Descendants of Charles Robbins, Sr. and his first
and second wives, Sarah (Nevill) and
Nancy (Pratt) Robbins

Charles Robbins, Sr. was the third child and son of Job and Sarah (Sela) Robbins. He was born Feb. 13, 1787, on his father's farm near the village of Goshen in Wallkill Township, Orange County, New York. His father was a prominent farmer of Wallkill Township for many years. He was a very religious man. He was twice married--first to Sarah Sela, by whom he had four children, namely, John, Matthias, Charles (born Feb. 13, 1787), and Jane. By his second wife, Miriam Brown, he had ten children: Peter, Cornelius, Jonathan, Gilbert, Archibald, Robert Sterritt, Mary or "Polly", Millicent, Sarah and Christine. Nothing is known of the birth place, date of birth or burial place of either Job Robbins or his first wife, Sarah. Job Robbins died in the latter part of 1814, as his will, which follows, was probated Dec. 10, 1814.

Will of Job Robbins

IN THE NAME OF GOD, AMEN, I, Job Robbins of the Town of Wallkill, County of Orange & State of New York, Farmer, being frail in body but sound in memory, thanks be given unto God for the same, and calling to mind the mortality of my body and knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die, do this seventeenth day of September in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirteen make and ordain this my last Will & Testament in manner following, that is to say,

punctually and first of all I give and recommend my soul into the hands of God that gave it and for my body I recommend it to the earth to be buried in a Christian like and decent manner at the discretion of my wife and executors, nothing doubting but at the general resurrection I shall receive the same again by the mighty power of God, and as touching such worldly estate wherewith it hath pleased God to bless me in this life I give, devise and dispose of the same in manner and form following, that is to say, in the first I give and bequeath to Marian, my wife, one third of my land estate during the time she remains my widow, to be divided to her as the line of John McCarty running from Tilton E. Hills land to the land of William McLaughry, also one father bed and bedding and one cow as her own property, Secondly I give to my oldest son, John, one equal half of the other two thirds of my land to be divided to him in such a manner as to lay joining the land he now owns and run in such a way as to include the buildings, it being my will that he have the buildings on his part as a compensation for the incumbrance of bringing up, schooling and fitting for trades my sons Corenelius, Jonathan, Gilbert, Archibald and Robert Sterritt; also to school my daughter Polly as much as shall be thought necessary and to put her out to a good place to be brought up. It is my desire that my sons above mentioned be put out to such trades as they shall choose when they come to be of a suitable age, and concerning the remaining third of my land, it is my will that it be sold at the discretion of my executors, and also that my moveable property be sold (except

one feather bed and bedding which I reserve for my daughter Jane) and that the money arising from the sale of the land and moveables be divided in manner following: to my son Charles, four hundred and fifty dollars, to my son Matthias, one hundred and fifty dollars, to my daughter Millicent, one hundred and fifty dollars, to my daughter Sarah, one hundred and fifty dollars, to my son Peter one hundred dollars, to my daughter Jane, one hundred dollars, to my son Cornelius, one hundred dollars, to my son Jonathan one hundred dollars, to my daughter Christian, one hundred and fifteen dollars, to my daughter Polly, one hundred and fifteen dollars, to my son Gilbert, fifty dollars, to my son Archibald fifty dollars, to my son Robert Sterritt fifty dollars, and if there should be any money remaining after paying out the above legacies and defraying all debts and expenses the money remaining to be equally divided among all my heirs, except John who I think is otherwise amply provided for, and if there should not be money enough to defray all the debts and charges and pay the legacies as above, the debts and charges must first be paid and each one of my heirs bear their proportion of the loss. The above legacies to be paid all my heirs mentioned that is of age in one year after my death, and to the younger ones as they shall come of age, provided, nevertheless, that if any of my heirs should die under age, that their legacy or legacies be equally divided among all the remaining living heirs, John excepted, and as it respects the third of my land above bequeathed to my wife Marian it is my will that the

land after her decease be sold and that my son John have the one half of the money and that the remaining half be divided among the remainder of my heirs in the same proportion as first above mentioned. And lastly I do ordain and appoint Jacob Dunning, Benjamin Crane, and my son John Robbins, Executors of this, my last will and testament, IN WITNESS whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal the day and year first above written, signed, sealed, published, pronounced and declared by the Testator and his last will and testament in the presence of us, Hiram Horton, James Boak, Jesiah Crane, Jun.

Job Robbins (L.S.)

Probated Dec. 10, 1814.

