

FOREWORD

The author, Thomas Allen Perkins, and his mother, were always interested in the family genealogy. After retiring from the practice of law, he spent seven years in tracing his ancestry, examining records in many towns, even going to England for this purpose. His untimely death left the work unfinished, and further research was necessary.

INTRODUCTORY NOTE

Thomas Allen Perkins, the compiler of this genealogy, died 18

September 1932.

As a boy he became interested in the history of his family by hearing his mother and his grandfather discuss the older generations of the Perkins family. In 1893 he assisted his brother in a collaboration of the records of the Perkins families of Wells and York, Me., but owing to pressure of other duties the work was soon put aside not to be taken up until the winter of 1925 when an effort was started to complete a genealogy of the descendants of Jacob Perkins of Wells. The work was still in progress at the time of the death of the compiler.

During the past eight years Mr. Perkins gave freely of his time and money to the task. He searched town, city, county, State, United States Census, and church records, copied family records and inscriptions on gravestones and monuments, interviewed a large number of persons and families in their homes, consulted family histories in public libraries, and obtained much information by correspondence.

In 1930 he visited the old church of St. John the Baptist, in the parish of Hillmorton, co. Warwick, England, and had a copy made of all references to the name of Perkins appearing on the church

records down to 1633.

The compiler of this genealogy sometimes included material that exceeded the scope of this book, and the editor has felt obliged to omit some of the records which did not deal directly with a member

of the Perkins family.

JACOB PERKINS OF WELLS, MAINE, AND HIS DESCENDANTS.

I. ANCESTRY OF JACOB PERKINS.*

1. JOHN¹ PERKINS, son of Henry† and Elizabeth (Sawbridge) Perkins, born at Hillmorton, co. Warwick, England, and baptized there 23 Dec. 1583, died at Ipswich, Mass., in 1654. He married,

9 Oct. 1608, Judith Gater, daughter of Michael Gater.
He sailed from Bristol, England, 1 Dec. 1630, in the ship *Lion*,
William Pierce, master, bound for Boston, Mass., taking with him
his entire family, consisting of his wife and five children. The boat arrived at Nantasket 5 Feb. 1631 and the next day anchored before

He settled first in Boston, where on 18 May 1631 he took the oath of freeman which admitted him to all rights of the colony. On 7 Nov. 1632 the General Court appointed Capt. Traske, William Cheeseboro, Mr. Conant, and John Perkins to set down the bounds between Roxbury and Dorchester, Mass.

*Jacob Perkins of Wells, Me., was a great-grandson of John¹ Perkins and the line of descent which is here given is based on material found in "The Family of John Perkins of Ipswich, Mass.," 1889, by George A. Perkins, M.D., Part I, pp. 1-21; part III, pp. 1-10. †Henny Perkins, of Hillmorton, perhaps the eldest son of Thomas and Alice (Kebble) Perkins of Hillmorton, was buried 11 Mar. 1608/9. He married at Hillmorton, 29 Nov. 1579, ELIZABETH SAWBRIDGE.

Letters of administration upon his estate were granted at Litchfield. 5 Apr. 1609, to

Thomas Perkins, the oldest son.

A bond was given for the tuition of Margaret, Edward, Anne, Sarah, Francis, William,

Lucy, Elizabeth, and James Pirkins, "the other children."

The inventory, dated 22 Mar. 1608, was taken by Rowland Wilcox, Gent., Thomas Pirkins, John Sawbridge, Thomas Compton, "yeomen." Amount, £336, 8s. 8d.

In 1633 he removed to Ipswich, Mass., the colony newly founded by John Winthrop, where he had several grants of land. His house was near the river, at the entrance to Jeffries Neck, on what is now

East Street. Here he engaged in agriculture.

He was a deputy to the session of the General Court held in Boston 25 May 1636. He held many town offices, occupied places of trust, and was one of the leading men at Ipswich. His will, dated 28 Mar. 1654, mentions all of his children except Ann.

II. JACOB PERKINS AND HIS DESCENDANTS.

4. JACOB PERKINS (Jacob, 3 Jacob, 2 John 1), of Cape Neddick in York,* who, with his descendants, is the subject of this book, was born at Ipswich, Mass., 15 Feb. 1685 and died intestate at Wells between 19 Mar. 1770, when he acknowledged a deed of land in Wells, and 15 Oct. 1772, when in a deed he is called "late of Wells, deceased." He married first Lydia STOVER, daughter of John and Abigail (Alcott) Stover of York; and secondly, at Hampton Falls, N. H., 12 Oct. 1717 (Rev. Theophilus Cotton, pastor of the First Church, officiating), Anna Littlefield, who was baptized at Wells 28 June 1702, daughter of Josiah and Lydia Littlefield.

