#### THE SCHERER FAMILY

#### OF MONTGOMERY COUNTY, ILLINOIS

Family history is an interesting study which grows more and more interesting as one finds bits of information of the earlier generations. The present history is not entirely the work of the author, but a compilation of material done by earlier researchers, plus the original work of the author.

The earliest history of the Scherer\* family was written during the years 1909 to 1910 by A. T. Scherer of Indianapolis, Indiana. This consisted of four pamphlets which traced the family from the early eighteenth century to the middle of the nineteenth century. This was followed by a short mimeographed history written by I. S. Blackwelder of Chicago in 1911. In 1938 Dr. Simon P. Scherer of Martinsville, Indiana, and Dayton D. Fertig of Franklin, Indiana, compiled a history of the descendants of Ambrose H. Scherer. Other works followed, such as a summary of the former histories plus additional data as compiled by Dr. Whitsett, and the work of M. G. G. Scherer of Virginia.

The author, however, knew nothing of the A. T. Scherer history, which is by far the most complete history of the family, until far along in his search for data. By means of countless letters and visits to various members of the family a start was organized and then built up until the following history is the result.

The data herein printed could not be compiled except by means of a search of the records at the courthouse at Hillsboro, the use of the 1850 Census at Springfield, and visits to the old family cemeteries.

To those many people who have aided in making this possible the author offers his thanks: the record is NOT complete, but it is as nearly complete as is possible to make it at this time. No doubt there are errors, there are certainly omissions. The author hopes that those who come in contact with this work will undertake to correct and add to this volume in order to make it more nearly complete. Many addresses are omitted, they should be entered in this pamphlet. Therefore, any additions or corrections which may be made should be sent to the author.

### NICHOLAS SCHERRER: born about 1675, died February 20, 1764 at Oberbetsbach, Rheinland, Germany. Name of wife unknown.

NICHOLAS (or NICKOLAS) SCHERRER was born about 1675, lived all his life in the village of Oberbetsbach, Rheinland, Germany—a village far up the Rhine and near Cologne. The country is very rough and hilly. Nicholas owned a small farm, the size of which is variously given at from thirty to forty-five acres. It is supposed, but not proven, that the family is of Swiss origin.

NICHOLAS SCHERRER and wife (name unknown) were the parents of three known children: George Theobald, who wrote the following letter to his brother; a daughter, name unknown, descendants unknown; and Jacob Daniel. It is from Jacob Daniel that our line is descended.

Little is known of the life if the family here in Oberbetsbach, but the letter which follows, taken from A. T. Scherer's History, Volume 1, throws a bit of light on the original family.

Letter from George Theobald Scherer to his brother, Jacob Daniel Scherer, dated April 19th, 1764. Translated principally by Rev. M. G. G. Scherer, D. D.

"First of all, greetings to you heartily and much beloved brother Jacob Daniel Scherrer, as well as to thy wife and children. I will write to you now how it is with us, and how I am, but I expect an answer from you. It is eight years the present Easter 1764, that I took charge of the farm and have not made anything but rather lost by degrees. My first wife, Catherine Elizabeth, died eight years ago, but I have two children by hertwo daughters, namely Marie Elizabeth the older, and the younger Catherine Salome. Six years ago, two weeks before Christmas, I married again and from this union have come two sons, named John Ludwig the older, and John Jacob, the younger. . . . She, my wife, is Angelia Miller, daughter of the village official Jochem Christian Miller. As for us, we are all, thank God, well and hearty. Mother died on St. Gertrude's Day, (Nov. 15th), 1763, and father one week before Shrove Tuesday of the present year 1764. Eternal thanks be to the Almighty that He has relieved me of this burden, for which I have long sighed. Had he lived longer he would have reduced me to poverty. I never had any peace and was constantly obliged to resort to litigation with him so that I wished well nigh a thousand times that this might end. I could truly say, "father and mother have deserted me but the Lord careth for me." Unable to support myself any longer, I was contrained and compelled to sell my home and land and move to you in the new country. When the bargain was closed it was recorded by the bailiff and then carried by him to the county judiciary at Ottweiller. It was reported to me that I would have to supplicate to my prince for a certificate of dismission from his allegiance. Thus I had to have written a supplication to my most serene Prince and Lord. When, therefore, I brought my supplication to the county judiciary he replied that I would not be permitted to leave the country but that the Prince had promised that the things should again improve in the land. He would recall all objectionable regulations. I however, refused, and entered into a disputation during which the judiciary said that if I should leave the country without securing a certificate of dismission from the Prince all my property would be confiscated and seized by the Prince, and the same thing would happen to my brother's possessions. Then I answered that the Prince could not confiscate my brother's possessions, because when he left these regulations were not in force. Now because of the great excitement everywhere, about the "new country," no one is permitted to take even one kroutser along. Not being permitted to take anything along, I was obliged to take charge again of my house and land, for I did not want to leave everything behind with wife and children. . . .

