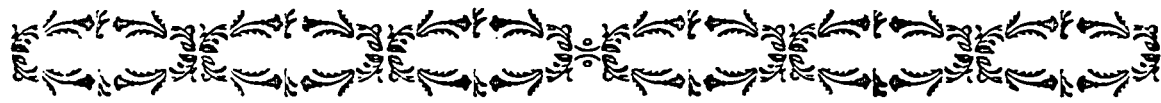

INTRODUCTION.

THE Editors of the following Account think it needless to make any Excuse or Apology for publishing the following Pedigree; as it is design'd only for the Use of themselves and their Families, and therefore have none to make an Excuse or Apology to.

GENEALOGIES, it is well known, are of as antient a Date as the Formation of Man: Tho' all have not been of equal Use and Importance to Mankind in general (Preference being given more especially to those contained in the Holy Scriptures, for universal Utility, where the sacred Volume comes) yet Genealogies have been of Use among all civilized Nations, Time immemorial; to the great Advantage and Benefit of Mankind, in Empires, Kingdoms, Countries, Towns, &c. There have been some special Advantages therefrom accruing to private Families also. And we can easily conceive of many good Reasons for the Continuance of Genealogies in Families; as it may give Demonstration of the Power, Faithfulness and Goodness of GOD to their Ancestors; excite in their Children, and Children's Children, Thankfulness, Hope and Dependance on the GOD of their Fore-Fathers. And also, where their Ancestors have led pious and religious Lives, been exemplary in their Conversation, &c. it may excite in their Decendants a laudable Ambition to imitate those Things that were excellent, praiseworthy and amiable in them.

It is not to be expected, that a particular and minute Account should be given, of the Family of STEBBINS, before their first coming from England, to settle in this Land. Let it suffice then, that the Compiler of the following Pages has been informed, there was one came from England, settled in Roxbury (next Town to Boston) soon after the English Plantations began in New-England. His Name was *ROWLAND STEBBINS*, who had two Sons, one settled at Springfield, and the other at Northampton, in the County of Hampshire. The Name of the eldest was Thomas, and the other John. * Thomas settled at Springfield soon after the Incorporation of that Town—who had five Sons, viz. *Samuel, Thomas, Benjamin, Joseph and Edward*. *Samuel* was born, September 19th, 1646 (ten Years after the Town was first settled.)

THE Head of the Family hereafter named, was Son of Samuel, last mention'd. The Time of his Birth, Marriage and Death may be seen in a following Page. As the Manner of his Life may be of some excellent Use to his surviving Offspring, I would take Leave to draw his Character. And it rather seems to devolve on me, as I first (not without considerable Pains) began the Plan of the following Pages, & brought it to the State in which it now appears.

HE was a kind and tender Husband to our honor'd Mother—an affectionate and bountiful Father to his Children. He was very Laborious in the several Callings of Life which he was employed in; and was exceeding frugal in his Expences, that so he might the better provide for her, and the numerous Offspring he saw rising under his Care.

Altho'

* John, (as has been observ'd) went to Northampton, and from him (as I've been well inform'd) deriv'd the Families of the Stebbins's that went to Deerfield before that Town was destroy'd in 1704, and those that now are there are their Descendants. One Family went up to Northfield, on the settling of that Town. And one Family, to escape the Dangers and Calamity of War, mov'd to Ridgfield, in Connecticut, where they now remain.

Altho' his Estate was small, compared to many of his Neighbours; yet, under his wife and prudent Oeconomy, of that little he had, he liv'd to see seven Sons and two Daughters, settled comfortably in the World.

NOTWITHSTANDING his great Affiduity in his Particular calling; yet he was far from neglecting the Education of his Children (either himself or through his Influence) in those Arts and Sciences his Circumstances would admit, as seem'd most likely to him would be beneficial to, and render us useful and serviceable to our fellow-men in the World.

HE took great Care to instruct us in Reading and Writting; (in this we are Evidences) he exceeded most, and had but few Equals. Nor was his Care limited to this only, but was extended more especially to our future and everlasting Welfare, by setting before us his great Veneration of the Holy Word of GOD. His Example also of Reading it in a steady Manner before Family Prayer, which I am a Witness he scarce ever Omitted for near twenty Years before I left him.

HE took special Care to instruct us in the Principles of that Holy Religion which he profess'd. And one of the Methods in doing which, was, to insist much on our Learning the Assembly of Divines Catechism with the Proofs at Length. And we all know how steadily he ask'd us the Questions every Lord's Day after Divine Service in the Afternoon. We all may well remember what Veneration he shew'd for the Lord's Day; beginning it soon after Sun set, allow'd no worldly Business to be done (even to a Scruple) nor any worldly Conversation till the Sabbath was ended.

HE was also Charitable to the Poor and Needy, as Opportunity presented, and Ability allow'd, I may add, in a peculiar Manner was he so to Strangers. He was temperate in his Living, and very Savory in his Conversation. He was much for Peace, a great Enemy to Law-suits; (of the which I never knew he had any.)

He

He had great Regard for the House and Worship of GOD, and was peculiarly steady in his Attendance on the Word preached. He was very careful in his Preparations for the Lord's Table, making it a Practice to spend the whole of each Friday, previous to the Sacrament, in Fasting and Prayer. He spake with great Respect of the Ministers of CHRIST, when mention was made of them.

HE was of a scrupulous and tender Conscience, did not act rashly, but must be well satisfied before he gave his Assent. I could Instance in many Things but omit them except in one only. §

HE was favoured with a good Constitution, whereby, by a good Regimen of living attended with the Blessing of GOD, he was able to Labour till a few Years before his Death.

