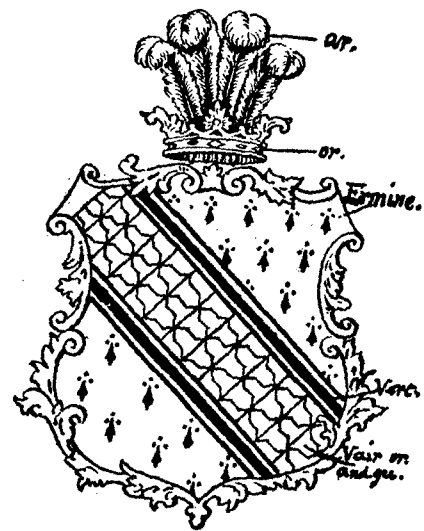

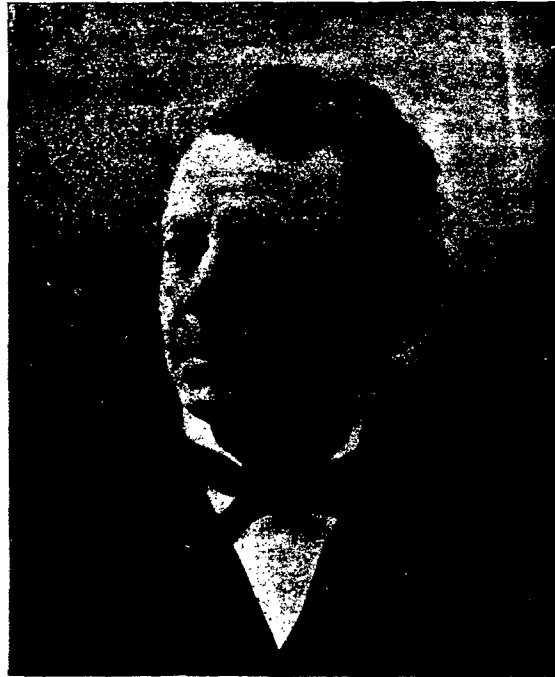

THE PLUMB FAMILY.

THE REASON WHY! Personal Explanation. IN THE FIRST EDITION.

In 1849, when I was a youth of 19, living with my uncle in Honesdale, Pa., my uncle received a letter from a boy of my age in Tennessee, called Sylvester Plumb. He said he was the only son of a Sylvester Plumb, who had died when he was a child, and he only knew his name, and, as he had seen my uncle's name in the *Scientific American*, he wrote to him to ask him if he could tell him anything about his ancestry, who his father was and where he came from, etc. My uncle read the letter to me and said he would go and see his father and mother in Prompton, (four miles distant) the next Sunday and ask them about it. I determined to go, too. We went, and grandfather and grandmother, both born Plumb, then past seventy years old, said they were born in Middletown, Conn. They had an uncle, Reuben Plumb, there, who had a son Sylvester who went South about 1800, and had not been heard of afterward by them; that he was probably the grandfather of this Sylvester. My uncle wrote this down. I listened to all, and having lost my father by death when a child, and until the year before—1848—never knew any of the name of Plumb, felt impelled to inquire further. I got paper and pencil, and grandfather and grandmother told me their grandfather's name was Waitstill John Plumb; that he lived in Middletown, where they were born. They told me the names of all his sons and daughters, and their cousins, the children of these sons, and what became of them, so far as they knew. They told me the tradition of the family, which was, of course, more interesting than all the rest to a youngster like me then. I kept that paper and often came across it and read it over, and I found in the course of time that I was the only boy who had done such a thing as to gather up the family history and genealogy from an ancestor as far back as a grandfather and write it down for preservation and preserve it forty years. Now, during these forty years it had been

growing upon me that I wanted to know more about my progenitors, and in the fall of 1888 I determined to go to Middletown, Conn., and search the ancient records, and I went. I found altogether more than I expected at Middletown, and, for a consideration, the son of the town clerk furnished me a number of families from the church records of Milford, and this brought me far on toward the first Plumb in America. I went to New London and gleaned the clerk's office there also. I then had some thirty families of a date previous to 1800, and I came home well pleased. When I came to look at my acquisitions the whole thing seemed a perfect chaos. It was bewildering, but with the help of what I had learned from my grandfather and grandmother I was able to put together our own family well enough all the way back, but I had some 200 names or more, and only about half of them seemed to connect on my family anywhere. But by getting my own into tables in proper form and order I acquired skill, and I digested and analyzed all of them in the course of a month or two and tabulated them all, and then I was so pleased that I felt a great desire to confer my pleasant knowledge on others. I arranged the families in what I thought the proper order and then made some copies and wrote to such Plumbs as I could easily get the address of, and explained the matter and agreed to send a copy of the 15 pages I then had if he would agree to make or have made at least one copy and send to another Plumb, making the same stipulation as to copying, etc., with him, and he was to send me his own family genealogy as far as he knew it. Some did not care about it, but some were highly pleased. I thought in this way in the course of time all the Plumbs would be known. I made eight copies and sent off, among the rest, one to Senator Plumb, of Kansas. There he found his own grandfather, and back of him to his grandfather's great-grandfather, and he was highly pleased, and

asked if I could not go to Connecticut again and hunt them all the way back and find the connecting links between those now separated, and offered to pay any part of the expenses that I thought right. Well, I had a good deal of a desire myself to know more, and I finally told him I would go, to be gone about 20 days, and to spend only about \$100, and that he might pay half of that; and at once he sent me a check for \$50. That settled it, and I had to go. I went on the 20th of May, 1889, and got back on the 10th of June. I at once began to arrange and systematize the chaos, and there was such an amount of it that I saw I had a great deal of work to do before I could commence to make any copies. I reported my success to Senator Plumb, and he wrote me that he would see the printing paid for if I would do the work of preparing the manuscript and attend to the printing of it, and no other copying need be done. He would have it printed for distribution to get further information. I agreed to do it, and here it is. No literary merit is claimed for it, and I am not to blame for having done it. I am not especially anxious to do work for nothing, but the love of one's family is not, in my opinion, a bad trait. Senator Plumb, and the Hon. Ralph Plumb, of Illinois pay out their money for love of the family, and why should not I? I have done all the work and paid out nearly as much money as either of them, and if it is a foolish expenditure, I am foolish for wishing to know my progenitors. But I do wish to know even more than I know now; but I don't feel able to go further than from the first Plumb in America, 1635, down to the children of men born previous to 1800. Ralph Plumb pays half the printing, Senator Plumb the other half.

Second Edition.

The English tables are numbered, but not indexed, from No. 1 to the last name on the tables.

The American Plumbs are numbered from No. 1, to the last in regular succession, or intended to be, the first being John Plum of Wethersfield, 1635, and of Branford, 1645. Over No. 1 will be his No. 32, on the English list. Then follows his eldest son Robert No. 2, and all his descendants; then Samuel No. 6, and his descendants; then John Plumb of Hartford 1660, and Lew London 1677, No. 505, with his English No. over it; then will come in succession all his son John's descendants; then Samuel's; then Joseph's; then Green's; then George's. After these will

follow Benoni's; and after his they are all merely fragments of families. Those of German descent being known by the name of Plum, I put in so all persons of the name can trace their descent. All on the American Tables are indexed.

In order to trace a person's parentage back, find the name on the index, turn to his No. and look at his father's No. over the family, in heavy black figures, turn back to that No. on the general list, and see his father's No. in heavy black figures at the left of his name and so on back. Instance, Senator Plumb's father is David, his father Ichabod, his father Reuben, his father Waitstill John, his father Joseph, his father John, his father Robert, his father John No. 1, and his his father on the English list

Robert, his father Robert, and his father John Plume, the first whose family is tabulated. From him back I cannot name the fathers.

A plus mark [+] at the end of a name shows that more is shown of him further on, and in this way names can be traced forward. A very little study will show it all. The name at this mark will have a general number which will be found in the heavy black type standing to the left of the name of the father of the family, further on.

THE PLUMB FAMILY.

PREFACE.

Dates were not always on the record, and, in such cases, where it was obvious that the date was near a certain time, the writer has put in a date in small figures there as his guess at it, and the word "say" to indicate his mere supposition. It may be asked, why not leave the space blank? The answer is that any one interested must, in his mind, assume a date anyhow; why, then, should not the compiler of the work, whose study of the whole thing has made him more familiar with it than any other person can be, put a suggestion of a date in any such place? Dates were sometimes written in figures alone, as: 1-7, 1636, which is read "First of the seventh month, 1636," but it still needs translation into our "New Style" of keeping time, and that is Sept. 1, 1636. March was the first month of the year in "Old Style," and March 25 was the first day of the year. Dates are frequently found where there are two figures at the end of the year, as: Mar. 17, 1747-8. This simply means that in Old Style March 17 was in 1747, but in New Style would be 1748. This method of

dating may be found till 1752, when it was only kept in New Style, and the months where it was used were from January 1 to March 24, inclusive; from March 25 they are both alike. From 1752 the new style was according to law, and the 1st of January was the first of the year. All should know that in these double figures the last one is the true one for our present style of counting time. The addition of the 11 days need not be noted at all.

By Act of Parliament in Great Britain in 1751, eleven days in September, 1752, were to be retrenched, and the third day of September was reckoned the fourteenth, and by the same act the first day of January was to be the first day of the year.

The indexes are to numbers standing opposite to the names, and not to the pages. The words "from the records" mean that the writer has himself searched the original town and probate records, and copied the names and dates, but sometimes other persons' searches are included, so that they are not always wholly his own.

The sign "plus" (+) at the end of a name means that his family or children are given further on. The figure in the left hand column is the whole number from the beginning or first one known in America, and will be found afterwards attached to the name of the father of a family of children, if they were found anywhere. The date on the upper left hand corner of the page is the year the writer got the information on that page, or the names at least. Where the date of birth is not known, but the baptism is, the letter "b" is put in before the date to show that it is baptism, and not birth, as there were years between these dates sometimes, though in general, it was only a few days between birth and baptism. Many were found—birth one day, baptism the next. My work will extend no further than to the children of men born previous to 1800 or in 1800. Some mistakes will be found, but mistakes are unavoidable in any human production. If I was a perfect being there would be no mistake in this book.

HISTORICAL STATEMENT.

The Plumbs were Normans and can be traced back to Normandy to the year 1180, at least, and in England to 1240. John Plum, the first known in America, came to Wethersfield, from England in 1635. We are informed by history that there was a dispute in the church at Watertown, and in Newtown, and in Dorchester, all in Massachusetts, about some matter, and the church was divided. The minister in each of these places and his congregation left there and removed to Watertown, Newtown and Dorchester, in Connecticut, in 1635, and settled in three separate places on the Connecticut river, which they at first called by the names of the places they came from in Massachusetts—Watertown, Newtown and Dorchester. These were the first settlers in Connecticut, and numbered between thirty and forty men in each town.

In 1637 the names were changed—Watertown to Wethersfield, Newtown to Hartford, and Dorchester to Windsor. John Plum came from England in 1635 and settled with those of Watertown (Wethersfield.) His name first appears on the Colonial records there, "17:1636," at a court held at Watertown that day, and among the proceedings was: "Whereas, there was tendered to us an inventory of the estate of Mr. Jo. Old'a", (Oldham) which seemed to be somewhat uncertainly valued, wee, therefore, think meete to, & so it is ordered that Mr. Jo. Plum & Rich. Gildersleeve, together with the constable, shall survey the said inventory and perfect the same before the next corte & then to deliver it into the corte." From February 9, 1637, he was a member of the court till 1642. The General Court was the Assembly of the colony of Connecticut. At a court held at Hartford, March 8, 1636, "Mr. Plum" being a member of the court: the business before it was the adopting of some means to buy corn from the Indians, as the inhabitants were in a starving condition. They agreed to pay from four to six shillings a bushel for it. "Mr. Plum" was appointed to receive the corn for Wethersfield. He held various offices, such as marking the boundaries of towns, laying out roads, determining the lines between towns, seeing to improving of the lands of the several plantations, attending court as a deputy. He was one of the men in Capt. Mason's little army during the Pequot war in 1637, and received a grant of land for his service. As he was a ship owner, I think he may have owned the ship that carried the 77 men of Capt. Mason's Army

