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#### PREFACE.

In 1893, Henry Porter Andrews of Saratoga Springs, New York, published a work in two large volumes, entitled "The Descendants of John Porter of Windsor, Conn. 1635-1639." It was a painstaking accumulation of facts and, as I am told, cost Mr. Andrews his evesight. Our ancestor, Moses Porter, is No. 857 and his pedigree is shown to go back to John Porter, through Experience Porter, No. 242, Experience Porter, No. 49, and Samuel Porter, No. 5. Mr. Andrews states the wife of John Porter to have been Rose Porter. At that time it had not been ascertained that the mother of John Porter's children was a first wife, Anna White, daughter of Robert White and granddaughter of William Allgar. As respects John Porter himself, no more is known at this time than what Mr. Andrews set down in his book. Mr. Andrews' work is one of the most valuable genealogies we have. Apparently he invited all his correspondents to furnish him their pedigrees, whether in the Porter line or otherwise, with the result that there is no other such compendium of American pedigrees in print. It is true that he seems to have printed everything that was sent him and many discordant accounts of the same family appear; but yet, if examined with discrimination, the work is a very valuable mine of genealogical information. I owe to it the starting point, at least, of many a successful research and much useful information respecting Moses Porter's descendants. It is to supplement Mr. Andrews' book with a full list of these latter that I publish what follows:

Moses Porter had seven children; Abigail, Sarah, Elijah, Joseph, Solomon, Moses R., and Hervey. Solomon died in boyhood. A few of the descendants of Sarah (Fitch), Elijah, Joseph and Moses R. were set down by Mr. Andrews, but he does not seem to have got into touch with any member of the family of Abigail (Hatch), the most numerous of all, or the family of Hervey. In what he did set down, he went only a generation or so and the information furnished was inaccurate and unreliable. Nevertheless, in view of the large task he

attempted to accomplish, it is remarkable that he did so well with our particular branch of the family. The descendants of John Porter as given in Mr. Andrews' book include many names of importance in American history. Amongst them are two Presidents of the United States, General Grant and Mr. Cleveland, Bishops Coxe and Huntington of the Protestant Episcopal Church, Judges Selden and Porter of the New York Court of Appeals: William E. Dodge, the merchant philanthropist of New York City; ex-Governor Baldwin of Michigan; Chief Justice Waite of the United States Supreme Court; President McKinley's private secretary, John Addison Porter, and many other men of prominence. If Porters were given to boasting, and they are not, they might well regard their family as one of exceptional distinction.

My own assembling of the descendants of Moses Porter was an undertaking which grew as the work proceeded. A member of the Joseph Porter family, who found my sister's name on the roll of the Daughters of the Revolution with a statement of her descent from Moses Porter, wrote to her for information as to the The letter was turned over to me and, after replying, I searched the various books of the Revolutionary societies and found the names and addresses of two ladies of the Abigail Porter Hatch descent who had obtained admission to the D. A. R. through the record of Moses Porter. I wrote to these ladies and, then, without the slightest notion how large the task might be, conceived the idea of getting the names of all my great grandfather's descendants through correspondence. One letter led to another; the field increased alarmingly, but with it my interest; when families seemed untraceable, a certain detective zeal was aroused; and there was pleasurable satisfaction in solving a difficult problem when some chance shot brought large and unexpected returns. After a great deal of such correspondence I realized that I had compiled a list of practically all the people who belonged to it, except the possible members of one or two small families who have become lost to their nearest relatives, and a very few people who practically refuse to have anything to do with me or my undertaking. I doubt, however, whether so many as ten to fifteen names have escaped me, although there are besides a few dates that I have been unable to obtain.

If I do not mistake, there is more feeling of kinship in families like ours' now, than there was seventy-five or a hundred years ago. Moses Porter was a Vermont farmer, whose children had to look out for themselves as soon as they could. It was a matter of necessity rather than of choice.

His eldest daughter, Abigail, married Timothy Hatch, and forthwith went West with her husband. They were at Le Roy, Genesee county, New York, as early as the second decade of the last century and there they both

lived out their useful lives and are buried.

The second daughter, Sarah, married Ephraim Fitch at the early age of sixteen years and three months, and died at Pawlet, her father's residence, before she was twenty-one; leaving, surviving her, three children, whose descendants number a little over three hundred persons. Ephraim Fitch, her husband remained at Pawlet and remarried. Two of his three children by Sarah Porter, Hubbard and Sarah (who married Judge Doolittle), went West. Dorastus Fitch remained his lifetime through in the old home, but his children, in turn, scattered.

The eldest son of Moses Porter, Elijah, studied medicine, and crossed the state line into Saratoga county, New York, where he married and founded a family of his own. He however kept in close touch with his relatives at Pawlet, both through correspondence and frequent visits.

