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The early history of the Norris Family of Maryland is still shrouded in the dim mystery of the past with but few sign posts to guide the seeker towards genealogical truth. That the family came from an honorable English ancestry there is no doubt as those of the name have been prominent in the history of England since the days of the Conqueror. Whence they came to Maryland is unknown as is also the time and reason for their coming. Years after the arrival of the first Norris, others came to Maryland but the dates of their coming are authenticated by the records of the land office. The records of this office, now being preserved, recopied and indexed under a liberal appropriation from the State may yet establish a relationship between these early settlers and furnish clues for a thorough investigation in the mother country.

The name Norris is first found in Maryland in 1642; according to a record in the State Archives of that year the Provincial Court orders a small debt to be paid to "Thomas Norris." No further record occurs until 1665 when "Thos. Norrish" is transported. He is followed by another Thomas in 1674, by Susanna Norris in 1675, Ann Norris in 1677 and William in 1678.

There is record of an Edward Norris, Anne Arundel Co., 1674; Thomas Norris, Kent Co., 1675; Thomas

Norris, Talbot Co., 1676; William Norris, St. Mary's Co., 1684; Daniel Norris, Kent Co., 1685; while "Henry Norrice, Stephen Norrice and Richard Norrice" are mentioned in the Assembly proceedings.

There is the will of John Norris of St. Mary's County proved in 1710 but his descendants seem to have remained there, later spreading westward into Montgomery and Frederick Counties. Records of these isolated Norrises and groups of Norrises are found in the appendix of this book, inserted there in the hope that some future investigator of the family may find them of service.

1. JOHN NORRIS—(B. -D.1740 M.1685-1716).

John Norris of Anne Arundel Co., known in the records as the "Planter," was probably the "John NorresTransported into the Province 9 Feb., 1677" (Old style).

The earliest positive legal record of this John Norris (1) is found in the following deed of Anne Arundel Co.

"Benjamin Hooker to John Norris—Made 10 day of Aug., 1691—3rd. yeare of the Reign of King William and Mary—For 5500 lbs. of Tobacco. Land Named 'Hookers Addition' lying in the said Co. in a swamp called Herring Creek."

He also patented Jan., 24, 1726-7 from Benjamin Leon Calvert "Norris' Addition," 32 acres in the Herring Creek Swamp and left it to his grandson Thomas by will.

John Norris passed the greater part of his life in Anne Arundel Co. and died there, nevertheless he made extensive purchases of land in Baltimore Co., as attested by these deeds.

"Peter Bond etc. to John Norris—6 Nov., 1716—Between Peter Bond & Wm. Hamilton, Both of Balto.

Co., and John Norris of Anne Arundel Co. 'Prospect'—243 acres—For sum of 30 lbs. sterling money."

"Thomas Preston to John Norris—4 Mar., 1718—Between Thomas Preston of Balto. Co. and John Norris of Anne Arundel Co. Planter—"Everly Hills"—365 acres—for 50 lbs. sterling money of Great Britain—Everly Hills in Balto. Co. above head of Bush River."

"William Parrish to John Norris—20 Sept., 1726—Between William Parrish and wife Susan and John Norris of Anne Arundel Co. for 30 lbs. sterling money of Great Britain. Land called 'Spring Garden' (150 acres) Lying in Patapsco in Baltimore Co."

John Norris conveyed by deed Nov. 9, 1724, part of "Prospect" to his son, Edward, and on the same date part of "Everly Hills" to his son, Benjamin, in each case "For the natural love and Affection which I have and doe bear for my Son....."

John Norris married 1st about 1685 Elizabeth Capell, daughter of Benjamin Capell (d. 1711) and his wife Isabel (d. 1717). To John Norris and Elizabeth (Capell) Norris were born the following children:

2. Elizabeth, born May 6, 1686. Baptized, August 18, 1700.
3. Susannah, born February 2, 1689. Baptized, August 18, 1700.

Elizabeth (Capell) Norris died in November, 1714,

as witnessed by this record, Archives of Maryland:

"Apr. 3, 1715—The petition of John Norris of Anne Arundel County setting forth that he is fined five hundred pounds of tobacco for not attending as a juror at a court held in November last for the said county during the sitting of which said court the petitioner's wife lay very sick and died; that he did not neglect his duty out of any contempt but was purely induced by his affection to and care of his wife—The truth of the said petition being certified by two of the commissioners of the aforesaid county court is thought reasonable and granted, wherefore ordered that the said fine be remitted and not levied."

John Norris married 2nd. April 3, 1716, Mary Newman and to them were born the following children:

9. Thomas, born December 26, 1716.

10. Mary, born February 16, 1718-9.

John Norris made his will, November 1, 1737 and died probably in the fall of 1740 since the probate of his will bears the date of execution, December 6, 1740. After leaving to his grandson, Thomas, "Norris' Addition" in the swamp lands of Herring Creek, he leaves all his land in Anne Arundel County to son, John, and to HIS son, John; to his daughter, Mary Metcalf, "Spring Garden" in Baltimore County; to his son, Thomas, the remainder of "Everly Hills" in Baltimore County except that deeded to his son, Benjamin. To son, Joseph, remainder of a tract of land in Baltimore County called "Prospect" except that part of Prospect deeded to his son, Edward. To his wife, Mary, an interest in his lands during life or widowhood, she to be "sole executor and Adm."

"My children—John, Benjamin, Edward, Joseph, Thomas, Susannah and Mary."

2. ELIZABETH NORRIS—(B. 1686-D. 1704-M. 1704)

Elizabeth Norris, daughter of John and Elizabeth (Capell) Norris, was born in Anne Arundel County, May 6, 1686 and was baptized August 18, 1700.

Her brief history ends with the following entry in the St. James Parish Records:

"Elizabeth Norris married Xber 1, 1704—Buried Xber 3, 1704."