around from the mouth of the Connecticut river to the Narragansett, from which they marched over land west, to attack the Pequots at Pequot Hill, Groton now. In 1643 he was nominated for election as "Assistant" but was beaten by Mr. Swaine. In the spring of 1644-5 he was appointed to attend to the clearance of vessels at Wethersfield, Edward Stebbins at Hartford, and Walter Tyler at Windsor. In the fall of 1644 he sold all his land and houses in Wethersfield and removed to Branford. The records of Wethersfield have been destroyed by fire some time in the past, and only a small land record of those early settlers exists. Only one of his children was born in America and no record of any exists, except that his son, Samuel, lived in Branford with him when he died. He is found in Branford in 1645, as the "Keeper of the Town's Book." He died there in 1648. His wife, "Mrs. Plume," administered on his estate August 1, 1648, and with "her son Samuel" filed the inventory. Samuel, his son, with others, in 1666, bought lands in Newark, N. J., and Samuel sold out in 1668 in Branford and removed to Newark, N. J.

In 1641, "Mr. Plum, Jr." in Wethersfield, was appointed to serve on the jury. This is supposed to have been a son of John and to have been named John, or he would not have been called "Mr. Plum, Jr.", but, as in those times very few men indeed were given the title of "Mr.," it may be that his father is the one meant, and Jr. only meant Juror. But his father was that same year a member of the Court. He is not known anywhere else.

A John Plum owned a lot in 1667 in Newark, N. J., but left it, and it was given to another person, and he is not known there after 1667. He may be the jurymen of Wethersfield of 1641, brother of Robert and Samuel. He was probably a ship-master, and never made his home at Newark. The Newark land was bought of the Indians by the settlers in 1666. I would much like to know whether this John ever married and had children.

Robert Plume was one of the Proprietors, and first settlers in Milford, Conn., in 1639, and had probably been portioned off by his father at that time, as he was not found having any interest in his father's estate; neither was John.

There was a John Plumb in Hartford, in 1660-1, who was the son of Georg Plumb, of Inworth, County Essex, England. The writer found him on the record there in 1665, and a deed to his wife, Elizabeth, for property equal to property he had previously received from her; and a deed of his is recorded there as late as 1672. He was appointed, by letter of attorney in England, in January, 1660-1, to collect debts of persons in Charlestown, Mass. A grant of land was made by the Assembly to him on his petition in Sept., 1674. He probably removed to New London in 1677, though he had some cases in court at Hartford late in 1677.

John Plumb, of New London, served in the war against King Philip, the son of Massasoit, in 1675 to '76. He received land for his services, and some of it was probably located in Preston after 1686, and some was perhaps in Voluntown, after 1708. This is the John Plumb that married a Green, and lived in New London after, if not before, the King Philip war, and is probably the John Plumb mentioned by Gurdon Saltonstall to Winthrop, when he says, January 2, 1691-2: "At the anniversary feast at Master Plumb's," and August 6, 1696, "at the anniversary feast at Master Plumb's." "John Plumb tells me that chest glass is not so good as crib glass."—Winthrop Papers. These Plumbs of New London were mariners, and followed the sea, and also ship building. His son George was wrecked on Plumb Island and drowned.

It was probably John Plumb's ship that was captured by the Dutch in July 1666, at Martha's Vineyard, Mass., and plundered and then let go.

Among the Winthrop papers are letters from Robert Plume, of Milford, but I have not the dates.

There was a John Plum in Dorchester, Mass., in 1680, who seems to have been a poor person, to whom a pair of shoes was given, but it may have been because he had been a soldier in the King Philip war in 1676. There were two John Plumbs in that war, and a John Plum was killed by the Indians, among Capt. Lathrop's men, at Muddy Brook, September 18, 1675. He was the son of John of Dorchester.

THE PLUMB FAMILY.

A Statement of 1891.

In 1891 Senator Plumb, of Kansas, wished me to go to New England again the third time, and gather up all the remaining Plumbs I could find, and the connecting links in the families we already had that needed joining, and he would see the expenses paid. With the aid of the Hon. Ralph Plumb, of Illinois, and the Hon. C. C. Jadwin, of Honesdale, Pa., I was furnished with \$225.00, and August 1, 1891, I started on my last tour for these searches, and was engaged in the search about six weeks.

I searched Watertown, Mass., Boston was thoroughly searched, and, with the assistance of C. F. Jenney, Esq., a lawyer, I think I have finally settled the matter of the family of John Plumb, of Dorchester, (now part of Boston,) and am satisfied there was no male descendants of his of the third generation. He removed to Rehoboth in 1706, when very old, his wife Mary having died the same year. In the record of Soldiers in the Revolutionary War, in the Massachusetts Archives in the Secretary of State's Office, Boston, there was a Sherman Plumb, private, and a John Plumb, Lieut. that I could find nothing of afterwards. Jared Plumb, of Westfield I found there, and I had Westfield searched for me.

I searched the records of Charlestown, Cambridge, Roxbury, Braintree, Dedham, Hingham; and had Taunton, Rehoboth, and Freetown, Mass., searched for me. I went to Nantucket and searched; and to Rhode Island, and searched Newport, and had Little Compton searched for me.

Then I returned to Conn. and searched New London the third time, and searched Preston, and Bozrah, and Lebanon, and the second time to Milford, and Branford, and New Haven, and Hartford, and Middletown; and searched North Lyme and Lyme, Windham, Stonington, Saybrook, Deep River, Norwich, Groton, Stamford, Stratford, Wethersfield, Windsor, Simsbury, Wallingford, Derby, Meriden, Guilford, Norfolk, Farmington and Fairfield. I had Washington and Canaan and a number of others searched for me a number of times, such as Litchfield, Norfolk and New Haven and Milford. The searches, I think, have been pretty thoroughly made in Conn. and Mass.

I searched New York City Surrogate and Land records; and on Long Island I searched Huntington, Jamaica, Hempstead, North Hempstead, Newtown and Oyster Bay, ancient towns settled by New England people. No places in New Jersey were searched, but by correspondence I got some families from private registers.

In Milford, Conn., by the help of N. G. Pond, Esq., an antiquarian of very great experience—an expert—before and after my coming there this time, we found the tombstone of Joseph Plumb and determined the date and age which shows him to have been the husband of Elizabeth Bailey, and of Thankful Gaylord; and that he must have died in Milford and not in Farmington. We deciphered the date and age of Samuel Plumb, and by the land records found his wife must have been Mehetable Hinde. We found his brother—Joseph Senior's—wife was Susanna Newton, and their son Joseph 2d's wife, was Rebecca Thomas.

At Branford we found the most important record of all; that John Plumb, of Wethersfield and Branford was the father of Robert 1st, of Milford. The record stated that Samuel Plumb branded a horse with the town brand, Jan. 13, 1658-9, for his "cosen" Robert Plumb. The only Robert Plumb living in 1658-9 was the son of the 1st Robert of Milford, and was then only 10 years old; at that time in America the children of one's brothers and sisters were called one's cosens.

At Hartford discoveries made by a lady searcher, employed by A. G. Plumb, of Cedar Rapids, Ia., and my own searches fix the age of John Plumb of Hartford, and show that he was afterwards the John Plumb of New London. and that his wife's name was Elizabeth "Green" almost to a certainty, as he was too young for the husband of any daughter of Guy and Justice Bainbridge or Banbury. No family of Timothy has been found, but the English records show him to have been a brother of John of Hartford. One record seemed to show he was of Windsor, but I found no trace of him there when I searched it.

Norfolk has only some land records. On these Amariah and his wife, Sarah Aspinwall was found, and their son Amariah (Jr.) But correspondence and a late publication called "Connecticut men in the Revolutionary War," has shown me three other sons of Amariah. (Senior)

In Middletown, Conn., Bailey, the youngest son of Joseph Plumb and Elizabeth (Bailey), of Milford, was found; married Abigail Bacon, and had two sons, Bailey and Joseph, and this last Joseph had a son Bailey, and several other children, whom I found by correspondence.

In New York city I found the will of Samuel Plumb, of Huntington, Long Island, who was the son of Green Plumb and Mary Hempstead, of New London, and is the father of Justus Plumb, of Stratford, Conn.

There was nothing on the records of Nantucket, but a very old man in Nantucket nearly 90 years, has through his daughter given me the name of a Samuel Plumb there, who died at sea, young, leaving one child, a son, named Samuel also, who died at sea, young, without leaving children. The widow of the last Samuel lived to be very old and died recently in Nantucket. Wm. R. Easton, my informant, thought they came from Long Island.

Through the late Senator Plumb I got extracts from the petitions for pension, in the Pension Office Washington, for the service of Plumbs in the Revolutionary War, and through this means by correspondence I found several families.

By correspondence I found a number of Plum families of German descent, and as they bear the name of Plum, I think they ought to appear here, and I have all I could get, which is but few. I believe they mostly belong to the Dunkard Baptist persuasion, a very honest, industrious, economical, and saving people, and good citizens.

A. G. Plumb, of Cedar Rapids, Ia., did all the work of correspondence and paid the expenses of getting the English records. By these we have the will of George Plume, of Inworth, Co. Essex, the father of John and Timothy, of Hartford; and we find the father and three predecessors of John, of Wethersfield, Conn., and the children of John with dates, and many other families in wills and other ways going back to 1180 A. D.; and many coats of arms of Plumbs, one of which is reproduced in outline, in ink, without colors, in this work.

The New England Plumbs all came from the County Essex, England, but there was an Englishman who came over in 1821 to Pennsylvania, who afterwards went west, his descendants now reside in Dubuque, Ia., and San Francisco, California. He was from Chester County, of the Lancaster County family, who write the name Plumb. They still reside in Lancaster and York County, in England; but these must appear here, as the father was born in time and these are American Plumbs.

The Plumbs appear to be of pure Norman blood, of the Norman race in England; a race which made England respectable and respected from the beginning of its rule there. This would go to show, that, after the English Normans, the Norwegians are the Yankee's nearest European cousins.

THE ENGLISH RECORDS.

The English records were procured by A. G. Plumb, of Cedar Rapids, Iowa, at a heavy expense.

The first of the name is found on the "Great Roll of Normandy," in 1180, during the reign of Henry II, of England; and the next 1195, during the famous Richard's reign. All on the first page of my book I could not tabulate, as I could not follow them from father to son, etc.

The first table begins with the Plume known to be the progenitor of the first American Plumb; the one found at Wethersfield, one of the original settlers of that town (as it was also one of the first three towns settled in Connecticut.) Then the English Church parish registers are followed all the way down with such help as we get from wills and Chancery Inquisitions, and the "Visitation of Essex" in 1634, which served to point out relationships and places of residence and some dates and approximate dates, and some names of sons, born before the register begins [and who were of course baptized somewhere else, or else the registers were lost.]

These tables are all of the County Essex family, and I have written the name as it was found on the record in all cases, the Essex family nearly always wrote the name with only one m with an e at the end—Plume—with a little dash over the m nearly always. There are 17 variations of the name. I begin the English tables with No. 1, but these numbers are not continued in the American. The American begin with No. 1 also.

The Essex family began their residence in Essex several generations before the one my tables begin with, but all the registers begin after the connection of the English Church with the Roman Church was served by Act of Parliament in 1534. No register was found older than 1538.

