I am grateful to many, who have been so ready to contribute records and genealogies, especially the Sheldon History, and the installments of Capt. A. D. B. Smead, many of which mark events of vital national interest, recognized by enduring monuments and memorials. Letters and vouchers have been placed in the memorial vaults of the Pocumtuck Association.

OUR FOOTPRINTS


Israel Stoughton came to Massachusetts Bay Colony in 1630 or earlier, became a member of the Colonial Legislature, and was one of the Commissioners that for a time governed the Territory of New Hampshire. He lived in Dorchester, now a part of Boston. Being of a military disposition, in 1636 or before, he rose to be commander of the Dorchester military company. He took part in the Pequot War. and it was said in one book at least that he commanded the Massachusetts troops in that expedition.

His sister, named Judith Stoughton, widow of a man named Denman, married a man named Smead (first name unknown) who came from South Western England in or near Devonshire. The Smeads were not Welsh but lived near Wales. Mr. Smead died in England leaving his wife Judith (Stoughton-Denman) and infant boy, who came to Dorchester, Massachusetts, in the year 1636 to join her brother, Israel Stoughton.

In 1637 Israel Stoughon was one of the founders of the celebrated "Ancient and Honorable Artillery Company," of Boston, and a charter member on its incorporation in 1638. It is the oldest military company in America, and second in age only to that of London. The Governor each year confers upon its annually elected officers the Insignia of their respective offices. In June 1642, Israel Stoughton was elected its captain and served as such until

1643. The company now consists of some eight hundred members, all of whom are supposed to be gentlemen of wealth and rank.

Israel Stoughton with some others went back to England and joined the Parliamentary Army against Charles First. He became Lieutenant-Colonel of Rainsborow's Regiment, During the war, he died at Lincoln, England, and his will is recorded there, in which he made endowment to Harvard College. He had a son, William Stoughton, who graduated at Harvard in 1650, became a fellow of New College. Oxford, England, and a minister of the gospel. But when independent ministers were shaken out of the Church of England, after Charles II's restoration in 1660, he returned to Massachusetts in 1662, and preached several times, of the annual sermons, before the Legislature. He became Chief Justice of Massachusetts and continued to hold that office for many years. He was also Lieutenant Governor at one time, and, on the death of Governor Phipps, was acting Governor. He never married; died July 7th, 1701, and his tomb is in Dorchester Cemetery, Stoughton and Summer Streets, in Boston. His epitaph, carved on the tomb, was composed by Cotton Mather, and upon one end of the tomb, there is a carved device which purports to be the Stoughton coat-of-arms undisputed two and a half centuries ago, before the modern practice of imitating, or stealing them. The carving on the other end was a religious emblem, but the

coat-of-arms was that of the Stoughton family, evidently, that is of the Judith (Stoughton) Smead's Father, our ancestor. It consists of a shield (ecu) quartered by two straight bands (bars) crossing each other diagonally with (at the point of intersection) an ornament, resembling a shell or device as a sort of buckle or fastener. There is no scroll or motto underneath, but the shield is surmounted by a head and neck in armor, and on top of the helmet is a crest in shape of a rampant open mouthed lion leaning upon some object, and the shield and helmet surrounded by a lot of plumes or foliage.

WIDOW JUDITH.1 of Dorchester, 1636; was sister of Israel Stoughton, married in England, John Denman, about 1620, and he died; she married (2) Smead about 1634; she died March, 1639. Her brother Israel, an English Colonist, was in Dorchester, Mass., by 1630. Later. in 1637 he was one of the organizers of the "Ancient and Honorable Artillery Company," of Boston, and in 1642, became captain of it. His son William, became Lieut. Governor, and then acting Governor of the colony, and was for years, Chief Justice, dying in 1701, July 7th, a bachelor. Thus William born in England in 1635, was Wm. Stoughton's first cousin. The child came, after the death of his father, with his mother, to be with her brother in Dorchester. William.2 after the death of hismother, was put under the care of one John Pope. An English farmer, of Kent, named James Bates, born in 1582, and his wife. Alice. born in 1583, Puritans, emigrated to Dorchester in the year 1630. Another English Puritan, named Thomas Lawrence, near the same time, emigrated to Hingham, and in the year 1638 married Elizabeth, the daughter of James Bates. They had three children: Nicholas, Mary, and Elizabeth. Junior.