"Dear brother, since the Prince is going to confiscate your inheritance I write you not to return on account of your inheritance. I beg of you, dear brother, to have the goodness at your first opportunity to write me or come yourself, that I may know what to do regarding your inheritance; whether you wish to give it to the Prince or give it to me. If this is the case I would petition my most seren Prince and Lord accordingly.

"Dear brother, please write me if I may still be able to secure a position where you are, and how one may get to your country. One is not able to take anything along, and it is well nigh impossible to live here. The Prince is very exacting—we have much compulsory service to render—every week, forced labor or help in the chase.

"I have two-thirds of our estate, that is, about thirty acres, for which I am obliged to pay annually to the Prince, 18 or 19 Ruchsthaler and five Gulden socage money. For two whole years we have had to survey the land. Our former system of taxation has been taken away. We now have the direct taxation and we are so overburdened that we find it difficult to exist. Our forest is gone-the Frankenholzer forest is cut down and turned into charcoal, the grove called Hohwaedchen, is cut away and made into cord wood and sold to the surrounding villages. Thus we have nothing but fallow ground and plats of misfortune. Now I will write to you why we had the lawsuit; father, mother, and our sister kept together and suppressed me because I did not give my consent that father bestowed so much upon our sister, especially the dowry, while we have nothing. I reproached him about it, but the judiciary upheld his part and said that he could do as he pleased with his things. Now I know nothing more to write you except that the peace of God which passeth all understanding, keep your minds and hearts through Christ Jesus our Lord, and the God of peace sanctify us through and through. I remain your faithful servant and dear brother George Theobald Scherer unto death. We wish all, a thousand times good night. Oberbetsbach, April 19th, 1874.

"Your letter written to me I received Feb. 27. Father was dead seven days when I received the letter. My letter was written April 19th, 1764, and I carried the letter to Zweibrucken to John Nicholas Hibner, who went to his brother at Krumbach, where George Hibner is staying with his father. Now I know nothing more to write for this time except the peace of God which passeth all human understanding, keep all of our heads and minds in Christ Jesus until Eternal life, Amen. We wish you all many thousand times good night. Unto God alone be the glory. The piece of money of which you wrote to me in your letter I have given to your God parents."

#### SECOND GENERATION

JACOB DANIEL SCHERRER, son of Nicholas Scherrer, born November 11, 1726 at Oberbetsbach, Germany; died September 26, 1795, Guilford County North Carolina.

JACOB DANIEL SCHERRER, son of Nicholas Scherrer was probably the second child and younger son; born November 11, 1726 at Oberbetsbach, Rheinish Palatinate, Germany. He learned the tailoring trade at Ottweiller in the same province and on August 31, 1751, was given an official letter of recommendation by the Masters of Tailoring at Ottweiller certifying under oath to his ability as a tailor. This document is still in existence, bearing the signatures of its officers; the official seal stamped in red wax is still intact. On the document are the figures of two men showing the cut or style of garments, also a pair of shears. (A. T. Sherer, Volume 1).

#### COPY OF DOCUMENT

"We, the Sworn Masters of Tailoring in the town of Ottweiller, do hereby certify that the present Jacob Daniel Scherrer, born in Ober-betsbach, 21 years ago, of average stature, brown hair, has learned the Tailoring trade to the satisfaction of Master Michael Grawang, and has shown himself industrious and truthful. We the undersigned wish to recommend him.

Ottweiller, August 31, 1751.