Morant in his history of Essex says the first Plumb he finds there was Robert, who was tenant under the great Earl of Oxford, John De Vere, thirteenth Earl, in the time of Henry VIII. John De Vere died in 1513. Henry VIII's Reign began 1509. This estate was called Great Yeldham, or Yeldham Magna. Morant says Robert the son and heir of the first Robert bought this estate of Edward De Vere the seventeenth Earl of Oxford, for his second son, Thomas Plume, and I have an abstract of the will of Robert the father of Thomas Plume where he wills it to him. His eldest son, Robert, has Spaynes and Butler's Manors, and Edmond the third son is given Hawkdon Hall in Suffolk. This Robert's will is dated 1611-12, and although a very old man, he could not have been born much earlier than 1530, so that instead of Robert the first being his father, he was probably his grandfather, or great grandfather, and I find his father to have been John Plume, who dwelt at Toppesfield at the time of his death, 1586. The "Visitation" of Essex also calls him John. There are no births nor deaths on these registers, only baptisms and burials. (Marriage dates are given.) I use them as if they were birth and death dates, in giving the age.

We have not been able to find the register of the family of John Plumb, of Hartford and New London, but I have an abstract of the will of George Plume of Inworth, County Essex, England. George's name is written with two m's in the body of the will, but the signature at the end is written Plume, with only one m. I am quite sure he is of the same Essex family as John of Wethersfield, but the connection has not been found. He names his two sons John and Timothy and mentions their being overseas. I found both of them at Hartford, Connecticut, and John afterwards at New London.

The origin of the name of Plume, Plumme, Plumb and Plumb, and its other variations is unknown; but it can be said that few families indeed, as early as 1180, A. D., had surnames, family names. It must have been a distinguished family previous to 1180 and furnished soldiers to William the Conqueror, in 1066, most likely.

By historians the Plumbs are said to have been originally of Norfolk, Eng., but the first one named is in Herts, in 1240, at Apseden. But they may very well have been originally seated in Norfolk when they first came from Normandy and settled in England. In 1274 they are found in Herts, Norfolk, Cambridge and Somerset, and in 1385 in Essex, and 1395 in Northampton.

COATS OF ARMS.

The Coats of Arms described here are only a few of the whole number belonging to the Plumb family in all its branches. The one believed to be the most ancient has a crest "out of a ducal coronet a plume of ostrich feathers." The crest was allusive, and alluded to the name of the grantee—Plume. This one in particular is called "Plume-England." There were at least four others belonging to the Essex families later, but all within the seventeenth century. Several have the grey-hound for a crest; and several have other hounds—the otter hound, the talbot, and one a wolf.

The arms of all are very much alike and all are evidently only slight variations of the same original. The difference was in the colors and crests.

Coats of arms were grants from the Kings, the "fountain of honor," and could not

be inherited by an American. The English people were the inventors of the English language and they applied the title of "Gentleman" to one possessing a coat of arms, and one not possessing a coat of arms could be no higher in honor or dignity than a "yeoman", in other words *not* a gentleman. In our country we use the word, but with a very different meaning. I do not know whether the word has changed its meaning in England or not, but I think not. It is usually abbreviated to "gent."

The first American Plumb's father possessed a coat of arms and was a "gent.," but his grandfather and great grandfather were not, but died yeomen; and as the American was a younger son, the arms descended to his brother, and afterward to his brother's son, who all died "gents."

The Arms and Crest given here is a tracing of the one having the crest of ostrich feathers. It is only one of the forms that has that crest. I do not know whether it is entirely correct, or whether it is the oldest of them. The other one with the same crest is or appears to be, a much later grant, but the only difference between them is that in the later one it is "Argent" instead of "Ermine." I could not get the Arms of Robert, (No. 10) or I might have presented an engraving of that as he was my own progenitor in direct line. I am not sure of any Motto, but this coat of arms I have represented was said to have the Motto, "Ardua Vinco," and that of the descendants of Thomas Plume, of Great Veldham, Essex, was "Vere Vade."

These are a few of the Coats of Arms and Crests of Plumbs as I find them; whether they are correct or not is more than I can say. Some are from Burke's work; and some from the Harleian Society's publications; and some from tracings of the Arms in England, sent to us; and some from other authors on heraldry. The one of Thomas Plume, of Great Veldham, must be a mistake as to him, as he died in 1615 a yeoman, but his son Samuel was a gent., and also his son Thomas of Maldon.

Some Connecticut History.

This is not the place to write a history, but it seems as if no harm can be done by telling some of the reasons why the New England families are so far distributed over the country. In the beginning of course it was only in New England. They received some immigrants from abroad and in their own towns new generations were coming on and they must spread in order to find or make farms for themselves. Their government was only their town government at first and it was all their own. There was no precedent to go by, and they had to learn by experience, and of course there was more or less friction. This helped to drive them off to settle new towns and here again the same thing was likely to occur. Thus was Connecticut settled principally by people from Massachusetts in the close neighborhood of Boston. Boston and the few towns surrounding and adjoining it was settled in 1630. Connecticut was settled from these towns principally, some new immigrants just arrived joined them and this was in 1635. The settlers from Mass. mostly went over land drove their animals of all kinds with them and were several weeks in making the journey of over a hundred miles the way they had to go to get there. They could carry but little food along and yet must live or die.

They settle Wethersfield about 30 miles above the mouth of the Connecticut river, on the west side of the river, and Hartford about 5 miles further up the river, and Windsor about 7 miles still further up, and Saybrook at the river's mouth.

The whites had been invited to settle there by the Indians. These Indians seem to have been held in subjection by a tribe (living east of New London after there was a New London) called Pequots, and were fearfully oppressed by them, and were at the same time in constant danger from inroads of the Mohawks, west of them, in New York.

The Pequots it appears, had not been consulted by the white people about settling there or if they had, the whites paid no regard to the Pequots claims of dominion. Anyway in the spring of 1637 the Pequots began to murder the white people in their fields where it was absolutely necessary for them to work to raise food for themselves and little ones, for there was no business carried on then but farming and such trades as were necessary for a farming community. They had to go to war with the Pequots, and they had to conquer them or die, for the Indians gave no quarter. The Indians had about 2000 fighting men, about as well armed as the whites, and the

whites could muster only 77 men for the war, as I am informed by Richard A. Wheeler, of Stonington, Conn., an Antiquarian and Historian. They had some 700 or 800 Indians as Allies with them, but they were so much afraid of their oppressors that they covered in the bushes and woods till the whites surprised the Pequots (not yet recovered from a night's drunken spree), and got them on the run, then their Indians could kill and take scalps.