In the publication, "New York in the Revolution", 2nd edition, Page 91, by James A. Roberts, Albany, N. Y., 1898, there appears the name of Jube Robins, who served as an enlisted man under Capt.; Major; Lieut. Col.; Col. & Brig. Gen. Marinus Willett, in the Levies, in 1st N. Y. Line with Col. Alexander McDugal's Reg't.; Col. Willette in 3rd Line; 5th Reg't. of the line in Reg't. of Levies. He was later with Tryon County Militia, in Battle of Jamestown. Whether or not this "Jube Robins" is the one and the same Job Robbins, husband of Sarah (Sela) Robbins and father of Charles Robbins, Sr. is not now known.

Charles Robbins, Sr., as above stated, was born Feb. 13, 1787. He died Apr. 25, 1867, at Hamden, Vinton Co., Ohio. When 18 years of age he, in company with his older brother Matthias, emigrated in 1805 to Ohio, seeking homes for them-

selves. Charles settled first in a section called Darby Plains in Pickaway County. He was living there during the war of 1812. His daughter, Lura Jane Robbins McKinniss, relates hearing him tell about many returning soldiers from the war of 1812 stopping at his house, and he would give them their dinner and feed their horses for 12½ cents. They would often say that was not enough, but he would reply that he would not charge a soldier more who had been fighting in defense of our Country. Shortly after this was he entered upon land in what is now Winton County, paying for it mostly in Orange County, New York, money. It was in orange colored bills. He and his first wife were early pioneers in this part of Ohio, which at that time was almost a wilderness, with no churches and very few school houses. Charles, like his father Job, was a religious man. His home, for several years, was both the place for holding all religious services of the neighborhood and home for the ministers then traveling in that part of the state.

In order to secure better schools for his children, he laid out the best part of his farm in town lots, calling the town Charleston. The name was afterwards changed to Hamden, the present name. He sold corner lots for \$4.00 and inside lots for \$2.00 each, and donated a site for a public school. In recent years a United Brethern Church was erected upon this same school site--the church of Charles' faith.

Matthias Robins, Charles' older brother, lived and died in Circleville, Ohio. He was a fearless, upright, straight-

forward man, noted particularly for his honesty. It was a common expression among the people of his community, "As honest as Matthias Robbins", and as much could be said of Charles.

Charles married first Sarah Nevill, Dec. 19, 1809. Their marriage is recorded at Chillicothe, Ohio, Vol. 1, Page 17. The marriage ceremony being performed by Christian Brotherlin. Sarah was one of twins and was the daughter of Henry Nevill. It is recorded that Henry Nevill came to Ohio from Virginia some years prior to 1810, stopping at a place then called Jefferson, located on the site of an old Indian town, which was visited by Christopher Gist in January 1751. Gist was a friend and guide of Genl. George Washington.

Jefferson, long since completely abandoned and referred to as "a lost town", was a considerable trading post, and Henry Nevill conducted there a general store and hotel. The place was about two miles south of the present city of Circleville in Pickaway County. Pickaway County came into existence March 1, 1810. Section Four of the act creating the county provided that "the courts for said county shall be held at the house of Henry Nevill, until a permanent seat of justice is fixed as the law directs." The first meeting of the Commissioners was held in Henry Nevill's house in Jefferson on Apr. 21, 1810, as was also the first regular term of the Common Pleas Court, July 23, 1810.

It is related that Henry Nevill Robbins (son of Charles Robbins, Sr. and Sarah (Nevill) Robbins, born Jan. 21, 1821) a Grandson of Henry Nevill, often said that his Mother and

Grandfather, Henry Nevill, were distantly related to Lord Nevill of England.

In a volume in a Columbus, Ohio, library on Ohio history it is recorded with reference to Pickaway County--"James Hedges came from Berkeley County, Va.--located at Jefferson 1807. He married Margaret Nevill and resided in Jefferson until the Fall of 1810 when he moved to Circleville. James Hedges' father, Phillip, and a cousin Joseph, arrived a short time afterwards. They both married into the Nevill family. Joseph became a partner of Henry Nevill in the store at Jefferson, which was finally moved to Circleville."

The date and place of birth of Charles' first wife, Sarah Nevill, is unknown. Also, the date of her death and place of burial are unknown. He married his second wife, Nancy Pratt, Dec. 31, 1826. She was born Sept. 17, 1793, in Green County, New York, near Elmira. She died Jan. 19, 1887, at Hamden, Ohio. Her parents, Ephraim and Ann (Ballard) Pratt, were natives of Massachusetts, near Boston. They moved to Bradford County, Pa. when Nancy was a year old, about Sept. 1794. Some time in the early twenties of 1800 they moved to Ohio. Ephraim Pratt was an honest, upright man and a Revolutionary soldier. He enlisted when 16 years of age and served the last four years of the war. He died March 23, 1855, age 92 years, 9 months and 27 days. His wife, Ann, died May 5, 1827, age 67 years.

He (Charles Robbins, Sr.) is buried in a private burial plot on his old farm near Hamden, Ohio. It is believed that his second wife, Nancy, is also buried there.

