's name was Benjamin. My Uncle John lived in Virginia, my Uncle James and Elijah in Pennsylvania and my Uncle William in western Pennsylvania. My grandfather died when my father was quite young. At the age of 16 he stood draft and entered the service in 1779 and served to the close of the war. He was one of the guard that guarded the men of Lord Cornwallis at Hagerstown in Maryland. He was born March 6, 1763. All of my ancestors were Quakers and they turned him out of the church or disowned him on that account, as they did not believe in war. On his discharge he did not return home to stay. He settled in Maryland and learned the trade of miller with a man named Gilliland near the Pennsylvania line where he became acquainted with Catherine Tate, daughter of William and Elizabeth (Colwell) Tate, to whom he afterwards was married by the Rev. John Brown, pastor of the Old Providence and Shortridge Church, Augusta County, Virginia, on the 17th day of March, 1787. Benjamin Newland and wife first settled on the Cowpasture River in Virginia. Afterwards they moved to North Sarolina near Beard's Forge, then they moved to Cataba River, thence to Little River where I was born. My father and mother raised twelve children to man-and womanhood. They are named as follows:

It is believed by the writers that Dr. Newland was in error as to several items in his statement, especially as to the names of his grandfather and grandmother. He probably was wrong also in his first statement.

The Quaker Church records quoted reveal much as to the moving about of some of the descendants of William and Hannah Newland. Also from the records of the Pennsylvania Genealogical Society, Vol. 10, No. 1, p. 38. (Cumberland County Marriages) we find these notes:

"Elijah Newland married Ann McGrew, Sept. 15, 1768.

James Newlon married Catharine Bennett, Apr. 7, 1768. Vol. 3, p. 195, "David Newland married Ann Neaff, Oct. 28, 1790, at St. Pauls Church, Philadelphia."

These notes are believed to pertain to the sons of William and Hannah Newlon. James "Newlin" was disowned by Warrington M.M., 6/11/1768 for marrying out.

John Newlon married Catherine Wierman at Menallen M.M., York Co., Pa., April 9, 1781. They removed to Virginia about 1786, for records of Menallen M.M. show that Catherine Newland was given a Certificate of Removal to Hopewell M.M. (with her husband, John Newland), Dec. 11, 1786; received there Oct. 1, 1787. They later moved to Liberty, The Meadows, (Goose Creek M.M.) Bedford County, Va. They removed to Kentucky (?) and finally came to Indiana about 1815. They settled in Franklin Twp., Washington County, where many of their descendants now live. They are buried in well-marked graves in the old Hicksite Quaker Cemetery about three miles from Salem. Nearly all their descendants use the spelling "Newlon."

William Newland (son of William and Hannah Newland) married Margaret Morton at Warrington M.M. Nov. 3, 1767. Apparently they continued to live for several years in that region for, on Aug. 7, 1780, they were given transfers from Warrington to Hopewell M.M. Five children are also named in the transfer. In 1797 and 1798 William Newland and William Newland, Jr., witnessed marriage certificates in Berkley Co., Va. On April 4, 1798, a Certificate of Transfer was issued at Hopewell for William and Margaret Newland and six children, names listed, to Goose Creek M.M. Their children, John, Tamar and Margaret (probably older) also transferred. Hopewell M.M. was situated on Opequan Creek about eight miles northeast of Winchester, Va. The writers have been unable to learn what became of them after this, but have found it nearly impossible to separate the descendants of this William from those believed to be descended from his brother, James. Both lines use the "Newlon" spelling.

Nothing has been learned positively of the whereabouts of James Newland who married Catherine Bennett in 1768, for which he was disowned 6/11/1768 for marrying out. It is believed that he or his children removed and settled somewhere in the region of Culpeper or Warrenton, Va. The traditions of descendants of the early Newland's of this section seem to indicate that this is true. Nearly all, if not all, names of their probable descendants are spelled "Newlon."

Elijah Newland (son of William and Hannah Newland) married Ann McGrew, Sept. 15, 1768. They are believed to have settled near West Newton in Westmoreland County, Pa., about 1784, and are believed to have remained there until their deaths. Their descendants are quite numerous, most of them using the "Newlon" spelling, while some spell it "Newlin."

Beyond the marriage record "David Newlon married Ann Neaff" Oct. 28, 1790, at St. Paul's Church in Philadelphia" nothing is known of him.

No record of Deborah Newland has been found save only the statement by Dr. Elijah Newland that she married a man named Simon Moon.

No record of any sort has been found of Ann Newland, daughter of William and Hannah Newland. Such records as have been found are believed to pertain to Ann, wife of Elijah Newland.

As much as is known of the life of Benjamin Newland, son of William and Hannah Newland, is contained in the statement by his son, Dr. Elijah Newland. Benjamin and his wife both died in Burke (now Caldwell) County, N. Car., and are buried in well-marked graves in the old family cemetery a few miles from Lenoir. Probably all of his descendants use the spelling 'Newland.' In signing his bond of marriage to Catherine Tate, the name was written "Benj. Newlan."

No official record of Revolutionary War service of William Newland or any of his sons has been found satisfactory to the writers, though some do not agree with this statement. Many attempts have been made to prove Dr. Elijah Newland's statement that his father, Benjamin, saw service, but with negative results.

For the reason that they seem the most likely possibilities as the parents of William Newland, the writers include the following genealogical sketch:

His inscription reads "In Memory of JOHN NEWLAND who departed this life April 9th, 1833, Aged 74 years." Her inscription reads "CATHERINE NEWLON departed this life February the 1829, aged 68 years." (The writers have had no success in reconciling this birth date of John Newland with the term of Robert Benson's will, dated July 3, 1746, by which he bequeaths to John Newlan- his grandson—£5). Robert Newland came from N. Car. to Salem, Ind., about 1823. Here he established a drug store and did some medical practice. His brother, Elijah, was associated with him in this practice. About 1840 he moved with his wife to Batesville, Ark., where he established another drug store. Tradition has it that during an illness his death was caused by his wife's having given strychnine in place of the quinine he requested. No descendants are known.

The writers have encountered in Culpeper Co., Va. members of the

Though the writers have never found that there was any relationship between the Newlon, Newland and Newlun families discussed in the preceding pages and the Nicholis Newlin who came to Philadelphia in 1683, they believe that a brief outline of the genealogy of Nicolas Newlin's descendants may interest many members of this and other lines. Nicholas Newlin is believed to have been of English descent, probably a descendant of the de Newland's who came to England with William the

Conqueror. He had resided in Ireland where he had belonged to the Friends or Quaker Church. It was from this Church at Mountmelick (County Tyrone?) that his Certificate of Removal to Pennsylvania was issued. It is interesting to note that in this Certificate his name is spelled "Newland," though it is believed that he and his descendants use the spelling "Newlin" almost exclusively. He was a gentleman in easy circumstance and besides acquiring considerable property in Concord and Birmingham Townships, Chester Co., Pa., he was quite useful and influential in the government of that day. His son, John, died probably unmarried. His son, Nathaniel, was also quite wealthy and influential in his community. The descendants of Nicholas Newlin probably number many thousands. For histories of Nicolas and Nathaniel Newlin see "History of Delaware County, Pennsylvania," by Dr. George Smith, "History of Delaware County, Pennsylvania," by Henry Graham Ashmead, and "History of Chester County, Pennsylvania," by Futhey and Copes.