3. SUSANNAH NORRIS—(B. 1689-D. -M.)

Susannah Norris, daughter of John (1) and Elizabeth (Capell) Norris, was born in Anne Arundel County, Maryland, February 2, 1689 and was baptized in St. James Parish Church, August 18, 1700.

Susannah Norris was mentioned in her father's will, probated in 1740 and was possibly the Susannah Norris who married November 1, 1721 Richard Atherton.

4. JOHN NORRIS—(B. 1691-D. 1741-M. 1714)

John Norris, son of John (1) and Elizabeth (Capell) Norris was born, February 28, 1691 and was baptized with several of his brothers and sisters, August 18, 1700 in St. James Parish Church, Anne Arundel County.

John Norris married in 1714 (record partly mutilated) Clare Wells, daughter of Thomas and Mary (Hopkins) Wells, and to them were born the following children:

11. Elizabeth, born November 15, 1715.
12. John, born October 31, 1720.
13. Sarah, born February 27, 1723.
14. Martin, born November 21, 1730.

(This record is probably incomplete.)

This John Norris received by will of his father certain lands in Anne Arundel County and died in 1741. His will dated August 20, 1740 and proved August 31, 1741 mentions his wife, Clare and "my children." No names of children are given.

5. HANNAH NORRIS—(B. 1698-D. -M.)

Hannah Norris, daughter of John (1) and Elizabeth (Capell) Norris was born August 20, 1698 and was baptized, August 18, 1700. She was probably the Hannah Norris who married William Jones in 1716.

6. BENJAMIN NORRIS—(B. 1698-D. 1772-M. 1719)

Benjamin Norris, son of John (1) and Elizabeth (Capell) Norris was born, August 20, 1698 and was baptized, August 18, 1700 in St. James Parish, Anne Arundel County, Maryland.

Benjamin Norris moved to Harford (then Baltimore) County about 1718 and settled upon the estate called "Everly Hills" recently purchased by his father from Thomas Preston. His name first appears on the records of Baltimore County in 1722 when he registered his cattle mark.

"A crop & slitt in the left Ear & a crop upper Sloope & Slit in the right ear."

This Benjamin was a large land holder and an extensive dealer in real estate. The first property he acquired was by deed of gift from his father, November 9, 1724 of part (175 acres) of a tract of land (365 acres) called "Everly Hills" in Baltimore County. "For the natural love & Affection which I have and doe bear unto my Son, Benjamin Norriss of Baltimore County" etc.

He purchased March 30, 1730 from Michael Taylor,

a tract called "Birr" above the head of Bush River; from William Sheapard, March 3, 1741, "Sheapard's Range" at the head of the Gunpowder River; from his brother, Thomas Norris, February 24, 1742, his (Thomas') portion of "Everly Hills"; and from Thomas White, May 14, 1745 a tract of land called "Gibson's Ridge."

"Norris' Addition" was surveyed February 23, 1741 and conveyed by deed in 1748 to "my son-in-law, John Hughes & unto my daughter, Elizabeth, his wife." He conveyed March 5, 1754 "for and in consideration of the natural love good will and affection.....to my beloved son, John Norris.....a tract of land called 'Birr' whereon my son's dwelling house stands..... also 50 acres called 'Gibson's Ridge'." On September 6, 1770 he deeded to his daughter, Sarah, "Addition to Sheapard's Range."

Benjamin Norris was vestryman of St. John's Parish, Baltimore County, and was appointed June 4, 1751 and August 3, 1757. According to the parish records.

"Benjamin Norris & Sarah his wife was married the 8th. of October in the Yr. of our Lord 1719."

Benjamin Norris married on the above date Sarah Whitaker (b. Nov. 10, 1699) daughter of John (d. Nov. 30, 1713) and Catharine Whitaker. To Benjamin and Sarah (Whitaker) Norris were born the following children:

The will of Benjamin Norris is dated April 4, 1770, and was probated February 25, 1772 in Baltimore County, Maryland.

To son John—"Tract called 'Birr' also 50 acres of tract called 'Gibson's Ridge' being the land already given him by deed of gift."

To wife, Sarah—"Tract called 'Everly Hills' where dwelling house and Plantation now is, which my father, John Norris, gave me by deed of Gift."

To son, Benjamin—"After wife's decease 'Everly Hills' also tract of land called 'Sheapard's Range'."

To son, Joseph—"Remaining part of 'Everly Hills'."

To sons, Thomas and Abraham—"Addition to 'Gibson's Ridge' and remaining part of 'Gibson's Ridge' respectively."

To daughter, Sarah—"Addition to 'Sheapard's Range' also 'Enlargement' if she should die, all to go to HER daughter, Mary Norris, wife of James Norris, son of Edward."

To daughter, Hannah Hendon—"Her full share."

"My five sons and three daughters—John, Benjamin, Joseph, Thomas and Abraham; Elizabeth Hughes, Sarah Norris and Hannah Hendon."

Executors—Sons, Benjamin and Joseph.

Codicil—Dec. 29, 1771—"Son Benjamin being deceased to my grandsons, Benjamin, John and Abraham Norris, sons of my son Benjamin my daughter-in-law, Mary Norris, relict of my son, Benjamin."

7. EDWARD NORRIS—(B. 1702-D. 1763-M. 1724)

Edward Norris, son of John (1) and Elizabeth (Capell) Norris was born, February 4, 1701-2 and was baptized in St. James Parish Church, Anne Arundel County, Maryland, May 24, 1702.

His boyhood days were spent in Anne Arundel County near Annapolis, probably until about 1720 when as a young man he removed to Harford, then Baltimore County and settled upon the estate called "Prospect" which his father, John Norris purchased, November 6, 1716 from Peter Bond and William Hamilton.

