SAWYER IMMIGRANTS TO AMERICA DURING THE SEVENTEENTH CENTURY

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It seems difficult to determine with any degree of certainty the origin and relationship of the various immigrant ancestors of the SAWYERS in America. There seems to have been a legend that three Sawyer brothers, Thomas, Edward, and William, emigrated from Lincolnshire, England, came on a ship with Capt. Parker, and settled in Mass. about 1636. MAINE GENEALOGY VOL. 3, page 1444, gives the following information on the origin of the Sawyer family: "The ancestors of the Sawyers, John Sawyer, was a farmer in Lincolnshire, Eng. where he is supposed to have been a landholder also. He was the father of three sons: William, Edward, and Thomas; who left England on a ship commanded by Capt. Parker, and settled in Massachusetts about 1636. Edward, son of John Sawyer, brought over with him from England his wife, whose name was Mary Peasley, and their children, Mary, Henry, and James, and settled first in Ipswich and then in Rowley, Mass. No more is known of Edward or his wife."

Searching the vital records of New England, we find that there was an EDMUND SAWYER at Ipswich Mass. as early as 1636. There was an EDWARD SAWYER and a THOMAS SAWYER who bought adjoining lots at Rowley in 1640. EDWARD SAWYER remained in Rowley and his children born in Rowley include Sarah, b. 19.10mo.1645, bur. 12.12mo.1645; John b. 17. 7mo. 1647, d. 1647/8; John b. 7.6mo.1648, m. Mary Parrat, d. 7 Apr. 1722; and Ezekiel (Flower of Essex) killed in the battle of Bloodybrook, 18 Sept. 1675. Will sworn to 31 Mar. 1674 by Ezekiel Northend and Thomas Tenny mentions wife (unnamed), eldest son John, and son Ezekiel. (Essex Probate File 24838). Widow Mary Sawyer and her son John agreed 6 Feb. 1676-7 upon a division of the property of Edward Sawyer, deceased. (Essex Deeds 4ips:83)

Some authorities suggest that EDMUND of Ipswich 1636, EDWARD of Rowley 1640, and EDWARD son of John of Lincolnshire, Eng. are the same person. Another thought which is suggested by Amory Carter, an authority on the Sawyer family, is that EDMUND of Ipswich 1636 is the same person who was at York (Maine) in 1661, and is not Edward Sawyer of Rowley. It is quite probable also that Edward, father of John of Rowley, and Edward son of John of Lincolnshire are not the same person. This is especially apparent if we consider James son of Edward of Lincolnshire to be the James of Gloucester as is suggested by the Maine Genealogy. For John of Rowley to have been the oldest son of Edward of Rowley in 1674, sons Henry and James (if they were brothers of John) would have had to be dead, where-as James of Gloucester lived until 1703.

In any case EDWARD SAWYER of ROWLEY is, thru his son John, the immigrant ancestor of most of the family of Sawyers of Rowley.

THOMAS SAWYER, immigrant ancestor of probably the largest group of Sawyers in America, is said to have come to Rowley about 1636. Vital records show that he received a lot at Rowley about 1640 next to his (brother?) Edward. He took up residence at Lancaster, Mass. 1647 and became one of its first permanent residents. Thomas became the ancestor of nearly all of the early Sawyers West of Middlesex County, Mass.

WILLIAM SAWYER, was first at Salem 1643, later at Wenham, and settled in Newbury by 1645. William may or may not be the son of John of Lincolnshire. I can find no definite proof that he is. William's descendants are located mainly in Essex, Suffolk, and Norfolk Counties, Mass., together with those of Edward Sawyer.

JAMES SAWYER of Gloucester. Maine Genealogy has the following comment on James Sawyer of Gloucester: "James, youngest son of Edward and Mary (Peasley) was born in England and came to Mass. with his parents. He was a weaver and settled in Gloucester where he died May 31, 1703. One authority says he is doubtless the son of Edward of Ipswich while others having searched the records of Ipswich were unable to verify this...". William Sawyer is also given by some authorities as the father of James Sawyer of Gloucester, though I can find no legal proof to substantiate this. James seems to be the ancestor of many of the Sawyers of Essex County, Mass., and much of the Sawyer family of Maine.

There was a MARY SAWYER of Newbury who married first, 7 Nov. 1648, William Mitchell, and second, 8 Dec. 1658, Robert Savory of Newbury. She may have been a sister of William of Newbury (Old Families of Salisbury and Amesbury).

The Will of Joseph Peasley 1660, seems to show that his daughters Elizabeth and Sarah were then single while Jane and Mary had rec'd their portion and were married, as he mentions his granddaughter Sarah Sawyer and his daughter Jane who married John Davis in 1646. It seems probable that Mary married a Sawyer unless there was another dau. who was dead 1660 who left a daughter Sarah Sawyer. (Hist. Rowley)

Savage list additional Immigrant Sawyers of which we do not have additional records, see Savage Gen. Dictionary Vol. 4; Edmund Sawyer of Ipswich 1636 removed to York Me. befor 1661; James Sawyer from Northbourne Co. Kent, Eng., came to America on Hurcules from Sandwich but we know not where he sat down; Job Sawyer (Sayer) at Southampton L.I. 1673 with Daniel and Francis (there was at least one Job there in 1635 and the others may have been his brothers and sisters); John Sawyer of Falmouth sold in 1655 to Isaac Walker of Boston, that Island called Long Island in Casco Bay; Richard Sawyer died at Hartford Conn. 1648, not md. employed by John Cullick; Robert Sawyer of Hampton 1640; Thomas Sawyer of Lynn 1635, one of the purchasers of Southampton L.I. in 1640.

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THE SAWYER FAMILY OF ELLIOTSVILLE PLANTATION, PISCATAQUIS COUNTY, MAINE.

While an attempt has been made by the author to gather as much information as possible on all branches of the "JAMES SAWYER OF GLOUCESTER" family, most of the available information on the later families has been on the Sawyers of Elliotsville Me., and their descendents. Thus this first edition of this genealogy is focused mainly on the Sawyers of Elliotsville and their kinfolk the Drakes.

