George Shultz

George Shultz was born in Germany, March 16, 1752, came to America and fought in Captain Peter Nagel's Company, Fourth Battalion, Berks County, Pennsylvania Militia, (Pennsylvania Arch. 5th, 249), in the Revolutionary War, three years and five months. Married Elizabeth Shoemaker, to whom were born Mary Elizabeth, John, Jacob, Katherine Elizabeth, Margaret, Susan, Solomon, Priscilla, Rachel, Elizabeth and Polly. They came from Harper's Ferry, Virginia, in 1804, and settled on a farm in German township, Harrison county, Ohio, where he died October 6, 1827, aged 75 years, 6 months and 20 days, and was buried in the Zion cemetery near Germano.

Elizabeth Shoemaker was born December 19, 1762, married George Shultz, died February 4, 1833, aged 70 years, 1 month, and 15 days, and was buried in the Zion cemetery beside her husband. (The above dates were taken from the monument a few years ago by W. L. Shultz, but can not be made out now.)

1. Mary Elizabeth Shultz, daughter of George and Elizabeth Shultz, was born in 1783, married Daniel Shawver, to whom were born Elizabeth, Margaret, Catherine, George, Jacob, John, Solomon, Elias, Joshua, Jonathan, Susanna, Sophia, Daniel and Michael.

Daniel Shawver was born in Greensburgh, Pa., in 1781, married Mary Elizabeth Shultz.

1 John Shultz, son of George and Elizabeth

Shultz, was born in 1785, married Polly Birchfield, to whom were born George, Polly, Jacob and Samuel.

2 George Shultz, first son of John and Polly Shultz. No data.

2 Polly Shultz, daughter of John and Polly Shultz, married Mr. Frier.

2 Jacob Shultz, son of John and Polly Shultz, married Mrs. Brown, a widow.

2 Samuel Shultz, son of John and Polly Shultz, had three children, Mary, David, and John W.

3 Mary Shultz, daughter of Samuel. No data.

3 David Shultz, son of Samuel and ——— Shultz, had two sons, Samuel and Charles, and lived in Carrollton, Ohio.

4 Samuel Shultz, son of David. No data.

4 Charles Shultz, son of David. No data.

3 John W. Shultz, son of Samuel, married Carrie Stemple, and they lived in Carrellton, Ohio.

1 Jacob Shultz, son of George and Elizabeth Shultz, was born January 24, 1788, married Anna M. Shoemaker, to whom were born Solomon, John, Eliza E., Mary Anna. and Philip Alexander. He was a member of the Presbyterian church, spent most of his life near Annapolis, Ohio, and died May 9, 1845, aged 57 years, 3 months and 15 days, and was buried in the Annapolis cemetery.

Anna M. Shoemaker was born November 3, 1788, married Jacob Shultz, was a member of the Presbyterian church, spent the later years with her son, Philip, on a farm near Annapolis,

Ohio, where she died July 12, 1883, aged 94 years, 8 months, and 9 days, and was buried beside her husband in the Annapolis cemetery.

2 Solomon Shultz, son of Jacob and Anna M. Shultz, was born November 18, 1815, died November 8, 1830, aged 14 years, 11 months and 20 days, and was buried in the Zion cemetery near Germano, Ohio.

2 John Shultz, son of Jacob and Anna M. Shultz, was born May 4, 1817, married Martha Margaret Birchfield, October 26, 1842, to whom were born William Kerr, Mary Elizabeth, Albert Alexander, John Thomas and Robert Merry. He was a carpenter, kept bees, was a member of the Presbyterian church, spent his life at Annapolis, Ohio, died July 17, 1870, aged 53 years, 2 months, and 13 days, and was buried in the Annapolis cemetery.

. Martha Margaret Birchfield was born September 10, 1821, married John Shultz, was a member of the Presbyterian church, died December 12, 1904, aged 83 years, 3 months, and 2 days, and was buried beside her husband in the Annapolis cemetery.

3 William Kerr Shultz, son of John and Martha Shultz, was born at Annapolis, Ohio, September, 1843, served in the Civil War, and was killed at the close by spies, March 14, 1866, aged 22 years and 6 months, and was buried near where he was killed, and his name and date of death placed on the family monument in the Annapolis cemetery.