On 27 Mar. 1708 Hannah Green, widow of John Green (mariner, once of Cape Neddick in York), with her surviving children, sold for £50 to Jacob Perkins, cooper, of Ipswich, Mass., 60 acres of upland and marsh at Cape Neddick, situated on the southwest side of Cape Neddick River between two creeks or coves, and 4 acres of marsh between Cape Neddick river and Ogunquit River, together with a house and barn on the said upland. (York Deeds, vol. 7, fo. 100.)

Jacob Perkins settled on this land and made it his home until 23 Oct. 1717, when he sold to James Carr, Jr., cordwainer, of Newbury, Mass., this property, which consisted of a piece of upland and meadow ground situated on the southwest side of Cape Neddick River in the township of York, where the said Perkins then lived, containing by estimation seventy acres, sixty acres whereof was sold to the said Perkins by Hannah Green and her children by a deed bearing the date of 20 Mar. 1708, the other ten acres given to said Perkins by the town of York 17 Mar. 1713/4, with one dwelling house and barn standing on said land, together with six oxen, three cows, ten swine, nine sheep, one mare, four yearlings, and three calves, and the whole of hay or corn upon said land with all the other materials for the husbandry, Anna, wife of said Jacob Perkins, releasing and setting over unto said James Carr all her rights of dowry and thirds. (York Deeds, vol. 8, fo. 247.)

On 25 Oct. 1717 he bought from Isaac Provender $48\frac{1}{2}$ acres of land in York, situated by the sea shore between the great marsh and the Wells bounds. (York Deeds, vol. 9, fo. 102.)

Within two months he again bought land. On 9 Dec. 1717 he purchased from Thomas Mason, weaver, of Wells, 100 acres in the township of Wells, bounded as follows: southwesterly by land of George Jacobs, from a stake upon the bank of Ogunquit River running up into the country upon a west-southwest line or point to a white pine tree marked on four sides, and from said white pine tree running forty poles or rods upon a north-northwest line to a white oak marked on four sides, the said white oak being the corner bounds between said granted land and land belonging to Zachary Goodall, and from the aforesaid white oak running upon an east-northeast line to a black ash tree marked, at the head of the salt water in Clay Hill Creek, and so on the same course directly to Ogunquit River, and southeasterly upon Ogunquit River till it come down to the bound stake before mentioned. (York Deeds, vol. 9, fo. 103.)

It was on this farm in Ogunquit that Jacob Perkins spent most of the remainder of his life, and some of his descendants still live on part of his old homestead. The business section of the present village of Ogunquit occupies a portion of the original farm.

By a deed dated 13 Oct. 1766 Jacob Perkins of Wells, yeoman, gave to his youngest son, Jacob Perkins of Wells, husbandman, all his homestead land and buildings where he then lived at a place called Ogunquit in Wells, containing 70 acres, more or less, fronting southeasterly on Ogunquit River and running back west-southwesterly between the lands of the late George Jacobs on the southeasterly side and those of the late Gersham Maxwell, deceased, on the northwesterly side to the utmost boundary of his farm, or however the said farm may be bounded. (York Deeds, vol. 41, p. 236.)

Jacob Perkins bought 6 July 1767 from his son Stephen Perkins four acres of upland with dwelling, barn, and orchard situated on the highway adjoining the old homestead, and sold it to his son Jacob Perkins 16 Feb. 1769. (York Deeds, vol. 40, p. 123; vol. 41, p. 193.)

He was a cooper by trade, a farmer, an extensive landowner for that period, and a part owner of mills in Phillipstown (now Sanford), York, and in the part of Berwick later set off as North Berwick. The records show that during his life he bought and sold many tracts of land in York, Wells, and Phillipstown.

He was interested in public affairs of Wells and served that town as a constable, surveyor of highways, and selectman.

In 1736 he was appointed a member of a committee to finish the first meeting house in Wells.

He was a large man physically and was called "Much Big" Perkins by the Indians of whom he had no fear.

On 4 Sept. 1795 Nathaniel Taylor and wife Anna conveyed to Jesse Perkins 7 acres in Wells adjoining land of Samuel Jefferds, but reserving two appletrees for life. (York Deeds, vol. 110, p. 89.)