Joseph Porter succeeded his father on the home farm. His letters to his brother, Elijah, indicate that the land afforded only the most meagre support to his family, and owing to the distance from the nearest market town, whatever surplus he had to sell cost him nearly all it was Nevertheless he and his family lived cheerful worth. and God-fearing New England lives. His granddaughter, Miss Ann S. Chapin, of Manchester, Vt., writes to me. "He lived and died on the same farm his father had. I think he was eight years old when they came. He took his father's place as Deacon of the Church. active in the church and with his worthy wife, who sang in the choir, kept up a typical New England home. hospitable for all; a ministers' tavern, some called it. He had a dairy of forty cows, making cheese, butter; spinning, weaving. Thanksgiving days the table fairly groaned with roast chicken, turkey, pork, chicken pie, vegetables, pies, puddings. All the children had part in the family work as well as an adopted daughter, older, but loving and loved like the rest." Joseph Porter cared for his mother until his death in 1840. She died in her one hundred and first year, forty years after her husband. His descendants are very few in number and are almost all Vermont people.

Moses R. and Hervey Porter went to Oswego county, New York, probably directly after their respective marriages. Hervey founded a family there; while his brother, physician and farmer, soon went on to Trumbull county in northeastern Ohio, where still reside the

greater part of his descendants.

It is not strange that these diverging branches of the Moses Porter family lost sight of each other. The two older brothers it is true kept track of each other as apparently the two younger brothers did; but so nearly as I can find out the Hatches and the Fitches, after they once left the old home were lost to their relatives and to each other, at least in the second generation. not to be wondered at. It was long before the time of railroads and the West was as far away as China is now. Postage was high for people with whom every penny counted and home surroundings gradually drove out all knowledge of relatives with whom there was no personal association. My mother was a granddaughter of Moses Porter, and I find that he had thirty-three other grandchildren. I can safely assert that most of these thirtyfour grandchildren were scarcely aware of the existence of each other, except as they were brothers or sisters. I sincerely trust then that my little book will serve to some extent to bring back the sense of kinship to the Moses Porter family.

We Americans are ever on the move. Not a descendant of Moses Porter remains at Pawlet, nor any descendant of Abigail Porter Hatch at Le Roy. In the later generations the case is somewhat different. The children of Sophia, the eldest daughter of Abigail and Timothy Hatch, settled in Walworth county, Wisconsin, as did some of the children of her brother, Hervey; and here and in an adjoining county are the larger part of her descendants and many of his. The descendants of Hubbard Fitch still abound in central Michigan; those

of Sarah Fitch Doolittle in northeastern Ohio; and those of Moses R. Porter in Trumbull county, Ohio. A very few of Elijah Porter's descendants are still in Saratoga county, New York; and several of the Hervey Porter family remain in Oswego county, New York. The most of Moses Porter's descendants, however, are widely scattered; many along the Pacific Coast; some, mostly of the Dorastus Fitch family, in the South. Hardly any remain in New England. On the other hand every one belongs to the United States, except one who holds official position in Porto Rico and two or three in Ontario.

The early Christian names of the family have mostly disappeared. There is no living Moses and the names Abigail, Elijah and Joseph have also died out amongst their respective descendants. On the other hand the name Hervey has survived and can be found today in the Abigail, Moses R. and Hervey lines. How this name got into the family I cannot ascertain; none of the first Hervey Porter's ancestors bore it. Some spell it Harvey, but I have not tried to ascertain which. The names, Augustus in the Hatch family and the name, Ferris, in the Fitch family are frequent, but they are not of Porter origin. The latter name comes from the family into which Ephraim Fitch married the second time.

I have added to this book the results of a search of many years for the ancestry of Moses Porter and that of his wife, Sarah Kilham Porter. I quote authorities in so far as they are in print so that the facts stated may be verified by those concerned. Some of my facts, however, come from correspondents, whom I do not feel authorized to quote, but I can give the assurance that I have put down here no such facts without the most implicit confidence in the truthfulness and accuracy of the person furnishing the same. The information was compiled by me without any reference to publication, and my set purpose was to accept nothing but what would stand in a legal proceeding. The only exception I make, where I do not quote my authority, is the location of John Pickworth's wife as Edmund Chandler's daughter. That she was appears to me evident for the reason that all the Christian names in the one family correspond to those in the other; and we know from the famous letter of Governor Bradford to Governor Winthrop, written in 1631, that John Pickworth got his wife in Edmund Chandler's immediate neighborhood.

I am sorry that I have been unable to show Sarah Kilham Porter to have been a descendant of Myles Standish. She asserted this in her extreme old age, but, if she stated how, it was unfortunately not recorded. The descent, if it exists, must be looked for through Sarah, the second wife of Ebenezer Hill of Bridgewater, where Standishes were living, or through Abiah, wife of Peter Yerrington. Nothing but the Christian names is known of these two women. Every other possibility seems to be eliminated. In my view the relationship was at most a collateral one through marriages.

There are two books that ought to be of interest to Moses Porter's descendants. One is entitled, "Under a Colonial Rooftree," and was written by Miss Arria S. Huntington, of Syracuse, N. Y., a descendant of John Porter. Its story is centered about the old home, at Hadley, Mass., of one of the early descendants of Samuel Porter, great grandfather of our Moses. The book is still in print. The other is by George Sheldon, and is entitled, "Half Century at the Bay. Heredity and early Environment of John Williams." It is a description of the boyhood at Roxbury, Mass., of Rev. John Williams, the "Redeemed Captive," who was a brother of Abigail Williams, the wife of the first Experience Porter, and grandmother of our Moses Porter. She is mentioned several times in the book. It was published by W. B. Clarke Co., Boston, in 1905.

