HISTORICAL. The record of our family begins with Hugo de Pagham, date and place of birth unknown. His home was near London, England. In the year 1256 he was appointed by King Henry III to go on a very important diplomatic mission to the King of Spain. He was so successful that King Henry was much pleased and on his return knighted him, giving him the new name Sir Hugo Page.

The following were doubtless all lineal descendants of Sir Hugo Page, but I find no record of dates of their birth or death. They were all prominent at about the date stated:
