Preface

HEN I started work on this book it was my intention to give an account of the ancestry of William Pountney of Birmingham, as well as a history of his descendants. However, I found that the cost of tracing an English family was quite prohibitive, so I have been obliged to keep to an account of the descendants of William Pountney through two of his children. I have hopes that some time in the future it will be possible to supplement this book with a second volume tracing the pedigree of William.

Of the material contained in this book, the majority of it was collected from the various members of the family mentioned; while the list of the children of William and Alice Pountney was compiled for me by the firm of Parkhouse and Allee in Birmingham, who instituted a search of the registers of the various parishes in Birmingham and the vicinity. For the last mentioned work I am indebted to Philip Baldwin Bekeart of San Francisco, who retained the services of the firm for me. It was also through the financial support of Mr. Bekeart that the publication of this book was possible.

I might add, before going into the family of William Pountney, that the Pountney family is, in all likelihood, a branch of the Poultney family which was seated at Poultney-Misterton in Leicestershire. The first of this family was Nigel de Pultney in the time of King John, and the senior line resided at Poultney-Misterton down to the middle of the seventeenth century when the family died out in female issue. The present representative of the senior line is the Marquess of Crewe, a descendant of Sir Clippesby Crewe of Crewe (died in 1648), who married Jane, daughter and co-heiress of Sir John Poultney of Poultney-Misterton.

Of the junior lines one was represented in the 18th century by Sir William Poultney who was created Earl of Bath in 1742. This title became extinct in 1808 on the death of Henrietta Laura Johnstone-Poultney, Countess of Bath, a cousin of the first Earl.

The name, while originally Pultney, has been spelled by various branches of the family as Poultney and Pountney. To-day members of the family are to be found mainly in the west

central counties of England, and around London. How they are all connected cannot be said as a complete pedigree of the English family has never been compiled.

The coat-of-arms of the Poultney family, which has been used since the time of Nigel de Pultney, and which it might be possible for the male descendants of William Pountney to assume, is: argent, on a fesse dancette gules, three leopards faces sable.

AN ACCOUNT OF THE DESCENDANTS OF WILLIAM POUNTNEY OF BIRMINGHAM

1st Generation

1. Of William Pountney, the first of this family, very little is known. It is likely that he was related to the many Poultney and Pountney families that resided in Birmingham in the 18th and 19th centuries, but it is evident that he was neither born or married in that city, since the church records, as far back as 1754, have no trace of him. However, it is known that he resided at Court Princess Street, and that he probably resided in Birmingham as early as 1791. It is likely that both he and his wife were alive in 1836-7.

Of William's wife, Alice, even less is known. It is possible that her daughter, Alice Childs Pountney was named for her, or that Powell, the middle name of her third son, was her maiden name. However, it will take further research to determine this.

William and Alice had the following children, all baptised at St. Martin's Church, Birmingham.

2nd Generation

2. William Henry Pountney (William) was b. in Birmingham, Sept. 17, 1793. He is said to have studied for the ministry in one of the English Universities, but never entered the Church. He res. in Birmingham until about 1836-7 when he moved with his family to the United States. He settled first at New Bridge, New Jersey, and in 1839 he moved to Staten Island. In 1842 he settled in Elizabethport, New Jersey, where he bought a portion of the old Trumbull estate and took up farming. The house in which he resided was the old Colonel William Crane tavern, and it was situated at the foot of the wharf from which a ferry ran across the Newark Bay to New York City. It was in this tavern that Washington is said to have eaten his breakfast before going to New York to take his oath of office as first President. The property is now owned by the Singer Sewing Machine Manufacturing Company.

William mar. 1st, Sarah Ketley about 1816. She died about 1820. He mar. 2nd, at St. Martin's Church, Sarah Smith, on Oct. 4, 1823. She was b. in Birmingham, June 25, 1795, the dau. of Samuel Smith and Ruth Poulton, who were mar. at St. Martin's Church, Aug. 26, 1793. William died at Elizabeth, May 16, 1874, and his wife died there, Aug. 21, 1884.