On 4 Sept. 1795 Nathaniel Taylor conveyed to his sons Jacob and Dimon 46 acres of land next to land he sold Jesse Perkins, with dwelling, etc., also 50 acres of land and 1/24 part of Little River mill. (York Deeds, vol. 62, p. 141.)

In a deed dated 8 July 1763 Joseph Perkins, yeoman, of Wells, affirming sole ownership, sold for £11 5s. to William Westcot of York, mariner, a tract of land in the township of York, containing 12½ acres, being half of the 25 acres of land his father, land. Bestime former by lived and died sided of the product of the state of the stat Jacob Perkins, formerly lived on and died seized of, together with all privileges, bounded as follows: beginning at the northerly corner of Norton Woodbridge's land on the easterly side of the highway that leads from York to Wells, then running by said land to the sea and by the sea northeasterly to land in possession of Col. Nathaniel Donnell and by said Donnell's land to the highway aforesaid and by said highway to place of beginning. (York Deeds, vol. 38, p. 78.)

John⁵ Perkins (*Jacob*⁴), of Wells, born at Cape Neddick in York about 1712 and as an adult baptized at Wells 8 Feb. 1735/6, died between 8 Mar. 1792, the date of his will, and 28 May 1795, when it was entered for probate. He married ELIZABETH PEARCE, daughter of William and Mary (Beale) Pearce of York.

On 15 Feb. 1720/1 John Stover, yeoman, of York, in con-

sideration of real and parental affection for his little grandson, John Perkins, son of his well-beloved daughter, Lydia Perkins, late of said York, the said John being one of the sons of his son-in-law, Jacob Perkins, of said York, conveyed to him one certain grant of 30 acres. (York Deeds, vol. x, fo. 170.)

On 17 Sept. 1737 John Perkins of Wells bought from his father, Jacob Perkins, a tract of land in the township of York situated by the sea between the great marsh and Wells bounds, containing 181/4 acres, the same being purchased by the said Jacob Perkins of Isaac Provender, and bounded as follows: beginning at the dividing line between York and Wells, at the southeast side by the highway, being a small red oak tree marked on four sides, and running from thence by said dividing line down to the sea, and by the said sea wall to the bounds of land formerly Robert Gray's now Mr. Gunnison's, which is a small pitch pine tree marked on four sides, and running from thence on a southwest line eighty poles to a red oak tree standing by said highway, marked on four sides, and from thence bounded by the highway to the said red oak tree first mentioned (Jacob Perkins excepting and reserving to himself, his heirs, and assigns the benefit and privilege of passing and repassing with carts, sleds, or otherwise to and from the landing place where the path now goes, he and they keeping up a sufficient pair of bars or gate so as that the said John nor his heirs may be in the least damnified). It was understood that if said John Perkins died without lawful issue then the above premises should descend to the heirs of said Jacob Perkins. (York Deeds, vol. 18, fo. 273.)

The house which John Perkins bought on this land and in which he was living as early as 1742 was torn down by his son Jedediah Perkins, who built another on the place later owned and occupied by Isaiah S. Perkins. It stands not far from the sharp curve in the shore road near Perkins Cove. The barn nearby occupies the site of the original house.

A town meeting in 1773 was held at the house of Stephen Perkins. In 1780 he was taxed 18 bushels, 24 quarts of corn on property valued £335 English money.

The census of 1790 gives the family of Stephen Perkins as consisting of 2 males over 16 years of age, and 4 females; the census of 1800 gives 1 male over 26 years of age, 1 male and

Thatcher Perkins attained prominence as a mechanic when a young man, for his skill and abilities were of a high order. As early as 1843 he had taken out patents on his inventions. He was master of machinery for the Baltimore & Ohio Railroad from 1 June 1847 to 12 Feb. 1851, and he constructed an engine for burning bituminous coal in 1849.

He became a member of the firm of Smith & Perkins, which was located at the Virginia Locomotive Works, Alexandria, Va., and built locomotives from 1815 to 1858 for the Baltimore & Ohio Railroad and the Pennsylvania Railroad.

He was again appointed master of machinery for the Baltimore & Ohio Railroad 1 Dec. 1859, resigning 10 May 1856 to become the superintendent of the Pittsburgh Locomotive and Car Works. In 1869 he took charge of the machinery department of the Louisville & Nashville Railroad, a position which he held until he retired in 1879.

He was the inventor of the Perkins ten-wheel locomotive in 1863, the Perkins passenger engine in 1865 and 1866, and also