WHEN he was laid by through Age and Infirmary, he spent his Time much in Reading (chiefly in a Room by himself) Meditation and Prayer. He studied the Holy Scriptures. Yet making use of many other Writings on Divine Subjects. He had a great Esteem of the Rev'd Mr. Willard, Mr. Stoddard, Mr. Thomas Boston Mr. Flavel, and Works of that Stamp.

THE Illness of which he died was short, in which he was exercised with great Pain, yet at Interludes was very full of good Advice. A great Part of the Time he spent in earnest Prayer to GOD, for an actual preparation for Death, and a Blessed Eternity. It was observed by the Family (and some of the Visitors) especially by his youngest Son, who was his constant Attendant the last Fortnight of his Life, that such a fervency of Spirit,

§ He was under great Doubts with Respect to the lawful partaking of the Lord's Supper, having early imbibed the Principle, that Assurance of sanctifying Grace was necessary, in Order to a lawful Attendance on that Ordinance; he had great concern at Times, in living in the neglect of it. Dare not think of turning his Back on such an Institution of CHRIST, so expressly enjoined on his Disciples, and some Years before his Death, he was so far satisfied of its being his Duty, that he became a Member of the Church of CHRIST at Long-Meadow.

Spirit, and ardency of Soul, striking Thoughts of Eternity, are rarely to be met with.

HE was very full of Advice to his Children, he warned them of the Danger of sinful Courses. Exhorted them to follow on in the Practice of true Religion; that so their end might be Peace.

HE was greatly Concerned for the welfare of his children's Children, and therefore charged, repeatedly Charged their Parents, to bring them up in the Fear of GOD. Not deal with a slack Hand, restrain them from Sin, set before them good Examples, warn them to flee youthful Vanities, instruct them, and beware of loosing their Authority over them. For he view'd it, that where good Government was not maintained in Families, Religion wou'd not long be a Guest there.

As this lay with great Weight on his Mind, so it was what he urged upon us till his his last. And as he lived a Life of Religion; so he died leaving a Charge on us to follow his steps.

AND although he did not leave this World with so clear Views of a glorious Immortality, as many have done, yet not without Hope. And I think we who were acquainted with his Manner of living, may charitably hope and believe, that after he had served GOD in his generation, he at last fell asleep in JESUS, and is one of that Number that GOD will bring with him.

NOR can I forget the mentioning our dear and honor'd Mother, by whose mild, tender and pious Care we were so gently nursed up; the Labour and Travail of which, none but Mothers can tell. But must I here break off abruptly, and drop my pen? No! Her distinguished Worth was seen by us, and the genuine Effects thereof felt (altho' her burdens were not.) Her Piety, Faithfulness, Meekness and Patience, makes her Memory precious to us all, and ought to be imitated by us. True it is, through a feeble Constitution, together with the Concern and Burden that naturally lay upon her; she was brought into a low State of Health,

till by Degrees it terminated in almost a confirmed State of Melancholly, which proved a great Hindrance to that Serenity of Mind which naturally flows from a devout Affection of Heart towards GOD, and the Saviour JESUS CHRIST; yet it never prevented her devout Attendance on all the outward Means of Grace, both public, private and secret. She daily read much in the holy Scriptures, especially the New Testament, the Psalms, and those Prophets that wrote most of CHRIST. * She never neglected any Opportunity in partaking of the holy Communion, for which she had a great affection & Reverence. But yet that Gloom that sat upon her Mind, might very naturally prevent those clear Views of the Virtue and Excellency of that all-sufficient Sacrifice, which JESUS paid once for all, which she had had in a better State of Health (as she expressed it to me.)

One Thing may not be improper to mention, which she told me, viz. When the Rev'd Mr. Whitefield (of precious Memory) first came to New-England, who was so famous, and whose preaching had so much Success attending it, for the Conviction, and hopeful Conversion of many, and the Increase of Grace, and Comfort of Saints, &c. she was in great Distress, knowing her bodily Health was so impaired she could not attend on his preaching when he should come to Springfield.† Thus it continued for several Days before he came; she fearing being left while others were taken, or denied that Comfort which others enjoyed. She fought unto the LORD, and spread her Cause before him, who was pleased to give an Answer of Peace: For when the Day came, and all were gone to hear him; she had Views of the Glory of JESUS CHRIST, and a comfortable Hope of her saving Interest in him; and those blessed Words came to her with animating and
reviving

* This I know, as I lived then at home, and for a Number of Years together was much with her.

reviving Power, “ Daughter, be of good Cheer, your
“ Sins are forgiven you.” §

It was this weak State of her's that gave Occasion for that peculiar Tendernefs, Wisdom and Prudence exercised by our honor'd Father towards her. What Cost did he spare? What Pains did he not take, to comfort and relieve, to counsel and advise, in those Days of Distress? And not without some Success. A great Deal of Time he spent in reading to her some of the best Authors, on Subjects most adapted to her present Case ; among which was a Book of the Rev'd and famous Mr. Baxter's One the most suitable, in Cases of Melancholy perhaps of any now extant.

The latter Part of her Life was more comfortable to herself and Friends, and her Faith and Hope never fail'd even to the last; and she left the World in Peace, with a good Hope of being with GOD in Glory.

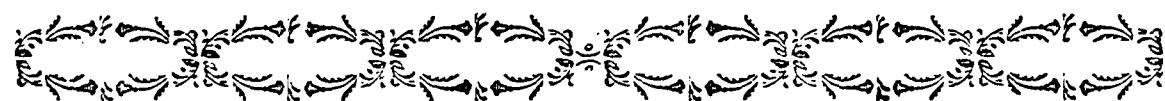
She's gone! we see her pious Soul arise,