I would like to acknowledge, name by name, my indebtedness to the many members of the family who have kindly assisted me in getting together the materials for this book. I cannot do so, however, without having difficulty in determining where to draw the line; for, outside my grandfather's family, nearly all my information has come in response to my letters. I feel, however, that I may properly make an exception by expressing my thanks in this preface to Mrs. Danforth E. Ainsworth (AGAC), of Albany, N. Y., who gathered for me a complete list of the descendants of her grandfather, Hervey Porter, with such thoroughness and accuracy that not a single fact remained for me to enquire about. I wish

also to express my gratitude for much needed assistance in finding families that appeared to be lost to Mrs. E. H. Hobbs of Selma, Ala., and Miss Helen M. Bromley, of Pawlet, Vt.; each of whom, though "not of the blood," has taken a lively and helpful interest in my work.

The copy of Governor Trumbull's commission to Moses Porter, which serves as a frontispiece, is taken from a photograph kindly sent to me by Mr. Mark B.

Hatch (AAEAC).

I do not feel certain that my lettering each member of the family will meet with general approval. I think, however, the system has decided advantages when studied out and understood. No two members of the family can ever be lettered the same and later accessions to the family fall necessarily into their proper places. Then, too, the letters tell precisely the descent, as for example:

If little Richard Potts should marry twenty or more years from now his children, grandchildren and so on could each be put into the proper place in the list by the addition of the proper letters; which would be entirely impossible, were a system of numbering used.

I had hoped to add something about the ancestry of each of those who had married the children of Moses Porter, but have only been able to obtain those of Timothy Hatch and Lucretia Bushnell, wife of Joseph Porter. To these I have added that of my grandmother, Mary Lawrence Porter, which I had already compiled. As respects extended biographical notices, I have felt compelled to confine myself to but three: two because the names belong to American history; the third will be understood.

I have aimed at accuracy in putting together the materials for my little book and in reading the proof sheets; for, although a genealogical author acquires slight personal fame, his work is certain to draw to itself a sanctity little short of that of a family Bible with the descendants of those whose names are recorded, and it would be a sin to perpetuate errors through carelessness. I hope, then, that if errors are discovered I may be informed promptly. If such come to my knowledge and are substantial, I will do what I can towards correcting them by leaves of errata to be inserted in copies of the book.

#### DESCENDANTS

A. MOSES PORTER, son of Experience and Abigail Safford Porter, was born at Mansfield, Conn., 30, Sept. 1738. He married, 12, May 1765, at Preston, Conn., Sarah, daughter of Phineas and Thankful Hill Kilham, then the widow of Joseph Park. Their first five children were born at Norwich, Conn. and the next at Worthington, Mass. in July 1779. The following year, 1780, they removed to a farm, south of and close to the village of Pawlet, Rutland County, Vermont; where they passed the rest of their lives.

Moses Porter was a Revolutionary soldier and was in the battles of Bunker Hill, Long Island and Saratoga and at the surrender of Burgoyne. He was a Selectman at Pawlet in 1786 and 1787, and a Deacon in the Congregational church.

Sarah Kilham, wife of Moses Porter, was born 1, May 1742, and died 7, June 1843. married Joseph Park, 29, Nov. 1761, but he died soon after and they had no children. After the death of Moses Porter, 17, Feb. 1803, she remained on the old farm as a member of the household of her son, Joseph; but survived him by nearly three years. Her eyesight remained good until she had passed her hundredth year. At the time of her death she had had one hundred and sixty-eight descendants; several of them, great great grandchildren. She and her husband lie buried in the Pawlet graveyard as do three of their children, Sarah, Joseph Solomon.

> The family residence was on a farm, located a mile out of Le Roy, Genesee County, New York. They had previously lived at Pompey, Manlius and Richfield Springs and, possibly, about 1801, in Saratoga County, New York. Timothy Hatch was a farmer, a Captain of Militia, and, beginning with the organization of the parish in 1817, the Senior Warden of St. Mark's Episcopal Church for twenty-seven years. About 1870, a window was erected in the church edifice to his memory. He was born at Fredericksburg, Putnam County, New York, 7, May 1764 and died at Le Roy, 27, March 1844. His second wife was Lucretia Buell, widow of Philo Pierson. Between them they had twentyfour children; eleven of whom were his; six, her's; and six the offspring of both; the dates of birth ranging from 1788 to 1838.

# MEMORANDA

RESPECTING THE ANCESTORS OF SARAH KILHAM PORTER.

#### ALLYN.

Robert Allyn. The date of his birth is unknown. He probably came from Manchester, Eng., where his brother, William, was born in 1602. He was at Salem, Mass. in 1637, at New London, Conn. in 1651, and at Norwich, Conn. in 1661. He was one of the proprietors of the settlement at Jeffreys Creek, Mass., now Manchester. He was one of the company that went from Gloucester, Mass. to New London with Rev. Mr. Blinman. His farm was on the Thames River, below Norwich, and "Allyn's Point" preserves the name. He died at Norwich, Conn. in 1683, supposed to be about seventy-five years old.

SARAH, wife of Robert Allyn, was a witness in court in 1642. Nothing else has been learned about her.

Hannah Allyn, wife of Thomas Rose. Nothing is known of her other than her parentage and marriage.