3 Mary Elizabeth Shultz, daughter of John and Martha Shultz, was born at Annapolis, Ohio, February 10, 1846, married Luther Rowley Price, June 25, 1865, to whom was born John

Elmo. Was a member of the Presbyterian church, died August 9, 1922, aged 76 years, 5 months, and 29 days, and was buried in the Annapolis cemetery.

Luther Rowley Price was born June 29, 1844, in Carroll County, Ohio, moved to Annapolis, and assisted his father in a dry goods and grocery store and ran a huxter wagon in the surrounding country, served in Company I, 157th Regiment, Ohio State National Guards, in the Civil War, married Mary Elizabeth Shultz. He was a member of the Annapolis Presbyterian church, led the singing for a number of years, and was Superintendent of the Sunday School for forty years. He died February 8, 1923, aged 78 years, 7 months and 9 days, and was buried in the Annapolis cemetery.

4 John Elmo Price, son of Mary Elizabeth and Luther Rowley Price, was born in Annapolis, Ohio, November 17, 1870, joined the Annapolis Presbyterian church, married Alberta Shields, December 12, 1893, to whom were born Emerson R. and Ethel G., and is living in Annapolis.

Alberta Shields was born near Annapolis, Ohio, December 27, 1871, married John Elmo Price, joined the Annapolis Presbyterian church and is living in Annapolis.

5 Emerson R. Price, son of John Elmo and Alberta Price, was born in Annapolis, Ohio, December 31, 1896, married Hallie Croskey, February 23, 1918, to whom was born John Marion, they moved to Dillionvale, where he is station agent.

Hallie Croskey was born near Apex, Ohio, married Emerson R. Price.

6 John Marion Price, son of Emerson and

Hallie Price, was born near Apex, Ohio, December 5, 1918.

5 Ethel G. Price, daughter of John Elmo and Alberta Price, was born in Annapolis, Ohio, December 5, 1900, studied music and is giving music lessons, and is living in Annapolis.

3 Albert Alexander Shultz, son of John and Martha Shultz, was born in Annapolis, Ohio, July 26, 1848, assisted his father with the carpenter work, married Minerva Hamilton, lived at Annapolis, where William and George were born, moved to Wellsville, where Howard, Charles and Everett were born, worked in the bridge gang on the railroad, and is now living in Glenwood.

Minerva Hamilton married Albert Alexander Shultz, died at Wellsville.

4 William Shultz, son of Albert and Minerva Shultz, was born in Annapolis, lived in Cleveland, and died there, and was buried in the Wellsville cemetery.

4 George Shultz, son of Albert and Minerva Shultz, was born in Annapolis, Ohio, moved to Wellsville, had three children, Virginia, Gertrude and John, and he lives in Glenwood.

5 Virginia and Gertrude Shultz, daughters of George Shultz, were born in Wellsville, and live in Glenwood. -

5 John Shultz, son of George Shultz, was born in Wellsville, and lives in Glenwood.

4 Howard Shultz, son of Albert and Minerva Shultz, was born in Wellsville, and lives in Cleveland.

4 Charles Shultz, son of Albert A. and Minerva Shultz, was born in Wellsville, lived in Mon-

tana, and was killed there and buried in the Wellsville, Ohio, cemetery.

4 Everett Shultz, son of Albert and Minerva Shultz, was born in Wellsville, Ohio, and lives there.

3 John Thomas Shultz, son of John and Martha M. Shultz, was born in Annapolis, Ohio, April 15, 1851, taught his first term in his home district, attended medical college, practiced medicine, married Mahala Shoemaker, moved to Kilgore, where Otto and Orlou were born. He continued his practice, moved to Germano, then settled in Steubenville, where Merton and Blanche were born, died December 22, 1920, aged 69 years, 8 months and 7 days, and was buried in the Steubenville cemetery.

Mahala Shoemaker was born near Unionport, Ohio, was a member of the Lutheran church, married John Thomas Shultz, and died in Steubenville in 1921, and was buried in the Leas cemetery near Annapolis.

4 Otto Shultz, son of John T. and Mahala Shultz, was born in Kilgore, Ohio.

4 Orlou Shultz, daughter of John T. and Mahala Shultz, was born in Kilgore, Ohio, married John Bailey, to whom was born Orlou. She died and was buried in the Leas cemetery near Annapolis.