On November 9, 1724, "John Norris Sr. of Anne Arundel County Planter" and his wife, Mary, deeded to HIS son, Edward, possibly as a wedding gift "for the natural love & Affection which I have and doe bare for my Son, Edward Norriss, of Balto. County" etc. part (116 acres) of tract (243 acres) of land called "Prospect" formerly surveyed for Richard Preston.

Edward Norris married, about 1724 Hannah Scott, daughter of Daniel (d. Mar. 20, 1745) and Elizabeth, (d. May, 1758) Scott and according to the records of St. Johns Parish, Harford County to them were born the following children:

 30. James, born February 25, 1742. Married, December 5, 1765, Mary Norris (74).
 31. Mary, born October 23, 1745. Died, September 26, 1825 (unmarried).
 32. John, born January 26, 1747. Married, November 12, 1772, Martha Long.
 33. Thomas.
 34. Aquila, born June 13, 1754. Married November 25, 1778 Sarah Norris (71).
 35. Susannah Married, George Garrison.
- Thomas, Aquila and Susannah Norris are mentioned in Edward's will but no records of their births are found at St. Johns. Edward Norris was appointed Church Warden, July 5, 1743, and April 3, 1744.

The will of Edward Norris was made December 5, 1761 and proved in the Orphan's Court of Baltimore, March 21, 1763. After a life interest to his wife Hannah, he gives to his son Joseph, "part of a tract of Land, called 'the End,' all of that part that lies north of the high bridge Branch." He bequeaths all the remaining part of his lands to his sons, Edward, James, John, Thomas and Aquila.

"All my children—Joseph, Daniel, Edward, James, John, Thomas, Aquila, Sarah Treadway, Hannah Fulton, Elizabeth Taylor, Susanna and Mary Norris."

Executors—Wife, Hannah (who abides by the will) and Daniel Treadway.

The land referred to in his will, called "The End" was purchased by Edward Norris, August 3, 1743 from Thomas Bond and Ann Fell for the sum of twenty-five lbs. sterling.

8. JOSEPH NORRIS—(B. 1705-D. 1784-M. 1734)

According to the records of St. James Parish, Anne Arundel County, Joseph Norris, son of John (1) and Elizabeth (Capell) Norris was born, February 20, 1705 but there is no date given for his baptism. With his brothers he settled in Hartford (then Baltimore) County and about 1734 married Mary..... To Joseph and Mary Norris were born the following children:

Joseph Norris inherited by will of his father a part of "Prospect" (126 acres). On March 6, 1753 he sold this land to John Bond for fifty lbs. sterling. "The whole, 243 acres.....the part aforesaid being the late dwelling plantation of the said Joseph Norris and devised to said Joseph by.....will of his father, John Norris, of Anne Arundel County."

The will of Joseph Norris dated April 2, 1781 was probated in Baltimore County, May 14, 1784.

"To be buried without Pomp or State (does not doubt they will carry out his wishes)."

To Joseph, Jr.—Tract, "Norris' Wonder," 100 acres —also part of tract—"Norris' Adventure"—twenty-two acres and certificate for eighty acres "Chance." "To my beloved son, Joseph."

"The rest of my personal estate to be equally divided to my children as follows: Edward, John, Joseph, Elizabeth Bosley, Rachel Vaughn, Willimene Bosley, and Walter Wyle's six children to have one child's part that he had by Susannah Norris and William Sinclair's Daughter, Willimene Sinclair to have one child's part."

Executors—Edward, John and Joseph Norris.

9. THOMAS NORRIS—(B. 1716-D. M. 1738)

Thomas Norris, son of John (1) and Mary (Newman) Norris was born in Anne Arundel County, December 26, 1716.

This Thomas Norris sometime previous to 1738 settled in Baltimore County on part of his father's tract of land called "Everly Hills" which he inherited in 1740 by will of John Norris (1). At least part of this land he deeded February 24, 1742 to his brother, Benjamin. On April 6, 1744 "Thomas Norris and Abrilla Norris his wife" conveyed to Antho. Asker "Chadwill's Ridge" for two thousand lbs. of tobacco. There is some confusion in the records since this Thomas (9) was contemporary in Baltimore County with another Thomas (420) of another Norris family, so the foregoing deeds are the only ones of several which positively deal with this Thomas (9).

Thomas Norris (9) married, October 10, 1738 Averilla Scott, and they had the following children:

48. William, born December 24, 1739.

49. Nathanael, born December 16, 1741.

50. Mary, born February 6, 1743.

51. John, born May 6, 1746.

The births of William and Nathanael are registered at St. Johns while the births of Mary and John are registered at St. Thomas', Garrison Forest, Baltimore Count. It would appear from the above that he moved from this vicinity soon after the sale of "Everly Hills" (or a part of it) to his brother, Benjamin. The will of this Thomas Norris has not yet been found so the above children are all that can be positively accredited to him. Thomas Norris executed his father's will and personally appeared before the court of Anne Arundel County, December 6, 1740.

10. MARY NORRIS—(B. 1719-D. M. 1735)

Mary Norris, daughter of John (I) and Mary (Newman) Norris was born in Anne Arundel County, February 16, 1718-9.

Mary Norris married in Anne Arundel County, August 6, 1735 John Metcalf of Baltimore County, and they settled upon a tract of land called "Spring Garden," willed to her by her father in 1740. John Metcalf sold to Thomas Norris December 12, 1745 "Murray's Meadow" for "250 lbs. current money" and November 27, 1753 "John Metcalf of Balto. Co." conveyed land to "John Norris of Anne Arundel Co." and to "John Davis of Frederick Co."