WILLIAM SMEAD,² son of Smead and Judith¹ (Stoughton), sister of Israel Stoughton, married Oct. 31st, or Dec. 31st,

1658, Elizabeth, daughter of Thomas Lawrence. She was killed in 1704. William died before 1704. He had moved to Northampton, and later to Deerfield.

On the very day President Lincoln issued his first call for Volunteer Troops, Captain Smead and his Company were the first Union Volunteers mustered into the U.S. service. After three months of arduous duty in defence of the City he was commissioned a Captain of the U. S. Artillery and placed in command of one of its mounted batteries. With this he fought in General McClellan's "Peninsula Campaign," and the subsequent battles of the Army of the Potomac, until Aug. 30th, 1862, when he was killed in battle. The Regiment erected a marble monument over his grave at Carlisle. Pa. He was married in 1858 to Miss Annie B. Ege, of Carlisle, Pa., and they had one child born in Washington, D. C., Oct. 25th, 1859, whom they named "Raphael Chart." The War Department at Washington, D. C., on May 10, 1902. directed the army steamboat which plies between San Francisco and the Forts in the bay, to be refitted and named "The Captain Smead" in honor of the Smeads:viz. BROKEN SMEAD RECORDS

Page 893 of Semi-official U. S. War Department publication known as Historical Register and Dictionary of the United States Army, 1780-1903, compiled by Francis B. Hectman, a War Dept. upper clerk and published by the Government printing office in Washington, D. C., in 1903, alphabetically arranged, occurs the name of five Smeads: First, Benjamin; Second, Raphael Cummings; Third, Abner; Fourth, Jo'an Radcliff, and Fifth, Alexander Dallas Bache. Their U. S. Army record is given as follows: Benjamin Smead, Vermont, (that is) born or appointed from Vermont, 1st Lt., 11th Inf., Mar. 12th, 1812; Capt., Aug. 15th, 1813, honorably discharged June 15th, 1815. The record of the others appear respectively in this genealogy except Abner, who was from Georgia, and at West Point when John Radcliff Smead was there.

Commander Walter A. Smead was the son of Walter E. Smead and an only grandson to Darwin D. Smead and Cynthia Cheney of Cheney, Mass. Walter E., was married to Elizabeth McNanny of Maddrid Springs, New York, the three children of their marriage being Walter A. Smead, Howard R. Smead and Harold B. Smead. Darwin had a brother by the name of Henry. Commander Smead was born at Central City, South Dakota, in 1880, and married Mollie, who lives at Walkers, Va. He died in March, 1926, while in command of U. S. Ship "Procyn," at Panama. Howard R. Smead died at Bend, Oregon, May 23rd, 1928. Harold Smead is Cashier at the First National Bank, Spokane, Washington. Their mother, Elizabeth, died June 19th, 1928.

In 1902, there was a business office on Broadway, New York, near 19th St., having the sign, "Smead & Lawton, India Rugs." On inquiry Mr. Smead said that he knew little of his own family line, but that he had been brought up in Eastern New York state, not far from West Point. On a printed letterhead there was as follows:

In the letter he said: . . . "My Grandfather's name was John Smead. Tradition says that he came from England before the Revolution and settled in Vermont, and my Grandfather's brother's name was Charles Smead.

They were manufacturers, and while one remained here (in New York) the other was in India.

Smead Brothers, Arthur and Lester, Vineland, N. J., sons of Elmer Jonathan of Proctorsville, and later Cuttingsville, Vt., and later East Wallingford. He was the son of Ithiel, who was born about 1780, and died April 20th, 1859, @ 79 years. He was married three times: 1st, Hannah, who died July 17th, 1821; 2nd, Ruth, who died April 16th, 1855, @ 64; 3rd, no record. Abner, son of Ithiel and Hannah died. Ithiel, son of Ithiel and Ruth, died, @ 20 years. Elvira, daughter of Ithiel. Elmer Jonathan, son of Ithiel. Wesley D., son of Ithiel. Albert, half brother of Jonathan.

Wesley D. Smead of Danby, Vt., now 73 years of age. From a fire lost the family record. Their tradition is that their ancestors were English of high officials. Elmer Jonathan was an inventor of the sap buckets and other appliances now in use.

Carolina Edwina Smead wrote what she knew of her family for the benefit of a friend, at a hotel at Buena Vista Springs, Pa., and Md., Blue Ridge, ten years ago (1918) that "she was the daughter of Edwin Julius and Charlotte (Howard) Smead, and granddaughter of William and Frances Catherine (Williamson) Smead, who were married in Oneida, N. Y., 65 or 70 years ago. Edwin Julius Smead was named for Major Edwin Julius Smead, who was either his great-grandfather or his great-nucle."

Tradition has it: That three Smead brothers, educated as physicians, left Germany for the Isle of Man in the Irish sea. Later they moved on to the United States and located, one in Seneca, N. Y., one in Baltimore, Md., and one went South and was never heard from. Only Ottello's line is known by the present generation. He was born in 1770 and died in 1844 of apoplexy; leaving four children, but two died young leaving Alonzo and Adelaide. Alonzo born in 1814 died in 1872 of apoplexy; graduate of Physicians and Surgeons, Penn. He had three children. Robert. Cassus Carroll and Mary. Robert Smead graduated at the Physicians and Surgeons of Penn., and died in 1899, leaving no children. Cassus Carrol was born in 1854 and died in 1918 of apoplexy. He was a graduate of Rush Medical College and was a physician. He had one son: Leslie Levant, born in 1881; graduated by the Northeastern University Medical School: a physician in Iowa. A brother of his mother was Dr. Virgil Hestwood.

Mary Smead was married to David Nolan, M. D. In an exchange of photographs with Ephraim Alexander Smead of Tioga, Pa., a letter now extant reads: "I have compared feature by feature and think we must be from the same line." There is a tradition extant that the Smeads came to Briton from Rome in the army of Julius Caeser. And when Caeser retired from the island with his troops many of them remained, and among them were the Smeads who became prominent settlers of the country. When the Northerners came down on the country and drove the inhabitants out, many including the Smeads, retreated up into the mountains of Wales, and it is said their descendants live there to this day.

Note: Numerals and combinations at the left of the records trace forward to heads of families.

REV. EDWARD BILLINGS (or BILLING) was born in Hatfield Aug. 10th, 1707, but his father removed later to Sunderland. He graduated at Harvard College in 1731. From his pastorate in Belchertown he was called to be the first pastor of the first Congregational Church of Greenfield (district of Deerfield, which included Gill) the 24th of Sept. 1754. He was settled on the 27th day of March and Thursday the 28th he was installed. Rev. Jonathan Edwards was appointed moderator and gave the charge to the pastor. The following twelve brethren bearing documents, showing dismissal from the church in Deerfield, appeared at the Council. The church was not built till 1760, and was then located in what was the topographical center of the town, or center of the district, including Gill (which later became a separate township).

His church being divided in mind on the matter, failed to send him, but he appeared at the meeting and voted, whereupon he was asked by his church to resign. The question involved by both churches was that of the claim to what was called the "half way covenant." Both pastors were in favor of it. It was a claim to the right: on once having received the rite of baptism, the person, if he chose, had the privilege to partake of the communion. This was recorded in substance in the records of Congregational churches of Franklin County.

BROKEN RECORDS

Clarence Morris Smead, born in 1886, now of Cleveland, Ohio, son of Sylvester R. Smead, and grandson of Timothy H. Smead, whose mother was a Herrick. No further knowledge of the family record.

David James Smead was born in Western New York or Southern Ohio about 1834. His father, name unknown, migrated into Ohio trying to rescue a team of horses from an ice-filled swollen stream of Ashtabula; contracted a cold and fatal pneumonia; leaving a widow and son, six months old. The widow later married a Mr. Waldo. She died when her boy was eight and a half years old, leaving other children. The boy was adopted, but being cruelly treated, when twelve years old, ran away and engaged on a sailing vessel on the Great Lakes. He rose rapidly to captain of a vessel at an early age. While yet young his vessel with others was driven on shore by a terrible storm at Cleveland. A man, learning his name, told him that he had relatives living near Owego, Tioga County, N. Y. He remembered, from his mother, cousins by the name of Harrington-that his ancestors came from Wales and that

there were three brothers. He found the cousins but soon afterward in 1899 married a young lady by the name of Almira Staunton, about 1860. Then came five children: Isabelle, Cora, Elizabeth, Edgar M., and Nettie C. He left the water when Edgar was born in 1871 for a farm near Owego. Having learned the harness trade winters he preferred it to the farm and was successful, but moved to Nichols. The business grew and he sold out and returned to Owego and opened again with success, by winning the name of "Honest Dave Smead". He died on the old homestead at the age of sixty-five in 1899.