The following extract from the History of Piscataquis County, by Loring- Pub. Hoyt, Fogg & Donhan, 1880, Portland, Me., gives us an insight on the first settlers of Elliotsville, including JOSEPH SAWYER, progenitor of the Sawyers of Elliotsville, and JOHN DRAKE progenitor of one branch of the Drakes of Elliotsville.

" ELLIOTSVILLE.

Elliotsville has faded from the list of towns in this county, but it once had a place in it. Though now in the twilight of its brighter days, it has a history. As primarily run out by John Boardman, it

was Number Eight, Nineth Range. It has two lofty mountains within its limits- Boarstone and Peaked Mountains,- while Ship Pond lies in its southeastern part, and vents its surplus waters into Sebec Lake. The Wilson Stream crosses the southwest corner of it, and therein receives the Little Wilson; these united to make very good mill privileges. But limited portions of its soil are good for agriculture; other portions has a fair amount of pine and spruce timber; and other large portions are waste and useless.

Grants and Proprietors. A strip on the west side, nearly a mile wide was included in the grant to the Massachusetts Medical Society to equal the 3,000 acres in Number Nine of that township, sold to William C. Whitney.

The Vaughan tract was the next granted. In February, 1812, the State of Massachusetts granted to the heirs of the late William Vaughan, one full half township of wild land, for services rendered to the State. A person of his name resided in Portsmouth N.H., who took an active part in projecting and pushing forward the expedition to Louisburg, in 1745, and this may be the individual. These heirs selected the northern part of this township, on the east of the Medical tract, and in 1814, 11,520 acres were conveyed to them by the State authorities, including the usual reserves for public uses.

By the Saco Free Bridge Co., Capt. Ichabod Jordan was appointed to select and locate four thousand acres, to make up the deficiency, and he took that amount on the south of the Vaughan tract. Two other small parcels in the south part, on either side of Ship Pond, remained which Elliot G. Vaughan Esq. and a Mr. Watson eventually purchased. The Vaughan heirs early sold an undivided part, amounting to 4,333 acres, to G. H. Vaughan, to raise money to pay the expense of obtaining and locating the grant.

This reduced the amount held in common, to about seven thousand acres. Some of the owners sold out their shares, and eventually Elliot G. Vaughan Esq. became chief owner.

First Settlers. Capt. Jordan had an opening felled on the Free Bridge part, in 1824, and Joseph and Eben Sawyer from Buxton also made beginnings. Joseph Sawyer was the first to move his family in, and fifty acres of land were given to his son Joseph in consideration thereof. In 1826, S. G. Bodfish from Norridgewock moved on to the lot which Capt. Jordan cleared. In 1828, John Drake and E. Briggs from Buckfield, came in, also two Messrs. Burnell from Portland, relatives of the Vaughan family. E. G. Vaughan Esq. took quite an interest in settling the township. He early erected a saw-mill, and started a clapboard machine on the Wilson Stream, and eventually settled his family there. He worked up a large amount of timber in these, while clapboard-cuts were also driven out on the Ship Pond and Wilson Streams. Mr. Vaughan's Mills and house were not upon the Vaughan tract but nearer the southern part of the township.

E. T. Bridge Esq. built a grist-mill on the Wilson, above Vaughans Mill, on the eastern side of the Medical tract.

Mr. Vaughan, hoping to promote the sale of his land, prematurely procured the incorporation of the town in 1835 and named it Elliotsville, perpetuating his own name. They were troubled to collect the non-resident taxes. A large amount of non-resident land was advertised and sold at auction, and this discouraged, rather than

encouraged, settlement.


A county road was located and opened to Monson, school districts were established, a school fund secured by the sale of reserved lands, and the settlement promised well, except that it was small and the non-resident taxes were not paid willingly.

After the annexation of the eastern part of Wilson, to Elliotville the depletion of its inhabitants went on. After the timber was cut off, the wild land would not sell for enough even to pay the taxes. E. G. Vaughan and many others moved away and in 1858, the inhabitants petitioned for a repeal of the act of incorporation. This was granted, and it has not been organized into a plantation since. (1880) Vaughan's mill has gone to decay, but the Sawyer's built a shingle mill upon the same dam, which is still operating (1880).

In 1860 the population was 59; in 1870 it was 42; in 1880 it is still less. "

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The following is a rough sketch of Piscataquis County Maine, showing location of the townships as they were divided in 1880 and the interconnecting roads:

(1) JAMES¹ SAWYER of Gloucester, Mass., was born about 1632, possibly at Lincolnshire, England; died at Gloucester, Mass., 31 May 1703. He probably married (1) Martha (maiden name not known) and (2) SARAH Bray, b. 1651, d. 24 Apr. 1727 at Gloucester, daughter of Thomas Bray and Mary Wilson of Gloucester. He is said to have settled first at Ipswich Jan 1669 and was a weaver there, and later, before 1680, settled in Gloucester.

We find the following account of James Sawyer in the MAINE GENEALOGY, Vol. 4 (see also Vol. 1): "James Sawyer, youngest child of Edward and Mary (Peasley) Sawyer was born in England and came to Mass. with his parents. He was a weaver and settled in Gloucester where he died May 31, 1703. One authority says that he is doubtless the son of Edward of Ipswich while another having searched the records of Ipswich was unable to verify this. Beginning with the first appearance of James in Gloucester, his identity with the generations succeeding as herein mentioned, does not seem to admit of doubt. About a week before his death James made a Will which gives the names of his children then living. The diary of a clergyman tells of meetings held at the house of James, also of his being present at the death of a daughter there. James Sawyer married Sarah Bray of Gloucester, born 1651, died 24 April 1727, probably a second wife. His children named in the Will were Thomas, John, Nathaniel, Abraham, Isaac, Jacob, Mary, Sarah, and James."

Continueing with the account of the Sawyer family in the MAINE GENEALOGY, Vol. 4, we find the account of Edward Sawyer the father of James, and John Sawyer his grandfather: "John Sawyer was a farmer in Lincolnshire, England, where he is supposed to have been a landholder also. He was the father of three sons: Edward, William, and Thomas; who left England on a ship commanded by Capt. Parker, and settled in Mass. about 1636. Edward Sawyer, son of John, brought over with him from England his wife, whose maiden name was Mary Peasley, and their children, Mary, Henry, and James, and settled first at Ipswich than at Rowley, Mass. No more is known of Edward or his wife."