John Metcalf evidently moved shortly afterwards from Baltimore County as there is record, May 20, 1756, "John Metcalf to Thos. Norris and John Norris conveyance.....for sum of 146 lbs. current money,87 lbs., 9 shillings.....and 1500 lbs. of tobaccofor Cattle, all household goods & furnishings of

every sort or kind whatsoever.....all my plantation and tools," etc. •

One child only is accredited to John and Mary (Norris) Metcalf in the records of St. James,' viz:—

15. ELIZABETH NORRIS—(B. 1720-D. M. 1740)

Elizabeth Norris, daughter of Benjamin (6) and Sarah (Whitaker) Norris was born, November 28, 1720 in Harford (then Baltimore) County, Maryland, St. John's Parish. She married, September 11, 1740 John Hughes and had the following children:

In 1748 Benjamin Norris gave to John Hughes by Deed of Gift—"For and in consideration of the natural love & affection I doe bear unto my son-in-law, John Hughes & unto my daughter, Elizabeth, his wife..... 100 acres of land.....it being part of the land reserved for his Lordship's use lying in Baltimore County..... 'Norris' Addition' which was surveyed for Benjamin 23 day of Feb., 1741." Elizabeth Hughes is mentioned in her father's will dated, April 4, 1770 and proved February 25, 1772.

The will of John Hughes dated August 25, 1785 was proved in Baltimore March 5, 1791. He mentions

wife, Elizabeth, sons, Thomas, John, Benjamin, Horatio, Samuel, James, Elijah, and daughters, Mary Bond, Elizabeth Brady, Martha Wheeler and Susannah.

16. JOHN NORRIS—(B. 1723-D. 1772-M. 1744)

John Norris, son of Benjamin (6) and Sarah (Whitaker) Norris was born in Harford County, March 4, 1722-3, according to St. John's Parish Records.

This John Norris married April 3, 1744 Susannah Bradford (b. June 7, 1724) daughter of William and Elizabeth Bradford and to them were born the following children:

John Norris received from his father, Benjamin Norris, March 5, 1754 "For and in consideration of the natural love, good will and affection.....to my beloved son, John Norris.....a tract of land called 'Birr'

whereon my sons dwelling house stands.....also 50 acres called 'Gibsons Ridge'." This tract of land called "Birr," John Norris sold to Robert Adair, December 7, 1769. Among other records is noted July 6, 1769 a controversy between John Norris and James Whitaker; award concerning bounderies of land. "The said John Norris.....shall peaceably and quietly render and give up unto the said Whitaker.....all such land..... by 1st day of August next reserving to himself the said Norris all such Crop" etc.

John Norris is mentioned in his father's will dated April 4, 1770....."To son, John.....Tract called 'Birr' also 50 acres of tract called 'Gibsons Ridge' being the land already given him by deed of Gift." The will of Joseph Norris dated October 6, 1772 mentions "my deceased brother, John" so he evidently died during that year.

17. SARAH NORRIS—(B. 1725-D. 1780-M.)

Sarah Norris, daughter of Benjamin (6) and Sarah (Whitaker) Norris was born May 29, 1725. This Sarah married a Norris some time between 1745 and 1750. To them a daughter was born.

74. Mary, born Married, December 5, 1765,
James Norris (30).

On September 6, 1770, Benjamin Norris deeded to his daughter, Sarah—"In consideration of the natural Love, Good Will and affection which I bear unto my well beloved daughter, Sarah Norris.....Land called 'Addition to Sheapard's Range'."

By will of her father, Benjamin dated April 4, 1770 "To daughter Sarah—tract 'Addition to Sheapard's Range' allso 'Enlargement'.....to have full share with her brothers and sisters (except debts charged against

her in my account book). If she should die (all to go) to HER daughter, Mary Norris (74), wife of James Norris (30), the son of Edward(7) in as full manner as I have left the same to her mother."

The will of Sarah Norris, dated October 20, 1770 was proved in Harford County June 15, 1780. In this will she leaves to daughter Mary (74) wife of James (30) son of Edward (7) "Addition to Sheapard's Range," 68 acres—"Enlargement," 50 acres and other lands 180 acres "being lands my father gave me by deed."

20. JOSEPH NORRIS—(B. 1731-D. 1775-M. 1766)

Joseph Norris, son of Benjamin (6) and Sarah (Whitaker) Norris was born in Harford County January 14, 1730-1. He married November 20, 1766 Christiana Price, but there were no children of this marriage. Joseph Norris died in 1775 and left a will mentioning children of his brothers John, Benjamin, Thomas and Abraham, sisters Elizabeth Hughes, Sarah Norris and Hannah Hendon. He leaves all his real estate to his wife, Christiana, viz: "Everly Hills" and "Addition to Gibson's Ridge."

The following interesting note is gleaned from the Augusta County, Virginia Records.

"In 1775, Joseph Norris of Harford County, Maryland died, leaving a widow Christian whom Nathan Gallion married in April 1776. Nathan moved to Ohio, County (now W. Va.) in 1789. Christiana died June 16, 1801.

21. BENJAMIN NORRIS—(B. 1732-D. 1771-M. 1754)

Benjamin Norris, son of Benjamin (6) and Sarah (Whitaker) Norris was born, October 20, 1732 and

married March 7, 1754 Mary "Devoll," daughter of Samuel and Elizabeth (Talbot) Duvall.

In the will of his father, Benjamin (6) are mentioned these children of Benjamin (21):

76. John.

77. Abraham, married January 22, 1783, Rebecca Cross.

By his father's will dated April 4, 1770 this Benjamin (21) inherited part of "Everly Hills" and "Sheepard's Range" and was appointed executor. The following codicil dated December 29, 1771 indicates that he died in that year—"Son Benjamin being deceased I give and bequeath the aforesaid Lands "Everly Hills" after my wife's decease unto my two grandsons, Benjamin Norris and John Norris, sons of my aforesaid son, Benjamin to be equally divided To my daughter-in-law, Mary Norris, relict of my son, Benjamin, land called 'Sheapards Range' during her natural life then to go to Abraham Norris, son of my son, Benjamin."