Joseph Richards, who was b. in Birmingham in 1819, the son of Thomas Richards and Maria Shaw, who came to this country in 1838 and settled in Washington Valley, N. J. Elizabeth d. at Washington Valley, Sept. 25, 1847. Joseph mar. 2nd Elizabeth Bulmer, in June, 1853. She was born at Morristown, N. J., April 1, 1818, the dau. of Jacob Bulmer and Anna Teeple. They res. in Bound Brook, N. J., where he d. Dec. 22, 1868, and his wife d. Dec. 29, 1903.

Mrs. Smalley is the Regent of the Elizabeth Snyder Chapter of the D. A. R. at Bound Brook.
- 5. Samuel John Pountney (William, William Henry), was b. in Birmingham, England, Oct. 2, 1825. He came to this country in 1836 with his parents and settled in Elizabeth, N. J., about 1842, where he res. until 1853, when he moved to New York City. In 1861 he returned to Elizabeth, and later settled in Roselle, N. J. For many years he was connected with the firm of Coleman and Walker in Elizabethport.

He mar. in Elizabeth on Jan. 18, 1848, Jane Linley. She was b. in Kendal, Westmoreland, England, Aug. 2, 1830, the dau. of William Linley of Kendal and Jane Jones of Shropshire. Jane came to this country about 1845-48 and resided in New York City with some relations. She died in Roselle on July 28, 1907. Samuel died Jan. 19, 1919.

He married Sarah Wetton, who was b. in Birmingham, England, Nov. 7, 1838, the dau. of Henry Wetton and Susanne Allen. The Wettons came to this country in 1839 and settled in Elizabeth. Capt. Pountney d. July 16, 1916. His wife d. March 1, 1904.

He was b. in Birmingham on July 24, 1824, and came to this country about 1850. He was naturalized in Elizabeth on Oct. 23, 1858, his future partner, David Walker, standing as his security. He was one of the owners of the Walker and Coleman Foundry in Elizabethport, until 1875, when he sold his share of the business. He served as City Clerk of Elizabeth from 1875 until his death. He d. Dec. 29, 1886. Mrs. Coleman d. Nov. 22, 1912.

He sold this business in 1866 and in that year was elected Street Commissioner in Elizabeth. He held this office until 1877 when he resumed his old business, which he ran until his death. He never again held a political office, although he was always active in the Republican Party in both state and local affairs. He belonged to the Elizabeth Club, and the Arthur Kull Boat Club.

He mar. Elizabeth Brouwer Walker on Feb. 21, 1883, by the Rev. Henry Erskine Duncan of Grace Episcopal Church. She was born in Elizabeth on Feb. 22, 1853, the dau. of David Walker III, who was b. in Halifax, N. S., and Frances Elizabeth Bath. Charles d. Jan. 4, 1909.

Philippe was b. on the Bekeart Manor near "le Fon du Lac" on Lake Geneva, France, on Jan. 24, 1795. He served as one of Napoleon's subalterns in the Russian and Spanish campaigns in 1812 and 1813. He was taken a prisoner by Wellington's troops in Spain and taken to England, where he settled and became a member of the faculty of Norwich College. He came to New York in 1832, where he lived until May, 1854, when he moved to Coloma, California, with his son. He d. in 1868.

Francois was bound out to a gunsmith named Sam Hall, who had a small factory on Long Island in 1836. In 1841 he received his discharge and the next year opened a store and shop in 118 Fulton Street, New York, which he continued until 1845. In Nov., 1846, he joined a Regiment, the Second Mississippi Rifles, and served through the Mexican War. In 1848 he went to California in search of gold and in 1849 settled at Sutter's Mill. He returned to New York several times, but finally in May, 1854, settled in Coloma with his father and family. In 1865 he moved to San Francisco, where he res. for the rest of his life. On landing in San Francisco on April 1, 1849, he started the Bekeart Co., which is today run by his son, and which is now the leading sporting store on the western coast.

Mary d. at San Francisco Feb. 4, 1889, and Francois d. Sept. 4, 1903. They left four children, all born at Sutter's Mill, Coloma, Ed Dorado County, California.