Connecticut could now be held by the whites by right of conquest, but they bought the land for every town from the Indians in its vicinity, for they were all free now from the Pequots. So four years after the settlement of Wethersfield and the other three towns, Milford was purchased and settled in 1639, and one of the settlers was Robert Plumb just come of age the year before. In 1644 Beantford was settled, and Robert's father and brother Samuel were among them, Samuel not yet of age.

The young generation growing up would be without land. Then from the various towns young men from 30 to 40 in number, mostly just married, would buy a piece of ground from the Indians in a place chosen by them from 5 to 10 miles square, have it surveyed, plotted and numbered, and then the purchasers divided them out by "lot," that is by chance, all having an equal chance to get the best locations, and no one had a right to grumble. Then the building of log huts began, and the same round was run in the town when a new generation came up.

When the land in New England had thus been parcelled out, the new generations had to go west and build up new States with new institutions, and more or less of the early New England "experience" have been incorporated in the later state, town and county governments.

There has been but one Indian War in New England since the Pequot War, and that was the King Philip War; but that was almost wholly in Massachusetts and Plymouth old Colony, in 1675-6. But the Indians have all died off. They seemed to be "wild men," made to live on flesh, and when the vicinity of the whites drove off or killed the wild animals, the Indians could not live on the food of civilized men, and gradually died out. I do not know how this is but this seems to be the case. "Fire Water" certainly has not done it all. It seems an unpleasant thought to lose a race of men, but it is difficult to see how it is to be prevented.

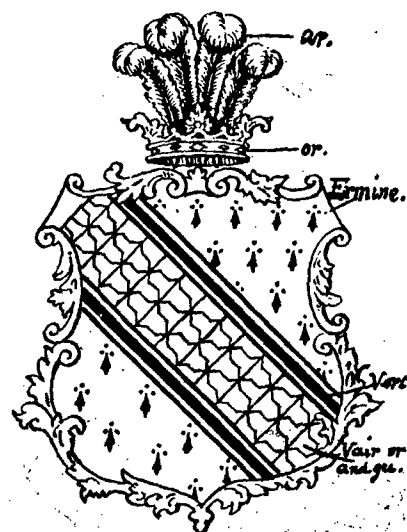
The Plumb Genealogy Completed.

After four years' steady work, personally searching records in Connecticut, Massachusetts and Rhode Island in New England, and New York city, and seven towns in Long Island, N. Y., that were settled in the early times by New England people, and by correspondence with Plumbs in all parts of the United States, the work is now finally completed.

I think it is the most full and complete of any work of the kind ever done in this country, for the time covered by it, viz: in America, from 1635 down to the children of men who were born previous to or in the year 1800, and in England I have five generations in regular line from father to son from about 1500 or 1505 (for the date of birth of the first *known* parent could not be found) down to the family of the first one that came to America in 1835, and to the second one that came to America and left descendants in 1690, and back of all these records, Plumbs are found, mostly through their wills, through all the centuries to 1180 A. D., in the Great Rolls of Normandy, thus showing our Norman ancestry in the time of Henry II, the great grandson of William the Conqueror. There are ten pages of the English Plumbs, including short notes of the wills for first page.

I must suppose that all men wish to know their ancestors, especially if their ancestors were of a class that were honorable and deserving, and I have gone back far enough to show that ours were of the class called "gentlemen" in England. And my searches have led me to believe that pretty much all the early settlers in New England were of that class, the landless younger sons and descendants of younger sons of the gentry of England. Very few indeed of the lower orders ever came here even as servants, for the settlers were nearly always too poor to bring servants with them.

I cannot explain here the difference between a hall, a mansion, a house and a cottage, but in England, in the ancient times at least, the names were significant.

Our first American Plumb's father possessed a coat of arms, but I was unable to get it and so I take the one I suppose to be the first granted coat of arms and crest to a Plumb. And this may not be strictly correct, it may be "argent" instead of "ermine." I saw it described in both ways.

There are seven engravings, five portraits, Senator P. B. Plumb, of Kansas; Ralph Plumb, ex M. C. of Illinois; A. G. Plumb, of Iowa; H. B. Plumb, of Pa.; and C. C. Jadwin, ex M. C. of Pa. These are the persons who paid the most of the expenses of this genealogy. Then there are the coat of arms, and the map or plot of ancient Milford, with the name of the owner of each lot, and the ancient palisade around the village to keep off the Indians in case of hostilities.

Seeing what the Plumbs are, I must suppose all the Plumbs will want to know it, and must have this book in every household.

With the assistance of several Plumbs, especially the late Senator Plumb of Kansas, and his widow, the most of the expenses of the work have been paid, so that it is now procurable by Plumbs at probably less than one-fourth what it would otherwise have cost. In fact it would not otherwise have been compiled at all.

Very nearly all the disjointed families of the first edition have been joined on to the others by the discovery of the missing links, and the chain is now complete, and anyone can trace his ancestry back without difficulty in this book to the first one in this country, and three generations back of him in England in the one case and one generation in the other. John Plumb of Dorchester, the only other *known* early English immigrant left no male descendant of the third generation.

There are a number of families of the descendants of German immigrants of the last century, and as they are called Plum, it seemed to me they ought to be in this book, that every Plum of old stock might be able to trace his family back to its origin in this country. These were mostly if not all Dunkard Baptists, as they probably are to-day.

I have also a complete list of the Plumbs that served in the Revolutionary War, so that any Plum that desires to join the patriotic societies of the Sons of the American Revolution, or the Sons of the Revolution, will find his ancestors in this list of names if he served in that war. There may be some of the Newark family that were not found, as I am quite sure I have not found all the Plumbs and Plumes of that branch of the family. As it is, I have forty names of Plumbs that served in the Revolutionary War.

He may have confiscated the Plume estate, and that would be a reason why they are not found there any more except to be buried. The son was also of Lincoln's Inn.