24. JOSEPH NORRIS—(B. 1725-D. M. 1750)

Joseph Norris, son of Edward (7) and Hannah (Scott) Norris was born in Harford County, Maryland December 5, 1725 according to the records of St. John's Parish Church. He married, August 2, 1750, "Philizana" Barton. This record of their children is incomplete:

The following deed is on record in Baltimore County:
"August 2, 1758—Joseph Norris & wife to Jacob Bond—Conveyance—'Bond's Gift'—40 acres Joseph Norris, Jr. Carpenter and Phillis, his wife."

By will of his father, Edward, proved March 21, 1763, Joseph received "part of a tract of Land called the

End—all that part that lies north of the high bridge Branch." Part of this land he deeded August 1, 1780 to his brother, Edward, while his brother, Thomas, seems to have possessed the other part though the deed is not recorded.

26. DANIEL NORRIS—(B. 1728-D. 1804-M. 1762)

Daniel Norris, son of Edward (7) and Hannah (Scott) Norris was born in St. John's Parish, Harford County, December 27, 1728. He married 1st., September 28, 1762, Sarah Beaver—2nd. Catharine..... No children were born of either marriage.

The will of Daniel Norris dated December 12, 1802 was proved April 24, 1804. He gives to wife, Catharine, a tract of land called "Prospect"—32 acres and after her death the same to sister Mary to hold for nephew and namesake, Daniel Norris (89) son of brother James. He mentions brothers James (30), Thomas (33) and Aquila (34); Sisters Hannah Fulton (28), Susannah Garrison (35), and Mary Norris (31); nephew Edward Norris (84) son of Edward (29).

27. ELIZABETH NORRIS—(B. 1736-D. M. 1757)

Elizabeth Norris, daughter of Edward (7) and Hannah (Scott) Norris was born April 29, 1736. She married October 18, 1757 John Taylor. There is record of only one child at St. John's.

80. John Taylor, born October 4, 1759.

28. HANNAH NORRIS—(B. 1738-D. 1804-M. 1754)

Hannah Norris, daughter of Edward (7) and Hannah (Scott) Norris was born in Harford County, September 7, 1738 and died there May 6, 1804.

She married October 4, 1754 John Fulton. There is no record of children at St. John's.

29. EDWARD NORRIS—(B. 1741-D. 1793-M. 1771)

Edward Norris, son of Edward (7) and Hannah (Scott) Norris was born April 8, 1741 in Harford (then Baltimore) County, Maryland and died there, August 25, 1793.

This Edward, a planter of means was but twenty-two years of age when his father died, and to him fell part of "Prospect" upon the division of the estate. This heritage he increased from time to time by purchase of property from his relatives and others. He purchased from his brother, James, August 1, 1780 "For 40 lbs. Current Money of Pennsylvaniaall that part of a tract of land left to said James Norris by his father, Edward Norris called 'Prospect' and also part of a tract of land called 'the End' containing 40 acres." He purchased on the same date from his brother, Joseph "all that part of a tract of land left to said Joseph Norris by his father, Edward Norris called 'the End' " while May 11, 1784 he bought part of "Cleggett's Forest" from John Beal Bordley.

Edward Norris married, November 21, 1771, Elizabeth Amos, (b. Oct. 21, 1752-d. Aug. 19, 1805) daughter of William Amos, (b. Mar. 3, 1717/8-d. Feb. 26, 1814) and Hannah (McComas) Amos (b. Apr. 6, 1723), William Amos was a noted minister of the Society of Friends and the records of Gunpowder Meeting show great concern over the marriage of his daughter to one of the Episcopal persuasion. She persisted, however, in her determination and was dropped from the roll of the society as the following records testify:

"At our Monthly Meeting held at Gunpowder,

25th of 12th Month 1771—Elizabeth Amos now Norris has Gone out in marriage. This meeting appoints Oliver Matthews and Mordecai Price to draw a Testimony against her Disorderly Conduct and produce it at next Monthly Meeting."

"At our Monthly Meeting held at Gunpowder 22nd. of 1st Month 1772—The Friends appointed to Draw a Testimony against Elizabeth Norris Complied therewith which is put in the hands of John Wilson In order to be read at the Close of a publick meeting at Little Falls if she Dont Incline to appeal against it—Provide her with a copy if she desires it and Return the said paper to next Monthly Meeting."

"At our Monthly Meeting held at Gunpowder, 25th of 3rd. Mo. 1772—Agreeable to direction of last Monthly Meeting some lines have been produced in order to Testify against Elizabeth Norris.

Testimony

"Elizabeth Norris (before marriage Amos) having gone out in marriage to a man of another society and was married by a Priest and for so doing this meeting Declares Her to be no member of our Society, until she condemns the above mentioned Conduct to the Satisfaction of this meeting, that she may by a True sence is our sincere Desire."

To Edward and Elizabeth (Amos) Norris were born the following children:

The will of Edward Norris dated August 16, 1793 was proved in Harford County, September 25, 1793. After fixing a life interest for his wife, Elizabeth, he leaves his landed estate to be equally divided between his sons, Edward and Oliver. To sons, John and William, he leaves 50 lbs. sterling each. His personal estate to be equally divided among his daughters, Hannah, Elizabeth, Susannah, Mary and Ann.

Executors—Wife Elizabeth, Aquila Norris, James Amos.

Elizabeth (Amos) Norris survived her husband about twelve years. The following notice appears in the "Baltimore American":

"Departed this Transitory life August 19, 1805, Elizabeth Norris, in the 53rd year of her age, relict of the late Edward Norris of Harford County; her remains were deposited in the ancient family burying ground."