5 Orlou Bailey, daughter of John and Orlou Bailey, was born in Steubenville, Ohio.

4 Merton Shultz, son of John T. and Mahala Shultz, was born in Steubenville, Ohio, and died at the age of seven, and was buried in the Leas cemetery near Annapolis.

4 Blanche Shultz, daughter of John T. and

Mahala Shultz, was born in Steubenville, Ohio, and is living in Detroit, Michigan.

3 Robert Merry Shultz, son of John and Martha M. Shultz, was born in Annapolis, Ohio, October 26, 1854, was a carpenter, married Mary Swan, to whom was born Inez; he is working at his trade and is living in Annapolis.

Mary Swan was born in Annapolis, Ohio, married Robert Merry Shultz; and is living in Steubenville.

4 Inez Shultz, daughter of Robert and Mary Shultz, was born in Annapolis, Ohio, and is living and teaching in Steubenville.

2 Eliza E. Shultz, daughter of Jacob and Anna M. Shultz, was born in Annapolis, Ohio, May 2, 1819, was a member of the Presbyterian church, died December 8, 1866, aged 47 years, 7 months, and 6 days, and was buried in the Annapolis cemetery.

2 Mary Anna Shultz, daughter of Jacob and Anna M. Shultz, was born in Annapolis, Ohio, October 13, 1822, was a member of the Presbyterian church, died November 3, 1859, aged 36 years and 20 days, and was buried in the Annapolis cemetery.

2 Philip Alexander Shultz, son of Jacob and Anna M. Shultz, was born in Annapolis, Ohio, January 1, 1826, joined the Presbyterian church, and continued a faithful member, married Margaret Cloman, May 29, 1851, moved to a farm west of Annapolis, where they built a house and spent most of their lives, and where Eliza Jane, Mary Ellen, John Wesley, James Herbert and William Luther were born. Near the close of the Civil War he enlisted in Com-

pany K, Ohio National Guards, and spent most of the time on guard on Delaware Island. They moved to Annapolis, and a short time afterwards Mrs. Shultz died, 1899, and he moved back to the farm where he lived until the fall of 1907, when he sold the farm and went to live with his daughter in Annapolis, where he died February 15, 1908, aged 82 years, 1 month and 14 days, and was buried in the Annapolis cemetery.

Margaret Cloman was born in Maryland, August 5, 1826, moved with her parents to Georgetown, Ohio, then to Annapolis, united with the Annapolis Lutheran church, married Philip Alexander Shultz, died in Annapolis, on March 21, 1899, aged 72 years, 7 months and 16 days, and was buried in the Annapolis cemetery.

3 Eliza Jane Shultz, daughter of Philip A. and Margaret Shultz, was born on a farm near Annapolis, Ohio, February 16, 1852, and died January 19, 1855, aged 2 years, 11 months, and 3 days, and was buried in the Annapolis cemetery.

3 Mary Ellen Shultz, daughter of Philip A. and Margaret Shultz, was born near Annapolis, Ohio, May 25, 1854, united with the Lutheran church, married Melanchthon Miller, September 18, 1873, to whom were born William Luther, Laura Belle, Stella Mae and Sadie Eva. She died in Annapolis, November 25, 1918, aged 64 years and 6 months. and was buried in the Germano cemetery.

Melanchthon Miller was born near Germano, Ohio, April 5, 1850, his mother died when he was only a few years of age, and he lived with Jacob and Catherine Levengood. They were Germans, and when Melanchthon started to school he knew only a few words of English

as he heard German at home, but soon could speak English. When he was eighteen his father took him to his home and he lived there until his marriage to Mary Ellen Shultz; he united with the Lutheran church, lived on a farm most of his life and then moved to Annapolis.

4 William Luther Miller, son of Mary E. and Melanchthon Miller, was born near Annapolis, Ohio, March 15, 1875. He united with the Two Ridges Presbyterian church when about eighteen, and later transferred his membership to the Annapolis Lutheran church. He married Minola Lucina Gault, August 16, 1899, and they bought a home near Germano, where Rubie Lorene, Dana Park and Kenneth Everett were born. Mr. Miller carried the mail from Germano to Cadiz Junction for six years, and for ten years has been doing carpenter work in the Apex coal field in sight of his home. He transferred his membership to the Germano Lutheran church, and served as Trustee for eighteen years, and Treasurer of the Sunday School for five years. He was a member of the German township Board of Education for four years. He was Treasurer of the Shultz-Winings Reunion for nine years, and was relieved by nominating another person to take his place. He is in good health except his hair is scarce on the top of his head.

Minola Lucina Gault was born near Annapolis, Ohio, January 20, 1878, united with the Annapolis Lutheran church, August 3, 1895, married William Luther Miller, transferred her membership to the Germano Lutheran church, of which she has served as Secretary and Teacher in the Sunday School, Treasurer of Woman's

Missionary Society, and was Vice President of the W. C. T. U.

Rubie Lorene Miller, daughter of William L. and Minola L. Miller, was born near Germano, Ohio, September 14, 1900, graduated from the High School. She united with the Germano Lutheran church at the age of thirteen, and served as Secretary of the Sunday School. Married Clyde Raymond Thompson, July 16, 1921, and they live in Germano, and there. Raymond Dean, Mildred Pauline and Walter Dale were born.

Clyde Raymond Thompson was born near Jewett, Ohio, April 18, 1900, worked in the Wayne coal fields a number of years. United with the Jewett M. E. church at the age of fourteen, married Rubie Lorene Miller, transferred his membership to the Germano M. E. church, and is working in the Apex coal field. He is a member of the Odd Fellows and Modern Woodmen of America.

6 Raymond Dean Thompson, son of Rubie L. and Clyde R. Thompson, was born in Germano, Ohio, January 26, 1922.

6 Mildred Pauline Thompson, daughter of Rubie L. and Clyde R. Thompson, was born in Germano, Ohio, October 31, 1923.

6 Walter Dale Thompson, son of Rubie L. and Clyde R. Thompson, was born in Germano, Ohio, October 17, 1925.

5 Dana Park Miller, son of William L. and Minola L. Miller, was born near Germano, Ohio, July 31, 1901, worked in the Apex Coal field where he is now employed.

5 Kenneth Everett Miller, son of William

L. and Minola L. Miller, was born near Germano, Ohio, February 8, 1916.

4 Laura Belle Miller, daughter of Mary E. and Melanchthon Miller, was born near Annapolis, Ohio, November 7, 1877, united with the Two Ridges Presbyterian church at the age of sixteen, transferred her membership to the Annapolis Lutheran church, and continues a faithful member. She married Irvin Auston Lowmiller, October 5, 1898, to whom was born Mary Olive.

Irvin Auston Lowmiller was born near Jewett, Ohio, December 11, 1875, joined the Germano Lutheran church, married Laura Belle Miller, transferred his membership to the Annapolis Lutheran church, and continues a faithful member. He was formen on the section of the New York Central railroad.

5 Mary Olive Lowmiller, daughter of Laura B. and Irvin A. Lowmiller, was born near Annapolis, Ohio, April 5, 1906.

4 Stella Mae Miller, daughter of Mary E. and Melanchthon Miller, was born near Annapolis, Ohio, September 20, 1885, united with the Annapolis Lutheran church, married Emmett Leas Stahl, November 16, 1906, lived in Annapolis, where Carrie Alice and Mary Pearl were born, moved to Alliance where Walter Miller and Hazel Irene were born, and after six years to Cuyahoga Falls, 333 9th Street.

Emmett Leas Stahl was born in Annapolis, Ohio, August 17, 1885, and lived there until his marriage to Stella Mae Miller, and is now working in Cuyahoga Falls.

5 Carrie Alice Stahl, daughter of Stella

M. and Emmett L. Stahl, was born in Annapolis, Ohio, September 8, 1907.

5 Mary Pearl Stahl, daughter of Stella M. and Emmett L. Stahl, was born in Annapolis, Ohio, December 16, 1910.

5 Walter Miller Stahl, son of Stella M. and Emmett L. Stahl, was born in Alliance, Ohio, August 25, 1913.

5 Hazel Irene Stahl, daughter of Stella M. and Emmett L. Stahl, was born in Alliance, Ohio, September 26, 1915.

4 Sadie Eva Miller, daughter of Mary E. and Melanchthon Miller, was born near Annapolis, Ohio, September 11, 1888, united with the Annapolis Lutheran church, married John William Bryan, May 19, 1906, and lived in Annapolis, where William Ernest and Beulah Eva were born, then they lived in Sebring, and Augusta, where Mary Mabel and Lola Doris were born, then near Annapolis, where Audra and Walter Emerson were born, and where they are living now.

John William Bryan was born near Annapolis, Ohio, December 7, 1877, married Sadie Eva Miller.

5 William Ernest Bryan, son of Sadie E. and John W. Bryan, was born in Annapolis, Ohio, April 21, 1908.

5 Beulah Eva Bryan, daughter of Sadie E. and John W. Bryan, was born in Annapolis, Ohio, October 19, 1910.

5 Mary Mabel Bryan, daughter of Sadie E. and John W. Bryan, was born in Augusta, Ohio, May 19, 1913.

5 Lola Doris Bryan, daughter of Sadie E.

and John W. Bryan, was born in Augusta, Ohio, July 21, 1916.

5 Audra Bryan, daughter of Sadie E. and John W. Bryan, was born near Annapolis, Ohio; and died in infancy.

5 Walter Emerson Bryan, son of Sadie E. and John W. Bryan, was born near Annapolis, Ohio, September 2, 1922.

3 John Wesley Shultz, son of Philip A. and Margaret Shultz, was born near Annapolis, Ohio, November 25, 1856, joined the Annapolis Presbyterian church in January, 1877, married Hannah Belle Winings, September 4, 1879, moved to the home of her parents on a farm near Germano, and worked there four and one-half years and where Wilber LeRoy and Sadie Leila were born. He transferred his membership to the Germano M. E. church, and in April, 1884, to the Bethel M. E. church in Green township, having moved to an eighty acre farm near there, where he was an active member, serving as a teacher in the Sunday School, Class Leader, Steward and Trustee. Oden Edwin was born here and in February, 1906, they took their nephew, William Donald Winings, nineteen days of age, his mother having died when he was three days old, and kept him till he was six when his father took him to his home. In July, 1911, he and his son, Wilber, sent an invitation to the relatives to meet in his grove August 16th to consider organizing a family reunion, and on that date 66 relatives met and organized the Shultz Family Reunion, with Mr. Shultz as President, and four annual reunions were held in his grove, with an increase in attendance, when it was decided to take it to a more central place. At the

first reunion the name was changed to the Shultz-Winings Family Reunion. He sold the farm in the spring of 1920, and June 24th moved to a ten acre home just west of Hopedale, where he still resides. His membership was transferred to the Hopedale M. E. church, where he continues a regular attendant, and is Class Leader and Trustee. The Fifteenth Annual Reunion of the Shultz-Winings Family was held at his home June 19, 1926, with 78 relatives present, and Mr. Shultz was elected President for the sixteenth time.

Hannah Belle Winings was born near Germano, Ohio, August 1, 1855, attended Sunday School and Church at the Germano M. E. church which she joined August 15, 1869, married John Wesley Shultz, was always active in Sunday School and Church, being a Sunday School teacher for a number of years. She died November 2, 1909, aged 54 years, 3 months, and 1 day. She had been married 30 years, and a member of the church 40 years. Interment was made in the Germano cemetery.

4 Wilber LeRoy Shultz, son of John and Hannah B. Shultz, was born near Germano, Ohio, February 25, 1881, baptized before he was three years of age, by Rev. John I. Wilson, moved with his parents to an eighty acre farm near the Bethel church, in April, 1884, graduated from the bookkeeping department of Scio College in 1908, attended the Bethel M. E. Sunday School from his youth, was Treasurer for two terms, Assistant Superintendent one year, Assistant Secretary one year and nine months, and Secretary for eight years, and was re-elected but declined as he had moved too far away. He