I have tried to check the foregoing statements from the MAINE GEN. Vol. 4, on the parentage of James Sawyer of Gloucester, from the vital records but have found little to prove the claim. It seems evident from the records of Edward Sawyer of Rowley, who is the ancestor of the Rowley Sawyers thru his son John, that James of Gloucester is not his son. At least from the will of Edward of Rowley, 1674, mentions only oldest son John (b. 1648), son Ezekiel, and wife (unnamed). (Widow of Edward Sawyer later named in deed as Mary Sawyer). If the Edward Sawyer of Ipswich (Edmund 1636) is not the same person as Edward Sawyer of Rowley than this Edward Sawyer of Ipswich may have been the father of James of Gloucester. Possible also that there are two Edward Sawyers of Rowley.

A few authorities have suggested that James may be the son of William of Newbury, but I can find no vital records to substantiate this either.

James Sawyer was a selectman in Gloucester in 1696. He received grants of land; six acres on the west side of the Annisquam river in 1688, and in 1690 he bought additional land in that section of the town and established his residence there. His wife outlived him many years and was living with her son Abraham on the family homestead, 1726. The estate was divided in 1752.

(2) THOMAS² SAWYER (James¹), of Gloucester, Mass., was born probably at Ipswich about 1674, died at Gloucester, 12 Jan. 1711; married (1) 17 Feb. 1690 HANNAH MILLET, d. at Gloucester 15 Sept. 1690, dau. of John Millett, (2) HANNAH (VERY) FOSTER, b. Mar. 1653, daughter of Thomas Very and Hannah Giles, and widow of Bartholomew Foster whom she married 9 Nov. 1668. Mrs. Hannah Foster had 10 children by her first husband, eight of which attended the second wedding which was on the 18th of Nov. 1691. Thomas bought the house of his second wife and lived there, which was located at the harbor near the beach.

* (3) JOHN² SAWYER (James¹), of Gloucester, Mass., born probably at Ipswich 1676, died at Cape Elizabeth, Maine, 23 Feb. 1760, aged 84, and buried at Meetinghouse Hill, So. Portland, Me. 25 Feb. 1760. He married at Gloucester, 20 Feb. 1701, REBECCA STANFORD, b. 1677, d. 23 Aug. 1755, at Cape Elizabeth, Maine, aged 78, and was buried at Meetinghouse Hill, So. Portland, Me., 25 Aug. 1755, daughter of Robert Stanford of Gloucester.

John is said to have lived at Cape Ann, Gloucester, Mass., and moved to Falmouth Me. in 1719. He settled in that portion that later became Cape Elizabeth. John was granted a ferry license at Portland, formerly Falmouth Me. May 1719, which he operated for many years. John was of "Purpoodyuck" at the time he was granted the ferry license. (Hist. Portland Me. p. 353). John Sawyer was one of the proprietors of the First Church of Falmouth. At a meeting 22 Feb. 1719-20, the town voted "that a meeting house be built as soon as possible, 36' x 28' stud." John was among those listed as being in charge of its building.

*(22) JABEZ⁴ SAWYER (Joseph³, John², James¹), of Buxton, Maine, was born at Cape Elizabeth Maine (second parish Falmouth), 31 Dec. 1743, died at Buxton, 19 April 1816. He married at Buxton, 8 March 1765, MARY PENNELL, who is said to be a descendent of Clement Pennell of the Isle of Jersey. Mary Pennell is also the granddaughter of Sarah Sawyer, the sister of Judge Joseph Sawyer. She died 10 March 1814 at Buxton.

Jabez Sawyer with his brother John settled first in the Blue Hill district, at or near the place now called Sedgwick, where they resided for several years on adjoining farms. When the Indians became troublesome in that district they returned to Cape Elizabeth, and when the times became more peaceful they went to Narragansett #1, now Buxton, and there cleared adjoining farms. Here they lived and died. Their farms are said to be located "between Old Corner and Duck Pond" on a lane a short distance from the main road.

The first record that we can find of Jabez in Narragansett #1, now Buxton, is his marriage "Jabesh Sawyer of Falmo' and Mary Pennell of Narragansett #1, married by Rev. Paul Coffin, 8 March 1765", at the Buxton Lower Corner Church. Also in the records of the Buxton Lower Corner Church are the baptisms of several of Jabez children. The older children were probably born at Blue Hill or at Cape Elizabeth, as no record can be found of their birth at Buxton.

The census record of 1790 list for Jabez Sawyer of Buxton, 4 males 16 years of age and over, 3 males under 16, and 5 females. In the records of Buxton about 1800, Jabez residence is described as follows: Range GN^o1 of 2^d Div., 896 sq. ft. one story high, 6 windows, totaling 32 sq. ft., wood, one dwelling, value \$200.00.

Jabez Sawyer is said to have been a soldier of the Revolution and a Pensioner, but no record of this can be found of this in the National Archives, though there is a record of his son Jabez who was in the war of 1812 and who received a pension.

(35) JOSEPH³ SAWYER (Jabez⁴, Joseph³, John², James¹), of Buxton Maine, was born in April 1774, probably at Buxton, but his birth is not recorded there. He married first, 17 Sept. 1803, at Cape Elizabeth, Me., JOANNA COBB, of Cape Elizabeth, who died at Buxton 3 Sept. 1825. After the death of his second wife he married, 11 March 1827 at Buxton, by Samuel V. Nason J.P., Miss. MARY REDLON, b. 15 Oct. 1785, Buxton, daughter of Ebenezer Redlon and Sarah Hancock (see Redlon - Hancock families).

Little is known of the early life of Joseph, only that he resided at Buxton. About 1828 Joseph Sawyer and Eben (probably his brother) moved to Elliotville Plantation in Piscataquis County Maine, where they made clearings and later constructed a shingle mill. See History of Elliotville in forward. Joseph moved his family to Elliotville soon after, and his son Joseph was given a grant of 50 acres. The mill was operated by his son John and was still in operation as late as 1880.

Little can be found on the later life of Joseph, but he was living with or near his daughter Eliza Stevens, of Bridgton Maine, the summer of 1842. He died about 1846 probably at Elliotville. It is not known when or where his wife Mary died. It is from this family that most of the Sawyers of Elliotville, and surrounding villages of Piscataquis County Maine, descended.