30. JAMES NORRIS—(B. 1743-D. 1824-M. 1765)

James Norris, son of Edward (7) and Hannah (Scott) Norris was born February 25, 1742-3. He married December 5, 1765, Mary Norris (74) daughter of Sarah Norris (17).

No children are mentioned in the records of St. Johns but the wills of his brother Daniel and sister Mary mention each one child:

31. MARY NORRIS—(B. 1745-D. 1825)

Mary Norris, daughter of Edward (7) and Hannah (Scott) Norris was born October 23, 1745 and died September 26, 1825 unmarried.

"Big Aunt Mollie" as she was known in the family, lived with her brother, Aquila and many stories of her kindness and good humor are still preserved. She is best remembered by her skill as a dancer and no party was complete without "Big Aunt Mollie" who could "dance and play the fiddle at the same time." Her dancing slippers are still in existence.

The will of Mary Norris dated February 19, 1825 and proved in Harford County October 4, 1825, mentions brother Aquila (34); nephew John (82); Edward (84) son of brother Edward (29); Elizabeth (85) daughter of brother Edward (29); nephew Oliver (87), niece Susan Cunningham (93) daughter of brother Aquila (34); nephew John Norris (82) and his wife Mary; Charlotte (90) daughter of brother James (30); Rebecca Norris wife of Edward (84); Eliza Ann (154) and Mary (155) daughters of Edward (84); Mary wife of Aquila (34) and Susan wife of Rhesa (92).

34. AQUILA NORRIS—(B. 1754-D. 1825-M. 1778-1804)

Aquila Norris, son of Edward (7) and Hannah (Scott) Norris was born in Harford (then Baltimore) County, June 13, 1754 namesake of his uncle Aquila Scott.

He was married 1st. November 25, 1778 his cousin

(71) Sarah Norris (b. Jan. 23, 1756) daughter of John (16) and Susannah (Bradford) Norris by whom he had all his children and 2nd. December 23, 1804 Mary (Waltham) Dutton, widow of Robert Dutton and mother of Susannah Dutton who married October 30, 1804 his son, Rhesa (92).

"Aquila Norris of Edward" was appointed Captain of the Harford County Militia Apr. 9, 1778—Revolutionary War. His will dated June 6, 1823 was proved in Harford County May 31, 1825. He mentions son, Rhesa, wife Mary, daughter Susan Cunningham and "granddaughter Sarah Ann Elizabeth Norris, daughter of my son, Silas Norris."

Aquila Norris purchased, May 11, 1784 from John B. Boardley "all that part of a tract of land being part of Clegget's Forrest, Harford County, containing seventy-three and one-half acres."

35. SUSANNAH NORRIS—(B. -D. 1811-M.)

Susannah Norris, youngest child of Edward (7) and Hannah (Scott) Norris, was born in Harford County, Maryland, between the years 1755 and 1760.

This Susannah Norris married George Garrison whose will mentioning his wife, Susannah was proved December 9, 1807. This marriage was childless. The will of Susannah Garrison dated June 9, 1809 was proved in Harford County May 14, 1811. She mentions niece Susanna (93) daughter of brother Aquila (34), nieces Hannah Scott (81), Elizabeth Norris (85), and Susannah Norris (86) daughter of brother Edward (29); sister Mary (31) and nephew John (82).

64. BENJAMIN BRADFORD NORRIS—(B. 1745-D. 1790-M. 1768)

Benjamin Bradford Norris, son of John (16) and Susannah (Bradford) Norris was born in Harford (then Baltimore) County, Maryland, August 16, 1745. He married at St. John's Church, April 3, 1768 Elizabeth Richardson and to them were born the following children:

A soldier in the Revolution he served under his brother Jacob (68) in the 6th Md. Reg't and was with Washington in the New Jersey campaign. He was elected to the first Legislature of the State of Maryland and died in April 1790.

Benjamin Bradford Norris had a large family but only two sons, one of which died in infancy and the other died of yellow fever in Norfolk aged twenty-one.

65. JOHN NORRIS—(B. 1747-D. 1835-M. 1785)

John Norris son of John (16) and Susannah (Bradford) Norris was born in Harford County June 6, 1747. Very little is known of this John except that he married February 18, 1785 Sarah Richardson and had the following children:

William Norris, son of John (16) and Susannah (Bradford) Norris was born in Harford County March 26, 1749. He married December 24, 1780 Martha Amos, daughter of William Amos (b. Mar. 3, 1717-8 d. Feb. 26, 1814) and Hannah (McComas) Amos (b. Apr. 6, 1723) and had the following children:

He mentions sons Jacob and William both deceased; granddaughters Henrietta and Susan Ellen Morgan, and son Thomas Amos Norris. A codicil dated July 28, 1825 mentions granddaughter Henrietta Morgan deceased.

67. MARTHA NORRIS—(B. 1750-D. -M. 1771).

Martha Norris, daughter of John (16) and Susannah (Bradford) Norris was born in St. John's Parish, Harford County August 16, 1750.

She married January 6, 1771 Vincent Richardson and to them were born the following children:

68. JACOB NORRIS—(B. 1753-D. 1807-M. 1785)

Jacob Norris, son of John (16) and Susannah (Bradford) Norris was born in Harford County, May 10, 1753.

As Lieutenant of one of the Maryland regiments in the Revolutionary War, he served with Washington in the New Jersey Campaign and was wounded and invalided home. His official record, according to Heitman's Hist. Reg.-Officers of Continental Army, is as follows:

2nd. Lieut. 6th. Md. Oct. 10, 1777; 1st. Lieut. Nov. 26, 1778; wounded and taken prisoner at Camden Aug. 16, 1780; transferred to 5th Md. Jan. 1, 1781; prisoner to close of war on parole; Capt. 9th U. S. Infantry Jan. 8, 1799; honorably discharged June 15, 1800.