On the 2nd day, 5th month, 1644, (which was July) he makes sale of land in Wethersfield, 13 parcels, from 2 acres up to 204 in size, and 2 dwelling houses, and he is not again found on the Wethersfield records. This sale was recorded in 1646. He removed to Branford the same year, 1644. He was probably one of the Soldiers in Capt. Mason's little army of 77 men that marched, attacked, surprised and totally defeated the Pequots at Pequot Hill (in Groton afterwards) in 1637. The name is often written "Jo. Plum" by the Clerks, and "Mr. Plum" and "Mr. Plume," but he wrote it John Plum. His wife is only known as "Mrs. Plume," on the Conn. records, but on the English as Dorothy ———. The original John Plum removed to Branford, Conn., in 1644, where he died in 1648. The New Haven Probate records say, "Mrs. Plume and her son Samuel," presented an inventory of the estate of John Plume, deceased, Aug. 1, 1648.

After a search of some two years in England, we have found the parish register of the family of John Plume, who was afterward the emigrant to Wethersfield, Connecticut. The register was found at Ridgewell parish. He resided in and probably owned Ridgewell Hall, by the gift of his father at the time of his marriage, and he was living there in 1634, as reported by the King's Heralds at the Visitation of Essex Co., in 1634. All his children were born there except Dorcas, who must have been born in Wethersfield as her name was not on the register.

It is well known that John Plum was among the first settlers and proprietors of Wethersfield, Conn., in 1635, and now it seems altogether likely that he sold his little property in Ridgewell, Co. Essex, Eng., early in 1635 and bought, if he had not previously owned, a ship and immigrated to Wethersfield in his own vessel, as he was from the first a ship owner there, and traded up and down the river with the Indians. It is also probable that it was his ship that was used in 1637 to carry the 77 men down the river and around to Narragansett Bay from which the march was made to Pequot Hill—now in Groton—to surprise the Indians. The ship returned after landing the men at Narragansett, to the mouth of the Connecticut river in full view of the Pequots. The Pequots supposed the men had given up the war and gone home, and so they themselves had a drunken spree that night and were taken by surprise by the English attack in the morning just at day-break. The Pequots were totally defeated and the remnant driven west and either killed or captured in the Fairfield Swamp. This pursuit of the Indians showed the land to the whites and 1639 Milford was settled and Robert Plume, who proves to be the eldest instead of the second son, was one of the settlers, and there he married, lived and died.

John, the second son, I have not found, but I seemed to have glimpses or indications of him in various directions and was ready to assert there was such a son, but now the register shows him.

Samuel, the 5th child, was found in Branford, Conn., when the father died, married and lived there till 1667-8, but his wife's name remains unknown.

Dorcas Plum was married in Branford to John Lyman.

Nothing is known of any of the other children of John Plume and Dorothy ———.

The State Penitentiary now stands on the spot where the dwelling house of John Plume stood in 1644, in Wethersfield, Conn. He owned another house in Wethersfield. At the first town meeting in Totoket, (Branford, Conn.), he was elected town clerk and held the office till his death. The first town meeting was Dec. 15, 1645.

Mrs. Banbury's or Bainbridge's will reads:

"The last will of Justice Banbury. First I commit my soul to the Lord Jesus Christ, my Redeemer; for that little that I have for dispose of, I give to my daughter Plumbe my feather-bed; to Elizabeth Plumbe my silk cap; to my daughter Butler my cloth gowne and my wattered ———; and to Hannah Butler my silk whood; and fower payer of shoes, two payer to my daughter Plumbe, and two payers to my daughter Butler's children, and each of them a payer of stockings, and to Deborah Green my bed-sted and all that be'ongs to it excepting my bed, and my trunk and my box and all that is in them, my warming pan, a chamber pot and an iron skillet and my stuff gowne and my chaire, my smoothing iron, my tongs and fire shovel and the ——— candlestick, and for the five pounds that Joseph Green gave me I give twenty shillings of it to Mr. John Whiting, and the rest of it shall be to pay for my honorable burial." Nov. 30, 1672."

Mrs. Banbury is said to have had 4 daughters, this shows 3 of them, one married a Green, one a Plumbe and one a Butler.

I think it is not unlikely that John, senior, gave his ship to John, jr., when he removed to Branford, and John, jr., being a mariner is not found settled anywhere.

Nothing is known to a certainty of "John Plum, Jr.," but it may be well to say that he, from the indications, probably married somewhere and had children. A John Plum had a lot in Newark, in 1667, or before, (as the land was bought of the Indians in 1666) as in 1667, John Plum is mentioned in a distribution of lots in the town, as having owned a lot—"the seventh to John Plum, now William Camp's." He was not afterwards known there, and what became of him is not known. I think this John Plum, Jr., is the son-in-law of Mrs. Justice Banbury, widow of Guy Banbury.

The numbers 32, 87 and 88 on this page refer to the No. on the English records.

Josiah probably died young. It may be well to state here that church records and Probate records do not always or often, have the double figures at the end of the years in Jan., Feb. and March, but it must be understood as there to be correct.

From the church and public records. Son of John Plumb, Sr., and Elizabeth Norton, born in Milford and outlived all his brothers. There is a deed of John, Sr., dated 1719 to him, wherein Mr. "John Plumb, Senior," gives for "love and affection" to his "only surviving son Joseph" some lots of land and limits them to him and his eldest son "according to the laws of England and not of this Government" and makes them "unlienable forever." His birth and baptism are not given. There was no minister at the Milford church from 1682 till Nov. 1685, and no record was kept of births then. He was appointed Adm'r of John, Sr.'s estate April 10, 1728. He was called Joseph, Sr., in 1726. He and his wife joined the church June 8, 1718. On Feb. 7, 1743, Charles was appointed "guardian of Bailey Plumb, minor son of Joseph Plumb, late of Milford deceased," by the Probate Court of New Haven, bond £200. Lewis and Thankful were born in Wallingford and recorded there. Gamaliel and Susanna, twins, were recorded on the church records at Milford when baptized there, and all of these together with Amariah, Sibila and Simeon, except Susanna, named in a deed to them at Farmington as the "heirs of Joseph Plumb, deceased," dated Oct. 29, 1745. In another deed dated Oct. 1, 1741, Joseph Plumb buys land in Farmington and is described as of Milford. It is not known where Amariah, Sibila and Simeon were born. Susanna was probably dead when the deed of 1745 was made as she was not named in it as one of "the heirs of Joseph Plumb, deceased of Farmington." Executor was granted letters June 9, 1742. He died in Milford, it is believed, as he is buried there and his tombstone has been found. It is inscribed "Joseph Plum died May 27, 1742, aged 58 years." His widow was his executrix and in the Inventory she names all her children and gives their ages. He gives all his property to his 2d wife's children and says all his children by his former wife have been fully provided for. It seems he married his 2d wife Thankful Gaylord in Wallingford; the date is not known but was probably in 1727. Joseph's widow, Thankful, within a year married Hezekiah Rue, and Thankful's children chose Samuel, Joseph and David Gaylord, their uncles, guardians as fast as they became old enough.