- John Hill was probably born about 1602. He was a landholder at Dorchester, Mass. in 1633. After 1644 he lived in what is now the town of Milton, Mass. He probably came from Chaffcombe, Somersetshire, Eng., and, if so, his family can be traced five generations back of him. He married his wife, Frances, about 1629. He died 31, May 1644, at Milton, Mass.
- Frances, wife of John Hill, was born in England about 1608, and died before 1680. Her family name is not known.
- EBENEZER HILL, was born about 1644 at Dorchester, Mass., and lived there until he removed to Bridgewater, Mass., in 1682, where he died in 1696. He was a soldier in King Philip's War, and took part

in the battle of the Narragansett Swamp Fort, 19, Dec. 1675. He married twice; his second wife, Sarah, whose family name is unknown, being the mother of his son John. The marriage took place about 1692.

SARAH, wife of Ebenezer Hill, was living at the time of her husband's death in 1696.

Joanna, mother of Thomas Rose. Nothing is known as to the date of her birth or parentage. She was the wife of Robert Fleming of Stonington, Conn., as early as 1669, when her son was nearly of age, and his widow in Jan. 1681/2. She was living at or near Norwich, Conn., in 1695. She signed herself Joanna Olmstead after 1687, but no record has been found of any of her three marriages.

Note.—The foregoing account of the ancestors of Moses Porter and those of his wife, Sarah Kilham, is an abbreviation of the results of the work of years; and, in so far as material exists in this country, is, I think, so nearly exhaustive that it seems doubtful whether much can be added through farther investigation. A thorough search of English records would however add much as respects the ancestry of the first immigrants from England and I hope it may be undertaken. It is noteworthy that not one of our ancestors, named in the foregoing account, is other than of pure English blood.

## 1. MILITARY RECORD OF MOSES PORTER.

He was Sergeant in the company which marched from Norwich, Conn. (Col. Jedidiah Huntington), "for the relief of Boston in the Lexington Alarm," April, 1775, and served sixteen days.

(Official Record of Service of Connecticut Men (1889),

page 19).

He was a private soldier in Captain Huntington's company; Col. Selden, 4th Battalion; Wadsworth's Brigade, 1776. The Battalion was raised in June, 1776 to reinforce Washington in New York and on Long Island. It was caught in the retreat and panic of September 15th, when the city was abandoned, and suffered some loss. It was present with the army until December 25, 1776, when the term of the Regiment expired.

He was Sergeant in Captain Eben Lathrop's Company from September 2nd. to October 22, 1777. Two large Regiments of Militia, composed of detachments from all the Brigades, were ordered to reinforce General Gates at Saratoga, in the summer of 1777. They were assigned to General Poor's Continental Brigade in Arnold's Division, and fought in both battles with the enemy, September 19th, and October 9, 1777. In the first battle they lost more than any two Regiments in the field. Upon their dismissal, after the surrender of Burgoyne, Gates spoke of them as "two excellent Militia Regiments from Connecticut." They were commanded by Colonels Jonathan Latimer of New London and Thaddeus Cooke of Wallingford.

While he was taking part in the Saratoga campaign, he received from Gov. Jonathan Trumbull of Connecticut a commission as second Lieutenant. (See the frontispiece.) The commission reads as follows:

## JONATHAN TRUMBULL, ESQUIRE.

Captain General and Commander in Chief of the State of Connecticut in America.

To Moses Porter, Gentleman, Greeting:

You being by the Governor and Council of Safety accepted and appointed to be 2nd. Lieutenant of a Company in the battalion ordered to be raised in this State by inlistment to be commanded by Samuel McCallum as Colonel, reposing special Trust & Confidence in your Fidelity, Courage and good Conduct, I DO, by virtue of the Laws of this State, me thereunto enabling, appoint and impower you the said Moses Porter to be 2nd Lieutenant of said Company. You are therefore carefully and diligently to discharge the duty of a 2nd. Lieutenant, in leading, ordering and exercising the said Company in Arms, both inferior Officers and Soldiers, and to keep them in good Order, and see that they are armed and equipped, according to Law, for military Service, hereby commanding them to obey you as their 2nd Lieutenant, and yourself to obey and follow such Orders and instructions as you shall from Time to Time receive, either from the Commander in Chief of this State, for the Time being, or other your superior Officers, according to the Rules and Discipline of War, declared and established by the Laws of the State aforesaid, pursuant to the Trust hereby reposed in you.

GIVEN under my Hand and Seal at arms at Lebanon

the 25th day of September, anno Domini, 1777.

In 1837, an application was made in behalf of his widow for a Revolutionary pension. Amongst the papers filed was the following affidavit by his son, Dr. Elijah Porter:

"State of New York, Saratoga County, ss.

