THE RONSHEIM FAMILY FROM ABTERODE

Abterode, the home of the small group which has as its name the word Ronsheim, is a tiny village in the mountain valleys slightly more than twenty miles east and slightly south of Kassel in Hesse. Even now it is off the main roads and has no railroad. Maps show elevations of almost 2,500 feet close by.

Off in the hills was, rather than is, the ancient cemetery. Here once was many stones bearing the name Ronsheim. The clean trimmed ivy was all about, and the records told the story of folk who had lived long in one place.

Within the village was the school. The church. Handed down, father to son, was the Memorbook. But all this is changed. The quiet folk are dead or scattered. Records were taken to Berlin and burned. Cemetery stones have been broken down. The ivy runs wild. Hitler and his Nazis passed this way.

As the past is gone from Abterode forevermore, but a few short miles to the eastward, along the Werra, the Iron Curtain is now closed down. If records do exist across that narrow stream they cannot be reached. It may be that what we record here closes the chapter on the years now gone.

No, that is not fully true. There yet live some of the name who know more. But they refuse to pass on what they know to complete the story. It will die with them to become part of what is already lost. The torch of Hitler and the silence of the living serve the same purpose.

The story of the Ronsheim family, its background, its present status all go to provide things to ponder on. The actual lack of information and of numbers add to the real facts. Among these may be the age of the family and the origin of the name itself.

The fragments which have been gathered bring to light the sons in a second generation bearing the name Ronsheim. This probably 175 years ago. Which suggests that the original bearer of the name as we know it may be listed as an "unknown Ronsheim" born about 1750.

Scholars of German who grew up in the general area of Abterode offer two explanations as to the name. It is possible someone may yet learn the full facts. But that remains for another generation and changed conditions and a chance to search records in Hesse itself.

The theory most recently offered, and it seems to have much weight behind it, would have the name come from the possible early residence of a family in the Hohe Rhon (Rhon Heights or Rhon Mountains) in which the Werra and the Fulda Rivers rise some 60 miles south of Abterode. These streams flow northward.

This theory suggests that the family "heim" or "home" was in, or near, the "Rhon". That is "Rhons-Heim" or the present spelling of Ronsheim. What the original family called itself is unknown. Just that here were people having a home in the Rhons heights. And German names generally are from places.

The other, and older, theory again bases on place names. In this it is

suggested that a family living east of the Werra in Thurigen or even more distant Prussia slowly spread westward until it had established itself in Hessen or, to the south, Bayern.

In the original home this idea would have it that the name was Ronshaus or Ronshausen, the "haus" meaning "house". That having crossed the Werra the name fitted itself to the more commong usage of the district and became heim or home, that is it became Ronsheim. A town, Ronshausen, is 15 miles south of Abterode.

The first suggestion has one great advantage over the older, or second, one in that it not only gives reason for the second syllable of the name but at the same time solves the source of the first syllable, long a puzzle to all who sought a solution. The prefix "rons" is not usual in the German language.

Either theory, the newer one which would have the name develop slowly from the fact this family lived or had its home in the Rhon Mountains or the older one which would bring about a sudden change because a family moved its location and shifted from one place name to another, could fit one more puzzle.

Did the name of Ronsheim come into use with some unit of a family about 1750? This would make it a very new name as the history of names go and could well explain the fact that it is even now a name rarely found and that no other branch has shown itself in research. There are people named Ronshausen.

And so our story begings with "1? Unknown Ronsheim" on page six. From what little family history exists in the memories of a very few people and from the even less material gleaned from what survived the Nazi destruction we do have a start of a family in its second generation, shown by the "2's".

This provides us with what seem to be three brothers with names and one without and, most likely, other brothers and sisters now unknown. From records available, Abraham Ronsheim seems to have been the elder of those known and so he, and the "New York family", lead the outlines attached.

It would seem that Wolf Ronsheim, who appears very briefly in the picture and then in a secondary part, would be second on the outline in a matter of age. And Geisel Ronsheim fits the next spot if birth of children is accepted. This is one of the "Cincinnati families". Last another "unknown".

The lines of Abraham and Geisel, so far as found in this country, are quite complete. That of the "unknown" is reasonably complete but much more could be had if answers were forthcoming from some of its members. If others would "talk" the line of Wolf also might be expanded but this is uncertain.

Only one thing seems certain -- all known persons bearing the name of Ronsheim trace back to Abterode and one common ancestor. It may be accepted, as well, that all known families of the name in this country are here recorded. And, third, that few, if any, bearing the name exist in Germany.