Miss Caulkins says Samuel and Joseph removed to Milford—I find them there—and George removed to Stonington—I find him there. She says he died in 1696. I found "Mrs. Plumb" joined the church in 1691, her son John and his wife join the church in 1693. The baptism of the three last named children is from Miss Caulkins. He was a ship owner and master and owned the Ketch Hartford.

								I think Justice Banbury's daughters were all too old to be the wife of John Plumb, of Hartford, as they were the sisters of Jane, the mother of the above children of Samuel Green. Mrs. Banbury in 1672 in her will gives the first item "to my daughter Plumb," and the second item to "Elizabeth Plumb"; evidently not her daughter, but probably her granddaughter the wife of John Plumb; the last item she gives to Delorah Green: probably the sister of "Elizabeth Plumb," so I think.

This son John Plumbe and wife joined the church in 1693. This is the son who lived, married and died in New London. His marriage, but not his birth is on record. I get all these names of John Plumbe and Elizabeth Green's children from Miss Caulkins' History of New London, and from a paper left by Mrs. Miles' father, Frederick Plumb, as to the wife Green. John was appointed Probate Judge, which he held at the time of his death. Green, lived, married and died in New London, though Miss Caulkins says both he and John went to Milford but returned. His birth is not on record.

Samuel I assume to be the Milford Samuel, married Mehitable Hine or Hinde.

Joseph I assume to be the Milford Joseph, married Susanna Newton, and was called Senior 1711 to 14.

George married, lived in Stonington, and died on Plumb Island. He was a mariner. His baptism is from Miss Caulkins' History. Descendants of his call him an Englishman, and say he was drowned in a shipwreck on Plumb Island, N. Y.

John Plume, Jr., the son of John of Wethersfield would have been the proper age for one of Mrs. Banbury's daughters.

In Hartford, March 1, 1666-7, John Plumb made over to his wife Elizabeth, to remain to her and her heirs for ever, a cow, a span of horses, and all his movable goods, "in consideration of estate he hath received which once belonged to her." She was fined for selling liquor to Indians, March 3, 1669-70, and she sold liquor to Indians again, April 21, 1671, and her husband, John, was heavily fined. I have a tracing of his signature to a Petition to the Assembly at Hartford for land in 1674 and another tracing of his signature to a bond in New London in 1681, which shows them to be one and the same man. He was a resident of Hartford in 1660, as he was made attorney in fact, to collect debts in Charlestown, Mass., for creditors in England, and was named as son of George Plumb, of Inworth, Co. Essex, Eng. He was a bearer of dispatches from New London to the Gov. at Hartford in Jan. 1675-6, during the King Philip War. He was granted land along with others or his children were, for services in the King Philip War, and the land was located mostly in Voluntown and Preston.

"To my said wife, one third of my goods."

"To my son, Timothy, the other two thirds of my goods, to be sent to him by my executor, as he shall see a most convenient time and passage upon the sea."

"Upon the death of my said wife the other third part shall go to the said Timothy."

"I give my wearing apparel, being woollen, to my cousin, Thomas London of Coxall, and to my cousin, Edward Barret, the younger, and Peter Osborne of Chappell."

"If my cousin, Edward Barret, my executor, shall understand for certain that my son Timothy is dead, then I give the said two-thirds to my said cousins."

"All the rest of my goods, money, etc., I give to my cousin, Edward Barret, the elder, whom I make my sole executor."

He makes his wife, Elizabeth and his son, John, Jr., Executors. Truman and Monrow are named as his daughters' husbands. He and his wife joined the church in 1693. The "Mrs. Plumbe" who joined in 1691 must be his mother. This is probably the John Plumb mentioned in the Winthrop letters 1691-6. Joshua and Amy Plumbe joined the church in 1726, and died in Middletown. Peter joined the church 1727, but no wife is mentioned. He was not married probably at that time. Abigail, Hannah and Elisha were probably dead in 1732 when their father's will was made, as they were not mentioned in it. Joshua and Peter are named when their shares are mentioned. John was named as executor with his mother, Elizabeth, but he refused to serve, but his mother died the next year and then he was executor for her and served, and in 1752 he was appointed executor by the will of his aunt, the widow of Green Plumbe. These are probate words.

His will is dated March 26, 1752. Proved June 25, 1752, and disposes of considerable property and dates it in Huntington in the Island of Nassau, Province of New York. He names his children in this order, and Justus is at sea, and unmarried; he called Anne—Whitne, of Norwalk, Conn.; Timothy is called a minor, as are all the others after him. I have not been able to trace his son Samuel, or Timothy, or Stephen.

After his wife's death John Plum removed to Rehoboth, Mass. 1707, and was admitted to full membership in the church there, so says the church record in Dorchester. I can find no other John Plum but this one—the father—to be the soldier in Capts. Johnson, Jacob, and Holbrook's Company, 1675 and 1676-7 in the "King Philip War." He must have been 50 years old or more then. He was with Capt. Johnson in the assault on the Indian Narragansett Fort, 19th Dec., 1675, when Capt. Johnson was killed in the assault at the entrance to the Fort. Nothing is known further of this family. He owned a lot of 30 acres of land in Dorchester near the Dedham Mills, which was granted to him by the Town, the 6th of the 1st month, 1665. I found no children of Thomas. I think this family runs out here.