The last will and testament of Charles Robbins, Sr. follows:

In the name of the Benevolent Father of all, I, Charles Robbins, of the County of Vinton, Ohio, do make and publish this my last will and testament:

Item 1: I give and devise to my beloved wife in lieu of her dower, the farm on which we now reside, situated in Vinton County, Clinton Township, containing about ninety acres, and also a tract of land now belonging to me and situated in Jackson County, Washington Township, containing about forty acres, during her natural life, and all the stock, household goods, furniture, provisions, and other goods and chattels which may be thereon at the time of my decease, during her natural life as aforesaid (she, however, selling so much thereof as may be necessary to pay my just debts). At the death of my said wife, the real estate aforesaid and all the goods and chattels that may be thereon, except the household furniture, I give and devise to my two sons Ephraim Robbins and Charles Robbins and their heirs. The said household furniture that may remain at said death of my said wife, I give and devise to my daughter Lura Jane McKinniss. And I also devise and direct that at the

said death of my said wife, my two sons Ephraim Robbins and Charles Robbins shall pay to my said daughter, Lura Jane McKimiss, and to my son Alanson Robbins each three hundred dollars, and to my sons John Robbins, James Robbins, Job Robbins, Jonas Robbins, and Henry Robbins, and to my daughter Sarah Wilson, each five dollars.

Item 2: I do hereby nominate and appoint my two sons, Ephraim Robbins and Charles Robbins, Jr., executors of this, my last will and testament, hereby authorizing and empowering them to compromise, adjust, release and discharge, in such manner as they may deem proper, the debts due me. I do also authorize and empower them, if it shall become necessary in order to pay my debts, to sell by private sale, or in such manner, upon such terms of credit, or otherwise, as they may think proper, all or any part of my real estate, and deeds to purchase, execute, acknowledge, and deliver in fee simple.

I desire that no sale and no appraisement of my personal property be made, and that the Court of Probate direct the omission of the same in pursuance of the statute.

I do hereby revoke all former wills by me made.

In testimony whereof, I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 30th day of January in the year 1861.

17. James Robbins (X1b), born Dec. 10, 1812, died Sept. 2, 1868, on his farm near Hamden, Vinton County, Ohio, which he purchased, cleared and farmed successfully until his death. He married, March 15, 1833, Minerva Wyman. She was born Jan. 2, 1815. She was the daughter of John Wyman, Jr. She died on the home farm April 25, 1890. The children of James and Minerva (Wyman) Robbins were: (a) Phannetta, (b) Harvey, (c) John, (d) Leander, and (e) Elihu Austin.

Minerva Wyman's father, John Wyman, Jr., was a Revolutionary soldier. He enlisted in the Continental Army for Town of Lancaster, Mass., July 8, 1779, 16 years of age. He again enlisted for 24 months from Jan. 1, 1781, (Oxford, Mass. V. R. P. 122, 263).

The Wyman lineage in this country descended from Francis Wyman, Sr., who lived in the parish of Westmill, County of Hertford, England, which is eight miles north of Ware, was married there May 1, 1617, to his first wife, Elizabeth Richardson, daughter of Thomas and Katherine (Duxford) Richardson. The Richardson family were of Standon and the Duxford family of Westmill. Elizabeth Richardson was baptised there Jan. 13, 1593, and buried June 22, 1630.

Mr. Wyman in his will dated Sept. 15, 1658, which was proved Feb. 14, 1658/9 mentions his second wife Jane _____, a son Thomas Wyman, who inherited the real-estate, a sister "Susan Huitt, Widow", besides his two sons in New England. The will reads: "I do give and bequeath unto my two sons, Francis Wyman and John Wyman, which are beyond the sea, ten pounds apiece in lawful English money to be paid unto them by my executor if they are in want and come over to demand the same."

Francis Wyman, Jr., his son by his first wife, was baptised in Westmill on Feb. 24, 1619, who, with his brother, Lieut. John Wyman, were among the earliest settlers of Charlestown Village, afterwards named Woburn, Mass. They signed Town Orders there on Dec. 18, 1640. Francis, Jr. was married first at Woburn Jan. 30, 1643, to Judith Pierce. His second wife whom he married Oct. 2, 1650, was Abigail Read, daughter of William Read of Woburn.

In the year 1666, Francis, Jr. built a country house in what is now Burlington, formerly part of Woburn. In 1900 this historical and ancestral home was to be sold, which led to the

organization of the Francis Wyman Association, which now owns the property. The house has historic interest, as it was used for a fort against Indian attacks, port holes for defense being still visible. It also witnessed many stirring scenes of revolutionary times. None of the Francis Wyman, Jr. family lived here during the Revolutionary period, however, during the Mount Hope Campaign, 1675-76, Francis, Jr. served under Capt. Thomas Prentice. He was a tanner by trade. He died at Woburn Nov. 30, 1699. Timothy Wyman, son of Francis Wyman, Jr., by his second wife, was born at Woburn Sept. 15, 1661. He was a husbandman there. He died in 1709. He married Hannah _____ about 1687.

Sergt. Solomon Wyman, son of Timothy Wyman, was born in Woburn, Oct. 24, 1693. He married in Medford, Mass. June 9, 1725, Mary Pierce of Woburn. In 1740 he was a member of the Colonial Militia and served as a Sergeant. The date of his death is unknown, but there is a record of his will made Jan. 2, 1760. Following his death Mrs. Wyman married Feb. 14, 1765, Benjamin Johnson, also of Woburn.

John Wyman, Sr., son of Sergt. Solomon Wyman, was born at Woburn, July 23, 1727. He later lived at Oxford, Worcester County, Mass., where, on Apr. 23, 1752, he married his first wife, Mrs. Experience Shumway Reed, widow of Thomas Reed, and daughter of Jeremiah and Experience (Larned) Shumway. Following her death he married second at Oxford, Dec. 9, 1762, Mrs. Arne Blood Town, widow of Samuel Town of Oxford.

John Wyman, Jr., son of John Sr. by his second wife, was

born at Oxford, Nov. 27, 1763, and moved with his parents to Charlton, Mass. in 1776. Following the Revolution he lived for some time in Mass. and Conn., afterwards moving to Steuben County, New York. He married (date unknown) Hannah (thought to have been Hannah Stiles). She was born Feb. 19, 1775, and died near McArthur, Ohio, Dec. 9, 1840. He (John Wyman, Jr.) died Mar. 26, 1839. Both are buried in cemetery at McArthur, Ohio.

John Wyman, Jr. and his family moved some time prior to 1833 to Ohio, traveling by flatboat to Marietta, Ohio, thence over-land to Athens County, settling near what is now the town of McArthur, Vinton County. (Vinton County was formed out of a portion of Athens County in 1850). Mr. Wyman was awarded Dec. 27, 1833, a pension commencing Mar. 4, 1831, of \$30.00 per annum. (Ohio Pension Rolls, 1835, p. 103). Mr. Wyman in his will dated Mar. 14, 1839, on file at Athens, Ohio, mentions his wife and nine children. The children were: De Marquis, Lydia Warford, Arthur, John, Daniel, Sylvia White, Lucy Ward, Minerva Robbins, and Levi.

It may be of interest of descendants of Sergt. Solomon Wyman, born Oct. 24, 1693, at Woburn, Mass. and married Mary Pierce, to note that Mary (Pierce) Wyman's paternal grandmother was Deborah (Converse) Pierce, and therefore, John Wyman, Jr.'s great great grandmother. The Converse name descended from an 18th generation, Edward Converse, born Jan. 30, 1590, at Wakerly, Northampton County, England. Edward Converse came to New England in 1630 with Gov. Winthrop's Company.

He was the founder, or one of the founders, of the town of Woburn, Mass., now a part of the City of Boston. The Converse name descended from Roger de Coigneries, one of William, the Conqueror's, Chieftains. Also, that Deborah (Converse) Pierce was descended (30th generation) from Charlemagne, Emperor of the West.

He was born Dec. 30, 1832, near Creola, Ohio. He died Dec. 27, 1911 at Portland, Ore., and buried there in G.A.R. Cemetery. They had children, (a) Frank Oscar, (b) Homer Lee, and (c) Cassius Clay. Mr. Clark served over four years in the Union Army during the late Civil War. After the war he took an active part in G.A.R. activities. In the early 70's he moved with his family to Kansas, purchasing a large acreage of farm and grazing lands, and was for many years a successful farmer and livestock breeder.
19. Frank Oscar Clark (X18a), born Aug. 1, 1867, near Savannah, Mo. He married Nov. 26, 1891 at Burlington, Kans., Mina Lucretia Alexander. She was born Oct. 30, 1870 at Coldwater, Mich. They had children: (a) Alvin Bruce, and (b) Viola Grace. Frank O. Clark is the owner of a large farm near Gridley, Kans. which he has successfully farmed for many years.
20. Alvin Bruce Clark (X19a), born Sept. 26, 1892 near Gridley, Kans., not married (1938). He lives at home with his father and mother.
21. Viola Grace Clark (X19b), born Jan. 12, 1894, near Gridley, Kans. She married Feb. 23, 1915 at Burlington, Kans., Howard Shaffer. He was born July 26, 1894 at Gridley, Kans. They had children: (a) Lyle C., born Jan. 5, 1916 near Gridley, Kans., (b) Glen S., born May 26, 1918 near Gridley, Kans., (c) Opal, born Jan. 9, 1921 at Gridley, Kans., and (d) Leona E., born Apr. 9, 1923 near Gridley, Kans.