Diana died about 1841 and John married (2) 1847, GERALDINE V. DRAKE, b. 17 June 1819, at Buckfield Me., sister of Diana Drake, above, and widow of Samuel Thompson of Penfield, Me. (see Drake family # D6) Geraldine died 22 Feb. 1860, the day after giving birth to twins.

John moved with his father to Elliottsville Plantation, Piscataquis, county Maine, about 1826-8, where they made clearings. He was a lumberman by trade and later operated his fathers shingle mill at Elliottsville. The following letter was written by him soon after the the death of his first wife, and is in beautiful hand writing. It is addressed to his sister Eliza Stevens.

Elliotsville, July Sunday, 4th, 1841.

"Dear Brother and Sister:

You may think strange of my not wrighting a single line to you sence Farther left here. But when I tell you the reason I hope you will forgive me. First I will try to inform you of my helth which is not very good at present I have enjoyed my helth well for most of the time since I went into the woods last winter untill now which I have reason to be thankful for what is life without helth. Although I think we ought at all times to be resign to the will of our Hevevly Farther yet at times I feell to murmer against his providen but when I consider that it is for our good that we are afflicted I then try to be reconcilled to it yet I feell to mourn (although I ought not) for my wife which our Farther has taken home to be with him in Heaven and left me alone, then I think, it will not be long that we shall be seperated before I shall so to meet her in reasms above when all pain sorrow and mourning will be known no more where we shall meet all of our friends and neighbours then to part no more. I can say with Poet

In my Dreams a form I view
That thinks on me and loves me too.
Alafs wehn the vision is flown
I weep that I am all alone

I got home on Friday the 2 day of July from off the river we got our lumber all down and scold of the 15 day of June and I came back as far as Monson. Mr. Lvetc?-- wanted me to go on to Gliddem Drive and help him down to Sebec with his so I started the next morning and work as long as I was able to work. You requesting me to give you a sketch of my winters work but I can not in full for we have not settled up the concern yet we had rather bad luck the first part of the winter we haul in a little risen two hundered thousand we drove it to Sebec and sold it for eight dollars per thousand our expences has been great I do not know what they will amount to yet. One yoke of our oxen we sold for ninety five dollars in the spring the other yok we have not disposed of yet we expect to settle this week then I shall know how we come out. Stillman and I shall come up this fall if we are both well. I think we shall come in August. Give my love to Farther and Phineas tell them I want to see them both. Right to me as soon as you can. I still remain your Brother."

The above letter was submitted by Laura Jane Ashcraft daughter of John E. Sawyer. As the letter indicates he was a very humble man and well loved by those who knew him.

Another letter by John Emery Sawyer was recently sent to us by Laura G. Anderson (his granddaughter). This letter was also addressed to his sister Eliza Stevens and is apparently the next letter written by him.

Monson, October 26, 1841.

"Dear Brother & Sister:

I now take this oppertunity to inform you of my helth which is a little better than it has been since my return I have been quite unwell. so much so that some times I am almost discourage. The next week after my return I went to work on the Road and I work four day

and that used me up for a while. How long I cant tell. But I think I am getting a little better I am in hopes that I shall be able to do some thing this winter yet that is if my Back gets a little better. I am at Monson now and have been here this Month. Doc Jorden says that it no use for him nor any one else to do any thing for me except I quit trying to do any thing untill I get entirely well I expect that I shall have to follow his directions. But it is hard to have to Lay still and hire my Board and pay a Doctor Bill besides. But I must try and be reconciled to my lot although it is hard. But yet we ought not to complain of the hand of Providence For our Heavenly Farther knows best what is for our good. I have not seen Stillman this three weeks I heard from him yesterday he is well as common although his helth has not been very good this fall. he is to work his place that he bought this Summer. We went to Portland No. 8 as it is salled they say we may have two or three hundered Acres and they will do that is right if it comes into our hands they shall not do any thing about it untill next August and then if it does come into their hands they shall come down and lay out the Roads through the Town

The 27. I now resume my pen again to pen a fiew more lines in regard to busines to this fall here it is very good there never has been so many Teams in the Woods a winter befor Lumber has done so well this Summer that every one wants to be engaged in it. The most of them comes from the Penobscot and Kenebeck those that put in the teams hire their hands and bring them with them so that makes wages low up here. If I had been well I should a went into the wood this winter. I have some thoughts of it now. If I can get the stumpage for that it is worth. William I Vaughan is very slim his helth is very poor. The rest of the folke are well. I want to hear from you and Farther vary much tell Farther that I want him to put you in mind of wrighting oftner then you have in the habit of doing. I must now leaf off for the Mail will come in a few minits and I shall not have any more tim to right"

Laura's father hired a family by the name of Toby to take care of her when she was three months old, when he returned for her at the end of the year the family had left. He never knew if the family had been killed by Indians or what had happened to them. Laura related that the Tobys had removed to Illinois, than to Kansas, and later on to Oregon. They settled on the coast near where Waldport now stands. There were only three white families in the settlement. Laura was 18 years of age befor she knew that she was not a child of the Tobys. Since they had not adopted her she resumed the name of Sawyer. Later she visited her twin sister in Wisconsin, and her kinfolk in Maine.
Laura Jane Ashcraft now lives at Woodland, Washington, on the banks of the Lewis river where her first husband operated a ferry the last seven years befor his death. Although Laura is nearly 86 years of age she writes a beautiful letter and has been very helpful to us in compiling this genealogy. Laura has no children.

(51) PHINEAS⁶ HANSON SAWYER, (Joseph⁵, Jabez⁴, Joseph³, John², James¹) of Elliottsville Maine and Jackson, Minn., was born, 7 Feb. 1828 at Buxton, Maine, died at Jackson Minn., 3 May 1910; married 22 March 1851, ADELINE WALKER DRAKE, b. 28 June 1828, probably at Paris Me., died at Jackson Minn., 28 Sept. 1907, dau. Stephen Drake and Martha Ann Hicks. (see Drake family for ancestors of Stephen Drake) Little is known of Phineas younger life but he must have been just an infant when the family moved to Elliottsville.

Phineas was a private in Capt. I. W. Cases Co, 22 Regiment of Maine Infantry, in the Civil war. He enrolled the 10th day of Sept. 1862, and received his discharge, 14th day of August 1863 at Bangor Maine.

Five children were born to Phineas and Adeline at Elliottsville. About the year 1865 the family moved to Monson where their last child was born. During the spring of 1871, the family started westward. They went by stage to Dexter, which was the nearest railroad at that time, where they stayed a short time with Adelines sister. From there they traveled by train through Canada to Chicago and on to Mankato, Minn. The train was wrecked a short way out of Chicago causing some delay. At Mankato the family bought a team and wagon and went on to Mountain Lake in Cottonwood county, Minn., where they homesteaded. The first crop of grain was harvested with a cradle. In 1875 the family sold their homestead to a "Russian" and moved to Jackson County, Minn, where they purchased a farm, which for many years was known as the Sawyer farm of Middleton township. Phineas was engaged mostly in the cattle and stock raising business. Phineas was killed by an accident while harrowing, the day before he

The log house in which Phineas and his family lived at Ellitsville was still standing in 1925. Ethel (Sawyer) McCullough, granddaughter of Phineas who visited his former home in Ellitsville in 1925 describes it as follows: "An old apple tree still stood by the door with apples on it. The beds were built into the walls, the rooms seemed small to me; it was in good condition; it stood on a gentle slope in a clearing; back of the house was a very large frame barn, showing signs of being used at the time for storing hay, a wagon and hay rack stood near."

George made his home in Jackson Minn. The following obituary gives us an excellent account of his life:

"The Jackson community is again called upon to mourn the passing of another of the sturdy pioneers who lent material assistance in building Jackson County in its present rich and fertile settlement so much enjoyed by present day residents, in the death of George H. Sawyer who passed away at the Sawyer family residence, on South Street, last Thursday.

Mr. Sawyer virtually grew up with Jackson county and took a prominent part in its development from a near wilderness to its present prominence in the northwest. He was a gentleman of high character and sterling honesty, in fact the word of Mr. Sawyer was as good as a gold bond. He was also progressive and during his busy years in the Jackson community he did many things that were worth while. His development of what is now known as the Sawyer's addition to Jackson, one of the important residential sections of our city is a monument to his enterprize.

Not only was Mr. Sawyer progressive in building up of Jackson community, but he also gave freely of his time and energy to the public, serving as a member of the city council and during his residence on the farm in Middletown township he was often called upon to serve in positions of trust such as a member of the township board and member of the board of education. For many years Mr. Sawyer conducted a wood and coal business in Jackson in company with the late V. W. Avery and performed other functions that helped Jackson to a higher business importance.

In matters of the church he was a liberal minded man and gave freely to assist in improving a higher standard of citizenship, in fact Mr. Sawyer could be relied upon to do just a little more than his share in any public enterprize that was suggested to make Jackson a better place in which all might live and enjoy, and his passing is being genuinely mourned by all who throughout the long years have been -

privileged to enjoy his pleasant and unfaltering friendship. He was also prominent in several fraternal societies of our city where his judgement was always highly respected.

Indeed, the many friends of Mr. Sawyer in Jackson will miss his pleasing and friendly greetings in the years to come and will heartily attest to the fact that the world has been made better and brighter because of his living so many useful years of service to the community.

George Hanson Sawyer was born in Elliottsville, Piscataquis, county, Maine, July 14, 1852, a son of the late Phineas and Adeline (Drake) Sawyer, and at the age of eighteen years accompanied his parents to Minnesota; the Sawyers homesteading in Cottonwood county. In 1875 the Sawyer family came to Jackson county and soon purchased the farm which for years has been known as the Sawyer farm of Middletown township, where Mr. Sawyer grew to manhood.

Later Mr. Sawyer purchased a farm of his own in Middletown township and on October 26, 1879, was united in marriage to Miss. Frances E. Russell, a daughter of one of the early day pioneer families of the Petersburg township community. The marriage was blessed by the birth of seven children, Ethel (Mrs. T. L. McCullough) of Riverside Calif.; Frank A. Sawyer of Jackson; Willie, deceased in infancy; Susie (Mrs. S. A. Finnegan) of Owatonna; Pearl (Mrs. R. B. Hunt) of Middletown township; Earl, a twin of Pearl died in infancy; Howard died while in the service of his country during the late World War.

Mr. Sawyer is also survived by the following sisters and brothers: Mrs. J. D. Baughman of Jackson; Charles of Bloomfield Nebraska; Albert of Rupert Idaho; Mrs. A. H. Baughman of Jackson; Fred D. of Whittier Calif.. Also ten grandchildren and numerous admiring friends who had esteemed him through many years of acquaintance.

June 1, 1924, at Winnipeg, Canada Mr. Sawyer was united in marriage to Mrs. Mary Brooks, who now survives him and has, since his long decline, been his constant companion, nursing him most tenderly during his long illness.

Funeral services were held from the home and the Methodist church, Monday afternoon and were in charge of the pastor, Rev. Leon W. Kern, who paid a much deserved tribute to the memory of the deceased. Many floral tributes were in evidence and a quartet composed of Messrs Kenneth, William and Edwill Muir and Frank Mundell, sang two numbers, favorites of Mr. Sawyer. Burial was held in Riverside cemetery."

In the Jackson Cemetery, on the bank of the Des Moines river, near the front entrance, in the George Sawyer lot with a large gray granite slab, are buried George H., Frances E., Earl, Willie, Howard R.. A short distance back and to the right are the P. H. Sawyer and J. D. Baughman lots.

Due to illness the Sawyers sold their ranch at Bloomfield and moved to Rupert, Idaho, in the spring of 1914. There they purchased a small farm one mile east of Rupert, built a new house and made it their home for many years. They became active members of the Methodist Episcopal church at Rupert, and were prominent members of the community.

Elsie died 23 Nov. 1920 at the Twin Falls County Hospital following an appendectomy. She was buried at the Rupert cemetery 26 Nov. 1920.

Note: This section of this genealogy is devoted to the descendants of Thomas¹ Drake of Weymouth, Mass., immigrant, thru his great-great grandson John⁵ Drake m. Molly Cole, of Bridgewater, Mass., and of Buckfield, Maine, whose descendants settled mainly in or near Ellitsville, Plantation, Maine, and some of whom intermarried with the Sawyers, descendants of James Sawyer of Gloucester. We have tried to include as many descendants of John Drake m. Molly Cole, as could be found. Several branches of this family apparently have been lost to us, at least for the present. If any one has any additional information on any branches of the family, please advise the author so that it can be included in succeeding revisions of this genealogy.

* * * * *

(D1) THOMAS¹ DRAKE, the immigrant ancestor of our Drake family is said to have been born at Colyton, Devon County, England, about 1635, for it is supposed that he is the same person who was bapt. at the St. Andrews Church at Colyton, 13 Sept. 1635, the son of William Drake and Margaret Westover (Westofer), the youngest of eight children. The above is the testimony given by Louis Stoughton Drake in his book "The Drake Family in England and America", printed in 1896, which has been considered the "Authority" on this family for a number of years. However, more recently some genealogist have taken issue with Louis Stoughton Drake, and have attempted to prove the above connection between the English and American Drakes in error. The most recent of these is given in an article in the New England Historical and Genealogical Registrar Vol. XCVIII., July 1944, by Edward Howard Drake of Lincoln, Nebr.

" THE PARENTAGE OF THOMAS DRAKE OF WEYMOUTH, MASS.- The following comments deal with Louis Stoughton Drake's "The Drake Family in England and America" (1896), correcting one obvious error, and questioning the parentage of Thomas¹ Drake of Weymouth by the author of that book.

Thomas¹ Drake probably was not a son of William Drake of Yarbury, co. Devon, England (p. xvi, 1). No documentary proof was offered by Mr. Drake in support of the parentage ascribed to Thomas the emigrant.

(D1) cont'd:

* The Colyton, co. Devon, parish register records the baptism of Thomas, son of William Drake, Sept. 13, 1635. Yet the Suffolk Co. Mass. Court file no. 1689 dated Mar. 7, 1677/78, begins thus: "Thomas Drake aged 49 years".

Vivian's Visitations of the County of Devon, pp. 297-98, shows that William Drake and Margaret Westofer were married on, or soon after, Nov. 14, 1620. Their first child, John was baptized Mar. 24, 1621/22. The baptism of the other eight children (Vivian omitted a daughter Jane) occurred in regular sequence: Dorothy, Mar. 26, 1623; Eleanor, Dec. 15, 1625; Joane, June 11, 1628; William, Dec. 22, 1629; Jane, Feb. 13, 1630/31; Elizabeth, Dec. 10, 1632; Endimion, June 25, 1634; and Thomas, Sept. 13, 1635.

Therefore it is more than likely that Thomas, son of William Drake of Yarbury, was baptized within a year after his birth. He could hardly have been identical, then, with the Thomas Drake of Weymouth, Mass., who was born about 1628/9, if the deposition in the Suffolk County Court files (no. 1689) is correct as to his age.

The supposed connection between Thomas Drake of Weymouth and the Yarbury, England, family was based on the baptismal records in Colyton co. Devon, of a Thomas Drake with sisters Elizabeth and Joan, and the coincidence of "finding" three Drakes thus named in New England at a later date.

It is true that Thomas¹ Drake of Weymouth had a sister Elizabeth who married Ezekial Hamlin of Boston. (Report of the Record Commissioners, Boston Births, Baptisms, Marriages and Deaths, 1630-1699 p. 48). Proof of the relationship is found in the will of Ezekial Hamlin, in which he mentions "my brother Thomas Drake of Weymouth". (Suffolk County Probate 8:4.) But documentary evidence of the reputed sister Joane has not been found.

The Weymouth Town Records are cited as authority by Louis Stoughton Drake, and by William L. Chaffin author of A Biographical History of Robert Randall (1909), for the supposed marriage of Joane Drake to Thomas² Randall (Robert¹). Weymouth vital records (1910), a compilation of the Town Records, does not show such a marriage; neither is there a record of a birth of a son, Thomas Randall, on Mar. 12, 1659, in this volume.

Without documentary evidence to support the connection, it is extremely doubtful, then, that a Joane Drake was in Weymouth Mass., between 1654 and 1671, or that Thomas² Randall ever had a wife named Joane, who can be proved to be a sister of Thomas Drake.

Untill more conclusive evidence is found, Thomas¹ Drake of Weymouth and his sister Elizabeth (Drake) Hamlin of Boston, should not be accepted as children of William and Margaret (Westofer) Drake of Yarbury co. Devon, England, and the problem of their parentage must be considered unsolved.

Incidentally, Mr. Drake was also in error when he stated that Thomas¹ Drake of Weymouth died in 1691 (p.2). On July 20, 1692, Thomas Drake Sen. was chosen for grand jury duty by the freeholders of Weymouth (Suffolk County Court files, no. 4096). The appraisal of his estate was made on Aug. 30, 1692 (Suffolk County Probate 13:54,55). Hence he died between July 20 and August 30 of 1692."

* * * * *

(D1) Cont'd:

While the above evidences must be considered, they are not conclusive, against the possibility that Thomas¹ Drake of Weymouth is the son of William Drake of Yarmbury. Undoubtedly Louis Stoughton Drake had considerable evidence not available to present genealogist such as traditions handed down thru the then living members of the family. While these traditions are not equal to documentary proof they often contain a great deal of truth. In any case there can be no doubt that our Drakes of Ellitsville descend from Thomas¹ Drake of Weymouth Mass., as most of the connections can be proven by vital records.

L. S. Drake suggest that Thomas came with a relative John Drake of Taunton Mass., about 1653-4, and his sisters Joane and Elizabeth (see note above), and settled at Weymouth, Mass.. His name first appears on the records of Weymouth in a list of property owners in 1663, in which he is described as owning "Lot 70, containing 6 acres in the first division, beginning on the boundry line", and 18 acres, Lot 33 in the second division. Prior to that, the latest list of landowners was that of Nov. 26, 1651 in which his name does not appear, hence he settled in Weymouth after 1651 and before 1663.

The frequency with which his name appears on the land deeds and the war records of the times shows that Thomas¹ Drake took an active part in the towns history. His name appears as a witness on deeds Dec. 15, 1664, and three years later he was a member of the Suffolk Troopers. He took an active part in the King Philips war, untill June 24, 1676, was a member of the garrison at Punkapouge where he saw at least two months service. Plymouth Colony Deeds (Vol. V, p. 320) record large purchases of land by him on July 29, 1682, near Taunton River in Freetown, half of which he sold June 12, 1688 to Ralph Paine of Rhode Island (N.E. Reg. Vol. XXII, p. 211). He died in Weymouth 1692 and his estate which was settled in 1692 was valued at L 237-2s-2d. A considerable sum at that time.

Thomas¹ Drake married first JANE HOLBROOK of Weymouth, dau. Thomas and Jane Holbrook. After her death he married second Mrs. Mellicent Carver, 9 Mar. 1681, dau. William Ford.

The remains of the cellar may still be seen; the massive door step, a good bulkhead way and other signs are indications of a well appointed house. (History of Easton)

"Dear Sister Martha and Brother Jacob Wheeler,-- again I greet you with a friendly line from home-- Gladly would I extend the warm hand of love and friendship but "htis" at present, "myst" be denied me which I heartily regret. Yet the opportunities that are still left us, may we no longer neglect but hold sweet intercourse, through the medium of pen and paper--- Dear Sister a long period of time has elapsed since I have had an opportunity of seeing and conversing with you and still more I have scarcely heard a syllable from you, this should not be so-- let us be more social by the way of correspondence, though the sweets of personal intercourse be denied us, Sister you are far away from the sweet home of your childhood and doubtless your memories wonders back to this our house in the forest and often in the silent watches your thoughts revert back to us thou hast left so far behind-- and then perhaps regret that you hast so unwisely left our own loved soil to seek a home in the far west-- but morning returns and with its accustomed joys and cares and your mind becomes wholly absorbed in your domestic duties and you think not of home or its endearments-- But you are happy and contented with your new home I understand you would not think of returning I am glad if you like well being you are there-- but I should have liked much better not to have had you gone there at all I think we could all get along as well in Maine but so it is I find we are still to be scattered abroad, like sheep without a shepherd but may the Great Shepherd of our souls at last call us from all our wondering-- and unite us in the fould of Christ where we shall no more go astray-- this alone must sustain us, as we journey down the declivity of life-- but away sad thoughts we will not reflect upon these long and dreary days of absence we will hope for better days then we may meet with joy enjoying the society of friends with the blessings of heaven. Dear Sister our Brother Harrison is with you I feel to rejoice with you, that you have the pleasure of his society but most sorely we lament his absence from among us it has been some time since we have heard from him therefore I do not whether he resides yet in your vicinity or not I hope we shall hear from you soon say sister do you think I could find employment there sufficient to supply myself and child, if you think I could get business (I'm not sure about that word) enough I am off

like a jug handle I am not happy-- nor do I ever expect to be but a change might for a time despel the gloom from my mind which I am aware has already lain its withering grasp upon my constitution I do not wish to have you think that I am laboring under any Body infirmity it is not so yet in my opinion no physical disease can compare with the debility of the mental ----- Pooh nonsense what am I talking about-- we have got a fine house a building and I hardly think I should be willing to leave it untill I get some of the ware and tare out of it-- but look out occasionally for we may all move out west one of these days unless you should conclude to return to old Maine-- but by the way how do you prosper and are you as happy and as contented there as you were here

Our friends in this vicinity are as well as usual with a fiew wxceptions the last we heard from Alexander he wrote us his health was very poor indeed Cousin Nancy Drake is very sick with the dropsy the Doctor has given her over we watched with her last night-- so you will not think it strange if I make some crooked marks Father is with us he is at work on our house-- say to Br Harrison we should be glad to hear from him if he has no objections write us soon tell us how you prosper how many babys you have got-- how many pigs you are going to raise and whether corn is pritty plenty for I suppose corn & pigs are the chief articles of produce in your diggins I guess I have written nonsense enough and shall be obliged to quit for my little one has just fell and hurt her and Mother just always see to the babies so good gy for this time Give our love to Brother Harrison and family I should be glad to just drop in and see how you look this morning yet I shall be nessitated to wait a little longer I suppose, I shall soon expect a long letter from you--

THE DRAKE FAMILY IN ENGLANDAND THEIR ROYAL KIN

(SHOWING POSSIBLE RELATIONSHIP TO THOMAS DRAKE)
(OF WEYMOUTH)

The following account of the early Drakes is taken from the book "English and American Drakes" by W. T. Drake:

"The Drakes are an ancient family. The name is from the latin "Drago" and signifies one who draws, or leads- a leader, and was obtained from the Greek, an Athenian legislator who 600 years befor Christ drew up a code of laws for the people. In all probability, the first Drake or Drago in England was a Roman soldier who came with the army of Julius Ceasar and instead of returning to the Roman Empire, remained in England and founded the Drake family which was well settled in the County of Devon when William the Conqueror came over from France in 1066.

After the conquest, the Drake families, a clan, took possession of an old Roman and British Encampment in what is now the Manor of Musbury in Devon County in the western part of England, which was subsequently called "Mount Drake" where a church was built, and where in the day of Queen Elizabeth the Drakes had a mortuary chapel which was afterwards lengthened to Drake Aisle. There was a fortified house at "Mount Drake" befor the "House of Ash" was established in 1420 by the marriage of John Drake and Christian, the daughter and heiress of John Billett of Ash. This John Drake is the first of the name from whom a lineal descent can be traced.

The first Drake on English record was a John Drake who owned lands in 1272. In the year 1313, a John Drake received permission of Edward the second to go beyond the sea, and undoubtedly he settled in Ireland and founded Drakerath in the County of Meathe. The Drakes scattered, locating in 1306 at Shipden, Norfolk, and in Yorkshire. Branches of these families settled in Scotland, Ireland, and Holland, and many are the "Landed Gentry", each family having its own crest but all using the same arms. Many of these families are represented in the United States by descendents of Drakes who came here between the years 1630- 1776 and later, claiming no relationship, yet all from the ancient Drakes of England.

The first Drakes on record to come to America was John Drake who came with Winthrop to Boston in 1630, and settled at Windsor, Conn., where he died 17 Aug. 1659, leaving a widow and three sons, who became ancestors of most of the Drakes in Southwestern New England, the Middle and Western States. On Sept. 8, 1636, a Robert Drake settled in Virginia and was granted 200 acres of land. Another Robert

Drake, born in Essex County in England in 1580, came with sons and one daughter, and died 14 Jan. 1668 at Hampton, New Hampshire. In 1660 THOMAS DRAKE of the English "HOUSE OF ASH" settled in Weymouth, Mass., and the same year, a Samuel Drake came to Fairfield, Conn., later moving to East Chester. His two sons, Joseph of East Chester and Samuel Jr. of West Chester, N.Y. were the ancestors of most of the Drakes of New York State."

" DRAKE Arms-Argent; a wivern with wings displayed; gules. It is a maxim with the hearlds that the more simple a coat of arms, the more ancient it is; this is too obvious to need any proof in support of it, than the reptition of the maxim; which eminently applies to the arms of the Drake.

The crest of this coat, as given by Guilim, is an "Eagle displayed" which seems to have been laid aside for the "dexter arm erect, holding a battle-axe", some ages ago, but the wherefore does not appear. The motto has always been : Aquila non capit muscas.

The figure in the shield, or escutcheon, is called by the hearlds a Wivern, which is another name for the fabled Dragon of antiquity.

Draco or Drago, is the Roman name for Drake, and as late as the time of Sir Francis Drake, writers frequently coupled his name with that of Dragon. Lope de Vega calls him by no other name throughout his long poem of ten books, which he composed about him; and Sir Winston Churchill (who married a Drake) says, Sir Francis found no Dragon more terrible than himself to guard the treasures of the Spaniards; and surely the Spaniards had reason, if any people could have, to imagine that Sir Francis Drake was descended and that, too, in no small degree, from the old master of all that was terrible.

The Romans had among their legions Draconarii, who were the bearers of their standards; hence the name Drake may have been derived from that Roman officer. The Romans got the name from the Greeks, and it seems to have been known other than an ideal one, from the Mediterranean to the Baltic, in earlier and later times.

We find that the Dragon was displayed in the banners of the Britons as early as 1448, and that churches have borne the emblem from time immemorial."

THE DRAKE FAMILY OF "ASHE"

- (1) John Drake, of Exmouth and Mount Drake, Devon County, England, is the first of this family that can be traced. He was born 1360, married Christian, dau. of John Billet of Ashe. He acquired by his marriage the estate of Ashe in the Parish of Musbury, Devon. John was engaged in shipping out of the port of Exmouth, as was his son and grandson. After his death his widow married Richard Franchevney.
- (2) John Drake, numbered in the hundred of East Budleigh, married Christina daughter and heiress of John Antage and settled at Otterton, about 16 Miles from Ashe. Founded the Otterton, Devonshire family of Drake. John was unlawfully excluded from Ashe by his half-brother Christopher Franchevney.
- (3) John Drake inherited Otterton; married a daughter of John Crews, Cruys, representative of the Crews of Morehand, an ancient Saxon family of importance.
- (4) John Drake of Otterton in the County of Devon, Esq., married Agnes, daughter of John Kailway.
- (5) John Drake, Esq. of Ashe and Exmouth, in the County of Devon, having recovered Ashe by a lawsuit, married Margaret, daughter and heiress of John Cole of Rill, in the parish of Whytecombe Raleigh, Devon near Exmouth.
- (5) John Drake of Mt. Drake, Ashe, and Exmouth, son and Hair, High Sheriff of Devon in the time of Queen Elizabeth, married Ann, dau. of Roger Greenville of Stow, Cornwall. He died 4 Oct. 1558. He and his wife are buried in the parish church at Musbury "where their tomb may still be seen."
- (6) Sir. Barnard Drake, Knight of Mt. Drake and Ashe. Sir Barnard Drake was Knighted at Greenwich 9 Jan 1585. He was a very distinguished person, being employed in several great offices at sea, and being much in favor with Queen Elizabeth who conferred the honor of Knight upon him. He is said to have ranked second of all English sea captains.

Sir, Barnard Drake married Gertrude Fortescue. He died 10 April 1586, and his wife followed 10 Feb. 1601. Both are burried in the parish church at Musbury.

(7) John Drake of Mount Drake and Ashe, married Dorothy, daughter of William Button of Ashton. John was buried 11 April 1628 at the the parish church of Musbury.

(8) William Drake Esq., of Yardbury in parish of Colyton, Devon, Eng. married Margaret Westofer, daughter of William Westofer. His childrer baptized at the parish church at Colyton on the following dates: John, 24 Mar 1621-2; Dorothy, 26 Mar. 1623; Eleanor, 15 Dec. 1625; Joan, 11 June 1628; William, 22 Dec 1629; Elizabeth, 10 Dec. 1632; Endimion, 25 June 1634; and THOMAS, 13 Sept. 1635. According to Louis Stoughton Drake in his book the Drake Family in England and America, Thomas Drake son of William Drake above is the same person as Thomas Drake who settled in Weymouth, Mass. We do not know for shure on what Mr. L.S. Drake baised his conclusion but probably on tradition and circumstantial evidence. Apparently there has been no legal evidence found to verify this conclusion, and because of this some of the more recent genealogist have expressed some doubt as to the reality of this connection between the Drakes of Ashe and the Drakes who descended from Thomas Drake of Weymouth, Mass. (see Thomas Drake D1). However, Louis Stoughton Drake must be considered the best authority on this family, and untill some one has given positive evidenee otherwise, we may as well consider his work correct.

Mathiew was a physician at Montpelier, Germany, Italy, and Switzerland; he also practiced medicine at Antwerp, being attached as physician to William of Orange. From Antwerp he came to London, and became physician to James Cole mentioned above. Dr. Lobel is the author of a number of books on medical plants, and is the discoverer of the medical plant now known as Lobelia which is widely used to the present day.

The James Cole family immigrated to America 1632 and settled first at Saco Maine but soon after moved to Rhode Island and from there to Plymouth Mass. The Cole family was the first to live on the "hill" at Plymouth and it became to be known as "Cole Hill" or "Burial Hill" as it was here that the Pilgrims of the Mayflower buried their dead. James Cole came to own considerable property at Plymouth, a part of which included "Plymouth Rock".

Considerable history could be written James Cole and his family but this has been adequately done by Frank T. Cole in his "Cole Genealogy" and by Ernest B. Cole in his "Desc. of James Cole", and will not be repeated here.