I, Elijah Porter, of the town of Waterford in said county, being duly sworn says, that he is the son of Moses Porter, late of the town of Pawlet, Co. of Rutland & State of Vermont; and that he, this deponent, was

63 years of age in Nov. last, and this deponent finds by examination of the family records that his father was born in Conn. 30th. of Sept. A. D. 1738 and was married to Sarah Killam, who is this deponent's mother, 12 of May 1765, that this deponent's father continued to reside in the St. of Conn. until 1778 or thereabouts; that during the time this deponent continued to reside in his father's family, he often heard his father speak of his services in the Revolution and often heard his father converse with his friends and individuals who were some of them acquainted with the facts in relation to his own services in the Revolutionary War, the facts as this deponent then and now understands, and which this deponent verily believes to be true are as follows:

In the Spring of the year 1775 this deponent's father went to Lexington under the command of Col. Putnam, but did not arrive until after the battle; that soon after the State of Conn. raised a regiment of men and this deponent's father was chosen a Commissioned Officer in one of the companies of said regiment, and soon after marched in said Regiment to Boston and was in Bunker's or Breed's Hill, defending a breast-work until it was carried by the British, and continued to serve in said Regiment until the time for which the Regiment was enlisted had expired. The time for which the Regiment was enlisted is not known to this deponent. That in the Summer of 1776 this deponent's father was in the service, and if this deponent recollects aright his Captain's name was Mix; that the Captain was wounded the day the army retreated over Kings Bridge, and from that time this deponent's father commanded the Company until the close of the Campaign. That this deponent's father was in the battle of White Plains, was under Genl. Washington in his retreat through New Jersey, was with and in the army when the British force was taken by Washington at Trenton and until the army went into winter quarters at Morristown. That in the Spring of 1777 a Company was raised in New London Co. Conn. in which my father was chosen Lieut., they were called mounted minute men, or Rangers and were held in readiness to march at a minute warning, they marched on horseback and fought on foot. In July, or August, 1777 my father went to the north with this Company, he was the eldest officer who went, and in the Company, and had command of the Company. Was under

Genl. Stark in the engagement with the British near Bennington, the next day marched to the Hudson River in the State of New York and joined Genl. Gates and was placed at Bemis Heights in the left wing of the army, under Col. Morgan, was in the battle in Sept. and acted as adjutant or aid to Genl. Arnold, that he continued in the army until after the surrender of Burgoine and marched with prisoners to near Boston. That after his return home he received a Captain's Commission and shortly after moved with his family to Worthington in the State of Mass. and was never in the service after he received his Captain's Commission to the recollection or knowledge of this deponent. That on or about the year 1782 my father moved to Pawlet, Rutland Co. Vt., where he continued to reside until his death and died in Feb. 1803.

That in the year 1799 this deponent resided at Bemis Heights in Stillwater, Saratoga Co. State of New York. That this deponent's father visited him there, that during his stay there he walked on the grounds with this deponent & pointed out the position of the army under Genl. Gates and the left wing under Col. Morgan and mentioned his having a horse killed under him at a certain breastwork then to be seen, which was taken and retaken several times in the course of the engagement. That during the last war Genl. Wilkinson visited Waterford, where this deponent then and now resides, at which time Genl. Wilkinson told this deponent that he was acquainted with his father and said that he, Genl. Wilkinson, was aid to Genl. Gates, and that this deponent's father was aid to Genl. Arnold at the time and previous to the surrender of Burgoine, and that Arnold would have been killed in that engagement had it not been for the timely relief rendered him by this deponent's father, for that Arnold acted like a madman. That this deponent has no precise knowledge of the time his father was in the service but he always understood it to be a little short of three years. That he was in at least part of three campaigns, and this deponent thinks he was home during some part of the winter. (Signed) Elijah Porter.

Sworn 5th Aug. 1837.

N. B. Doe, Judge Saratoga County." The following is from a letter, dated at Pawlet, Vt., August 9, 1837, written by Joseph Porter, son of Moses Porter, to his brother, Dr. Elijah Porter of Waterford, Saratoga county, New York. The original is in the possession of John S. Lawrence of Grand Rapids, Mich., a grandson of Dr. Porter:

"Mother is no worse, and I should think better, than when you saw her last. She has no recollection of anv officer under whom our father served in the Revolutionary War; and it is very imperfect as to the length of time that he was out. She, however, thinks that at Bunker Hill he was absent about two weeks: the next year, at Long Island and New York, five or six months; and, 1777, at the taking of Burgoine, two or three weeks. She thinks you are mistaken respecting his continuing until the army went into winter quarters, 1778, and likewise respecting his being at Bennington battle. The following year he did not leave home until Solomon was about four weeks old" (born 28, August, 1777), "which would bring it until about the 20th. Sept." "She likewise states he was frequently called out on alarms on the coast at New London, Stonington, Rhode Island, etc."

At the time the foregoing was written, Mrs. Porter was ninety-five years of age. She lived to be one hundred and one years old.

Moses Porter, of Hartford, Conn., who had a long and honorable record in the Revolutionary War, and was later a member of the regular army, was a distant relative.

# 2. A SHORT GENEALOGICAL ACCOUNT OF THE HATCH FAMILY.

The following is taken from a manuscript owned by Alfred H. Hunt, Esq. of Grand Rapids, Michigan, entitled "Memoir of the Hatch Family, by Jarvis Malatiah Hatch, attorney at law of Rochester, Monroe county, New York, 1860."

## THOMAS HATCH, ancestor of the Hatch Family.

Thomas Hatch, the true ancestor of our branch of the Hatch family, emigrated to Boston, Mass. in 1630, or early in 1634. The name of his wife was "Grace." She was of Welsh descent. I think it probable her family name was Lewis, though that is uncertain. He was probably born about the year 1603, somewhere in the county of Kent, and probably in the town of Biddenden, near Cranbrook; but possibly at or near Sandwich on the sea coast.

They had two children, one son and a daughter. They

were probably married about 1624, perhaps 1627.

Jonathan, the son, was born in England, probably in 1625. Lydia, the daughter, was probably born about 1628. This implies that his wife, Grace, was born about 1604. It is said he was a tailor by trade. They probably lived in some village, possibly Cranbrook, or Sandwich. His wife, it is said, was the daughter of a farmer, and born and brought up on a farm and accustomed to the usual female labor of a farm at that period of time; among other things to assist in the harvesting or field labor in harvest time and was expert at it. Some anecdotes of them are preserved which show this. He was small, slender, and of feeble strength; she was robust, strong and healthy.

Thomas Hatch was admitted a freeman of the colony

of Massachusetts Bay at Boston, May 14, 1634.

January 17, 1639, he became one of the nine original purchasers of Yarmouth township, Plymouth colony, on Cape Cod; and was admitted a freeman of that colony and removed to that place from Boston.

The nine proprietors were Anthony Thatcher, John Crome, Marmaduke Matthews, Thomas Hower, Philip Tabor, William Palmer, Samuel Rider, William Lumpkin and Thomas Hatch. See records of Plymouth colony, General Court, January 7, 1639, O. S. for the record of the grant. Part of these persons probably emigrated in the same ship with him, as they were made freemen at Boston with him.

In 1640, he became an equal, or joint, proprietor of the township of Barnstable with about twenty-five other men. In June, 1641, he is described as "of Barnstable" in deeds and public records of the colony, and therefore had become a resident of that town. He died there in the year 1661, a respected citizen. He was a member of the Congregational church of that town and probably was a member of that church before leaving England.

He was a man of considerable pecuniary means. He was a resident freeholder in Dorchester, Mass., May 14, 1634.

## JONATHAN HATCH of Falmouth.

Jonathan Hatch of Falmouth, son of Thomas and Grace Hatch of Barnstable, was born in England about 1625, and emigrated to America with his parents and resided with them at Boston, Yarmouth and Barnstable. He was of very robust constitution and lived to a great age, it is said near 100 years. He married Sarah Rowley at Barnstable, April 11, 1646.

He was one of the fourteen original purchasers of the township of Falmouth, removed there in 1660, and died there. His son, Moses, was the first child born in that town. He and his sons were large landholders in that town. He died in 1711.

Benjamin Hatch was a cordwainer. He was of Harwich in 1729, and bought land in Mansfield, Tolland county, Connecticut, in October of that year and removed to Tolland or Mansfield. His sons, Benjamin lived in Brewster, John in Mansfield, Timothy in Tolland, Eddy in Willington, Solomon in Falmouth and all died in those places, except Timothy, who removed to Kent, Litchfield county, in 1739. I have no information as to the daughter. Benjamin Hatch, Jr., married Sarah Bangs of Brewster, and died there, Feb. 14, 1769, aged eightythree. Malatiah was lost at sea, probably unmarried.

The following is taken from minutes kindly furnished me by Mr. Mark B. Hatch (AAEAC), of Ponce, Porto Rico:

Benjamin Hatch, born September 7, 1655 in Falmouth, Mass. (Barnstable record makes birth June 6, 1656;) died before 1736, either at Mansfield, or Tolland, Conn. He married three times; first to Mary Hamblin, who died early; second, to Elizabeth Eddy, March 16, 1682, who was born at Martha's Vineyard, May 3, 1659. She was admitted to the Barnstable church, July 14, 1710, and was dismissed to the church in Falmouth in

October, and died soon after. His third wife was Experience, widow of Jabez Davis of Barnstable, whom he married Feb. 13, 1711/12.

## FOURTH GENERATION.

TIMOTHY HATCH, born at Falmouth, October 19, 1695, and died at Kent, Conn., March 30, 1766. (?) Married at Lebanon, Conn., about 1716, to Deborah Newcomb of that place. She was born at Edgartown, Martha's Vineyard, 1696/7, from which place her father, Simon Newcomb, moved to Lebanon, Conn. in 1713. Timothy Hatch moved to Tolland, Conn., when a young man and purchased land there in 1721; and his name is found there until 1739, when he moved to Kent, Conn. In May, 1740, he was commissioned Captain of the Train Band by the General Assembly at Hartford, Conn. He was appointed by the Assembly Justice of the Peace for Hartford county, May 12, 1743, and continued to be appointed such until Oct. 1751, when he was appointed to the same office for the new county of Litchfield. He was reappointed until May, 1761. In 1743, he was chosen Moderator of the town. He was a very influential man and quite wealthy for the times. He was admitted to the church in Kent, June 28, 1741. (Taken in part from papers left by Edw. T. Hatch, deceased, of Hudson, N. Y.)

## 7. JOHN P. HATCH.

"John Porter Hatch, soldier, born in Oswego, N. Y., Jan. 9, 1822, died in New York City, April 12, 1901. He was a descendant of Timothy Hatch, who came to the New World in 1634, and was a great grandson of Major Moses Porter, who served in the battle of Saratoga. He was graduated at West Point in 1845, and entered the 3rd. Infantry, serving with that regiment during the Mexican War at Corpus Christi and at Palo Alto; after which he took part in the campaign under General Scott, participating in the battles at Vera Cruz, Contreras and Churubusco, and in the taking of the city of Mexico, receiving three brevets for gallantry. He became Adjutant of the Mounted Rifles, Nov. 1, 1847. At the close of the war with Mexico, he accompanied the regiment on its march from the Missouri River to Oregon, where he served as acting assistant Adjutant of the 11th Military Department, and explored the country from Puget's Sound to Klamath River. He was sent in the autumn of 1850 to Washington city with despatches from the Pacific, but in 1851 rejoined his regiment; and early in 1852 accompanied it to Texas, where he spent two years in campaigns against the Indians. Failing health led to his being ordered to recruiting service until 1856, when he again joined his regiment; and, until 1861, was in New Mexico, during which time he participated in the campaigns against the Gila Apaches and the Navajos; and explored the route for a railway from the Rio Grande to the western border of Missouri. He was promoted to Captain, Oct. 13, 1860. Soon after the opening of the Civil War he was made Brigadier General of Volunteers, and he led a brigade at the first battle of Bull Run. He then received command of the cavalry under General Banks and served under that commander during the campaign in the Shenandoah valley, participating in the battle of Winchester and covered the retreat. At the second battle of Bull Run, he led a charge and was wounded in the head, but he recovered in time to participate in the battle of South Mountain, where he commanded a division and was shot in the leg while leading his men, after two horses had been killed under him. For gallantry at this battle he received a medal of

honor. While convalescing, he served on court-martial duty, had charge of the draft rendezvous in Philadelphia. and organized the cavalry depot in St. Louis: receiving his majority on Oct. 27, 1863. Early in 1864, he was ordered to the Department of the South, where he had the Coast Division and co-operated with General Sherman in his march to the sea, participating in the operations against Charleston to the command of which he was assigned after its fall. He received the brevet of Major General of Volunteers at the close of the Civil War; and, after being mustered out of that service, he returned to the 4th. Cavalry, with which he served in Texas, Indian Territory, Montana and elsewhere. He was promoted to Colonel of the 2nd. Cavalry in June 1881, and was retired by action of law on Jan. 9, 1886, having gained a reputation as one of the ablest of cavalry commanders, noted for having a keen edge upon his sabres."

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## 8. John K. Porter.

John K. Porter was the third son of Dr. Elijah Porter of Waterford, Saratoga county, New York, and was born Jan. 12, 1819. He was prepared for entrance to Union College, Schnectady, N. Y., at an early age, and graduated there in the class of 1837. His father desired him to become a physician as had been his two deceased brothers, but after a short period of medical study he turned gladly to the law and almost before he was ready for practice gained fame as an advocate in his native county. It was not long before his wonderful power over juries and his acute legal judgment made him known throughout eastern New York and there was no time thereafter up to his retirement from the profession when his law business was not growing. In his early days after leaving college, he, like most ambitious young lawyers, took part in political life; but the law was his commanding mistress, and except for attending the Whig National Convention at Baltimore in 1844, as a delegate, and taking an active part in the campaign of that year, he seemed to care little for political strife and political distinction. At one time however, he was offered an appointment as United States Senator by the Governor of New York, but the then occupant of the place did not resign as had been expected. In 1848 he removed to Albany, where he became a member of the law firm of Hill, Cagger and Porter. At the time, it was the custom of the lawyers of the state to put their cases before the Court of Appeals into the hands of some one at the state capital and thus he and his partners made a large part of the arguments in that court and his reputation as a powerful advocate became state wide. As a trial lawyer he was associated with Charles O'Conor in the celebrated Parish will case; he was the attorney for Horace Greeley in the Littlejohn libel suit and obtained a verdict of no cause of action; in 1863, in association with William C. Noyes, he succeeded in establishing the constitutionality of the Legal Tender act in the Metropolitan Bank case; and he was successful in many other important and hard-fought litigations of the time.

In 1864, he was appointed by the Governor a Judge of the New York Court of Appeals to fill a vacancy and the next year was elected as a Republican for the full term of eight years. His portrait in oil now hangs on the wall of the court room at Albany. After serving as a Judge for three years his longing for the more active work of the profession overcame him and he resigned and removed to New York City, where he became the head of the law firm of Porter, Lowrey, Soren and Stone. From this time his reputation became national and his name stands among the few highest in the history of American jurisprudence, although unaided by political prominence. His firm were the counsel for the Western Union Telegraph Company and the New York Elevated railroads. It was Judge Porter who by his legal acumen secured for the latter most of the privileges they now enjoy in the city streets. He took part in the extensive Erie Railroad litigation, but always refused a retainer from any one seeking to obtain advantage through misuse of the law. Tweed sought to obtain his services, but met with a firm refusal; on the other hand Judge Porter took part in the examination of the accounts of the city controller, one of the leading members of the Tweed administration. He was always a man of too high integrity to take a dollar for legal services that had been dishonestly acquired; but when he had once satisfied himself of the justice of his client's cause, that cause became entitled to his most powerful support. Nothing was left undone and he seemed intolerant of anything that smacked of doubt, whatever the good faith of the doubter. In General Grant's time he defended private secretary Babcock at St. Louis in the so-called whiskey trial, and obtained his acquittal; with William M. Evarts, he was counsel for Mr. Beecher in the Tilton trial; and at the express solicitation of President Arthur he took charge of the prosecution of General Garfield's murderer, securing a conviction through a cross examination that will always be classic of legal literature.