By will of his grandfather Benjamin (6) he inherited part of "Sheapards' Range" but later moved to Baltimore County where he purchased "Hooks & Crooks" and "Bosleys Chance Enlargement."

Abraham Norris married January 22, 1783 Rebecca Cross. His will is dated May 19, 1800 and was probated June 5, 1800 "Beloved wife Rebecca & two youngest children viz: Margaret and Asalph the profits arising from my Plantation situate in Baltimore County near the Black Horse Tavern now rented to a certain Thomas Turner?.....consisting of 3 tracts....."Sheapard's Range,' 'Hooks & Crooks' and an 'Addition to Sheapard's Range' during her natural life.....after her decease I give it to my children to be equally divided. To my dearly beloved children:

Hannah Norris, daughter of Edward (29) and Elizabeth (Amos) Norris was born in Harford County, Maryland December 17, 1772 and died in 1814. She married March 5, 1795 Joseph Scott of Baltimore and to them were born the following children:

82. JOHN NORRIS—(B. 1774-D. 1829-M. 1811)

John Norris, son of Edward (29) and Elizabeth (Amos) Norris was born December 24, 1774 in Harford County, Maryland. He removed to Baltimore when a youth and entered the counting house of Elisha Tyson, a member of the Society of Friends. On reaching his majority, John Norris formed a partnership with Isaac Tyson, the son of his late employer, and together they conducted a successful milling establishment for the manufacture of flour, until the failure of his health compelled him to give up active business and try the recuperative influence of a voyage to Spain and Portugal. Upon his return he built a residence at "Olney," Harford County, on a part of his ancestral estate and there passed the remainder of his days.

John Norris married September 17, 1811 Mary Rooker, (b. Apr. 12, 1785-d. July 8, 1868), an English lady who came to this country with her father and mother in 1807. She was daughter of the Rev. James Rooker (b. 1756-d. Dec. 1, 1828) and Mary (Berry) Rooker (b. 1762-d. Dec. 31, 1814) of Walsall near Birmingham, England.

To John and Mary (Rooker) Norris were born the following children:

John Norris died at "Olney" October 16, 1829—By his will dated April 8, 1829 and proved November 12, 1829, he leaves a life interest in all his estate to his wife, Mary. To son, John Saurin Norris, farm and dwelling house. To son, Charles Sidney Norris, lot and warehouse on Pratt St., Baltimore at the head of Smith's Dock. To daughter, Sarah Ann Norris, land in Harford County and \$400.00. To sister, Elizabeth, personality. Executor, Cousin Isaac Tyson. Witnesses Rhesa Norris, John Reese, Cardiff D. Norris and David Lee Norris.

John Norris purchased December 11, 1810 from his brother, Oliver, part of "Prospect" and "Clegates Forrest" for the sum of \$1333.33. This amount was paid June 11, 1811 and constituted an "agreement between Oliver & John Norris, sons of Edward who died in 1793." This land lay "on the South side of the Public Road between Bel Air and Joppa." This land had become the property of Oliver Norris by deed of partition with his brother, Edward, dated December 4, 1810.

83. WILLIAM NORRIS—(B. 1777-D. 1809-M. 1802)

William Norris, son of Edward (29) and Elizabeth (Amos) Norris, was born in Harford County, March 7, 1777.

He married in Baltimore, March 16, 1802 Rebecca Smith (b. July 8, 1786) daughter of Job Smith and they had the following children:

"At the close of that brief term of service, extending only to eighteen months, the Rev. Oliver Norris

took charge of Christ Church. Mr. Norris was of Quaker descent, but occasionally attending the services of St. Peter's Church, Baltimore, during the ministry of Mr. Dashiell, first became convinced of sin, then of his need of a Savior, and then of the excellency of our service to build up a convert in the true faith and practice of a Christian. He has often detailed to me the circumstances of his conversion. He first ministered at Elk Ridge and near Bladensburg in Maryland, and then came to Virginia. He was an affectionate pastor and faithful preacher of the Gospel, very dear to his people, and esteemed in the Church of Virginia."

A portion of the funeral oration, preached by Bishop Meade is printed in vol. 2, pages 261-2.

Thomas Miller Myers son of John Norris Myers (240) and Laura Virginia (Starr) Myers was born on Park Ave., Baltimore, Maryland, April 3, 1884. A Mechanical Engineer, educated at Dickinson College and Lehigh University and a member of Beta Theta Pi Fraternity. After leaving college in 1904, was a resident of Bethlehem, Pa., Johnstown, Pa., Fort Wayne, Ind., and New York City.

He married November 29, 1911 Nellie Penrose Vass (b. Jan. 6, 1887) daughter of Henry FitzHugh Vass (b. Apr. 2, 1855-m. Feb. 5, 1879) and Minnehaha (France) Vass of Danville, Va.

Line B. 415. WILLIAM NORRIS—(B. -D. 1720-M)

William Norris, possibly the brother of John (1) was probably the William Norris referred to in the following record:

"William Norris—Imported in the ship, Dover, of London—Capt. John Harris Commander, 1678."

A William Norris was Clerk of the Vestry of All Faiths Parish, St. Marys County and is frequently mentioned in the records from January, 1697 to December, 1700. No other Norris records in this parish.

He first appears in Baltimore County in 1705 for in that year "William Norris from Caddwallider Jones—Conveyance. "Caddwallider"—100 acres—June 30, 1705 for 2500 lbs. of Tobacco." This land he sold to Samuel Jackson December 28, 1705 for the same price as purchased. He again purchased land in 1707 as witnessed by this deed:

"William Norris from Samuel Brown—Conveyance.

'Edens Addition' 100 acres-December 15, 1707 for 3500 lbs. of Tobacco."