First turning to the least known group. Because of his son, Levi, Wolf appears in the little left at Abterode. But he could be one of two possible

ancestors of Alfred Ronsheim, of New York. However, Levi (4?) under David (3?) page six, seems more likely.

Members of the family living in New York did reach Alfred by telephone but he never replied to letters. It was learned that his father was Louis Ronsheim and that he died in this country, in 1949 it seems. And with less proof that his grandfather was Levi Ronsheim.

It is believed that the wife of this Levi was named Marianne and it is reported that this couple observed a sixtieth wedding anniversary at an advanced age. This last point alone casts doubt as to making Levi, son of Wolf, the Levi who was father of Louis. Levi, son of Wolf, was born in 1815, died in 1887.

Now to turn to the better known lines. So far as records are to be found it is certain that no Ronsheim moved beyond the limits of Hesse until some of the children of Geisel moved to America, finally making homes at Ripley, Ohio. About 1820 the family had moved to Buseck-Grosen, half way from Kassel to Frankfort and about 18 miles south of Marburg.

Two sons and two daughters of Geisel came to Ohio, probably about 1849 but not shown in the 1850 census. These included Henry, who became a merchant tailor; Louis, who established himself in the clothing business and, also, jointly in the livery trade with a string of race horses on the side; Sarah, and Frederickie.

Henry and Louis both moved their families to Cincinnati about 1890. But the latter kept his livery trade at Ripley for many years longer. Sarah married and died in Ripley while Frederickie married and her records have become lost.

Also about 1850, Joseph and Ephram left Hesse and settled in Cincinnati. It has been impossible to determine the father of these two men. That the tie with the Ripley family was close is best indicated by the fact that given names of the children are almost exactly the same. Too, when Louis died in 1892, William was one of those named to handle his estate.

The family of Joseph has, as a whole, remained in Cincinnati where some of its members have become prominent in the business and manufacturing fields. Ephram married a widow and, so far as can be found, had no family. There is some question as to whether these two men had a cousin, also Joseph. But from lack of findings it would appear there was but one of the name.

Although Levi, son of Geisel, did not come to this country, about ten years after the rest of those who settled in Ohio reached America they were followed by three sons of Levi. These were Herman, Joseph Levi and Isaac. Herman established what now is the biggest Ronsheim group in Cincinnati. Joseph Levi married and had but one daughter. Isaac lived first at Georgetown, near Ripley, where he married and established a business. He was active in the community and, prior to the death of this first wife, an officer in Georgetown Lodge No. 72, F. & A. M. He died in Florida.

The next line of the family to be established in this country has as its ancestor, Siegmund Ronsheim. He was the son of David and grandson of Abraham.

As has been shown, it is possible his brother, Levi, was the grandfather of Alfred. All these groups center about New York.

Siegmund may have been the most traveled, so far as early days go, of all the family in America. Shortly after the end of the Civil War he reached New York as a youngster barely turned 18. After becoming familiar with his new home he joined the great caravan of men who covered the nation with packs and trunks selling directly to customers.

Siegmund, with loaded trunks, followed the early railroads from town to town across the country east and west and north and south. As one trunk became empty it was sent back to New York to be restocked and sent off to meet him again at an arranged point. He seems to have followed this life for upward of ten years. He had a large family but only one great-grandson. Others were girls.

Between 1865 and 1935 a few other Ronsheims reached this country. But it is believed, from what records have been found, they did not establish any permanent family of the name. But the coming of Hitler, and the concentration camp sent a new flood of the family to this country. They were the great grandchildren and the great great grandchildren of Geisel through Levi. None carried the name but all are part of the family and closely kin. They center in New York and Detroit and through these it was possible to establish many of the facts used now about Abterode.

So widely has the family spread, from the Atlantic at New York and south to Florida, westward along the Gulf to Mobile and New Orleans, north to St. Louis and South Dakota, to Detroit and across New York state again to Boston and back to New York, it is impossible now to take up each group or individual. The outline covers each and everyone on vital statistics.

But Ronsheims have entered every phase of live -- doctors, editors, teachers, social workers, merchants, industry, artists and on and on. And in each field they have become recognized and respected. They have been active in politics and war. They have become part of America, these people from Abterode.

Part of this story includes two letters, one from Abterode and the other from the International Tracing Service in Germany. They tell another story, one of horror and elimination. Of cruelty and persecution. But all this would not be complete unless what these reports show is included here. Much can be only conjecture now that both the records and the people are gone.

On page 7 will be found the Hartman family. Although the tracing service has information only on Levi Hartman (see letter), relatives in this country say that all died in the Nazi purges other than Lissa, now in Sweden. No contact has been made with her.

The Max Ronsheim in the tracing service report is known to have been married and had three children. After living in London, to which he escaped, he returned to Bad Neuheim, a health resort near Frankfort, where he died in 1951 or 1952.

Max is said to have married Trude Rothschild. However, it seems reasonable to assume that she was the Jenny (Rothschild) Ronsheim in the tracing service report. He was living in Abterode about 1935 when relatives left for this country but was in Frankfort later. And Horst, Hans and Gerd are the ages his children would have been. Family reports say that his wife and the children all died in a concentration camp and the tracing service shows these people were sent to Riga.

Members of the family who visited Germany in pre-Hitler days met Gustav and Elsa (Monheimer) Ronsheim in Frankfort. He was the son of one of the sons of David, page 1. It is improbably that he was other than a son of Loesser, married late in 1876 with Gustav being born early in 1879 at Abterode. Nothing is known about their having children. They, too, went to Riga.

It also has been accepted as a reasonable possibility that Emil J. Ronsheim also was a son of L_0 esser and that Emma S. (Loeb) Ronsheim was his wife. The dates are felt not unreasonable and they all were part of the group sent to Riga.

Too, there is a belief that Max Ronsheim was a younger son of Loesser. That the wife of Loesser was much younger than he was is indicated by the late date of his marriage. And that those believed to be his wife and children lived with Emil in Frankfort and all were sent to Riga other than Max. He was in Abterode when the war ended.

There is another report to the effect that Max was the cousin of Alfred. The degree is unknown but this tends to confirm the idea that the ancestor of all was David Ronsheim.

That others on the tracing service report tie with the family is best shown by places of birth and dates. But how or where may never be known with the records gone.

In closing this record it should be said here that the story of the family may be in error in places. However, every effort has been made to check both family and official records. Endless miles of travel and weeks of work went into that research. Hundreds of letters were mailed and for the most part brought replies. Those few who failed to assist may have solved the puzzles. Copies will go to the many libraries and for all time this record of the family will survive. If various members add to it through the years the record becomes more valuable.

To trace yourself first find your name. For example my name appears on page 10 at 5a. I go backward to the first 4 which happens to be 4b, then back to the first 3, or 3d to my grandfather. From there to the first 2 or 2?, Geisel, and then to 1?.

There was a surprisingly small amount of material left over after the outline was made and the story written. Usually a fairly large supply of dates and names remain. In the present case it is possible that some of the material not used does not belong to the Ronsheim family at all but that someone, using phonetics to spell a name, got it like or so nearly like Ronsheim confusion results. But, rather than exclude anyone who may have belonged to family his right to be included this extra material is added below. Maybe someone can yet fit it in.

Amanda Ronsheim, on Cincinnati death records as being the daughter of Isaac Levi and Elizabeth Weil, born in Germany, July 16, 1822 and as died in Cincinnati, Dec. 14, 1911 at 87. Really she was 89. A widow, Amanda lived at 353 Hearne Avenue when she died. Buried United Jewish Cemetery. (Record file, 1911-6386)

Magdalena Rousheim or Ronsheim, died at 34 years on Jan. 6, 1876 and buried at Walnut Hills. No further data.

Infant Ronsheimer, born dead May 6, 1876 and buried at Walnut Hills by an undertaker confusing records shows as Henry Ronsheimer. Of course not of the family but the name has interest.

Isidor Ronsheim, born in Germany, Feb. 3, 1972, came to Cincinnati about 1888, died of pneumonia at St. Joseph+s Hospital, 12-2-1893.

Carrie Ransheim or Ronsheim married on Jan. 16, 1890 to Wendelin Wahlman.

Infant Ronsheim, born Dec. 30, 1877 to August and Helena Ronsheim, both born in Germany but living at Corryville where he was a stove dealer.

Getzer Ronsheim, first name very hard to figure out and may be error, born at Ripley, Ohio, and on record at Georgetown as born Sept. 25, 1869 to Louis Ronsheim and Betty Blontheim. Some chance this could have been Ida Ronsheim, daughter of Henry instead, born at Ripley, Sept. 30, 1869.