Shortly after learning the tailoring trade Jacob Daniel must have come to America for in Rupp's book, "30,000 Immigrants in Pennsylvania," (page 279, which lists passengers to America) is found this item: "Jacob Daniel Scherrer, September 26, 1752 (date of landing in America); Ship "Richard and Mary," John Moore, master, from Rotterdam, last from Plymouth, England." Thus we find Jacob Daniel landing at Philadelphia in 1752. He took oath of allegiance to his Majesty on the day of landing. Within the next three years he had married Hannah Sophia Dick, the location is unknown, but the date is October 7, 1755. Their first known child, John Jacob, was born in the colony of Delaware, September 14, 1759. The next child was born in 1763 in Guilford County, North Carolina. The movements of the family from 1752 until 1763 are unknown. In Guilford County Jacob Daniel Scherrer learned the hatter's trade, taught school, probably in connection with Frieden's Church, and finally bought several tracts of land, one situated on the north side of Rock Creek containing about 195 acres. This was sold by his wife, Jacob Jr., John, Christian and David Shearer, heirs of Jacob Shearer Senior to Henry Strader in the year 1801 for the sum of six hundred dollars.

Another tract of land in what is now the eastern part of Guilford County, three miles south of the town of Gibsonville and one mile north of Alamance stream was bought by Jacob Daniel. The surrounding community had been settled even before his arrival by many Lutherans and Reformed people who chose this section because of its natural beauty and fertility. This farm became known as the Scherer farm and passed to his son Frederick, then to a grandson, Reverend Jacob Scherer and then after being owned by the Scherer family for eighty years was sold to Daniel Foust in 1832. The executor of the latter, Daniel P. Foust conveyer it to Livinia Summers Foust, and it was purchased from her by William Thornton Whitsett who from 1888 to 1918 conducted here a boarding school for boys that attracted during the thirty years of its existence six thousand students from a wide area. The old Scherer home has long since passed away, but at the foot of the hill still bubbles the spring which supplied the water for the household.

The grave of this pioneer, Jacob Daniel Scherer had long been forgotten, but on June 7, 1925, his great-great grandson, Dr. M. G. G. Scherer, on a visit to Freiden's Cemetery discovered it. The old tombstone was broken off, and hidden and covered by grasses, but the base of it was found a few feet to the south of the grave of his son, Frederick Scherer, and here the grave was easily located. The inscription on the stone reads as follows:

> Hier schlafet Jacob Daniel Scherer Ist gehohren Anno 1726 den 11 November Nimmt Sophia Dick in Surehe an 1755 den 7 October zeiget 9 kinder und sterbet an 1795 den 26 September sein gantzes alter ist 68 J. 10 M. 14 T. TRANSLATION: Here sleeps Jacob Daniel Scherer He was born on the 11th of November In the year 1726 He took to wife Sophia, Dick on October 7, 1755

begot nine children and died on the 26th of September, 1795 Aged 68 years, 10 months, 14 days.

FREDERICK SCHERER, born 1763 in Guilford County, North Carolina; died February 20, 1817, Freidens, Guilford County, North Carolina; married Barbara Smith.

FREDERICK SCHERER, son of Jacob Daniel and Hannah Sophia (Dick) Scherer, was born about 1763 on the homestead in Guilford County, North Carolina. He was a hatter by trade, and also a farmer. Later he became a distiller, an occupation then considered honorable even by church members. In 1782 he enlisted for eighteen months in the 10th Regiment of Raiford's Company, North Carolina (p. 1166, Volume 16, North Carolina State Records). After his service he married Miss Barbara Smith, daughter of Andrew Smith. Frederick Scherer bought a number of tracts of land in Guilford county, the first about 1799 and the last about 1811.

The following portion of a letter written by Jacob Sherer (son of Jacob Daniel) to Benjamin Goodner (husband of Elizabeth Scherrer) gives some information on this family.

"North Carolina, Guilford County, March 8, 1814.

Dear Cousin: . . Brother Andrew, who is the next oldest to me, was married before me to my wife's sister and has one child, called Lefina. Brother Frederick, the third brother, married last, to Barney Clapp's daughter, Margaret, and has three children, the oldest Nelly, the second Sally, and the youngest is a boy not baptized yet. Daniel, the fourth brother, is single yet and lives with me the most of his time, endeavoring to get some qualifications for the ministry. I have three sisters, all single, two namely, Barbara and Hanah, are grown; the other is small yet, namely Nancy. Brother John is the oldest boy father has with him now. He begins to plow, David is younger, and Eli is the youngest child. We all have enough to eat, and to wear. Taxes are getting very high. . . ." (A. T. Scherer's History, Volume 2, pp 47-48). (Notice: follow chart to understand the names of the children of Frederick mentioned above. AUTHOR)

Frederick Scherer died February 20, 1817 when fifty-four years of age and was buried by the side of his father in the Shoemaker or Freiden's Cemetery, Guilford County, North Carolina. His wife survived him only a few years.







