# Parmenter Line

GUILLAUME (WILLIAM), French Huguenot, born about 1465, driven to the mountains (whence name, signifying "from the mountains" or "mountaineers") by the Catholic massacre, escaped to England about 1520. His wife was CRISTYNE ————. Their son,

GEORGE, was born in 1492 and died in 1592 (100 years old), also fled to England and was buried in Yeldham Cemetery. His wife was MARGARET ————.

 JOHN 3d, was born in 1640 and died Sept. 18, 1719. He married ELIZABETH CUTLER in 1667. She was born July 29, 1646. Their son,

JOHN 4th, was born April 9, 1678, and died Oct. 17, 1768. His wife's name was MARTHA

Their son,

CALEB, was born April 9, 1722, and died May 21, 1795. On Nov. 3, 1742, he married SARAH RICHARDSON of Attleborough, Mass. She was born Sept. 10, 1720. (CALEB came to Attleborough from Sudbury after a brief sojourn in Norton, Mass.) Their son, CALEB Jr., was born Aug. 29, 1758, and died in 1850. May 18, 1780, he married ELIZABETH ROUND, who was born Nov. 6, 1758, and died in 1854. (Both CALEB Sr. and CALEB Jr. were Revolutionary soldiers, the latter having fought at Lexington and Bunker Hill. He had the rank of Captain.) Their son,

JOSEPH, was born April 29, 1782, and died Jan. 5, 1866. Sept. 23, 1802, he married ROXA (ROXANA, ROXANNA, ROXY, ROXEY) RICHARDSON, who was born Nov. 1, 1784, and died June 28, 1866. (JOSEPH came from Attleborough, Mass., to "Parmenter Hill" in China Plantation, Harlem (now China), Me., in 1805, where he built a log cabin and began

clearing a farm from the forest, to which his wife and two small children, JOSEPH and DANFORD, came soon after. JOSEPH Sr. was a soldier in the War of 1812.

THOMAS was born in the log cabin referred to above March 4, 1818, and died in China, Me., May 22, 1899. June 22, 1841, he married

JANE GREENOUGH WEBB, who was born at the foot of "Parmenter Hill," Harlem (now China), Me., July 19, 1818, and died in Freeport, Me., April 17, 1910. Their children were:

- I ALVECIA MILLER, born June 24, 1842, died Jan. 27, 1916. She married Sept. 28, 1862, ISAIAH WIGGIN, born June 22, 1835, died June 16, 1907. Their children:
  - HATTIE EMMA, born Aug. 10, 1863, died July 31, 1936. Nov. 1, 1884, she married (1) NORRIS HUBBARD CLARK, born Nov. 14, 1855, died June 1, 1892. April 11, 1909, she married (2) ADDISON WASHBURN SEE-KINS, born Oct. 6, 1853, died Oct. 16, 1934.
  - ELLA ELVIRA, born Nov. 22, 1867. Nov. 21, 1885, she married WILLIAM HENRY JONES, born Oct. 8, 1864.
  - EDWARD EVERETT, born Feb. 28, 1875, died July 21, 1897.
  - MABEL MAUD, born Oct. 24, 1878, died June 25, 1900. May 20, 1896, she married CHARLES EBEN BAILEY, born May 20, 1876.
- JOHN GREENOUGH, born Sept. 4, 1844, died Feb. 25, 1903. Dec. 23, 1869, he married MARIA BRADSTREET STINSON, born April 2, 1849. JOHN was a member of Co. 6, 7th Maine Regt., Civil War Volunteers. Their children:





# Richardson Line

SAMUEL, born about 1610, died 1658, came from England with two brothers, Ezekiel and Thomas, in the "Arabella," with Governor Winthrop, in 1630, and settled at Charlestown, Mass., in 1636. He was founder and largest landowner of Woburn, Mass., and was selectman of said town in 1644, 1645, 1646, 1649 and 1650. His wife was JOANNA——, and she united with the church at Charlestown Sept. 9, 1639. Her will is dated June 30, 1666. She probably died soon after, as her will was proved in 1667. (See Middlesex Probate Records, I, 142, and IV, 122.) Their son,

STEPHEN, was born in Woburn, Mass., which then included Burlington and a part of Wilmington, Oct. 15, 1649. His will is dated Aug. 15, 1713, and was proved April 22, 1718. (See Middlesex Probate Records, XV, 157-165, occupying six folio pages.) He died March 22, 1717/18. His widow, ABIGAIL WYMAN, of Woburn, was born about 1659 and died Sept. 17, 1720 (Gravestone record). They were married Jan. 2, 1674/5. STEPHEN served in King Philip's War.

SETH, son of STEPHEN, was born in Woburn Jan. 16, 1689/90, and married MARY BROWN. Further dates are not at present to be found. SETH was taxed in Medford, Mass., in 1711, but a year or two afterwards removed to Attleborough, Mass., with a brother Francis and others of his kindred. Their son,

SETH Jr., was born in Attleborough, May 26, 1723, and married SARAH FRENCH. They lived in Attleborough and raised a family of eleven children, all of whom married and had families. SETH Jr. was a Revolutionary soldier and had part in the reception given the British April 19, 1775, at Lexington. Their daughter,

ROXA (ROXANA, ROXANNA, ROXY, ROXEY), was born in Attleborough, Nov. 1, 1784, and died in China. Me., June 28, 1866. Sept. 23, 1802, she married JOSEPH PAR-MENTER, born in Attleborough, April 29, 1782, died in China, Me., Jan. 4, 1866. (The FIVE generations of descendants are to be found in the PARMENTER LINE.)

### Mullins - Alden - Bass Line

WILLIAM MULLINS, 10th signer of the Mayflower Compact, and his wife, ALICE——, died during that first severe year in America, 1621. There is no known record of their births or marriage. Their daughter,

PRISCILLA (date of birth unknown), married JOHN ALDEN, Mayflower Pilgrim and seventh and last surviving signer of the Mayflower Compact, some time previous to 1624, and died some year later than 1650. JOHN was born about 1599 and died in 1687. Their daughter,

RUTH, was born in 1634 and died in 1674. In 1657/58 she married JOHN BASS, born in 1632 and died in 1716. JOHN was the son of SAMUEL and ANN BASS, who came from England about 1630 and located in Roxbury, Mass., in 1632, but removed to Braintree, Mass., in 1640. SAMUEL was born in 1600 and died in 1694. The wife, ANN, died in 1663. MARY, daughter of JOHN and RUTH ALDEN BASS, was born Feb. 11, 1669, at Braintree, Mass. (There is no known record of date of her death.) May 24, 1686, she married CHRISTOPHER WEBB of Braintree. born in Billerica, Mass., March 25, 1663, died of small pox at Braintree, Mass., Feb. 7, 1689/90. He was the son of CHRISTOPHER WEBB 2d and HANNAH SCOTT WEBB.

(See WEBB LINE.)

### Webb Line

CHRISTOPHER WEBB came from England previous to 1645, for in May, 1645, he became a free man of the Massachusetts Colony. No record of dates of his birth, marriage or death has been found. His son,

CHRISTOPHER 2d, was born in England about 1630 and died in Braintree, Mass., in 1694. Jan. 18, 1654/5, he married HANNAH SCOTT. He lived the most of his life in Braintree. His son,

CHRISTOPHER 3d, was born in Billerica, Mass., Jan./March 25, 1663, and died of small pox, one authority says in March, 1690, but another says Feb. 7, 1689/90. May 24, 1686, he married MARY BASS, daughter of JOHN and RUTH ALDEN BASS and granddaughter of DEACON SAMUEL BASS of Braintree, also of JOHN ALDEN, the Mayflower Pilgrim of Duxbury. (See MULLINS-ALDEN-BASS LINE.) Their son,

CHRISTOPHER WEBB 4th, posthumous, and only son of CHRISTOPHER 3d and MARY BASS WEBB, was born in Braintree Aug. 19, 1690, and was married in Boston by Rev.Cotton Mather, D.D., to ANNE WHITE, born March 2, 1696. (No further record of dates is obtainable.) They lived in Boston three or four years after marriage, then removed to Braintree. Their son,

SAMUEL, was born in Boston, Oct. 5, 1716, and died in Woolwich, Me., Aug. 27, 1773. Dec. 25, 1740, he married SARAH LINCOLN, whose death is recorded in Woolwich, Me., Vital Records as occurring March 16, 1813, at the age of 97 years. They lived in Braintree until after the birth of their second son, CHRISTOPHER, in 1747, then presumably removing to Woolwich, Me. Their son,

CHRISTOPHER, was born in Braintree, Mass., April 21, 1747, and died "Sept. 10, 1845, aged 96 yrs.," according to inscription on monument in Cemetery No. 4, Albion, Me., on lot of his great-grandson, SAMUEL R. WEBB. Jan. 15, 1767, he married BETTEY (BETSY) SMITH of Woolwich, Me. She died in January, 1826, presumably at Canaan, or Skowhegan, Me. Their son,

DEACON SAMUEL, was born presumably at Woolwich, Me., in March, 1773/4, and "died Jan. 24, 1853, Aet. 78 yrs. 10 mos." (gravestone inscription in Richardson Neighborhood Cemetery, East Skowhegan, Me.). He married SARAH IRELAND, where or when is not at present known. From gravestone inscription in cemetery just referred to, her date of birth would seem to be Oct. 30 or 31, 1774, since the date of her death recorded thereon is "Dec. 19, 1857," and her age at death, "83 ys. 1 mo. 19 da." SAMUEL was a soldier in the War of 1812. Their son,

CHRISTOPHER, was born presumably at Skowhegan, Me., March 13, 1799, and died at China, Me., July 5, 1875. In 1817 he married

ELIZA ANN GREENOUGH, presumably of Skowhegan. She was born in 1798 and died in Albion, Me., in 1880. (These dates are from inscriptions on monument in Cemetery No. 4, Albion, Me., reference to which has been previously made.) Their daughter,

JANE GREENOUGH, was born in China (or Skowhegan), Me., July 19, 1818, and died in Freeport, Me., April 17, 1910. June 22, 1841, she married THOMAS PARMENTER, born in China, Me., March 4, 1818, and died in China, Me., May 22, 1899. (See PARMENTER LINE.)