The trial of Guiteau was a fitting ending to a distinguished career. Judge Porter's health broke down soon after and for years he was the victim of sickness, increasing in virulence and painfulness until death brought him relief. These last years were spent in his native village of Waterford and there he is buried, close to the grave of his father. Union College conferred upon him its degree of Doctor of Laws in 1887.

## 9. Cornelia Porter Lawrence.

(Obituary from the New York Observer. March 12, 1868.)

LAWRENCE. At Chicago, on the 18th of January, 1868, Cornella Porter, wife of John Lawrence, aged 46 years.

The death of Mrs. Lawrence was felt as a sad bereavement, not only in the city where she resided, but in the county of Saratoga, where the earlier portion of her life was spent, and where her remains were brought for interment. No more touching tribute could be paid to her memory than that which rose, almost without volition, from the hearts of all who knew her in the intimate relations of family and social life; but we cannot forbear saying a few words of one whose name awakens many tender regrets and many fond recollections. She was the daughter of the late Dr. Elijah Porter of Waterford, and her early years were passed, not only amidst the best advantages for intellectual culture, but amidst domestic and social influences most favorable to the formation of her general character. She continued to be a resident of that place until long after her marriage; and the removal of the family to Chicago, some five years prior to her death, was matter of general regret in the circles with which she had been familiar so long. But she was one of those around whom friends gather wherever they go; and her new home had soon the same sunny and attractive aspect with that which she left in the village of her birth. In January, 1867, she accompanied her husband and her elder son on a visit to Europe, which she was peculiarly fitted to enjoy by her refined and cultivated tastes and her rare appreciation of the beautiful in nature and in art. By extending their journey to the Holy Land, she was enabled to gratify a cherished desire of her life and to visit the Sea of Galilee, the Mount of Olives, and the Garden of Gethsemane—scenes hallowed to her by associations inwrought with all her religious convictions. occurred to mar the pleasure of the excursion until they reached England, when, on the eve of the return voyage, her health began to droop under the influence of an unforeseen and insidious disease. On her arrival at Waterford, where she had left her two younger children

under the care of her only surviving sister, her heart was pierced by the tidings that one of them had been accidently drowned, while she was on the way home. He was a bright and beautiful boy, of rare promise, and around whom clustered many brilliant and cherished hopes. She sustained her sinking spirit until she reached her home in Chicago; but through the few remaining months of life, her strength failed from day to day, until she passed gently into the arms of Him who giveth his

beloved sleep.

It is difficult, in a few words to group even the leading traits which made Mrs. Lawrence a woman of such singular attractions. Her very presence inspired confidence, admiration and love. No one could look, even now, at her refined and intellectual features, as traced in the beautiful portrait of Healey, without being struck with the transparent purity of her character. All who were in intimate relations with her were sensible of a healthful and genial influence, which seemed to assimilate their natures to her own. There was an easy blending of strength and grace, which enabled her to leave on every one who approached her, the impress of her habitual rectitude of thought and her warm and generous kindness. A desire to make others happy pervaded her whole life, and it seemed as natural for her to be doing good as it is for the sun to shine. Those who were won by her engaging manners and her ingenuous simplicity and grace, found themselves insensibly yielding to a quiet, beneficient and ceaseless influence, of which they were scarcely conscious, except by finding that she had made them better and happier. The law of kindness intoned her whole being; and there was no measure of self-denial which seemed to her too great, if it tended to promote the welfare of those she loved. To her the path of duty was always a path of light; and there was no struggle between the impulses of affection and her convictions of right, for both ran in the same direction. Her clear intelligence and steady constancy of purpose were traceable in the details of a well ordered household, in the air of cheerful equanimity which surrounded her. in the happiness of her domestic relations, in the moral and intellectual training of her children, and in the simplicity and beauty of her daily life.

The graces so beautifully blended in her character never shone more brightly than during the period in which she was breathing away her life. The current of her affections ran full and strong down to the last pulsation. She bore with heroic and uncomplaining fortitude the sufferings of the long and wasting illness which was bearing her to an early grave. She was never more considerate and thoughtful for those who were nearest her heart, and never evinced more courage and self-devotion, than when her failing strength warned her that she was on the eve of death. Her illness was attended with every alleviation which conjugal and filial tenderness could supply. She had been happy in all her varied relations and her heart was full of gratitude for the blessings which had brightened her life.

She was a sincere and earnest Christian; and her trembling sensibility, in view of the severance of cherished earthly ties, was not more touching, than her reverent submission to the will of God, and the trusting faith with which she committed herself and those she loved to His gracious and protecting care. The pulse of life beat more and more faintly, until the silver cord was loosed and the imprisoned spirit was free. She died, surrounded by those to whom she was most endeared, and her frame yielded so gently to death, that the light of immortal life seemed to rest upon her face as she fell

asleep.