Reverend Daniel Sherer (later Scherer) was the fourth son and probably the fourth child of Frederick and Barbara Scherer. In 1814, his brother, Reverend Jacob Sherer (or Scherer) wrote of him saying that Daniel was still single and that he made his home most of the time with him and was endeavoring to obtain some qualification for the ministry. In this he happily succeeded, reflecting great credit upon his youthful instructor, Rev. Jacob Scherer. Daniel was licensed to preach in the Lutheran church and was ordained by the Synod of North Carolina held in 1821, at Lans Church in Guildford County, North Carolina. In 1821 Reverend Daniel Scherer became pastor of St. John's Church, Cabarrus County, North Carolina, succeeding the Reverend C. A. G. Stork. "Reverend Daniel Scherer proved himself to have been a faithful pastor. He was much beloved by his people and remained nearly ten years among them." (quotation from Birnheim's 'Lutheran Church in the Carolinas' quoted by A. T. Scherer).

In 1823, Reverend Daniel Scherer became pastor of the Organ Chuch, Rowan County, North Carolina, again succeeding Reverend Stork. Reverend Stork had completed thirty five years of service to this churrh. It is stated that Reverend Daniel Scherer at the Organ Church had probably the largest class of catechismers, numbering eighty-three persons, that was confirmed in this church during a session of the North Carolina Synod. Reverend Daniel labored but six years in the Organ church congregation. "As he had the oversight of so many churches he thought it advisable to resign some portion of his charge into the hands of another minister in order to do justice to the cause of Christ, and Reverend Jacob Kaempffer became his successor in 1829." ("Organ Church, Rowan County, North Carolina," quoted from A. T. Scherer).

About the close of the year 1831, the Reverend Daniel Scherer moved to Illinois and succeeded Reverend Schonberg as pastor of the Lutheran congregations in Union County, Illinois. In 1832, on his circuit riding, he arrived at Hillsboro and organized there a Lutheran Congregation. Here Reverend Scherer found many people who had come from the Carolinas and they were without services of a minister of their faith. In 1833, he wrote a letter to the Synod of North Carolina containing the information of his surcess in forming a congregation in Hillsboro consisting of thirtymembers. (A. T. Scherer). By 1834, Reverend Daniel Scherer had five gathered a congregation large enough to locate a churchhouse, located jdst north of where the present Lntheran Church now stands in Hillsboro. It was a frame structure, the first of its kind in Illinois, and so well did he do his work that in 1834 the North Carolina Synod adopted the iollowing resolutions: "Resolved, that we express our appreciation of the laudable efforts of the Reverend Daniel Scherer in collecting and organizing a Lutheran congregation in Hillsboro, Illinois." (A. T. Scherer History).

In 1835 Prov. Haverstick of Philadelphia visited the Hillsboro congregation and wrote of the untiring labors of Reverend Scherer in the highest terms of praise, mentioning that Reverend Scherer frequently traveled one hundred fifty niles from home on horseback in order to rinister to the spiritual needs of such colonies as were not included in his own immediate charge, and this of necessity inasmuch as he was the only resident Lutheran minister at that time in the entire state of Illinois.

The Reverend Daniel Scherer served as pastor of the Hillsboro Lutheran Church for ten years, from 1832 until October, 1843, when he moved to Wabash County, Illinois, where he died in 1852. Reverend Scherer may rightly be considered the "father of the Lutheran Church in Illinois."

## FOURTH GENERATION

F.BARBARA SCHERER: born in Guilford County, North Carolina, daughter of Frederick and Barbara Scherer. The date of birth is unknorn, but Barbara is thought to be the second oldest girl and her birth is placed between 1791 and 1796. Barbara married Christian Kime and reared a large family of children, some of whose names are known. The starred (\*) names below are the names of the children known to have come to Montgomery county. When Barbara Scherer or her husband, Christian Kime, were born, married, or died, is not known. Samuel A. Kime, of Hillsboro, wrote A. T. Scherer in a letter of August 27, 1906, that "father and three or four brothers came to Illinois in the spring of 1851 in a one-horse wagon." ISSUE:
