# PREFACE.

This compilation of Sheldon Genealogy treats mainly of the descendnts of Joseph Sheldon, born in Suffield, Connecticut, in 1751. The rief sketch of his progenitors, and also that of his brothers and isters, herein given, is derived mostly from the compilation of Shelon genealogy by Rev. Henry O. Sheldon of Ohio, who gave much of his ime for forty or more years in canvassing and correspondence to ccmpiling a genealogy of all the Sheldons found in this country, tracing them back to three brothers, Isaac, John and (William?). A sentence is here due and gratefully given to the memory of Rev. Henry'O. Sheldon for his arduous and painstaking work in compiling and preserving a history of Sheldon early settlers in this country. He was a descendant of John, one of the three brothers above mentioned and was born September 8, 1799 at Hartford, Connecticut. He moved with his father, first to Cayuga County, New York, second to Huron County, Ohio. He was a Methodist preacher for sixty-three years,had a classical education, - lived in several towns in Ohio, but longest at Berea, - was for a number of years Secretary of North Ohio Conference, and was the founder of Norwalk Seminary. He died in Oberlin, Chio, in 1883, and was buried there. Age 84.

Benjamin Sheldon, grandson of the Benjamin who was an own brother of the aforesaid Joseph, and who now lives (1901) in the house built by

his grandfather on the old original Capt. Jonathan purchase, in West Suffield, Conn., has also given valuable aid in compiling this genealogy.

It appears that very little is known of the aforesaid three brothers, but Sheldon is undoubtedly an English name, and Joseph, above mentioned, was a lineal descendant of Isaac.

The names underscored in the following list are the lineal progenitors of the branch of the Sheldon family herein considered.

- 1. ISAAC SHELDON (lst.) had two sons, John and Isaac.
- 2. ISAAC SHELDON, (2d.) was born in Dorchester, Massachusetts, about 1629 and died in 1708. As a small boy he went from Dorchester, Mass. to Windsor, Conn. He married, first, Mary Woodford, by whom he had twelve children, viz: Mary, Isaac, John, Thomas, Ruth and Thankful (twins), Mindwell, Joseph, Hannah, Eleazer, Samuel and Ebenezer. In 1654, the year in which his first child was born, he moved from Windsor, Conn. to Northampton, Mass. His wife Mary died in 1681. He married, second, Mrs. Mehitable Ensign, who died in 1720, by whom he had two children, Mercy, who was born and died in 1684, and Jonathan, bern 1687.
- 3. (CAPTAIN) JONATHAN SHELDON, born in 1687, married Mary Southwell and removed from Northampton, Mass. to West Suffield, Conn, about the year 1722 or 1723, where he bought a large tract of land whereon he lived and later settled five of his sons, viz: Daniel, Gersham, Elijah, Jonathan and Phineas, building for each a h use and barn. A large part of said land is still (1901) owned by his lineal descendants.

  They had ten children, Mehitable, Jonathan, Rebecca, Daniel, Phineas, Elijah, Silence, Asa, Gersham and Mary.

  He died in 1769, aged 82.
- 4. PHINEAS SHELDON (Esquire), born in 1717, at West Suffield, Conn. He married, first, Deborah Hathaway, June 7, 1743, at West Suffield, by whom he had five children. Her children were:

- V. Benjamin, b. Jan. 11, 1753, m. Elizabeth King. They had eight children; one, Elizabeth, b. 1788, m. Adam Smith and lived near Florida, N. Y., another, Ruby, b. 1793 lived at Suffield, another, John Adams, b. 1800, m. Hannah E. Stevens, lived at Suffield and had five children. The names and history of Benjamin's other children are not known. Some of them are said to have settled in Vermont

Phineas Sheldon's (No. 4) wife Deborah died 1755 at Test Suffield, and he married, second, Nrs. Ruth Harmon Smith, by whom he had ten children. All his children were born in West Suffield, on the Romestead given him by his Father. Children by second wife:

- Lydia, b. 1759, m. first, Deacon Cephas Kent of Dorset, Vt., VII. who died in 1813, probably at Dorset. His father's name was also Cerhas. It appears that the Sheldons and Kents who settled in Dorset, Vt., came there from Suffield Conn. The name Cephas was a very common one among the lents. It was at the Lore of one Cephas Kent, in Dorset, Vt., that the famous first meeting of the famous Council of Hafety was held. It was also there, in September 1776, that the resolution was taken to declare Vermont a separate and independent district, in opposition to the rival claims of New Hampshire and New York, and there at his home its first local government was organized. They had ten children, - Deacon Cephas Sheldon Hent, who is thought to have lived at one time in Benson, Vermont, Lydia, who married William Farnsworth, - Lucinda, who m. Reuben Farnsworth, - Diantha, who m. Rev. Stephen Martin-cale, who lived at LaCrosse, "is., - Sylvester, a physician, Beulah, who m. Webber Almer, - Rev. William, who lived at Waterloo, - Rev. Eliphalet, of Shelbyville, Ia., - Ebenezer, and Maria, who m. Samuel Voak. Lydia Sheldon m. second, Daniel Welch. No children. She died 1846, aged 87.
- VIII. Deacon Ezra, b. 1762, lived in Mendon, N. Y. and died in 1840. He m. Eunice Melson. They had five children, Eunice, who m. Rev. C. Leavit. Haysville, Histher, who m. first, David Percy, second, Abram Flint, St. Joe County, Mich., Ezra, who lived at Lima, H. Y., Asaph, who lived at Randolph, N. Y., Gad, who lived at Bouth Pristol/ N. Y.
  - IX. Anna H., b. 1764, m. Israel Sykes, Dorset, Vt. They had seven children, Betsey, m. Lions Cranston, Lucretia, m. Uriah Kent, Dorset, Vt. The names and history of the other children are not known.

At that time the office of Justice of Peace was an important one, much like Judge of Lower Court now, and the title of Esquire was usually given when addressing them. He died at lest Suffield, Conn. 1807, aged 90. His homestead is now (1901) occupied by his great-grandson, Edwin John Sheldon.

Having thus briefly outlined the history of the antecedents of JOSEPH SHITLDON, so far as known, we now come to the history of himself and his descendants. Joseph Sheldon of this genealogy (No. 6) was of slender build but men priding themselves on their strength were often surprised to find him outlifting them. Wrestling was the athletic sport of the day. Seldom a house-raising or military training day that a match was not made up for p blic entertainment. On one occasion, while on a visit to his brother Oliver at Burlington, Vermont, he attended a Large gathering for wrestling. Burlington had sent out a challenge for anyone to meet their champion. One man was apparently the champion, as he threw all who were willing to enter the lists. Joseph being called for, entered the ring and threw him, supposing that he had thrown the champion of that locality, but the real champion had been held in reserve. He was a man that weighed over 200 pounds and was very agile, while Joseph was so slim that he, in after years, confessed himself "ashamed of his . legs, they were so small". After nearly an hour's tussle the large man said to him "I dont think you can throw me, and I dont

'seem to succeed in my effort to throw you. I move that we quit."and they did so.

When about 24 years old he married and settled in Fair Maven, Vermont, but refused to further engage in wrestling sports, but finally, it having been noised abroad that an expert wrestler had come to town, he consented to take hold on condition that they would bring forward their best man and excuse him from further contest. It was the first Tuesday in June, Vermont's legal militia training day. They agreed to his proposition and chose Abram Sharp, a heavy but nimble man, as their best wrestler. The contest lasted less than one minute as Sheldon threw Sharp at the second pass made at him.

He was also quite an inventor. Among other things he planned and built two mills for sawing lumber and a mill for hulling clover seed, on his waterfall, with many ingenious contivances not then used in other mills, such as a "Bull theel" for hauling logs into the mill, operated by a lever attachment to saw gate, also a gigging device by which the carriage was quickly and automatically returned after the saw had passed through the log. Hany other ingenious, labor saving devices made by him might be enumerated. His good judgment and clear intellect remained with him to his dying day at 81 years. His wife, Diadema, died June 29, 1846, and he married, second, Rachel Preston, sister of Diadema, Feb. 5, 1847, who died June 8, 1873. He died at Fair Haven, Vernont, Sept. 29, 1857 and was buried in West Street Cemetery in Fair Haven.

Was one of the leading sheep breeders of the state. Was called "sheep" crazy" when he paid one thousand dollars for a choice Merino buck, but it proved to be one of the best financial ventures of his life.