ROBERT, living about 1275, married EMMA, daughter and heir of WILLIAM WOOD-HOUSE, and carried the estate of WOOD-HOUSE, County York, to her husband.

WILLIAM, died 1308-9, of WENTWORTH-WOODHOUSE, married BEATRICE, daughter of GILBERT THAKEL, County York.

WILLIAM WENTWORTH, of WENT-WORTH-WOODHOUSE, died in 1295. He married DIONYSIA, daughter of PETER de ROTHERFIELD; (2) LUCY, daughter of SIR ADAM NEWMARCH, who died sine postcritate.

WILLIAM WENTWORTH, of WENT-WORTH-WOODHOUSE, married ISABEL, daughter and co-heir of WILLIAM PEL-LINGTON, County York.

JOHN WENTWORTH of North Elmsall married JOAN, daughter of RICHARD le TYAS. From him descended ELDER WILLIAM WENTWORTH, the Emigrant; also the present Baron Wentworth.

JOHN WENTWORTH of North Elmsall, living in 1413, married AGNES, sister and co-heir of SIR WILLIAM DRONSFIELD, of West Bretton, County York.

JOHN WENTWORTH of North Elmsall married ELIZABETH, daughter of RICH-ARD BEAUMONT.

JOHN WENTWORTH of North Elmsall married ELIZABETH, daughter of WIL-LIAM CALVERLY.

THOMAS WENTWORTH, died about 1522. He married JANE, daughter of OLIVER MIRFIELD.

OLIVER WENTWORTH of Goxhill, County Lincoln, died 1558. He married JANE ——.

WILLIAM WENTWORTH of Waltham, County Lincoln, died 1574. He married (1) ELLEN, daughter of JOHN GILBY and widow of John Ferrars; (2) ANNE ——.

CHRISTOPHER WENTWORTH of Alvord, County Lincoln, died about 1633. He married CATHERINE, daughter of WILLIAM MARBURY, Esq.

WILLIAM of Rigsby, County Lincoln, married SUSANNAH, daughter of EDWARD CARTER, widow of Uther Fleming.

WILLIAM, the Emigrant Ancestor, born 1615/16, died 1696/97, came from England to Boston in 1636, was a founder of Exeter, N. H., in 1639, removed to Wells, Me., in 1642, and to Dover, N. H., 1649. He married ELIZ-ABETH KENNEY.

EZEKIEL, fourth son of ELDER WILLIAM WENTWORTH of Dover, N. H., died 1711 or 1712. He married ELIZABETH (KNIGHT, probably).

JOHN of Somersworth, N. H., died 1717 or 1718; married MARTHA MILLER.

EZEKIEL of Somersworth, N. H., married MARTHA LORD. He had seven children.

SAMUEL, born in Berwick, Me., Feb. 19, 1742, son of EZEKIEL and MARTHA LORD WENTWORTH, married Oct. 23, 1766, LYDIA GOWELL. He died May 19, 1798. July 4, 1805, she married LEMUEL WOOSTER. She lived with her daughter, SARAH, at Albion, Me., and died there in 1843, aged 93. SAMUEL was a Revolutionary soldier.

DORCAS, daughter of SAMUEL and LYDIA GOWELL WENTWORTH, married Feb. 25, 1790, JOHN FALL of Berwick, Me., and died in 1800. They had one child, TRISTRAM FALL. On July 23, 1800, JOHN married SARAH, sister of DORCAS. SARAH was born in 1776, died in Albion, Me., March 31, 1859. (See FALL REVOLUTIONARY LINE.)



LIEUT. TRISTRAM Jr., born May 8, 1740, died Feb. 7, 1792. March 5, 1759, he married MARTHA PRAY, born May 20, 1739, died Jan. 14, 1814. He was in the 4th Berwick, Me., Company, 2d York Regt. of Mass. Militia.

DEACON JOHN, born 1767, died June 10, 1843. Feb. 25, 1790, he married DORCAS WENTWORTH, died 1800. They had one child, TRISTRAM. July 23, 1800, JOHN married SARAH, a sister of DORCAS, born 1776, died at Albion, Me., March 31, 1859.

TRISTRAM, born 1791, died Aug. 14, 1876. July 25, 1816, he married MARY (POLLY) HURD of Berwick, born March, 1793, died April 13, 1890.