joined the Bethel M. E. church in December, 1892, during a revival conducted by Rev. William G. Walters, and remained a regular attendant and served as Steward, Treasurer of the Official Board and Recording Steward of the Germano charge, and held several offices till he moved away. He was a delegate to the Lay Electoral Conference in Cleveland in 1907. With his father he decided to call a meeting of the relatives for August 16, 1911, to consider organizing a family reunion and on that date was elected Secretary of the Shultz-Winings Family Reunion, and is serving his sixteenth year, and has secured the names and addresses of several hundred relatives. He was Secretary of the Farmers' Telephone Company from its organization to June 24, 1920, when with his father and sister he moved to Hopedale, and assisted in the Hopedale Creamery, of which he had been elected a Director and Secretary-Treasurer a few years before, and continued till it was sold and had charge of the settling up of the business. He had been correspondent from Jewett to the Cadiz Republican and Cadiz-Democrat-Sentinel from 1916, and after moving to Hopedale, by request of the Editors, continued as correspondent from Hopedale. He transferred his membership to the Hopedale M. E. Church, and at once, by request of District Superintendent H. K. Hillberry, was elected Steward, and the following year Secretary of the Official Board, and in 1924, Recording Steward of Bloomingtondale charge, and continues to hold these offices. He was reserve delegate to the Lay Electoral Conference in Cleveland, 1922-23, and seated part of the time and was reserve dele-

gate to Akron in 1925, and was seated during the conference. In May, 1921, he was elected President of the Epworth League, and re-elected the following year, and retired the following year by nominating his successor, but was elected First Vice President, and the following year by the same way was elected Third Vice President, and the next year Treasurer, and the next year re-elected. In December, 1925, he was elected Treasurer of the Sunday School. He served as Republican Clerk of the Green township election precinct for a number of years, and at the Primary in August, 1924, he was elected Republican Committeeman, and served as Judge in the November election, and in November, 1925, was elected township clerk by a 142 to 60 vote, and the following August served as Clerk and was re-elected Republican Committeeman.

4 Sadie Leila Shultz, daughter of John W. and Hannah B. Shultz, was born near Germano, Ohio, September 12, 1883, baptized during her first year, attended the Bethel M. E. Sunday School and Church, joined the Church in September, 1893, and continued a regular attendant. June 24, 1920, she moved with her father and brother to Hopedale, and her membership was transferred to the Hopedale M. E. church, but she was not able to attend, but read her Bible. In February, 1922, she was taken to Massillon State Hospital so she could have better care, and she died there May 13, 1923, aged 39 years, 8 months and 1 day. She was buried in the Germano cemetery beside her mother.

4 Oden Edwin Shultz, son of John W. and Hannah B. Shultz, was born near Cadiz Junc-

tion, Ohio, June 15, 1890, baptized when young, graduated from the bookkeeping department of Scio College in June, 1908, and the Scio Business College in June, 1909. He attended the Bethel M. E. Sunday School and Church, joined the church in 1900. April 28, 1910, he went to Cleveland, and accepted a position as stenographer with the Booth Fishing Company, then the Frost Superior Fence Company for two years, during which time, December 4, 1915, he married Lillian Mae Gunton, to whom was born Dorothy Mae, who was only three weeks old when her mother died, and they have made their home with Lillian's mother, Mrs. Ann Gunton, and are now living at 14205 Orinoco Avenue, East Cleveland. He worked for the Willard Storage Battery Company for over a year, and was there during the World's War, and has been painting since. He transferred his membership to the First Glenville M. C. church in 1920.

Lillian Mae Gunton was born in Glenville, Ohio, August 12, 1898. She was a regular attendant at the First Glenville M. E. Sunday School and Church from her youth, and joined the Church in her fifteenth year, and continued a faithful member. She attended the Shultz-Winings Family Reunion at the home of J. W. Shultz near Cadiz Junction, Harrison County, in June, 1915. She married Oden Edwin Shultz. She was disappointed when her health would not permit her to attend the Shultz-Winings Family Reunion in June, 1916. Dorothy Mae was born October 8, 1916, and her health became worse, and she was taken to a hospital where she died October 29, 1916, aged 18 years, 2 months, and 17 days, leaving her husband, and

three week old daughter, father, mother, brothers and sisters. She was buried in the beautiful Lake View Cemetery.

5 Dorothy Mae Shultz, daughter of Oden E. and Lillian M. Shultz, was born at 10308 Garfield Avenue, Cleveland, Ohio, October 8, 1916, her mother dying when she was only three weeks old, she lived with her father and grandmother Gunton, moved to 13813 Strathmore Avenue, East Cleveland, and later to 14205 Orinoco Avenue, where they are living. She attended Sunday School at First Glenville M. E. Church, attended school and is in the third grade.