William Norris married previous to 1704 Sarah..... and according to the records of St. George's Parish, Baltimore County died May 2, 1720 leaving the following children:

417. Elce Norris, born April 16, 1713. Married April 4, 1733 John Lee.

The will of William Norris dated May 2, 1720 was probated May 21, 1720 in Baltimore County. He leaves to his daughters, Mary and Elce, his "Whole and sole estate between them" and appoints as the executor "Henry Million my well beloved friend."

Line C. 418. THOMAS NORRIS—(B. -D. -M.)

Thomas Norris, possibly brother of John (1) was the first of the name Norris to settle in Baltimore County. The "List of Early Settlers" at Annapolis records the arrival of two Norris settlers of the name Thomas. March 3, 1665 "Thomas Norrish" and others assign their "rights of Land due them by their transportation.....unto John Morgan of Talbot County" while on March 3, 1674 Joseph Tilly "proves his right.....for Transporting Thomas Norris" and others into the colony.

Very little is known of this Thomas. The records of St. George's Parish, Baltimore County, state that "Elizabeth Norris wife of Thomas Norris, died December 1710." The following land patent may be found at Annapolis.

"Thomas Norris of Baltimore County 'Envell Chese' Patent.....has due 230 acres.....by a warrant for 200 acres granted May 10, 1696.....as also by

assignment of 30 acres from Thomas Hooker out of a warrant for 38 acres granted to sd. Hooker 19 Feb., 1695 We.....grant unto Thomas Norris tract called 'Envell Chese'.....according to certificate of Survey taken returned May 20, 1696."

Thomas Norris died without leaving a will and there are no records of children at St. Georges or St. Johns. However, he had one child, an only son and heir.

419. John Norris, (d. 1761).

This relationship is established by a deed dated June 4, 1746 when John Norris conveys land to William Bennett.

"17 May, 1696 Land (230 acres) laid out for Thos. Norris of Baltimore County.....Thos. Norris died leaving only son and heir John Norris," etc.

419. JOHN NORRIS—(B. -D. 1761-M. 1712)

John Norris, son of Thomas (418) was probably born about 1690. He inherited from his father as stated above "Envell Chese" 230 acres, which he sold June 4, 1746 to William Bennett, all excepting "one half acre contained in this deed where the rooling house now stands" same not to be sold but to be preserved "for the use of John Norris."

John Norris purchased May 5, 1724 from "Alexander Maccomas, Carpenter and Elizabeth his wife.... ..for 3000 lbs. of Tobacco.....Land called 'Macedon' Lying in Baltimore County at the head of Bush River." He also purchased March 3, 1730 from Archibald Rollo 'Rebeccas Lot' for 4000 lbs. of Tobacco.

John Norris married about 1712 Ann.....and to them were born the following children:

The will of John Norris dated March 26, 1760 was proved in Baltimore County May 18, 1761. In this will he gives "to wife, Ann all personal estate during widowhood or life and at her decease to be equally divided among my seven children, viz: Thomas, James, William, Ann Greer, Sarah Hitchcock, Rebecca Elliott, and Mary Love." To "James Expectation" and "Rebecca Lot." Executrix—Beloved wife Ann.

420. THOMAS NORRIS—(B. 1713-D. 1761-M. 1736)

Thomas Norris, son of John (419) and Ann Norris was born in Harford County, November 27, 1713. He married December 26, 1736 Elizabeth McComas, daughter of Alexander (d. Jan. 1761-m. Nov. 19, 1713) and Elizabeth (Day) McComas. To Thomas and Elizabeth (McComas) Norris were born the following children:

To son Thomas, "land called 'Turkey Range'." (54 acres).

To son Alexander, "land called 'Hills & Dales'." (47 acres.)

To son James, "negro girl called Phillis."

Witnesses, Daniel, Solomon and Moses Maccomas. Executrix, "My loving wife Elizabeth."

Elizabeth Norris survived her husband and was living February 27, 1769.

446. AQUILA NORRIS—(B. 1776-D. 1856-M. 1810)

Aquila Norris, son of Thomas Norris (430) was probably the Aquila who settled in Sangamon County, Ill. According to Powers (Sangamon County Ill. Settlers, 1876) Aquila Norris lived near Baltimore, Md. and married there Eleanor Norris, and to them were born eight children. Of these children three died young. 452. Edward, the eldest died near Baltimore, August 30, 1830, aged nineteen years.

With four children Aquila and Eleanor Norris emigrated to Sangamon County, Ill., arriving in Round Prairie, six miles east of Springfield in April 1835. Of these children:

453. James L. Norris, born July 18, 1813. Married, October 17, 1841 in Sangamon County Sarah E. Cole.

454. John Norris, born October 17, 1814. Died, September 28, 1844, married October 17, 1841 Mary W. Cole (d. Feb. 22, 1858).

Isaac Norris, son of Thomas (430) and Hannah (Norrington) Norris, was born near Baltimore, June 25, 1783. He married August 5, 1805 Charity Ann Conley (b April 14, 1786) and they moved to Zanesville, Ohio in 1811.

They had a son Elias (457) who had a son John (458) who had a son Carey E. Norris (459) living (1895) in Zanesville, Ohio.

LINE D. NORRIS FAMILY OF ST. MARYS COUNTY, MD.

The Norris family of St. Marys County is descended from John Norris whose will was proved in that county August 2, 1710.

This John married previous to 1680 Susannah Heard, daughter of John (d. 1696) and Susannah Heard (d. 1707) and according to his will had sons Thomas, Luke, John, Mark and daughters Monica, Elizabeth and Mary. In 1702 John Norris testified that he was 50 years old and that his son John, Jr. was 22. A combination of the will records, marriage records and the following church and county records makes possible a fairly complete history of this family to the year 1800. Ann Norris whose will was proved June 10, 1766 was widow of the above John Norris, Jr.
